THE LOSS...

- Made Kansas 16-2 or better for the second-straight season and ninth time in Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU.
- Ended a Kansas 10-game winning streak.
- Dropped Kansas to 1-1 in overtime games this season and Bill Self to 26-11 in overtime contests while at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 5-1 or better in Big 12 play for the 16th time in the Bill Self era.
- Ended a Kansas seven-game winning streak against Kansas State.
- Made Kansas 2,373-879 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas dished out 21 assists on 26 made baskets. The 21 assists were the most at K-State since having 24 assists on Jan. 28, 2004.
- Kansas scored a season-high 10 points in overtime, (prev. 6 points vs. Wisconsin on Nov. 24, 2022).
- Kansas secured 12 offensive rebounds. The Jayhawks have at least 10 offensive rebounds in 15 of their 18 games this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson scored a career-high 38 points, marking the second time Wilson has scored 30+ points this season (33 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 18, 2022). Wilson's 38 points were the most by a Jayhawk since Andrew Wiggins scored 41 at West Virginia (March 8, 2014).
- Wilson's 38 points were also the third-most scored in the Bill Self era (since 2003-04) behind Wiggins and Elijah Johnson's 39 points at Iowa State on Feb. 25, 2013. He was the first Jayhawk to score 30+ points against Kansas State since Ben McLemore had 30 on Feb. 11, 2013 vs. K-State.
- Wilson has scored 1,126 points in his career, moving him into 48th on the Kansas all-time scoring list, passing Lagerald Vick (1,100).
- Sophomore forward KJ Adams Jr. finished with 17 points, shooting a perfect 6-of-6 from the floor. Adams has scored in double-figures 11 games in a row after not scoring 10 or more points in the first seven games of the year.
- Freshman guard Gradey Dick scored 16 points, marking the 14th time he has scored in double-figures this season. Dick also swatted a career-high two blocks in the game.
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. dished out a career-high 11 assists in the contest and also swiped two steals from the Wildcats.
