KANSAS CONCLUDES REGULAR SEASON ON SENIOR DAY VS. #14 UTAH

The Kansas Jayhawks return home to David Booth JAYHAWK QUICK HITS Kansas Memorial Stadium on Friday, Nov. 28 to host the No. 14 Utah Utes, which will serve as Senior Day for 33 Jayhawks. Kickoff is slated for 11 a.m. CT on ESPN with Anish Shroff (Play-by-Play), Andre Ware (Analyst) and Paul Carcaterra (Sideline) on the call.

Kansas enters the regular season finale with a 5-6 (3-5 Big 12) record following a pair of Big 12 Conference road losses at Arizona and Iowa State. The Jayhawks enter Friday's game in search of bowl eligibility, which would be Kansas' 15th bowl appearance in school history and the third in the last four seasons for just the second time in program history. To become bowl eligible, the Jayhawks will have to defeat No. 14 Utah, who makes their first trip to Lawrence since 1993. Kansas is led by redshirt senior quarterback Jalon Daniels, who is having the best year of his career by completing 188of-292 passing for 2,344 yards and 21 touchdowns. Over his career, Daniels has thrown for 9,095 career passing yards for 66 touchdowns, while rushing for 22 touchdowns. Daniels is one of 10 players in Big 12 Conference history to have at least 9,000 career passing yards, 60 career passing touchdowns and 20 career rushing touchdowns and is joined by Baker Mayfield, Colt McCoy, Sam Ehlinger, Patrick Mahomes, Trevone Boykin, Robert Griffin III, Charlie Brewer and Max Dugan to do so. Defensively, the Jayhawks are led by redshirt junior linebacker Trey Lathan, who leads the team with 82 total tackles. Lathan tied his career high of 13 tackles last week at Iowa State, which was the most since totaling 13 earlier this season at Missouri.

Utah comes to Lawrence with a 9-2 (6-2 Big 12) record and are in the thick of the Big 12 Conference Championship race. Utah is coming off a thrilling 51-47 win over Kansas State on Senior Day on Nov. 22, of which Utah scored 16 unanswered points in the final seven minutes to overtake Kansas State. Kansas and Utah will meet on Friday for the fifth time in the series history and the first time since 1996. The series is tied at 2-2, while Friday's matchup will be the first between the two teams as Big 12 Conference opponents.

· Friday's game against Utah serves as senior day for the Jayhawks, as Kansas recognizes 33 seniors for their contributions to the program. Kansas' seniors have contributed nearly 400 career starts, back-to-back bowl appearances in 2022 and 2023 and national and Big 12 awards, among other honors. Kansas' seniors that will be recognized on Friday include: Emmanuel Henderson Jr., Bangally Kamara, Leshon Williams, Doug Emilien, Dean Miller, DJ Graham, Daniel Hishaw Jr., Jayson Gilliom, Levi Wentz, Devin Dye, Jalen Dye, DeShawn Hanika, Landon Nelson, Finn Lappin, Grayden Addison, Cole Mondi, Emory Duggar, DJ Withers, Hank Kelly, Kael Farkes, Nolan Gorczyca, Kobe Baynes, Enrique Cruz Jr., Mack Moeller, Boden Groen, Tommy Dunn, Cole Petrus, Kenean Caldwell, Gage Keys, Laith Marjan, Bryce Foster, Justice Finkley and Jalon Daniels. • Among Kansas' seniors, redshirt senior Jalon Daniels will play his final game inside David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium on Friday, having completed 724of-1,167 passing for 9,095 yards and 66 touchdowns over his career. Daniels is one of 10 players in Big 12 Conference history to have at least 9,000 passing yards, 60 passing touchdowns and 20 rushing touchdowns over his career, Daniels' senior season has been his best yet, completing 188-of-292 passing for 2,344 yards and 21 touchdowns. Daniels has totaled 10,508 career yards of total offense and is 1-of-10 active players in FBS to accomplish such a feat and is 1-of-2 active players to do so all at one school (Cade Klubnik, Clemson).

· While Kansas is in search of its 15th bowl eligibility in school history, the Jayhawks will need to defeat the No. 14 in the country in Utah. Friday's game will be Kansas' second against a ranked opponent this season after falling to No. 9 Texas Tech on Oct. 11, while the Jayhawks are 3-2 against ranked opponents over the last two seasons. Last season, Kansas recorded threestraight wins over ranked opponents (45-36 vs. No. 17 Iowa State, 17-13 at No. 7 BYU and 37-21 vs. No. 16 Colorado) for the first time in program history. Head coach Lance Leipold is 5-9 against AP Top-25 teams in his time at Kansas, while it will be Kansas' first time facing off against a ranked Utah team.



GAME NOTES

KANSAS UNDER HEAD COACH LANCE LEIPOLD

Head Coach Lance Leipold is in his fifth season at the helm for the Kansas Jayhawks, leading the Jayhawks to back-to-back bowl appearances in 2022 and 2023, something that KU has only accomplished twice in school history (2022-23, 2007-08).

• Leipold has led the Jayhawks to a 27-34 record in

his five seasons at KU and is just the seventh coach in KU history to win at least 25 games over their career. In the 12 years prior to Leipold's arrival, the previous five head coaches of Kansas combined for a 20-108 record.

- Leipold boasts a 173-73 career record, including six national championships and he was the fastest coach in NCAA history to reach 100 career wins. Leipold has the seventh most wins among active FBS head coaches.
- Since the start of the 2023 season, the Jayhawks are 12-14 in Big 12 Conference play. Prior to Lance Leipold's arrival, Kansas was 10-102 in Big 12 contests from 2008-2020. This season, Kansas is 3-5 in Big 12 Conference play with wins over West Virginia (41-10, Sept. 20), at UCF (27-20, Oct. 4) and Oklahoma State (38-21, Nov. 1). Kansas finished with a 5-4 record in Big 12 Conference play in 2023, which was the most Big 12 Conference wins in a single season for KU since the 2007 season.
- In 2023, Leipold led KU to its first nine-win season since 2007, including the Jayhawks' first winning season since 2008. The nine-win season marked the seventh in program history and Kansas' seventh bowl win all-time.
- · Since 2021, Kansas has six Big 12 road wins under Leipold (at Texas, 2021; at West Virginia, 2022; at Iowa State, 2023; at Cincinnati, 2023; at BYU, 2024; at UCF, 2025). In the 12 years prior to Leipold arriving at KU, the Jayhawks were 1-54 in Big 12 Conference road games from 2008-2020.

· Leipold is the fourth KU head coach to make two or more bowl appearances over their KU career, joining Mark Mangino (3-1), Glen Mason (2-0) and Don

Fambrough (2-0).

· Under Leipold, Kansas has recorded five wins against Top-25 opponents (2024 vs. No. 16 Colorado; 2024 vs. No. 7 BYU; 2024 vs. No. 17 Iowa State; 2023 vs. No. 6 Oklahoma; 2022 vs. No. 18 Oklahoma State). Leipold matches Bud Moore (1975-78) for the most wins against top-25 opponents over their KU careers. From 2010-2021, Kansas was 0-44 against Top-25 opponents with its last win coming against No. 15 Georgia Tech on Sept. 11, 2010.

• During the 2024 season, Kansas won three-straight games against ranked opponents, becoming the first school in FBS history with a sub .500 record to defeat three-straight ranked opponents. Kansas' three wins over ranked opponents were the most by a Jayhawk team since 1995. It's only the second time in school history the Jayhawks have accomplished such a feat.

· The Jayhawks are also 11-6 in non-conference games under Leipold, including 2-1 in 2025.

 The Jayhawks have been strong at home under Leipold, including a 4-2 record at David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium in 2025. Kansas finished with a 4-2 record at home in 2024 and 5-2 at home in 2023. Kansas' 5-2 record at home in 2023 was the most home wins since 2008, while the Jayhawks are now 17-6 at home since the start of the 2022 season and 18-11 overall. In the 12 years prior to Leipold's arrival (2008-2020), Kansas was 17-47 at home.

• Since the start of the 2022 season, Kansas has appeared in the AP Top-25 nine times, including two appearances in 2024. Kansas' appearance in 2022 was the first for the Jayhawks since 2009.

 Kansas began the 2024 season ranked No. 22, marking its first preseason ranking since 2009. It marked the first time since 2008 that Kansas was ranked in both the AP Preseason Poll and USA Today Preseason Coach's Poll.

KANSAS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Friday's game against No. 14 Utah marks Kansas' second game against a ranked opponent this season after falling at No. 9 Texas Tech earlier this season.
- The Jayhawks are 3-2 against ranked opponents over the last two seasons. In 2024, Kansas recorded three-straight wins over ranked opponents, including wins over No. 17 Iowa State (45-36), at No. 17 Iowa State (17-13) and No. 16 Colorado (37-21) for the first time in program history.
- Kansas head coach Lance Leipold is 5-9 against AP Top-25 teams in his time at Kansas. The win over BYU in 2024 marked Kansas' first win over a top-10 opponent on the road since defeating No. 4 Colorado in Boulder on Oct. 7, 1995, 40-24.
- · Kansas' pair of ranked wins in 2024 gave the Jayhawks two or more ranked opponents in the same season for the first time since 2007. The Jayhawks have defeated two or more ranked opponents in a season just six times in program history (2024, 2007, 1995, 1983, 1975, 1968).
- Prior to head coach Lance Leipold's arrival in 2021, Kansas was 4-47 against ranked opponents, dating back to the 2006 season. Prior to Leipold's arrival in 2021, Kansas was 0-43 against top-25 foes between 2010-2021 with its last win coming against No. 15 Georgia Tech on Sept. 11, 2010.
- The Jayhawks are 31-185-2 all-time against ranked opponents, including 12-97-2 against opponents ranked in the top-10 all-time.

- · Kansas football head coach Lance Leipold announced Kansas' season captains ahead of the season, including quarterback Jalon Daniels, center Bryce Foster and defensive end Justice Finkley.
- The Jayhawks will also select a rotating captain by game. Kansas has been represented by nine different rotational captains including DJ Withers (Fresno State, Kansas State), Lyrik Rawls (Wagner, Oklahoma State), Daniel Hishaw Jr. (Missouri), Trey Lathan (West Virginia), LeShon Williams (Cincinnati), Emmanuel Henderson Jr. (at UCF), Jalen Todd (at Texas Tech), Kobe Baynes (at Arizona), at DeShawn Hanika (at Iowa State).
- Daniels was voted captain by his peers for the fourth-straight season (2025, 2024, 2023, 2022) becoming Kansas' first four-time captain in program history.
- · Finkley and Foster are first-time captains after Finkley transferred to Kansas following four seasons
- Kansas' team captains were determined by team. vote prior to the start of the 2025 season.

 Kansas quarterback Jalon Daniels, nicknamed JD6, is among the top quarterbacks in all of college football this season, as the sixth-year senior is having the best season of his career.

• Daniels has completed 188-of-292 passing for 2,344 yards and 21 touchdowns, along with 109 rushing attempts for 370 yards and 3 touchdowns on the ground. Daniels' 21 passing touchdowns are the fifth most in single season Kansas football history.

Against Oklahoma State on Nov. 1, Daniels surpassed 10,000 career yards of total offense and now has 10,508 career yards, becoming the second Jayhawk in program history and 1-of-10 active players in FBS to accomplish such a feat and is 1-of-2 active players to do so all at one school (Cade Klubnik, Clemson).

- Against Cincinnati on Sept. 27, Daniels threw for 445 yards on 19-of-28 passing and 4 touchdowns. Daniels' 445 yards passing are the sixth most in FBS in a single game this season, while his 500 total yards (455 passing, 55 rushing) are the fourth most in the country this season, trailing on Demond Williams' (Washington) 538 yard performance vs. Rutgers on Oct. 10. Daniels' 445 passing yards were the second-most of his career and are the fifth most in Kansas football single game history. Daniels previously threw for a school record 544 yards against Arkansas in the 2022 AutoZone Liberty Bowl. His 500 yards of total offense are the 4th most in school history.
- Daniels has completed passes to 15 different receivers. In the win over Wagner on Aug. 29, Daniels completed passes to 11 different receivers, which was the most since completing passes to 11 receivers vs. Houston in 2022. Daniels completed passes to 10 different receivers in the season-opener vs. Fresno State
- Over his career, Daniels has thrown for 9,095 career passing yards on 724-of-1,167 (62%) passing and 66 touchdowns, along with 1,413 career rushing yards on 412 attempts and 23 touchdowns.
- Daniels' 9,095 career passing yards are the 10th most among active FBS quarterbacks, while his 66 career passing touchdowns are tied for the ninth most.
- Daniels is one of 10 players in Big 12 Conference history to have at least 9,000 career passing yards, 60 career passing touchdowns and 20 career rushing touchdowns and is joined by Baker Mayfield, Colt McCoy, Sam Ehlinger, Patrick Mahomes, Trevone Boykin, Robert Griffin III, Charlie Brewer and Max Dugan to do so.
- Daniels is one of five active Power 4 quarterbacks nationally with 65+ touchdown passes at one school, joining Cade Klubnik (Clemson), Behren Morton (Texas Tech), Josh Hoover (TCU) and Noah Fifita (Arizona).
- Daniels, a native of Lawndale, California, is one of Kansas football's most productive quarterbacks in school history, ranking second in Kansas football history in career passing yards (9,095), career completions (724), and career passing touchdowns (66).
- Daniels currently ranks third in KU career passing percentage at 62% (724-of-1,167) trailing Todd Reesing's 63.3% (932-of-1,461) (minimum 500 att.).
- Daniels' abilities don't end with his arm. He has proven to be a threat in the Kansas running game as well, rushing for 370 yards on 109 attempts and 3 touchdowns this season. Daniels' 22 career rushing touchdowns are tied for the 8th most in school history and are the 2nd most by a quarterback, trailing only Chip Hilleary's 23 rushing touchdowns set from 1989-92.
- Daniels has rushed for 1,413 yards over his career, which are the second most by a quarterback in school history, trailing only Nolan Cromwell's 1,664 career rushing yards set from 1975-76.
- one In the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in 2022, Daniels passed for a school record 544 passing yards, becoming the first Jayhawk in school history with 500+ passing yards in a game. Daniels also threw for five touchdowns against Arkansas, tying for the second most in a single game in school history. Following the 2022 season, Daniels led all of college football in total QBR at 90.0, which ranks 22nd since ESPN began tracking the statistic.

- Daniels is in his fifth season with head coach Lance Leipold and Jim Zebrowski as his quarterbacks coach, which is the longest tenured quarterback/

head coach/QB coach trio in all of power-four football. Daniels is also the only quarterback in FBS with a start in each of the last six seasons under the same program.

DANIELS A FINALIST FOR THE CAMPBELL TROPHY

- Not only is Daniels impressive on the field, but he was also recently named 1-of-16 finalists for the 2025 William V. Campbell Trophy, college football's premier scholar-athlete award.
- Daniels will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 2025 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments. He will travel to Las Vegas for the 67th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Tuesday, Dec. 9, at the Bellagio Hotel & Casino.
- Daniels becomes Kansas' fifth NFF National Scholar-Athlete all-time joining Todd Reesing (2008), Tom Fitch (1977), Mike McCoy (1971) and Ron Oelschlager (1964).
- Daniels is Kansas' first four-time team captain and was Kansas's first Big 12 Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2024. Daniels was recently named a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award, awarded to honor exemplary leadership by a college player on and off the field.
- Daniels has excelled on and off the field as a fivetime Academic All-Big 12 member and a 2022 CSC Academic All-American. Daniels has also been very involved in community, launching the "Mom2JD6" Foundation committed to supporting single mothers raising athletic children by providing financial aid, mentorship, sports training, and community resources. Daniels also contributed to Kansas football's offseason community service program, which dedicated a program record 517 hours of community service during the summer of 2025.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- Kansas is in its first year with Jim Zebrowski as its offensive coordinator, though, the chemistry between Zebrowski and Leipold goes back over a decade, with Zebrowski on Kansas' staff since 2021, as a quarterbacks coach at Buffalo from 2017-20 and as Wisconsin-Whitewater's offensive coordinator from 2007-09.
- Kansas' offense has gone over 500 yards twice (631 vs. Wagner, 597 vs. Cincinnati) this season. Kansas' 597 yards of offense against Cincinnati were the most yards in a conference game since 1991, when Kansas totaled 648 against Missouri on Nov. 23, 1991. In that game, Tony Sands set the then-FBS rushing record with 393 yards.
- In addition, Kansas' 445 passing yards against Cincinnati were the 5th most in program history and the most in a Big 12 Conference game since 2009 against Missouri (498).
- Since head coach Lance Leipold took over in 2021, Kansas has gone over the 500+ yard mark in a single game 17 times. Kansas went over the 500-yard mark only 11 times over the 10 years prior to Leipold's arrival in 2021.
- In the 46-7 win over Wagner, Kansas totaled 631 yards of total offense, which was the fourth most in school history for a single game and the most in a game since 2003 (641 vs. Jacksonville State).
- game since 2003 (641 vs. Jacksonville State).

 The Kansas offense averaged 420.2 yards of offense per game in 2024, marking its third-straight season with 400+ yards of offense per game. In the 12 seasons prior (2010-2021), Kansas did not average

HISTORY OF DAVID BOOTH KANSAS MEMORIAL STADIUM

1890

Kansas Football plays in its inaugural season, playing in three games captained by Howard Peairs.

1920

Phog Allen, in his only season as football head coach, rallies his team from a 20-0 halftime deficit to a 20-20 tie vs. Nebraska. The following Monday, students and faculty gather to celebrate the comeback and more than \$200,000 is pledged over a three-day period to build a concrete stadium.

MAY 10, 1921

The university observed "Stadium Day" and more than 4,000 students showed up to help demolish the old stadium, McCook Field.

OCT. 3, 1921

In the first game in Kansas Memorial Stadium, KU defeated Kansas State, 21-7 in front of 5,160 fans on Oct. 3, 1921. When the stadium was completed, the east and west stands had a capacity of 22,000.

NOV. 11, 1922

On Nov. 11, just prior to the KU-Nebraska game, Kansas Memorial Stadium was formally dedicated.

1927

Phog Allen's dream of a horseshoe-type stadium turns into reality as the north bowl is completed and the stadium capacity is increased to 35,000.

1965

The east and west stands are expanded, ultimately raising capacity to 51,500. A new press box was added to the west side of the stadium.

1978

A \$1.8 million renovation of Kansas Memorial Stadium includes improvements to repair concrete, replacing the original wooden seats, adding new dressing rooms and additions to the press box.

1999

The two-year, \$26 million, renovation project which included extensive infrastructure repairs, new concourse with improved concession stands and restrooms, new home locker room, and a new press box with 36 suites. In addition, the 1999 season marked the debut of a new video board in the south end zone.

2N1/J

The historic track surrounding the field at Kansas Memorial Stadium was removed with the completion of Rock Chalk Park and replaced with FieldTurf.

Kansas Football celebrates 100 years of Memorial Stadium.

OCT. 7, 2022

Plans for the Gateway District were announced while hosting ESPN College Gameday in 2022.

AUG. 15, 2023

Kansas unveils the vision behind the Gateway District, releases renderings and sets timeline for project.

DEC. 2023

Following the 2023 season, demolishment of the stadium begins.

2024

Kansas plays the 2024 season at Children's Mercy Park and GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City.

AUG. 13, 2025

Kansas announces transformational \$300 million gift from David Booth, with \$75 million to Phase 2 of the Gateway District, which includes development of new retail, dining, parking, residential facilities and a hotel.

AUG. 23, 2025

Kansas opens the 2025 season in the new David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium on August 23 vs. Fresno 400+ yards of offense in a single season. The last time Kansas had three-straight seasons with 400+ yards per game was 2007-09.

 Kansas' offense compiled 5,042 yards in 2024, marking its third-straight season with at least 5,000 yards of offense. Kansas has had 5,000+ yards of offense in seven seasons since 1945, while the Jayhawks have only had three-straight 5,000+ yard seasons one other time in program history (2007-09).

Kansas' offense converted 50.7% (75-of-147) on third downs in 2024, marking its highest third down conversion percentage since at least 1996. Kansas' 50.7% conversion percentage ranked atop the Big 12 Conference and third nationally. In each of the past three seasons, Kansas has ranked in the top-10 nationally in third down conversion percentage, leading the Big 12 Conference twice (2024, 2022).
Kansas scored 89.4% (42-of-47) in the red zone in

• Kansas scored 89.4% (42-of-47) in the red zone in 2024, which was the highest conversion percentage since 2017 (93.8%). The Jayhawks finished the season ranked No. 3 in the Big 12.

 Zebrowski also served as Kansas' playcaller during the 2023 Guaranteed Rate Bowl vs. UNLV, where the Kansas offense went for 591 yards and seven touchdowns.

THERE GOES EMAN

• Emmanuel Henderson Jr. has burst onto the scene this season as Kansas' leading receiver with 42 receptions for 653 yards and 5 touchdowns. Henderson is on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, awarded to the nation's top receiver.

• Of Henderson's 5 receiving touchdowns, he has scored on plays of 94 yards, 93 yards and 75 yards so far this season.

 Henderson has been a threat on offense and in special teams this season. Henderson ranks 13th nationally and 1st in the Big 12 in kick return yards with an average return of 25.8 yards. He also ranks eighth in the Big 12 and 61st nationally in all-purpose yards with 97.4 per game. Henderson is now over 1,000+ all-purpose yards with 1,072 this season.

 Against Cincinnati, Henderson took the first Kansas offensive play 93 yards for a touchdown on a dime from Daniels. The touchdown marked the 4th longest passing touchdown in school history.

• Henderson's 93-yard score was also the longest opening play from scrimmage in all of FBS since 2014 (LSU vs. Sam Houston State). It's also the longest first play from scrimmage in the Big 12 since at least 2003. • Henderson also struck for a 75-yard touchdown pass from Daniels against Cincinnati, giving him his second multi-touchdown game. His pair of touchdowns of over 70 yards made him the only player in FBS this season with two receiving touchdowns of 75+ yards this season and the first in the Big 12 Conference since Jaylen Noel of Iowa State in 2023. He is also the first Jayhawk in the Big 12 era (since 1996) to have two receiving touchdowns of 75+ yards.

• Against West Virginia, Henderson took the opening kickoff of the second half for a 94-yard touchdown, becoming the 4th player in program history with multiple 90-yard plays in his career. The list includes Gale Sayers (2 rush/1 kick return), LaQuivionte Gonzalez (1 kick return/1 reception), and Eric Vann (1 kick return/1 rush). Gonzalez is the only other player to have multiple such plays in the same season.

• Henderson caught 5 passes for 214 yards and 2 touchdowns against Cincinnati, which are the 5th most receiving yards in a single game in school history. It was also the most yards in a single game for a Jayhawk since Steven Sims had 233 against Kansas State in 2017. Henderson's 214 receiving yards are the 3rd most in a single game in all of college football this season.

• Henderson's back-to-back 100+ yard receiving games were the first of his career, while it's the first time a Jayhawk has done so since Andrew Parchment in 2019 (at Boston College, vs. West Virginia).

• Henderson played in 33 games over three years at Alabama, with five career catches for 96 yards. In 2024, Henderson caught four passes for 82 yards with a 19.2-yard average. Henderson also helped the Crimson Tide on special teams with five kick returns for 107 yards in 2024. At Geneva County high school (Ala.), he was rated one of the top athletes and running backs in the nation as a five-star recruit. He rushed for 1,447 yards and 20 touchdowns as a Junior and 1,996 yards and 32 touchdowns as a sophomore.

• Redshirt junior Cam Pickett is Kansas' second leading receiver with 40 receptions for 445 yards and 3 touchdowns, including 2 in his Kansas debut vs. Fresno State. Pickett's 2 touchdown debut was the first since Sept. 6, 2014 when Nick Harwell caught 2 touchdowns against Southeast Missouri State in the 2014 season opener.

• Pickett is in his redshirt junior season at Kansas following three seasons at Ball State, where he earned Third Team All-MAC honors in 2024. Pickett had four touchdowns on 49 receptions and 528 yards as Ball State's second leading receiver. Pickett played his prep career at Brooks College Prep (III.), where he was a three-star recruit and totaled over 4,000 career all-purpose yards. As a senior, he totaled 24 touchdowns with four on special teams.

- Kansas running backs Daniel Hishaw Jr. and Leshon Williams have shared the Jayhawk backfield throughout the season and while both healthy provide a solid 1-2 punch for the Kansas offense.
- · Hishaw leads the team in rushing this season with 102 attempts for 480 yards and 4 touchdowns, while Williams has carried 82 times for 456 yards and 7 touchdowns.
- Both Hishaw and Williams were named to the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List, which is awarded to the nation's top-running back. Hishaw has been named to the preseason watch list in each of the last three seasons, while Williams was previously named to the list in 2024 and 2023
- Against Oklahoma State, both Hishaw and Williams found the end zone, as Hishaw scored twice and Williams scored once. It marked Hishaw's first multitouchdown game since Oct. 28, 2023 in the win over No. 6 Oklahoma.
- Kansas' rushing attack combined for 232 yards against Oklahoma State, marking the fourth time this season that the Jayhawks have rushed for over 200
- Williams had a breakout performance at UCF, carrying 12 times for 58 yards and 3 touchdowns, marking his first career multi-rushing touchdown game. Williams' 3 rush-ing touchdowns were more than he has had in a season over his career, while they were the most rushing touchdowns by a Jayhawk since Devin Neal had 3 against Colorado in 2024.
- Williams was also the first Jayhawk to rush for 3 touchdowns in his first season at Kan-sas since Devin Neal rushed for 3 on Nov. 13, 2021 at Texas.

 • In the 41-10 win over West Virginia, Williams scored
- through the air and on the ground, as Williams caught a 39-vard pass from Daniels for a touchdown, along with a 62-yard rushing touchdown. It marked the first time since 2023 that a Jayhawk had a touchdown rushing and receiving in the same game (Devin Neal vs. Missouri State).
- Williams and Hishaw Jr., take over a Kansas rushing attack after Kansas' all-time lead-ing rusher, Devin Neal, was selected in the 2025 NFL Draft.
- · In the win over Wagner, Hishaw took a bulk of the carries with 14 attempts for 89 yards and a score. The touchdown was Hishaw's first since Sept. 28, 2024 vs. TCU. In the sea-son-opener vs. Fresno State, Hishaw led the Jayhawks in rushing on 13 attempts for 69 yards, while Williams carried six times for 57 yards and a touchdown.
- Facing a 4th-and-1 in the second quarter of the season-opener, Williams broke off a 21-yard rushing touchdown, his first-career touchdown as a Jayhawk and the fourth of his career. It was Williams' first touchdown since Oct. 14, 2023 at Wisconsin, where he rushed 25 times for 174 yards and a touchdown.
- In 2024, Hishaw played in eight games, rushing 65 times for 376 yards and three touch-downs.
- Hishaw had a career year in 2023, following two injuries in 2020 and 2022, rushing for a career-high 626 yards on 121 attempts and eight touchdowns.

- Hishaw led the Jayhawks in rushing on the Oct. 8, 2022, loss to TCU, carrying 13 times for 85 yards and a touch-down. The performance was Hishaw's first time leading in rushing this season and the first since Nov. 7, 2020, when he led Kansas with 73 yards at Oklahoma.
- · Williams was Iowa's leading rusher in 2023, rushing 170 times for 821 yards and 1 touch-down. Williams was named All-Big Ten honorable mention following the 2023 season.
- Williams has rushed 324 times for 1,380 yards and 4 touchdowns over his career at Io-wa, while catching 28 passes for 188 yards and 1 touchdown.
- Kansas' rushing attack under Leipold and assistant head coach/RB's Jonathan Wallace has been a strength of the Kansas offense. In 2024, Kansas' offense rushed for 2,537 yards, marking its secondstraight season with at least 2,500 rushing yards. It marked the first time since 1993-94 (2,719 in 1994; 2,567 in 1993) that Kansas has rushed for 2,500+ yards in consecutive seasons. Kansas' rushing attack averaged 211.4 rushing yards per game in 2024, the most in a season since 2011 (211.7). Kansas' rushing offense finished the season ranked second in the Big 12 and 13th nationally.

MOB - MEN OF BOOTH

- Nicknamed as "MOB" (Men of Booth) Kansas' offensive line has been a steady force for Kansas under head coach Lance Leipold.
- The Kansas offensive line brings 148 career starts across the offensive line, featuring Calvin Clements at left tackle, Amir Herring at left guard, Bryce Foster at center, Kobe Baynes at right tackle and Enrique Cruz Jr. at right tackle.
- Kansas is 1-of-9 teams across college football to start the same five offensive lineman in every game this season, joined by Duke, Iowa, Maryland, Miami (Fla.), Minnesota, Old Dominion, San Diego State and Texas Tech.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Baynes and Foster have not allowed a sack in over 650 snaps played. As a unit, Kansas' offensive line has not allowed a sack in five games this season, including against Wagner, West Virginia, Oklahoma State, Arizona and Iowa State.
- · In the win over West Virginia, Kansas held the Mountaineers, who ranked No. 4 in the NCAA in sacks going into the game, to zero sacks and a single tackle-for-loss.
- The Kansas offensive line was named the Big 12 Conference's "Beef of the Week" following their performance vs. Fresno State in which the Kansas offense rushed for 207 yards and established the line of scrimmage.
- · Under Leipold and offensive line coach Daryl Agpalsa, Kansas' offense allowed just .83 sacks per game (10 total) in 2024, which were the fewest allowed in the Big 12 and fourth fewest nationally. Kansas' 10 sacks allowed are the fewest by a Jayhawk team since at least 1996.
- Kansas' offensive line also allowed just 47 tackles for loss (3.92 per game) in 2024, ranking 13th nationally and second in the Big 12 Conference.
- Foster, a two-sport athlete between football and track & field at Kansas, was named Second Team All-Big 12 following the 2024 season after starting all 12 games at center. Following the football season, Foster competed for the Kansas Track & Field program in shot put, advancing to the 2025 NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, Oregon and earning Second Team All-America honors. Foster became the first Jayhawk since Isaac Byrd to earn All-America honors and All-Big 12 honors in two sports in the same academic year.

DEFENSE STANDS STRONG

- Under the direction of first-year defensive coordinator D.K. McDonald, the Kansas defense has held three opponents to 10 or fewer points.
- Despite allowing 20 first half points to UCF on Oct. 4, the Kansas defense bounced back by shutting out the Knights offense in the second half. Kansas forced a turnover on downs at the goal line with 1:52 remaining in the game and also forced a late turnover deep in UCF territory on a Jalen Dye strip sack. Kansas' second-half shutout marked the first in a second half for Kansas in a Big 12 Conference road game in Big 12 history.
- On Sept. 20, 2025, Kansas held West Virginia to just 10 points, marking the fewest points allowed in a Big 12 Conference game since 2007, when Kansas held

Iowa State to 7 points in Lawrence. The 10 points allowed marked the third time this season the Kansas defense allowed 10 or fewer points. The last time that the Jayhawks held three opponents to 10 or fewer points over their first four games was in 2007.

 The Kansas defense forced West Virginia to punt on each of its first six possessions while forcing the Mountaineers to punt 8 times, which were the most forced punts in a game since forcing Iowa State to punt nine times on Oct. 14, 2017.

 In the win over Wagner on Aug. 29, Kansas held the Seahawks to just 143 total yards and 6 total first downs (2 rushing, 3 receiving, 1 penalty). The 6 first downs allowed were the fewest allowed in a single game since also allowing 6 first downs to UAB on Aug. 28, 1997.

 Despite allowing a touchdown on their opening possession of the season vs. Fresno State, the Kansas defense did not allow a score the final 9 Fresno State drives. The Jayhawks would hold Fresno State to just 141 yards and nine first downs the remainder of the

The Kansas defense forced Fresno State to turn the ball over three times, including two interceptions and one fumble. Kansas' three takeaways by the Kansas defense were the most in a season opener since 2016 vs. Rhode Island (3).

 Kansas' defense held Fresno State to just 39 rushing yards total, which was the fewest rushing yards allowed since holding BYU to 9 rushing yards on Sept. 23, 2023, while it was the 12th time since 2000 holding an opponent under 40 rushing yards.

 Kansas' defense is led by redshirt junior Trey Lathan, who leads the Jayhawks in total tackles (82). Next to Lathan, redshirt senior linebacker Bangally Kamara leads the defensive unit with 9.5 tackles-for-loss.

• Lathan has recorded two games with at least 10 tackles this season, including a career-high 13 tackles at Iowa State and at Missouri this season. Lathan now has four career games with at least 10 tackles.

 Lathan arrived in Lawrence following three seasons at West Virginia, where he played in 22 career games. Lathan had a standout season in 2024, totaling 79 tackles (40 solo, 39 assisted), 9.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks. Lathan also forced 1 fumble in 2023 and 2024.

• The linebacking unit stepped up in a big way in the season-opening win over Fresno State, as Lathan led the team with 8 tackles and Bangally Kamara recorded 2.0 tackles-for-loss, 1.0 sack and a forced fumble. Bangally Kamara's sack was the first for him in a Kansas uniform, the sixth of his career and first since Nov. 16, 2023 vs. Boston College, while

· Bangally Kamara arrived to Kansas following one season at South Carolina and four years at Pittsburgh, appearing in 63 career games and registering 173 career tackles, 22.0 career tackles-for-loss and 6.5 sacks, along with 1 career interception. Kamara's 9.5 tackles-for-loss are the most in a single season over his career.

LEEERROOOY HARRIS

• One of Kansas' biggest breakouts this season has been the play off the edge from sophomore Leroy Harris III, who leads Kansas in sacks through 11 games with 4.5 sacks.

· Harris, who was originally thought to redshirt, arrived to Kansas this summer from Chattanooga.

· Harris is a part of one of Kansas' most experienced units in its defensive line, which has over 100 career starts and over 370 career games played among them

• In the 38-21 win over Oklahoma State, Harris came up with a big play before halftime, blocking the Cowboy field goal. The block was Kansas' first field goal block this season and the first since Oct. 5, 2024, when Kenean Caldwell blocked a field goal at Arizona State.

· Kansas has now blocked a field goal in back-toback seasons for the first time 2014-15.

· On the road at Arizona, Kansas recorded 5.0 sacks, which were the most in a Big 12 Conference road game for the Jayhawks since 2018 at West Virginia. It's also Kansas' most sacks in a game since totaling 7.0 against Houston in 2024.

• In the win over UCF, Kansas recorded 9.0 tacklesfor-loss, which are the most in a Big 12 Conference road game since tallying 9.0 at West Virginia on Oct. 17, 2020.

• In the season-opener vs. Fresno State, Kansas' defensive front helped stuff the Fresno State rushing attack, holding the Bulldogs to 39 rushing yards

total. The 39 rushing yards allowed vs. Fresno State were the fewest rushing yards allowed since holding BYU to 9 rushing yards on Sept. 23, 2023, while it was the 12th time since 2000 holding an opponent under 40 rushing yards.

• In 2024, the Jayhawks recorded 28 sacks, which were the most in a season since the 2016 season. Kansas finished the season ranked third in the Big 12 Conference in sacks per game (2.33). Kansas also recorded 5.8 tackles-for-loss per game in 2024, the most since totaling 7.4 tackles-for-loss per game in

MONEY MARJAN

· Kansas kicker Laith Marjan has been nearly perfect this season, converting on 14-of-16 field goals, while connecting on 37-of-37 PAT's this season.

· Marjan broke the KU school record for most consecutive field goals made in the 38-21 win over Oklahoma State, as he connected on a 39-yard field goal in the first quarter. Marjan's kick broke the school record of 11, previously set by Dodge Schwartzburg, set in 1984.

· Marjan has been a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in each of the last two seasons.

· Against Texas Tech, Marjan connected on a career long 55-yard field goal to finish the first half, which was tied for the 6th longest field goal in school history and is the longest field goal made since Jacob Branstetter hit a 57 yard field goal against Oklahoma in 2009.

Entering the 2025 season, 26 Jayhawks have already obtained their degree including, Kobe Baynes (Communication Studies), Leyton Cure (Liberal Arts and Sciences), Jalon Daniels (Sports Management), Doug Emilien (Liberal Arts and Sciences), Nolan Gorczyca (Geography), Daniel Hishaw Jr. (Liberal Arts and Sciences), Mack Moeller (Business Administration), Grayden Addison (Finance), Kenean Caldwell (Communications Studies), Emory Duggar (Sports Management), Tommy Dunn Jr. (Marketing), Devin Dye (Liberal Arts and Sciences), Jalen Dye (Liberal Arts and Sciences), Jayson Gilliom (Sports Management), Gage Keys (Liberal Arts and Sciences), Landon Nelson (Management and Leadership), Cole Petrus (Management and Leadership), DJ Withers (Marketing), Bryson Canty (Columbia, Psychology), Deshawn Hanika (Iowa State, Communications), Levi Wentz (Albany, Sociology), Leshon Williams (Iowa, Sport and Recreation Management), DJ Graham (Utah State, Integrated Studies), Bangally Kamara (South Carolina, Service Management), Laith Marjan (South Alabama, Professional Development) and Lyrik Rawls (Oklahoma State, Marketing).

 Kansas redshirt senior Jalon Daniels is one of 15 Academic All-Americans all-time at Kansas. Five of Kansas' Academic All-Americans all-time have come within the last three seasons.

Not only are the Jayhawks succeeding in the classroom, Kansas is putting in work in the community as well. During the 2025 offseason program the Jayhawks contributed 519 hours of community service, marking a new program record.

KANSAS OPENS THE NEW DAVID BOOTH KANSAS **MEMORIAL STADIUM**

- The 2025 season marks the first season played in the new David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium and the completion of Phase 1 of the University of Kansas' Gateway District, which has undergone transformational \$448 million upgrades to the Anderson Family Football Complex, southwest, west and north sides of the stadium. The upgrades include a 55,000-gross-square-foot conference center space in the north endzone and a major renovation of the Anderson Family Football Complex, which serves as the hub of Kansas football.
- The Jayhawks are 3-1 in the new David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium, following wins over Fresno State (31-7) on Aug. 23, Wagner (46-7) on Aug. 29 and West Virginia (41-10) on Sept. 20.
- · Among the changes fans saw on gameday include a restricted seating bowl with improved sightlines and increased fan proximity to the field, along with expanded concourse circulation, upgraded accessibility, diverse new premium seating options and an overall more comfortable gameday experience. Fans also enjoyed new food and beverages that feature a strong local flavor that will connect Jayhawk fans to some of their local and national brands. Among the local additions to the stadium for the upcoming season are Johnny's Tavern, Tiki Taco, Bigg's BBQ, Princeton Popcorn, Uplift Coffee and famous Kansas City brewery, Boulevard. Reputable national partners such as Chick-fil-A, Serendipity Ice Cream, Anheuser-Busch, Modelo, Surfside, Jim Beam and Pepsi are also available. In addition, a new strategic partnership with Jack Stack BBQ will offer food options in the Jayhawk Landing south endzone space, premium seating and their famous sauces will be served throughout the stadium.
- The initial vision of the University of Kansas Gateway District was first announced on Oct. 7, 2022, when Kansas hosted ESPN College Gameday to campus for football for the first time in program history. In under a year, The University of Kansas unveiled its plans behind the Gateway District with renderings and a timeline for the project on Aug. 15, 2023. Following the completion of the 2023 season, demolishment of the stadium began as Kansas played its 2024 season in the Kansas City Metro at Children's Mercy Park, home of Sporting KC, in Kansas City, Kansas and GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium, home of the Kansas City Chiefs, in Kansas City, Missouri.
- With Phase 1 now complete, future phases of the Gateway District will introduce new academic and hospitality facilities, student housing, retail, and a 20,000-square-foot plaza designed for community events and outdoor programming. These components will extend the district's impact and help position KU as a national leader in integrated campus development.

BOOTH GIVES BACK WITH UNPRECEDENTED GIFT

• On Wednesday, August 13, 2025, the University of Kansas announced an unprecedented gift from alumnus David G. Booth of Austin, Texas. The extraordinary gift, amounting to approximately \$300 million, is the largest in Kansas Athletics and University of Kansas history, and is among the largest single gifts in the history of college athletics.

· Booth, a graduate of both Lawrence High School and KU, is an investing legend and founder of Dimensional Fund Advisors — a global investment firm that manages \$853 billion in assets as of June 30, 2025. Booth's visionary gift includes a \$75 million challenge to other donors that launches the next phase of progress on the Gateway District and David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium. The remainder of his commitment will generate a stream of income that will strengthen Kansas Athletics across generations.

· It's not just the scale of the gift that is remarkable, but what it will accomplish. Booth's commitment will propel the Gateway District's next phase, which adds to private and civic investment for a new hotel, additional retail and restaurant spaces, student housing, improved parking and an outdoor event plaza. The remainder of Booth's gift will allow Kansas Athletics to be strategic, innovative and maintain a leadership position in college athletics. With the advent of revenue sharing and the continued changes

in NCAA and conference dynamics, his generosity will help enable KU to take the next step in cementing itself as a national leader in college athletics.

 Booth's landmark gift is the most recent in his long legacy of support at KU, helping transform athletics and its impact for the university. Booth provided a foundational gift of \$50 million in 2017 to kick off renovations at the stadium, which was named for him in 2018. In 2010, he donated James Naismith's original rules of basketball to the university, a top attraction housed at the DeBruce Center, next to the Booth Family Hall of Athletics, which he and his family provided \$5 million for in 2004, followed by \$4 million for subsequent improvements. His philanthropy is legendary and extends across areas, including the arts and academics. In 2008, he provided a gift valued at \$300 million to the University of Chicago School of Business, where he earned his MBA. The school was named the University of Chicago Booth School of Business in his honor.

 The Lawrence High graduate attended KU, earning both a Bachelor of Arts in Economics in 1968 and a Master of Science in Business in 1969 before earning his Master of Business Administration from the University of Chicago in 1971.

KANSAS TO PLAY IN FIRST EVER COLLEGE FOOTBALL GAME AT ICONIC WEMBLEY STADIUM

- The Kansas Jayhawks will play in the first ever college football game played at the iconic Wembley Stadium in London in the Union Jack Classic on Sept. 19. 2026 against Arizona State.
- The game will serve as a home matchup for the Jayhawks, who will still play six home games at the reimagined David Booth Kansas Memorial Stadium in 2026. With the east side of the stadium slated for construction following the 2025 season and throughout the 2026 season, Kansas will have reduced capacity for home games next season.
- The Union Jack Classic will be the third Big 12 football game in two seasons played in Europe, which began with Iowa State's and K-State's 2025 season opener in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic in Dublin, Ireland. TCU will face North Carolina in the same event to open the 2026 season.

KANSAS VS. UTAH CONNECTIONS

· Kansas and Utah meet on the gridiron for the fifth time in the series history on Friday and the first time as members of the Big 12 Conference.

· Friday's meeting will be the first between the two teams since 1996 in a series that dates back to 1950. Kansas won the first two meetings between the two schools, including a 39-26 win in Salt Lake City in 1950 and a 26-7 win in Lawrence in 1951. Utah won the last two meetings with a 41-16 win in Lawrence in 1993 and a 45-42 win in Salt Lake City in 1996.

· The University of Kansas and the University of Utah and divided by 1,042 miles.

· Only two Jayhawks have seen game action against Utah in their careers, including Lyrik Rawls while at Oklahoma State and DJ Graham III while at Utah State. Utah head coach Kyle Whittingham has connections to the Kansas City area as his son, Alex, serves as an assistant defensive line coach for the Kansas City

A KANSAS WIN WOULD ..

- Move Kansas to 617-692-58 all-time, including 28-34 in the Lance Leipold era. Leipold's career record would improve to 174-73 overall.
- Make Kansas bowl eligible for the 15th time in program history, including the third time under head coach Lance Leipold. Leipold would become the second coach in program history to lead his team to three bowl appearances, joining Mark Mangino.
- · Give Kansas its third bowl eligibility in four seasons, which has only been done once in program history (2005-08).
- Give Kansas the series advantage over Utah at 3-2, including 2-1 in games played in Lawrence. Kansas would have its first win over Utah since 1951.
- · Give Kansas its fourth win over a ranked opponent over the last two seasons. It would be Kansas' first ranked win of the season.
- Kansas would improve to 32-186-2 against AP ranked opponents all-time, including 20-90-2 against ranked opponents at home.
- Make Kansas 13-14 in Big 12 Conference play since 2023

Lance Leipold, a six-time National Champion, a five-time conference coach of the year and the fastest coach in NCAA history to reach 100 career wins, was named the 41st head coach in Kansas Football history on April 30, 2021.

Leipold's track record as a program builder showed itself early in his time in Lawrence, leading the Jayhawks to back-to-back bowl games in 2022 and 2023, a feat that has only been done in Lawrence once in program history. Leipold has guided Kansas to its first-ever program win in Austin, Texas in 2021, followed by Kansas' first-ever win over West Virginia in Morgantown in 2022 and a win over #6 Oklahoma in 2023. In just his second year at the helm, Leipold helped Kansas to secure its first bowl eligibility with a win over No. 18 Oklahoma State on November 5, 2022, giving Kansas its first bowl berth since 2008. Kansas' ranked win was the first since 2010, snapping a 44game losing streak to AP ranked opponents, while it was Kansas's first ranked win against a conference opponent at home since 2005.

Leipold has engineered Kansas to one of the greatest stories in college football, guiding Kansas to its first national rankings in 675 weeks, hosting ESPN's College Gameday for the first time in program history on October 8, 2022, hosting FOX Big Noon Kickoff for the first time on Oct. 28, 2023, and earning Kansas' first-ever ranking in the College Football Playoff Ranking on Oct. 31, 2023.

In 2024, Leipold led the Jayhawks to its first preseason ranking in both the AP Preseason Poll and USA Today Coach's Poll since 2008. Kansas played all six of its home games in the Kansas City Metro during the 2024 season while work continued on the University of Kansas Gateway District, as the Jayhawks notched three-straight wins over ranked opponents (No. 16 lowa State, No. 7 BYU and No. 17 Colorado), marking the first time in program history with three-straight wins over ranked opponents.

Leipold arrived at Kansas after a successful six-year stay at Buffalo, where in his final three seasons, he posted three straight winning seasons for the first time in 20 years. He won 24 games over the final three seasons, which included a seven-game shortened-season schedule in 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic, marking the most successful three-year run in Buffalo history.

A proven winner with a strong track record for player development, Leipold served as the head coach at Wisconsin-Whitewater for eight seasons from 2007 to 2014, capturing six NCAA Division III national championships and tallying an astounding record of 109-6.

After taking over a rebuilding Buffalo program that went 7-17 in his first two seasons, Leipold put together a record of 30-16 over his final four seasons, including three bowl appearances and two bowl victories with the Bulls.

Leipold had a 2020 season at Buffalo that brought unprecedented success to the program. The Bulls went a perfect 5-0 in the regular season and won the MAC East Division title for the second-straight year. Leipold's squad also beat Marshall in the Camellia Bowl for the program's second ever bowl win and second in as many years.

Buffalo also appeared in the Associated Press Top 25 at No. 24 on December 6, 2020, marking the first-time in school history the Bulls appeared in the national rankings. The team finished the season ranked 25th in both the AP poll and the Amway Coaches Poll. Leipold was named the MAC Coach of the Year for the second time in his career after the record-breaking season.

Showcasing his pristine reputation for player development and a keen eye for recruiting, Buffalo tied a school-record with 12 All-MAC selections in 2020, all of whom were recruited by Leipold. Running back Jaret Patterson led the way, rushing for 1,072 yards in just six games, including a 409-yard performance against Kent State, which is the second-best performance in FBS history.

Patterson was named the winner of the Vern Smith Leadership Award, given to the MVP of the MAC and was also named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year under Leipold's tutelage.

Buffalo also had 12 all-conference players in 2019, a season that culminated in the school's first-ever bowl victory – a 31-9 win over Charlotte in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl. The 2019 team featured one of the best defenses in the school's history. Buffalo ranked seventh nationally in total defense, allowing 291.9 yards per game. The Bulls were also fourth nationally against the run, allowing 94.2 yards per game.

In 2018, Buffalo won 10 games in a season for the first time ever in program history. Leipold's team went 7-1 in MAC play and won the East Division title. The Bulls also won 42-13 at Rutgers, marking the school's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent. He was named the MAC Coach of the Year and was also a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award.

In that 2018 season, the Buffalo offense had a recordbreaking season. Buffalo scored 484 points, 64 touchdowns and totaled 5,803 yards of total offense, establishing new school records in each category. Quarterback Tyree Jackson was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year, while Patterson earned MAC Freshman of the Year honors.

In Leipold's third season in 2017, the Bulls gained bowl eligibility for just the third time as an FBS program. The Bulls offense averaged 432 yards per game and led the conference in passing yards per game at 291. Showing an ability for explosive plays, Buffalo produced 20 plays of 45 or more yards on the season.

Leipold became the head coach at Buffalo in December of 2014 after a triumphant career as the head coach at Wisconsin-Whitewater, which saw him earn six National Coach of the Year awards. In his first season there in 2007, the Warhawks went 14-1 and won the Division III national championship. In 2008, the team made it back to the title game and fell to Mount Union.

Wisconsin-Whitewater then went 45-0 over the next three seasons, winning three straight national championships. After a 7-3 campaign in 2012, Whitewater went 30-0 combined in 2013 and 2014 winning two more national titles with Leipold at the helm.

During his time there, Warhawk players totaled 56 All-America honors, with running back Justin Beaver winning the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen won the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Running back Levell Coppage earned D3Football.com Offensive Player of the Year honors, while Cole Klotz won those honors on the defensive side.

Leipold, a native of Jefferson, Wisconsin, began his coaching career at Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin in 1991, where he served as a graduate assistant for Barry Alvarez for three seasons and helped the Badgers win a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

He then served as an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000, helping the Mavericks become three-time conference champions. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, before moving on to Nebraska where he worked for Frank Solich for four seasons. He then returned to Nebraska-Omaha for three years as the associate head coach and offensive coordinator, before moving on to Wisconsin-Whitewater in 2007.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater, where he was a standout quarterback.

Leipold and his wife Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon. Landon is a recent graduate of Free State high school and will play collegiately at the University of Nebraska-Kearney, while Lindsey is a former collegiate volleyball player at Stetson University.






