UMBC Head Men's Lacrosse Coach Don Zimmerman couldn't be happier with how all of his players have responded to a disappointing 2015 campaign.

"Beginning this summer, we could sense there was a different attitude and approach in our returning players" said Zimmerman. "When the fall semester began, our staff immediately saw how our upperclassmen, especially our seniors, were relaying that mindset to the incoming freshmen who, to their credit, bought in."

A pair of one-goal losses to Hartford (overtime) and Vermont knocked UMBC (5-8, 1-6 America East) out of the America East Conference Tournament for the first time in 12 league seasons. Twenty-seven of UMBC's 41 student-athletes are freshmen or sophomores and Coach Zimmerman and his staff will not be shy about utilizing the entire depth of this year's roster.

"We are young, but many of our younger players are putting themselves in a position to see playing time on game day," said Zimmerman. UMBC opens the season on Saturday, Feb. 13, when they host No. 5 Johns Hopkins. The non-conference schedule also includes contests versus nationally-ranked Ohio State and Towson, while America East foes Albany and Stony Brook also dot the preseason USILA Top 20. The Retrievers open league play at Binghamton on March 19.

Position Breakdown – Goalkeeper

The coaching staff is confident that they have three capable goalkeepers in the fold. Junior **Connor Gordon** excelled in his red-shirt freshman season in 2014, setting a freshman record for saves, while starting all 15 games. But Gordon suffered a lower body injury in April of 2014, missed the ensuing fall campaign and could not regain his form in the early stages of the 2015 spring season. But he is back to full health and is expected to challenge for the starting position. Junior **Ruston Souder** took over the starting position against Stony Brook in late March and started the final seven games of season. His 10.83 saves per game and 10.69 goals against average ranked second amongst America East netminders. **David Pisanic** opened eyes with an excellent relief effort in the opener versus Hopkins and the hard-working sophomore is firmly in the mix for the starting slot.

Close Defense

Despite the loss of a pair of starters, the coaching staff is bullish on the group that will form the close defensive unit. Part of that confidence stems from the example set by senior **Zach Esser**. One of the 2016 team captains, Esser became the first

Retriever defender to earn America East First Team honors in back-to-back seasons. Moreover, the senior, who has started 41 career games, has thrived as a team leader.

Esser will likely maintain his role of handling the opposition's top attacker, while sophomore **Billy Bollhorst** has made a big push to start inside. Bollhorst possesses a high lacrosse IQ and is a good communicator on the back end. Freshman **Ian Junge** is another strong inside defender from Sachem North, who is progressing very well in his first year on campus. At this stage, a trio of players is waging a battle for the third close defensive starting position. Junior **Garrett Hasken**, sophomore **Mark Pryor** and freshman **Cooper Cuje** all bring different strengths to the group. Hasken is one of the team's top conditioned athletes and is a former long-stick middle. At 6'6", Pryor is rangy and is developing quickly in his second campaign, while Cuje is a tremendous all-around athlete demonstrating outstanding instincts at an early age.

Junior **Wyatt Griffith** and red-shirt sophomore **Pat Dignan** are nipping at the heels of the aforementioned group. Both defenders possess great attitudes and understand their roles. Freshman **Kennedy Solomon**, who is adjusting well to the college game, rounds out the close defensive unit.

Defensive Midfield

The coaching staff loves the depth and quality that the Retrievers have displayed in the preseason at the long-stick position. Sophomores **Billy O'Hara** and **John Tornabene** and freshmen **Jason Brewster** and **Tomas Rodriguez** give the squad a pair of 1-2 punches at this position. O'Hara and Tornabene earned extensive playing time as freshmen and bring an effective combination of skill and tenacity. Brewster and Rodriguez are expected to spell the more experienced duo early in their tenures.

while Ciccarone has impressed the staff with his knowledge and ground-ball acumen.

The UMBC coaching staff entered fall practice with the philosophy that all of the team's midfielders would understand and be able to execute on both ends of the field. Hence, only a pair of players, sophomore **Mason Witzler** and freshman **Luke Ciccarone**, are considered strictly defensive specialists. Witzler possesses a high motor on the field and in his conditioning,

Face-Off

Sophomore **Brett Malamphy** enters the spring as UMBC's top face-off specialist. Malamphy came on down the stretch of the 2015 season and enters this spring primed to be a steady and effective performer taking draws.

Junior **Steven Larson**, the opening day starter in 2015, and freshmen **Ryan Baker** and **Blake McDermott** are other candidates at the face-off "x", while long-stickers **Hasken** and **Brewster** also work with the face-off unit.

Midfield

The coaching staff expects to put out a pair of midfield units and a third group on a game-by-game basis this spring. Seniors **Jack Gannon** and **Steve Winsor** are expected to lead the top two units. Gannon earned America East Second Team honors in 2014 after a huge break-out campaign. He amassed 41 points, but injuries curtailed his 2015 campaign, although he still managed to contribute 17 goals in 10 appearances.

Winsor has been a solid defensive midfielder during his first three seasons at UMBC and, like Gannon, earned Second Team honors from the conference in 2014. He will bring his good speed to an offensive unit in 2016 and is an obvious asset when defending as well.

Junior **Dylan McDermott** has taken big strides and can be relied on as another solid two-way midfielder for the Retrievers. McDermott, who totaled five goals and four helpers in 2015, is one of the team's top dodgers from the perimeter. Sophomore **Max Haldeman**, who saw some action during his freshman campaign, is capable of adding some good scoring punch to one of the top midfield units.

Three freshmen midfielders – **Jack Andrews**, **Pat Clipp** and **Billy Nolan** – also may figure into the team's offensive plans early in their tenures. Junior **Grant Searfoss**, sophomore **Corey Reynolds** and freshmen **Ryan Baker**, **Blake McDermott** and **James Nagro** are battling for playing time behind the aforementioned seven midfielders.

Attack

Senior **Nate Lewnes** has been a model of consistency throughout his tenure at UMBC. He carries the nation's sixth-longest goal-scoring streak (18) into the 2016 campaign and needs only two points to reach the 100-point plateau. Like Esser, the team co-captain leads by the example he sets in all aspects of a true student-athlete.

injury curtailed his 2015 campaign. A good inside player, Borsody is looking to reprise that role in 2016. Sophomore **Jonah Kozireski** saw action as a freshman and is one of several sophomores who have made great strides as the 2016 campaign dawns.

Senior **Mark Monroe** and sophomore **Steven Partlow** are recovering from injuries and hope to contribute in 2016. Freshman **Gunnar Schimoler** had an excellent prep career, but is also on the comeback trail from injury and looks to get back on the field in late February. Freshman **Zach Kalas** adds solid depth to the attack unit.

Junior **Max Maxwell** earned 2014 All-Rookie Team honors, but saw his production slip somewhat as a sophomore. But the crafty attackman played extremely well in the fall and is a dual threat with his deft passing and determination around the goal.

Freshman **Pat Brennan** has emerged in the preseason as a complement to Lewnes and Maxwell. The Chesapeake High School standout is an all-around player, who is equally adept in all aspects of playing up front.

Senior **Drew Borsody** had worked his way into the man-up unit before a season-ending

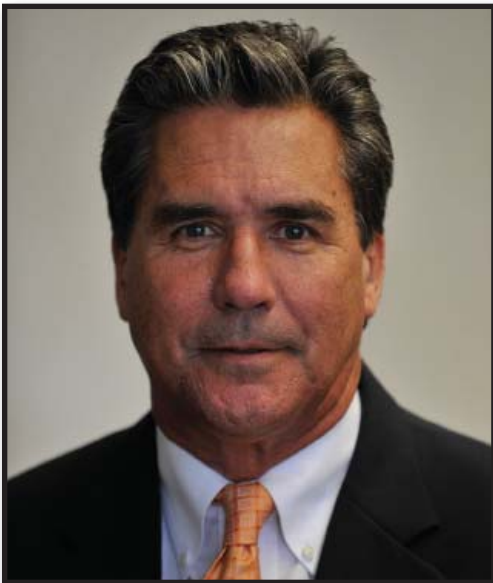

COACHES

HEAD COACH DON ZIMMERMAN



Head Coach Don Zimmerman enters his 23rd season at UMBC and his 30th as a collegiate head coach. Amongst Division I head coaches, the Retriever mentor stands eighth with 233 victories and is 17th in winning percentage at .591 entering the 2016 campaign. In the all-time coaching annuals of Division I lacrosse, Zimmerman is 26th in total victories.

Coach Zimmerman has made 13 NCAA Tournament appearances in his tenures at Johns Hopkins (1984-90) and UMBC (1994-present). His 1984, 1985 and 1987 Hopkins teams earned national titles and he coached the Retrievers to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1998.

In 1984, he became the first man to lead a team - the Johns Hopkins Blue Jays - to a national championship in his first season as a head coach.

Zimmerman won two more national titles at Hopkins, then began to build the program at UMBC, starting in the spring of 1994. He piloted the Retrievers to four consecutive NCAA Division I tournament appearances from 2006-09, a feat accomplished for the first time in the school's Division I lacrosse history. In 2009, the Retrievers posted a 12-4 record and won their third America East title in four years. The previous season, UMBC set a new school record with 11 straight wins before a tough 10-9 loss at second-seeded Virginia in the first round of the NCAA Championships. UMBC climbed to a school-record ranking of No. 5 by the USILA in mid-April and was ranked No. 6 in the final poll.

Zimmerman was named America East Conference Coach of the Year by his colleagues in both 2008 and 2009. The Retriever mentor was the 2008 Coach of the Year in LaxPower men's lacrosse Fan Awards, he achieved career win No. 200 in 2010 and is 10th among active coaches with 202 victories in 24 campaigns. "UMBC is a well-known and respected name in terms of Division I lacrosse, and the volume of emails from (prospective student-athletes) that we receive today versus six or seven years ago is incomparable," Zimmerman said. "The kids realize that we are a high-tier program. We have been champions of the America East Conference; the NCAA appearances go a long way and the reputation of the university has also made us more attractive because kids and parents are not only looking for an opportunity to play Division I lacrosse, but to get a quality education.

"We've had some success and that is due to the quality of players that we have been able to attract," Zimmerman said. "It takes everything to fall into place; I've had good assistants, we've recruited good players and gotten tremendous support from the university, and as a result we have been successful. Coaching lacrosse at UMBC is both challenging and rewarding. Having the opportunity to work with quality young men with a unified goal of competing for a national championship and playing lacrosse in Baltimore - the cradle of the sport - is something special."

"Don Zimmerman is one of the nation's top collegiate lacrosse coaches," UMBC president Dr. Freeman Hrabowski said at that time. "He is a gifted teacher and mentor, and we are delighted he will remain at UMBC, keeping our lacrosse program nationally competitive."

"Coach Zimmerman is recognized nationally as one of the brightest offensive minds and head coaches in the game," UMBC Director of Athletics Tim Hall said. "Our student-athletes are well-prepared every time we take the field. We fully expect to capture another America East title under Coach Zimmerman's leadership."

The respect that the Retriever mentor has garnered nationally and globally truly resonated in 2013. He was part of a nine-member class (the 19th overall) to be inducted into the Johns Hopkins University Athletic Hall of Fame on Sat., April 20. The previous evening, the partisan crowd at Albany gave him a standing ovation when he was honored before a rivalry game between the Retrievers and the Great Danes.

Later that spring, Coach Zimmerman's book, *Men's Lacrosse*, co-authored with Peter England, was released by Human Kinetics and received outstanding reviews from the lacrosse community. Less than two weeks later, the Retriever mentor led the lacrosse program to Japan for the third time in the past nine years. He is credited with the widespread popularity of the game in the Land of the Rising Sun.

Widely recognized as one of this nation's premier teachers of the sport of lacrosse, Zimmerman traveled to Buenos Aires, Argentina, to assist in the development of the game in the South American country in December 2004. It was not Zimmerman's first venture in the international development of the sport—in fact, the Retriever mentor has taught the game on four different continents. He has also spent time in Europe (Great Britain) and Asia (Japan).

"The game of lacrosse is the best game out there and I would love to see it played in the Olympics," Zimmerman said. "It's incumbent upon us to introduce and develop the game when opportunities occur in order to reach that goal."

"My coaching philosophy has always focused on teaching the fundamentals - the little things that make the big difference," Zimmerman said. "Lacrosse is a game of skill and precision, best played when using a simple, basic approach."

In the spring of 1993, UMBC changed the complexion of its lacrosse program by appointing Don Zimmerman as its head coach. Success did not happen overnight. After a 7-7 campaign in 1994, UMBC struggled to records of 4-9 and 3-9 the next two seasons. But even then, the program was changing. A position was created for a full-time assistant coach in 1996, and UMBC recruited a trio of players from The Boys' Latin School that formed the nucleus of an evolving team.

In 1997, UMBC was the most improved team in the country, finishing at 9-3 and posting its highest final season USILA ranking of No. 16. The 1998 season opened with tough losses to Navy and Towson, but a now more experienced team rebounded by winning eight of the next 10 games, including a victory over No. 9 Georgetown. Then, on May 2, 1998, the Retrievers shocked everyone in the lacrosse world except themselves when they scored a 12-8 victory over No. 1 Maryland. The victory propelled UMBC into its first-ever NCAA Division I Championship appearance and made the hard work of Zimmerman and his staff worth the wait.



The 1999 Retrievers proved the previous year was no fluke, as wins over Navy, North Carolina and Maryland once again landed UMBC in the NCAA Tournament. In 2003, UMBC took the second-biggest leap in the lacrosse power rankings, from 29th to 13th. In its second America East Conference season in 2005, UMBC captured the regular-season title by defeating Albany on its home field. In 2006,

the Retrievers captured their first America East championship and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. In 2007, Zimmerman's squad became the first UMBC Division I team to advance in NCAA Tournament play with a first-round win at Maryland.

In the spring of 2005, UMBC Athletics completed a \$5 million stadium locker room complex. Among its many amenities, it is the first building on campus to be completely outfitted with fiber-optic cable. Moreover, the stadium field was outfitted with Sportexe's Momentum turf, the same product used at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore.



"Our goal has always been to get ourselves to the same level as the other top teams in the country," Zimmerman said. "What we're doing in lacrosse runs parallel to what we're doing as a university. We feel we have an outstanding product at UMBC and we want people to know that."

"I have been very fortunate to be at good schools and worked with good people and I love what I do."

Zimmerman's entire playing and coaching career has been based on winning. He led Johns Hopkins (14-0) to the national title in 1984 and piloted the Blue Jays to another pair of championships in 1985 and 1987. The Baltimore native chalked up 73 wins against only 15 losses in his seven years at Homewood. After leaving JHU after the 1990 season, Zimmerman served as an assistant coach at Loyola College from 1991-93.

Zimmerman prepped at St. Paul's School, where he was a member of three MSAAC Conference championship teams. A 1976 graduate of Johns Hopkins, Zimmerman played under the late Henry Ciccarone, received Honorable Mention All-America recognition and was awarded the Turnbull-Reynolds Award for Sportsmanship and Leadership in 1976. In his first season after graduation, Zimmerman was named coach of the Hopkins B squad.

After spending a year as assistant coach at Princeton in 1978, he joined Willie Scroggs' staff at North Carolina. The Tar Heels won a pair of national titles (1981, 1982) in Zimmerman's four years in Chapel Hill. He then returned to his alma mater the following year, and when Coach Ciccarone retired after the 1983 season, Zimmerman became head coach.

On Jan. 25, 2002, Coach Zimmerman was honored with induction into the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the United States Lacrosse Hall of Fame. UMBC standout defenseman Gary Clipp ('77) joined him as an inductee in a gala affair at Martin's West in Baltimore. Gary's son Pat is a freshman on the 2016 Retrievers' squad.

Zimmerman also served as an assistant coach of the United States team in the 1986 World Games and was a coach for the South squad for the 2002 North-South All Star game. Zimmerman and his wife, Dorothy, reside in Towson. The Zimmermans have two children, Emily and Jake, who completed four years on the UMBC lacrosse squad in 2013.

Former Retriever standout Andy Gallagher was named assistant men's lacrosse coach at UMBC in the fall of 2009 and was elevated to the position of associate head coach in 2014.

"It's great to have Andy Gallagher back as an assistant coach at UMBC," Zimmerman said at that time. "During his playing career, Andy consistently demonstrated outstanding leadership skills and a terrific feel for the game of lacrosse, playing the game with an incredible sense of passion and determination. The Retriever program is fortunate to have a person of Andy's character on board and looks forward to continued growth and development."

Gallagher served as the director of student activities and assistant boys' lacrosse coach at his alma mater, DeMatha Catholic High School, from August 2008 until accepting the position at UMBC.

The Rockville, Md., native showed tremendous courage and skill during his playing career at UMBC. He suffered torn ACLs in each of his first two playing seasons (2003 and 2004), but recovered to cap his career with an All-America citation in his senior campaign of 2007. He captained that team, which became UMBC's first-ever to advance in NCAA Tournament competition, and amassed 35 goals and 51 points in his senior season.

For his career, Gallagher recorded 98 goals and 146 points, and he is currently ranked 11th on UMBC's all-time scoring list. He earned America East First-Team honors as a sophomore midfielder in 2005 and second-team recognition at attack in 2007.

Gallagher's older brother, Matt, captained the 2004 UMBC squad and earned four letters from 2001-04. His younger brother, Danny, lettered in lacrosse at the University of Maryland.

Gallagher earned his bachelor of arts degree in sociology and minored in history. He was also an active participant in UMBC's "You Can Make a Difference" mentoring program and the "Ride with Pride" program for disabled children at the Maryland Equestrian Center.

He currently resides in Catonsville, Md., with his wife, Sarah, and their daughter Annabelle (2).

UMBC alum Steve Settembrino was named assistant men's lacrosse coach at his alma mater in August of 2013.

Settembrino competed as a defenseman for the Retrievers from 2005-09 and was a part of four consecutive squads that competed in the NCAA Tournament. He earned the team's Unsung Hero award after his senior campaign.

The Yorktown Heights, N.Y. native saw action in 35 games in his first three seasons, but started at close defense in all 16 contests in 2009. Nationally, Settembrino's defensive units were ranked fourth (5.6 goals against per game) and second (5.2) respectively in his two campaigns in Erie.

Settembrino earned a master's degree in special education at Mercyhurst in 2013.

He returned to his home state in 2012-13 as an assistant coach/defensive coordinator at Binghamton University. The Bearcat defense led the America East Conference in scoring defense and led the nation in man-down defense at 86.2 percent.

Settembrino also served as recruiting coordinator during his stint in Vestal.

"We are delighted to have Steve Settembrino return to UMBC as a member of our men's lacrosse coaching staff," said Zimmerman. "Steve has proven to be a highly effective coach and mentor during stints at both at Mercyhurst and Binghamton. He is respected by his colleagues for his passion for teaching and knowledge of the game of lacrosse. As a former Retriever, Steve has the admiration and support of our alums. All in all, Steve is a great fit for our program and everyone is excited for him to be back on campus."

He will serve as a volunteer assistant coach and reprise his role in working on the defensive side of the field and with the goalkeepers.

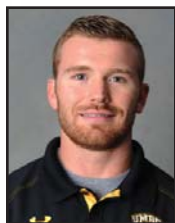

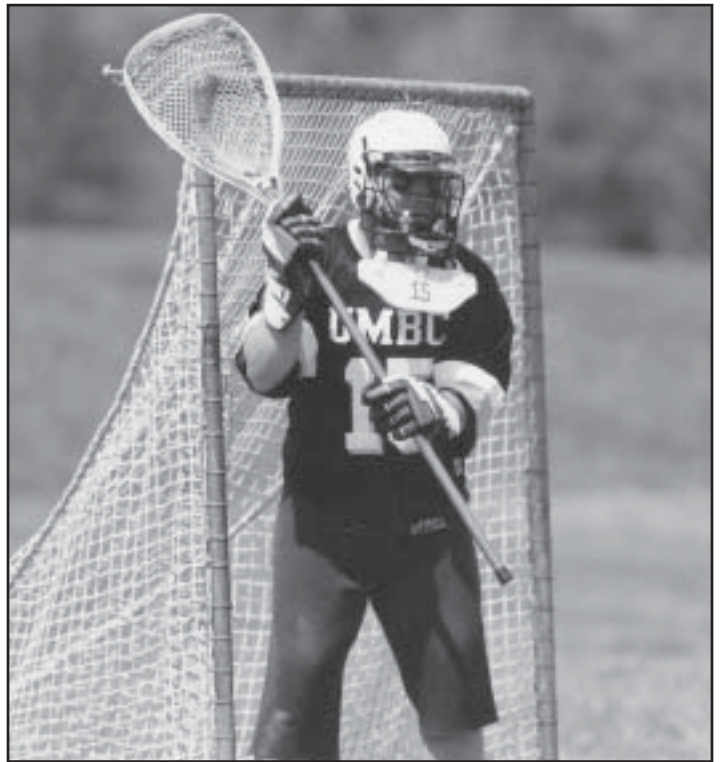

MEDIA GUIDELINES

Members of the working press are welcome to visit UMBC as often as possible. It would be greatly appreciated if members of the media who plan to cover Retriever Lacrosse would notify the Office of Athletic Communications 48 hours prior to the game, as press box seating is limited. Season passes will be sent to media agencies who cover UMBC Athletics on a regular basis. Game-by-game credentials will be available at the press box.

GAME SERVICES

UMBC will provide the following services for each home lacrosse game: game notes, rosters, half-time and post-game statistics and play-by-play.

Radio stations which are broadcasting the game can also obtain stats at most time outs. Coach Zimmerman and requested players will meet the media in the Team Room of the Dawg House Locker Room Complex approximately 15 minutes after the conclusion of the game. Check with the visiting school SID to determine its post-game policies.

MEDIA WORK AREA

Reporters may file from the press box. Wireless internet is also available.

PARKING

The road leading from The Stadium Lot/Giffen Hill lot to the lot behind the locker room complex will be inaccessible. Therefore, for weekend games, all media will have to park on Hilltop Circle or the Stadium Lot and enter through the main ticket gate. For those that need credentials, they can be picked up at the will call window of the ticket booth. For coverage of weekday games or daily practice, parking is very challenging, so please contact me and I will arrange for visitor parking either by the RAC or in the Commons Garage.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers should follow all guidelines set forth by the Media Guidelines manual, published by the NCAA. Only credentialed photographers will be permitted to have field access. All photographers must shoot from the bleacher side of the field and must shoot from the track.

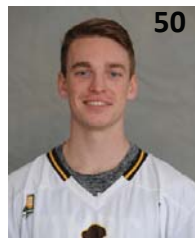
