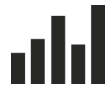

# HEAD COACH GREG CANNELLA

24TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH • UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS '88

Recognized as one of the nation's top lacrosse coaches, Greg Cannella enters his 24th year at the helm of the University of Massachusetts program in 2017-18. A veteran presence on the sidelines in Amherst, Cannella is currently the second-longest tenured head coach across all Division I schools and has the fifth-most years as a Division I head coach among all current program leaders nationally.

During his extended tenure, Cannella has guided his Minutemen to eight NCAA Tournaments, claimed eight New

England Championships, won five conference titles and guided the Minutemen to the program's first-ever No. 1 national ranking. He was named the CAA Coach of the Year in 2012, his sixth conference coach of the year honor, earned the New England Coach of the Year five times and was named the ECAC Coach of the Year on four occasions. In 2006, Cannella was chosen as the USILA National Coach of the Year after he led UMass to its first-ever lacrosse NCAA Championship Game appearance.

A 1988 University of Massachusetts graduate, Cannella took the reigns of the UMass lacrosse program in November, 1994 with a great understanding of the program's storied history. He was a two-time letterwinner for legendary team leader Richard F. Garber in 1986 and 1987 and an assistant coach for two seasons with the Minutemen prior to taking over as the head coach.

Under Cannella's tutelage, UMass enjoys some of the program's highest levels of success on and off the field. With a history as one of the top teams in New England, the reputation of UMass lacrosse spreads across the country due in part to his leadership. Since taking over as head coach, the team has enjoyed success as a whole and among individual players. Cannella has produced three Tewaaraton finalists, 45 USILA All-America selections, 102 All-New England picks, 72 all-conference honorees and nine positional league players of the year. For the work accomplished by Minutemen in the classroom, the program sports 15 Academic All-Americans, 41 New England Scholar-Athletes and 32 academic all-conference picks.

Since 2001, UMass has been one of the most successful programs in the country thanks in part to the friendly confines of Garber Field. During that span, Cannella has led UMass to a 81-29 record at Garber while the Minutemen are 154-99 since the beginning of 2001, with six seasons featuring 12 or more wins.

During 2017, Massachusetts reached the CAA Championship Game for the fourth time in the program's short tenure as a member of the conference. The Minutemen rebounded from a slow start to the year with seven wins in the last 11 games, including a 13-12 CAA Semifinal Round win over No. 14 nationally-ranked Hofstra for the title game berth.

With only 12 upperclassmen on the 2015 roster, the inexperienced Minutemen struggled during the regular season before the squad compiled a strong close to the campaign. Cannella guided the team to its third CAA Championship Game appearance over five seasons in the league as the squad fell one game shy of earning an NCAA Tournament bid. Following the season, Ryan Izzo tallied USILA All-America for the second consecutive campaign and became the 11th Minuteman under Cannella's tutelage to earn multiple all-America laurels from the USILA.

Cannella led a young Minuteman squad featuring 24 underclassmen among 37 total players to a 7-6 record during 2014. UMass earned wins over a pair of nationally ranked programs in No. 5 Penn State and No. 14 Ohio State during the year, before it ended the season receiving votes in the national polls. Following the end of the campaign, freshman Nick Mariano took in the CAA Rookie of the Year Award while he was honored on the All-CAA listing alongside teammates Kyle Karaska and Connor Mooney. Cannella was also inducted into the National Junior College Athletic Association Hall of Fame for his accomplishments within the game of lacrosse spanning nearly 30 years as a competitor and coach.

Two of the most historic campaigns in the program's history have occurred under Cannella's watch. The 2006 squad became the first-ever New England-based team to reach the NCAA Championship Game, while the 2012 squad went undefeated during the regular-season with a program-best 15 wins and a No. 1 national ranking.

The 2006 season will go down as one of the best for any athletic program at UMass. As an unseeded team, the Minutemen had the most difficult path to a lacrosse championship game in history, beating the second, third and fourth-ranked teams in the nation. UMass topped No. 2 seed Maryland, 8-5 in the semifinals after advancing to its first Final Four with a stunning 11-10 overtime win against Hofstra on May 20, 2006. The difficult comeback saw the Minutemen rally from a 10-5 deficit with 8:03 left in the fourth quarter as UMass won its quarterfinal game at Stony Brook.

During the 2006 campaign, Cannella also had a personal milestone as he recorded his 100th career win after a 12-7 victory at Harvard on March 11.

Individually, that season saw UMass produce two First-Team USILA All-Americans for the first time in school history with Sean Morris on attack and Jack Reid being honored on defense. Jake Deane was also named an honorable mention All-American. For the second year in a row, Morris was named a finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy as the top player in all of NCAA Division I college lacrosse.

During the 2012 regular season, week-by-week, UMass continued to win games - some in dramatic fashion and others through a relentless fury of goal scoring and a stifling defense. As each week of the regular-season went on, the Minutemen continued to climb higher and higher in the national polls. On April 16, 2012 it became official, the Minutemen were the No. 1 team in the country, marking the first time a UMass athletic program held the top spot in the country since the 1995-96 NCAA Final Four men's basketball team. Cannella led the Minutemen to an undefeated regular-season, the program's first-ever CAA Tournament Title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament for the 19th time in the history of the Minutemen.

Individually, UMass produced six USILA All-Americans, including Will Manny being selected to the first team. Manny also earned CAA Player of the Year, New England Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Tewaaraton Award. Cannella was recognized as the CAA Coach of the Year and the New England Coach of the Year.

Other milestone seasons for Cannella include 2003 and 2005, where the Minutemen won 13 games and made an NCAA Tournament appearance in each campaign.

## UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS LACROSSE COACHING STAFF

The 2005 season saw the Minutemen tie the then-school record for wins with a 13-3 overall mark. UMass advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the 10th time in program history while winning the ECAC and New England Championships. The season was historic as UMass knocked off Syracuse twice in a three-week span, including a 16-15 win in the NCAA Tournament First Round to end the Orange's 22-year run of reaching the semifinals. UMass was featured on ESPN's SportsCenter as well as in Sports Illustrated after the monumental win. Cannella continued to coach some of the nation's top players as attackman Sean Morris was selected as UMass' first-ever finalist for the Tewaaron Trophy. Morris was one of four all-Americans on the 2005 team, which also featured seven All-New England choices.

The 2003 UMass squad also tied the previous school record with 13 victories, advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals for only the fifth time in school history and was ranked as high as No. 3 in the country, the then-highest ranking for the Minutemen.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Cannella spent four years as an assistant coach at Stony Brook from 1988-92. Cannella masterminded the offense and served as the recruiting coordinator on John Espey's staff. He earned a master's degree in liberal studies while coaching at Stony Brook.

Cannella earned a bachelor's degree in physical education while playing at Massachusetts from 1986-87. He was a two-year starter for the Minutemen and a member of two NCAA Tournament teams. Cannella scored 64 points (33 goals, 31 assists) in his UMass career.

Before playing at UMass, Cannella spent one year at Nassau (N.Y.) Community College, where he was a first team All-America selection and led Nassau to the 1985 Junior College National Title.

A native of Lynbrook, N.Y., Cannella played for three years at Lynbrook High School. One of the most prolific scorers in Lynbrook history, Cannella was a high school All-America selection and still ranks among Lynbrook's all-time leading scorers.

Cannella served as the President of the New England Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association in 1998, 1999 and 2000, and served as the Vice President in 1997. Cannella is currently the chairman of the annual NEILA Scholar Athlete Team, which he started in 1999. He has also served on the NCAA Championships Regional Advisory Committee that selected the teams for the NCAA Tournament in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2003 and 2004. Cannella was a regional voter in the USILA/STX weekly poll from 1997-2001 and has served as a USILA regional voter for all-American selection since 2003. He now serves on the prestigious committee to help select the Tewaaron Award, a honor given to the nation's top player.

Cannella is a native of Rockville Centre, N.Y. He and his wife, Laurie, reside in Hadley with their son, Vance, and daughter, Virginia.

# UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS LACROSSE COACHING STAFF

## DOC SCHNEIDER

### ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

#### NINTH SEASON

#### MASSACHUSETTS '09

Schneider begins his ninth season on the University of Massachusetts coaching staff and his first on the sidelines as the associate head coach in 2017-18.

Schneider is in his third campaign as the offensive coach after he served as a volunteer assistant during 2014-15, following five years as an assistant coach from 2010-14 and four more as a starting goalkeeper for the Minutemen prior to that. In addition to his work on the offensive side of the ball, Schneider will continue to tutor the UMass goalies.

After four years between the pipes from 2006-09, Schneider joined the coaching staff as an assistant ahead of the 2010 season. He maintained his role working on the defensive side of the game through the 2014 season, after which he chose to pursue an opportunity outside of the coaching realm. However, Schneider rejoined the staff as a volunteer coach prior to the 2015 season. The 2016 campaign will mark his 11th consecutive year with the program and seventh as a coach.

Schneider's tutelage of the offense in 2017 helped the squad earn its way to the CAA Championship Game. Led by All-CAA First Team midfielder Dan Muller, UMass posted 134 goals on the season and posted wins in seven of its final 11 contests. The attack saved its best effort for the postseason as the Minutemen put in a season-best goals total against No. 14 Hofstra during the CAA Semifinal Round for the 13-12 victory over the Pride.

Schneider worked with the offense while he served as a full-time volunteer in 2015 and simultaneously assisted in all aspects of on- and off-field preparations. Prior to the most recent season, Schneider was responsible for various components of the direction of the defense and goalie units during the 2010-14 campaigns.

Through Schneider's tutelage during his tenure as the defensive coordinator, three-year starter Tim McCormack developed into a USILA All-American and First Team All-New England selection at goalie in 2012. Schneider simultaneously coached the Minutemen defense, including the man-down unit, which featured all-America selections Jake Smith (2012-13), Tom Celentani (2012) and Diogo Godoi (2010).

As a student-athlete at Massachusetts, Schneider was a four-year starter from 2006-09, racking up the second-most saves in program history (753). Schneider owned a 7.98 goals-against average and .611 save percentage for his career while earning 34 victories in net. A 2009 USILA All-American and Tewaaraton Award finalist, the Massapequa, New York, native, also received all-New England honors on four occasions, competed in the USILA North-South All Star Game and was named the ECAC Goalie of the Year as a senior.

Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Schneider was the highest drafted goalie in Major League Lacrosse during 2009, when he eventually helped the Toronto Nationals win the MLL Championship alongside former Minuteman Jeff Zywicki. In the championship game, Schneider backstopped the Nationals with 12 saves after he picked up the semifinal victory over Long Island.

## CRAIG MCDONALD

### ASSISTANT COACH

#### FOURTH SEASON

#### ALBANY '08

University of Massachusetts men's lacrosse assistant coach Craig McDonald recently completed his third season on the Minuteman sidelines in 2017 with the team's second CAA Championship Game appearance during his tenure. McDonald teaches the defensive side of the game and works with the UMass goalie unit as well.

McDonald's defense clamped down on the opposition in 2017 and only allowed 10.07 goals per game while the squad ranked in the top-20 nationally for caused turnovers in each contest, with an average of 7.87 per game. Close defenseman Isaac Paparo, a CAA All-Conference selection, emerged as a leader on the field with a program-record 33 caused turnovers (2.20 per game; sixth-most nationally).

An up-and-down 2015 saw McDonald help the Minutemen earn a berth in to the CAA Championship, where the side advanced by host and No. 1 seed Fairfield, 9-8, for a spot in the finale. Under McDonald's tutelage, short-stick defensive midfielder Ryan Izzo earned his second career USILA All-America honor while close defenseman Kyle Karaska secured CAA First Team All-Conference.

McDonald spent the 2012-14 seasons at Rutgers, where he coached the defense and also served as the team's recruiting coordinator.

In 2013, McDonald mentored Big East Goalie of the Year Kris Alleyne while the squad pulled in four all-conference selections following the 2014 campaign. Prior to working with the Rutgers men's lacrosse program, McDonald was on-staff at Siena to help the team win the Mid-American Athletic Conference and advance to the 2011 NCAA Tournament.

McDonald joined the collegiate coaching ranks in 2008 when he was named an assistant at Union College under 1999 National Lacrosse Hall of Fame inductee Paul Wehrum. While at Union College, McDonald filled roles as the defensive and recruiting coordinator. In 2010, under McDonald's tutelage, the Dutchmen ranked second among all NCAA Division III programs for scoring defense and fifth for man-down defense while goalie Sean Aaron earned the lowest goals-against average nationally at 5.69 given up per game.

McDonald played four seasons at Albany from 2005-08, totaling three all-conference selections as a starter on close defense for the Great Danes. The native of Geneva, N.Y., helped the squad make NCAA Tournament appearances in 2005 and 2007 while the program won 41 games during his playing tenure, an average of more than 10 victories per season.

## JEREMY PHELPS

### VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

#### FIRST SEASON

#### WINTHROP '10

Jeremy Phelps joined the 2017-18 University of Massachusetts men's lacrosse coaching staff as a volunteer assistant and brings a vast knowledge of the game to the Commonwealth, which includes his most recent position as the primary assistant, defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Rhodes College.

While at Rhodes College, an NCAA Division III institution, Phelps built the Lynx defense into one of the top-performing units in the nation during two seasons on the sidelines. During 2016, Rhode College ranked No. 1 across NCAA Division III for man-down defense while it was the sixth-best scoring defense in the country. Under Phelps' guidance, Rhode College improved to the No. 1 scoring defense in the nation in 2017, with only 7.3 goals-against per game.

Prior to guiding Rhodes to a combined 25-8 record during the 2016-17 seasons, Phelps was the primary assistant, defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Goucher College in 2014 and 2015. Goucher's defense experienced similar success with Phelps, as the Gophers only gave up 7.6 goals per game in 2015.

During his tenure at Goucher College, Phelps undertook the opportunity to serve as a coaching intern at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. During two months with the men's lacrosse team at Navy, he worked as the team's primary faceoff coach and assisted in the development of one of the nation's top faceoff specialists, Brady Dove, who was an All-Patriot League First Team selection the following season.

Phelps was the primary assistant and defensive coordinator for Marywood University for the 2012 and 2013 seasons, during which he developed one first team, four second team and nine honorable mention all-conference selections within the Colonial States Athletic Conference (CSAC).

He earned his start in collegiate coaching at Guilford College in 2011, as the secondary assistant and faceoff specialists coach. During his season at Guilford College, the Quakers produced their most wins in one season in nearly 20 years.

Phelps graduated Winthrop College with a bachelor's degree in sports management. He finished his playing tenure at Winthrop with the fourth-most points in school history while he served as team captain for the 2008, 2009 and 2010 seasons.

Following graduation from Winthrop, Phelps accepted a position at IMG Academy as an assistant coach, where he helped build the school's newly-established program on and off the field. He added a master's degree in athletic administration and leadership in 2015 while coaching at Goucher College.

## TRANSITION POINTS

### University of Massachusetts men's lacrosse...

- Head coach **Greg Cannella** is in his 24th season as the program leader in 2018. He has been the head coach at UMass since the 1995 campaign. It is his 26th year coaching with the program overall, including two years as an assistant coach in 1993 and 1994, while he also played two seasons with the program in 1986 and 1987.
- Assistant coaches **Doc Schneider** (ninth season) and **Craig McDonald** (fourth) return in their respective roles. Schneider guides the offense and works with the goalies. McDonald oversees the defense.
- Winthrop College alumnus **Jeremy Phelps** added his name to the coaching register as a volunteer assistant for the 2018 season. He holds coaching experience at Goucher College, Guilford College, Marywood University, Navy and Rhodes College. Phelps primarily works with the faceoff unit and coordinate substitutions.
- Head coach **Greg Cannella** approached career head coaching victory No. 200 currently. Entering play against Harvard, Cannella owns 195 wins at the helm of the program.
- Head coach **Greg Cannella** is one of the most tenured program leaders in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse. Cannella ranks second among all active Division I head coaches for consecutive seasons coached at their current institution and fifth for total years of head coaching experience.
- Junior close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** earned selection to the Preseason All-CAA Team and Preseason All-NEILA First Team. Paparo is the team's active leader in caused turnovers, with 42 through two games of the 2018 campaign.
- Senior faceoff specialist **Noah Rak** surpassed 300 career faceoff victories during the game at No. 16 Army West Point on Feb. 10, 2018. He is 319-of-572 (.558) entering play against Harvard. The program record for faceoff victories is 423, held by **Dane Collins** (2003-06).
- Freshman starting attack **Chris Connolly** won CAA Rookie of the Week on Feb. 20 after Connolly potted four goals in the 13-9 win over Sacred Heart. His day included a behind-the-back, underhanded shovel goal at the Pioneers' crease which sealed his first collegiate hat trick.
- Reached the CAA Championship Game for the fourth time in the team's history as an affiliate member of the league (2010-present), and the second time in the last three seasons, during 2017. The squad last won the CAA in 2012 (regular season, postseason).
- Won its 2017 CAA Semifinal game against No. 14-ranked and No. 2-seeded Hofstra, 13-12 on redshirt senior **Dan Muller's** 35-yard buzzer-beating desperation heave with one second left on the game clock. It capped a five-point day for Muller and reset his single-game goals scored record at four. It was ESPN SportsCenter's No. 2 Play of the Day and the second of a pair of man-down goals scored by UMass.
- Posted 11.57 goals per game and only 8.71 allowed over the team's seven wins as Massachusetts tallied a +20 goals margin (81-to-61) during the victories against No. 15 Yale (3/7), UMass Lowell (3/15), Hartford (3/18), Delaware (4/1), Fairfield (4/15), Drexel (4/28) and Hofstra (5/4). As a team, the Minutemen shot 31.4 percent (81 goals, 258 shots), won 103-of-163 faceoffs (63.2 percent) and caused an average of 84 turnovers per game (59 total).
- Then-sophomore close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** set the program's single-season record with 33 caused turnovers in 2017, the most since the NCAA began officially tracking the statistic before the 2010 season. Paparo had at least two in 11 games and averaged 3.0 per game over the final five contests.
- Then-freshman midfielder and 2017 CAA All-Rookie Team recipient **Jeff Trainor** had 21 points (10 goals, 11 assists) in the last eight games (2.3 per game) of the 2017 season. He had one (an assist) in the opening four games of his career. He missed two game due to injury.
- Squared off against one of its former coaches when **Greg Cannella** led UMass against **Andy Shay's** Yale Bulldogs. Shay assisted Cannella during the 2001-03 seasons. Shay helped Cannella lead Massachusetts to 37 victories, three New England titles and a pair of ECAC championships while filling various roles, including recruiting and defensive coordinator spots. The Minutemen won the eighth meeting between the teams since Shay assumed head coaching duties, 11-9, to even the series at four games each.

# UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS LACROSSE GAME NOTES

## STAYING POWER

Head coach **Greg Cannella** now approaches career win No. 200 in the midst of his 24th season at the helm of the Minuteman program, one of the longest tenured coaches active in Division I men's lacrosse. He is the second-longest tenured head coach at one institution and fifth nationally in terms of total years spent as a Division I head coach. Cannella began his time as the leader of the team ahead of the 1995 season and, since then, won 10 or more games during seven campaigns. He guided the Minutemen to eight NCAA Tournament appearances and currently stands at 195-137 overall (58.7 win percentage).

Due to that, 2018 tallies as Gravante's 23rd year with the Mount.

## C.C. PUTS THE CAA ON NOTICE

Freshman attack **Chris Connolly** won CAA Rookie of the Week on Tues., Feb. 20 following his four-goal performance in the 13-9 win over Sacred Heart. It is the first weekly accolade for the Minutemen in 2018.

## BIG GAME BUDDY CARR

Senior midfielder **Buddy Carr** provided a touchdown and extra point on three goals and four assists against Sacred Heart. His personal-best seven points came on his fourth collegiate hat trick and a career high in assists. It marked the most points in a game since **Grant Whiteway** had eight on seven goals and an assist during a 16-11 win over Providence on March 11, 2014.

## SAVE BY SCONEONE!

Junior goalie **Sean Sconone** reset his career high in saves during each of the first two games of the season, including 14 at No. 16 Army West Point and 15 over the win against Sacred Heart.

Sconone's previous one-game best was his 13-stop showings against Delaware on April 2, 2016 and Hofstra on April 23, 2016.

Through games on Sat., Feb. 17, Sconone's 14.50 saves per game ranks fourth across NCAA Division I while his 29 total saves stands tied for 11th.

## 4G NETWORK

Freshman attack **Chris Connolly** scored four times against Sacred Heart in his Garber Field debut and collected three groundballs - two of which led to additional UMass tallies. His third goal of the day came on a highlight-reel behind-the-back, underhanded shovel shot. # UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS LACROSSE GAME NOTES

## FIRST GOAL OF THE SEASON CLUB

Sophomore attack **Devin Spencer** scored the team's first goal of the season with his tally at No. 16 Army on Feb. 10, 2018. He converted following the game's second faceoff on a pass by freshman attack **Chris Connolly**.

Devin older brother, junior midfielder **Ben Spencer**, had the team's first goal of the season in 2016. They are the only two active Minutemen with a season-opening goal.

## CHUCK THE DEUCES

Freshman attack **Chris Connolly** posted a pair of points via two assists in his collegiate debut. He sent goal-creating passes to **Devin Spencer** and **Jeff Trainor** for the first two Minutemen conversions of the game.

## PAPARO FOR THE COURSE

Junior close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** recorded five groundballs and three caused turnovers at No. 16 Army. It was his third career game with five or more groundballs and his seventh with three or more caused turnovers.

His defensive success against the Black Knights reflected a continuation of his sophomore year output, which included 46 groundballs and a program-record 33 caused turnovers.

## GOALS FROM LONGPOLES

Junior close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** scored on his only show of the 2018 season-opener at No. 16 Army. He has four career tallies. It moved Paparo ahead of **Shane Rinkus** (3) for most among active Minutemen longpoles.

## FO-GOALS

Senior faceoff specialist **Noah Rak** scored a pair of goals at No. 16 Army in the season-opener, the first multi-goal game for Rak in his career and the first by the Minutemen in 2018.

He added his third goal on as many shot attempt during the 13-9 win over Sacred Heart. Rak already reset his single-season career high with his third goal of the season. He previously had two apiece as a sophomore and junior.

Rak enters play against Harvard with 14 career points via seven goals and seven assists.

## MR. 300

Senior faceoff specialist **Noah Rak** eclipsed 300 career faceoff victories during the season-opener at No. 16 Army. His 300th faceoff victory came 12:20 remaining in the first quarter. He is 328-of-589 (.557) entering play against Harvard. **Dane Collins** holds the record for most faceoff victories by a Minuteman in program history with 423 secured between 2003-06.

## THE CAPTAINS: LISAUSKAS, PAPARO, RINKUS

UMass men's lacrosse seniors **Jake Lisauskas** and **Shane Rinkus**, and junior **Isaac Paparo** lead the team as tri-captains in 2018.

Lisauskas played first and second-line midfield over his opening three seasons. Rinkus is the team's top long-stick midfielder who also saw time on close defense during his tenure. Paparo started his career at long-stick midfield before he transitioned into close defense five games into the 2017 season.

Paparo is only the third junior elected captain during head coach **Greg Cannella's** tenure. The honor was previously bestowed on **Ryan Izzo** during his junior year in 2014 and **Buddy Hoffman** in 1995.

## THE FIRST-TIMERS

Six Minutemen made their collegiate debuts during the game at No. 16 Army West Point, including **Hampton Brannon**, **Joe Casucci**, **Chris Connolly**, **Sam Eisenstadt**, **Clayton Proctor** and **Kevin Tobin**.

Connolly started at attack while Proctor rotated in as a reserve up front. Tobin played as a reserve midfielder while Casucci and Eisenstadt saw minutes as part of the close defensive lineup. Brannon relieved starting goalie **Sean Sconone** during the fourth quarter.

**Logan Danenza** made his first appearance as a Minuteman on defense as well. He previously appeared in eight games as a member of the High Point program in 2017.

Three Minutemen also made their first collegiate starts at Army West Point, including Connolly, first-line midfielder **Ben Spencer** and close defenseman **Jackson Suboch**.

## CAA PRESEASON POLL, ALL-CONFERENCE

Massachusetts collected third place on the CAA Coaches Poll while junior close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** earned preseason all-conference. Towson was picked first and Hofstra second. Drexel earned fourth, followed by Fairfield and Delaware. The full poll and preseason all-conference team is available on page 11.

## THE WINNING FORMULA

In the seven victories during the 2017 season...

- **Dan Muller** averaged 3.0 points per game (21 total) from his spot in the midfield, balanced between 12 goals and nine assists.
- **Noah Rak** was 96-of-149 on faceoffs (64.4 percent) with 41 ground balls (5.9 per game), two goals and as many assists. He has taken all but 14 faceoffs in the wins.
- Won the groundball battle, 217-176, led by Rak's 41 and followed by 25 from **Shane Rinkus**, 23 by **Mike McDonough** and 19 more from **Isaac Paparo**.
- Assisted on 52 of the team's 81 goals scored (64.2 percent), led by **Jeff Trainor's** 10 while **Dan Muller** had nine.
- Shot 31.4 percent (81 goals, 258 shots) and held opponents to 26.8 percent (61-of-228). It equates to 11.57 goals per game for the Minutemen and 8.71 goals against.

## MADE THE MOST OF THE EXTRA MAN

The Minutemen stood 14th nationally in man-up offense with conversions on 42.6 percent of their chances (20-of-47) through the end of the 2017 season. **Ben Spencer** led the team with eight man-up goals while **Dan Muller** added four and **Gianni Bianchin**, **Grant Consoletti** and **Jeff Trainor** have two apiece. It ranked second in the CAA behind Drexel (13th; .432; 19-44) and is 11 spots ahead of the next conference foe, Hofstra (25th; .365; 19-52).

## CAUSED TURNOVER AND EFFECT

UMass led the CAA and was 16th-best in NCAA Division I with an average of 7.87 caused turnovers per game (118). Led by **Isaac Paparo** (33 CTs) and supported by balance across the lineup (19 Minutemen with one or more CTs), Massachusetts outpaced the next CAA team, Towson (7.12; 26th). A caused turnover directly led to 30 UMass goals in 15 games (2.0 per game).

## FOUR SPLIT FIVE CAA YEAR-END AWARDS

Four Minutemen combined for five CAA end-of-season awards, including **Dan Muller** (All-CAA First Team; All-Academic Team), **Isaac Paparo** (All-CAA Second Team), **Noah Rak** (All-CAA Second Team) and **Jeff Trainor** (All-Rookie Team). It marked the first-such honors for Muller, Rak and Trainor. Paparo took home All-CAA Second Team as a rookie in 2016.

## THE LEUNGS OF THE CAA OFFENSE

Freshman attackman **Jesse Leung** had 11 goals on 21 shots against CAA opponents (52.4 percent), including the 2017 CAA Championship games. His nine scored during the five-game regular season conference slate were the most tallies by a Minuteman during league play. Leung had five of those nine during the Senior Night win over Drexel when he connected on all but one of his attempts. Leung tallied all nine of his goals during the regular season in CAA play as he had two against Fairfield and one each versus Delaware and at No. 7 Hofstra.

## FOCUSED ON HIS TRAINOR-ING

After he missed on his first eight collegiate shots, **Jeff Trainor** scored on 10 of his final recent 30 tries (33.3 shot percentage). He tallied twice at No. 15 Yale and, after missing two games due to injury, added two more versus Brown, Delaware and Fairfield. He posted another goal at No. 7 Hofstra and his 10th during the CAA Semifinal Round win over No. 14 Hofstra.

## BEN SPENCER MANS-UP

**Ben Spencer** posted eight man-up goals during his sophomore season, which put Spencer first in the CAA for man-up goals and ranked him tied for fourth nationally. He scored his eight man-up tallies in only 15 games, tied for the second-fewest games with as many or more man-up goals across the country.

He scored two at No. 20 Ohio State, had another at No. 15 Yale in the 11-9 win, added his fourth vs. Brown, followed with his fifth vs. Delaware, sixth against Fairfield, seventh at No. 7 Hofstra and eighth vs. the No. 14 Pride in the CAA Semifinal Round. The 6-foot-4 shooter totaled three man-up scores as a freshman in 2016 when he collected CAA All-Rookie Team.

His 11 career man-up goals rank him tops among active Minutemen entering 2018.

## THE QUICKER GROUNDBALL PICKER-UPPER

**Isaac Paparo** led the non-faceoff specialist Minutemen in groundballs with 46, an average of 3.1 per game. He ranked fourth in the CAA for groundballs per game and was the top-standing long-pole in rankings.

Paparo's 48 grounders placed him ahead of four faceoff men that took more than 150 faceoffs on the season. His 3.07 groundballs per game are the most by a UMass close defenseman since **Dan Whipple** averaged 3.71 per game (52 total) in 2007.

## BACKBONE OF THE BACK LINE

Then-sophomore **Isaac Paparo** moved into a starting role on close defense for the game against UMass Lowell and owns 26 caused turnovers along with 32 groundballs over his 10 appearances at the spot. Paparo, who previously played long-stick midfield, led the team in caused turnovers with a career high and program-record 33 during the 2017 season (2.2). He ranked second in the CAA and sixth nationally in the category upon completion of the 2017 NCAA Tournament.

## IKE LIKES CAUSED TURNOVERS

Long-stick midfielder and close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** provided 33 caused turnovers in his 15-game sophomore season - 27 more than the All-CAA Second Team honoree had as a freshman in 2016. He was the team leader in the category, second in the CAA and sixth nationally for caused turnovers per game (2.2) through the end of the 2017 NCAA Tournament.

Paparo became the program leader for the most caused turnovers by a Minuteman in a single season since the statistic was officially recognized by the NCAA prior to the 2010 season after his two created against Drexel in the Senior Night win. Paparo was previously tied with **Jake Smith** (2011) and **Tom Celentani** (2010) for the most in one year (25).

At 5-foot-7, Paparo was the shortest competitor in NCAA Division I lacrosse with as many caused turnovers.

## RAK-ED UP THE FACEOFF WINS

Over the final 11 games of the 2017 season, **Noah Rak** went 145-for-233 on faceoffs (62.2 percent) with 68 groundballs, two goals scored and as many assists dished out.

He won at least half of his attempts against No. 15 Yale (14-23), UMass Lowell (12-21), Hartford (18-24), Brown (12-23), Delaware (15-18), No. 15 Towson (10-19), No. 7 Hofstra (19-26), Drexel (12-20), No. 14 Hofstra (17-26) and No. 12 Towson (8-16).

Rak scored a goal each against UMass Lowell and Hartford and dished assists versus Fairfield and Drexel. His 10 groundballs at Hartford marked a career high while he has at least six in seven of those contests.

Rak ranked first in the CAA and ninth nationally with his 60.7 win percentage (148-244). He was also first in the CAA and 18th in NCAA Division I with 5.8 groundballs per game.

## IN THE PIPE, FIVE-BY-FIVE

Four Minutemen tied for the team lead in points in a single game during 2017 as **Tyler Bogart, Jesse Leung, Dan Muller** and **Jeff Trainor** each posted five - with Muller pulling off the feat twice. Bogart was the first to do so on four goals and an assist against UMass Lowell. Muller followed 10 days later with two goals and three assists vs. Brown. Trainor also had two goals and three assists versus Fairfield (April 15) before Leung sprung for five tallies against Drexel (April 28). Muller added a second five point game with four goals and one assist against No. 14 Hofstra in the CAA Semifinal Round (May 14). UMass went 4-1 when a Minuteman goes for five points.

## THE SIX

UMass had six goals in a quarter twice during 2017 and each happened during two of the final three games. Massachusetts poured in six goals vs. Drexel during the second quarter before it achieved the same feat against No. 14 Hofstra in the CAA Semifinal Round. The previous one-quarter high for the team was five during the third quarter at Hartford.

In a classic UMass-Hofstra rock fight, **Dan Muller** won the 13-12 upset of the No. 14-ranked and No. 2-seeded Hofstra at the 2017 CAA Championship with a 35-yard launch at the buzzer that snuck by Pride goalie Jack Concannon. The play, and subsequent celebration, earned Muller and the Minutemen No. 2 on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 Countdown. It capped a game in which the Maroon and White led by as many as six before Hofstra furiously rallied and tied the game in the final minutes.

## MAN DOWN! MAN DOWN!

UMass, which entered the 2017 CAA Semifinal Round game against Hofstra without a man-down goal in 782 minutes played on the season, scored two while short a player against the Pride in the 13-12 victory. It is as many man-down goals as the rest of the CAA scored during the entire season to that point.

The man-down tallies were the final two Massachusetts tallies of the contest. In another feat of unlikelihood, short-stick defensive midfielder **Dylan Gruder** accounted for the first on a pass from long-stick midfielder **Mike McDonough** with 5:06 remaining in the game. It moved UMass ahead, 12-11 during the faceoff following Hofstra's game-tying goal, which rolled deep into the UMass defense half before McDonough could corral the loose ball. The second man-down goal was **Dan Muller's** game-winning tally at the buzzer.

UMass was one of seven teams in the nation with multiple man-down goals, all tied for first with two on the year (Brown, High Point, Providence, Robert Morris, Siena and Syracuse). The Minutemen were the only team to score both in the same game.

### SHARING IS CARING

Massachusetts sported assists on 86 of the team's 134 goals (64.2 percent), the second-most per contest (5.73) in the CAA behind only Hofstra (89, 6.36). **Dan Muller** (15), **Grant Consoletti** (14) and **Jeff Trainor** (12) ranked as the top distributors among Minutemen. Muller and Consoletti reset their previous single-season assist records. Trainor was a freshman.

Massachusetts posted assists on each of its nine goals against Delaware, the only game of the year with a 100.0 percent assist rate. In total, UMass has six games with assists on 75.0 percent or more of its goals in 2017. The team only had two games with assists on fewer than 50.0 percent of its goals this season.

### HATS OFF TO THESE MINUTEMEN

Four current Minutemen own at least one career hat trick, including eight split between them. Senior **Buddy Carr** has four, including his seven-point game against Sacred Heart (3G, 4A). **Ben Spencer** tallied two during the 2017 season, when **Jesse Leung** added one - the lone five-goal game among active Minutemen. **Chris Connolly** became the fourth Minuteman with a hat trick following his four-goal game over Sacred Heart on Feb. 13, 2018.

### A FAMILIAR FACE ON THE OPPOSITE SIDELINE

Head coach **Greg Cannella** coached against a familiar face on March 7, 2017, with its trip to No. 15 Yale, which is led by former Massachusetts assistant coach **Andy Shay**.

From 2001-03, Shay helped Cannella lead the Minutemen to 37 victories, three New England titles and a pair of ECAC championships. Shay filled roles that included recruiting coordinator and defensive coordinator. He departed for Yale following the 2003 season and is 113-79 at the helm of the Bulldog program with five Ivy League titles.

The Minutemen downed Yale, 11-9 for the upset win in the first meeting between the teams since the 2010 season. The series between Cannella and Shay is evenly matched over the first eight meetings (2004-10, '17) at 4-4.

Massachusetts will again face Yale in 2018, doing so at Garber Field on Feb. 27.

### GARBER'S DEFENDANTS

Four Minutemen recorded double-digit point totals in front of the home crowds at Garber Field in 2017, led by 16 from redshirt senior midfielder **Dan Muller** (seven goals, nine assists). **Jeff Trainor** (six goals, nine assists) added 15 points while **Tyler Bogart** had 13 on 12 goals and an assist. **Grant Consoletti** rounded out the group with 10 points on three goals and seven assists. **D.J. Smith** backstopped the defense with an 8.13 goals-against average and .611 save percentage over 361 minutes between the pipes. Close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** added 3.0 groundballs and 2.0 caused turnovers as a starter in front of Smith.

Massachusetts opened its home slate with a 13-9 win over Sacred Heart. In the triumph, **Buddy Carr** posted seven points (three goals, four assists) and **Chris Connolly** scored four times. **Dan O'Brien** added a career day with four caused turnovers and two groundballs.

### RANKED FOES LEFT, RIGHT & CENTER

The Minutemen played seven games against USILA Top-20 ranked teams during 2017, including No. 7 Hofstra, No. 9 Albany, No. 12 Towson in the CAA Championship Game, No. 14 Hofstra in the CAA Semifinal Round, No. 15 Yale, No. 15 Towson and No. 20 Ohio State.

The Minutemen have at least one ranked opponent on the docket in 2018, as Army began the season at No. 16. Five future opponents received rankings in the USILA Preseason Top-20 Poll, including No. 3 Albany, No. 5 Yale, No. 14 Towson, No. 19 Hofstra and No. 20 Brown.

### THE BG CREW

Massachusetts sports four former Bishop Guertin High School (Nashua, N.H.) standouts on the 2018 roster in sophomore **Charlie O'Brien**, junior **Anthony Reale**, redshirt junior **Dom St. Laurent** and freshman **Christian Trahan**.

Bishop Guertin is a common training ground for future Minutemen. Recent graduates **Bob Fahey** ('16), **Kyle Karaska** ('16) and **Paul Spinney** ('17) also attended the school.

### HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

Garber Field has proven to be one of the toughest home field advantages in all of college lacrosse as UMass has posted an 86-34 record (71.7 win percentage) at Garber since the beginning of 2001.

The squad won at least four home games in 12 of the last 16 seasons, including a program-record 10 victories in 2003 and another nine wins in Amherst during the 2012 campaign.

The Minutemen played their first five home games of 2015 at McGuirk Stadium due to winter weather-related damage to the playing surface at Garber. They went 2-3 at McGuirk in 2015 and 1-1 at Garber Field following their return against Drexel (4/18) and Delaware (4/24).

# UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS LACROSSE GAME NOTES

## TRANSFERRING IN

Massachusetts has four transfer student-athletes on the 2018 roster, including **Aidan Byrne**, **Cameron Carpenter**, **Logan Danenza** and **Mike Sullivan**.

Byrne attended Stony Brook and was a member of the men's lacrosse program in 2017, but did not compete during his true-freshman season.

Carpenter made three appearances at Mount St. Mary's during his first collegiate season in 2017. He played just under 70 minutes as a reserve goalie and sported a 9.53 goals-against average.

Danenza saw time on close defense in eight contests for High Point one year ago. He finished the season with five groundballs and two caused turnovers.

Sullivan, who is in his second year with the team, played for Siena College as a freshman in 2016. He had 12 groundballs over nine games played for the Saints.

## GORILLA PRIDE PASSED DOWN

Six current men's lacrosse student-athletes are relatives of University of Massachusetts graduates, including **Buddy Carr**, **Isaac Paparo**, **Billy Philpott**, **Anthony Reale**, **Ben Spencer** and **Devin Spencer**.

**Buddy Carr's** father is Kelley Carr, who was a four-year letterman and is one of 39 members of the UMass Men's Lacrosse 100-Point Club.

**Isaac Paparo's** parents, Russ and Leslie, graduated from the University of Massachusetts. Russ did not compete for the team.

**Billy Philpott's** father, Scott, graduated from the University of Massachusetts and played for the men's lacrosse program in 1981.

**Anthony Reale's** older brother, Joe, was a member of the team from 2006-09.

Brothers **Ben** and **Devin Spencer's** father, Ted, played for the men's lacrosse team from 1983-85 before a 13-year tenure as the coach of the Fairfield men's lacrosse program.

## THE BROTHERS SPENCER

Junior midfielder **Ben Spencer** and sophomore attack **Devin Spencer** are the only pair of siblings on the team. Ben is in his first season as a starter on the first-line midfield while Devin is in his first season as a starter on attack. Their father, Ted, also played for the program in the 1980s.

Following Massachusetts, the next-most common home states among Minutemen are New York (8) while no other has more than four UMass men's lacrosse student-athletes calling it home.

## "GARBER'S GORILLAS" EXPLAINED

For the past 50 years, the University of Massachusetts men's lacrosse team has held the unofficial nickname of "Gorillas." In 1965, UMass took in its first high-profile recruit, **Kevin O'Connor**, from New York. His girlfriend, poking a bit of fun at the relatively diminutive size of the Minutemen players at the time, drew a picture of a gorilla donning a lacrosse helmet with a stick in its hand. The art major and members of the team made stickers of the newly adopted moniker and put them everywhere, including their helmets. Thus, the nickname, "Garber's Gorillas" and style of play, "Gorilla Lacrosse" were born.

## SLAYING GIANTS

**Greg Cannella** continues to challenge his squad with contests against nationally talented programs. In the process, Cannella guided UMass to 63 total wins versus nationally ranked foes during his tenure, including multiple in nine of the last 10 seasons.

Dating back to the 1973 season, the earliest available poll data from the USILA, the Minutemen have secured the most single-season top-20 wins as a program under Cannella with seven during 2003.

## TWO DECADES UNDER THE INFLUENCE

The 2018 season marks **Greg Cannella's** 24th as the head coach of UMass. The University of Massachusetts graduate is 194-136 overall and stands as one of the longest tenured coaches in NCAA D-I. In terms of total D-I experience, Cannella is fifth while his 24 years in Amherst place him second for longest head coaching tenure at a current school among all head coaches in D-I during the 2017 season.

Cannella has guided the Minutemen to many of the most successful campaigns in program history since being named the head coach on Nov. 9, 1994. The Lynbrook, N.Y., native took the 2006 squad to the NCAA Championship Game and led UMass to the most single-season victories in program history (15) as well as the No. 1 national ranking during the 2012 season, which culminated in the most recent of the team's eight trips to the NCAA Tournament under Cannella.

# UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS LACROSSE GAME NOTES

## ROAD TRIPPIN'

Among all Minutemen, brothers **Ben** and **Devin Spencer** trekked the furthest to play for head coach Greg Cannella at UMass, as the Spencers call the State of California home.

The Spencer brothers left the Gold Coast for New England and covered approximately 2,600 miles to do so. They hail from Danville, which is about 20 miles West of Oakland.

Recent graduate **Grant Consoletti** ('17), spanned a distance of roughly 2,550 miles directly across the country from his town (Thousand Oaks) on the Pacific Coast to the Berkshires. Consoletti was the second Minuteman to hail from California in recorded program history upon arrival and the first since **Bob Woodbury** (Van Nuys, Calif.) lettered for UMass in 1962 and 1963. The hometowns of those two are only approximately 25 miles apart.

## MADDEN MOVES INTO COACHING ROLE

**Shane Madden** is in his first season filling a role as an undergraduate volunteer assistant with the men's lacrosse program following two years as a competitor with the team.

As a freshman in 2016, Madden won a CAA Commissioner's Academic Award and scored one goal on his only shot taken over three games played as a reserve on midfield or attack. He did not see the field as a sophomore in 2017 due to injury, medically retired from competition and shifted into his current role following the season.

Madden is a graduate of Trinity-Pawling High School in Pawling, N.Y., after he began his scholastic studies at Brookfield High School. He captained the Trinity-Pawling squad as a senior in 2015 and provided 32 points via 19 goals and 13 assists and received All-Founders League in his first year (2014), when he contributed 19 points on 14 goals and five assists.

Madden was an Under Armor All-American and All-SWC selection at Brookfield High School in 2013. He led Brookfield as a sophomore in 2012 with 53 points through 34 goals and 19 assists and followed his 2012 season with 74 points on 49 goals and 25 assists in 2013. Madden was a member of the National Honor Society in 2014 and 2015.

## PAPARO TABBED TO ISRAEL NATIONAL TEAM

Junior close defenseman **Isaac Paparo** was chosen for Israel Lacrosse's 2018 FIL World Championship roster, as announced by the organization. One of only seven defensemen selected to the roster, Paparo will have the opportunity to represent his Jewish heritage with participation in the upcoming tournament, scheduled for July 12-21, 2018, in Netanya, Israel.

Over his two completed seasons as a Minuteman, Paparo owns 73 groundballs alongside 39 caused turnovers, including a program-record 33 created as a sophomore last season. He split his first two years between long-stick midfielder and close defenseman, and received second team All-CAA in both campaigns.

The Israel Nation Team roster is composed of Israeli players, as well as members of the Jewish Diaspora, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL). In conjunction with the Israel Lacrosse Tzedakah Program, each player will be competing in honor of a charity of their choosing.

## GUOBADIA HONORED BY UMass

Alumnus **Efosa Guobadia** received the inaugural School of Public Health and Health Sciences (SPHHS) Distinguished Young Alumna Award, as announced by the SPHHS on Aug. 28, 2017. Guobadia, PT, DPT, is the Co-Founder, President and CEO of Move Together, a non-profit organization dedicated to improving access to quality rehab medicine around the corner and around the world. He is also the co-founder and co-director of the international initiative Physical Therapy (PT) Day of Service, and formerly developed and led the international volunteer program ATI MissionWorks for ATI Physical Therapy.

## VALENZA NAMED TO ITALIAN NATIONAL TEAM

Senior close defenseman **Luc Valenza** earned inclusion on the 2018 Italian National Team roster for the upcoming Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World Championship, as announced by Team Italy. Valenza is the second Minuteman selected to compete in the international tournament, alongside junior close defenseman Isaac Paparo (Team Israel).

Valenza started all 15 games at close defense for the Minutemen in 2017 and posted career highs of 25 groundballs and 15 caused turnovers. He tallied at least one caused turnover in 11 of his 15 appearances and had multiple groundballs in seven contests, including four each against Army West Point (Feb. 11) and Harvard (Feb. 25). Valenza also recorded his first collegiate point during the 2017 season on an assist at Harvard.

## INAUGURAL UMass LAXBACKERS CAREER DAY RECAP

UMass Laxbackers, the alumni support network for the University of Massachusetts men's lacrosse program, coordinated a business networking event in New York City for the current Minuteman juniors and seniors.

The student-athlete group visited three companies over the course of the day, where speakers from each business, including Chief Executive Officers (CEOs) and human resource representatives, spoke to the Minutemen about what traits they emphasize in a job applicant, how to prepare for an interview, what to expect during the first year of work, and a general overview of their respective industries.

The first presentation took UMass lacrosse to Atlas Capital, a full service real estate investment, development and management firm based in Midtown Manhattan. Following their stop at Atlas Capital, the Minutemen headed around the corner to The Benchmark Company, a broker-dealer that provides equity research, sales, trading and investment banking. The day concluded back in Midtown Manhattan with a final presentation at IgnitionOne, an advertising technology company.

The men's lacrosse program and the UMass Laxbackers will expand the program and will continue to provide a valuable networking resource to the student-athletes, and to the alumni, family and friends of the team.

## SMITH, SPOONER NAMED TO US LACROSSE WESTERN MASSACHUSETTS HALL OF FAME CHAPTER

The US Lacrosse Western Massachusetts Chapter announced the inductions of alumni **Norm Smith** (1976-79) and **Jeff Spooner** (1974-77) into the organization's Hall of Fame as part of the five-person Class of 2017.

Smith, a three-year NEILA All-New England choice (1977-79) and two-time all-America selection (1977, '79), posted 140 points via 74 goals and 66 assists during four standout seasons on attack. Upon graduation after the 1979 season, Smith ranked sixth all-time on the school's scoring list.

Spooner, the program's all-time leading scorer (275 points, 134 goals, 141 assists), is the only player with 65 or more points in four consecutive seasons as a Minuteman. He won all-America awards from the U.S. Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) from 1975-77 and was inducted into the UMass Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001.

Combined, Smith and Spooner helped Massachusetts men's lacrosse to 58 victories from 1974-79. During the 1976-77 seasons when Smith and Spooner donned the Maroon and White side-by-side, UMass was 21-7 overall (.750 win percentage) and earned the team's first-ever NCAA Tournament berths.

## DONOVAN, HILLER RECOGNIZED BY US LACROSSE LONG ISLAND METRO HALL OF FAME CHAPTER

Two members of the University of Massachusetts men's lacrosse family were recognized by the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame Metro Long Island Chapter on Jan. 28, 2018. **Scott Hiller** was inducted into the organization's hall of fame as part of a 10-member Class of 2017 while **Rich Donovan** was a co-recipient of the Class of 2017's Whitey Hendrickson Lifetime Achievement Award.

One of only three UMass athletes to be named a four-time All-American, Hiller starred on the lacrosse field for the Minutemen from 1987-90. He was a four-time All-New England selection and currently ranks third all-time in career goals scored (135) and seventh in points (190). He helped the Minutemen to four NCAA Tournament berths and as many New England Championships.

Donovan, a standout at East Meadow High School on Long Island, was a four-year member of the UMass defense and a team captain for the Minutemen in 1978. He helped the squad win 39 games over his four seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in 1976 and 1977.

Following graduation from UMass, Donovan pursued coaching and began as an assistant to Dick Garber with the Minutemen in 1979. He went on to coach collegiately at C. W. Post (defensive coordinator, 1983-85) and Hofstra (associate head coach, 1986-95) while he also impacted the game at the scholastic level.

Donovan was the varsity coach at Herricks High School in 1981-82 and East Meadow High School from 2002-04, while he is currently the leader of the Wheatley/Carle Place High School squad. He also holds experience at the Major League Lacrosse (Bridgeport Brigade, 2002) and international levels (German National Team, 2010-14).

## DWYER NAMED TO US LACROSSE NEW JERSEY NORTH HALL OF FAME CHAPTER

University of Massachusetts men's lacrosse alumnus **Charlie Dwyer** will be inducted into the U.S. Lacrosse Hall of Fame New Jersey North Chapter as the 2017 Richard Rizk "Unsung Hero" Award on Sun., Jan. 28, 2018. One of seven selected to the Class of 2017, Dwyer is being recognized as a member of the New Jersey lacrosse community whose continued contributions to the game help foster the growth and success of the sport locally, regionally and nationally.

Dwyer competed as a defenseman for the Minutemen during the 1983 and 1984 seasons and earned a letter during his senior year. Head coach Richard Garber's squad won eight games during Dwyer's senior season in 1984, including seven of its final nine. With Dwyer's contributions on the defensive end, the Maroon and White limited foes to 7.67 goals per game, including six or fewer during wins over Army, Boston College, Dartmouth, Hofstra and New Hampshire.

Following his competitive days at UMass and two more as a defenseman and defensive midfielder for the Western Massachusetts Lacrosse Club and Boston Lacrosse Club, Dwyer continued his involvement in the sport of lacrosse at the youth level. During the last 21 years, Dwyer contributed to New Jersey lacrosse as a coach and administrator locally and at the state level, including as a U15 team leader.
