TIPOFF

- Coming off a 69-64 win against No. 6 Duke in the Champions Classic, Kansas (3-0) will host Southern Utah (3-1) on Friday, Nov. 18, at 7 p.m. in Allen Fieldhouse. The contest will be televised on Big 12 NOW via ESPN+ with Dave Armstrong, Nick Bahe and Kennetra Pulliams making the call.
- With the win versus Duke, Kansas won its 14th-consecutive game dating back to last year's NCAA National Championship run. The 14-straight wins ties for the seventh longest winning streak in the Bill Self era at Kansas, which began in 2003-04.
- Kansas is 1-0 against Associated Press Top-10 teams this season and 25-11 versus those top-10 foes over the last 10 years, beginning in 2013-14. In the Bill Self era, KU is 46-26 against top-10 teams.
- Also, the win against Duke made Kansas 7-5 in the Champions Classic which ties Duke for the most wins in the event. Michigan State and Kentucky are both 5-7 in the Champions Classic.
- Last season, Kansas became the all-time winningest program in NCAA Division I, currently at 2,360 victories.
- Kansas and Southern Utah will be meeting for the first time in men's basketball. Kansas is 8-0 all-time versus current membership of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). KU played two WAC teams last season - Tarleton State and Stephen F. Austin.
- Kansas leads the Big 12 and ranks eighth nationally in blocked shots at 8.0 per game.
- Through two games, redshirt-junior Dajuan Harris Jr. leads the Big 12 and is third nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio at 11.50. Harris had a career-high 10 assists versus Duke with one turnover and has 23 dimes and two turnovers for the season. His 7.7 assists per game are seventh nationally.
- Redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson leads the conference in points (21.7), rebounds (8.0) and double-doubles (2).
- Kansas is celebrating its 125th year of men's basketball in 2022-23.

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 6 Kansas (3-0) is coming off an 69-64 against No. 7 Duke in the State Farm Champions Classic at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Indianapolis on Nov. 15. The win was KU's 14th-consecutive dating back to last season. The Jayhawks are averaging 80.0 points per game and have a plus-17.7 scoring margin. Kansas pulls down 41.3 rebounds per contest with a plus-6.0 rebounding margin. KU leads the Big 12 with 8.0 blocked shots per game. The Jayhawks are second in the league in assists per game at 22.3 and in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.03. They also average 7.0 steals per outing.

All-America candidate Jalen Wilson, a redshirt-junior, leads the Big 12 in scoring at 21.7 ppg, which includes a career-high 25 points in the win versus Dule (11/25), rebounding (10.3 rpg) and double-doubles with two. Freshman Grady Dick is next in scoring at 16.3 points per game, which is fifth in the Big 12. Dick is shooting 57.1 percent from the field, including 42.9 percent from beyond the arc. Wilson and Dick lead KU with six three-pointers made this season. Redshirt-senior guard Kevin McCullar Jr. has a team-high five steals and averages 9.3 points and 5.3 rebounds per contest. Redshirt-junior Dajuan Harris Jr. leads the Big 12 and is third nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio at 11.50. He had a career-high 10 dimes against Duke and leads the league and is seventh nationally in assists per game at 7.7. Sophomore KJ Adams (5.3 ppg, 4.3 rpg) rounds out the Kansas starters.

Other KU regulars include sophomore guard Bobby Pettiford Jr. (5.7 ppg, 12 assists), freshman forward Ernest Udeh Jr. (4.3 ppg, 3.3 rpg) and freshman forward Zubey Ejiofor (1.7 ppg, 5.0 rpg).

ABOUT SOUTHERN UTAH

Located in Cedar City, Utah, Southern Utah is 3-1 on the season and brings a three-game winning streak to Lawrence. The Thunderbirds are coached by Todd Simon who is in his seventh season at Southern Utah with a 99-95 record and his eighth season overall with a 108-103 mark. Southern Utah lost at New Mexico, 89-81, on Nov. 7, but have defeated La Verne (117-55), St. Katherine (91-48) and Bethesda (126-67) in their last three games. The Thunderbirds average 103.8 points per game, which is fourth nationally, with a plus-39.0 scoring margin. SUU pulls down 46.3 rebounds per outing with a plus-12.3 rebound margin. SUU also averages 21.3 assists, 13.3 steals and 2.5 blocked shots per game.

Senior guard Tevian Jones leads the way for SUU with 18.0 points per game, while sophomore center Jason Spurgin (10.5), senior forward Maizen Fausett (10.3), senior guard Harrison Butler (10.0) and graduate guard Cameron Healy (10.0) also have cleared 10 points per game. Fausett (6.8) and Spurgin (5.3) are SUU's top two rebounders on the team. Sophomore guard Drake Allen (8.0 ppg) leads the Thunderbirds in assists at 4.3 per game.

Be Kansas' 10-straight win in Allen Fieldhouse and make KU 3-0 in AFH this season, 835-116 all-time in the venue, including 295-16 in the Bill Self era ... Make Kansas 2,361-877 all-time.

A KANSAS LOSS WOULD...

Make Kansas 3-1 for the first time since also going 3-1 in 2020-21 ... Make the KU-Southern Utah series 1-0 in favor of the Thunderbirds ... Be Kansas' first loss against current WAC membership making that series 8-1 in favor of KU ... End a Kansas nine-game winning streak in Allen Fieldhouse ... Make KU 2-1 in Allen Fieldhouse this season, 832-117 all-time in the venue, including 294-17 in the Bill Self era ... Make Kansas 2,360-878 all-time.

DUKE LEFTOVERS

- Kansas improved to 3-0 for the 11th time in head coach Bill Self's 20 seasons at KU.
- Kansas is now 7-5 in the State Farm Champions Classic, including 3-1 vs. Duke. The 7-5 ties Duke for the most wins in the event.
- Kansas improved to 46-26 against Associated Press top-10 teams in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas finished the game on a 15-5 run.
- Kansas posted a season-high 13 blocks. The 13 blocks were the most in a game since Jan. 5, 2014 vs. #21 San Diego State (13).
- Kansas grabbed 12 offensive rebounds. The Jayhawks have at least 10 offensive rebounds in each of the first three games of the season for the first time since the start of the 2019 season.
- In the first half, Kansas assisted on 11 of 15 made field goals. KU finished the game with 21 assists on 31 made baskets.
- Kansas scored a season-high-tying 48 points in the paint, matching the total scored in the season opener against Omaha (Nov. 7).
- Redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson recorded his second double-double of the season (18th career) with a career-high 25 points, a season-high-tying 11 rebounds. Wilson is the first Jayhawk ever with multiple double-doubles in the Champions Classic (Dec. 1, 2020 vs. Kentucky - 23 PTS, 10 REB). Other Jayhawks with double-doubles in the Champions Classic were Dedric Lawson (2018 - 20 PTS, 14 REB) and Thomas Robinson (2011 - 11 PTS, 12 REB).
- Redshirt-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. finished with 12 points, six rebounds, two assists and two blocks.
- Freshman Grady Dick scored 14 points on 6-of-11 (54.5 percent). Dick scored seven points in the final 2:22 of the game.
- Redshirt-junior Dajuan Harris Jr. dished out a career-high 10 assists to go along with six points and four rebounds. He is the first Jayhawk with double-digit assists in a game since Devon Dotson on February 8, 2020 at TCU (11).
- Freshman Ernest Udeh Jr. had a career-high four blocks in 13 minutes off the bench.

WINNING STREAKS IN THE BILL SELF ERA

Kansas won its last 11 games of the 2021-22 season en route to its sixth all-time, fourth NCAA, national championship. At 3-0, Kansas' 14-game winning streak ranks tied for seventh longest in the Bill Self era. It marks the 17th time in the Self era KU has won 10-straight contests.

WILSON LOOKING TO JOIN ELITE KANSAS COMPANY

Redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson leads the Big 12 in scoring at 21.7 points per game, which included a career-high 25 points in KU's 69-64 win against No. 7 Duke on Nov. 15. Sure, it's early in the season but Wilson is vying to become the third Jayhawk in the Bill Self era to average 20-plus points per game and the seventh KU player to lead the Big 12 in scoring.

KANSAS IN PRESEASON NATIONAL POLLS

For the 11th-consecutive year, Kansas entered the 2022-23 season ranked seventh or higher as KU was tied for No. 5 in the 2022-23 preseason Associated Press poll released Oct. 17. The Jayhawks are currently No. 6 in the AP poll.

This is also the 13th time in the last 14 seasons that the Jayhawks have entered the season No. 7 or higher by the AP, including nine times in the top five and five in the top three. KU was No. 1 in 2009-10, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 1 in 2018-19, No. 3 in 2019-20 and No. 3 in 2021-22.

Last season, Kansas entered the preseason ranked No. 3 nationally in the Associated Press poll and finished the year at No. 3. The Jayhawks were ranked in the AP top 10 during the entire 2021-22 season.

Under 20th-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 17th time that Kansas entered the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 5 ranking marks the 25th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Like it was in the preseason Associated Press poll, Kansas is ranked No. 5 in the preseason USA TODAY Coaches' Poll released Oct. 26 and remain No. 5 in the Nov. 14 poll.

This was the ninth-straight year the Jayhawks have opened the season in the top-five and KU is ranked in the preseason for the 31st time in the 34-year history of the poll. With the preseason ranking, Kansas has 594 all-time appearances in the poll, including 316 in the top five.

The No. 5 ranking marked the ninth-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 17th time in the Bill Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 11 seasons.

In 2021-22 Kansas opened the year No. 3 in the preseason coaches' poll and ended No. 1 for the third time ever - 2008, 2020 and 2022.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson and redshirt-senior Kevin McCullar were named to the 2022-23 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches. Wilson was a unanimous selection, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

A starter on the Kansas 2022 NCAA National Championship team, Wilson is KU's leading returning scorer and rebounder from last season, when he averaged 11.1 points and 7.4 rebounds per game. The Denton, Texas, forward has been listed on many preseason All-America teams in 2022-23, and was an All-Big 12 Third Team selection last season. Wilson is a two-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree and was on the Julius Erving Award Watch List last season, when he posted seven double-doubles and led KU in rebounding 16 times and in scoring in seven contests.

McCullar, a transfer from Texas Tech, was a national semifinalist for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year in 2021-22. The guard from San Antonio, Texas, averaged 10.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and a team-leading 3.1 assists and 1.4 steals per game last season. A three-time Academic All-Big 12 honoree, McCullar was a two-year starter at Texas Tech and an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection last year.

Historically, Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 first team in all but two of the 27 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Wilson marks the 38th Jayhawk to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

KU PICKED SECOND IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 COACHES' POLL

Kansas was voted second by the league's head coaches in the 2022-23 Big 12 men's basketball preseason poll.

Kansas' second-place finish in the poll marks just the sixth time the Jayhawks were not the coaches' top selection in the 27-year history of the conference. At season's end, KU has outright or tied the conference regular-season championship 20 times, including an NCAA-record 14 consecutive from 2005-18. A coaches' preseason poll was not conducted in the Big 12's first season of 1996-97.

For the 2022-23 poll, the Jayhawks collected four first-place votes and finished with a total of 73 points. Baylor received five first-place nods and is the preseason favorite with 77 points. Texas, with one first-place vote, was third with 64 points, while TCU was fourth with 58 points. Oklahoma State and Texas Tech tied for fifth with 42 points, followed No. 7 Oklahoma (32), No. 8 Iowa State (30), No. 9 West Virginia (20) and No. 10 Kansas State (12). Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

WILSON & MCCULLAR ON THE PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson was one of 20 players named to the 2023 NABC Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced Nov. 3. The 2023 NABC Division I Player of the Year – selected by a vote of Division I head coaches – will be announced the week of the 2023 Men's Final Four in Houston.

On Nov. 6, Wilson was named *The Sporting News* Preseason All-America Second Team. On Nov. 7, Wilson was named to the Naismith Trophy Preseason Player of the Year Watch List, along with reshirt-senior Kevin McCullar.

On Nov. 15, Wilson and McCullar were named to the 2023 John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List. KU is one of nine schools with multiple players on the 50-member list. The Kansas pair is vying to become the third recipients of the John R. Wooden Award, joining Danny Manning in 1988 and Frank Mason III in 2017.

TWO JAYHAWKS ARE ON STARTING FIVE WATCH LISTS

In October, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced watch lists for its “Starting Five” for the 2022-23 season. Two Jayhawks were among the 20 watch list honorees.

Kansas redshirt-junior Jalen Wilson is on the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award for the second straight season, while senior Kevin McCullar is on the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates for every starting five.

College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for each honor will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to five. In March, the Hall of Fame's selection committee will determine the winners.

WIGGINS WINS NBA TITLE

Former Kansas guard Andrew Wiggins became the 14th Jayhawk to win an NBA title when the Golden State Warriors defeated the Boston Celtics in the 2022 NBA Finals, 4-2. Wiggins, who played at KU in 2013-14 and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft.

There have been 14 Jayhawks who have won 19 NBA titles during their professional careers. Before Wiggins, Markieff Morris was the most recent to win a title after doing so in 2020 with the Los Angeles Lakers. Wiggins becomes the fifth Jayhawk under current KU head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien, Mario Chalmers, who won two titles, Brandon Rush, Sasha Kaun and Morris.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

Kansas' win against No. 7 Duke made the Jayhawks 1-0 versus top-10 foes this season. KU played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season and went 8-4 versus those teams. In 2020-21, Kansas went 8-7 against AP ranked foes. Eight of the last nine and 15 of Kansas' last 17 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. In the Bill Self era, KU is 119-63 against AP-ranked opponents. In that span, Self's KU teams have collected four wins or more over top-25 ranked foes in 16 of those seasons, including 2021-22.

Nov. 18, 2005: Kansas opened up its 2005-06 campaign with a 90-66 victory over Idaho State. Sophomore Sasha Kaun scored 25 points and grabbed 16 rebounds, both career bests. In their first collegiate game, freshmen Mario Chalmers, Brandon Rush and Julian Wright combined to score 36 points. Chalmers collected three assists and four steals, and went 7-7 from the free throw line, while Rush managed to pull down seven rebounds. The Jayhawks' defense forced 24 turnovers from Idaho State and held them to just 33 percent shooting from the field.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 22-11 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, the Jayhawks are 18-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 9-1 versus top-five opponents.

WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 19 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 15 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the conference is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 10 times in Bill Self's 18 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule five times, including 2019-20.

MORE KANSAS NOTABLES

- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse last season. KU has won 10 or more home games for 39 consecutive seasons, beginning in 1983-84. Entering 2022-23, KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for the last 23 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- Kansas has won a mind-boggling 50-straight home openers (beginning in 1973-74 under coach Ted Owens), 31-consecutive conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams) and 39-straight Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets. He is the fourth KU graduate to coach at the highest level - John McClendon (ABA, 1969-70 at Denver); Wilt Chamberlain (ABA, 1973-74 at San Diego); Kevin Pritchard (NBA, 2005 at Portland, 27 games); Jacque Vaughn (NBA, 2012-15 at Orlando, 2022-present at Brooklyn).
- KU legends Wilt Chamberlain and Paul Pierce were named to the NBA 75 Team, announced at the 2022 All-Star Game.
- In the spring 2021 semester, the men's basketball program set a new program high with a 3.56 GPA which came on the heels of Bill Self's squad establishing a new program record of 3.44 in fall of 2020.
- Kansas men's basketball great Paul Pierce became the 21st Jayhawk to be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in September 2021. Pierce was also one of eight individuals inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2021 on Nov. 21. The College Basketball Hall of Fame opened in 2006 with 11 KU-related players and coaches being part of the founding class. Pierce joins Danny Manning (2008) and Clyde Lovellette (2012) as formally being inducted from Kansas and former KU coach Roy Williams will be inducted in November 2022.

- Kansas has 2,360 all-time victories which is the most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Over the last 19 seasons, Kansas has as many regular-season conference championships (16) as it has losses at Allen Fieldhouse (16).
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 651 of its last 654 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Gonzaga (102-90) on 11.26.2020 with the previous being Oklahoma (100-78) on 2.27.1990.
- Kansas set the NCAA DI record for being ranked in the Associated Press poll at 231 consecutive weeks from Feb. 2, 2009 until Feb. 1, 2021. KU's stretch consisted of 433 games of being ranked.
- The Jayhawks have won 25 of their last 33 regular-season games against AP top-10 teams. Under Bill Self, KU is 45-24 against top-10 opponents, a figure that includes postseason play.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 22-straight years, which is the longest active streak in the nation. This includes 2021-22.
- Each four-year KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. The current KU four-year players - senior Michael Jankovich and redshirt juniors Dajuan Harris and Jalen Wilson - have won 86 contests.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every conference foe.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 357-81 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 256-175. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is top at 404-94, while Texas is second at 282-197.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 152-10 (93.8%) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 7-2 in 2018, 9-0 in 2019, 8-1 in 2020, 8-1 in 2020-21 and 9-0 in 2021-22.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has experienced only two regular-season conference sweeps by a Big 12 opponent. In 135 regular-season Big 12 home-and-home series during the Self era, Kansas has 88 sweeps, 45 splits and has been swept twice (by Oklahoma State in 2018 and Texas in 2021).

The three will be freshmen at KU for the 2023-24 season. The Kansas class ranks 10th nationally according to 247sports.com.

ELMARKO JACKSON, G, 6-3, 185, MARLTON, NEW JERSEY (SOUTH KENT SCHOOL [CONN.])

- Playing his final prep season at South Kent School in Connecticut.
- A combo guard who is known for his leadership skills and explosiveness, Jackson is a strong combo guard.
- Has good size, speed, terrific play-making ability and is a tough defender.

NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight titles from 2005-18, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won as many regular-season league titles (16) as he has home losses (16) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino).
- While at Kansas, he has coached 12 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 23 of the last 24 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 league crowns in the last 24 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 11 career 30-win seasons ranks third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12); and is No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Ten of his 11 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherine's, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including nine times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-18-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
