THE WIN...

- Made Kansas 23-5 overall and 11-4 in Big 12 play
- Gave Kansas 11 conference wins for the 29th consecutive season, a streak which started in 1994-95 and is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I
- Made Kansas 7-3 in true road games this season and 10-4 in games not played at Allen Fieldhouse
- Made Bill Self 579-129 while at Kansas, 782-234 all-time and 29-7 vs. TCU, 22-8 while at Kansas
- Gave Bill Self 23 wins for the 19th time in 20 seasons at Kansas, and the 24th time in 30 years as a head coach
- Made Kansas 2.380-882 all-time

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas held TCU to 58 points on Monday and improved to 5-0 this season when holding its opponent to fewer than 60 points. All-time under Bill Self, Kansas is 205-2 when holding its opponent under 60.
- Kansas outrebounded TCU 48-42 in the win. The 48 rebounds are the most by the Jayhawks in a conference game this season. Kansas is now 17-0 when outrebounding its opponent this season. Spanning the last two seasons, the Jayhawks are 45-0 when outrebounding their opponent. Kansas has won 49 straight games when outrebounding its opponent, dating back to Feb. 8, 2021.
- Kansas outscored TCU 42-30 in points in the paint. The Jayhawks have 40 or points in the paint in five straight games, which is the team's longest streak of the season. Over the last five games, Kansas is outscoring its opponents by 60 in the paint.
- The Jayhawks' largest lead in the game was seven when they took a 7-0 lead to start the game. Kansas never had a larger deficit than that the remainder of the game.
- Kansas led 33-29 at halftime on Monday and is now 21-0 this season when leading at the break and 7-0 in true road games when up at half.
- The starting five of Dajuan Harris Jr., Gradey Dick, Jalen Wilson, Kevin McCulllar Jr., and KJ Adams Jr., have started 20 straight games for the Jayhawks and have started all but one game for Kansas this season. The five have combined for 283 career starts.
- The Jayhawks had 19 assists in Monday's win and have double-digit assists in every game this season, while holding opponents to nine games with single-digit assists on the season.
- Kansas shot 39.4 percent on Monday and picked up the victory, marking just the third time this season Kansas has posted a win while shooting less than 40 percent. Kansas also beat Wisconsin and Oklahoma while shooting less than 40 percent.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Gradey Dick became the 10th freshman in Kansas history to surpass the 400-point mark in a season with 19 points in Monday's win. Dick now has 416 points on the season, which ranks eighth all-time in KU freshman history. Dick will now look to pass Devon Dotson, who is seventh with 442 points.
- Redshirt junior guard Dajuan Harris compiled eight assists and no turnovers, marking his 12th game this season with eight or more assists. Over the last three games, Harris has 26 assists and two turnovers, and has 176 assists to 54 turnovers this season. Harris had a career-high four offensive rebounds in the win Monday.
- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson finished with 13 rebounds for the second-straight game. He now has 10 games this season with 10-plus rebounds.
- Redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. finished with 15 points and has now scored in double figures 17 times this season and 55 times in his career.
