Offense

- Redshirt sophomore Ross Comis earned his first start at quarterback and finished 9-of-17 for 141 yards and a touchdown on the ground.
- Comis' five-yard touchdown scamper marked his first rushing score as a Minuteman.
- Andy Isabella caught a 53-yard pass from Ross Comis down the Florida sideline during the second quarter, the longest reception and pass completion of Isabella and Comis' careers, respectively.
- Isabella led all receivers with 95 yards on three receptions. Both reset Isabella's single-game career highs.
- Marquis Young rushed for 59 yards against the Gators. Combined with his 2016 numbers, Young now owns 1,019 career yards in 13 games played. He is the first UMass running back to eclipse 1,000 career yards during the FBS era.

Defense

- **Tedrick Lowery** provided 11 tackles against the Gators, including eight in the first half, during his first game as a Minuteman.
- Ali Ali-Musa forced a first quarter fumble and provided a TFL among two total stops in his first game with UMass.
- **James Allen** set a career high in tackles with seven, including four solo stops. He added a pass breakup and also had a two-yard TFL.
- The Minuteman defense held Florida to 24 points, tied for the fewest given up to a nationally-ranked FBS team in school history. UMass also allowed 24 points to No. 12 Boston College on Sept. 29, 2007 (L, 24-14).

- UMass limited itself to 25 penalty yards on seven infractions against at No. 25 Florida.
- The game captains for UMass were Peter Angeh, Michael Boland, Bernard Davis and Shane Huber.
- UMass won the toss and elected to defer possession to the second half. Florida received the opening kickoff and the Minutemen defended the South endzone.
