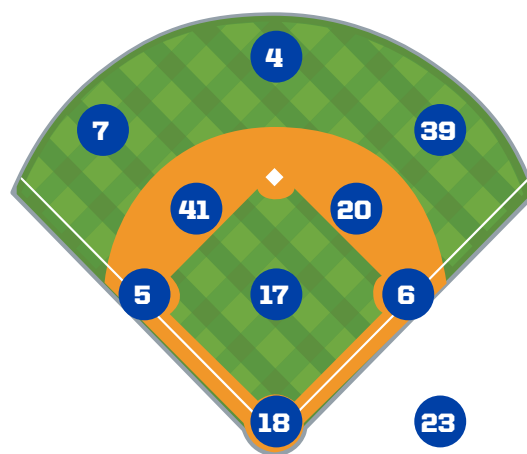

FIRST PITCH

The Jayhawks are set to compete in their third tournament of the season at the San Marcos Invitational in San Marcos, Texas, from Feb. 22-24. Kansas will face Texas State in two games and Southern Illinois in two others, playing four games in total.

Kansas has faced Texas State four times, accumulating three wins. The most recent victory came in 2013, when the Jayhawks secured a 4-2 win over the Bobcats.

As for the Salukis, the two teams have met nine times, with Kansas holding a 4-5 record against Southern Illinois. The Jayhawks' largest win in the series came in 2016 with a 10-4 victory.

The Jayhawks hold a two game winning streak heading into the weekend and look to continue to streak across the four games with hopes of going undefeated against their opponents

In the Wilson Invitational Tournament, the Jayhawks delivered strong performances across all four games, finishing with a 3-1 record. Their biggest win came against Southern Utah, where they secured an 8-1 victory. Kansas' most impressive win came in the final game of the tournament against Long Beach State. The Jayhawks battled back from an 0-2 deficit, with the game coming down to the bottom of the seventh inning to secure the win. Junior Lizzy Ludwig played a crucial role as a relief pitcher, stepping up in a high-pressure moment. With the bases loaded, she fielded her position to force an out at home, leading to a double play turned by freshman catcher Bailey Amezcua, preventing any runs from scoring and securing the 3-2 victory

At the plate, Kansas is led by three players batting over .400. Junior Aynless Linduff leads the team with a .483 batting average, tallying 14 hits, including three doubles. Junior Presley Limbaugh follows closely behind with a .448 average, recording 13 hits, four doubles, and multiple RBIs. The freshman class is also making an impact, with Ava Wallace posting a .444 batting average. All three hitters have contributed to the strength of the Kansas offense.

Defensively, Kansas has been a standout unit, with more than 10 players maintaining a perfect fielding percentage (1.000) through nine games. The team has committed minimal errors, resulting in an impressive .970 fielding percentage. This defensive efficiency places the Jayhawks second in the Big 12 and 61st nationally, showcasing their consistency and reliability in the field.

Who's Back

The Jayhawks welcome back 16 after lettering eight players from their last season roster.

Key players such as Hailey Cripe, Sara Roszak, Campbell Bagshaw, Katie Brooks, Presley Limbaugh, Aynslee Linduff, Olivia Bruno, and Lizzy Ludwig will look to make a notable return this season.

Notable Newcomers

The Jayhawks welcome nine new players to their roster, featuring six talented freshmen eager to make their mark and three experienced transfers bringing depth to the defense along with speed and power to the offense side.

Among the six freshmen, Kennedy Diggs, Karsen Griggs, Bailey Amezcua, and Kaelee Washington were named to the Softball America Freshman Watchlist, with Diggs and Griggs also earning spots on the D100 Freshman Watchlist.

Trio of Transfers

Haley Webb (#21), a 6'1" sophomore catcher from Fort Wayne, Indiana, started all 30 games as a freshman at Indiana State. Concluded her season with 129 putouts and five errors while adding 16 hits, five doubles, and six RBIs.

Madi Hays (#36), a 5'4" sophomore outfielder from Bellevue, Nebraska, appeared in 53 games at UTSA, hitting five doubles, four home runs, and driving in nine RBIs with a .338 on-base percentage. In high school, she set multiple records at Millard South, including home runs and batting average.

Candace Yingling (#10), a 5'10" senior from Temecula, California, transferred from Cal State Fullerton, where she hit .389, posted a .436 on-base percentage, and recorded no errors. Previously at UC Berkeley, she achieved a .992 fielding percentage across 63 games.

Last Season Milestones

Last season was a landmark year, highlighted by several historic achievements. The team secured its first Big 12 series sweep since 2005 by defeating No. 19 Baylor and went on to achieve three conference sweeps (Baylor, Houston, Iowa State) for the first time since 2005. With a seven-game winning streak, the longest since 1997, and 27 total wins, the program reached its highest victory total since 2018. Additionally, the team recorded 10 Big 12 wins, marking its best conference performance since 2001.

2024 Fall Ball

Kansas Softball played in a total of seven fall ball games this season spanning over a total of 54 innings. Kansas faced notable opponents such as Wichita State and border rival Mizzou.

The team opened its home slate with a 12-0 win over Central Methodist. They followed up with a 9-1 victory against Baker and a 17-0 win over the University of Central Missouri. The Jayhawks wrapped up their fall campaign with a 12-3 win over Ottawa University.

2025 Schedule Breakdown

This season's schedule features 52 games overall, including a 24-game Big 12 lineup with matchups against three new members of the league.

Kansas will host Wichita State in its home opener on March 12. Other non-conference games include matchups with Omaha, Missouri, Kansas City, and Missouri State.

Kansas' first Big 12 home game at Arrocha Ballpark will feature a series against Texas Tech, where they will face NiJaree Canady, the reigning National Player of the Year.

McFalls 100th Win

Last season, in the first game against UTSA at the Texas A&M Invitational, the Kansas Softball team earned its fifth win of the season, and Head Coach Jennifer McFalls achieved a significant milestone, securing her 100th win in her Kansas Jayhawk career. McFalls, who has been instrumental in the program's growth and success, reached this achievement in her sixth season at the helm. She now has a total of 123 wins for the Kansas program.

New Hire

Justin Lewis was named assistant softball coach at Kansas in May 2024. He joins the Jayhawks after three seasons as head coach at Nicholls State, where he led the team to a 17-win improvement in 2023 and earned Southland Conference Coach of the Year honors. Lewis also guided Nicholls to a 31-26 record in 2024. His coaching experience includes stints at Fresno State, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, and Texas A&M Kingsville, where he helped the Javelinas reach the NCAA Division II Women's College World Series in 2019. Lewis brings a strong coaching background and leadership to a Kansas program coming off a 28-win season in 2024.

Kansas Softball Welcomes Six on National Signing Day

Sam Claire, Ella Boyer, Audri Youngblood, Lila Mae Patridge, Blakely Barber, and Brinley Ramirez. The incoming class features three pitchers, a strong catcher, and two versatile athletes with speed for the outfield. Representing four states, this group brings a wealth of accomplishments, including state championships, All-State honors, and standout performances in high school and club competition. Coach McFalls emphasized their potential to enhance the program, noting their depth, power, and athleticism that will positively impact the Jayhawks' roster.

Up Next

The Jayhawks will continue their tournament stretch as they prepare to face 11 teams across three different tournaments.

The next tournament Kansas will compete at is the Oklahoma Tournament. In which they will prepare to face past Big 12 foe, Oklahoma as well as two other teams.

THE MCFALLS FILE

Coach McFalls completed her sixth season leading the Kansas Softball program in 2024, having been hired by the University of Kansas on August 20, 2018. The 2025 season will mark her seventh year as head coach. In 2023, Kansas Director of Athletics Travis Goff announced a contract extension for Coach McFalls after she guided the team to a 25-27 record, the program's highest win total since 2018. The Jayhawks also achieved a sixth-place finish in the Big 12 with a 5-3 conference record, their best since 2016. Building on that success, McFalls led the team to a 28-25-1 record in 2024, once again surpassing the program's previous win totals under her leadership.

The 2024 season saw many milestones for the Jayhawks, as McFalls and her coaching staff helped lead the team to a record-high 28-25-1 season, marking Kansas' best performance since 2018. Among the highlights was a historic series sweep over No. 19 Baylor, the program's first Big 12 series sweep since 2005. The Jayhawks also achieved a remarkable seven-game winning streak, their longest since 1997. The team secured 27 total wins, the most since 2018, and dominated in conference play with three Big 12 series sweeps against Baylor, Houston, and Iowa State — a feat not accomplished since 2005. Additionally, Kansas earned ten Big 12 wins, the program's best conference performance since 2001. These achievements underscored the program's growth and resurgence under McFalls' leadership, setting a new standard for success.

Since taking the helm at Kansas, Coach McFalls has made significant strides in revitalizing the program. In 2022, the Jayhawks achieved a 25-27 overall record, their most wins since 2018, and a 5-13 Big 12 record, marking the program's most conference victories since 2016. The team secured a Big 12 Championship win for the first time since 2007, defeating No. 8 Oklahoma State. That season also saw Kansas earn its first Big 12 series victory since 2019 and a five-game winning streak from March 12-19, the longest since 2019. The Jayhawks defeated nine NCAA Tournament teams and hit 55 home runs, the third-most in program history, trailing only the 2011 and 2021 teams. Notable highlights included upsetting No. 24 Missouri, 11-7, at Arrocha Park. McFalls also coached freshman Olivia Bruno to All-Big 12 Second Team and Big 12 All-Freshman Team honors, while nine players earned Academic All-Big 12 First Team recognition.

In 2021, McFalls guided the team to a 22-26 record, highlighted by upsets over three ranked opponents: No. 10 Oklahoma State, No. 18 Missouri, and No. 23 Wichita State. The team also set a program record with 14 Academic All-Big 12 honorees. During the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season, Kansas played 26 games, finishing with a 13-13 record. That year, McFalls coached redshirt sophomore Shelby Gayre to a stellar campaign in which she batted .393 with 11 home runs and earned Second-Team All-American honors from Softball America.

In her first season in 2019, McFalls led the Jayhawks to a 15-36 overall record, finishing sixth in the Big 12 with a 3-15 conference mark. Over her tenure, Coach McFalls has fostered growth on and off the field, achieving both individual and team milestones while continually building a strong foundation for future success.

Before becoming the head coach of Kansas Softball, McFalls spent eight years at Texas, where she served as an assistant coach and contributed to the success of one of the nation's most reputable softball programs. She helped lead the Longhorns to seven NCAA Regional appearances, including a Women's College World Series semifinal in 2013. As the defensive coach, McFalls guided Texas to a program-record .980 fielding percentage and multiple top defensive rankings. Her tenure saw nine All-America selections, 31 NFCA All-Region picks, and numerous Big 12 Player and Freshman of the Year honorees, along with 44 Big 12 All-Academic Team honors. An Olympic gold medalist, McFalls brought exceptional experience and leadership to the program.
