THE WIN...

- Gave Kansas at least a share of its 21st Big 12 and NCAA-leading 64th all-time conference regular-season title.
- Gave Kansas its 40th-straight victory in home finales.
- Gave Kansas 13 conference wins for the 16th time in Bill Self's 20 seasons at Kansas.
- Made Kansas 15-1 this season inside Allen Fieldhouse, 845-117 all-time in the venue, including 307-17 under Bill Self.
- Gave Bill Self 25 wins for the 17th time in 20 seasons at Kansas, and the 21st time in 30 years as a head coach.
- Made Self 581-129 while at KU, 784-234 overall and 30-9 versus Texas Tech (29-6 while at Kansas).
- Made Kansas 2,382-882 all-time.

TEAM NOTES

- The starting five of Dajuan Harris Jr., Gradey Dick, Jalen Wilson, Kevin McCulllar Jr., and KJ Adams Jr., have started 22 straight games for the Jayhawks and have started all but one game for Kansas this season. The five have combined for 289 career starts.
- Saturday's contest marked the 352nd consecutive sellout at Allen Fieldhouse, a streak that started in the second game of the 2001-02 season.
- Kansas led 30-21 at halftime and improved to 23-0 on the year when leading at halftime.
- The Jayhawks had 13 assists in Tuesday's win and have double-digit assists in every game this season, while holding opponents to 11 games with single-digit assists this season, including tonight as Texas Tech finished with nine assists Tuesday night.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt junior Jalen Wilson and redshirt senior Kevin McCullar Jr. were honored tonight for senior night, playing in their last game in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Wilson scored 21 points marking the 16th time this season he has scored at least 20 points. Wilson also shot 90 percent from the free throw line (9-of-10). Wilson ties Mario Chalmers (1,320) for 31st on the Kansas alltime scoring record list.
- Redshirt junior Dajuan Harris Jr. dished out five assists and finished with 16 points (7-of-12). Kansas is 13-0 this season when Harris has made a three-pointer. He made two tonight. Harris' five assists led the Jayhawks, and Harris has led the team in assists 24 times this season. Harris now has 147 steals in his career, tying Paul Pierce for 22nd on the Kansas all-time career steals list.
- McCullar Jr. finished with 14 points and scored his 1,000th career point. McCullar has scored in double-figures in 19 games this season, including his last three games. McCullar was one rebound shy of a double-double, coralling nine rebounds in the contest.
