TIPOFF

- Playing in its 12th State Farm Champions Classic, No. 6 Kansas (2-0) will face No. 7 Duke (2-0) on Tuesday, Nov. 15, at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Indianapolis. The contest will start at 8:30 p.m. (Central) and will be televised on ESPN with Dan Shulman, Jay Bilas and Holly Rowe calling the action.
- Kansas is 6-5 in the Champions Classic and the Jayhawks have won five of their last six appearances in the event. Duke is 7-4 in the Champions Classic, while Kentucky is 5-6 and Michigan State is 4-7.
- Last season, Kansas became the all-time winningest program in NCAA Division I, currently at 2,359 victories. The Champions Classic field has three of the top five all-time wins leaders with No. 1 Kansas, No. 2 Kentucky at 2,355 and No. 4 Duke at 2,248. Michigan State is No. 23 at 1,791.
- Duke leads the overall series with Kansas, 8-5, but the Jayhawks have won three of the last four meetings and are 2-1 versus the Blue Devils in the Champions Classic.
- Having won its final 11 games en route to the NCAA Championship, Kansas has the longest win streak in NCAA Division I at 13 games. Xavier (7) is next followed by Bellarmine (4). It is the 17th time in the Bill Self era KU has amassed a win streak of 10 or more games.
- Through two games, redshirt-junior Dajuan Harris Jr. leads the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio at 13.00. Harris, who led the Big 12 and was 14th nationally last year in the stat, has 13 assists and one turnover this season.
- KU returned two starters and seven letterwinners from last season's 34-6 team that finished tied for first in the Big 12 with a 14-4 record. KU advanced to its NCAA-record 32nd-consecutive NCAA Tournament, winning the national title, its sixth overall and fourth in NCAA history.
- Through two games, preseason All-America forward Jalen Wilson is averaging a double-double with 20.0 points and 10.0 rebounds per contest.
- Kansas is celebrating its 125th year of men's basketball in 2022-23.

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 5 Kansas (2-0) is coming off an 82-59 win against North Dakota State on Nov. 10. The Jayhawks are averaging 85.5 points per game and have a plus-24 scoring margin. KU leads the Big 12 with 44.5 rebounds per game and has a plus-14.5 rebound margin. KU also leads the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.56, which is 11th nationally. Kansas averages 8.0 steals and 5.5 blocked shots per contest.

All-America candidate Jalen Wilson is averaging a double-double with 20.0 points and 10.0 rebounds through two games. The redshirt-junior forward leads KU with six three-pointers made and is second on the team with eight assists. Freshman guard Grady Dick is next in scoring at 17.5 points per game, including 23 in his college debut against Omaha on Nov. 7. Dick has made five three-pointers and has three steals this season. Freshman guard MJ Rice missed the opening game due to injury but scored 10 points in his college debut against North Dakota State on Nov. 10. Senior Kevin McCullar (8.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg) leads KU with four steals and three blocked shots, while redshirt-junior guard Dajuan Harris Jr. (8.0 ppg, 3 steals) leads the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio at 13.00 (13 assists, one turnover). Other KU regulars include sophomore guard Bobby Pettiford (7.5 ppg, 10 assists), freshman forward Ernest Udeh Jr. (6.5 ppg, 4.5 rpg), junior guard Joseph Yesufu (5.0 ppg), sophomore forward KJ Adams Jr. (2 starts, 4.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg), freshman forward Zubey Ejiofor (1.5 ppg, 5.0 rpg) and sophomore forward Zach Clemence (11 minutes per game, 2.5 rpg).

Kansas returned two starters – Wilson and Harris – and seven letterwinners from last season's 34-6 season, in which it won its sixth national title and fourth in NCAA history. Wilson was named a unanimous Preseason All-Big 12 selection for the upcoming season, while McCullar, a transfer from Texas Tech, was an honorable mention honoree by the conference.

Including McCullar, Kansas added seven newcomers to the roster for 2022-23. Three were 2022 McDonald's All-Americans in guards Dick, Rice and Udeh.

Last season, KU tied Baylor for first place in the Big 12 regular season with a 14-4 record. It was KU's NCAA-record 63rd conference regular-season title and 20th in the 26-year history of the Big 12. The Jayhawks then won the Big 12 Tournament, advanced to its NCAA-record 32nd-consecutive NCAA Tournament, a streak that started in 1990, and its 16th Final Four. The Jayhawks won their last 11 games of the season en route to the NCAA title.

ABOUT DUKE

Located in Durham, North Carolina, with an enrollment of 6,789, No. 7 Duke is 2-0 on the season after its 84-38 win against USC Upstate on Nov. 11. The Blue Devils are coached by Jon Scheyer who is in his first season at his alma mater replacing the Hall of Fame legend Mike Krzyzewski.

Duke is averaging 77.5 points per game and has a plus-36.5 scoring margin. The Blue Devils pull down 48.0 rebounds per outing with a plus-22.0 rebound margin. Duke makes 8.5 three-pointers per contest and averages 17.5 assists, 10.5 steals and 5.0 blocked shots per game.

Freshman forward Mark Mitchell leads the team with a 15.5 scoring average. Mitchell pulls down 4.0 rebounds per contest. Junior guard Jeremy Roach leads Duke with six three-point field goals made and 11 assists. He scores 13.0 ppg. Freshman center Kyle Filipowski leads the team with an 11.0 rebound average to complement his 12.5 ppg. He has a team-high three blocked shots. Graduate center Ryan Young is second in rebounds at 7.5 rpg and averages 11.5 points per game. Freshman guard Tyrese Proctor (2.5 ppg, 4.0 rpg) rounds out the Duke starters. Other Duke regulars include graduate guard/forward Jacob Grandison (7.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg), sophomore guard Jaylen Blakes (7.0 ppg, 3 3FGS) and freshman center Dereck Lively II (4.0 ppg).

KANSAS-DUKE SERIES

Although it only started in 1985, Kansas and Duke have shared a high-stakes series. Duke leads, 8-5, but Kansas has won three of the last four meetings. The most recent battle was a 68-66 Duke win in the 2019 Champions Classic in New York City. The previous was an 85-81 overtime KU win in the 2018 Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament that propelled KU to its 15th Final Four.

Eleven of the 13 match-ups have been on neutral floors, while seven of the games have been NCAA Tournament battles, including three Final Fours and one NCAA title game.

The first meeting was the 1985 Preseason NIT championship game in Madison Square Garden, which Duke won 92-86. The same two teams met in Dallas in the Final Four semifinal later that season, a game which was the first-ever game between two 30-win teams. Duke won that contest, 71-67. In 1988, Duke traveled to Lawrence for a February non-conference game and came away with a 74-70 overtime win. Later that season the teams met again, this time in the Final Four semifinal, with Kansas defeating Duke, 66-59, at Kemper Arena in Kansas City, Missouri. The national title was on the line in the 1991 meeting, a Duke 72-65 win in Indianapolis. The Blue Devils ended the Jayhawks' season in the second round of the 2000 NCAA Tournament in Winston Salem, N.C., while KU returned the favor in the 2003 Sweet 16 in Anaheim, Calif., en route to its Final Four run. Duke won the 2011 Maui Invitational title meeting defeating KU, 68-61, in the championship game.

- Kansas improved to 2-0 for the 11th time in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas 2-0 is in Allen Fieldhouse this season and 832-116 all-time in the venue.
- Kansas is 2,359-877 all-time, the most wins in NCAA Division I.
- The Jayhawks never trailed taking a 3-0 lead at the 18:55 mark on a Grady Dick three-pointer.
- Kansas forced 14 turnovers and scored 22 points off those turnovers. KU has averaged 20 points off turnovers through two games.
- Kansas' 29-point lead at half is its largest halftime margin since leading Monmouth by 38 (59-21) on Nov. 15, 2019 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson finished with 21 points and nine rebounds, marking his eighth career 20-point game. He was two-points off his career-high.
- Sophomore Bobby Pettiford Jr. dished out eight assists setting a new career high.
- Making his collegiate debut at KU, freshman MJ Rice produced 10 points, four rebounds and two assists.
- Redshirt-freshman Dillion Wilhite played two minutes in his first action in his Jayhawk career.
- Redshirt-junior Dajuan Harris Jr. tallied his second and third blocked shots of the season. He now has 17 blocks for his career.
- Harris had five assists and no turnovers and has 13 dimes with one turnover for the season.

STATE FARM CHAMPIONS CLASSIC HISTORY

Beginning in 2011, the State Farm Champions Classic is a neutral site doubleheader series featuring men's basketball powers Kansas, Duke, Kentucky and Michigan State. The inaugural Champions Classic was held at Madison Square Garden in 2011 followed by the Georgia Dome in 2012 and the United Center in Chicago in 2013.

Kansas is 6-5 in the Champions Classic and the Jayhawks have won five of their last six appearances in the event after last year's 87-74 win against Michigan State in Madison Square Garden. Duke is 7-4 in the Champions Classic, while Kentucky is 5-6 and Michigan State 4-7.

In 2011, Kansas and Kentucky's Champions Classic meeting also became the matchup for the 2012 NCAA National Championship title game in New Orleans. The Wildcats defeated the Jayhawks, 75-65, in the Champions Classic.

In 2012, KU fell to Michigan State in Atlanta, 67-64. KU won its first game in the Classic with a 94-83 win against Duke in Chicago in 2013. In 2014, No. 1 Kentucky defeated Kansas 72-40 in Indianapolis. In 2015, Kansas lost to Michigan State, 79-73, in Chicago, and defeated Duke, 77-75, in Madison Square Garden in 2016.

In the 2016-17 season, Kansas defeated all the other three teams in the Champions Classic. KU defeated then-No. 1 Duke, 77-75, in the event and won at then-No. 4 Kentucky, Jan. 28, in the Big 12/SEC Challenge. KU completed the feat with a 90-70 win versus Michigan State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Tulsa on March 19, 2017.

KU will face Kentucky in 2023.

KANSAS IN PRESEASON NATIONAL POLLS

For the 11th-consecutive year, Kansas entered the 2022-23 season ranked seventh or higher as KU was tied for No. 5 in the 2022-23 preseason Associated Press poll released Oct. 17. The Jayhawks are currently No. 6 in the AP poll.

This is also the 13th time in the last 14 seasons that the Jayhawks have entered the season No. 7 or higher by the AP, including nine times in the top five and five in the top three. KU was No. 1 in 2009-10, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 1 in 2018-19, No. 3 in 2019-20 and No. 3 in 2021-22.

Last season, Kansas entered the preseason ranked No. 3 nationally in the Associated Press poll and finished the year at No. 3. The Jayhawks were ranked in the AP top 10 during the entire 2021-22 season.

Under 20th-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 17th time that Kansas entered the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 5 ranking marks the 25th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Like it was in the preseason Associated Press poll, Kansas is ranked No. 5 in the preseason USA TODAY Coaches' Poll released Oct. 26 and remain No. 5 in the Nov. 14 poll.

This was the ninth-straight year the Jayhawks have opened the season in the top-five and KU is ranked in the preseason for the 31st time in the 34-year history of the poll. With the preseason ranking, Kansas has 594 all-time appearances in the poll, including 316 in the top five.

The No. 5 ranking marked the ninth-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 17th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 11 seasons.

In 2021-22 Kansas opened the year No. 3 in the preseason coaches' poll and ended No. 1 for the third time ever - 2008, 2020 and 2022.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson and redshirt-senior Kevin McCullar were named to the 2022-23 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches. Wilson was a unanimous selection, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

A starter on the Kansas 2022 NCAA National Championship team, Wilson is KU's leading returning scorer and rebounder from last season, when he averaged 11.1 points and 7.4 rebounds per game. The Denton, Texas, forward has been listed on many preseason All-America teams in 2022-23, and was an All-Big 12 Third Team selection last season. Wilson is a two-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree and was on the Julius Erving Award Watch List last season, when he posted seven double-doubles and led KU in rebounding 16 times and in scoring in seven contests.

McCullar, a transfer from Texas Tech, was a national semifinalist for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year in 2021-22. The guard from San Antonio, Texas, averaged 10.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and a team-leading 3.1 assists and 1.4 steals per game last season. A three-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree, McCullar was a two-year starter at Texas Tech and an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection last year.

Historically, Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 first team in all but two of the 27 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Wilson marks the 38th Jayhawk to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

KU PICKED SECOND IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 COACHES' POLL

Kansas was voted second by the league's head coaches in the 2022-23 Big 12 men's basketball preseason poll.

Kansas' second-place finish in the poll marks just the sixth time the Jayhawks were not the coaches' top selection in the 27-year history of the conference. At season's end, KU has outright or tied the conference regular-season championship 20 times, including an NCAA-record 14 consecutive from 2005-18. A coaches' preseason poll was not conducted in the Big 12's first season of 1996-97.

For the 2022-23 poll, the Jayhawks collected four first-place votes and finished with a total of 73 points. Baylor received five first-place nods and is the preseason favorite with 77 points. Texas, with one first-place vote, was third with 64 points, while TCU was fourth with 58 points. Oklahoma State and Texas Tech tied for fifth with 42 points, followed No. 7 Oklahoma (32), No. 8 Iowa State (30), No. 9 West Virginia (20) and No. 10 Kansas State (12). Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

WILSON & MCCULLAR ON THE PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson was one of 20 players named to the 2023 NABC Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced Nov. 3. The 2023 NABC Division I Player of the Year - selected by a vote of Division I head coaches - will be announced the week of the 2023 Men's Final Four in Houston.

On Nov. 6, Wilson was named *The Sporting News* Preseason All-America Second Team. On Nov. 7, Wilson was named to the Naismith Trophy Preseason Player of the Year Watch List, along with reshirt-senior Kevin McCullar.

TWO JAYHAWKS ARE ON STARTING FIVE WATCH LISTS

In October, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced watch lists for its "Starting Five" for the 2022-23 season. Two Jayhawks were among the 20 watch list honorees.

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson is on the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award for the second straight season, while senior Kevin McCullar is on the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates for every starting five.

College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for each honor will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to five. In March, the Hall of Fame's selection committee will determine the winners.

WIGGINS WINS NBA TITLE

Former Kansas guard Andrew Wiggins became the 14th Jayhawk to win an NBA title when the Golden State Warriors defeated the Boston Celtics in the 2022 NBA Finals, 4-2. Wiggins, who played at KU in 2013-14 and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft.

There have been 14 Jayhawks who have won 19 NBA titles during their professional careers. Before Wiggins, Markieff Morris was the most recent to win a title after doing so in 2020 with the Los Angeles Lakers. Wiggins becomes the fifth Jayhawk under current KU head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien, Mario Chalmers, who won two titles, Brandon Rush, Sasha Kaun and Morris.

Nov. 15, 1989: Kansas opened up its second season under Roy Williams with a 109-83 victory over UAB in the first game of the Preseason NIT in Allen Fieldhouse. Senior Kevin Pritchard and junior Mike Maddox scored 22 and 21 points, respectively, in a game where the Jayhawks never trailed. Kansas went on to win the Preseason NIT by defeating St. John's in Madison Square Garden, 66-57. The Jayhawks finished the 1989-90 season with a 30-5 overall record, including an 11-3 mark in Big Eight play. Despite being unranked at the beginning of the season, the Jayhawks finished the year No. 5 in all three national polls.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

Kansas played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season. KU went 8-4 versus ranked foes last season. In 2020-21, Kansas went 8-7 against AP ranked foes. Eight of the last nine and 15 of Kansas' last 17 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. Under Bill Self, KU is 118-63 against AP-ranked opponents. In his 19 seasons, Self's KU teams have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 16 of those seasons, including 2021-22.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 21-11 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 18-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 9-1 versus top-five opponents.

WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 19 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 15 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the conference is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 10 times in Bill Self's 18 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule five times, including 2019-20.

- Kansas has 2,359 all-time victories which is the most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Over the last 19 seasons, Kansas has as many regular-season conference championships (16) as it has losses at Allen Fieldhouse (16).
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 650 of its last 653 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Gonzaga (102-90) on 11.26.2020 with the previous being Oklahoma (100-78) on 2.27.1990.
- Kansas set the NCAA DI record for being ranked in the Associated Press poll at 231 consecutive weeks from Feb. 2, 2009 until Feb. 1, 2021. KU's stretch consisted of 433 games of being ranked.
- The Jayhawks have won 24 of their last 32 regular-season games against AP top-10 teams. Under Bill Self, KU is 44-24 against top-10 opponents, a figure that includes postseason play.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 22-straight years, which is the longest active streak in the nation. This includes 2021-22.
- Each four-year KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. The current KU four-year players - senior Michael Jankovich and redshirt juniors Dajuan Harris and Jalen Wilson - have won 85 contests.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every conference foe.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 357-81 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 256-175. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is top at 404-94, while Texas is second at 282-197.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 152-10 (93.8%) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 7-2 in 2018, 9-0 in 2019, 8-1 in 2020, 8-1 in 2020-21 and 9-0 in 2021-22.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has experienced only two regular-season conference sweeps by a Big 12 opponent. In 135 regular-season Big 12 home-and-home series during the Self era, Kansas has 88 sweeps, 45 splits and has been swept twice (by Oklahoma State in 2018 and Texas in 2021).

MORE KANSAS NOTABLES

- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse last season. KU has won 10 or more home games for 39 consecutive seasons, beginning in 1983-84. Entering 2022-23, KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for the last 23 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- Kansas has won a mind-boggling 50-straight home openers (beginning in 1973-74 under coach Ted Owens), 31-consecutive conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams) and 39-straight Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets. He is the fourth KU graduate to coach at the highest level - John McClendon (ABA, 1969-70 at Denver); Wilt Chamberlain (ABA, 1973-74 at San Diego); Kevin Pritchard (NBA, 2005 at Portland, 27 games); Jacque Vaughn (NBA, 2012-15 at Orlando, 2022-present at Brooklyn).
- KU legends Wilt Chamberlain and Paul Pierce were named to the NBA 75 Team, announced at the 2022 All-Star Game.
- In the spring 2021 semester, the men's basketball program set a new program high with a 3.56 GPA which came on the heels of Bill Self's squad establishing a new program record of 3.44 in fall of 2020.
- Kansas men's basketball great Paul Pierce became the 21st Jayhawk to be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in September 2021. Pierce was also one of eight individuals inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2021 on Nov. 21. The College Basketball Hall of Fame opened in 2006 with 11 KU-related players and coaches being part of the founding class. Pierce joins Danny Manning (2008) and Clyde Lovellette (2012) as formally being inducted from Kansas and former KU coach Roy Williams will be inducted in November 2022.

KU SIGNS THREE IN NOVEMBER

Three guards - Elmarko Jackson (Marlton, New Jersey), Chris Johnson (Fort Bend, Texas) and Jamari McDowell (Manvel, Texas) - have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball at Kansas, KU head coach Bill Self announced Nov. 9. The three will be freshmen at KU for the 2023-24 season. The Kansas class ranks 10th nationally according to 247sports.com.

ELMARKO JACKSON, G, 6-3, 185, MARLTON, NEW JERSEY (SOUTH KENT SCHOOL [CONN.])

- Playing his final prep season at South Kent School in Connecticut.
- A combo guard who is known for his leadership skills and explosiveness, Jackson is a strong combo guard.
- Has good size, speed, terrific play-making ability and is a tough defender.
- Began his prep career at St. Augustine Prep in Richland, New Jersey. He then transferred to Academy of the New Church in Bryn Athyn, Pennsylvania. He earned all-state and all-league honors in 2021-22 at Academy of the New Church in Bryn Athyn, Pennsylvania.
- Averaged 17.9 points, 5.7 rebounds, 5.4 assists and 2.0 steals per game in 2021-22.
- Is ranked No. 18 by 247Sports and No. 28 by ESPN100.

CHRIS JOHNSON, G, 6-4, 180, FORT BEND, TEXAS (MONTVERDE ACADEMY [FLA.])

- An explosive scorer who has deep range.
- Is physical, plays with an edge, and can score a variety of ways, and is a solid defender.
- Johnson transferred to Montverde Academy in Florida for his senior season after earning All-Greater Houston honors at Elkin High School in Texas.
- Averaged 19.5 points, 5.0 assists and 4.7 rebounds for Elkin in 2021-22, where the team went 30-6.
- Played AAU basketball for the Houston Defenders along with fellow signee Jamari McDowell.
- Is ranked No. 24 by ESPN100.

JAMARI MCDOWELL, G, 6-4, 180, MANVEL, TEXAS (MANVEL HIGH SCHOOL)

- Plays at Manvel High School in Manvel, Texas, a suburb of Houston.
- Can play all three perimeter positions.
- Has size and versatility on the perimeter, is athletic with a high motor.
- Media outlets wrote McDowell will remind KU fans of Christian Braun and Ochai Agbaji from the 2022 NCAA National Championship team.
- Last season Manvel posted a 19-5 record and McDowell averaged 21.7 points, 7.2 rebounds, 5.1 assists and 4.5 steals per game.
- Played AAU basketball for the Houston Defenders along with fellow signee Chris Johnson.
- Is ranked No. 42 by 247Sports. He chose Kansas over Texas A&M, Xavier and Wake Forest among others.

NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight titles from 2005-18, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won as many regular-season league titles (16) as he has home losses (16) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino).
- While at Kansas, he has coached 12 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 23 of the last 24 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 league crowns in the last 24 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 11 career 30-win seasons ranks third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12); and is No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Ten of his 11 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherine's, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including nine times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-18-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).

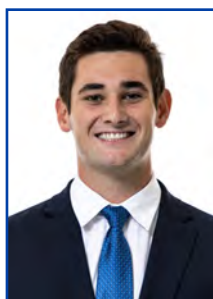

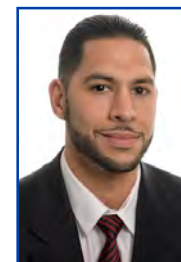
