THE WIN...

- Gave Kansas its 20th win of the season for the 34th consecutive season, a streak which started in 1989-90 and is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's basketball.
- Extended Kansas' winning streak against Oklahoma to five games.
- Made Kansas 5-3 in true road games this season and 8-4 in games not played in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Gave Bill Self 20 wins for the 25th-straight season, including all 20 while at Kansas, and the 26th time in 30 years as a head coach.
- Made Self 576-129 while at Kansas and 779-234 all-time.
- Made Kansas 2,377-882 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas' 16 steals were its most in conference play since Jan. 27, 2007 vs. Colorado (19). It's the most steals on the road in conference play since Feb. 13, 2006 at Oklahoma State (16).
- Kansas forced a season-high-tying 24 turnovers (Nov. 25, 2022 vs. Tennessee). That is the most turnovers by a conference opponent since Feb. 16, 2019 vs. West Virginia (24), and the most on the road in conference play since Feb. 13, 2006 at Oklahoma State (24).
- Kansas scored a season-high-tying 50 points in the paint for the fourth time this season.
- Kansas shot a conference season-high 55.0 percent (33-of-60) from the field.
- Kansas shot 50.0 percent (5-of-10) from three-point range against Oklahoma. The 50.0 percent shooting is the highest three-point percentage on the road this season.
- Kansas is 19-0 this season when leading at halftime.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson finished with a team-high 18 points, five rebounds, five assists and a career-high five steals in 31 minutes. Wilson has 24 double-digit scoring contests this season.
- Wilson now sits in 35th on the Kansas all-time career scoring list with 1,267 points, passing Jerod Haase (1,264).
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. posted 16 points on 7-of-11 (63.6 percent) shooting, three rebounds, three assists and three steals in 34 minutes. Harris has scored in double figures in 11 games this season, including six in Big 12 play.
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. had 13 points, five rebounds, five assists and three steals in 35 minutes. He has scored in double figures 15 times this season.
- Sophomore KJ Adams Jr. added 10 points on 5-of-6 (83.3 percent) shooting and three rebounds in 21 minutes. Adams Jr. has 14 double-figure scoring games this season, eight of those coming in conference play.
- Freshman Ernest Udeh Jr. played a career-high 17 minutes off the bench. He contributed eight points, four rebounds, two blocks and two steals.
