THE WIN...

- Gave Kansas its 204th all-time win against K-State, the most victories against an opponent in NCAA Division I history.
- Gave Kansas its 17th-straight win against Kansas State in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Made Kansas 11-1 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 841-117 all time in the venue, including 303-17 in the Bill Self era.
- Made Self 574-128 while at Kansas, 777-233 all-time and 40-7 versus Kansas State.
- Made Kansas 2,375-881 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas made 11 three-point field goals in the contest. KU has now made 10+ three-pointers seven times this season.
- Kansas collected 44 rebounds, a season high in conference play.
- Kansas held Kansas State to only 20 field goals, tying the fewest by an opponent this season (vs. West Virginia, vs. Indiana).
- Kansas limited K-State to 33.9 percent shooting, the lowest by a Kansas opponent this season.
- Kansas had nine blocks compared to two by K-State. The nine blocks were a season high in Big 12 play.
- Kansas secured 13 offensive rebounds. The Jayhawks have at least 10 offensive rebounds in 17 of
- their 22 games this season.
- Kansas is 17-1 this season when leading at halftime.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson finished with 20 points, including four three-pointers, eight rebounds and four assists in 39 minutes. Wilson has scored 20+ points in five straight games and 13 times this season (20th career). He is the first Jayhawk with at least 20 points in five consecutive games since Dedric Lawson scored 20+ in six straight games (Nov. 21-Dec. 15, 2018).
- Wilson has scored 133 points over his last five games, which marks the most points by a Kansas player in a five-game stretch since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996-97.
- Wilson now sits in 37th on the Kansas all-time career scoring list, passing Wayne Selden Jr. (1,202), Jacque Vaughn (1,207), Greg Dreiling and Scot Pollard (1,209).
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. posted a career-high-tying 18 points on 7-of-12 (58.3 percent) shooting in 34 minutes. His seven field goals marked a career high.
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. recorded his seventh double-double of the season (10th career)
 with 16 points, a career-high 13 rebounds and four assists in 30 minutes. McCullar has earned a
 double-double in three-straight games for the first time in his career. He made a KU career-high 10
 free throws.
- McCullar Jr. has 12+ rebounds in three straight games. The last Jayhawk to have at least 12 rebounds in three-consecutive games was Dedric Lawson (Jan. 2-9, 2019).
- Sophomore Zach Clemence blocked a career-high three shots in a career-high 15 minutes off the bench.
- Freshman Ernest Udeh Jr. grabbed a career-high six rebounds in 10 minutes off the bench.
