FOOTBALL MEDIA DAYS

TOP PRESEASON STORYLINES –

- Heading into his second season as ULM head coach, **Bryant Vincent** looks to build upon the foundation created in his first season at the helm. Coach Vincent established a culture of grit and resilience in 2024 that propelled the Warhawks to one of their most successful starts in nearly four decades.

ULM opened last season 5-1, the program's best start in 37 years, and Vincent was the only Sun Belt Conference Coach named to the 2024 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award Watch List.

Under Vincent's direction, the Warhawks led the SBC in several statistical categories, including passing yards allowed (183.9), blocked kicks (3) and fewest penalty yards per game (43.25).

- ULM's 2025 Sun Belt Conference Media Day representatives are **Billy Pullen** and **Nate Sullivan Jr.** Pullen was named to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Fourth Team to open the 2025 season, after starting in all 12 games and awarded All-Sun Belt Third Team last season. Pullen accumulated 47 tackles, 7.5 TFLs and 6.0 sacks (leading the team) in his debut season with the Warhawks. Sullivan made appearances in all 12 games last season, registering 14 receptions for 133 yards, averaging 9.5 yards per catch.

- Returning at the quarterback position this season is redshirt junior **Aidan Armenta**, who assumed the starting position after week five in the win over James Madison. Senior **Hunter Herring** also makes the return, appearing in eight games on the offense and on special teams in 2024. Two more quarterbacks join the room, in freshman **Bryson Kimbrough** and App State transfer **Mason McHugh**.

- Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Ahmad Hardy entered the transfer portal after a sensational season, but the Warhawks reloaded at the running back position by adding transfers **Braylon McReynolds** (South Alabama), **Zach Palmer Smith** (Richmond), **Jaydon Wright** (Minnesota), **Dorian Lewis** (New Mexico) and **Tyrell Reed Jr.** (Arkansas). ULM also signed true freshman tailback **D'Shaun Ford**, who was ranked the nation's No. 68 prospect at the running back position according to On3 Sports and committed to ULM in the Navy All-American Bowl last January.

- **Jake Godfrey**, who led the Warhawks with 265 receiving yards, is back on the roster and was one of Armenta's top targets last season. Godfrey hauled in his first career touchdown reception in the fourth quarter of ULM's thrilling victory over JMU and added a touchdown catch at Arkansas State, both of which were from Armenta. **Tyler Griffin** appeared in all 12 games last season and made at least one reception in seven games, concluding his year with a touchdown versus the Ragin' Cajuns. **Javon Campbell** is also back after sustaining a season-ending injury in week seven at South Alabama, finishing the season with eight catches for 176 yards and one score. ULM added New Mexico transfer **Nic Trujillo**, Ole Miss transfer **Brandon Buckhault** and Jackson State transfer **Rico Powers Jr.** in the wide receiver room.

- The Warhawks return both starting guards from last season. **Elijah Fisher** is set for his sixth season in Monroe and has earned All-SBC Honorable Mention in back-to-back seasons. Fisher was voted Phil Steele All-Sun Belt Preseason Third Team. **Jay Mickle** started all 12 games for ULM last season and is back for his final season. The graduate student from Picayune, Miss., was voted Phil Steele Preseason All-Sun Belt Fourth Team. Also returning for the Warhawks' offensive line is **Que McBroom** and **Reese Steele**, both of whom made starts last season.

- Returning for the defense includes **David Godsey Jr.**, back for his sixth season with the Warhawks after posting 39 tackles, a tackle for loss, four pass breakups and two forced fumbles to receive All-Sun Belt Honorable Mention accolades. Also returning is **Carl Fauntroy**, who totaled 55 tackles, four pass breakups, an interception and a forced fumble last season. Defensive back **Markeegan Gray** remains with ULM for his redshirt senior season after becoming a Burlsworth Trophy nominee in 2024.

Phil Steele Preseason All-Sun Belt Third Team member **Kevontay Wells** returns to ULM after a stellar 2024 campaign, tallying 50 tackles, 11 tackles for loss and three sacks while earning All-Sun Belt Second Team Defense honors. **Dylan Howell** returns for his third Warhawk season, after totaling 23 tackles and two quarterback hurries in 2024. **Billy Pullen** returns for his second season, named to the Phil Steele Preseason All-Sun Belt Fourth Team, after starting in all 12 games and awarded All-Sun Belt Third Team last season.

Newcomers in the defense include **D'Arco Perkins-McAllister**, named to the Phil Steele Preseason All-Sun Belt Third Team after transferring in from Chattanooga, posting 22 tackles, two tackles for loss and four interceptions last season. **Zy Jackson** joins the Warhawks after becoming a two-time all-conference defensive back at Copiah-Lincoln CC, totaling 10 tackles, a fumble recovery and 586 return yards in 2024. Defensive back **Kamrin Canterbury** led West Florida with 49 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss last season before transferring to ULM for the 2025 season. **Noah Flemmings** adds to the linebacker room after transferring in from Trinity Valley CC, named First Team All-Conference and an NJCAA First Team All-American in 2024.

- Special teams players **Max Larson**, **Makenzie Ryan**, **Andrew Wells** and **Nolan Wilson** are all back on ULM's 2025 roster. Larson went 14-for-17 on field goal attempts and 27-for-28 on PATs in his first season with the Warhawks and was named Phil Steele Preseason All-Sun Belt Third Team. Ryan booted 58 punts with an average of 39.2 yards per punt, downing 18 inside the 20-yard line. Wells served as the team's holder and Wilson was the long snapper for all games last season. ULM signed West Monroe native **Peyton Todd** to the roster. Todd appeared in all 13 games last season at LSU and averaged 41.3 yards per punt on 19 punts for the Tigers.

- ULM's coaching staff features four new faces in 2025, including running backs coach and run game coordinator **Hindley Brigham**, wide receivers coach **Kishawn McClain**, defensive ends coach **Jontavius Morris** and offensive assistant coach **Cody Wells**. Brigham arrives after nine seasons at UAB, McClain joins the staff after stops at ETSU and Gardner-Webb and Morris was added after being on staff at Louisville and Purdue. Former ULM quarterback Wells returns to Monroe after a few seasons at Evangel University.
- ULM's 12-game football schedule features five home games, four being conference opponents.

According to ESPN, the Warhawks have the second-toughest schedule in the Sun Belt and the eighth toughest in the Group of Five. ULM's opponents carried a winning percentage of .460 last season.

The Warhawks' 2024 opponents went a combined 90-67 (.573) last season, with seven opponents posting .500 or better records, including four teams that posted double-digit win totals, in Jackson State (12-2), Texas (13-3), Marshall (10-3) and the Ragin' Cajuns (10-3). In addition, seven foes also participated in postseason bowl games a year ago: Jackson State (Cricket Celebration Bowl), South Alabama (IS4S Salute to Veterans Bowl), James Madison (Boca Raton Bowl), Arkansas State (68 Ventures Bowl), the Ragin' Cajuns (Isleta New Mexico Bowl), Texas (Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl, Cotton Bowl) and Texas State (Servpro First Responder Bowl).

ULM's 2025 opponents went a combined 69-81 (.460) in 2024, with five opponents going over .500. In addition, six foes also participated in postseason bowl games a year ago: Alabama (ReliaQuest Bowl), Coastal Carolina (Myrtle Beach Bowl), South Alabama (IS4S Salute to Veterans Bowl), Arkansas State (68 Ventures Bowl), the Ragin' Cajuns (Isleta New Mexico Bowl) and Texas State (Servpro First Responder Bowl).

- ULM opens its second season under head coach **Bryant Vincent** against Saint Francis on Thursday, Aug. 28, with kickoff scheduled for 6 p.m. CT in Malone Stadium on ESPN+. It marks the first-ever meeting between the Warhawks and the Red Flash.

BRYANT VINCENT

SECOND SEASON AT ULM (5-7) THIRD SEASON OVERALL (12-13)

Bryant Vincent, known for his strong leadership and expertise in creating powerful offensive schemes in college football, was named the 17th head football coach in University of Louisiana Monroe history on Wednesday, December 6, 2023.

"We are fired up to welcome Coach Bryant Vincent to our Warhawk family and lead ULM football," said ULM Athletics Director John Hartwell. "Coach Vincent is bringing passion, positivity and a proven plan to guide our football program to levels of success we have not seen since becoming an FBS program. He is a relationship guy, and that will resonate with our student-athletes, prospective recruits, his coaching staff, the University, Northeast Louisiana and all of Warhawk Nation."

In his first season as head coach of ULM football, Coach Vincent began establishing a culture of grit and resilience that propelled the Warhawks to one of their most successful starts in nearly four decades. ULM opened the 2024 season 5-1, the program's best start in 37 years, and Vincent was the only Sun Belt Conference Coach named to the 2024 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award Watch List.

Vincent secured his first victory as head coach with a 30-14 win over Jackson State on August 29, 2024. In week two, the Warhawks stunned UAB with a dominating 32-6 win after shutting out the Blazers in the second half inside Malone Stadium. After defeating Troy on the road 13-9 in the Sun Belt

Conference opener, Vincent led the Warhawks to a signature victory over JMU by a score of 21-19 to give ULM its first 4-1 start in the FBS era. ULM completed the 5-1 start with a 38-21 win over Southern Miss in week six.

Under Vincent's direction, the Warhawks led the SBC in several statistical categories, including passing yards allowed (183.9), blocked kicks (3) and fewest penalty yards per game (43.25).

He developed 2024 Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year Ahmad Hardy, who led the league with 1,351 rushing yards and 13 rushing touchdowns as a true freshman. Hardy was named ULM's first FWAA Freshman All-American in program history and was also voted Louisiana Freshman of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association.

Including Hardy, nine Warhawks garnered SBC post-season honors for the first time in over five seasons including All-Sun Belt Second Team defensive lineman Kevontay Wells and All-Sun Belt Third Team defensive stars Billy Pullen, Carl Glass Jr., and Wydett Williams Jr. Additionally, two of Vincent's players went on to compete at the professional level after senior cornerback Car'lin Vigers signed an undrafted free agent contract with the NFL's Washington Commanders and senior offensive lineman Sam Carson was drafted by the CFL's Ottawa Redblacks.

Off the field, Vincent's leadership produced unprecedented academic results. ULM football recorded

the highest term GPA in program history in Fall 2024, and the team's 84% graduation success rate (GSR) led all Sun Belt programs. Additionally, major facility upgrades were completed at Malone Stadium, including renovations to the team room, locker room and main athletics lobby.

Before arriving in Monroe, Vincent served as the Offensive Coordinator at the University of New Mexico during the 2023 season. Under Vincent's offensive schemes, the Lobos earned national top-20 rankings in red zone offense (14th) and rushing offense (19th). Additionally, Vincent coached running back Jacory Croskey-Merritt to a record-breaking season. The New Mexico running back was the first Lobo to ever have back-to-back 200-yard rushing games and finished with 17 rushing touchdowns, which is third all-time in New Mexico football history.

Prior to New Mexico, Vincent served as the Interim Head Coach at UAB following the retirement of Bill Clark and led the Blazers to a 7-6 season and a win in the 2022 Bahamas Bowl. UAB's offense generated 30.1 points per game and 438.2 yards per game, which was the 33rd highest mark in the country. Vincent spent four seasons as UAB's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and was a key figure in elevating the program since its reinstatement in 2017. In all, Vincent helped lead UAB to a pair of Conference USA Championships and bowl game victories.

UAB has been the winningest team in Conference USA since returning to the playing field and collected 42 wins since Vincent returned as OC. The Blazers won the 2018 CUSA title game 27-25 over Middle Tennessee State, winning on the road, and the 2020 CUSA title game, that one 22-13 over Marshall, again on the road.

UAB also made it to the 2019 championship game as champions of their division. Since the reinstatement of the program in 2017, Vincent coached in five bowls games, qualifying for six. UAB won the 2018 Boca Raton Bowl 37-13 over Northern Illinois, the 2021 Independence Bowl 31-28 over BYU and the 2022 Bahamas Bowl. UAB also played in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl against Ohio and the 2019 New Orleans Bowl against App State, and the team qualified for the 2020 Gasparilla Bowl against South Carolina, before being canceled due to COVID-19.

With Vincent at offensive coordinator, the Blazers set FBS-program records for wins in 2018, going 11-3. Vincent never had a losing season with Blazers, going 7-6 as head coach and going 48-27 overall in his six years with UAB. The 2018 Blazers had the best offensive season in program history which resulted in 21 school records, including the aforementioned 11-3 overall record and winning the program's first Conference USA title and bowl game.

Among the school records that fell in 2018 included total points (418), total touchdowns (53), rushing touchdowns (32), total yards (5,680) and rushing yards (2,818). Additionally, UAB set the single game school record for total yards (668) and rushing yards (419) in a 52-3 victory over UTSA on Nov. 3, 2018.

Vincent is no stranger to the Sun Belt Conference and spent six years in two separate stints with South Alabama. He served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2015-17 and was an assistant coach from 2011-13 for the Jaguars' football program. Vincent helped guide the Jaguars to the 2016 Nova Home Loans Arizona Bowl led by record setting quarterback Dallas Davis. In Vincent's offense, Davis threw for the most yards in school history (2,706) and his 2,951 total yards of offense are second most in program history.

Before entering the collegiate ranks, Vincent was a successful high school football coach in Alabama and tallied a record of 49-16 in five seasons at two different schools. In his first season as a head coach, Vincent led Greenville High School to a 10-3 record and was selected as the Class 5A Coach of the Year in 2006. Vincent was at the helm of Spanish Fort High School football for four seasons and produced a record of 39-13. His team captured the Alabama 5A State Championship in 2010.

Vincent is a native of Glasgow, Kentucky. He and his wife Holli have two sons, Brady, a member of the ULM football coaching staff and Bret, a wide receiver for the Warhawks.
