### TIPOFF

- No. 1 Kansas will conclude its two-game homestand to open the 2023-24 season when it plays host to Manhattan College on Friday, Nov. 10 at 7 p.m. (Central), in Allen Fieldhouse. The game will be televised on Big 12 NOW via ESPN+ with Steven Davis, Nick Bahe and Kennetra Pulliams on the broadcast.
- KU won its mind-boggling 51st-straight home opener with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. The streak began in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 21-0 in home openers in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas posted a 28-8 overall record in 2022-23 and won the Big 12 regular season title with a 13-5 league mark. Manhattan College is 1-0 on the season and went 12-18 last season, including a 10-10 record in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), finishing tied for fifth.
- KU and Manhattan will be meeting for the first time in men's basketball.
- Though its only one game, KU leads the nation in field goal percentage at 69.6% and is second in three-point field goal percentage at 56.5%. KU also leads the Big 12 in assists per game at 34.0, which is second nationally.
- Though its only one game, senior Hunter Dickinson leads the nation in three-point field goal percentage at 100%. His 88.9% field goals lead the league. Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. leads the Big 12 and is third nationally with a 10.0 assists per game average.
- Kansas is No. 1 in the Associated Press poll for the fourth time in poll history, with all coming four in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.
- KU has been ranked in the AP top 10 in each of the last 39 polls dating back to the 2021-22 preseason poll. The 39 consecutive is the longest active streak in men's college basketball.
- Including 2023-24, Kansas has been the Big 12 coaches' choice to win the league 20 times in the 27-year history of the conference.
- Kansas is celebrating 126 years of men's basketball in 2023-24.

**ABOUT KANSAS**

No. 1 Kansas opened the 2023-24 season with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6, in Allen Fieldhouse. The game was part of the McLendon Classic.

Kansas dominated NCCU from the start and led 59-18 by halftime. Graduate senior Kevin McCullar Jr. led the way scoring 22 points, while senior Hunter Dickinson added 21 and led all rebounders with eight. Dickinson was 8-for-9 from the field, including 3-for-3 from three-point range. Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. posted a game-high 10 assists. Other KU players scoring in double figures were graduate senior Nicolas Timberlake (13), junior KJ Adams Jr. (12) and graduate senior Parker Braun (10).

Kansas is coming off a 28-8 season in which it won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 13-5 league record. It was KU's NCAA-record 63rd conference regular-season title and 16th under head coach Bill Self in his 20 seasons at Kansas.

Kansas returns three starters – Adams, Harris and McCullar – and eight letterwinners from last season. KU welcomes nine newcomers, including the 2023-24 coaches' Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Dickinson. Dickinson, Harris and McCullar were on the All-Big 12 Preseason team as well.

**ABOUT MANHATTAN COLLEGE**

Located in the Bronx, New York, Manhattan College is 1-0 on the season after winning 61-59 at Bryant on Nov. 6. The Jaspers are coached by John Gallagher who is 1-0 in his first season at Manhattan and 170-207 in his 13th season overall.

Sophomore forward Daniel Rouzan led all scorers in Manhattan's win at Bryant with 16 points. Freshman guard/forward Seydou Traore posted a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds, while redshirt-sophomore guard Brett Rumpel had 10 points and two blocked shots. Freshman guard Jaden Winston (8 points) and graduate guard Perry Cowan (6 points) rounded out the Manhattan starters at Bryant. Manhattan played 10 players nine-plus minutes in the opener. The Jaspers returned three letterwinners and have 14 newcomers on the 2023-24 roster.

Manhattan is coming off a 12-18 record in 2022-23, including a 10-10 record in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) finishing tied for fifth.

**THE KANSAS-MANHATTAN COLLEGE SERIES**

Kansas and Manhattan are meeting for the first time in men's basketball. KU is 16-1 against current membership of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) - 4-1 vs. Iona, 3-0 vs. Rider, 2-0 vs. Canisius, 2-0 vs. Niagara, 2-0 vs. Saint Peter's, 2-0 vs. Siena and 1-0 vs. Fairfield. KU last faced a MAAC team in 2021 when it defeated Iona, 93-83, on Nov. 28, 2021 in the opening round of the ESPN Events Invitational in Orlando, Florida.

**NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL LEFTOVERS**

- Kansas is 1-0 for the 18th time in head coach Bill Self's 21 seasons at KU.
- Kansas won its 51st-consecutive home opener, a streak that started in 1973-74 under then-head coach Ted Owens.
- The win made Kansas 2,371-885 all-time.
- Kansas shot 69.6 percent (39-of-56) from the field for the game. That is the highest shooting percentage by KU in a game since Jan. 9, 1997 vs. Niagara (72.1 percent). The 78.6 percent shooting percentage in the first half was the highest since Jan. 9, 1997 vs. Niagara in the second half (79.2 percent).
- Kansas dished out 34 assists, which marked the most in a game since Nov. 26, 1999 vs. Xavier (program-record-tying 36 assists). It was the most assists in Allen Fieldhouse since Dec. 9, 1989 vs. Kentucky (36). Kansas had 21 assists in the first half to tie a program record for a half (Jan. 14, 1993 vs. Oral Roberts and Dec. 9, 1989 vs. Kentucky).
- Kansas' 59 points in the first half were the most in a half since Nov. 15, 2019 vs. Monmouth (1st half, 59 points).
- Kansas shot 75.0 percent (9-of-12) from three-point range in the first half. That is the best since shooting 81.8 percent (9-of-11) from deep in the first half against Toldeo on Nov. 28, 2017 (min. 10 attempts).
- Kansas' 13 three-pointers made were the most in a season-opener since Nov. 13, 2015 vs. Northern Colorado (15).
- Kansas had five players score in double figures (McCullar – 22, Dickinson – 21, Timberlake – 13, Adams – 12, Braun – 10).
- Kansas held North Carolina Central to 18 points in the first half, the fewest points in a half since holding Miami to 15 points in the second half on March 27, 2022 in the NCAA Regional final.
- Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. had a Kansas career-high 22 points on 8-of-12 (66.7 percent) shooting, six rebounds and five assists. The game was his fourth career 20-point effort.
- Senior Hunter Dickinson finished with 21 points on 8-of-9 (88.9 percent) shooting, eight rebounds, five assists and two blocks. His 21 points mark the 35th time in his career he has scored at least 20 points.
- Redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. tallied a game-high 10 assists in 25 minutes. He has four double-digit assists games in his career.
- Graduate-senior Parker Braun added 10 points on 5-of-6 (83.3 percent) shooting, five rebounds and three assists in 20 minutes off the bench. Braun recorded his 100th career block in the second half.
- Graduate-senior Michael Jankovich matched his career high with five points (Nov. 15, 2019 vs. Monmouth).

**JAYHAWKS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON POLLS**

Kansas enters the 2023-24 season No. 1 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls. This marks the fourth time KU has been No. 1 in the preseason AP poll with all four in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24. This is the fifth time in the coaches' poll that the Jayhawks have been No. 1 in the preseason poll with four in the Self era - 1996-97, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.

Under 21st-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 18th time that Kansas entered the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 1 ranking marks the 26th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas could possibly play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25. KU will play against No. 6 UConn, No. 7 Houston, No. 16 Kentucky, No. 18 Texas and No. 20 Baylor (twice). KU could also play No. 3 Purdue, No. 5 Marquette, and No. 11 Gonzaga in the Maui Invitational, Nov. 20-22, in Honolulu.

The No. 1 ranking marked the 10th-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 18th time in the Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 12 seasons.

KU PICKED FIRST IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the 20th time in the 27-year history of the coaches' preseason Big 12 poll, Kansas has been selected as the favorite to win the league as the preseason poll was announced Oct. 13.

For the 2023-24 poll, KU collected 12 of a possible 14 first-place votes and finished with a total of 168 points. Houston received two first-place nods and was second with 153 points. Texas was third with 143 points, while Baylor was fourth with 137 points and TCU fifth with 113 points to round out the top five.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas men's basketball senior Hunter Dickinson, redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. and graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. were named to the 2023-24 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches, the conference announced Oct. 12.

Dickinson is the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first player in conference history to earn both honors in the same season. Dickinson is joined on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team by Harris, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

Historically, Dickinson is the 11th Jayhawk to collect the preseason player of the year award and the fifth to earn preseason newcomer. Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team in all but two of the 28 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Dickinson and Harris are the 39th and 40th Jayhawks to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

KU TRIO ON NAISMITH PRESEASON TOP 50

The Kansas men's basketball trio of Hunter Dickinson, Dajuan Harris Jr. and Kevin McCullar Jr. have been named to the 2023-24 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Men's preseason 50 watch list the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced Monday, the opening day of the season. Kansas is the only team with three players on the list and one of eight schools with multiple players.

Kansas has had two previous winners of the Naismith Trophy with Danny Manning in 1988 and Frank Mason III in 2017.

In late January the Naismith Trophy will name a top 15 midseason team. In early March 2024 the award will announce 10 national semifinalists and later that month name four finalists. The Naismith Trophy Men's Player of the Year will be awarded April 7, the Sunday prior to the NCAA title game.

DICKINSON ON THE PRESEASON NABC WATCH LIST

Kansas senior Hunter Dickinson was one of 20 players named to the 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced Nov. 2. The 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year - selected by a vote of Division I head coaches - will be announced the week of the 2024 Men's Final Four.

FOUR JAYHAWKS ARE ON STARTING FIVE WATCH LISTS

In October, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced watch lists for its "Starting Five" for the 2023-24 season. Four Jayhawks were among the 20 watch list honorees with Dajuan Harris Jr. on the Bob Cousy Point Guard Award, Kevin McCullar Jr. on the Jerry West Shooting Guard Award, Johnny Furphy on the Julius Erving Small Forward Award and Hunter Dickinson on the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center Award.

A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates for every starting five.

College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for each honor will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to five. In March, the Hall of Fame's selection committee will determine the winners.

Historically, Kansas' Jalen Wilson was the 2023 Julius Erving Award recipient and Jayhawk Frank Mason III won the 2017 Bob Cousy Award.

## BRAUN WINS NBA TITLE

Former Kansas guard Chirstian Braun became the 15th Jayhawk to win an NBA title, when the Denver Nuggets defeated the Miami Heat last June.

Braun played three seasons at Kansas from 2019-20 to 2021-22. In 2020, the Burlington, Kansas, native was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team and he was a 2021 all-conference honorable mention selection the following season. In Kansas' 2022 NCAA National Championship season, Braun averaged 14.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. The two-time Academic All-Big 12 First Team selection was an all-league second-team selection, and was on the all-tournament teams for the Big 12 Championship and the NCAA Tournament Midwest Regional. In his three seasons at KU, Braun played in 101 games with 74 starts and had 1,018 career points, 506 rebounds, 183 assists and 97 steals.

Braun is the fifth player in NBA history to win an NCAA title and an NBA title in back-to-back seasons. He joins Bill Russell (1956 San Francisco; 1957 Boston Celtics), Henry Bibby (1972 UCLA; 1973 New York Knicks), Magic Johnson (1979 Michigan State, 1980 L.A. Lakers) and Billy Thompson (1986 Louisville; 1987 L.A. Lakers).

With the addition of Braun, there have been 15 Jayhawks who have won 20 NBA titles during their professional careers. Braun becomes the seventh Jayhawk under head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien (2006), Mario Chalmers (2012, 2013), Brandon Rush (2015), Sasha Kaun (2016), Markieff Morris (2020) and Andrew Wiggins (2022).

Braun is the fifth Kansas player to have won both an NCAA and NBA title and the fourth under Self. He joins Clyde Lovellette (1952 NCAA title), Chalmers, Rush and Kaun, who were members of the 2008 NCAA National Championship team.

## KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

No. 7 Texas (March 11, 2023) was the 14th Associated Press top-25 ranked team Kansas played in 2022-23. KU was 7-7 against AP ranked foes in 2022-23, including 4-2 versus top 10 teams. KU played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season and went 8-4 versus those teams. Eleven of the last 14 and 17 of Kansas' last 23 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. In the Bill Self era, KU is 120-72 against AP-ranked opponents, including 47-28 versus Top-10 foes. In that span, Self's KU teams have collected seven or more wins against ranked foes in each of the last three and four of the last five seasons.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 21-13 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, 2003-04, the Jayhawks are 18-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 9-1 versus top-five opponents.

**Nov. 10, 2000:** No. 7 Kansas defeated Saint John's, 82-74, in the title game of the Coaches vs. Cancer IKON Classic in historic Madison Square Garden in New York City. Jayhawk Kenny Gregory was named the event's most valuable player after recording a double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds in the win. Drew Gooden joined Gregory on the all-tournament team as he had 22 points and nine rebounds in the contest. Kansas defeated No. 17 UCLA, 99-98, the day before in the semifinals of the event. KU would go on to post a 26-7 record and advance to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

In 2022-23, Kansas had 11 games decided by five points or less and/or in overtime. KU went 9-2 in those contests. In Kansas' 2021-22 national championship season, KU also played 11 games with the outcome being decided by five points or less or in overtime. The Jayhawks went 9-2 in those contests.

### WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 19 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 15 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the league is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 13 times in Bill Self's 20 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule six times - 2004-05, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19 and last season in 2022-23.

- Kansas has 2,371 all-time victories which is the second most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has won 16 regular-season Big 12 championships with just 17 losses at Allen Fieldhouse.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 765 of its last 768 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Gonzaga (102-90) on 11.26.2020 with the previous being Oklahoma (100-78) on 2.27.1990.
- Kansas set the NCAA DI record for being ranked in the Associated Press poll at 231 consecutive weeks from Feb. 2, 2009 until Feb. 1, 2021. KU's stretch consisted of 433 games of being ranked.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 23 of the last 24 seasons.
- Each four-year KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. The current KU four-year players - graduate Michael Jankovich and redshirt senior Dajuan Harris Jr. - have won 84.

- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 365-86 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 275-179. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is top at 417-99, while Texas is second at 304-201.

**MORE KANSAS NOTABLES**

- On Nov. 7, Naismith Hall of Fame member Bill Self signed an amended contract with the University of Kansas. Self and KU Director of Athletics Travis Goff signed the reworked agreement — effectively a five-year extension worth \$44.5 million, including a \$1 million signing bonus.
- Kansas went 16-for-16 on free throws at Baylor on Jan. 23., 2023. That is the most free throws made in a game without a miss in program history, surpassing Dec. 9, 2015 vs. Holy Cross when KU went 12-for-12 from the free throw line.
- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse each of the last two seasons (2021-22 and 2022-23). KU has won 10 or more home games for 38 of the last 39 seasons, beginning in 1983-84. KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for 23 of the last 24 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- Kansas has won a mind-boggling 50-straight home openers (beginning in 1973-74 under coach Ted Owens), 32-consecutive conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams and including 2022-23) and 40-straight Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, 2022, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets. He is the fourth KU graduate to coach at the highest level - John McClendon (ABA, 1969-70 at Denver); Wilt Chamberlain (ABA, 1973-74 at San Diego); Kevin Pritchard (NBA, 2005 at Portland, 27 games); Jacque Vaughn (NBA, 2012-15 at Orlando, 2022-present at Brooklyn).

**UPCOMING - CHAMPIONS CLASSIC HISTORY**

Beginning in 2011, the State Farm Champions Classic is a neutral site doubleheader series featuring men's basketball powers Kansas, Duke, Kentucky and Michigan State. The inaugural Champions Classic was held at Madison Square Garden in 2011 followed by the Georgia Dome in 2012 and the United Center in Chicago in 2013.

Kansas is 7-5 in the Champions Classic and the Jayhawks have won six of their last seven appearances in the event after last year's 69-64 win against Duke in Indianapolis. Duke is 7-5 in the Champions Classic, while Kentucky is 5-7 and Michigan State 5-7.

In 2011, Kansas and Kentucky's Champions Classic meeting also became the matchup for the 2012 NCAA National Championship title game in New Orleans. The Wildcats defeated the Jayhawks,

75-65, in the Champions Classic.

In the 2016-17 season, Kansas defeated all the other three teams in the Champions Classic. KU defeated then-No. 1 Duke, 77-75, in the event and won at then-No. 4 Kentucky, Jan. 28, in the Big 12/SEC Challenge. KU completed the feat with a 90-70 win versus Michigan State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Tulsa on March 19, 2017.

KU will face Michigan State in 2024.

### NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.

- At Kansas, Self has won 16 regular-season league titles with just 17 losses in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino) and one of 16 all-time with multiple titles.
- While at Kansas, he has coached 13 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 23 of the last 25 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 regular-season league crowns in the last 25 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 10 career 30-win seasons are tied for third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12), John Calipari (10); and is tied for No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Nine of his 10 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catharines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including eight times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).


