QUICK HITS

During the 2016 season, UMass field hockey...

- Makes its 26th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and second consecutive trip in 2015. The Minutewomen have been to the NCAA Tournament more times than any other Atlantic 10 team.
- Owns a conference-best 16 Atlantic 10 titles, more than all other current and former A-10 programs combined (13). UMass has won four the most recent five with victories in 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2016.
- Junior forward **Sarah Hawkshaw** ranks third in the conference with 15 goals scored, a single-season personal best. She is also the leader on the squad in points (34), shots (71) and shots on-goal (46).
- Had four returning players set single-season personal bests in points: **Sarah Hawkshaw** (34), **Grace Horgan** (9), **Nicole Kuerzi** (10) and **Nicole Miller** (29).
- Earned 10 year-end awards from the Atlantic 10 split across eight Minutewomen, including Defensive Player of the Year (**Melanie Kreusch**), all-conference first team (**Izzie Delario**, **Sarah Hawkshaw** and **Kreusch**), second team all-conference (**Anne Dijkstra**, **Celina Hocks** & **Nicole Miller**), an all-rookie award to Hocks and all-academic status for **Nicole Kuerzi** and **Cliodhna Loughlin**.
- Redshirt junior goalkeeper **Emily Hazard** is in her first season as the starting goalkeeper and is the only goalie on the 2016 roster. As a result, Hazard has played all 1,489 minutes and sports a 1.97 goals-against average and .622 save percentage.
- Leads the Atlantic 10 in scoring average (2.96), shots per game (14.57), goals scored per game (3.00) and total goals (63).
- Interim head coach **Amy Robertson** holds an all-time record of 142-142 entering the NCAA Tournament First Round. She previously coached for 14 seasons at Indiana University as its first varsity head coach from 2000-14.
- Is guaranteed its fifth consecutive winning season. Entering play at No. 2 Maryland, UMass is 71-40 in that span (.640) with 12 victories over NFCA nationally ranked teams.
- Includes seven international student-athletes hailing from Belgium (**Melanie Kreusch**), England (**Hannah Farrell**), Germany (**Celina Hocks**), Ireland (**Sarah Hawkshaw** & **Cliodhna Loughlin**) and The Netherlands (**Sophie de Jonge** & **Anne Dijkstra**). Assistant coach **Sarah Mansfield** is also a native of England.
- Represents 10 states with student-athletes from California (**Mirra Stillman**), Colorado (**Emily Hazard**), Delaware (**Sara Davis** & **Izzie Delario**), Massachusetts (**Jamie Melley**), Michigan (**Haley Notarantonio**), New Hampshire (**Shauna Rankin-Byrne**), New Jersey (**Nicole Kuerzi** & **Nicole Miller**), New York (**Hannah** and **Rachael Burchell** & **Courtney Ocasal**), Pennsylvania (**Hailey Cockrum** & **Maggie Harrison**) and Virginia (**Katie Clark** & **Grace Horgan**). Head coach **Amy Robertson** hails from Colorado.

MASSACHUSETTS-MARYLAND SCOUTING REPORT

University of Massachusetts field hockey and Maryland clash in the NCAA Tournament First Round on the Terrapins' campus in College Park, Maryland, at the Field Hockey & Lacrosse Complex. The game is Maryland's 29th NCAA appearance and marks the 26th for the Minutewomen.

Maryland is 17-4 overall and finished 7-1 in the ACC. The Terrapins entered the Big Ten Championship game on a 10-game winning streak; however, Penn State got the best of the Terrapins, 2-1 for the league title. Maryland begins NCAAAs as the No. 2 overall seed and No. 2 nationally ranked program in the nation.

Depth on offense propels the Terrapins up front, led by Welma Luus' 38 points via team-high 15 goals and eight assists. Grace Balsdon adds 31 points (13 goals, five assists) while two Terrapins sport 23 points: Linnea Gonzales and Emma Rissinger. Five additional Maryland competitors hold at least 10 points entering the NCAA Championship in Lein Holsboer (13), Madison Maguire (12), Sophie Pelzer (11), Kelee Lepage (10) and Carrie Hanks (10).

Two goalies split time in the cage for the Terrapins in Sarah Bates and Sarah Holliday, with nearly even time between them. Bates (738 minutes), sports a 10-1 record on the strength of a 1.83 goals-against average and .758 save percentage. Holliday is 7-3 with a 2.57 goals-against average and .672 save percentage.

Maryland is undefeated against Massachusetts in 15 meetings, including a narrow victory last time out when the No. 1 Terrapins escaped the Nook in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, with a 3-2 win. Current UMass senior Nicole Miller had two goals in the contest.

FIRST SEASON AS MASSACHUSETTS HEAD COACH // MASSACHUSETTS '88

University of Massachusetts Director of Athletics Ryan Bamford announced program alumna and veteran collegiate coach Amy Robertson as the UMass Field Hockey Interim Head Coach on Wednesday. Robertson brings a wealth of experience back to Western Massachusetts, including 15 NCAA Tournament appearances and more than 350 victories as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach over the previous three decades.

Robertson was a two-sport standout at the University of Massachusetts who competed for the field hockey and women's lacrosse programs. As a student-athlete, she helped the field hockey squad to 56 victories and four NCAA Tournament appearances from 1984-87, including a Final Four berth during her senior season.

After graduating from UMass in 1988, Robertson attained a master's degree in sport psychology from the University of Iowa while she simultaneously served as a graduate assistant coach on the field hockey staff from 1989-91. The Hawkeyes secured NCAA Tournament appearances in each of her three seasons on staff with Final Four spots in 1989 and 1990. She was also a U.S. National Team member and "A Camp" selection from 1987-90, including a 1989-90 Olympic Festival participant.

Robertson previously coached at the University of Massachusetts as an assistant from 1992-96, during which she helped guide the squad to the NCAA Final Four (1992) and Elite Eight (1993) among three tournament berths. The Minutewomen also claimed the Atlantic 10 Championship in 1992, 1993 and 1996.

Robertson joined the field hockey at Wake Forest in 1997 for a three-year stretch, which culminated in the squad earning an 18-4 record in 1999 and reaching the NCAA Elite Eight. The Demon Deacons were ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation during 1999, earned second place in the ultra-competitive ACC during the regular season and advanced to the conference championship game.

Outside of the collegiate arena, Robertson has been involved in Team USA training and club-level competition during her coaching career. She is currently the Region 8 U16 National Futures Team Head Coach while she previously served as the USA Field Hockey U19 Team leader during its 2008 tour through Chile. She holds a Level III coaching accreditation from USA Field Hockey.

In addition to her recent U16 team direction, Robertson previously served as an assistant coach for the U18 squad in 2001 and U16 team in 2003.

"I am very pleased that Amy has accepted our offer to lead the UMass field hockey program for the 2016 season," Bamford said. "Given the timing of our change in leadership, having an alum with considerable head coaching experience step up to direct our program is a tremendously positive outcome. Amy's excitement to mentor and challenge the women in our program to meet the high expectations we have for the upcoming season will serve us well this fall and beyond."

Robertson led the Indiana University field hockey program for 15 seasons from 2000-14, accumulating 134 victories and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances during her tenure. She oversaw the team's elevation from club level to NCAA Division I varsity status in 2000, earned Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2003 and led the program to the Elite Eight during its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2005.

During Robertson's tenure, the Hoosiers claimed eight all-America accolades, including two for 2005 Big Ten Player of the Year Kayla Bashore. Additionally, the program earned 29 NFHCA All-West Region honors to go with 30 All-Big Ten awards. Also noted for its academic prowess, IU field hockey picked up 81 Academic All-Big Ten laurels.

"I am so proud to return to my alma mater, UMass," Robertson said. "It is a privilege that the administration believes I am the right leader for this transition. I want to thank Ryan Bamford and his staff for this opportunity. I am extremely impressed with both the administrative support for the program and the desire of the student-athletes to pursue the highest athletic and academic achievements. I am excited and committed to taking this team as far as we can go in 2016 and helping to prepare for continued success in the future. I hope that my presence back on campus will invigorate our alumnae base, and create a buzz around this team that they so deserve. I cannot wait to get started."

UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS FIELD HOCKEY GAME NOTES

UMASS IN THE NCAA PLAY-IN ROUND

The 2016 NCAA Tournament marks the 26th appearance in the field for Massachusetts. It ranks the Minutewomen sixth across the NCAA Division I landscape for most tournament berths. UMass first appeared in the NCAA Tournament in 1981 and collected 13 consecutive berths from 1981-93. The Minutewomen also earned a spot in the field from 1997-2001, '07, '08, '10, '12, '13 and '15.

DELARIO HITS CAREER TRIPLE DIGITS

With five points on two goals and an assist in the NCAA Play-In Round at Monmouth, senior forward **Izzie Delario** reached 100 career points with the Minutewomen. Delario did so via 38 career assists and 31 goals scored over 75 games played. Delario is in the later stages of a standout senior season, during which she now owns 31 points over 21 games via 12 goals scored and seven assists. Delario had 26 points as a junior, 25 as a freshman and 18 as a sophomore.

PLAY-IN THEIR WAY IN

UMass field hockey played its way into the NCAA Tournament First Round with a 4-3 victory at Monmouth on Wed., Nov. 11. It improved the Minutewomen to 8-1 all-time in the NCAA Play-In Round. In the game against the Hawks, **Izzie Delario** (two goals, one assist), **Sarah Hawkshaw** (one goal) and **Nicole Miller** (one goal, one assist) accounted for all 10 points. The defense eliminated Monmouth's late comeback push as it turned aside a pair of penalty corner opportunities after time expired in the second half.

BACK-TO-BACK LIKE JORDAN '96, '97

UMass field hockey won the 2016 Atlantic 10 Championship with a 2-1 victory over Saint Joseph's in the title game on Sat., Nov. 5. It marked the second consecutive season and fourth in the last five years the Minutewomen claimed the league's crown. The 2016 title marked the team's 16th with the Atlantic 10, more than all other current or former league members combined (13). UMass also went back-to-back in 1992 and '93, won six straight from 1996-2001, claimed the 2007-08 crowns and again won back-to-back in 2012 and '13.

FIELD HOCKEY WINS 2016 ATLANTIC 10 CHAMPIONSHIP

University of Massachusetts field hockey used a late penalty corner conversion to secure the 2016 Atlantic 10 Championship over No. 1 seed and No. 20 nationally ranked Saint Joseph's, 2-1 at VCU's Cary Street Field in Richmond, Virginia, on Sat., Nov. 5.

The Minutewomen secured a berth in the NCAA Championship with the victory, their 13th win of the year. Saint Joseph's drops to 15-6 with the loss, the first to an Atlantic 10 team this season.

Nicole Miller gave the Minutewomen the decisive goal in the 67th minute. The senior forward cleaned up a loose play in front following a penalty corner chance, one of nine the Maroon and White earned against the Saint Joseph's defense.

FOUR NAMED TO A-10 ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

UMass field hockey's **Izzie Delario**, **Sarah Hawkshaw**, **Nicole Miller** and **Shauna Rankin-Byrne** each earned Atlantic 10 All-Tournament Team immediately following completion of the championship contest. Additionally, Hawkshaw was named the Atlantic 10 Championship Most Outstanding Player.

Hawkshaw led all players in the tournament with seven points on three goals and an assist. Delario and Miller each scored in the championship game while Rankin-Byrne helped stabilize the defense throughout the tournament to the tune of only two goals allowed.

HAWKSHAW'S HATTY SENDS UMass TO A-10 TITLE GAME

UMass field hockey junior midfielder and forward **Sarah Hawkshaw** won the Atlantic 10 Championship Most Outstanding Player Award with seven points over the two-game slate, split between three goals and one assist.

She now owns a team-high 15 goals scored following the NCAA Play-In Round, a single-season career best. The Dublin, Ireland, native is currently second only to Izzie Delario (31) for most active goals among Minutewomen as Hawkshaw enters the NCAA Tournament First Round with 30.

Three more from the squad earned placement on the Atlantic 10 All-Conference Second Team in **Anne Dijkstra**, **Celina Hocks** and **Nicole Miller**. Hocks, a junior transfer from Germany with no prior collegiate field hockey experience, was also named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team. **Nicole Kuerzi** and **Cliodhna Loughlin** were recognized for their respective successes in the classroom as members of the A-10 All-Academic Team.

DELARIO SELECTED TO NFHCA SENIOR GAME ROSTER

The National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) announced the 2016 NFHCA Senior Game selections and alternates on Mon., Oct. 31, including University of Massachusetts forward **Izzie Delario**. Delario, a starter up front in all 21 games for the Minutewomen, was one of only three Atlantic 10 student-athletes among the 50 participants and alternates.

The Rehoboth Beach, Delaware, native was previously lauded by the NFHCA with third team all-America as a junior in 2015, when Delario was also an NFHCA All-Northeast First Team and Atlantic 10 All-Conference First Team choice.

UMass sports six Minutewomen in double-digits atop its points leaderboard in 2016, led by **Sarah Hawkshaw's** 34 points and followed closely by 31 from **Izzie Delario** and 29 by **Nicole Miller**. **Melanie Kreusch** adds 13 points, ahead of 12 from **Celina Hocks** and 10 by **Nicole Kuerzi**.

Among Atlantic 10 Conference teams, Massachusetts is tied for first with Lock Haven, ahead of Davidson, Saint Joseph's and Saint Francis (Pa.) for most double-digit points scorers as the Wildcats, Hawks and Red Flash follow with five.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

The UMass roster is dotted with international student-athletes with five countries represented on the roster in addition to the United States. **Melanie Kreusch** hails from Belgium while **Hannah Farrell** represents England and **Sarah Hawkshaw** and **Clíodhna Loughlin** are natives of Dublin, Ireland. **Sophie de Jonge** and **Anne Dijkstra** mark the fourth nation outside the U.S. represented and hails from The Netherlands and **Celina Hocks** is from Germany. In addition to the competitors, assistant coach **Sarah Mansfield** is a native of England.

SCORING MORE AND MORE

UMass field hockey has the top-scoring offense in the Atlantic 10 this season with 63 goals in 21 games played for an average of 3.0 per contest. **Sarah Hawkshaw** leads the way with 15 goals scored, followed by 12 for **Izzie Delario** and nine by **Nicole Miller**. Hawkshaw's 15 goals ranks third in the conference and makes her one of only four Atlantic 10 players with 10 or more goals on the year. Delario and Hawkshaw are the only pair of teammates in double-figures.

IT'S MILLER TIME!

Senior forward **Nicole Miller** is having a career-year as a senior with a personal best 29 points via nine goals and 11 assists as a starter up front in all 21 games played. Miller leads the team in assists and is third in goals scored. She has the highest shots-on-goal percentage among players with at least 10 attempts as she put 28 of her 37 shots on-target (75.7 percent).

ASSISTS A-PLENTY

A pair of current Minutewomen rank in the top-10 all-time in program history for assists in seniors **Izzie Delario** and **Clíodhna Loughlin**. Delario owns 38 career assists, the fourth-most among all Minutewomen and three from surpassing **Holly Hockenbrock** (1990-93) in third with 40. Loughlin sits 10th with 25 and is one behind **Judy Strong** (1978-81) and **Kate Putnam** (1995-99) tied for eighth.

CLIPPING THE EAGLES

University of Massachusetts field hockey took a 3-2 overtime game at No. 9 Boston College on Sun., Sept. 25. It marked the highest-ranked team downed by the Minutewomen since the squad defeated No. 7 Virginia, 4-3, in overtime during the NCAA Tournament First Round on Nov. 16, 2013.

UMass rallied from down one goal on two occasions against the Eagles as BC led 1-0 following a 23rd-minute goal and 2-1 in the 42nd minute. **Sarah Hawkshaw** provided the game-tying tally at the 54:23 mark to force overtime. **Anne Dijkstra** ended it with her first goal of the year in the 82nd minute as Dijkstra forced a turnover near the Boston College circle, dribbled in and shot into the right side for the sudden victory.

GUNNED FOR THE GOALS RECORD & GOT IT

University of Massachusetts field hockey dropped 12 goals on Saint Louis in a shutout win at the Gladchuk Sports Complex on Fri., Sept. 16. It reset the program record for goals scored in a single-game. Previously, UMass scored 11 on two occasions, including one performance accomplished by the current seniors during their freshman year. The Minutewomen had 11 at Saint Louis in a shutout of the Billikens on Sat., Oct. 12, 2013 and also posted 11 at Smith College on Oct. 25, 1979.

OFFENSIVE FIREWORKS ON FULL DISPLAY

University of Massachusetts field hockey posted eight goals at UMass Lowell on Sun., Sept. 4. It marked the most offense by the Minutewomen since a 9-1 win over Saint Joseph's on Oct. 20, 2013 – a span of 53 games between the eight-goal outing.

Melanie Kreusch and **Nicole Kuerzi** each posted two-goal games while **Izzie Delario**, **Sarah Hawkshaw**, **Celina Hocks** and **Nicole Miller** scored once apiece. Delario and **Clíodhna Loughlin** also had three assists each while Hocks added two and Katie Clark earned her first collegiate point via an assist.

KEEPING THE KENNEDY CUP

The University of Massachusetts and UMass Lowell started a new tradition during 2013 in tandem with UMass Lowell's elevation to Division I: the Kennedy Cup. Through four meetings, the Minutewomen have not relinquished the game trophy.

The Maroon and White blanked UMass Lowell during the inaugural game, 6-0 on Sept. 3, 2013. One year later, Massachusetts traveled to the River Hawks for a 3-1 victory on Sept. 14, 2014. Last season, offensive fireworks were displayed through the 4-3 UMass win on Sept. 11. This year, the Minutewomen controlled the tempo en route to an 8-0 victory.

The Kennedy Cup is named in honor of University of Massachusetts and UMass-Lowell alumnus, John F. Kennedy, who is a strong supporter and graduate of both institutions.

ROBERTSON RETURNS TO HER ALMA MATER

1988 University of Massachusetts graduate **Amy Robertson** returned to her alma mater to serve as the UMass field hockey interim head coach for the 2016 season. Robertson previously held an assistant coach position with the Minutewomen from 1992-96 and was a standout defender from 1984-87.

Robertson led the Indiana University field hockey program for 15 seasons from 2000-14, accumulating 134 victories and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances during her tenure. She oversaw the team's elevation from club level to NCAA Division I varsity status in 2000 and led the program to the Elite Eight during its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2005.

She also served as an assist at Iowa (1989-91) and Wake Forest (1997-99) prior to her 15-year tenure at Indiana. Over the previous three decades, Robertson accumulated 15 NCAA Tournament appearances and more than 350 victories as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

FRESH FACE IN THE CAGE

University of Massachusetts field hockey features a new starter in the cage for the first time since the 2012 season in redshirt junior **Emily Hazard**.

Hazard, a Highlands Ranch, Colo., native saw limited time behind previous starter Sam Carlino over the last two seasons. She entered the year with 24 minutes, 15 seconds in the cage and a career 2.89 goals-against average.
