MASSACHUSETTS-HOLY CROSS PREVIEW

The University of Massachusetts and Holy Cross renew a long-running series for its 55th all-time meeting with a Sun., Nov. 20 contest at the DCU Center in Worcester, Mass. The Minutemen and Crusaders first met during the 1907-08 season and Holy Cross owns the series advantage, 34-20. However, Massachusetts has won nine of the last 12 contests dating back to the 1985-86 season.

Holy Cross is coming off of an improbable run to the 2016 NCAA Tournament as the team finished the year 10-15 overall and just 5-13 in the Patriot League, but secured a national postseason berth with four consecutive road victories in the Patriot League Tournament. The Crusaders defeated Loyola (Md.), 72-67 in the opening round, followed up with a 77-72 double-overtime victory at Bucknell, thrashed Army West Point, 60-38 to reach the championship game and slipped by Lehigh, 59-56 for the Patriot League's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Holy Cross is currently 0-2 on the season with losses at South Carolina, 90-46 and Syracuse, 81-49. Robert Champion's 13 points per game leads the Crusaders while Malachi Alexander scores 11.5 with a team-best 6.5 rebounds on average.

Bill Carmody is in his second season at the helm of the program. A veteran of the NCAA Division I head coaching ranks, Carmody is in his 19th campaign as a program leader, including 13 years at Northwestern (2000-13) after four at Princeton (1996-99). He holds a 299-267 career record with three NCAA berths and six NIT appearances.

The last time these teams met, Massachusetts came away with an 83-76 victory after the Minutemen held off a late Crusader charge. The Maroon and White held a 24-point lead with just over eight minutes to play; however, Holy Cross put together a 26-6 run and closed the gap to four in the final two minutes. UMass mustered the strength needed to hold off the rally for the home victory that improved the Minutemen to 6-0 on the young season.

UMASS BASKETBALL FASTBREAK POINTS

University of Massachusetts men's basketball...

- Head coach Derek Kellogg is in his ninth season at the helm of the program in 2015-16. Kellogg, a
 1995 graduate of the University of Massachusetts, sports a 142-120 career record currently, the thirdmost wins by a head coach in the more-than 100-year history of the program and the 15th-most in the
 history of the Atlantic 10 Conference.
- Newcomers provide an average of 47.7 points per game led by **DeJon Jarreau** (15.0), **Luwane Pipkins** (12.7) and **Zach Lewis** (12.0). Tyrn Flowers adds 4.7 per game and Chris Baldwin scores 3.3 on average. It equates to 57.7 percent of the team's total points per game over the opening three games.
- Freshman guard **Luwane Pipkins** tied the program record with eight steals against UMass Lowell. It was his first collegiate game. He has 14 on the season through three contests, the most by a single player and the highest per game average (4.7) in NCAA Division I men's basketball. As a team, the Minutemen are seventh in total steals and 13th for steals per game as of contests on Fri., Nov. 18.
- Freshman guard **DeJon Jarreau** is fifth nationally for assists with 20 over the opening three games. This reflects games played through Fri., Nov. 18. He is 27th for assists per game (6.7) and has produced no less than six assists in each appearance.
- Only has one senior on the roster, walk-on forward Zach Turcotte. The Minutemen are the only team in the Atlantic 10 with one or fewer seniors.
- Junior guard Donte Clark has at least eight points in each of his last 41 career games. He has scored double-figures in 34 of those contests.
- Sophomore center **Rashaan Holloway** is 22nd in NCAA Division I men's basketball for total free throw attempts with 24 on the year. The 6-foot-11, 310 pound big-man has made 14 of those.
- Ranks 25th in the nation for total blocks (17) through games played on Fri., Nov. 18. It is an average
 of 5.7 per game. Rashaan Holloway leads the team with 2.0 per appearance, putting Holloway in 79th
 nationally for stuffs.
- Junior guard Donte Clark was named to the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Team, one of only five non-seniors recognized on the yearly preseason accolades list.
- Head coach Derek Kellogg promoted Shyrone Chatman to associate head coach prior to the start of
 the year. Chatman's first season as associate head coach doubles as his sixth campaign on the coaching
 staff after he spent the previous five years as an assistant.
- Hosts 18 games at home in the Mullins Center, a program record for the regular season. The slate is split evenly between non-conference and Atlantic 10 play.
- Played UMass Lowell in the first game of the 2016-17 season between NCAA Division I teams thanks to the 4 p.m. matinee tipoff at the Mullins Center. Massachusetts won, 90-76.
- Head coach Derek Kellogg inked a recruiting class that ranks among the most highly touted nationally
 with Chris Baldwin, Tyrn Flowers, Brison Gresham, DeJon Jarreau and Unique McLean. The
 quintet combined to give the Minutemen the top class in the A-10 according to 247Sports, ESPN and
 Rivals. The rankings do not reflect the addition of Luwane Pipkins (2015-16 academic non-qualifier)
 or Zach Lewis (transfer from Canisius College).
- The Minutemen moved into their new home during the Summer 2015, the John Francis Kennedy
 Champions Center for UMass Basketball. The 53,000 square foot dedicated facility features full practice
 courts, a strength and conditioning suite, state-of-the-art athletic training space, office and meeting
 areas for the coaches and team, a theatre-style film room, a UMass basketball hall of fame as well as
 additional spaces for team meals, equipment management and miscellaneous team-related resources.
- Guard trio of **Donte Clark**, **Trey Davis** and **Jabarie Hinds** provide 67.1 percent of the offense on average in 2015-16 with a combined 49.3 points per game for the Minutemen. At least one of the three recorded the most points by a Minuteman in 30 of the 32 games played by the team this season.

FAST-HANDED MINUTEMAN

Freshman guard **Luwane Pipkins** has the most steals across NCAA Division I men's basketball with 14 and also leads the nation steals per game (4.7). He had eight in the opener against UMass Lowell, four more at Ole Miss and a pair against Temple.

His eight against UMass Lowell also rank tied for the most in a single game in NCAA Division I this season and in the history of the UMass men's basketball program.

Led by Pipkins' 14, Massachusetts is fifth in the nation for total steals (34) and 13th in steals per game (11.3).

MORE THAN BEGINNER'S LUCK

After he had four points (1-4 FG, 0-1 3FG, 2-2 FT) in the season-opener against UMass Lowell, **DeJon Jarreau** posted back-to-back team-leading performances on the scoreboard with 25 points at 0le Miss and 16 more against Temple. During the two games, Jarreau was 12-of-26 on field goals (.462), including 6-14 on 3-point attempts (.429), and 11-16 at the foul line (.688) for 20.5 points per game.

MAKING THE LAST PASS

Massachusetts men's basketball has assists on 52 of its 82 made field goals this season, equal to 63.4 percent. Opponents are only average an assist on 50.0 percent of their conversions (37-of-74).

DEEKY THE DISTRIBUTOR

Freshman guard **DeJon Jarreau** - nicknamed "Deeky" - has 20 assists over the opening three games of the season. This ranks him first in the Atlantic 10 for total assists and second for per game assists (6.7). He is the only freshman in the top-15. It also ranks him tied for 27th in the nation and fifth among freshmen.

Jarreau does not play favorites with who he dishes to and has distributed the ball to eight scorers for his 20 assists, including C.J. Anderson (1), Chris Baldwin (3), Donte Clark (4), Tyrn Flowers (3), Rashaan Holloway (3), Malik Hines (1), Zach Lewis (2) and Luwane Pipkins (3).

He has as many assists as the next two Minutemen combined: Clark (11) and Pipkins (9).

D33KY FOR THR33KY

Freshman guard **DeJon Jarreau** has six made 3-pointers over the last two games, with his latest also his most clutch. Jarreau drained a right side triple against Temple with 34 seconds left that put the Minutemen up 68-67 en route to a 70-67 victory over the Owls. Jarreau also had the final fastbreak layup for five points in the last 34 seconds of the game.

BETTER PERFECT THE FINGER-WAG

UMass men's basketball is averaging 5.7 blocks per game over the opening three contests, led by six from **Rashaan Holloway** and three apiece from **Malik Hines** and **Zach Lewis**. On the other end of the court, foes have only turned aside eight UMass attempts combined.

THE CHICAGO BULLDOG

Chicago native and Bogan High School graduate **Luwane Pipkins** made his first collegiate game a memorable performance with eight steals against UMass Lowell, which tied Pipkins for the single-game program record in the category. Pipkins is tied with **Alex Eldridge**, who previously had eight apiece against Harvard (Nov. 30, 1977) and Maine (Feb. 11, 1978).

Pipkins did not play favorites with UMass Lowell and spread his eight swipes over five River Hawks: Rinardo Perry (3), Jahad Thomas (2), Stefan Borovac (1), Matt Harris (1) and Isaac White (1).

THE SHORT AND LONG OF THINGS

The shortest (Luwane Pipkins, 5-foot-11) and tallest (Rashaan Holloway, 6-foot-11) players on the roster combined for domination on both sides of the court to the tune of 35 points, nine steals, eight rebounds, three blocks and three assists in the 90-76 win over UMass Lowell.

Pipkins tied the UMass record for steals in a game with eight while he posted 14 points in his first collegiate game. Holloway reset his career high with 21 points and turned aside three shots.

20/20 COURT VISION

Delon Jarreau dished out seven assists (six during the second half) in 22 minutes played during his first collegiate game. The freshman from New Orleans, La., split time between point guard and playing offball. Jarreau shared the ball with six different Minutemen in those seven assists: **Tyrn Flowers** (2), **C.J. Anderson, Chris Baldwin, Donte Clark, Malik Hines** and **Luwane Pipkins**.

He has at least six assists in all three of his games played.

THE BEST POSSIBLE OPENING ACT OUTCOME

UMass defeated UMass Lowell, 90-76, in its 2016-17 season opener, which marked the seventh consecutive season the Minutemen began the year victorious. Head coach Derek Kellogg is 8-1 in season-openers over the last nine seasons

FIRST!

The University of Massachusetts and UMass Lowell combined to play the first Division I game of the 2016-17 season with the 4 p.m. tipoff time at the Mullins Center on Fri., Nov. 11. The Minutemen won, 90-76, led by Rashaan Holloway's 21 points.

THE FIRST TIMERS

Five Minutemen made their team debuts during the 90-76 win over UMass Lowell, including **Chris Baldwin**, **Tyrn Flowers**, **DeJon Jarreau**, **Zach Lewis** and **Luwane Pipkins**. The quintet combined for 43 points, 17 rebounds, 12 steals and 11 assists.

MINUTEMEN DEPLOY THE YOUNG GUNS

UMass men's basketball's 2016-17 roster features only one senior, walk-on **Zach Turcotte**. The remainder of the roster breaks down to five juniors, three sophomores and six freshmen. The Minutemen are the only team in the Atlantic 10 with a one-man senior class.

MAXING OUT OUR TIME IN THE MULLINS CENTER

UMass men's basketball's will play 18 regular season home games at the Mullins Center in 2016-17, a one-year record for the program. Massachusetts also played 18 games at the Mullins Center in 2010-11, which included one Atlantic 10 Tournament contest along with 17 regular season contests in the building.

KELLOGG RANKS AMONG WINNINGEST COACHES IN A-10 HISTORY

Head coach **Derek Kellogg** ranks among the winningest coaches in the history of the Atlantic 10 Conference with 142 victories at the helm of the UMass program. He stands 15th all-time among Atlantic 10 head coaches and is fifth among current leaders after Phil Martelli (406; Saint Joseph's), Chris Mooney (204; Richmond), John Giannini (185; La Salle) and Mark Schmidt (147; St. Bonaventure). Records reflect tenures through games on Tues., Nov. 15.

GIMME THAT!

University of Massachusetts took possession from UMass Lowell with 17 steals against the River Hawks. It marked the most since UMass also had 17 against Northeastern on Nov. 26, 2014. The River Hawks turned the ball over 28 times total during the game.

THE FIRST FLUSH

Malik Hines recorded the first dunk of the 2016-17 during the season half of the 90-76 win over UMass Lowell. Hines hammered down on a pass from **DeJon Jarreau** with 14:26 to go in the game. The bucket increased the UMass lead to 65-43.

Hines has a pair of dunks through three games, tied with **Rashaan Holloway** for the team lead as the front-court pair are the only Minutemen with dunks this season.

CLARK CHOSEN TO ATLANTIC 10 PRESEASON THIRD TEAM

University of Massachusetts junior guard **Donte Clark** picked up an Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Third Team honor, as announced by the league. Clark averaged 16.1 points per game as a sophomore with 3.8 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game.

Clark is one of only five non-seniors chosen to the Atlantic 10 Preseason Awards listing. He had 14 points and nine rebounds in the season-opener against UMass Lowell.

CHATMAN PROMOTED TO ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

University of Massachusetts men's basketball head coach **Derek Kellogg** announced ninth-year staff member **Shyrone Chatman's** elevation to associate head coach on Sept. 8. Chatman's first season as associate head coach doubles as his sixth campaign on the coaching staff after he spent the previous five years as an assistant.

Since moving to the role of assistant coach with recruiting and on-court responsibilities five seasons ago, UMass has produced 101 victories, posted three 20-win seasons and, in 2014, made the school's ninth all-time NCAA Tournament trip and first since the 1997-98 campaign. With Chatman's help, the Minutemen also made a pair of NIT appearances, including an NIT Final Four showing in 2012, and reached the Atlantic 10 Tournament semifinals on two occasions.

Before his promotion to assistant coach, Chatman served as the director of player personnel in his first three seasons with the University of Massachusetts men's basketball program. He joined UMass after two seasons on-staff at his alma mater, the University of Memphis.

NEW NUMBER, WHO DIS?

Four returning Minutemen changed their numbers prior to the season. **Seth Berger** dropped 24 in favor of 33, **Zach Coleman** switched from 13 to 14, **Rayshawn Miller** moved off of 35 to 11 and **Zach Turcotte** changed from 55 to 34. In addition to the returnees with new numbers, the rookies will be playing for the first time in No. 2 (**Luwane Pipkins**), No. 3 (**DeJon Jarreau**), No. 4 (**Unique McLean**), No. 5 (**Chris Baldwin**), No. 24 (**Tyrn Flowers**) and No. 55 (**Brison Gresham**).

Zach Lewis, a redshirt junior transfer in his first season of competition at UMass, will wear No. 1.

MINUTEMEN IN THE COMMUNITY

Head coach **Derek Kellogg** keeps the Minutemen involved in the local and regional community through a multitude of civic responsibilities.

All members of the men's basketball team joined in the Pi Kappa Phi 2016 Ability Experience fundraiser, which included a 36-hour bike-a-thon to help raise awareness and donations for those who live with disabilities. During their time spent at the fundraiser, the Minutemen participated in the bike-a-thon and handed out flyers to students passing by the on-campus fundraiser.

Kellogg and the Minutemen also participate in the JDRF One Walk at Six Flags New England each fall in support of the fight against childhood diabetes. UMass men's basketball also visits Crocker Farms Elementary School to read to its students and participate in the annual Walk To School Day.

HIGHLY-TOUTED QUINTET FILLS OUT LATEST RECRUITING CLASS

Head coach **Derek Kellogg** brought five new members to the program on during the 2015-16 signing periods as **Chris Baldwin, Tyrn Flowers, DeJon Jarreau, Brison Gresham** and **Unique McLean** signed their National Letters of Intent to compete for the Maroon and White beginning in 2016-17. The quintet combined to earn a national ranking across the three major recruiting services: 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals. In addition to the praise heaped on the individual student-athletes, Kellogg's signees represent the top ranked class across all Atlantic 10 programs.

Baldwin, the No. 2 ranked player in Massachusetts and a four-star recruit via ESPN, hails from Springfield where he attended Notre Dame Prep.

Flowers, a unanimous three-star selection, held the No. 4 spot for the State of Connecticut according to ESPN and 247Sports. He won three consecutive state championships with Sacred Heart High School as a sophomore, junior and senior.

Gresham, who was a teammate with Jarreau at McDonogh 35 High School in New Orleans before he joined Baldwin at Notre Dame Prep, ranked No. 7 among players from the state of Louisiana according to 247Sports with an overall grade of 92.

ESPN also touts the abilities of Jarreau, who is a four-star player tabbed No. 61 overall in their top-100 listing with more than 20 offers from NCAA Division I programs across the country.

McLean, who played locally at the MacDuffie School in Granby, chose the Minutemen over Rutgers and a trio of other Atlantic 10 institutions in Dayton, Fordham and Rhode Island.

Luwane Pipkins joins the class after he was a non-qualifier as a freshman in 2015-16. The 2014 signee is a four-star recruit according to ESPN and listed as a three-star player with a grade of 88 by 247Sports. Pipkins was also the No. 7 recruit in the state of Illinois via ESPN, No. 22 at point guard nationally and No. 23 in his region while he was slated as the No. 9 recruit in the state and 41st at the point guard position by 247Sports.

CLARK WORKING HIS WAY TO THAT COMMA

Despite only being three games into his junior season in 2016-17, **Donte Clark** already surpassed 800 career points. Clark currently has 863, an average of 12.9 per game played since the beginning of his freshman year (67 contests).

Clark expedited his process of getting to 1,000 points through his stellar sophomore season that included 16.1 points per game (515 over 32 games), a 41.0 field goal percentage and 139 free throws made in 185 taken (75.1 percent).

CLARK STEADY AS THEY COME

Donte Clark produced 16.1 points per game over the 18-game league season in 2015-16, a continuation of his success from 2015-16 non-conference play. Clark scored double-figures in 15 of those games, including 20 vs. Saint Joseph's, 21 at No. 25 Dayton and vs. George Washington to go with 22 in the win over VCU, 23 at Richmond and 25 at home against St. Bonaventure. He finished 15th in the A-10 for scoring during the entire season and in league-only play.

Clark averaged a similar total (17.6 points scored per game) during the non-conference slate as he produced 209 during 12 out-of-league games.

BETTER LATE TO THE BLOCK PARTY THAN TO NEVER SHOW UP

Freshman center **Rashaan Holloway** finished his freshman year with 13 blocks in the last 13 games after he had five during the opening 19 contests. **Cady Lalanne** was the last UMass freshman center with at least 10 blocks in his inaugural season when the recent NBA draft pick had 21 in 2011-12. Holloway ranked tied for second on the team in blocks (**Antwan Space**) and had the most among underclassmen.

Holloway ranks first among Minutemen with six blocks. It ties him for third in the conference in total blocks and blocks per game.

ANDERSON THE FACILITATOR

C.J. Anderson sported a +1.81 assist-to-turnover ratio on the 2015-16 season (67 assists, 37 turnovers), which improved to +1.95 in the final 18 games (41 assists, 21 turnovers). He earned multiple assists in 12 of those contests and only coughed up more than one turnover on five occasions in that span.

CLARK PICKS UP EVEN BETTER THAN WHERE HE LEFT OFF

Donte Clark scored in double figures during each of the final five games of his true freshman season in 2014-15 and averaged 14.4 points per game in the span. Over his sophomore campaign, Clark averaged 16.1 points per game, which stands 13th overall in the A-10 as of the end of the regular season. He shot 41.0 percent overall (157-of-383), including 33.9 percent from beyond the arc (62-of-183), and hit 139 of his 185 free throws (75.1 percent).

CLARK POSTS 20-POINTERS

After he had three games with 20 or more points in 2014-15 over 30 appearances, **Donte Clark** tripled his freshman year's output with nine in 32 games as a sophomore. Clark provided 20 or more versus Clemson (25; Nov. 23), Ole Miss (24; Dec. 5), New Orleans (30; Dec. 16), LIU Brooklyn (21; Dec. 29), No. 25 Dayton (21; Jan. 6), St. Bonaventure (25; Jan. 9) and Richmond (23; Feb. 6), VCU (22; Feb. 11) and Saint Joseph's (20; Feb. 24).

UMASS IN THE MULLINS CENTER

Since the beginning of the 2011-12 season, the Minutemen are 56-19 overall (.747) and 27-15 in Atlantic 10 contests (.643) in the Mullins Center.

UMass completed its 23rd season playing at the Mullins Center in the Spring 2016 and holds an alltime record of 224-94 (.704) at the facility. The Minutemen also own a 122-63 (.659) historical mark in regular season Atlantic 10 Conference games at the Mullins Center, and a 4-2 ledger in Atlantic 10 Tournament contests. The first game was played on Feb. 4, 1993, when UMass bested West Virginia, 64-59 in overtime.

AIMING FOR 80-A-GAME

UMass was nearly perfect in 2015-16 when it scored at least 80 points in a game at 7-1. When the Maroon and White score fewer than 80 points the squad was 5-16 overall. The 80+ point games included Howard, (85-79), Central Arkansas (89-62), Clemson (82-65), Boston University (99-69), New Orleans (103-95 [0T]), LIU Brooklyn (83-79) and Duquesne (108-99 [0T]).

The wins when scoring fewer than 80 points came at Harvard, 69-63 on Nov. 17; at La Salle, 74-67 on Jan. 3, against Rhode Island in overtime, 61-56 on Feb. 2; over VCU, 69-63; vs. George Mason, 70-64 and in the Atlantic 10 Championship Second Round over Rhode Island, 67-62. The lone loss is the 85-83 defeat at St. Bonaventure on Feb. 27.

SHOOTING THEIR WAY TO VICTORIES

When the Minutemen outshot their opponents, UMass sported 12 wins in 16 chances during 2015-16. However, when the opposition holds a higher conversion rate, Massachusetts went 2-14 on the year.

GUARD TRIO WENT OFF FOR UNIVERSITY OF SPLASH-ACHUSETTS

Starting guards **Donte Clark** and **Trey Davis** and **Jabarie Hinds** all ranked among the 20 highest scoring players across the Atlantic 10 in 2015-16. Davis was first among Minutemen with 18.7 points per game (fourth in A-10), followed by Clark (16.1; 15th) and Hinds (14.5; 20th). Richmond and St. Bonaventure are the only other Atlantic 10 schools that have three shooters among the top-20 in scoring.

Each of the three eclipsed double-digits in scoring during the same game on 13 occasions. Davis led the way with 16 games of 20 or more points while Clark sported nine and Hinds owned seven. The last trio to average 14.0 or more points was **Mike Pyatt** (15.6), **Mark Donoghue** (15.5) and **Jim Town** (14.9) in 1975-76.

FIVE 30+ POINT GAMES MARKED MOST IN 20 YEARS

Three 30+ point performances by **Trey Davis** (40 vs. New Orleans; 30 at Davidson; 36 vs. Saint Louis) and one each from **Donte Clark** (30 vs. New Orleans) and **Jabarie Hinds** (37 at Duquesne) gives UMass men's basketball its most 30-point individual performances since the team had seven in 1995-96 (**Marcus Camby 5**; **Donta Bright** 1; **Carmelo Travieso** 1).

PLAYING CLEAN LED TO WINS

UMass only turned the ball over six times during the 69-63 win at Harvard on Nov. 17, 2015, its fewest giveaway since the squad had five in n 80-62 win over Saint Joseph's on Feb. 9, 2013. It was a span of 77 contests between the two outings. Over the previous five seasons, the Minutemen have committed less than 10 turnovers on 12 occasions and are 8-4 in those contests.

FINDING FRIENDS INSTEAD OF FOES

UMass posted 24 assists against 12 turnovers in the 89-62 victory over Central Arkansas on Nov. 19. The last time UMass had at least 24 assists and doubled its turnover total was Feb. 2, 2013 at Charlotte (24 assists, nine turnovers). The Minutemen nearly tripled up on assists over turnovers against Boston University when the squad had 23 dimes and only coughed up possession eight times.

WINS WITH ROOM TO SPARE

The Maroon and White routed Central Arkansas by 27 points, 89-62 on Thursday, Nov. 19. The margin of victory marks the largest for the Minutemen since a 38-point win over Fordham, 90-52 on Jan. 26, 2014. It was the fourth win by 25 or more points dating back to the 2013-14 campaign and 10th under head coach **Derek Kellogg**.

UMass men's basketball blasted Boston University, 99-69 on Dec. 2, 2015, the first time UMass posted a 30-point margin in victory since the +38 win over Fordham. It marks the fifth victory by 30 or more points under head coach **Derek Kellogg**.

UMASS UNVEILS JOHN FRANCIS KENNEDY CHAMPIONS CENTER

The University of Massachusetts men's and women's basketball program moved into their first dedicated team facility during the Summer 2015 with the introduction of the John Francis Kennedy Champions Center for UMass Basketball. The 53,000-square foot building offers a state-of-the-art facility for the Minutemen and Minutewomen that will benefit generations of basketball student-athletes to come.

The structure is named in honor of longtime athletics support **John Francis Kennedy**, who donated the lead gift of \$11 million toward the project. The 53,000-square foot facility houses the daily operations for the UMass men's and women's basketball programs. The \$22-million facility features dedicated practice courts for each team, office space for the coaching staffs, locker rooms and areas for strength and conditioning along with athletic training services. It also contains Legacy Hall, which will display the rich history of UMass basketball along the building's Eastern corridor.

HEAD COACH DEREK KELLOGG

MASSACHUSETTS '95 // NINTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH OVERALL AND AT MASSACHUSETTS

Entering his ninth season at the helm of his alma mater, UMass men's basketball head coach Derek Kellogg has guided the Minutemen back to prominence with national postseason appearances in the NCAA Tournament and NIT, culminating in 140 head coach victories for the 1995 UMass graduate entering 2016-17.

Kellogg, already the third-winningest coach in the 100-plus year history of UMass basketball, moved the Minutemen down the block to the program's new home, the John Francis Kennedy

Champions Center for UMass Basketball ahead of the 2015-16 season. The 53,000-square foot basketball-centric facility offers one of the top homes in college basketball with dedicated practice courts, full athletic training and strength and conditioning suites, a cinema-style film room and additional space for team meetings and meals, coach and administrative offices and a connecting tunnel to the Mullins Center.

With the help of assistant coaches Andy Allison, Shyrone Chatman and Adam Ginsburg, Kellogg guided Massachusetts averaged 20 wins per season over the last five campaigns. The successful stretch includes the 24-win season in 2013-14 when Kellogg led the Minutemen back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 15 years and an NIT Final Four berth during 2011-12.

Kellogg's noted success as a recruiter, combined with the state-of-the-art, dedicated home for basketball at UMass, helped the eighth-year leader land a top-25 class ahead of the 2016-17 school year. The group, comprised of Chris Baldwin, Tyrn Flowers, Brison Gresham, DeJon Jarreau and Unique McLean, ranked among the top 25 nationally and provide the Minutemen the most vaunted incoming class in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

In addition to infusing energy on the sidelines and court, Kellogg-led UMass teams have re-dedicated themselves to the local and regional community that cheers on the Minutemen. Kellogg serves as the Honorary Co-Chairman of the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation for the Northern Connecticut/ Western Massachusetts chapter, while participating with the entire team in the JDRF Walk to Cure Diabetes. He has also lent his time to the Clarke Schools for Hearing and Speech and Baystate Children's Hospital of Springfield/Children's Miracle Network.

The 2015-16 season marked a year of transition for the Minutemen as the squad adjusted to its new home in the Champions Center. The guard trio of Donte Clark, Trey Davis and Jabarie Hinds buoyed Massachusetts as it reached the Atlantic 10 Championship Quarterfinals via the combined strength of nearly 50 points per game from the three. Davis collected USBWA All-Region following the season while Hinds earned Atlantic 10 Co-Sixth Man of the Year.

Massachusetts picked up its fourth consecutive winning season in 2014-15, spearheaded by Kellogg and a pair of then-seniors and current professional basketball players, Maxie Esho and Cady Lalanne. Esho, who recently signed an NBA D-League contract, and Lalanne, the 55th pick of the 2015 NBA Draft (San Antonio Spurs), assisted Kellogg in winning 17 games and finishing tied for sixth in the talent-rich Atlantic 10.

In 2013-14, Kellogg's dedication to his alma mater brought the program back to the national spotlight. UMass opened the year with 10-consecutive victories and collected the Charleston Classic Championship as it rose to a top-20 ranking - its first time in the polls since early in the 1998-99 campaign. The squad eventually was slotted as high as No. 12 in the coaches poll and No. 13 in the Associated Press ledger and spent 10 weeks and played 15 games as a ranked team.

The year secured UMass a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament after the program had not achieved that benchmark since 1998. Senior Chaz Williams capped his Minuteman career with his third consecutive appearance on first team all-district and all-conference listings.

UMass also continued its rise at the gate as the team averaged 6,600 fans, putting season attendance numbers at a 100 percent increase over the previous three years. The Minutemen sold-out six games at the Mullins Center and, by year's end, UMass' home attendance had increased by 1,345 fans from 2012-13 to 2013-14, ranking 10th nationally.

The 2013-14 campaign marked the second-consecutive year the Minutemen appeared in the top-30 for the largest increase from the previous year. The 6,600 home attendance average was the highest since the 1998-99 campaign, while the single-season increase was the largest since moving into the Mullins Center midway through the 1992-93 year. It was also the eighth-highest average in school history.

The Minutemen posted 21 victories during 2012-13, including their second NIT appearance in as many seasons. Williams picked up his second consecutive first team all-conference and NABC all-district laurels and became the first player to go back-to-back in both categories since Rashaun Freeman (2005-07).

During 2011-12, Kellogg's tutelage led Massachusetts to a 25-11 overall record and advanced to the semifinals of the Atlantic 10 Championship and the NIT. Kellogg's energy as a coach, mimicked by the squad on the court, earned UMass a tied for fifth in the A-10 after the squad was picked 12th in the preseason poll. Kellogg also installed his up-tempo offense to go along with a pressure defense that resulted in a the team breaking the school record for steals, while ranking in the top five nationally in possessions per game.

Leading the way during 2011-12 was Williams, who tallied first team all-Atlantic 10 and NABC all-district after averaging 16.9 points, 6.2 assists and 4.4 rebounds per game. Williams set UMass sophomore records for assists (231) and steals (81). The friendly confines of the Mullins Center and its home crowd helped the team earn a 15-1 mark during games played in Amherst. The Minutemen played before four crowds of more than 6,200 in the final six games, including a season-high 8,399 in the victory over Saint Louis.

In 2010-11, Kellogg guided UMass to its best start since the 1995-96 Final Four campaign as the Minutemen opened the year with a 7-0 mark. UMass also posted its first seven-game win streak since 1998 and have since eclipsed that figure when it won 10 straight at the start of 2013-14.

UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS MEN'S BASKETBALL COACHING STAFF

Kellogg capped his second season with an Atlantic 10 Tournament appearance and first round victory, the first in eight years, as UMass knocked off No. 6 seed Charlotte, 59-56.

In his first year as the head coach at UMass, Kellogg led the Minutemen to one of their most thrilling wins in recent memory, an epic win over defending NCAA Champion Kansas before a nationally-televised audience on ESPN.

Kelloga's first full recruiting class at UMass was named one of the nation's top groups and the consensus best class in the A-10. Kellogg guided Putney, Riley and Vinson to 1,000-point careers at UMass while members of the guintet helped Kellogg win 97 games from 2009-14 and secure three national postseason appearances.

Kellogg was named the 21st head coach in University of Massachusetts men's basketball history on April 23, 2008. He returned to his alma mater for his first head coaching opportunity after he served as an assistant coach for 12 years, the last eight at the University of Memphis under former UMass head coach and Naismith Hall of Fame inductee John Calipari. The energetic and hard-working Kellogg is largely credited for recruiting many of the student-athletes who helped Memphis reach the 2008 NCAA Championship Game and record eight consecutive 20-win seasons with as many consecutive postseason berths, and Kellogg has continued his strong recruiting efforts at UMass.

Kellogg spent eight years on the Memphis staff alongside Calipari where he brought his "coach on the floor" mentality at UMass to the sidelines, and it produced results for the Tigers. In Kellogg's eight seasons in Memphis, he helped the Tigers to eight-straight 20-win seasons and eight consecutive postseason berths (NCAA: 2003, '04, '06, '07, '08; NIT: 2001, '02, '05). It marked the first time the Memphis basketball program reached eight consecutive national postseasons, breaking the previous mark of six-in-a-row from 1988-93.

In 2007-08, Kellogg was an integral part of another magical Tiger campaign, which continued through to the 2008 NCAA Tournament Championship Game. The NCAA Final Four appearance was the Tigers' first since 1985 and the NCAA title contest was the program's first since 1973. Memphis set an NCAA single-season record for victories with 38 wins (38-2 mark) and held down the No. 1 spot in both national polls for five-straight weeks during the season. The Tigers finished 2007-08 ranked No. 2 in the nation, the highest final ranking in school history. Memphis also won a school-record 26-straight games and swept the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles for a third-consecutive season.

The Tigers won 30 games for a third-straight year in 2007-08, becoming the second school in NCAA Division I history to accomplish the feat. Kentucky was the first to do so from 1947-49 and 1996-98. UCLA joined the elite group later in 2007-08. From 2005-06 to 2007-08, Memphis won 104 games (104-10 record) and tied the 1996-98 Kentucky squads for the most victories in a three-year period in NCAA Division I history.

In 2006-07. Kellogg helped lead Memphis to another record-setting campaign. The Tigers won 33 games for a second-straight season (33-4 record) and captured their second-consecutive Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. The back-to-back outright regular season crowns were a first for the Memphis program, and the consecutive tournament championships were the Tigers first since they won two-straight Metro Conference Tournaments in 1984 and 1985. Memphis advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight for a second-straight year (2006, 2007), marking the first time in school history

The 2006-07 Tigers also pulled a first in Conference USA history. Memphis posted a perfect 16-0 regular season mark and captured the league's postseason tournament. The Tigers were the second squad in C-USA history to go 16-0 in the regular season as Cincinnati did so in 1999-2000. That Bearcat team, though, did not win the Conference USA Tournament title. The Tigers received a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament and finished in the top 10 in both national polls (No. 5/AP; No. 7/ESPN-USA Today).

Kellogg also played an integral role in the Tigers' 2005-06 remarkable season. Memphis posted a 33-4 record and won the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. The conference regular season crown was the Tigers' second in three years. The 2005-06 Memphis squad earned the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament No. 1 seed and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time since 1992. The Tigers finished the season ranked in the top 10 of both national polls (No. 4/AP; No. 6/ESPN-USA Today). Those final rankings were the highest in Memphis basketball history at the time.

From when Kellogg joined the Memphis staff in 2000-01, the Tigers won the 2002 National Invitation Tournament Championship, claimed a share of the 2004 Conference USA regular season crown and took home the 2002 and 2003 C-USA National Division titles. The Tigers posted 219 overall victories (27.3 wins per year) and 101 conference wins (12.6 league victories per year) in his eight seasons. The eight years prior to that span, the Tigers only had 140 total wins and 66 conference victories.

In addition to the 2006-08 final national rankings, the Tigers also finished the 2003 (No. 19) and 2004 (No. 24) seasons ranked in the final Associated Press poll. Prior to the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons, the last time Memphis was ranked in the final polls in consecutive years was the 1984-85 and 1985-86 campaigns.

Kellogg was an off-campus recruiter for the Tigers and also assisted in scouting opponents. His hard work -- especially on the recruiting trail -- gained him national recognition. In the summer of 2007, Rivals. com listed Kellogg (No. 7 spot) as one of the nation's 10 assistants "ready to move up." A year earlier in 2006, the same web site named Kellogg as one of the nation's top 25 recruiters, and HoopScoop magazine tabbed him as one of the nation's top assistant coaches.

Prior to joining Calipari's staff, Kellogg spent one season at Youngstown State. In his lone year at Youngstown State, Kellogg was a member of a coaching staff led by former UMass assistant John Robic that rallied a community around Penguin basketball. Youngstown State finished fourth in the Mid-Continent Conference regular season standings, despite the absence of leading scorer Elmer Brown for the final seven games of the regular season. Youngstown State signed a freshman class that included three top-100 recruits during Kellogg's tenure.

Kellogg joined the Youngstown State staff after two seasons at George Mason University in Fairfax, Va., where he worked for Jim Larranaga. The Patriots posted a 19-11 record during the 1998-99 season, captured the Colonial Athletic Association regular season and tournament championships and earned an automatic bid to the 1999 NCAA Tournament.

As a four-year letterwinner at Massachusetts from 1992-95, Kellogg played on four Atlantic 10 Conference regular season and tournament championship teams. The Minutemen were just the second team in NCAA history to win four-straight outright season and tournament championships.

During his four-year career at UMass under Calipari, the Minutemen were 111-24, including 51-11 in the Atlantic 10, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year, including the Elite Eight in 1995. Kellogg was named the team's captain as a junior and senior, earned Atlantic 10 All-Conference in 1995 and picked up three Atlantic 10 All-Academic honors. Kellogg ranks fifth in assists (453) and seventh in three-pointers (138) as well as seventh in three-point percentage (38.1) all-time at UMass.

Kellogg played his high school basketball at Springfield Cathedral where he was a two-time Massachusetts All-State player and McDonald's All-America Honorable Mention.

Following graduation from UMass, Kellogg pursued professional basketball before he began his coaching career at his alma mater. He was a graduate assistant and part-time radio broadcaster at UMass for the 1996-97 season after he played a season with the Connecticut Skyhawks in the United States Basketball League in 1995.

Kellogg, 42, is a 1995 graduate of the University of Massachusetts with a degree in real estate and finance. In May 2005, he married Nicole Flory, who graduated from UMass in 1997. The couple has one son, Max, while Kellogg's parents, George and Ruth, still reside locally in Belchertown, Mass.


