SUN DEVIL REWIND

The Sun Devils started their three-day road trip to Massachusetts out on the right skate, as they never trailed in a 3-2 victory over American International on Tuesday night in Springfield.

In his return to his former school, redshirt junior forward DAVID NORRIS was the difference maker, as his goal just four minutes into the third period eventually became the game-winner.

Also finding the back of the net was sophomore forward Jack Rowe, who netted his first of the season to start the scoring off for ASU.

In his first game back since Nov. 4, sophomore defenseman Joey Raats tallied an assist on both the second (game-tying) and eventual game-winning goal.

As a team, the Devils capitalized on both sides of special teams, going 1-for-2 on the power play while shutting out the Yellow Jackets' by going 4-for-4 on the penalty kill.

Freshman goaltender Joey Daccord recorded his second victory of the season -- and first since the team's first win against then-No. 18 Air Force on Oct. 16.

UPCOMING MATCH-UP

For the fifth time this season, the Sun Devils will have the opportunity to win back-to-back games. So far this season, it has yet to happen while being outscored 13-5 in those games following a victory.

Friday will feature a different opponent for the Devils, as they match-up with the University of Massachusetts-Amherst at William D. Mullins Memorial Center for the first time.

The Minutemen are led by head coach Greg Carvel, who is in his first season with the program after spending his last five seasons at St. Lawrence -- four as head coach and one as an assistant.

Atop their stat sheet is sophomore forward Austin Plevy with five goals and six assists this season.

Freshman Ryan Wischow leads the team between the pipes, holding a 3-6-2 record with a .911 save percentage and 2.69 GAA this season. That includes a 5-4 victory over then-No. 12 Notre Dame on Dec. 2. Since then, Wischow and the Minutemen are on a three-game skid at the hands of the Irish, Connecticut and Princeton.

In four of the Sun Devils five victories this season, the squad needed a season-high five goals to win. (Oct. 16 vs. Air Force, Nov. 12 at New Hampshire, Nov. 25 vs. RPI, Dec. 2 vs. Colgate)

Four of the Sun Devils final nine opponents this season are currently ranked in the USCHO top-20, including #2 Denver, #9 Ohio State, #14 Quinnipiac and #16 Western Michigan.

Three of the Minutemen's five victories have come at home, as they hold a 3-5-1 record at Mullins Center this season.

The Sun Devils will return to the state of Arizona at the end of December, as they host the 2nd Annual Desert Hockey Classic in Prescott Valley, AZ. They will take on Brown in game one on Friday, Dec. 30 at 7:00 p.m.

RIDE THE HOT HAND

- Redshirt junior WADE MURPHY is currently averaging a point per game over the last five games with three goals and two assists. On Tuesday, MURPHY tallied the Devils' second to give them the 2-1 lead over American International.
- Teammate LOUIE ROWE is doing MURPHY one better, as he has two goals and two assists in just the last three games for a three-game point streak.
- Sophomore forward ANTHONY CROSTON is also on a three-game heater with a goal -- his first of the season -- and two assists.
- In his first game back since Nov. 4, sophomore defenseman JOEY RAATS made two perfect passes for primary assists on the two biggest goals of the night against AIC on Tuesday.

SAME FACES, NEW PLACES

- A season ago, ASU graduate senior ROBBIE BAILLARGEON and UMass d-man Josh Couturier shared the ice at Boston University. Couturier was a freshman, while BAILLARGEON was a junior.
- Sophomore defenseman JOEY RAATS and Minutemen forward Jack Suter played together with the Sioux Falls Stampede in 2014-15.
- In 2014-15, sophomores JACK ROWE, RYLAND PASHOVITZ, JOE LAPPIN, GEORGY GORODETSKY and LIAM McGING played with UMass centerman Joseph Widmar. McGING, ROWE and Widmar were also roommates at the time.

WISE(NHEIMER)

- Graduate senior ROBBIE BAILLARGEON -- one of only two Devils with 30-plus games of NCAA experience -- has proven to be a crucial addition to the young Sun Devil squad in 2016-17.
- The former Boston University forward paces the team this season with eight goals and seven assists, including two multi-goal and three additional multi-point performances.
- Through 18 games, BAILLARGEON has yet to go more than a game without tallying a point.

YOUNG & THE RESTLESS

- Thirty-three of the 43 goals scored by the Sun Devils so far this season have come off the sticks of players who did not wear the maroon & gold in 2015-16.
- Sophomore defenseman NICHOLAS GUSHUE, and forwards ANTHONY CROSTON, JOE LAPPIN, DAVID NORRIS, JACK ROWE and JORDAN MASTERS have accounted for the other 10 goals. WADE MURPHY and DYLAN HOLLMAN were a part of the team, but redshirted the 2015-16 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM

- This week's trip back east to Massachusetts is the Sun Devils' third journey to the state in less than two months.
- After the victory on Tuesday, the Devils are 1-3 in The Bay State with losses to then-No. 17 Northeastern and then-No. 3 Boston College.
- The Devils first road victory -- a 5-4 victory over New Hampshire -- did begin with a flight into Boston, Mass. before driving just over an hour to Durham, N.H.

INTERNATIONAL HUB

- As the No. 1 public university in the U.S. for hosting international students -- according to the 2016 Open Doors Report -- Sun Devil Athletics is represented by more than 60 international student-athletes.
- Sun Devil Hockey welcomes their first student-athletes from across the pond, as defenseman JAKOB STRIDSBERG from Sweden and forward GEORGY GORODETSKY from Russia join the roster. Latvia's GVIDO JANSONS will also join the Devils in 2017-18.
- Through nine games, STRIDSBERG has tallied four goals and an assist from the blue line, while GORODETSKY earned his first collegiate assist against Michigan.

CLASS, CLASS, CLASS!

- The Sun Devils 2017-18 signing class is currently ranked 13th in the country by NeutralZone.net, a national hockey scouting and news site.
- The fall signing day revealed five new Devils for next season, including the 2nd-ranked player from the 1996 class in defenseman PATRICK KUDLA -- who was drafted by the Arizona Coyotes in the 6th round in 2016.
- The Devils also picked up two other top-50 prospects according to NeutralZone in forward TYLER MALTBY (41) and JOHNNY WALKER (45). Defensemen GVIDO JANSONS from Latvia and JACOB WILSON will also join the Devils in 2017-18.

DRAFTED DEVILS

- Three of the new Sun Devils were NHL draft picks within the past four years.
- While freshman JOEY DACCORD was drafted prior to wearing the Maroon & Gold, he is officially the first drafted player in Sun Devil Division I history as he was committed to ASU. DACCORD went 199th overall in the 7th round of the 2015 NHL Draft to the Ottawa Senators.
- Graduate transfer ROBBIE BAILLARGEON was also drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the 2012 NHL Draft in the 5th round and 136th overall.
- Redshirt junior WADE MURPHY was selected 185th overall by the Nashville Predators in the 2013 NHL Draft.
- 2017-18 signee PATRICK KUDLA was the most recent Sun Devil to be drafted, as he was selected 158th overall in the 6th round by the hometown Arizona Coyotes.
- Redshirt sophomore LOUIE ROWE and freshman BRINSON PASICHNUK were invited to NHL Development Camps, including the Winnipeg Jets and Minnesota Wild, respectively. ROWE tallied two goals and one assist in two games played.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

- The Sun Devils will have five games televised nationally this season, with three of them already occurring on the Pac-12 Network (vs. Air Force, vs. Harvard and vs. Michigan).
- ASU will also be featured on ESPNU and the WatchESPN app against Ohio State on Saturday, Jan. 14 at 12 p.m. (AZT).
- For all Sun Devil fans in Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, Nevada, South Dakota, Wyoming and Utah, they'll have the chance to watch our match-up with #3 Denver on Jan. 6 on Altitude Sports 2.

WE'VE GOT THE POWERS

Coach Powers enters his ninth overall season on the Sun Devil Coaching Staff and his second as Head Coach of ASU's NCAA Division I Hockey program. In his first year as head coach, he led the team to a 10-23-5 in 2015. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 179-63-14 career record at ASU, and his team ended the 2014-2015 season ranked #3 in the ACHA with a 35-4-1 record qualifying for the team's third-straight ACHA Division I Final Four. Since taking the reigns as head coach, Greg has also coached eight ACHA Div. I All-Americans and 15 ACHA Academic All-Americans.

Coach Powers has helped lead Sun Devil Hockey to five consecutive ACHA National Tournament appearances, starting with his first year as head coach in 2010. In 2012-13, he led ASU to a new program best record and first ever 30-plus win season with a record of 35-8-1, its first ever Final Four Appearance, first ever National Ranking of #1, and a benchmark win over NCAA DI Penn State. During the 2013-2014 season, ASU Hockey won the ACHA DI National Championship, with Powers named ACHA DI National Coach of the Year. The Sun Devils were also named WCHL Conference Champions both for 2013-2014 and 2014-2015, and Powers was named WCHL Coach of the Year for 2013-2014. Powers was also named an ACHA Division I National Coach of the Year finalist in 2012-13 and 2014-15.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.

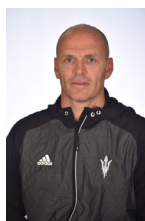
