# Swimming & Diving 2012-13



## OUTLOOK

For the first time since joining the America East Conference in 2003 the UMBC swimming and diving programs enter the season not as conference champions. Despite having the conference Most Outstanding Male Swimmer, Mohamed Hussein, the Most Outstanding Male Diver, Andrew Eckhoff, and the Women's Coaches' Award Recipient, Abbey McKenney, the Retrievers were knocked off at the 2011 championships by meet host Boston University. Last year's results, however, may be just what program needs to take the next step.

"A conference championship isn't taken for granted around here anymore," said head coach Chad Cradock. "I think our team is in a better place because we're focused on what is ahead of us and we're excited to start a new season." And though the squad loses McKenney, along with numerous past conference champions, Cradock is confident that this year's group will step up to the challenge.

"This is a totally different team this year and I'm looking for the vast majority of the returners, not just the seniors, to step up and lead," the UMBC alum and 12th year head coach said. "I'm really excited to see new people rise up and lead this team even if they are not a captain.

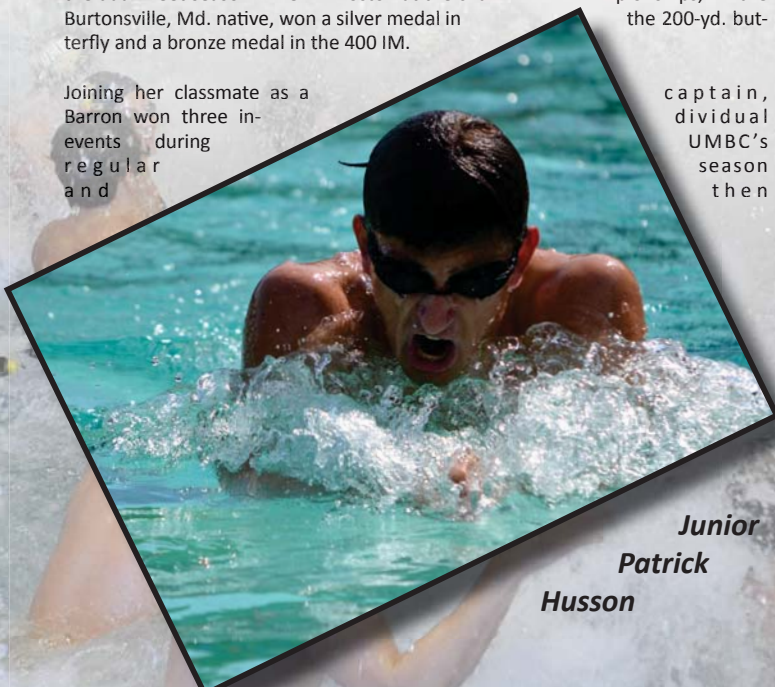
But even if Cradock is looking for the team as a whole to step up to the challenge of reclaiming the conference crown, he needs to look no further than the three captains he appointed this summer.

Now a senior, Andrew Eckhoff is the only returning captain from the 2011-12 squad and the only male captain this season. Last year he earned the conference's highest athletic honor at the championship meet after claiming both the 1-meter and 3-meter titles. Eckhoff has been a leader during his first three years in the classroom as well and was named the America East Swimming and Diving Scholar Athlete last year.

"There's no question of how hard Andrew works," said Cradock. "He gains tremendous respect from his peers for the amount of time and effort he puts forth." For the women, seniors Jennifer Kotonias and Claire Barron will lead a team looking to get back to the top of the podium for the fourth time since 2003. Though first-year captains, both swimmers have enjoyed plenty of success during their careers in Baltimore.

A year ago Kotonias was named an Honorable Mention on the CollegeSwimming.com Mid-Major All-America list after winning eight individual events during the dual meet season. Then in Boston at the championships, the Burtonsville, Md. native, won a silver medal in the 200-yd. butterfly and a bronze medal in the 400 IM.

Joining her classmate as a captain, Barron won three individual events during regular season and

took the competition by storm by winning three individual gold medals – 100-yd. backstroke, 200-yd. IM and 200 back – at the conference meet, each in record time. Then after the season, Hussein, who had already qualified for the Games in the 100m free, set the Egyptian national record and qualified in the 200m IM as well. His dream was only cut short when FINA changed the necessary times just weeks before the competition.

De Waal was also impressive for the Retrievers a year ago also winning three gold medals in Boston. A versatile swimmer, De Waal broke the meet, pool and UMBC school record in the 200 fly with a time of 1:46.68. During the spring, De Waal competed at the South Africa Olympic Trials, but fell just short behind the eventual Olympic gold medal winner.

Rounding out the trio of Olympic hopefuls, junior Patrick Husson should be factor for the Retrievers in 2012-13. The Camp Springs, Md. native, swam a season-best 57.46 in the 100 breast while exhibiting at the conference meet and went on to make the US Olympic Trials in Omaha, Neb. Over the summer.

In addition, the men's team brings back a talented field of past winners and leaders. Relay anchor and sprinter Steve Gallagher returns for once last charge while junior Johan Rohtla, the 2011 200-yd. back champion, and countryman Lauri Kaei also return for Cradock.

"We bring back a lot of tremendous athletes on the men's side," Cradock said. "I'm really looking forward to having them for another year to watch the work and progress even further."

The women's side is not quite as proven in depth as the men's side going into the 2012-13 season, but Cradock still has plenty of talent to pull from.

One of the biggest assets for UMBC this season will be the return of senior Amy Fay. Forced out of action in the middle of the 2011-12 season due to elbow surgery, Fay will boost the Retrievers' distance squad as she looks to reclaim the 500 free conference title she won in 2011.

In the backstroke, junior Klara Pavelkova is back for the Black and Gold. Last year as a sophomore, she won the 100-yd. backstroke in a UMBC school record time of

56.00 at the America East Championships and then promptly reset the standard at 55.76 while helping the 400 medley relay win gold.

Also, senior Elise Blaschke and Tara Morrissette return for their final campaigns in Baltimore hungry to get back to the top. Blaschke swept the backstroke events against George Washington last year while also winning a silver medal in the 100-yd. event at the Patriot Invitational. Morrissette, meanwhile, looks to reclaim her form from 2011 when she won three medals at the conference meet. Last year she won the 200 butterfly against GW and was named to the conference All-Academic Team for the second consecutive year.

In the breaststroke, UMBC hopes to see continuing progress from sophomore Becca Pindral and Lexi Coon, to aid Barron. At the conference championships last year, Pindral and Coon both set season-best times with Pindral dropping five seconds in the prelims and then another two in the event finals to claim fifth place in the 200-yd. event.

Perhaps the newest looking thing for the Retrievers will be their home pool, the newly rebranded UMBC Aquatic Complex. This past summer the complex received a face lift for the first time in nearly forty years as maintenance and renovations were made to the diving boards, pool, starting blocks, HVAC system and the pool deck tile. And with the new paint job and bright white, black and gold tile, the renovations have not gone unnoticed.

"The team is very excited and ready to get going in the new pool," Cradock said. "The athletes and coaches recognize how this will help with recruiting and boost the program as a whole."

In addition to a redone facility, the Retrievers' schedule has seen a slight overhaul as the teams prepare for the conference meet in Orono, Maine without title rival BU in the mix. As local rivals Navy and Loyola remain on the slate to go along with the annual trip to the Patriot Invitational, UMBC adds regional contenders Old Dominion and East Carolina.

"We've put together a tough schedule, but it allows us to be strong all-around as a team," said Cradock. "Even without BU in the mix, the conference championship is our goal but we're focused on ourselves and getting better to achieve the desired results."

Both teams begin their season this Saturday, Sept. 29 as Bucknell comes to Baltimore for an exhibition meet. The Retrievers' first competition comes two weeks later, Oct. 13 when Rider, as well as the James Madison women's team, travels to UMBC for a 1 p.m. meet.

When Chad Cradock took over at the helm of the UMBC swimming and diving teams in 2001, becoming only the second head coach in the program's 17-year history, he took over a program that was already one of UMBC's most successful in the school's Division I era.

As he enters his 12th season at UMBC, Cradock has raised the teams' stature even higher, earning nine consecutive men's conference titles from 2003-11 and four total women's crowns.

In UMBC's final two seasons in the Northeast Conference, Cradock led both the men's and women's teams to two league titles, and the men also won their fifth and sixth consecutive ECAC crowns. In 2002, Cradock coached UMBC's first NCAA qualifier in 13 years, Lindsey Prather. When UMBC joined the America East Conference in 2003, Cradock guided the Retrievers through a seamless transition, as both teams finished with school-best 12-1 records, and the men's squad dominated at the league championships, scoring a then-record 901 points to take the title, while the women placed second.

In 2004-05, the men finished 10-0, becoming UMBC's first-ever undefeated team, and captured another conference title by repeating as AEC champions and breaking their own league record for points with 920.

The 2005-06 campaign proved to be record-breaking for the women's team, which posted a 9-1 dual meet mark, winning the first eight meets of the season, and shattered 11 school records. The Retrievers took seven gold medals and finished second at the America East Championships, just 54 points behind two-time conference titlist New Hampshire, a huge improvement from a year earlier when UMBC was a distant third, 252 points behind the Wildcats. And though the men were just 6-4 in dual meets, they captured their ninth straight conference crown and third in the America East.

Then in 2007, Cradock made history as his women's squad became the first women's team from UMBC to claim an America East title in any sport, while the men once again displayed their dominance, capturing their fourth straight America East championship.

In addition, Cradock earned his 100th career victory in the 2006-07 season, when the Retrievers defeated Binghamton on Nov. 4, and his success has not gone unnoticed. He and his staff have been awarded numerous honors over the last eight years, including 2001-02 Northeast Conference Women's Coach of the Year, ECAC Men's Coach of the Year in 2001-02 and 2002-03 and America East Men's Coaching Staff of the Year in 2003-04 and 2004-05.

In 2007-08, the men once again dominated at the America East Championships, winning with a score of 929, a new record for most points. Although the women lost the second-most dual meets in Cradock's career, they outpaced second-place Boston University by 56 points on their way to a second consecutive America East crown.

In 2008-09, the men came from behind to catch Boston

University and win an unprecedented sixth consecutive America East championship. Despite a 4-7 dual meet record, the women finished second at the conference meet.

In 2009-10, the first year the men were not picked to win the America East, but scored just 2.5 points less than their own conference record on their way to a 13th consecutive crown. The women, who were picked to finish well behind Boston U., finished just 84 points behind in second, the fifth straight year they have finished second or higher.

In 2011, both the men's and women's teams won the America East Championships for the third time in five years.

Last year, both programs finished second at the conference championships, falling to Boston U., despite having the Men's Most Outstanding Swimmer, Mohamed Hussein, and Most Outstanding Male Diver, Andrew Eckhoff, in addition to the Female Coaches Award Recipient, Abbey McKenney.

Now entering his 12th season, Cradock holds an incredible 172-56-1 men's and women's combined record, good for a .753 winning percentage. Cradock has been a part of 20 of 21 league titles, as he served as an assistant coach for three seasons from 1997-2000.

A native of Barrie, Ontario, Cradock earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from UMBC in 1997 and was a four-year letter-winner for the Retriever swimming and diving program. "I really enjoyed my experience as an athlete at UMBC," said Cradock, the recipient of UMBC's Matt Skalsky Outstanding Scholar-Athlete award as a senior. "The friends that I made here are friends that I'll have for a lifetime, and the whole school experience was a tremendous run for me. Being from Canada, it was a dream-come-true to swim at UMBC, since I always wanted to go to the States to compete. To be successful on top of it all was even more amazing."

While at UMBC, Cradock swam at the U.S. Open and was fifth in the 400-meter freestyle at the Canadian Olympic Trials in 1996. A mid-free and distance swimmer, he capped his senior season of 1997 by earning ECAC Swimmer of the Meet honors after winning the 200-, 500- and 1,650-yard freestyle events and breaking pool records in the 200 and 500 free to lead the Retrievers to a second-place finish. The previous season, he won both the 500 free and the mile at ECAC's.

Following his graduation, Cradock guided the UMBC Masters team to the 1998 YMCA short course national championship. Before arriving to coach the Masters team, Cradock was the assistant director at Camp Chikopi in Magnetawan, Ontario, where he coached alongside Olympic coaches. Cradock has also served as head coach of the Retriever Aquatic Club since 2000.

Cradock, who was inducted into the UMBC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004, currently resides in Odenton, Md., with his wife Christie, their daughter Amanda and sons Geoffrey and CJ, and their dog Riley.

### CHRIS GIBEAU

Chris Gibeau returns for his 12th season as assistant coach at UMBC and senior coach of the Retriever Aquatic Club (RAC). In his past four years, Gibeau has had swimmers achieve National Age Group Top 16 consideration and multiple NCAA "B" qualifying standards, and he has coached numerous Junior National, US Open and Senior National. In addition, two of his swimmers qualified for and competed at the 2008 USA Swimming Olympic Trials held in Omaha, Neb.

Prior to his return to UMBC in 2004, Gibeau had a six-year stint with the Monocacy Aquatic Club, including two years as head age group coach and four as the team's head coach. While with MAC, Gibeau had several swimmers achieve NAG Top 16 consideration, as well as a number of Junior National and U.S. Open Qualifiers. Under his guidance, MAC placed third in the inaugural Maryland Swimming LSC Championships in March of 2003. In addition, Gibeau helped the MAC double in size during his tenure.

"It's good to be back at UMBC", Gibeau said at the time of his hiring. "This is where my coaching career began and it was nice to return to where I have spent so many years." Gibeau swam for UMBC from 1989-93.

Before his time with MAC, Gibeau spent three years as an assistant coach at UMBC and as age group coach with the Retriever Aquatic Club, where he helped lay the foundation for the future success of the men's and women's swimming programs.

Gibeau spent nine years as a member of the Maryland Swimming Board of Directors, holding multiple positions during that time. He was selected as a Maryland Swimming All-Star Coach by his peers five years in a row and served as Head All-Star Coach for the team that competed in Buffalo, N.Y. in the summer of 2004

An American Swim Coaches Association (ASCA) Level 4 achievement Lifetime Member, Gibeau currently resides in Baltimore, Md.



### ROB BELLAMY

ASSISTANT COACH • FIRST SEASON  
UMASS '03

Rob Bellamy joined the UMBC swimming and diving staff in April 2012

Bellamy comes to Baltimore with a wealth of experience in both swimming and personal training. For the past five years he was the owner and manager, while also doing personal training, at Snap Fitness in Pasadena, Md. In addition, he also coached for two years for the Greater Baltimore Swim Association.

"We're really excited for Rob to join our staff," said Cradock. "With his background, he will bring a lot of strength to our land programs [weight lifting and dry land activities]."

In addition to coordinating dry land workouts, Bellamy will be responsible for the majority of the recruiting effort for the Retrievers.

Originally from Maryland, Bellamy spent three years in California after college where he assisted in coaching the varsity and junior varsity swim teams at Mt. Carmel High School while also working as a personal trainer.

"We pursued Rob knowing that he could elevate our team to the next level," Cradock said. "He brings things to the table a lot of things that our staff was not as strong in and I think he will help everyone involved with our program."

Bellamy is certified for personal training and performance enhancement through the National Academy of Sports Medicine (NASM).

The Columbia, Md. native went north for college and swam for four years at the University of Massachusetts – Amherst (UMASS) where he served as captain during his junior season. His times in the 500-yd. (4:34.78) and 200-yd. free (1:40.61) still rank seventh and ninth, respectively, in school history. In 2009, while swimming under coach Gibeau and Cradock, Bellamy qualified for the USA Swimming National Championship meet in 50 meter free (24.19) and 100 meter free (52.24).

Bellamy, who currently resides in his hometown, graduated from UMASS with a Bachelor's degree in Hospitality and Tourism Management in 2003.



### PETAR TRIFONOV

DIVING COACH • FOURTH SEASON  
NATIONAL SPORTS ACADEMY (BULGARIA) '95

Petar Trifonov joined the Retrievers in the summer of 2009 as the head diving coach.

Trifonov has had a decorated diving career, winning more than 50 national championships in his native Bulgaria and culminating in an appearance in the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona, Spain.

After he finished his competitive career, Trifonov became a recognized judge and coach. He judged the USA Diving National Championships from 2001-05, and last year was a judge at the FINA Junior Diving World Championships.

Trifonov's coaching career includes stints at the College of William and Mary and American University, and was the head coach of the Montgomery Dive Club team in Rockville, Md., for eight years.

In addition to coaching at UMBC, Trifonov will be the head coach of the Retriever Dive Club, which will be geared for youth divers in the Baltimore area.

In 2010-11, UMBC Athletics celebrated its 25th anniversary of competing in NCAA Division I athletics. Since that first fall of 1986, the growth of Retriever Athletics has been remarkable—from the quadrupling of staff size to the creation and/or renovation of all athletic facilities. Alma maters and fight songs have been penned and performed, spirit groups created and flourished, attendance records smashed and championships celebrated.

In 2011-12...

Track and field alum Cleopatra Borel competed in the 2012 Summer Olympics in London, her third consecutive Games. The former NCAA shot put champion also competed for her native country, Trinidad and Tobago, in both the 2004 Games in Athens and the 2008 Games in Beijing.

The men's soccer team finished 25th nationally in attendance, drawing nearly 1,000 fans per game to Retriever Soccer Park and for the second consecutive year, UMBC hosted a nationally-televised game on Fox Soccer Channel.

Lacrosse alums Brendan Munderf, Drew Westervelt and Peet Poillon earned MLL All-Star recognition in the summers of 2011 and 2012.



In the fall of 2011, UMBC's student-athletes posted a record-setting semester in the classroom, with sixty-two percent (209) of the student-athletes recording a grade-point average of 3.00 or better. The combined GPA of the department set a new record at 3.03

Baseball team captain Curtis Schickner was named Vice Chair of the NCAA's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

Volleyball's Iman Kennedy and basketball's Michelle Kurowski were one of ten national finalists, respectively, for the Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sports Scholar Award and the Lowe's Senior Class Award.

Also in 2012, Hrabowski was among the inaugural recipients of the U.S. News & World Report STEM Solutions Leadership Hall of Fame Award. In 2011, he received both the TIAA-CREF Theodore M. Hesburgh Award for Leadership Award, recognized by many as the nation's highest awards among higher education leaders. Also in 2011, he was named one of seven Top American Leaders by The Washington Post and the Harvard Kennedy School's Center for Public Leadership.

• UMBC is one of 50 public institutions in the United States recognized by The Princeton Review as a "Best Value College," offering a combination of educational excellence and affordability. UMBC was also included in Kiplinger's Top 100 "Best Values in Public Colleges 2010-11," a ranking based on academic quality and affordable education. UMBC is ranked among schools such as University of North Carolina, University of Virginia and Binghamton University.

• Baltimore was ranked seventh in a new study of large U.S. cities that are the best places to attend college, as compiled by an economics research team.

• Approximately 77% of students at UMBC receive some financial aid in the form of scholarships, loans and grants.

• UMBC is one of the country's most environmentally-responsible colleges according to The Princeton Review and was included in its "Guide to 286 Green Colleges."

• The university's Alex. Brown Center for Entrepreneurship received \$2 million from the Kauffman Foundation to build entrepreneurship education across the campus. The mission of the Kauffman Campuses Initiative is to catalyze entrepreneurship programs outside of business and engineering schools. The award acknowledges the success of UMBC's Alex. Brown Center for Entrepreneurship, created six years ago through a gift of \$1 million from the Alex. Brown Foundation to develop a leading university entrepreneurship center for the Baltimore region.

• The Shriver Center's Choice Program has become a national model for effectively serving youth and families in at-risk environments. A community-based intervention program administered by UMBC's Shriver Center, Choice has provided intensive supervision and family support to almost 20,000 children throughout Maryland since 1989.

• The university is fourth among U.S. research universities in the production of IT degrees and certificates, according to the most recent data from the Department of Education. The data also shows that UMBC ranks second among U.S. research universities in undergraduate IT degrees awarded, and it is the largest producer among those universities of IT graduates in Maryland, DC and Virginia.

• The Rise of American Research Universities, a book ranking university research achievement on a per-capita basis, found that UMBC scholars in the arts and humanities ranked 13th among all public campuses in the nation in prestigious awards.

• UMBC ranks second among U.S. universities in NASA funding. The university's NASA-funded centers are the Joint Center for Earth Systems Technology, the Goddard Earth Systems and Technology Center and the Center for Research and Exploration in Space Science and Technology.

• UMBC has a comprehensive recycling program and also donates various office/classroom furniture and athletic equipment to charitable organizations.

Kuhn Library, the Engineering and Computer Science Building, the Physics Building, the Public Policy Building, the Arts and Humanities Building, techcenter@UMBC on a satellite South Campus, and the high-tech bwtech@UMBC Research and Technology Park.



Sweeping changes have occurred in the campus' social scene, highlighted by the University Commons. The 36-million dollar structure opened in January 2003 and has been the hub for UMBC student life, featuring a food court, restaurant, bank, bookstore, performance space, high-speed wireless internet access and game room that features eight pool tables, video games, pinball and air hockey, as well as a number of flat-screen TVs, making it a popular spot to hang out.



UMBC's Shriver Center serves as a national model of how colleges and universities can have a direct and positive impact on communities across the country. The Center places 1,000 UMBC students each year in internships and co-op positions throughout Maryland and the U.S., as well as in dozens of international settings.

Just as UMBC students are active participants in their education, they don't sit on the sidelines when it comes to campus life. Intercollegiate Division-I sports is an outlet for many students; others participate in club or intramural sports. # UMBC ADMINISTRATION

## DR. FREEMAN A. HRABOWSKI, III

### PRESIDENT

Freeman A. Hrabowski, III, has served as President of UMBC since May 1992. He joined the university in 1987, serving first as Vice Provost, then as Executive Vice President.

Born in 1950 in Birmingham, Ala., Dr. Hrabowski graduated at 19 from Hampton Institute with highest honors in mathematics, and he received his M.A. (mathematics) and Ph.D. (higher education administration/statistics) from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign at age 24.

In 2008, he was named one of *America's Best Leaders* by *U.S. News & World Report*, which in 2009, 2010, and 2011 ranked UMBC the #1 "Up and Coming" university in the nation. In 2011, *U.S. News* also ranked UMBC 4th nationally for "Best Undergraduate Teaching" – tied with Yale. *TIME* magazine named him one of *America's 10 Best College Presidents* in 2009, and one of the "100 Most Influential People in the World" in 2012. In 2011, he received both the *TIAA-CREF Theodore M. Hesburgh Award for Leadership Excellence* and the *Carnegie Corporation of New York's Academic Leadership Award*, recognized by many as the nation's highest awards among higher education leaders. Also in 2011, he was named one of seven *Top American Leaders* by *The Washington Post* and the Harvard Kennedy School's Center for Public Leadership. In 2012, he was among the inaugural recipients of the *U.S. News & World Report STEM Solutions Leadership Hall of Fame Award*.

Dr. Hrabowski serves as a consultant to the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the National Academies, and universities and school systems nationally. He is a member of numerous boards, including the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, France-Merrick Foundation, Marguerite Casey Foundation (Chair), The Urban Institute, McCormick & Company, and the Baltimore Equitable Society. He served previously on the boards of the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and the Maryland Humanities Council (member and Chair).

In addition, Dr. Hrabowski has been elected to the American Academy of Arts & Sciences (effective October 2001), named the 1999 Marylander of the Year by the editors of *The Baltimore Sun* and received the BETA Award (Baltimore's Extraordinary Technology Advocate), The Henry A. Rosenberg, Sr. Distinguished Citizen Award (Boy Scouts of America, Baltimore Council), The Andrew White Medal (Loyola College of Maryland), The Hatikvah Award (The Jewish National Fund), The Educator Achievement Award (NSF), The Outstanding Science Educator (Eli Lilly & Company), The Golden Torch Academic Visionary Award (National Society of Black Engineers), the Reginald H. Jones Distinguished Service Award (National Action Council for Minorities in Engineering) and The U.S. Presidential Award for Excellence in Science, Mathematics and Engineering Mentoring (awarded to Dr. Hrabowski's university in recognition of the nationally acclaimed multi-million-dollar Meyerhoff Scholars Program for gifted African-American undergraduates in science and engineering).

Dr. Hrabowski also was instrumental in the formation of the Governor's Academy for Mathematics, Science and Technology. He is co-author of the book, "Beating the Odds," which focuses on parenting and high-achieving African-American males in science, published by Oxford University Press in 1998; he co-authored a second book, "Overcoming the Odds," on successful African-American young women in science, published by Oxford University Press in early 2002. Also a child-leader in the Civil Rights Movement, Dr. Hrabowski was prominently featured in Spike Lee's 1997 documentary, *Four Little Girls*, on the racially motivated bombing in 1963 of Birmingham's Sixteenth Street Baptist Church.



Over the past 11 years, Retriever teams have won 48 league championships and made 30 appearances in NCAA Championship competition. In all five years of league play in the NEC, UMBC was awarded the Commissioner's Cup, symbolic of the conference's top overall program. In 2002 UMBC produced its first national champion, as Cleopatra Borel won the shot put at the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships.

UMBC has adjusted well to life in the America East Conference with a fourth-place or higher finish in the conference's Commissioner's Cup race in five of the last seven years. The athletic department just experienced its most celebrated year-long period in school history with the school's first-ever men's and women's basketball conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances, sweeps in back-to-back years in the America East men's and women's swimming and diving championships, a conference title and NCAA appearance by men's tennis and an NCAA Tournament win over Maryland and a third straight national tournament appearance by the men's lacrosse team.

UMBC's student-athletes have excelled in the classroom as well as the playing fields. In the last 12 years, 31 student-athletes have earned Academic All-America status, and more than 62 percent of Retriever student-athletes are earning 3.0 or higher grade-point averages. Moreover, UMBC's student-athletes graduate at a rate which is more than 10 percent higher than the university rate and the Retrievers' NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) and Graduation Success Rate (GSR) are also considerably above the national averages.

Dr. Brown has increased the full-time faculty and staff of the athletic department from 23 full-time employees at his arrival to 63 currently. There were only 13 full-time coaches (nine head, four assistant) upon Dr. Brown's arrival; now there are 32 (14 head, 18 assistant) to ensure the Retrievers' success on and off the playing fields. New positions were created in Marketing and Promotions, Fund Raising, Facilities and Operations, Business Administration, Community Outreach, Strength and Conditioning, Athletic Communications, Sports Medicine and Academic Services. He also initiated the UMBC Dance Team, the Down and Dirty Dawg Band and the newly reinstated cheerleading squad.

Dramatic increases in the department's entrepreneurial efforts have been implemented to support UMBC's student-athletes. UMBC Athletics received \$5,403 in gifts in the first year of Dr. Brown's tenure. In contrast, over the last several years, UMBC Athletics has brought in an average of \$1.25 million per year via fundraising, corporate sponsorships and other entrepreneurial efforts.

Starting from scratch in the 1990s, Dr. Brown developed a club sport program which has evolved into a 25-sport, 750-student program today.

In the area of community service, UMBC student-athletes currently donate more than 1,000 hours of time per year to mentor local elementary and middle school students, and coaches make hundreds of appearances in the community throughout the year. The program was recognized by *The NCAA News* as one of the finest in the country.

Dr. Brown has improved the visibility of UMBC in many ways. In the spring of 1995, he made a bold move as he brought the first and second rounds of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championships to the Baltimore Arena. Sellout crowds put Baltimore in the national spotlight for one glorious March week. In the spring of 1998, UMBC hosted the Women's Lacrosse National Championships at UMBC Stadium, drawing record crowds and kudos from the national media. Dr. Brown also led the successful bid to bring the Men's Lacrosse National Championships to M&T Bank Stadium in 2003, 2004 and 2007, where all existing attendance records were shattered.

He has spearheaded the university's rapid enhancement of athletic and recreational facilities during his tenure. Lights were added to UMBC Stadium in 1992, and the region's finest outdoor aquatic complex was unveiled in the summer of 1996. Just a few months later, UMBC added a national-class track and field complex and replaced its main stadium field with an all-weather artificial surface. In the fall of 1999, the department moved into the Retriever Activities Center, which doubled the size of its existing indoor facility and provided all students with the top of the line in recreational facilities. Baseball's Alumni Field was improved during Dr. Brown's tenure with the addition of permanent seating and was later renamed The Baseball Factory Field at UMBC in a dedication ceremony following the addition of lights to the field in 2005. UMBC Soccer Stadium was constructed in 1999 and a new Bermuda grass surface - the only one of its kind in the conference - was dedicated in 2006. Chairback seating and a video display scoreboard were added to the arena in 2000. Lights were added to the tennis complex in 2005 and the courts were resurfaced and outfitted with Retriever wind screens. Field turf was added to the stadium in 2005 and a new \$5 million stadium locker room complex was completed in the spring of 2008.

Dr. Brown's impact has been felt beyond The Loop, as well. He has served two terms as president of the Maryland Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and served a term on the NCAA Division-I Championships/Competition Cabinet, where he influenced other directors to increase student-athlete participation in NCAA Championship competition. Dr. Brown is also currently on the board of the Howard County tennis patrons.

He is the fourth person to hold the position of athletic director on a permanent basis in the 41-year history of UMBC. W. Richard Mentzer served from 1966-68, followed by E. Richard Watts, Jr., who directed the program from 1968-1985. Rick Hartzell led UMBC into Division I athletics in the fall of 1985, prior to Dr. Brown's arrival in June of 1989.

Currently residing in Ellicott City, Md., with his wife, Linda, Dr. Brown, received his bachelor of science degree from Long Island University in 1967 and earned a master of science from Brooklyn College in 1969 and a Doctorate in Physical Education from Springfield College in 1980. The couple has two daughters, Melissa, an attorney, and Michelle, an elementary school teacher, and the Browns have four grandchildren.

## DR. CHARLES BROWN

### ASSOCIATE VICE PRESIDENT & DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS, PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND RECREATION

UMBC's Dr. Charles Brown was promoted to Associate Vice President & Director of Athletics, Physical Education and Recreation, President Dr. Freeman Hrabowski announced on Friday, June 17, 2011.

"We are all very proud of Dr. Brown's stellar career as Director of Athletics over the past two decades," Dr. Hrabowski said. "He has led the program with both enthusiasm and integrity, and, most importantly, our student-athletes are succeeding athletically and academically."

The Brooklyn, N.Y., native will begin his 23rd year at UMBC this September and is the longest-tenured AD in the state of Maryland. He has transformed UMBC Athletics from a struggling Division-I program to one which has fared quite well regionally and nationally for the past decade.

Dr. Brown has championed UMBC Athletics' enhanced profile by positioning the Retrievers within appropriate levels of competition. One of his first tasks was to move UMBC into a Division-I conference, which he completed in 1988-89, his first year with the university, as the Retrievers joined the East Coast Conference. UMBC won the league's President's Cup in its second conference season, but the league folded shortly thereafter. Dr. Brown was able to move UMBC into the Big South Conference the following year (1992) and successfully positioned UMBC into a much better geographic fit when the Retrievers joined the Northeast Conference in 1998. He also helped to initiate the ECAC (Men's) Lacrosse League in 1999, and most recently, Dr. Brown engineered UMBC Athletics' move to a strong and improving mid-major conference, the America East Conference, in 2003.



# UMBC ADMINISTRATION

## DR. NANCY YOUNG VICE PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS

Nancy Young has served as the Vice President for Student Affairs at UMBC since July 2007. In addition to Athletics, her responsibilities include oversight of the departments of Career Services, Residential Life, University Health Services, University Counseling Services, Student Judicial Programs, Transportation Services, Student Life, Off-Campus and Transfer Student Services and the operations of The Commons (student center).



Prior to being appointed as the Vice President for Student Affairs, Dr. Young was the Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs and Director of Housing Operations. With prior experience in Orientation, Campus Activities, and Housing at Southern Methodist University, McDaniel, University of Maryland College Park and the Ohio State University, Dr. Young has over 25 years experience in the field of Student Affairs. Dr. Young is a graduate of the Ohio State University and the University of Maryland, College Park.

## DR. MARVIN MANDELL NCAA FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE

Marvin Mandell is a Professor of Policy Sciences and UMBC's FAR for the past eight years. Last summer, Dr. Mandell was selected to head the America East Conference's group of faculty athletic representatives. He is responsible for entrepreneurial efforts, construction, long-term planning, day-to-day and game-day operations and facilities upkeep and programming.



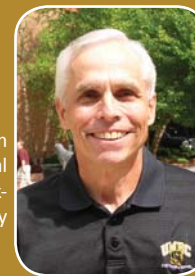

# RETRIEVER FACILITIES



Originally opened in 1973, the Retriever Activities Center, seats 4,024 for athletic events, and has hosted a number of prominent events throughout the years, including an international volleyball match between the USA and Peru, numerous collegiate conference championships and the Maryland Public Secondary Schools Association Championships in girls' basketball.

In the spring of 2004, UMBC Athletics began renovations to the Retriever Activities Center in its continuous effort to bring top-notch facilities to its student-athletes. The \$2.4 million construction plan was set out to provide newly renovated varsity locker rooms for the men's and women's basketball and swimming and diving teams, along with a new state of the art media center, sports medicine training room, Student-Athlete Academic Center and outdoor Tennis Complex.



The RAC seats 4,024 for athletic events, and has hosted a number of prominent events throughout the years, including an international volleyball match between the USA and Peru, numerous collegiate conference championships and the Maryland Public Secondary Schools Association Championships in girls' basketball. In addition, the RAC has been the site of concerts for such artists as Stain'd, Good Charlotte, Bush, Snoop Dogg and N.E.R.D.

# RETRIEVER FACILITIES



UMBC Stadium was built in 1976 with a seating capacity of 4,500. Lights were added in 1992, and in 1996 a world-class track and field complex was introduced. The Jim Pfrogner Press Box (named for UMBC's long-time track and field coach) was refurbished in 2000, and it features two roof-top broadcast booths and wireless internet capabilities. In spring 2005, UMBC Stadium's Deso-Turf surface was replaced by Sportexe's Momentum 51 synthetic turf, an infill system consisting of 70-percent ground rubber and 30-percent kiln-dried sand, at a cost of more than \$800,000. UMBC hosted its first game on the new turf on national television (ESPNU). The stadium recently received a new \$5 million locker room complex, which was completed in the spring of 2008 and houses all of UMBC's outdoor sports, in addition to a new scoreboard which arrived in the summer of 2011.

The Baseball Factory Field at UMBC (capacity 1,000), located within the Stadium Complex, has permanent seating and a press box behind home plate. Recently, lights and a new warning track surrounding the field were added, along with refurbishments to the dugouts and infield. Night spring games have become popular among students and the local community. The UMBC Softball Stadium (capacity 500), just beyond the Baseball Factory Field's right field fence, also features a press box and bleacher seats.



Retriever Soccer Park, situated adjacent to UMBC Stadium, was constructed in 1998 and has since experienced dramatic upgrades, including the installation of a Bermuda grass surface – the only one of its kind among America East Conference schools – in the spring of 2006. In the summer of 2011, a state-of-the-art lighting system was installed, giving the Retrievers' men's and women's soccer programs the ability to play games at night. The stadium, which has increased to a 2,000 seat capacity, is sponsored by Elite Tournaments, by virtue of a generous donation by former Retriever Mike Libber.



A new six-court tennis facility was completed in April of 2005. The enclosed center features lights and additional spectator seating.

UMBC has one of the finest aquatic complexes in the Mid-Atlantic region. The indoor pool (UMBC Natatorium) was added to the RAC in 1977. Adjacent to the Natatorium is an outdoor pool complex added in 1996. In 2005, UMBC hosted the America East Conference Swimming and Diving Championships, as the Retrievers' men's team captured its eighth straight league title.

# SUPPORTING THE RETRIEVERS

When fans come to see the Retrievers play, they witness the excitement of Division I athletics. What they may not see is all the work that is done behind the scenes so that the student-athletes can achieve their highest potential, both on the field and in the classroom.

UMBC's Sports Medicine Department strives to provide comprehensive athletic training services to approximately 425 UMBC student-athletes. A staff of five certified athletic trainers oversees the medical care for all of the student-athletes competing in UMBC's 19 varsity sports. The services include recognition, treatment, rehabilitation, education and prevention of injuries occurring during participation in athletic activities. Each athletic trainer supervises Retriever student-athletes during practices and home events as well as road competitions.

In the winter of 2005, UMBC introduced the newly designed and built Sports Medicine Services Center. Increasing the size of the previous center nearly three-fold, the new capabilities of the Sports Medicine training room allows student-athletes to rehabilitate with greater ease.

The Academic Center for Student-Athletes (ACSA) is not only a place for student-athletes to study, it also serves as the liaison to several departments on campus. ACSA assists students with registration, financial aid and career development. It is located on the second floor of the RAC and is furnished with 15 computers, individual study carrels, tutoring space and a comprehensive resource area. Each year, UMBC Athletics sets new standards for academic excellence and the support of the ACSA has been critical to its success.

# SUPPORTING THE RETRIEVERS

The Office of Marketing and Promotions implements marketing and promotions programs that will increase awareness, interest and enthusiasm for UMBC sports. The department markets to UMBC students, faculty and staff, as well as youth groups, organizations and the communities surrounding the campus. The Office of Marketing and Promotions advocates a positive game atmosphere and encourages new and old UMBC traditions.

The Office of Athletic Communications is responsible for all of the publicity needs of the athletic department. Services such as publications, statistics, electronic media productions, website maintenance and game management are provided by the Athletic Communications staff. The staff hopes that media opportunities for UMBC's student-athletes are a valuable part of their athletic and educational experience.



UMBC Strength and Conditioning provides student-athletes the latest and newest approaches to safe and successful training of their bodies. The newly renovated 3,000-square foot Michael S. Knapp Varsity Weight Room is solely dedicated to UMBC's student-athletes.

UMBC has a proud tradition of successful student-athletes and is currently experiencing tremendous growth. UMBC fields 19 intercollegiate athletic teams competing at the Division-I level in the America East Conference in addition to 26 club sports teams. At the heart of the Retrievers' athletic program are the more than 1,100 student-athletes representing the university on our athletic fields and in the classroom. In order for these young men and women to continue to succeed, we must increase our external support and department resources. The need for support has never been greater, largely due to the success the Retrievers have recently experienced.

With limited funding through university and state resources, the UMBC Athletic Department relies on the generosity of individuals to secure the financial backing necessary for our student-athletes to achieve the highest standards of athletic competitiveness and academic achievement. Gifts made to UMBC Athletics are managed in accordance with the University of Maryland Foundation's official policies and procedures and approved Athletic Department guidelines and are utilized to expand scholarship opportunities for student-athletes, maintain and improve physical facilities, provide academic support programming and enable UMBC to compete in the America East Conference.

Today's student-athletes face more challenges than ever. Along with the high demands of their sports - practice, training, travel, community involvement and competition - it is our student-athletes' greatest responsibility and commitment to achieve academic success. In the last five years, 20 student-athletes have earned Academic All-America status. Over the previous two semesters, more than 47% of UMBC student-athletes have earned 3.0 grade-point averages or higher. The involvement and financial support of alumni, families and fans will enable our student-athletes to build upon these standards.

Rick Moreland (pictured with Michael Jordan) currently is the Vice President for Washington Sports and Entertainment Incorporated. Moreland, a 1983 graduate, established the school record for most points in a season with 610 and ranks second all-time with 1,728 career points in UMBC men's basketball history.



Cleopatra Borel, Interdisciplinary Studies '02, a three-time track and field NCAA All-American in the shot put and UMBC's first-ever Division-I NCAA champion, competed in the 2004, 2008, and 2012 Olympics. Borel reached the finals in her event in Athens and placed 10th in the world in the competition.



Former major league pitchers Wayne Franklin and Jay Witasick pitched collegiately at UMBC, and a host of other Retrievers have played professional baseball, including Zach Clark, who is currently pitching in the Baltimore Orioles' minor league system. Five ex-Retrievers won Major Indoor Soccer League titles with the Baltimore Blast, and Levi Houapeu was drafted by the Philadelphia Union of Major League Soccer. A solid contingent of UMBC lacrosse players star in Major League Lacrosse, including recent standouts Drew Westervelt, Brendan Mundorf, Peet Poillon and Terry Kimener.

UMBC's 500-acre campus is situated just 10 minutes south of Baltimore, Md., and 30 minutes from Annapolis, Md., and Washington D.C., giving the campus great proximity to all the local cultural and historic scenes. 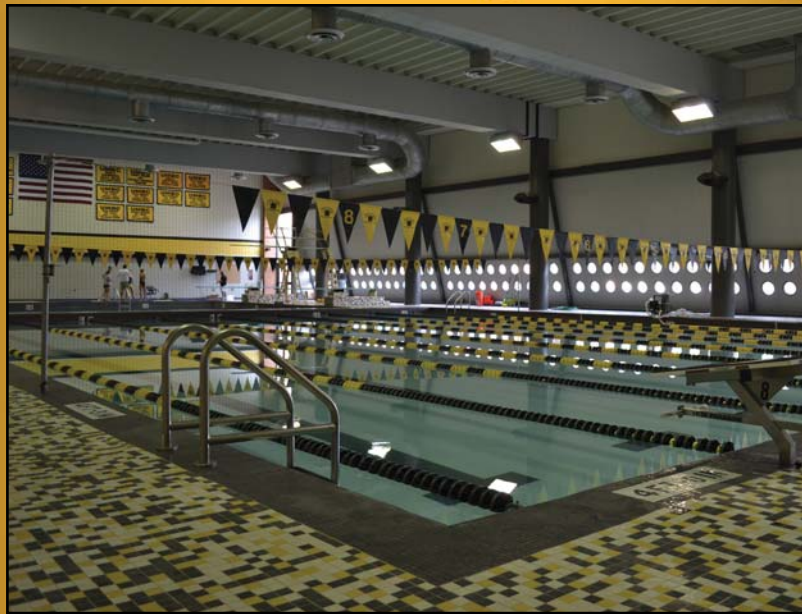
