TIPOFF

- No. 5 Kansas will conclude its two-game homestand to open the 2022-23 season when it plays host to North Dakota State on Nov. 10 at 7 p.m. (Central), in Allen Fieldhouse. The game will be televised on Big 12 NOW via ESPN+ with Steven Davis, Wayne Simien and Kennetra Pulliams on the broadcast.
- KU won its mind-boggling 50th-straight home opener with an 89-64 win against Omaha on Nov. 7. The streak began in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 20-0 in home openers in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas leads the overall series with North Dakota State, 2-0, with an 84-74 win on March 20, 2009, in the opening round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament in Minneapolis. KU defeated North Dakota State, 65-61, on Dec. 5, 2020, in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Having won its final 11 games en route to the NCAA Championship, Kansas has the longest win streak in NCAA Division I at 12 games. Xavier (6) is next followed by Fresno State (5), Oklahoma State (3) and Bellarmine (3).
- KU returns two starters and seven letterwinners from last season's 34-6 team that finished tied for first in the Big 12 with a 14-4 record. KU advanced to its NCAA-record 32nd-consecutive NCAA Tournament, winning the national title.
- KU's two starters returning include redshirt-junior guard Dajuan Harris Jr. who led the Big 12 in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.81, which was 14th nationally, and redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson who is KU's leading returning scorer (11.1 ppg) from last season. He led KU in rebounds per game at 7.4 last year.
- Wilson was named to the 2023 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Watch List for the second straight season. Redshirt-senior transfer guard Kevin McCullar was named to the 2023 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Watch List.
- The NDSU contest will be Salute to Service with activities throughout the contest.

ABOUT KANSAS

Kansas opened up the 2022-23 season with an 89-64 win against Omaha on Nov. 7. The victory was KU's 50th-consecutive home-opening win, a streak which started in 1973-74. Freshman Gradey Dick led all scorers with 23 points, while redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson posted a double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds. Redshirt-junior Dajuan Harris tied his career high with eight assists to go along with 11 points, while sophomore Bobby Pettiford chipped in a career-high 13 points going 6-for-7 from the field.

Kansas returns two starters – Wilson and Harris – and seven letterwinners from last season's 34-6 season, in which it won its sixth national title and fourth in NCAA history. Wilson was named a unanimous Preseason All-Big 12 selection for the upcoming season, while McCullar, a transfer from Texas Tech, was an honorable mention honoree by the conference.

Wilson is KU's leading returning scorer at 11.1 points per game and rebounder at 7.4 rebounds per outing. McCullar averaged 10.1 points per contest at TTU last season. Other returners for Kansas include senior guard Michael Jankovich (0.6 ppg), Harris (5.5 ppg, 4.2 assists), junior Joseph Yesufu (2.1 ppg), sophomores KJ Adams Jr. (1.1 ppg), Zach Clemence (2.1 ppg), Bobby Pettiford Jr. (1.4 ppg)

Super-senior Cam Martin and freshmen Kyle Cuffe Jr., Dillon Wilhite and Charlie McCarthy were redshirts last season, with Wilhite and McCarthy serving as walk-ons. Prior to KU, Martin averaged 25.0 ppg and 9.1 rpg in his senior campaign at Missouri Southern State in 2020-21 where he played for Jeff Boschee.

Including McCullar, Kansas added seven newcomers to the roster for 2022-23. Three were 2022 McDonald's All-Americans in guards Dick, MJ Rice and forward Ernest Udeh Jr. Forward Zubey Ejifor and walk-on guard Wilder Evers are also new to the KU team.

Last season, KU tied Baylor for first place in the Big 12 regular season with a 14-4 record. It was KU's NCAA-record 63rd conference regular-season title and 20th in the 26-year history of the Big 12. The Jayhawks then won the Big 12 Tournament, advanced to its NCAA-record 32nd-consecutive NCAA Tournament, a streak that started in 1990, and its 16th Final Four. The Jayhawks won their last 11 games of the season en route to the NCAA title.

ABOUT NORTH DAKOTA STATE

Located in Fargo, North Dakota, with an enrollment of 12,242, North Dakota State is 0-1 on the season after its 76-58 loss at No. 10 Arkansas on Nov. 7. The Bison are coached by David Richman who is 159-98 in his ninth season at his alma mater.

In the opener, junior forward Grant Nelson and junior guard Boden Skunberg each scored 17 points to lead NDSU. Sophomore forward Andrew Morgan had a team-high seven rebounds, one more than Nelson, while Luke Yoder led the Bison with four assists.

North Dakota State went 23-10 last season and finished second in the Summit League with a 13-5 record. The Bison return one starter, Nelson, and five letterwinners from last season's team.

KANSAS-NORTH DAKOTA STATE SERIES

Kansas leads the overall series with North Dakota State 2-0, which included a 84-74 win on March 20, 2009, in the NCAA Tournament in Minneapolis and a 65-61 win on Dec. 5, 2020 in Allen Fieldhouse. Only two current Jayhawks played in the 2020 KU-Omaha contest which was played before 2,500 fans due to the COVID-19 pandemic restricting seating capacity. Jalen Wilson started and had nine points and seven rebounds in 17 minutes. Dajuan Harris Jr. came off the bench and played 20 minutes with two points and two assists.

OMAHA LEFTOVERS

- Kansas is 1-0 for the 17th time in Bill Self's 20 seasons.
- Kansas won its home-opener for the 50th consecutive year, dating back to the 1973-74 season.
- Kansas won its 12th-consecutive victory, dating back to the 2021-22 season.
- Kansas shot 36-of-69 (52.2 percent) from the field and 9-of-22 (40.9 percent) from beyond the arc.
- Kansas assisted on 24 of its 36 made baskets. The 24 assists eclipsed the 2021-22 season high for the Jayhawks.
- Sophomore Bobby Pettiford finished with 13 points, setting a new career high and shooting 6-of-7 (.857) from the field. Pettiford also finished with two assists and a new career high with two steals.
- Making his first start at KU, freshman Gradey Dick produced 23 points, the most in a freshman debut since Xavier Henry scored 27 vs. Hofstra to open the 2009-10 season on November 13, 2009.
- Dick's nine made field goals are the most in a Kansas debut since Carl Henry knocked in 12 field goals en route to a 31-point night against U.S. International on November 27, 1982. Dick's four three-point buckets mark the most in a Kansas debut since Quentin Grimes nailed six treys against Michigan State on November 6, 2018.
- In his second career start, sophomore KJ Adams Jr. pulled down nine rebounds, including eight offensive rebounds, setting a new career high. Adams also recorded four assists in his 29 minutes of play, both career highs.
- Redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson finished with 19 points and 11 rebounds, marking his 17th career double-double. Wilson also set a new career best with seven assists.
- Redshirt-junior Dajuan Harris dished out eight assists, tying his career-high. He also had eight assists at Iowa State last season (Feb. 1, 2022).

KANSAS IN PRESEASON NATIONAL POLLS

For the 11th-consecutive year, Kansas enters the 2022-23 season ranked seventh or higher as KU is No. T-5 in the 2022-23 preseason Associated Press poll released Oct. 17.

This is also the 13th time in the last 14 seasons that the Jayhawks have entered the season No. 7 or higher by the AP, including nine times in the top five and five in the top three. KU was No. 1 in 2009-10, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 1 in 2018-19, No. 3 in 2019-20 and No. 3 in 2021-22.

Last season, Kansas entered the preseason ranked No. 3 nationally in the Associated Press poll and finished the year at No. 3. The Jayhawks were ranked in the AP top 10 during the entire 2021-22 season.

Under 20th-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 17th time that Kansas enters the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 5 ranking marks the 25th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas could possibly play 12 games against teams ranked or receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25. KU will twice play against No. 1-5 Baylor, No. 12 Texas, No. 14 TCU and No. 25 Texas Tech in Big 12 contests and will also face No. 4 Kentucky, No. 7 Duke and No. 13 Indiana.

Like it was in the preseason Associated Press poll, Kansas is ranked No. 5 in the preseason USA TODAY Coaches' Poll released Oct. 26.

This is the ninth-straight year the Jayhawks have opened the season in the top-five and KU is ranked in the preseason for the 31st time in the 34-year history of the poll. With the preseason ranking, Kansas has 594 all-time appearances in the poll, including 316 in the top five.

The No. 5 ranking marks the ninth-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 17th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 11 seasons.

Kansas could potentially play 15 games against teams ranked or receiving votes in the coaches' preseason poll this season. Those include: No. 4 Kentucky, No. 6 Baylor (twice), No. 8 Duke, No. 12 Texas (twice), No. 14 Indiana, No. 16 TCU (twice), No. 24 Texas Tech (twice). KU could play No. 11 Tennessee and No. 25 Dayton at the Battle4Atlantis Nov. 23-25.

In 2021-22 Kansas opened the year No. 3 in the preseason coaches' poll and ended No. 1 for the third time ever - 2008, 2020 and 2022.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson and redshirt-senior Kevin McCullar were named to the 2022-23 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches. Wilson was a unanimous selection, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

A starter on the Kansas 2022 NCAA National Championship team, Wilson is KU's leading returning scorer and rebounder from last season, when he averaged 11.1 points and 7.4 rebounds per game. The Denton, Texas, forward has been listed on many preseason All-America teams in 2022-23, and was an All-Big 12 Third Team selection last season. Wilson is a two-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree and was on the Julius Erving Award Watch List last season, when he posted seven double-doubles and led KU in rebounding 16 times and in scoring in seven contests.

McCullar, a transfer from Texas Tech, was a national semifinalist

for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year in 2021-22. The guard from San Antonio, Texas, averaged 10.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and a team-leading 3.1 assists and 1.4 steals per game last season. A three-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree, McCullar was a two-year starter at Texas Tech and an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection last year.

Historically, Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 first team in all but two of the 27 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Wilson marks the 38th Jayhawk to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

KU THE PICKED SECOND IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 COACHES' POLL

Kansas was voted second by the league's head coaches in the 2022-23 Big 12 men's basketball preseason poll.

Kansas' second-place finish in the poll marks just the sixth time the Jayhawks were not the coaches' top selection in the 27-year history of the conference. At season's end, KU has outright or tied the conference regular-season championship 20 times, including an NCAA-record 14 consecutive from 2005-18. A coaches' preseason poll was not conducted in the Big 12's first season of 1996-97.

For the 2022-23 poll, the Jayhawks collected four first-place votes and finished with a total of 73 points. Baylor received five first-place nods and is the preseason favorite with 77 points. Texas, with one first-place vote, was third with 64 points, while TCU was fourth with 58 points. Oklahoma State and Texas Tech tied for fifth with 42 points, followed No. 7 Oklahoma (32), No. 8 Iowa State (30), No. 9 West Virginia (20) and No. 10 Kansas State (12). Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

TWO JAYHAWKS ARE ON STARTING FIVE WATCH LISTS

In October, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced watch lists for its "Starting Five" for the 2022-23 season. Two Jayhawks were among the 20 watch list honorees.

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson is on the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award for the second straight season, while senior Kevin McCullar is on the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates for every starting five.

College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for each honor will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to five. In March, the Hall of Fame's selection committee will determine the winners.

WIGGINS WINS NBA TITLE

Former Kansas guard Andrew Wiggins became the 14th Jayhawk to win an NBA title when the Golden State Warriors defeated the Boston Celtics in the 2022 NBA Finals, 4-2.

Wiggins, who played at KU in 2013-14 and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft.

There have been 14 Jayhawks who have won 19 NBA titles during their professional careers. Before Wiggins, Markieff Morris was the most recent to win a title after doing so in 2020 with the Los Angeles Lakers. Wiggins becomes the fifth Jayhawk under current KU head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien, Mario Chalmers, who won two titles, Brandon Rush, Sasha Kaun and Morris.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

Kansas played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season. KU went 8-4 versus ranked foes last season. In 2020-21, Kansas went 8-7 against AP ranked foes. Eight of the last nine and 15 of Kansas' last 17 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. Under Bill Self, KU is 118-63 against AP-ranked opponents. In his 19 seasons, Self's KU teams have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 16 of those seasons, including 2021-22.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 21-11 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 18-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 9-1 versus top-five opponents.

Nov. 10, 2000: No. 7 Kansas defeated Saint John's, 82-74, in the title game of the Coaches vs. Cancer IKON Classic in historic Madison Square Garden in New York City. Jayhawk Kenny Gregory was named the event's most valuable player after recording a double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds in the win. Drew Gooden joined Gregory on the all-tournament team as he had 22 points and nine rebounds in the contest. Kansas defeated No. 17 UCLA, 99-98, the day before in the semifinals of the event. KU would go on to post a 26-7 record and advance to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

2021-22 NABC TEAM ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARD

Last July, Kansas men's basketball was recognized for its work in the classroom as the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced its annual Team Academic Excellence Award and NABC Honors Court.

In addition to the team honor, 10 Jayhawks were named to the NABC Honors Court for excelling in the classroom this past academic year. Jayhawks who earned NABC Honors Court recognition include Ochai Agbaji, Christian Braun, Jalen Coleman-Lands, Dajuan Harris, Michael Jankovich, Cam Martin, Remy Martin, David McCormack, Chris Teahan and Jalen Wilson.

The NABC Team Academic Excellence Awards recognize men's basketball programs that completed the 2021-22 academic year with a team GPA of 3.0 or higher. The NABC Honors Court, meanwhile, includes junior, senior and graduate student men's basketball players who finished the 2021-22 year with a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher.

In spring 2022, Kansas men's basketball was one of 14 KU teams posting a 3.00 grade point average or better with a 3.14 GPA.

WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 19 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 15 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the conference is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 10 times in Bill Self's 18 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule five times, including 2019-20.

MORE KANSAS NOTABLES

- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse last season. KU has won 10 or more home games for 39 consecutive seasons, beginning in 1983-84. Entering 2022-23, KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for the last 23 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- Kansas has won a mind-boggling 50-straight home openers (beginning in 1973-74 under coach Ted Owens), 31-consecutive conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams) and 39-straight Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets.
- Former KU teammates Joel Embiid and Andrew Wiggins were named NBA All-Star starters in a fan vote, the NBA announced Jan. 27. Embiid and Wiggins played just one season at KU in 2013-14 and Wiggins was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft. Embiid was the third overall pick in 2014.
- KU legends Wilt Chamberlain and Paul Pierce were named to the NBA 75 Team, announced at the 2022 All-Star Game.
- In the spring 2021 semester, the men's basketball program set a new program high with a 3.56 GPA which came on the heels of Bill Self's squad establishing a new program record of 3.44 in fall of 2020.
- Kansas men's basketball great Paul Pierce became the 21st Jayhawk to be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in September 2021. Pierce was also one of eight individuals inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2021 on Nov. 21. The College Basketball Hall of Fame opened in 2006 with 11 KU-related players and coaches being part of the founding class. Pierce joins Danny Manning (2008) and Clyde Lovellette (2012) as formally being inducted from Kansas and former KU coach Roy Williams will be inducted in November 2022.

- Kansas has 2,358 all-time victories which is the most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Over the last 19 seasons, Kansas has as many regular-season conference championships (16) as it has losses at Allen Fieldhouse (16).
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 649 of its last 652 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Gonzaga (102-90) on 11.26.2020 with the previous being Oklahoma (100-78) on 2.27.1990.
- Kansas set the NCAA DI record for being ranked in the Associated Press poll at 231 consecutive weeks from Feb. 2, 2009 until Feb. 1, 2021. KU's stretch consisted of 433 games of being ranked.
- The Jayhawks have won 24 of their last 32 regular-season games against AP top-10 teams. Under Bill Self, KU is 44-24 against top-10 opponents, a figure that includes postseason play.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 22-straight years, which is the longest active streak in the nation. This includes 2021-22.
- Each four-year KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. The current KU seniors have won 107 contests.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every conference foe.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 357-81 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 256-175. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is top at 404-94, while Texas is second at 282-197.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 152-10 (93.8%) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 7-2 in 2018, 9-0 in 2019, 8-1 in 2020, 8-1 in 2020-21 and 9-0 in 2021-22.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has experienced only two regular-season conference sweeps by a Big 12 opponent. In 135 regular-season Big 12 home-and-home series during the Self era, Kansas has 88 sweeps, 45 splits and has been swept twice (by Oklahoma State in 2018 and Texas in 2021).

Three guards – Elmarko Jackson (Marlton, New Jersey), Chris Johnson (Fort Bend, Texas) and Jamari McDowell (Manvel, Texas) – have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball at Kansas, KU head coach Bill Self announced Wednesday. The three will be freshmen at KU for the 2023-24 season. The Kansas class ranks 10th nationally according to 247sports.com.

ELMARKO JACKSON, G, 6-3, 185, MARLTON, NEW JERSEY (SOUTH KENT SCHOOL [CONN.])

- Playing his final prep season at South Kent School in Connecticut.
- A combo guard who is known for his leadership skills and explosiveness, Jackson is a strong combo guard.
- Has good size, speed, terrific play-making ability and is a tough defender.
- Began his prep career at St. Augustine Prep in Richland, New Jersey. He then transferred to Academy of the New Church in Bryn Athyn, Pennsylvania. He earned all-state and all-league honors in 2021-22 at Academy of the New Church in Bryn Athyn, Pennsylvania.
- Averaged 17.9 points, 5.7 rebounds, 5.4 assists and 2.0 steals per game in 2021-22.
- Is ranked No. 18 by 247Sports and No. 28 by ESPN100.

UPCOMING - CHAMPIONS CLASSIC HISTORY

Beginning in 2011, the State Farm Champions Classic is a neutral site doubleheader series featuring men's basketball powers Kansas, Duke, Kentucky and Michigan State. The inaugural Champions Classic was held at Madison Square Garden in 2011 followed by the Georgia Dome in 2012 and the United Center in Chicago in 2013.

Kansas is 6-5 in the Champions Classic and the Jayhawks have won five of their last six appearances in the event after last year's 87-74 win against Michigan State in Madison Square Garden. Duke is 7-4 in the Champions Classic, while Kentucky is 5-6 and Michigan State 4-7.

In 2011, Kansas and Kentucky's Champions Classic meeting also became the matchup for the 2012 NCAA National Championship title game in New Orleans. The Wildcats defeated the Jayhawks, 75-65, in the Champions Classic.

In 2012, KU fell to Michigan State in Atlanta, 67-64. KU won its first game in the Classic with a 94-83 win against Duke in Chicago in 2013. In 2014, No. 1 Kentucky defeated Kansas 72-40 in Indianapolis. In 2015, Kansas lost to Michigan State, 79-73, in Chicago, and defeated Duke, 77-75, in Madison Square Garden in 2016.

In the 2016-17 season, Kansas defeated all the other three teams in the Champions Classic. KU defeated then-No. 1 Duke, 77-75, in the event and won at then-No. 4 Kentucky, Jan. 28, in the Big 12/ SEC Challenge. KU completed the feat with a 90-70 win versus Michigan State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Tulsa on March 19, 2017.

KU will face Kentucky in 2023.

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight titles from 2005-18, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won as many regular-season league titles (16) as he has home losses (16) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino).
- While at Kansas, he has coached 12 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 23 of the last 24 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 league crowns in the last 24 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 11 career 30-win seasons ranks third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12); and is No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Ten of his 11 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catharines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including nine times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-18-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).

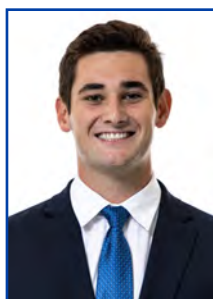
