- No. 25 Kansas (2-1) will conclude its two-game homestand when it plays host to Princeton (2-1) on Saturday, Nov. 15. The contest will tip from historic Allen Fieldhouse at 1 p.m. (Central) and be broadcast on ESPN+ with Steven Davis and Nick Bahe calling the action.
- Kansas holds a 2-0 all-time series lead on Princeton with the last meeting on Dec. 12, 2001, a KU 78-62 win at Princeton.
- Kansas is coming off a 77-46 win against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Nov. 11. The Jayhawks are 2-1 or better for the 22nd time in Bill Self's 23 seasons at KU. Princeton is 2-1 on the season after its home win, 100-59, against John Jay. The Tigers have won the Ivy League three of the last four seasons.
- Kansas has won 22-straight non-conference games at in Allen Fieldhouse beginning on Nov. 7, 2022. Kansas is 161-6 (96.4%) against non-conference opponents inside Allen Fieldhouse under Bill Self.
- With the win against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Kansas is 133-24 (84.7%) following a loss in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas leads the Big 12 and is eighth nationally in blocked shots per game at 7.7. Sophomore Flory Bidunga's 2.3 blocked shots per game are second in the conference and 42nd nationally.
- Kansas head coach Bill Self is 611-157 in his 23rd season at KU. Last season, Self became Kansas' all-time winningest coach, surpassing Phog Allen, who was 590-129 in 36 seasons on the KU sidelines. Self is in his 33rd season overall with an 818-262 record. He is one of only four active coaches with 800 or career wins - Rick Barnes, John Calipari, and Kelvin Sampson.

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 25 Kansas (2-1) is coming off a 77-46 win against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Nov. 11. The victory marked the 22nd time KU is 2-1 or better in the 23 seasons under Bill Self. Through three games, Kansas is averaging 81.7 points per game and has a plus-20.3 scoring margin. The Jayhawks pull down 38.3 rebounds per contest with a plus-8.0 rebound margin. KU averages 17.3 assists and 6.3 steals per contest. KU leads the Big 12 and is eighth nationally with 7.7 blocked shots per game. The Jayhawks are third in the Big 12 in three point field goals made per game at 10.0 and fourth in the conference in three-point field goal percentage at 40.0%.

Freshman guard Darryn Peterson leads Kansas with a 21.5 points per game average. He is the first KU freshman to score 20 or more points in back-to-back games since 2022 All-America Ochai Agbaji did during the 2018-19 season. Peterson is tied for the KU lead with six threes made and he leads the team with four steals. Sophomore center Flory Bidunga is next in scoring at 14.3 points per game, which includes a career-high 23 points in the season opener versus Green Bay (11/3). Bidunga leads KU with a 7.0 rebounds per game average and seven blocked shots. Senior guard Tre White and redshirt freshman forward Bryson Tiller are averaging 10.0 points per contest. White has three steals on the season, while Tiller made all four of his threes at North Carolina (11/7) in scoring a season high 12 points. Tiller has a 75.0 three-point percentage as he is 6-for-8 from beyond the arc. Freshman guard Kohl Rosario (9.7 ppg) has started all three games and is coming off a season high 16 points against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (11/11). Senior guard Melvin Council Jr. is averaging 6.7 points per game and he leads KU with 17 assists. Other KU regulars include graduate guard Gee Ngala (5.5 ppg, 3-4 3FGs), senior guard Jayden Dawson (5.0 ppg, three threes), redshirt-sophomore guard Elmarko Jackson (one start, 3.3 ppg), and redshirt-sophomore guard Jamari McDowell (2.0 ppg).

ABOUT PRINCETON

Located in Princeton, New Jersey, Princeton (2-1) brings a two-game winning streak to Allen Fieldhouse after its 100-59 win against John Jay on Nov. 13. The Tigers are coached by Mitch Henderson who is 253-133 in his 15th season at Princeton. Three of Princeton's four Ivy titles under Henderson have some in the last four seasons - 2022, 2023, and 2024. Princeton finished fourth last season.

Junior guard Dalen Davis leads Princeton in scoring at 16.3 points per game. He also leads the team with 10 assists and is tied for the team lead with six threes made through three games. Junior forward Jackson Hicke is next in scoring at 10.7 points per contest and he has made five threes. Sophomore forward CJ Happy (9.0 ppg) leads the team with three blocked shots and three steals. Sophomore forward Malik Abdullahi (8.0 ppg) leads the team with 5.3 rebounds per outing. Sophomore guard Jack Stanton (7.3 ppg) is next in rebounding at 5.0 per game, leads Princeton. He too has made six threes this season. Junior forward Jacob Huggins is a regular who scores 7.0 points per game. Other Princeton regulars include freshman guard Sebastian Whitfield (5.0 ppg), freshman forward Jacob Hammond (4.0 ppg), and freshman guard Landon Clark (2.7 ppg).

THE KANSAS-PRINCETON SERIES

Kansas is 2-0 all-time against Princeton. The Jayhawks defeated the Tigers, 82-67, on Dec. 22, 1999, in Lawrence and 78-62 on Dec. 12, 2001, in Princeton, New Jersey. Kansas' 2001-02 is the only team in Big 12 history to go undefeated in league play at 16-0. The 2002 Jayhawks advances in the 2002 Final Four in Atlanta.

TSN is one of four outlets which make up Consensus All-America, along with Associated Press, USBWA and NABC. Peterson is on the USBWA and NABC national player of the year watch lists.

PETERSON NAMED ON INAUGURAL BIG 12 STARTING FIVE

Darryn Peterson Kansas freshman Darryn Peterson was named to the inaugural Big 12 Men's Basketball Starting Five, the league announced Nov. 10.

The Big 12 Men's Basketball Starting Five is voted on by a media panel that votes on weekly honors that include the player and newcomer of the week. The five honored highlight additional strong performances from across the conference.

Last week, Peterson finished with 22 points at No. 25 North Carolina Friday after scoring 21 in the opener versus Green Bay on Nov. 3. The Canton, Ohio, guard is the first KU freshman to have back-to-back 20-point games since Ochai Agbaji (2/9/19 and 2/11/19). He's also the first KU player, regardless of class, to open the season with back-to-back 20-efforts since Agbaji did it in the first two games of the 2021-22 season.

PETERSON ON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS

Kansas freshman Darryn Peterson was named to the 50-member 2026 Naismith Trophy Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the Atlanta Tipoff Club released Nov. 3. PETERSON AND BIDUNGA NAMED NAISMITH STARTING FIVE TOP 20 WATCH LISTS

On Oct. 27, Kansas freshman Darryn Peterson was named to the 20-member Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Watch List. On Oct. 31, sophomore Flory Bidunga was named to the 20-member Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Watch List.

Peterson is looking to become the second Jayhawk to win the Bob Cousy Award joining Frank Mason III, the 2017 recipient.

Named the Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year and a unanimous Preseason All-Big 12 selection by the league coaches, Peterson is one of Kansas' highest-ever recruited players after earning Naismith Trophy High School Player of the Year and McDonald's All-American honors following the 2024-25 season. Peterson was ranked as the No. 1 newcomer in college basketball this year by ESPN.com. CBS Sports has ranked him as the No. 2 player in the nation.

In 2024-25, Bidunga started six of his 34 games played and led Kansas with 54 blocked shots. His 1.6 blocks per game were third in the Big 12 and 60th nationally and his 54 blocks rank fourth on the KU freshman list. Bidunga also concluded 2024-25 first on the KU freshman list in field goal percentage at 69.8% (88-126) and he averaged 5.9 points and 5.4 rebounds per game.

KANSAS NO. 19 IN PRESEASON POLLS

For the 34th-consecutive season, the Kansas men's basketball team is ranked in the Associated Press (AP) Preseason Men's Basketball Poll. The Jayhawks, ranked in each preseason poll since the 1990-91 season, check in at No. 19 in the preseason poll announced Oct. 13.

KU BY THE NUMBERS

The AP preseason poll started in 1962 and this marks the 48th time Kansas has appeared in the poll that is selected by a media panel. The 48 ranks fifth most in NCAA Division I history behind Kentucky (58), North Carolina (56), Duke (50), and UCLA (49).

Kansas is one of six Big 12 teams ranked in the AP preseason top 25, which ties for the most nationally with the Big Ten and the SEC. Kansas is ranked along with No. 2 Houston, No. 8 BYU, No. 10 Texas Tech, No. 13 Arizona, and No. 16 Iowa State. The six ranked league teams are tied for the most in conference history, matching the mark set last season to open the 2024-25 season.

This also marked the fourth time in the last six years that at least five Big 12 teams have been ranked by AP in the preseason.

Kansas will play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason AP Top 25, and potentially one more in the third game of the Players Era, Nov. 25 or 26. Seven of the 10 games will be against Big 12 foes with No. 2 Houston, No. 8 BYU, No. 10 Texas Tech, No. 13 Arizona (twice), and No. 16 Iowa State (twice). KU will also play No. 4 UConn, No. 6 Duke and No. 25 North Carolina.

Like the preseason Associated Press poll, Kansas men's basketball has been voted No. 19 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll, released Oct. 22.

KU SIXTH IN THE COACHES BIG 12 PRESEASON POLL

Kansas finished sixth in the 2025-26 coaches' preseason poll garnering 163 points. Houston (224 points) is the coaches' favorite followed by BYU (204), Texas Tech (200), Arizona (179), and Iowa State (170). Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team or student-athletes in the poll.

PETERSON NAMED PRESEASON BIG 12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Kansas freshman sensation Darryn Peterson has been named the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and preseason all-conference as the league announced its coaches' preseason honors today.

Historically, Peterson is the 10th Jayhawk to be named Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year in the 30-year history of the conference. He joins Quentin Grimes (2018-19), Jackson (2016-17), Cheick Diallo (2015-16), Cliff Alexander (co-2014-15), Wiggins (2013-14), Josh Selby (2010-11), Julian Wright (2005-06), David Padgett (co-2003-04), and Nick Collison (1999-2000).

ELEVEN JAYHAWKS ON NBA OPENING DAY ROSTERS

A proud NBA tradition continued this season as Kansas men's basketball had 11 players on NBA opening day rosters heading into the 2025-26 season.

Three Jayhawks have won NBA titles in the last four seasons with Andrew Wiggins of the Golden State Warriors in 2022, Christian Braun of the Denver Nuggets in 2023 and Sviatoslav Mykhailiuk, who won the 2024 title with the Boston Celtics.

On Oct. 20, 2025, Braun signed a five-year contract extension with the Nuggets after a strong three-year start to his professional career. Wiggins currently plays for the Miami Heat, while Mykhailiuk plays for the Utah Jazz.

Two NBA teams have Jayhawk teammates entering the 2025-26 season with Joel Embiid and Kelly Oubre Jr. of the Philadelphia 76ers and Ochai Agbaji and Gradey Dick on the Toronto Raptors. Additional Jayhawks on opening day rosters included: Hunter Dickinson (New Orleans Pelicans), Johnny Furphy (Indiana Pacers), Kevin McCullar Jr. (New York Knicks) and Jalen Wilson (Brooklyn Nets).

CLOSE CALLS

Kansas went 4-3 in games decided by five points or less or in overtime in 2024-25. In 2023-24, Kansas posted a 7-3 record in games decided by five points or less. In 2022-23, Kansas had 11 games decided by five points or less and/or in overtime. KU went 9-2 in those contests. In Kansas' 2021-22 national championship season, KU also played 11 games with the outcome being decided by five points or less or in overtime. KU went 9-2 in those contests.

Nov. 15, 1989: Kansas opened up its second season under Roy Williams with a 109-83 victory over UAB in the first game of the Preseason NIT in Allen Fieldhouse. Senior Kevin Pritchard and junior Mike Maddox scored 22 and 21 points, respectively, in a game where the Jayhawks never trailed. Kansas went on to win the Preseason NIT by defeating St. John's in Madison Square Garden, 66-57. The Jayhawks finished the 1989-90 season with a 30-5 overall record, including an 11-3 mark in Big Eight play, which tied for second. Despite being unranked at the beginning of the season, the Jayhawks finished the year No. 5 in all three national polls.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents in Allen Fieldhouse is even more impressive. KU is 25-18 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, 2003-04, the Jayhawks are 26-6 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse and have won 10 of their last 12 such meetings.

WINNING THE BIG 12 IS NO CAKEWALK

The Big 12 has led all conferences in average NET ranking in four of the last five seasons and has been the top ranked Conference in NET/RPI (prior to 2019) in nine of the past 12 seasons.

The stoutness of the Big 12 is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 14 times in Bill Self's 22 seasons at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule six times - 2004-05, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19 and 2022-23.

KANSAS NOTABLES

- Kansas is 220-2 under Bill Self, since 2003-04, when holding foes to 59 or less points, including 2-0 this season.
- Kansas allowed 51 points in the season opener against Green Bay (11/3), marking the fewest allowed in a season opener since allowing 50 to Western Michigan 69-50 in 1993.
- Kansas has won 22-straight non-conference games at in Allen Fieldhouse beginning on Nov. 7, 2022. Kansas is 161-6 (96.4%) against non-conference opponents inside Allen Fieldhouse under Bill Self.
- Kansas is 133-24 (84.7%) following a loss in the Bill Self era (2003-04 to present).
- For 55 weeks, from the first poll of the 2021-22 season until Feb. 26, 2024, KU was ranked in the Associated Press Top 10.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 24-4 (85.7%) in Allen Fieldhouse against teams ranked higher than KU. The losses were March 1, 2025 vs. Texas Tech (78-73), Jan. 25, 2025 vs. Houston (92-86 2OT) and Dec. 1, 2005 vs. Nevada (72-70) and KU has won 16 of the last 18 in that scenario.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 26-6 (81.3%) against AP top-10 teams in games played in Allen Fieldhouse, including 2-2 in 2024-25. KU has won 10 of its last 12 against AP Top-10 foes in AFH dating back to Feb. 27, 2021.
- Kansas has won its nine of its last 10 games against Blue Blood schools - North Carolina this season; North Carolina and Duke in 2024-25; Indiana, UConn and Kentucky in 2023-24; Kentucky, Indiana and Duke in 2022-23; and North Carolina in the 2022 NCAA title game.

- Kansas is 87-8 in its last 95 games when outrebounding its opponent. Included was a 61-game streak when KU outrebounded its opponent.
- KU has won 85 of its last 87 games in Allen Fieldhouse when leading at halftime, dating back to the beginning of the 2018-19 season.
- Kansas is 118-18 (86.8%) in the month of December under coach Bill Self (since 2003-04). KU has won 26 of its last 29 games in the month of December beginning with the final game of the 2019-20 season.
- Kansas men's basketball posted a 3.12 grade point average in the spring 2025 semester.
- With the 86-51 win against Furman on Nov. 30, 2024, Kansas won its 2,400th all-time game, becoming only the second school to achieve 2,400 wins - 1. Kentucky (2,424); 2. KANSAS (2,416); 3. North Carolina (2,398).
- Kansas has been ranked in 312 of the last 317 Associated Press polls dating back to Feb. 2, 2009. Included was a streak of 231 polls from 2.2.2009 until 2.1.2021. Kansas' 80 consecutive weeks from 2.15.2021 until 2.16.25.
- Kansas' 2002 team remains as the only team in Big 12 history to go undefeated in Big 12 play. Kansas went 16-0 in 2002.
- Kansas has won 10 or more home games for 39 of the last 40 seasons, beginning in 1983-84. KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for 25 of the last 26 seasons beginning in 1999-2000 (9-3 in 2018 due to vacated wins).
- Kansas won its mind-boggling 52nd-straight home opener with an 87-57 win against Howard on Nov. 4, 2024. The streak began in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 22-0 in home openers in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas has won 33 of its last 34 conference openers, beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams. The 33-game streak ended with a KU 62-61 loss to West Virginia on 12/31/24.
- Beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown, Kansas has not lost a home finale which is a span of 42 seasons.

NOTES

- With the 77-69 win versus Michigan State on Nov. 12, 2024, Bill Self became the winningest head coach in Kansas history, surpassing Phog Allen’s 590 mark.
- With the 84-66 win against UNCW on Nov. 19, 2024, Bill Self won his 800th career game.
- Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self earned career win No. 800 with an 84-66 win over UNCW on Nov. 19, 2024. Self is the fourth-fastest coach of all time to reach the 800-win milestone and just the 16th ever to reach the feat.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU’s 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record-tying 13-straight titles from 2005-17, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won 16 regular-season league titles with just 18 losses in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU’s win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self’s Kansas team won the title. Self is one of three active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino and Dan Hurley) and one of 17 all-time with multiple titles.
- While at Kansas, he has coached 13 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 24 of the last 26 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self’s teams have won 20 regular-season league crowns in the last 25 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self’s 10 career 30-win seasons are tied for third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12), John Calipari (10); and is tied for No. 1 on the active coaches’ list. Nine of his 10 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA’s U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catharines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including eight times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).

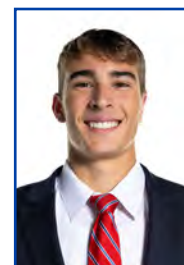

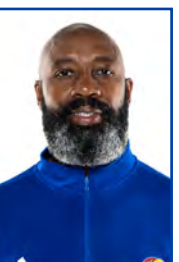

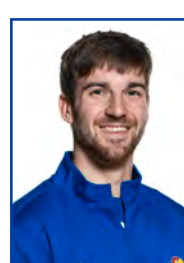
