- No. 19 Kansas (1-0) will play at No. 25 North Carolina (1-0) on Friday, Nov. 7. The blueblood battle will tip from the Dean E. Smith Center at 6 p.m. (Central) and the game will be televised on ESPN with Dan Shulman and Jay Bilas calling the action. Kansas ranks No. 2 in all-time victories with 2,415 wins, while North Carolina is No. 3 at 2,395.
- Kansas holds a 7-6 all-time series edge on North Carolina and KU has won the last five meetings, with four of those being in the NCAA Tournament. The last matchup was last season, a Kansas 92-89 win on Nov. 8, 2024 in Allen Fieldhouse. This will be the first meeting between the two schools played in Chapel Hill, North Carolina.
- Kansas has won seven-straight games versus ACC opponents and 16 of its last 17 against the league dating back to 2012. The 16-1 mark includes wins versus Duke (5), UNC (4), NC State (3), Miami, Clemson, Wake Forest, and Syracuse.
- Kansas is No. 19 in both the Associated Press and USA TODAY Coaches polls entering the 2025-26 season. This marks the 34th-consecutive season Kansas is ranked in the Associated Press (AP) preseason poll. Since 2006-07, this marks the 20th-consecutive season Kansas has been ranked in the coaches' poll. Including 2025-26, KU has been ranked in 34 of the last 35 coaches' polls, a streak that started in 1991-92.
- Kansas head coach Bill Self is 610-156 in his 23rd season at KU. Last season, Self became Kansas' all-time winningest coach, surpassing Phog Allen, who was 590-129 in 36 seasons on the KU sidelines. Self is in his 33rd season overall with an 817-261 record. He is one of only four active coaches with 800 or career wins - Rick Barnes, John Calipari, and Kelvin Sampson.

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 19 Kansas opened the 2025-26 season with a 94-51 win against Green Bay on Nov. 3. KU was led by sophomore Flory Bidunga who scored a career-high 23 points on 9-of-11 shooting with six rebounds and three blocked shots. Freshman guard Darryn Peterson scored 21 points in his collegiate debut on 7-of-11 shooting with three threes, three assists and two steals. Senior Melvin Council Jr. added 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting with a team-high four assists. The win marked KU's 53rd-consecutive home opening victory, a streak that started in the 1973-74 season.

Kansas allowed 51 points in the season opener against Green Bay, marking the fewest allowed in a season opener since allowing 50 to Western Michigan 69-50 in 1993.

Kansas returns six letterwinners from the 2024-25 season. Bidunga started six games last season. Elmarko Jackson was a redshirt in 2024-25. He started 17 games in 2023-24 and returns after a torn patella injury that occurred in June 2024. Sophomore Jamari McDowell took a redshirt in 2024-25. McDowell played in 31 games in 2023-24 and averaged 7.2 minutes per contest.

Kansas welcomes eight newcomers to the KU squad, featuring Peterson, the top-rated recruit in the nation. There are four upperclassmen transfers on the newcomers list with Council, senior Jayden Dawson, graduate Nginyu "Gee" Ngala, and Tre White.

Peterson, the third No. 1 ranked national recruit to play for Self at Kansas, joining Andrewiggins and Josh Jackson, is surrounded by a talented freshmen class this year, including Kohl Rosario, Paul Mbiya, Tiller, Samis Calderon and Corbin Allen.

ABOUT NORTH CAROLINA

Located in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, No. 25 North Carolina won its opener, 94-54, against Central Arkansas on Nov. 3. The Tar Heels are coached by UNC alum Hubert Davis who is 102-45 in his fifth season at UNC. Freshman F Caleb Wilson led North Carolina in the season opener scoring 22 points. Junior G Kyan Evans had 15 points and led the team with five assists and four steals. Redshirt-junior C Henri Veesaar posted a double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds, while senior G Seth Trimble had 12 points and four assists and junior G Luka Bogavac poured in 10 points.

North Carolina went 23-14 last year and 13-7 in the ACC. UNC returns two starters and five letterwinners from last season and has 10 newcomers on its roster.

THE KANSAS-NORTH CAROLINA SERIES

The Jayhawks and Tar Heels meet for the 14th time in the series history with Kansas holding a 7-6 edge. The two teams last met on Nov. 8, 2024, in Allen Fieldhouse with Kansas winning 92-89. This will be the first meeting between the two schools in Chapel Hill.

The first meeting was in the 1957 NCAA title game won by UNC, 54-53 in triple overtime at historical Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City, Missouri.

Beginning with the 2008 NCAA Tournament semifinal contest in San Antonio, Kansas has won the last five meetings with North Carolina with four of the five battles being in the NCAA Tournament. The teams met in the 2022 NCAA title game, a KU 72-69 win in New Orleans on April 4, 2022, on March 24, 2013 in the NCAA Tournament second round in Kansas City, Missouri, in which Kansas came out victorious, 70-58. KU also won 80-67 in the 2012 NCAA Tournament Elite Eight in St. Louis.

All in all, the two teams have met seven times in the NCAA Tournament, with Kansas 5-2 in those games. Head coach Bill Self is 6-1 against North Carolina in his career, including 5-0 at Kansas.

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- Legendary North Carolina coach Dean Smith was born in Emporia, Kansas, and graduated from KU in 1953. He was a member of Kansas' 1952 NCAA National Championship team. Smith coached at North Carolina from 1961-97 and won two titles in 1982 and 1993, defeating Kansas, coached by Williams, in the 1993 title game.
- Hall of Fame coach Roy Williams' first head coaching job was at Kansas from 1989-2003. Williams guided KU to four Final Fours (1991, 1993, 2002, 2003), nine conference regular-season titles and four league tournament titles amassing a 418-101 record. Williams returned to his alma mater and guided UNC to three NCAA titles (2005, 2009, 2017) and concluded with a career record of 903-264.
- Hall of Fame coach Larry Brown was an assistant coach at North Carolina from 1965-67. Brown coached five seasons at Kansas from 1983-88, guiding the Jayhawks to two Final Fours, including the 1988 NCAA National Championship.

GREEN BAY LEFTOVERS

- The win gave Kansas its 53rd-consecutive home opening win, a streak that began in 1973-74
- The Jayhawks had nine players make their Kansas debut. All nine players scored in the victory. The players making their debuts included: Peterson (21 points), Melvin Council Jr. (10), Tre White (9), Bryson Tiller (7), Kohl Rosario (6), Jayden Dawson (5), Nginyu Ngala (5), Samis Calderon (1) and Paul Mbiya (1).
- Kansas allowed 51 points in the season opener, marking the fewest allowed in a season opener since allowing 50 to Western Michigan 69-50 in 1993.
- The Jayhawks finished with 20 assists to just three turnovers in the win. It marks the first time Kansas registered 20 or more assists with three or less turnovers since at least the 1989-90 season.
- Kansas' three turnovers were its fewest since KU had two turnovers against Oklahoma on Jan. 13, 2024 and is tied for the program's second-fewest turnovers in a game in the Big 12 era. The Jayhawks also turned it over three times against Texas in 2015 in Austin.

- Freshman Darryn Peterson's 21 points marked the most points in a Kansas debut by a freshman since Gradey Dick had 23 against Omaha (11-7-2022).
- Senior Melvin Council Jr. recorded his 58th game with 10-plus points in Division I after scoring 10 points on 4-5 shooting from the field. Council recorded his 1,000th career point scored at the NCAA D1 level.
- Freshman Kohl Rosario led the team with three offensive rebounds. Rosario finished the game with six points, three assists, and five total rebounds.

PETERSON ON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS

Kansas freshman Darryn Peterson was named to the 50-member 2026 Naismith Trophy Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the Atlanta Tipoff Club released Nov. 3. Also on Nov. 3, Peterson was named to the 50-member USBWA 2025-26 Oscar Robertson Trophy preseason watch list. On Oct. 30, Peterson was named to the 20-member NABC 20-member 2026 NABC Division I Player of the Year Preseason Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

Peterson is looking to become the third Jayhawk to win the Naismith Division I Player of the Year joining Danny Manning (1988) and Frank Mason III (2017).

Peterson is looking to become the second Jayhawk to win the Oscar Robertson Trophy joining Frank Mason III (2017).

Peterson is looking to become the fourth Jayhawk to win the NABC Player of the Year joining Drew Gooden (2002), Nick Collison (2003), and Frank Mason III (2017).

PETERSON AND BIDUNGA NAMED NAISMITH STARTING FIVE TOP 20 WATCH LISTS

On Oct. 27, Kansas freshman Darryn Peterson was named to the 20-member Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Watch List. On Oct. 31, sophomore Flory Bidunga was named to the 20-member Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Watch List.

KU BY THE NUMBERS

Peterson is looking to become the second Jayhawk to win the Bob Cousy Award joining Frank Mason III, the 2017 recipient.

In his college debut, Peterson scored 21 points, including three three-point field goals, with four rebounds, three assists and two steals in No. 19 Kansas' 94-51 win against Green Bay on Nov. 3.

Named the Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year and a unanimous Preseason All-Big 12 selection by the league coaches, Peterson is one of Kansas' highest-ever recruited players after earning Naismith Trophy High School Player of the Year and McDonald's All-American honors following the 2024-25 season. Peterson was ranked as the No. 1 newcomer in college basketball this year by ESPN.com. CBS Sports has ranked him as the No. 2 player in the nation.

Bidunga scored a career-high 23 points in the season opener against Green Bay. He also had six rebounds and three blocked shots versus the Phoenix. In 2024-25, Bidunga started six of his 34 games played and led Kansas with 54 blocked shots. His 1.6 blocks per game were third in the Big 12 and 60th nationally and his 54 blocks rank fourth on the KU freshman list. Bidunga also concluded 2024-25 first on the KU freshman list in field goal percentage at 69.8% (88-126) and he averaged 5.9 points and 5.4 rebounds per game.

KANSAS NO. 19 IN PRESEASON POLLS

For the 34th-consecutive season, the Kansas men's basketball team is ranked in the Associated Press (AP) Preseason Men's Basketball Poll. The Jayhawks, ranked in each preseason poll since the 1990-91 season, check in at No. 19 in the preseason poll announced Oct. 13.

The AP preseason poll started in 1962 and this marks the 48th time Kansas has appeared in the poll that is selected by a media panel. The 48 ranks fifth most in NCAA Division I history behind Kentucky (58), North Carolina (56), Duke (50), and UCLA (49).

Kansas is one of six Big 12 teams ranked in the AP preseason top 25, which ties for the most nationally with the Big Ten and the SEC. Kansas is ranked along with No. 2 Houston, No. 8 BYU, No. 10 Texas Tech, No. 13 Arizona, and No. 16 Iowa State. The six ranked league teams are tied for the most in conference history, matching the mark set last season to open the 2024-25 season.

This also marked the fourth time in the last six years that at least five Big 12 teams have been ranked by AP in the preseason.

Kansas will play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason AP Top 25, and potentially one more in the third game of the Players Era, Nov. 25 or 26. Seven of the 10 games will be against Big 12 foes with No. 2 Houston, No. 8 BYU, No. 10 Texas Tech, No. 13 Arizona (twice), and No. 16 Iowa State (twice). KU will also play No. 4 UConn, No. 6 Duke and No. 25 North Carolina.

Like the preseason Associated Press poll, Kansas men's basketball has been voted No. 19 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll, released Oct. 22.

KU SIXTH IN THE COACHES BIG 12 PRESEASON POLL

Kansas finished sixth in the 2025-26 coaches' preseason poll garnering 163 points. Houston (224 points) is the coaches' favorite followed by BYU (204), Texas Tech (200), Arizona (179), and Iowa State (170). Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team or student-athletes in the poll.

PETERSON NAMED PRESEASON BIG 12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Kansas freshman sensation Darryn Peterson has been named the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and preseason all-conference as the league announced its coaches' preseason honors today.

Historically, Peterson is the 10th Jayhawk to be named Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year in the 30-year history of the conference. He joins Quentin Grimes (2018-19), Jackson (2016-17), Cheick Diallo (2015-16), Cliff Alexander (co-2014-15), Wiggins (2013-14), Josh Selby (2010-11), Julian Wright (2005-06), David Padgett (co-2003-04), and Nick Collison (1999-2000).

ELEVEN JAYHAWKS ON NBA OPENING DAY ROSTERS

A proud NBA tradition continued this season as Kansas men's basketball had 11 players on NBA opening day rosters heading into the 2025-26 season.

Three Jayhawks have won NBA titles in the last four seasons with Andrew Wiggins of the Golden State Warriors in 2022, Christian Braun of the Denver Nuggets in 2023 and Sviatoslav Mykhailiuk, who won the 2024 title with the Boston Celtics.

On Oct. 20, 2025, Braun signed a five-year contract extension with the Nuggets after a strong three-year start to his professional career. Wiggins currently plays for the Miami Heat, while Mykhailiuk plays for the Utah Jazz.

Two NBA teams have Jayhawk teammates entering the 2025-26 season with Joel Embiid and Kelly Oubre Jr. of the Philadelphia 76ers and Ochai Agbaji and Grady Dick on the Toronto Raptors. Additional Jayhawks on opening day rosters included: Hunter Dickinson (New Orleans Pelicans), Johnny Furphy (Indiana Pacers), Kevin McCullar Jr. (New York Knicks) and Jalen Wilson (Brooklyn Nets).

CLOSE CALLS

Kansas went 4-3 in games decided by five points or less or in overtime in 2024-25. In 2023-24, Kansas posted a 7-3 record in games decided by five points or less. - Kansas has 2,415 all-time victories which is the second most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has won 16 regular-season Big 12 championships with just 21 losses at Allen Fieldhouse.

- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 383-103 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Including the league postseason championship, KU is first at 433-118.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 172-15 (92.0%) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 3-2 in 2018, 9-0 in 2019, 8-1 in 2020, 8-1 in 2020-21, 9-0 in 2021-22, 8-1 in 2022-23, 8-1 in 2023-24 and 7-3 in 2024-25.

Nov. 7, 2022: Defending NCAA National Champion Kansas defeated Omaha, 89-64, to open the 2022-23 season. Freshman Gradey Dick led KU with 23 points in his first career game, while redshirt junior Jalen Wilson posted a double-double with 19 points, a game-high 11 rebounds and a career-high seven assists in the victory. Kansas would go on to win the 2023 Big 12 regular-season title posting a 28-8 overall record and a 13-5 conference record. Wilson would go on to be named Consensus All-America First Team and recipient of the Julius Irving Small Forward of the Year Award.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

Kansas went 4-4 versus Associated Press ranked foes in 2024-25. In 2023-24, Kansas went 7-5 against AP ranked opponents, including 4-2 versus top 10. In the Bill Self era, KU is 131-81 against AP-ranked opponents, including 53-34 versus Top-10 foes. Entering 2025-26, Self's KU teams have collected seven or more wins against ranked foes in four of the last five and five of the last seven seasons.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents in Allen Fieldhouse is even more impressive. KU is 25-18 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, 2003-04, the Jayhawks are 26-6 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse and have won 10 of their last 12 such meetings.

WINNING THE BIG 12 IS NO CAKEWALK

The Big 12 has led all conferences in average NET ranking in four of the last five seasons and has been the top ranked Conference in NET/RPI (prior to 2019) in nine of the past 12 seasons.

The stoutness of the Big 12 is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 14 times in Bill Self's 22 seasons at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule six times - 2004-05, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19 and 2022-23.

KANSAS NOTABLES

- Kansas is 218-2 under Bill Self, since 2003-04, when holding foes to 59 or less points.
- With the win against Arizona, Kansas is 131-24 (84.5%) following a loss in the Bill Self era (2003-04 to present), including 8-4 in 2024-25.
- For 55 weeks, from the first poll of the 2021-22 season until Feb. 26, 2024, KU was ranked in the Associated Press Top 10.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 24-4 (85.7%) in Allen Fieldhouse against teams ranked higher than KU. The losses were March 1, 2025 vs. Texas Tech (78-73), Jan. 25, 2025 vs. Houston (92-86 2OT) and Dec. 1, 2005 vs. Nevada (72-70) and KU has won 16 of the last 18 in that scenario.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 26-6 (81.3%) against AP top-10 teams in games played in Allen Fieldhouse, including 2-2 in 2024-25. KU has won 10 of its last 12 against AP Top-10 foes in AFH dating back to Feb. 27, 2021.
- After its win versus Duke (11/26/24), Kansas has now won its last nine games against Blue Blood schools - North Carolina and Duke last season; Indiana, UConn and Kentucky in 2023-24; Kentucky, Indiana and Duke in 2022-23; and North Carolina in the 2022 NCAA title game.
- Kansas is 87-8 in its last 95 games when outrebounding its opponent. Included was a 61-game streak when KU outrebounded its opponent.
- KU has won 84 of its last 86 games in Allen Fieldhouse when leading at halftime, dating back to the beginning of the 2018-19 season.
- Kansas is 118-18 (86.8%) in the month of December under coach Bill Self (since 2003-04). KU has won 26 of its last 29 games in the month of December beginning with the final game of the 2019-20 season.
- Kansas men's basketball posted a 3.12 grade point

average in the spring 2025 semester.

- With the 86-51 win against Furman on Nov. 30, Kansas won its 2,400th all-time game, becoming only the second school to achieve 2,400 wins - 1. Kentucky (2,423); **2. KANSAS (2,415)**; 3. North Carolina (2,394).
- Kansas has been ranked in 311 of the last 316 Associated Press polls dating back to Feb. 2, 2009. Included was a streak of 231 polls from 2.2.2009 until 2.1.2021. Kansas' 80 consecutive weeks from 2.15.2021 until 2.16.25.
- Kansas' 2002 team remains as the only team in Big 12 history to go undefeated in Big 12 play. Kansas went 16-0 in 2002.
- Kansas has won 10 or more home games for 39 of the last 40 seasons, beginning in 1983-84. KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for 25 of the last 26 seasons beginning in 1999-2000 (9-3 in 2018 due to vacated wins).
- Kansas won its mind-boggling 52nd-straight home opener with an 87-57 win against Howard on Nov. 4, 2024. The streak began in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 22-0 in home openers in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas has won 33 of its last 34 conference openers, beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams. The 33-game streak ended with a KU 62-61 loss to West Virginia on 12/31/24.
- Beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown, Kansas has not lost a home finale which is a span of 42 seasons.

- With the 77-69 win versus Michigan State on Nov. 12, 2024, Bill Self became the winningest head coach in Kansas history, surpassing Phog Allen’s 590 mark.
- With the 84-66 win against UNCW on Nov. 19, 2024, Bill Self won his 800th career game.
- Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self earned career win No. 800 with an 84-66 win over UNCW on Nov. 19, 2024. Self is the fourth-fastest coach of all time to reach the 800-win milestone and just the 16th ever to reach the feat.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU’s 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record-tying 13-straight titles from 2005-17, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won 16 regular-season league titles with just 18 losses in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU’s win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self’s Kansas team won the title. Self is one of three active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino and Dan Hurley) and one of 17 all-time with multiple titles.
- While at Kansas, he has coached 13 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 24 of the last 26 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self’s teams have won 20 regular-season league crowns in the last 25 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self’s 10 career 30-win seasons are tied for third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12), John Calipari (10); and is tied for No. 1 on the active coaches’ list. Nine of his 10 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA’s U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catharines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including eight times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).

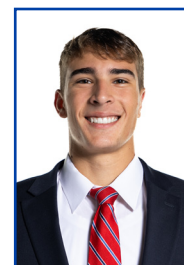

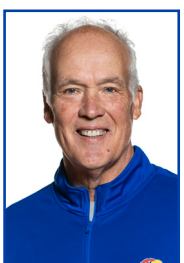
