THINGS TO KNOW

1. Massachusetts has faced Miami (Ohio) twice in program history, posting a 2-0 record.
2. The teams first met on January 2, 2013, in Oxford, Ohio, where Massachusetts narrowly won 70-69 with Raphiael Putney (20 points, nine rebounds) leading the way for UMass.
3. Massachusetts' nine MAC games have been decided by a combined 36 points or 4.00 points per contest.
4. Danny Carbuccia's 4.00 assist to turnover ratio in MAC games ranks second in league games, as does his 6.67 assists per game mark.
5. Graduate students Leonardo Bettiol and Marcus Banks Jr. lead the team in scoring, averaging 17.1 and 16.2 points per game, respectively.

SERIES HISTORY

- ▶ Massachusetts has faced Miami (Ohio) twice in program history, posting a 2-0 record.
- ▶ The Minutemen and the RedHawks competed in a home-and-home series over the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons.
- ▶ The team first met on January 2, 2013, in Oxford, Ohio, where Massachusetts narrowly won 70-69 with Raphael Putney (20 points, nine rebounds) leading the way for UMass.
- ▶ The second meeting came on January 4, 2014, when Massachusetts secured a 73-65 victory at the Mullins Center.
- ▶ Chaz Williams led the Minutemen in scoring with 18 points.

LAST TIME OUT

- ▶ Massachusetts came up with several clutch possessions down the stretch to edge Buffalo, 68-67, last Friday night, to improve to 4-5 in the MAC.
- ▶ Graduate student Marcus Banks Jr., scored a team-leading 19 points, knocking down four three-pointers on the night.
- ▶ Leonardo Bettiol followed with 16 points, shooting 7-for-10 from the field, and tallying seven rebounds.
- ▶ Daniel Hankins-Sanford registered his eight double-double of the season with 15 points and a game-high 10 boards, going 4-for-4 from the charity stripe.

SCOUTING THE REDHAWKS

- ▶ Miami (OH) enters Tuesday's game with a 20-game win streak, after defeating Kent State on the road, 107-101 last Tuesday.
- ▶ RedHawks Head Coach Travis Steele is in his fourth season at Miami (OH), accumulating a 72-46 (41-25 MAC) overall record during his time in Oxford, Ohio.
- ▶ Brant Byers leads the team in points, averaging 15.2 per game, and ranking 12th in the league.
- ▶ Eian Elmer and Antwone Woolfolk lead the RedHawks in rebounds, averaging 5.8 and 5.3, respectively. Elmer is ranked 14th in the MAC, while Woolfolk is 22nd in the conference.
- ▶ The RedHawks are 20-0 overall and 8-0 in the MAC.

TIP-OFF TIDBITS

- ▶ UMass has held opponents to a 29.2 shooting percentage from three, ranking first in the conference and 18th in the country.
- ▶ UMass' +6.1 rebounding margin ranks second in the MAC.
- ▶ Massachusetts ranks third in offensive rebounds per game (12.33).
- ▶ The Minutemen rank third in the MAC and 32nd nationally by averaging 17.6 assists per game.
- ▶ Massachusetts' nine MAC games have been decided by a combined 36 points or 4.00 points per contest.
- ▶ UMass features four players averaging double figures in points including Leonardo Bettiol (17.1), Marcus Banks Jr. (16.2), Daniel Hankins-Sanford (11.7) and K'jei Parker (11.6).
- ▶ Bettiol and Banks Jr., rank seventh and ninth, respectively, in points per game in the MAC.
- ▶ Bettiol is also shooting 60.5 percent from the field to rank first in the league and 25th nationally.
- ▶ Bettiol is also averaging 7.5 rebounds per game to rank fifth in the MAC, while Hankins-Sanford ranks eighth (7.2).
- ▶ Among MAC players, Banks Jr., ranks first in three-point attempts (177), second in three pointers made (66) and in three pointers per game (3.14), and third in three-point percentage (37.3).
- ▶ Danny Carbuca's 6.0 assists per game rank second in the MAC and 32nd in the

country, while his 3.21 assist/turnover ratio is second in the league and 33rd in the country.

- ▶ Carbuca ranks third in the country among freshmen in both categories.
- ▶ Carbuca's 4.00 assist to turnover ratio in MAC games also ranks second in league games, as does his 6.67 assists per game mark.
- ▶ Hankins-Sanford (8) and Bettiol (3) each have multiple double-doubles this season.
- ▶ Hankins-Sanford's eight double-doubles are the second most in the MAC.

RANKED NOTES

- ▶ Massachusetts most recently played a ranked opponent on Feb. 15, 2020 when it faced sixth-ranked Dayton (L, 71-63 at the Mullins Center).
- ▶ Massachusetts last defeated a ranked opponent on Nov. 22, 2013 when it downed New Mexico, 81-65, in the semifinals of the Charleston Classic in Charleston, S.C. (TD Arena).

FIGGER HONORED

- ▶ Men's basketball assistant coach Matt Figger has been named one of the 100 Most Impactful Mid-Major Assistants by Silver Waves Media as part of its seventh annual recognition list.
- ▶ Currently in his second season with the Minutemen, Figger was hired as an assistant coach on May 21, 2024.
- ▶ He spent 10 seasons on head coach Frank Martin's staff at Kansas State and South Carolina before head coaching stints at Austin Peay and UT Rio Grande Valley.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK

- ▶ During the first semester, Massachusetts put together a five-game winning streak from Nov. 24 – Dec. 13, including wins over Oregon State, Harvard, UMass Lowell, Boston College and Florida State.
- ▶ It was the longest winning streak for the Minutemen since winning six straight from Nov. 17, 2022 – Dec. 5, 2023, which included wins over Colorado, Murray State, Charlotte, South Florida, Harvard and UAlbany.
- ▶ The back-to-back victories over Boston College and Florida State marked the first consecutive wins against teams currently in a power six conference since Dec. 9, 2017 (Providence) and Dec. 16, 2017 (Georgia).
- ▶ During the five-game winning streak, Marcus Banks Jr. averaged 21.4 points per game while shooting 21-for-45 from three (.467).
- ▶ Daniel Hankins-Sanford averaged 16.8 points per game to go along with 7.2 rebounds per game, while Leonardo Bettiol checked in with 14.2 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per game.

MINUTEMEN IN THE MAC

- ▶ The Minutemen are in their first season in the Mid-American conference after 43 seasons in the Atlantic 10.
- ▶ Massachusetts holds a 538-498 record in conference play all-time and a 28-35 record (24-30, A-10) under Coach Martin.
- ▶ The Minutemen opened MAC play on Saturday, Dec. 20, hosting Kent State in the Mullins Center, falling 69-59 to the Golden Flashes.
- ▶ UMass earned its first MAC win against Ball State (79-71) on Jan. 10, 2026.

MONEY IN THE BANKS

- ▶ Marcus Banks Jr. comes to Massachusetts as one of the top three-point shooters in the nation, making 313 across his first four seasons in Division I.
- ▶ The UMBC transfer led the America East Conference in 3-point field goals (192) over the past two seasons and ranks seventh nationally amongst returning DI players in 3-pointers made last season (107).
- ▶ Banks Jr. is a career 37.3% shooter from beyond the arc and shot a career-high 41.8% last season.

BETTIOL BIG EARLY

- ▶ Graduate student Leonardo Bettiol has made his presence known during his first season as a Minuteman, averaging 17.1 points and 7.5 rebounds through 21 games.
- ▶ The transfer from Abilene Christian is averaging career-high's in points, rebounds, field goal percentage (.605) and minutes (27.9) in his fourth collegiate season.
- ▶ Bettiol recorded back-to-back double-doubles against Le Moyne (17 pts/11 reb) and CCSU (19 pts/15 reb) during Massachusetts season-opening four game homestand.
- ▶ The Roncade, Italy native ranks seventh in the MAC in points per game (17.1) and fifth in rebounds per game (7.5).

DOUBLE DOUBLE DAN

- ▶ Senior Daniel Hankins-Sanford earned his eighth double-double of the season, tallying 15 points and 10 rebounds at Buffalo (1/23/26).
- ▶ Hankins-Sanford recorded his first double-double of the 2025-26 season, putting up a 14 point, 10 rebound performance vs. UAlbany (11/8/25).
- ▶ Hankins-Sanford returns to Amherst after playing 58 games in two years with the Minutemen.
- ▶ Hankins-Sanford led the team and ranked 56th nationally with nine double-doubles a season ago.
- ▶ The Charlotte, North Carolina, native averaged a career-high 7.37 rebounds per game in 2024-25, while recording 10 games with 10-plus rebounds on the year.
- ▶ Hankins-Sanford recorded four consecutive double-doubles last season against GW (12 pts/11 reb), Rhode Island (19 pts/12 reb), St. Bonaventure (22 pts/11 reb) and Loyola Chicago (22 pts/15 reb)

NEWCOMERS: BY THE NUMBERS

- ▶ 3 - Three freshmen will make their collegiate debut in the Maroon and White this season.
- ▶ 5 - Five newcomers come to Amherst from Division II or Junior College institutions
- ▶ 5 - Massachusetts welcomes a diverse group of newcomers representing five different states and four different countries
- ▶ 10 - The Minutemen welcome 10 total newcomers to the 2025-26 roster

FAST & FURIOUS

- ▶ The Minutemen play with one of the highest tempos in college basketball, ranking 183rd nationally in adjusted tempo, with 71.4 possessions per 40 minutes.
- ▶ Massachusetts has been furious on the glass ranking second in the MAC and 46th nationally in rebound margin (6.1). The Minutemen continue to crash the offensive boards, ranking third in the conference and 86th nationally in offensive rebounds per game (12.3).
- ▶ UMass has utilized their tempo and aggressive play to attack the paint, ranking sixth in the MAC with 22.9 free throw attempts per game.

YEAR FOUR FOR COACH MARTIN

- ▶ Massachusetts basketball enters its fourth season under head coach Frank Martin in 2024-25.
- ▶ Under Martin's leadership the Minutemen enjoyed their best campaign since 2014 last year, finishing the 2023-24 season with a 20-11 overall record and securing a top-four seed in the Atlantic 10 Championship
- ▶ Martin ended the 2023-24 campaign ranked third in program history with a 35-27 record through his first two seasons with the Minutemen, sitting just below Bruiser Flint and Travis Ford.
- ▶ Coach Martin started his time in Amherst by leading the Minutemen to their best record under a first-year head coach since 1996 and the Myrtle Beach Invitational title during the 2022-23 campaign
- ▶ Martin holds a 346-256 (.575) collegiate coaching mark, picking up 171 of his wins in 10 seasons at South Carolina while recording 117 wins in five seasons

at Kansas State.

- ▶ Head coach Frank Martin picked up his 300th collegiate coaching win on Jan. 25, 2023 with a 85-76 win over Richmond.

EXPERIENCE ON THE BENCH

- ▶ The Massachusetts coaching staff features three assistants, Allen Edwards, Matt Figger and Anthony Evans, who have served as NCAA Division I head coaches.
- ▶ Associate Head Coach Allen Edwards was the head coach of the Wyoming Cowboys from 2016-20. Edwards' teams recorded 60 wins over four seasons, including back-to-back 20-win seasons
- ▶ Assistant Coach Matt Figger spent the last three seasons at UT Rio Grande Valley after four seasons leading Austin Peay.
- ▶ Director of player development Anthony Evans spent five seasons as the head coach at FIU following six years as the head coach at Norfolk State.

Frank Martin enters his fourth season at the helm of the Massachusetts men's basketball program in 2025-26. Martin was named the 23rd head coach in men's basketball history in March of 2022.

The Minutemen finished the 2024-25 season with 12 wins, including seven in conference play. Under Martin's tutelage guard Rahsool Diggins had a breakout senior season, averaging a team-high 16.8 points on his way to earning All-Atlantic 10 Third Team honors.

During the 2023-24 season, Martin led the Minutemen to their best campaign since 2014, finishing with a 20-11 overall record and securing a top-four seed in the Atlantic 10 Championship. The campaign marked the program's first 20-win season since 2013-14 and first top-four seed since the 2007-08 season.

Martin guided the Minutemen to the A-10's top offense, averaging 77.5 points per game including a NCAA best 9.0 points per game off post-ups. Bringing the best out of the roster, Martin coached two players to First Team All-Atlantic 10 honors. It marked the first time a UMass duo earned the honor since Rashaun Freeman and Stephane Lasme in the 2006-07 season.

The Minutemen opened Martin's first season at the helm with a 7-1 record and a Myrtle Beach Invitational title. UMass' midseason tournament championship run featured wins over Colorado, Murray State, and Charlotte while jumpstarting a six-game win streak for the Minutemen. The team also picked up a win over Hofstra at the Basketball Hall of Fame Invitational in the Barclays Center with Matt Cross claiming the MVP honor. Martin's team recorded the largest true road win over an A-10 opponent by a UMass squad since February of 1996 with a 69-45 win at Rhode Island.

Martin brought 15 years of head coaching experience to Amherst after spending 10 seasons prior as the head coach at South Carolina, where he led the Gamecocks to the program's first ever NCAA Final Four in 2017.

Martin began his 10-year run in Columbia, S.C. prior to the 2014-15 season and went on to match the program's record for wins in a season as his team finished the 2015-16 campaign with a 25-9 record. The squad rose to as high as 15th in the USA Today Coaches Poll following the Gamecocks' best start since the 1933-34 season.

Under Martin, South Carolina broke the record for wins in a single season with 26 in 2016-17 on the way to the best NCAA Tournament run in program history. Martin led the Gamecocks to their first NCAA Tournament win since 1973 and to the program's first-ever Sweet 16, Elite Eight, and Final Four. The No. 7-seed squad defeated No. 2 seed Duke in the round of 32 and earned wins over Baylor in the Sweet 16 and Florida in the Elite Eight before falling to Gonzaga in the national semifinals.

He was named the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year. The Gamecocks were ranked in the AP Poll for nine weeks and the coaches poll for 10 weeks and finished as the No. 6-ranked team in the final USA Today Coaches Poll. Sindarius Thornwell was named a CBS Sports First-Team All-American and the NCAA East Regional Most Outstanding Player.

Martin got his first head coaching opportunity at Kansas State in 2007-08 and brought the Wildcats to the NCAA Tournament in four of his five seasons at the helm. He guided the Wildcats to their first win over rival and No. 2-ranked Kansas since 1983 and took the team to its first NCAA Tournament since 1996.

In 2009-10, Martin led Kansas State to a 29-8 record and an Elite Eight appearance. The Wildcats earned their first win over a No. 1-ranked team in Texas since 1994 and finished the year ranked inside the top-10 in both major polls. Kansas State went into the 2010 NCAA Tournament as the No. 2 seed and defeated North Texas, BYU and Xavier in postseason play. He was recognized as the Big 12 Coach of the Year.

A Miami, Fla. native, Martin began his coaching career in the high school ranks in Miami, earning his first head coaching job at North Miami High School before moving to Miami Senior, where he led the team to three straight state championships. His first collegiate coaching job came in 2000 as he was named an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Northeastern University. From there, he joined Bob Huggins' staff at Cincinnati and was part of Huggins' coaching staff at Kansas State during the 2006-07 season.

A fixture off the court and in the community, Martin and his wife, UMass track and field alumna Anya (nee Forrest), have hosted numerous philanthropic events and have been key investors in the UMass women's track and field program.





Allen Edwards

Associate Head Coach

Fourth Season | Kentucky

an upset win over Duke in 2007. Prior to arriving at VCU, Edwards spent three seasons at Morehead State in his first full-time assistant coaching role following a year as a special assistant coach under Tubby Smith at Kentucky during the 2002-03 season.

As a student-athlete at Kentucky from 1995-98, Edwards was part of two national championship teams in 1998 and 1996 and helped the Wildcats to a runner-up finish in 1997 and an Elite Eight appearance in 1995. The Miami, Fla. native played high school ball at Miami Senior High School.

Allen Edwards was hired as the Associate Head Coach at UMass in April of 2022. Edwards joined the Minutemen with four years of head coaching and 16 years of assistant coaching experience and most recently spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Loyola Marymount.

"Super excited to once again line up with Allen Edwards on my side," said Frank Martin. "I was fortunate enough to coach him in high school and watched him grow as a coach after completing his unbelievably successful playing career. He brings unbelievable experience as a former head coach and as a lead assistant coach for tremendous coaches in his background. Allen and his family will be a tremendous addition to UMass and the Amherst communities."

At Loyola Marymount, Edwards helped the Lions to a top-three finish in the West Coast Conference in 2020-21 and helped them secure their first winning record in conference play since 2011-12. The squad finished in the top-100 in the NCAA NET rankings at No. 95, the highest finish in NET or RPI since the 1990 season.

Prior to arriving at LMU, Edwards spent nine seasons at Wyoming and was the head coach of the Cowboys from 2016-20. Edwards' teams recorded 60 wins over four seasons, including back-to-back 20-win seasons while winning 23 games in 2016-17 on the way to the CBI Championship. As an assistant at Wyoming, Edwards helped the 2015 team to the NCAA Second Round and coached Larry Nance to a first-round draft pick in the 2015 NBA Draft.

Edwards also spent time as an assistant coach for a year each at Western Kentucky and Towson after three years at VCU as an assistant under Anthony Grant. VCU reached the NCAA Tournament twice from 2006-09 and picked up



Brian Steele

Assistant Coach

Fourth Season | South Carolina

Brian Steele was hired as an assistant coach at UMass in April of 2022 after spending time on head coach Frank Martin's staff at South Carolina. Steele served as the team's video coordinator for the 2020-21 season following time as a player for the Gamecocks.

The Greenville, S.C. native was an assistant coach for two years prior at Queens University in Charlotte, where he helped guide the Royals to a NCAA DII Elite Eight appearance in the 2018-19 season. Steele signed the highest ranked recruit in Queens history in three-star guard Justin Thomas and helped coach the Royals to a top-25 finish in both major national polls for a fifth-straight season in 2019-20.

Steele was a three-year letter winner at South Carolina as a student-athlete and served as a student assistant during the 2015-16 season in addition to the 2016-17 Final Four campaign. Steele was a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll member and earned his degree in sport and entertainment management in 2016. During his prep career at Wade Hampton High School, Steele earned all-state, all-region, and all-county honors and helped his squad earn a state championship during his junior season.

"Brian Steele is a future star in the coaching profession," said Martin. "He became a graduate assistant after completing his playing career for me at South Carolina. He then moved on to Queens College, where he was an assistant coach and helped them prepare a team that was worthy of being in the Elite Eight at the DII level. I rehired him to be my video coordinator and decided to promote him to assistant coach after one year. He has an unbelievable enthusiasm to help players improve and for continuing to grow his knowledge while he teaches the game."

Matt Figger was hired as the Assistant Coach at UMass on May 21, 2024. Figger spent ten seasons on Martin's staff at Kansas State and South Carolina before head coaching stints at Austin Peay and UT Rio Grande Valley.

Coming to Amherst with a wealth of head coaching experience, Figger spent the last three seasons at UT Rio Grande Valley after four seasons leading Austin Peay. The 2017-18 OVC Coach of The Year, Figger compiled a 76-51 (.598) record, including a 49-25 (.662) mark in OVC play with the Governors. Figger secured two consecutive 20-plus win seasons, recording double-digit conference wins in all four years at the helm in Clarksville, Tennessee.

Engineering one of the NCAA's largest defensive turnarounds, Figger became the first coach in program history to earn double-digit conference wins in his first two seasons. Under Figger's tutelage, multiple players received All-OVC honors including two-time OVC Player of the Year and current NBA player Terry Taylor. Taylor recorded an NCAA-best 20 double-doubles in 2020-21 while also leading the NCAA in offensive rebounding at 5.15 per game.

Serving on staff under Martin at both South Carolina and Kansas State, Figger helped Martin lead both programs to new heights. As associate head coach and recruiting coordinator, Figger helped Martin bring the Gamecocks to their first NCAA Tournament win since 1973 and to the program's first-ever Sweet 16, Elite Eight, and Final Four appearances

From 2007-12 Figger worked as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State as part of Martin's staff that secured at least 21 wins and finished fifth or better in the Big 12 all five seasons. A nationally recognized recruiter, Figger helped sign two McDonald's All-Americans at Kansas State, including 2008 National Freshman and Player of the Year

Michael Beasley. During his time in Manhattan, Kansas Figger helped develop five All-Americans including Beasley and Jacob Pullen.

Prior to his time at Kansas State, Figger served a brief stint as the director of operations at Arkansas (April-June 2007).

Jake Hayden was promoted to Director of Basketball Operations on head coach Frank Martin's staff in July of 2023. Hayden spent the 2022-23 season under Martin as an administrative and graduate assistant following four years as a student manager.

"From the first day on campus, I realized that Jake Hayden, who served as head manager before I arrived, had the potential to become a phenomenal employee. After serving one year as an administrative assistant, we've promoted him to Director of Basketball Operations. He bleeds UMass through and through, as does his family, and he's going to be a tremendous asset to the working environment in our office."

Hayden received his undergraduate degree from the McCormack Sport Management program in 2022. The Worcester, Mass. native went to high school at Saint John's in Shrewsbury.

"I am extremely grateful for the opportunity that Coach Martin has given me, especially growing up in a UMass basketball family," said Hayden. "I look forward to continuing my work here at my alma mater and adding value here at UMass basketball."



Doug Edwards

Fourth Season | Florida State

Doug Edwards was hired as the Director of Player Personnel and Special Assistant to the Head Coach in May of 2022. Edwards joined Frank Martin's staff after spending nine years at South Carolina as the Director of Student-Athlete Development following time in the same role under Martin at Kansas State.

"I am so excited that Doug will continue to provide his mentorship to our players," said Martin. "He was provided that for me the past 14 years. He is as accomplished of a player as there is from being a McDonald's All-American, to a leading person in the building of Florida State basketball, to a top-20 NBA pick. He has a great basketball mind that will assist us in the building of our program."

As a collegiate player at Florida State, Edwards led the Seminoles to three straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1990-93. The Miami, Fla. Native scored 1,604 points in his career and is the only player at FSU to score 500 or more points in three consecutive seasons. Edwards earned All-SEC Second-Team honors as a senior before being drafted with the 15th overall pick by the Atlanta Hawks in the 1993 NBA Draft.

Edwards was coached by Martin at Miami Senior High School from 1986-90, where he won two Class 4A State Championships, including one as a senior on the way to a No. 2 final ranking in the USA Today Super 25. Edwards was named Florida Mr. Basketball and was the runner-up for USA Today's National High School Player of the Year. Edwards graduated with a bachelor's degree in social science from Florida State in 2007.



Anthony Evans

Director of Player Development

Third Season | St. Thomas Aquinas

Anthony Evans joined Frank Martin's staff as the team's Director of Player Personnel in July of 2023. Evans was most recently an Advanced Regional College and High School Scout for the Cleveland Cavaliers and brings 11 years of Division I head coaching experience to Massachusetts.

Evans spent five seasons as the head coach at FIU following six years as the head coach at Norfolk State. At FIU, Evans' teams ranked in the top-10 percent nationally from 2015-17 in the NCAA Academic Progress Report and coached multiple Conference USA all-league and all-defensive players.

Evans became a collegiate head coach for the first time in May of 2007 as he was promoted to head coach at Norfolk State after four seasons as an assistant coach. In 2013, Evans led his squad to the program's first MEAC regular season championship and was named the league's coach of the year after posting the conference's first unbeaten season since 1994. Evans guided the team to its first Division I NCAA Tournament as a 15-seed and upset no. 2-seeded and no. 3 nationally ranked Missouri in the second round. He was named a finalist for the Jim Phelan and Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year awards in 2013.

The Brooklyn, N.Y. native earned his bachelor's degree in 1994 from St. Thomas Aquinas College, where he played point guard for the Spartans.
