THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 16-1 or better for the seventh time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU.
- Made Kansas 5-0 in Big 12 play for the 10th time in the Bill Self era and the first time since the 2016-17 season.
- Gave Kansas its 10th-straight win, its longest winning streak of the season.
- Gave KU its seventh-consecutive win against lowa State.
- Gave KU its 16th-straight win in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 10-0 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 840-116 all-time in the venue, including 302-16 in the Bill Self era.
- Made Kansas 2,373-878 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas is 15-0 when leading at the half this season.
- KU held lowa State to only 60 points, the lowest point total by a Big 12 opponent this season. It was the least amount of points allowed in a conference game since Feb. 19, 2022 at West Virginia (71-58).
- There were 15 lead changes and eight ties.
- Kansas improved to 6-0 in games decided by five points or fewer or overtime this season. The Jayhawks have won the last 10 contests decided by five points or fewer or overtime dating back to Feb. 7, 2022 at Texas.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Freshman guard Gradey Dick scored 21 points on 7-of-13 (53.8 percent) shooting from the floor and 5-of-9 from beyond the arc. Dick has now scored 20+ points four times this season and has made 47 3FG's so far in his Kansas career. He passed Andrew Wiggins (43) and tied Sherron Collins (47) for ninth on the all-time KU freshman three-point field goals list.
- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson scored 16 points and corralled 11 rebounds, giving him his 24th double-double in
 his career and conference-high eighth this season. Wilson has now scored 1,088 points in his career, passing
 Charlie Black (1,082) to move into 49th on the all-time scoring list. Wilson's 11 boards are good enough to
 move him into the 24th spot on the KU all-time career rebounds list, passing Greg Dreiling (650).
- Sophomore forward KJ Adams Jr. scored 15 points on 6-of-9 (66.7 percent) shooting from the floor. Adams has now scored in double-figures for the 10th game in a row, after not scoring in double-figures the first seven games of the season.
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. swiped three steals from the Cyclones. McCullar has 30 steals in his last nine games. McCullar finished with eight points and five rebounds.
