The University of Maine men's ice hockey team returns to action when it travels to Florida to participate in the Florida College Classic for the 11th straight season. After a 16-day break, the Black Bears will face Miami in the first round of the tournament in a battle of top-10 teams, and then either St. Cloud or Cornell the following night.

**FLORIDA COLLEGE CLASSIC:** The 11th annual Florida College Classic features another strong field. Miami is ranked sixth in both national polls released on Monday, Dec. 13, while the Black Bears are ninth in both polls. Both Cornell and St. Cloud were in the top-15 in preseason national polls.

**SCOUTING THE BLACK BEARS:** Maine is led by junior Spencer Abbott (Hamilton, Ontario), who has 11 goals and 10 assists for 21 points on the season. He has a team-best four power play goals and one game-winner. Gustav Nyquist (Malmo, Sweden) has 20 points with six goals and 14 assists. Robby Dee (Plymouth, Minn.) is chipping in with six goals and 11 assists for 17 points. He has three power play goals. Joey Diamond (Long Beach, N.Y.) is adding eight goals and has seven assists for 15 points. He has two game-winning goals. Brian Flynn (Lynnfield, Mass.) has nine goals and five assists for 14 points. He has three power play goals and is tied for the team lead with two game-winning goals. Tanner House (Cochrane, Alberta) has 11 points on five goals and six assists. Josh Van Dyk (Woodstock, Ontario) has nine assists for nine points. Kyle Beattie (Avondale, Ariz.) is adding three goals and two assists for five points. Jeff Dimmen (Colorado Springs, Colo.) and Adam Shemansky (Robbinsville, N.J.) each have two goals and three assists for five points. Will O'Neill (Salem, Mass.) and Mike Cornell (Franklin, Mass.) are each chipping in with a goal and four assists for five points as well. Matt Mangene (Manorville, N.Y.) also has five points via five assists. Ryan Hegarty (Arlington, Mass.) has a goal and two assists for three points. Brice O'Connor (Londonderry, N.H.) and Mark Anthoine (Lewiston, Maine) have each dished out three assists for three points. Mark Nemec (Rouses Point, N.Y.) and Klas Leidermark (Gavle, Sweden) both have a goal and an assist for two points. Nick Pryor (Woodbury, Minn.) and Mike Banwell (Scarborough, Ontario) each have a pair of assists, while Theo Andersson (Gothenburg, Sweden) has one assist.

Dan Sullivan (York, Pa.) is 5-3-1 on the season with a 2.44 goals against average and a .892 save percentage. Shawn Sirman (Bleazard Valley, Ontario) is 2-0-2 in goal for the Black Bears. He has a 2.61 goals against average and a .911 save percentage. Martin Ouellette (St.-Hippolyte, Quebec) is 1-1-1 with a 2.25 goals against average and a .908 save percentage. Ouellette has Maine's lone shutout on the season.

**A LOOK BACK:** Brian Flynn's hat trick propelled Maine to 4-1 win over UMass in the final game of the first semester on Dec. 12. UMass jumped out to a 1-0 lead 14:34 into the first period when Chase Langerap beat Maine goalie Dan Sullivan. Flynn was able to knot the score at 1-1 at 5:33 of the second period. Robby Dee got the puck to Nick Pryor at the point. Pryor had a shot that a UMass defenseman blocked and fell on. Flynn was able to dig the puck out an one-time it past Minutemen goalie Paul Dainton. eventual game-winner 2:24 into the third period with assists from Nyquist and Pryor. Adam Shemansky gave Maine a 3-1 lead at 9:19 when a Brice O'Connor shot from the blueline deflected off him and past Dainton. Flynn got the hat trick at 17:56 to make it a 4-1 final.

Maine goalie Dan Sullivan made 21 saves in the game and improves to 5-3-1 on the season. Dainton made 28 saves and falls to 3-4-2.

The Black Bears had a 32-22 edge in shots on goal in the game. Maine was 1-for-4 on the power play, while UMass finished the game 0-for-4.

**FLYNN NAMED HOCKEY EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK ON DEC. 13:** Junior Brian Flynn was named the Athletic Republic Hockey East Player of the Week on Monday, Dec. 13. It was the second Player of the Week honor for Flynn this year. He is the lone player in Hockey East to have garnered the honor twice. Flynn had a goal in Maine's 4-3 overtime loss to New Hampshire on Friday, Dec. 10. He followed that up with a hat trick in Maine's 4-1 win over UMass on Sunday, Dec. 12. Flynn ended the first semester ranked second on the team in goals scored with nine.

**SELLOUT AT ALFOND:** There was a sellout crowd on hand to see the Maine vs. New Hampshire game on Friday, Dec. 10 at Alfond Arena. 5,445 fans packed the Alfond Arena. It was Maine's first sellout since Nov. 10, 2007 when the same number saw the Black Bears play Providence.

**FRIENDLY CONFINES OF ALFOND ARENA:** Maine is 6-1-1 at home the season. The lone loss came to then third-ranked New Hampshire 4-3 in overtime on Dec. 10.

**PRYOR GETS ON THE SCOREBOARD:** Sophomore Nick Pryor picked up his first career points with a pair of assists in Maine's 4-1 win over UMass on Dec. 12. Pryor has seen action at both forward and defense this season for the Black Bears.

**FIRST CAREER POINT:** Rookie defender Brice O'Connor picked up his first career point on Friday, Dec. 3 with an assist on Maine's first goal at Providence. O'Connor will always remember his first point, as it came on his first shift of the game with his older brother, Ian, a senior captain for the Friars, on the ice.

**BLANKING ITS OPPONENT:** Maine shut out Providence 5-0 on Saturday, Dec. 4. It is the first time that Maine has blanked an opponent since defeating UMass Lowell 2-0 on March 13, 2010 in the Hockey East quarterfinals. It was Maine's first road shutout since defeating New Hampshire 1-0 on Feb. 7, 2009 in a game played at the Verizon Center in Manchester.

**THREE POINT NIGHT:** Spencer Abbott had a part in all three goals on Friday, Dec. 3 in Maine's 3-3 tie at Providence. It was the second three point game for Abbott, who tallied a goal and two assists in Maine's 4-2 win against Merrimack on Jan. 9, 2010. Abbott has 11 goals on the season, a new career high.

**HIGH FIVE:** Maine defensemen Mike Cornell and Josh Van Dyk each finished the game a +5 on Saturday, Dec. 4 at Providence. Both defensemen were on the ice for all five of Maine's goals. Cornell leads Maine with a +12 on the season, while Van Dyk is second with a +10. Joey Diamond, Robby Dee and Mark Nemec are tied for third as each is +7.

**KILLING PENALTIES:** Maine has allowed just one power play goal in its last four games. The Black Bears have killed off 17 of the last 18 opponent power plays.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** Maine has three quality goaltending options. Sophomore Shawn Sirman came into the season as the only one with any collegiate experience. He is 2-0-2. Rookie Dan Sullivan has played in 10 games and is 5-3-1. Fellow classmate Martin Ouellette has seen action in three games. He is 1-1-1 with Maine's lone shutout on the season.

**OH SO CLOSE:** On Friday, Dec. 3 against Providence, Maine appeared to have won the game as overtime expired. Tanner House shot the puck into the net and it was called a goal on the ice. After reviewing the play, it was determined that the puck crossed the line just after time had expired. The game finished in a 3-3 tie.

**MOVING ON UP:** Maine is currently ranked ninth in both of the national college hockey polls released on Monday, Dec. 13. The Black Bears had a season-high ranking of third in the nation on Nov. 15. The last time Maine was ranked this high was the start of the 2006-07 season. After beginning the campaign 8-0-1, the Black Bears were ranked first in the country for three straight weeks from Oct. 23- Nov. 6, 2006.

**DEE REACHES 100-GAMES PLAYED PLATEAU:** Robby Dee played in his 100th career game on Saturday, Nov. 13 against Northeastern. He has currently seen action in 106 career games. He joined teammates Josh Van Dyk (120 games played), Tanner House (118 games played) and Jeff Dimmen (117 games played) who have reached the milestone. Gustav Nyquist and Brian Flynn are expected to be the next to reach the milestone. Each have played in 93 career games.

**PUTTING IN EXTRA TIME:** Maine has gone to overtime in six of its first 16 games. The Black Bears have a record of 1-1-4 in overtime games this season. The school record for overtime games in a season is 11 set in 2001-02. The most number of ties in a season is seven set in 2000-01 and tied in 2001-02 and 2004-05.

**ABBOTT NAMED ATHLETIC REPUBLIC HOCKEY EAST PLAYER OF THE MONTH:** Junior forward Spencer Abbott was named the Athletic Republic Hockey East Player of the Month

for October on Nov. 2. Abbott finished October with six goals and seven assists for 13 points. He led Hockey East in scoring and was ranked tied for fourth in the nation for the month. Abbott had at least one point in all seven games in October. He had two points in six of the seven games.

**NYQUIST REACHES 100-POINT PLATEAU:** Gustav Nyquist became the 48th player in Maine history to reach the 100-point plateau on Friday, Oct. 22 when he tallied a goal against then second ranked North Dakota. Brice picked up an assist on his first shift of the game with Ian on the ice.

**TWO GAME SCORING STREAK FOR NEMEC:** Mark Nemeč recently had a two-game scoring streak. He had Maine's lone goal at Boston College on Nov. 21 and then had an assist in Maine's game at Providence on Dec. 3. It was the first time in his career that he has had points in back-to-back games.

**PRYOR MAKES SEASON DEBUT:** Sophomore Nick Pryor (Woodbury, Minn.) made his season debut Dec. 3 at Providence. He missed the second half of last season with an injury. Pryor played forward for the Black Bears at Providence Dec. 3 and 4 and played the point on the power play.

**ABBOTT SETS SCHOOL RECORD WITH TWO GOALS IN 10 SECONDS:** Junior forward Spencer Abbott set a Maine school record on Friday, Oct. 15 when he scored two goals in the span of 10 seconds at Michigan State. Abbott broke the record for fastest two goals by an individual player that was set on Dec. 3, 2000 when Matthias Trattnig scored two goals in 17 seconds at Northeastern.

**WINNING IN OVERTIME ON THE ROAD:** Maine defeated Vermont 3-2 in overtime on Saturday, Oct. 30 in Burlington, Vt. It is the first time that the Black Bears have won a game in overtime on the road since defeating New Hampshire 3-2 in overtime on Feb. 2, 2003. The Black Bears almost won a second overtime game on the road on Dec. 3 at Providence, but it was ruled that the puck crossed the goal line just after the buzzer had sounded.

**EIGHT TENTHS OF A SECOND:** Robby Dee scored a goal on Saturday, Oct. 30 at Vermont with just eight tenths of a second remaining in the second period. At the time, the goal gave the Black Bears a 2-1 lead. The goal was officially credited at 19:59.

**FOUR FOR OCTOBER:** Maine posted four wins in the month of October. That is the most wins for the Black Bears in October since winning four in October 2007.

**FIVE GOAL FIRST:** Maine scored five goals in the first period on Friday, Oct. 22 in its 7-3 win over second ranked North Dakota. It is the first time that the Black Bears have scored five goals in a period since notching five in the third period on Feb. 26, 2010 at Merrimack. It is the first time that Maine has scored five goals in the first period since putting up five in the opening stanza against St. Lawrence on Nov. 28, 2009 at the Cumberland County Civic Center in Portland.

**SPREADING THE WEALTH:** Maine has eight wins on the season and six different players have chipped in with game-winning goals. Joey Diamond and Brian Flynn each have a pair while Spencer Abbot, Ryan Hegarty, Will O'Neill and Kyle Beattie each have a game-winner on the season.

**COMMANDING EDGE IN SHOTS:** Maine has outshot its opponents in 15 of 16 game and in the other game finished in a tie in shots on goal. For the season, the Black Bears have a 574-404 edge in shots. Maine's largest shots on goal margin was +24 against UConn. The lone game Maine did not outshoot its opponent was on Dec. 4 when both Maine and Providence registered 32 shots. Only four times this season has Maine allowed an opponent more than 25 shots on goal. Michigan State had 38 shots in a 4-4 tie on Oct. 14. Boston University got off 30 shots in a 2-2 tie on Nov. 6. Providence had 38 shots on Dec. 3 in a 3-3 tie and 32 shots the following night. Maine is averaging a +10.6 margin in shots per game.

**WHITEHEAD WINS 200TH GAME AT MAINE:** Maine head coach Tim Whitehead won his 200th career game as head coach of the Black Bears in the season-opener on Oct. 8 against UMass Lowell. He has a record of 207-130-40 in his 10th season as head coach of the Black Bears. Whitehead has

283 career victories. He ranks second all-time in victories at Maine, trailing Hall of Fame coach Shawn Walsh, who finished his career with 399 victories.

**FINDING THE BACK OF THE NET EARLY IN THE GAME:** Robby Dee has scored Maine's first goal of the game twice this season. He notched the season-opening goal just 69 seconds into the game on Oct. 8 against UMass Lowell. He tallied just 43 seconds into the game on Friday, Oct. 22 against North Dakota. In both games, Maine has skated to large margin victories. Both goals set the tone for the game early.

**WATCHING THE BLACK BEARS:** Maine had 5,361 fans at the game on Saturday, Oct. 23 against North Dakota. It is the most people to see a game at Alford Arena since 5,365 fans packed the Alford to watch Maine and Boston College on January 25, 2008. Maine has had 5,100 fans or more in five of its last six home games.

**DIMMEN, HOUSE CANDIDATES FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD:** Jeff Dimmen and Tanner House have been named two of the 20 finalists for the Lowe's Senior Class Award. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidates will be narrowed down to 10 midway through the season.

**FIT TO BE TIED:** The Black Bears skated to a tie in four of their first 16 games this season. In addition, two of the first three games ended in a tie. It is the first time in school history that two of the first three games have ended in a tie.

**IT'S BEEN A WHILE:** Maine opened the season with a win for the first time since the 2006-07 season when it defeated Minnesota 3-1. The last time Maine won by six goals in its opener was in 2004-05 when it skated past Vermont, who at that time was not a member of Hockey East, 7-1. It is the first time that the Black Bears have scored eight goals in the season-opener since 2002-03 when it downed Lake Superior State University 8-1.

**PRETTY GOOD OPENING 1:30:** In the season-opener against UMass Lowell on Friday, Oct. 8, Maine scored a goal in the first 1:30 of each period. Robby Dee notched the first goal of the season just 69 seconds into the game. Joey Diamond scored his second of the game just 76 seconds into the second period. Tanner House gave Maine a 7-1 lead just 55 seconds into the third period.

**SHORT-HANDED GOALS:** Maine scored a pair of short-handed goals in the same penalty kill early in the second period on Saturday, Oct. 9 against UConn. Tanner House found the back of the net at the :52 second mark of the second period, while Brian Flynn scored at 1:58.

**BLACK BEARS SELECTED SECOND IN HOCKEY EAST PRESEASON POLL:** Maine was selected second in the 2010 Hockey East Preseason Coaches Poll. Defending national champion Boston College was selected to win the league. The Eagles received nine first-place votes and 90 points overall. The Black Bears were second with one first-place vote and 80 points overall. UNH was third, while BU was fourth.

**FIVE GOALS, THREE TYPES OF GOALS:** Tanner House has five goals on the season and three different types of goals. He has two regular strength goals, two power play goals and a short-handed tally.

**NYQUIST NAMED TO HOBEY BAKER HAT TRICK:** Then sophomore sensation Gustav Nyquist was one of the three finalists for the 2010 Hobey Baker Award. He joined eventual winner Blake Geoffrion of Wisconsin and UNH standout Bobby Butler. Nyquist is the only one of the trio returning to play college hockey this season.

**SHINING LIKE A DIAMOND:** Sophomore forward Joey Diamond is off to a great start after finishing his rookie campaign on a high note. Diamond was named to the 2010 Hockey East All-Tournament team and was HEA Rookie of the Week late last year. Diamond has 11 goals and eight assists for 19 points in his last 18 games dating back to last season. He opened the season with two goals and two assists against UMass Lowell. He was named Hockey East Player of the Week on Nov. 15.

**A CONFERENCE OPENER:** Maine opened the 2010-2011 season with a Hockey East Conference game. It is the first time that the Black Bears have

opened the season with a conference tilt since facing Providence to start the 1993-94 season.

**NYQUIST LED NATION IN SCORING IN 2010:** Gustav Nyquist led the nation in scoring last season with 19 goals and 42 assists for 61 points. Fellow sophomore Derek Setpan of Wisconsin finished second with 12 goals and 42 assists for 54 points.

**MAINE LED NATION IN POWER PLAY PERCENTAGE IN 2010:** Maine led the nation in power play percentage a year ago. The Black Bears converted on 62 of their 224 power play chances to score at a 27.7 percent clip with the man advantage.

**2010-2011 MAINE CAPTAINS:** Tanner House returns to captain the Black Bears for the second year in a row. Jeff Dimmen will serve as an assistant captain this year for the second straight year as well. In addition, junior Gustav Nyquist will also serve as an assistant captain this season.

**LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON:** Maine rookie forward Kelen Corkum follows in the footsteps of his father, who played for the Black Bears from 1985-1989. The elder Corkum is now an associate head coach with the Black Bears. Kelen becomes the first second generation Black Bear. Kelen saw action in his first game on Sat., Nov. 6 at Boston University.

The Tournament is hosted by the Florida Everblades, a member of the ECHL and played at Germain Arena. Maine has won the tournament four times, in 2000, 2002, 2006 and 2009. The Black Bears have played in the championship game six years. Overall Maine has a 10-7-3 record in the Tournament. This year, Maine and Cornell are joined by Miami and St. Cloud

Dunham was part of a goaltending duo during the 1992-1993 season when he earned First Team All-American, First Team All-New England and First Team All-Hockey East honors. He shared goaltending duties with Garth Snow and helped lead Maine to its first-ever National Championship. He earned the Howard Neville Rookie of the Year team award in 1990-91. He played for the US Olympic Team in 1992, 1994 and 2002. He earned a silver medal with the 2002 team. Dunham played 10 years in the NHL including stints with the New York Rangers, Nashville Predators, New Jersey Devils and the New York Islanders. He currently serves as goaltending coach with the New York Islanders.

Bob Corkum and Dan Kerluke will serve as associate head coaches, while David Alexander will serve as the volunteer assistant. Corkum played at Maine from 1985-89. He then went on to have a 12-year, 720-game NHL career. Kerluke returns for his fifth season with the Black Bears. Kerluke was part of Maine's 1999 National Championship team. David Alexander will serve as a volunteer assistant coach with the Black Bears this season. A 2006 graduate of the University of New Brunswick, Alexander will work primarily with Maine's goaltenders.
