THE LOSS...

- Made Kansas 25-6 overall and 13-5 in Big 12 play
- Ended a seven-game winning streak for Kansas
- Ended a Kansas three-game road winning streak and made KU 7-4 in true road games this season and 10-5 in games not played in Allen Fieldhouse
- Made Bill Self 581-130 while at Kansas, 788-235 all-time and 27-13 vs. Texas, 27-11 while at KU
- Made Kansas 2,382-883 all-time.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Redshirt-junior forward Jalen Wilson scored 11 points in the first half to give him 600 points on the season. He became the 10th player in the Bill Self era to score at least 600 points in a season, joining Perry Ellis (641), Tyshawn Taylor (647), Marcus Morris (654), Sherron Collins (661), Devonte' Graham (675), Thomas Robinson (692), Dedric Lawson (700), Ochai Agbaji (732) and Frank Mason (753). Wilson now has 612 points this season.
- With his 23 points, Wilson moved into solo possession of 31st all-time in program history in scoring. Wilson entered Saturday's game tied with Mario Chalmers with 1,341 career points. Wilson now has 1,364 points and is seven points behind Marcus Morris for 30th.
- Wilson finished with 23 points and 10 rebounds for his 10th double-double this season and the 26th of his career. The game also marked the 17th time this season Wilson scored 20-plus points and the 24th time in his career.
- With his 10 rebounds, Wilson now has 764 for his career, which moves him into 15th all-time in program history. He passed Thomason Robinson, who finished his career with 763. Greg Ostertag is next for Wilson at 770 rebounds.
- Redshirt-junior guard Dajuan Harris Jr., finished with seven assists, and now has 425 for his career. He passed Mario Chalmers for 16th all-time in Kansas history. He is now tied with Jeff Boschee for 15th all-time.
- Harris has at least five assists in six straight games for the Jayhawks. That is the longest stretch of his career, topping his previous high of four set earlier this season. He has just four turnovers during the six games, with 44 assists.
- Harris didn't have any turnovers to his seven assists. He now has three games this season with five-plus assists and no turnovers. He also did it against North Dakota State (five assists, no turnovers) and at TCU (eight assists, no turnovers).
- Freshman Gradey Dick had six points on Saturday and now has 442 points on the season. He is now tied with Devon Dotson (2019) for seventh all-time on the single-season freshman scoring list.
