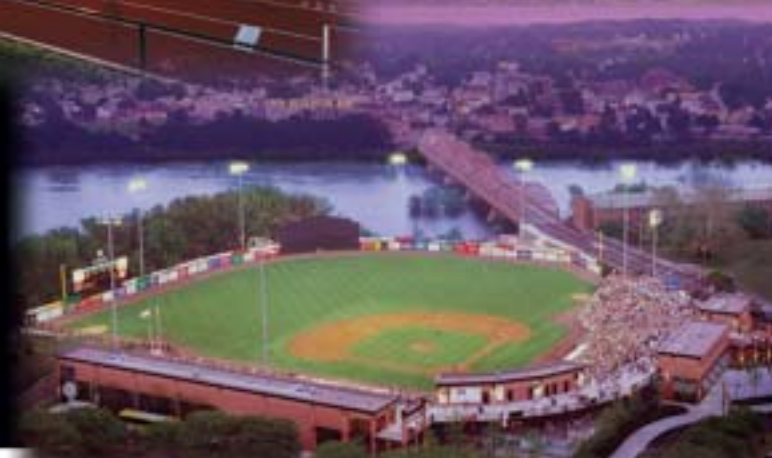
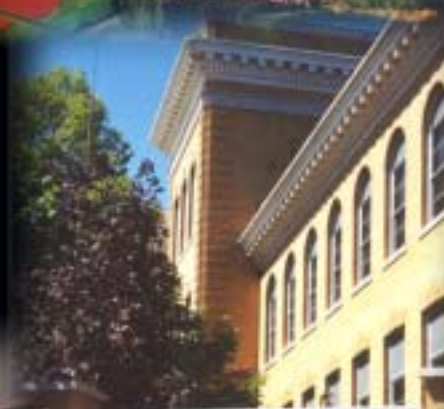

# 2005 OUTLOOK

Four or five years ago, the 2005 season would have been classified as one of those rebuilding years.

Reload, replenish or restock are the more accurate terms for the UMass Lowell men's soccer program nowadays.

No doubt the 2005 season is a year of change for the River Hawks. But Head Coach **Ted Priestly** can guarantee there will be no respite, reprieve or repression in his approach.

The River Hawks graduate some of the best players to ever wear the UML uniform: **Jonathan Curran**, the two-time All-American and Northeast-10 Conference Defensive Player of the Year; **Jason Paige**, the program's all-time leading scorer; and all-NE-10 standouts **Kyle Burson** (defender) and midfielder **Tim Garry** (midfielder).

"Every year, we deal with the loss of the previous senior class, and the leadership void that is created," Priestly said. "I am confident that our captains and upperclassmen will fill that void, and help us continue to move forward as a constantly improving team."

Though the losses are considerable, UML returns seven starters and 12 players who routinely saw significant action in 2004, which saw the River Hawks enjoy their best season numerically in school history.

UML's midfield will remain well-manned behind juniors **Christian Figueroa** and **Michael Cafeteiro**. The 2003 NE-10 Rookie of the Year, Figueroa sat out six matches last year due to an injury, but returned to start the final 13 with impact (he scored in UML's 1-0 victory at Le Moyne in the NE-10 Tournament semifinal).

Cafeteiro, who shattered the school record for assists in a season (13) is arguably the region's deadliest player on set pieces. A free kick specialist, Cafeteiro helped UML score roughly one-third of its goals last season on set plays.

Tearing down the right side will be sophomore **Edens Chery**, an exquisite dribbler who gave left backs fits with his ability to penetrate.

Filling in the final middle spot will likely be senior **Craig Lamy**, who started nine of 13 matches last year and brings plenty of poise and

precision.

The River Hawk midfield collectively compiled six goals and 22 assists a year ago, virtually all from Cafeteiro, Figueroa, Chery and Lamy.

Up front, junior **Andrew Doherty** returns after leading the River Hawks in scoring – and earning a spot on the All-NE-10 second team – with 11 goals and one assist (23 points). Priestly could have a special player in sophomore **Dale Totman**, who registered 4-1-9 in his first five appearances (one start) last year before an injury curtailed his season.

Sophomore **Jonathan Melo**, limited to only two appearances last year due to injury, will also look for more minutes. Melo made the most of his shortened season, scoring the deciding penalty kick in UML's marathon victory over Franklin Pierce for the NE-10 Tournament championship.

Defensively, senior **Diego Pinheiro** and sophomore **Tiago Cordoso** are each primed to maintain the smothering backline. Curran and Burson helped UML establish the last four years.

Pinheiro, an all-American sprinter on UML's track and field team, will enter his third straight year as a starter while Cordoso

started eight of 11 matches last year despite a foot injury. Junior **Ryan Keefe** may also step in after playing as a reserve the last two seasons.

Senior **Bobby Ritter**, the 2004 NE-10 Tournament most valuable player, will man the woodwork again following another splendid year. A second team all-NE-10 selection, Ritter established single season school-records of 0.69 goals against and nine shutouts.

Backing up Ritter will be junior **Benn Eaton**, who made one appearance last season.

Priestly welcomes a balanced class of 10 newcomers to the fold this season

Up front, freshman **Jim Columbo** (Littleton, MA) should see quality minutes following a stellar five-year career at Littleton H.S. Columbo was a three-time Mid-Wachusett League all-star and twice the league's most valuable player, compiling 47 goals and 44 assists for his career.

In the midfield, freshman **Matias Pietropinto** (Leominster, MA) will likely figure in immediately following a three-year career at Worcester Academy. A native of Uruguay, Pietropinto graduated as the program's all-time assist leader and was a three-year conference all-star.

Sophomores **Brendan Dunican** (Londonderry, NH) and **Niall McDaid** (Chelmsford, MA) could also see playing time right away. McDaid was a former standout at Chelmsford H.S. while Dunican was an all-state standout at Londonderry H.S.

Also battling for minutes is freshman **Andrew Sale** (Stow, MA), a four-year starter at Nashoba Regional H.S.

Defensively, freshmen **Adam Fontaine** (Newburyport, MA) and **Alex Fischer** (Groton, MA) could step into the back four. Fontaine comes to UML after one

season as a starter at Southern Maine, which followed two all-conference years at Newburyport H.S.

Fischer was an all-state and all-conference standout at Groton-Dunstable H.S.

Freshmen **Adam Fitzgerald** (Dracut, MA) and **Michael Galvin** (Brockton, MA) could also have an immediate impact. Fitzgerald was the Merrimack Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year as a senior, capping a splendid three-year career at Dracut H.S.

Galvin was a three-year player at Thayer Academy and led it to the New

England Class 'B' championship last fall. An all-league and all-state player, Galvin was also a three-year player in the Cape Cod Crusaders system and helped lead the Crusaders to the 2005 Super Y League national championship match.

Freshman **Sean Neri** (Lincoln, MA) could also see a share of starts after a solid career at Lincoln-Sudbury H.S., where he earned all-state status and won a state championship in 2003.

"This year's incoming class is another talented one, but that talent alone is never enough," Priestly noted. "Talent got them in the door, but their ability to develop that talent, to outwork the opposition, and help our team compete and win games will largely determine their involvement.

"Every member of this incoming class was a captain and most valuable player for their high school and/or club team," Priestly added. "That is only a beginning, though. They have tremendous potential, but potential alone is worth very little in a team environment.

"They have to bring that inner desire, commitment and passion to the field every single day, and the development will take care of itself."

# THE COACHING STAFF



## Ted Priestly, Head Coach

Fresh off another record-breaking season, Head Coach Ted Priestly returns for his ninth season at UMass Lowell.

For the fourth time in his eight-year career, Priestly has guided the men's soccer program to a school record in winning percentage, leading the River Hawks to a 15-3-2 clip (.750). Over the last six years, Priestly has guided

UMass Lowell to five postseason berths as well as two Northeast-10 Conference Tournament championships and the program's first-ever trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2003 and 2004. In 2003, the River Hawks won the NCAA New England Region championship and advanced to the quarterfinal.

The River Hawks highlighted the 2004 season with their second straight Northeast-10 Conference Tournament championship, defeating Franklin Pierce, 6-5, on penalty kicks following 110 minutes of scoreless play. Along the way, UML shattered school records for fewest matches lost (three); goals surrendered (14, previously 21) and shutouts (10).

Since Priestly's arrival in 1997, the men's soccer program has consistently improved with each season and has been regarded as one of the premier Division II teams in the New England Region and the country. After finishing 7-12-0 and 5-14-1 in his first two seasons, he has guided UML to a clip of 77-33-9 (.647) over the last six.

Priestly has compiled an all-time record of 89-59-10 (.563). Additionally, he has guided UML players to All-America status four times (Brandon Curran in 2002; Jason Paige in 2003; Jonathan Curran in 2003 and 2004); All-New England Region honors 11 times; and all conference accolades 22 times, including seven in each of the last two seasons.

A native of Westford, MA, Priestly graduated from UMass Amherst in 1994 with a degree in political science and was a three-year standout for the Minutemen. He lives in Chelmsford, MA, with his wife, Melanie, and their son Luke (4) and daughter Madeline (1).

# THE COACHING STAFF



**Brandon Curran**

Entering his third year on the UML coaching staff, Brandon Curran will be responsible for fitness training and defensive strategy.

A four-year starter, Curran graduated as the most decorated player in program history, becoming the first-ever UML player to earn All-America honors. He currently ranks seventh on UML's all-time scoring list with 17 goals and 12 assists (46 points) and appeared in all 77 games in his career, then a school record.

Curran also became the first UML player to sign a professional contract and recently concluded his third year with the Phantoms of New Hampshire, appearing in 19 of 20 matches. During the 2003 season, Curran was also regularly called upon to practice with the New England Revolution.

Curran resides in Lowell, MA.

Making his coaching debut, Andrew Eicher steps to the sidelines following a stellar college career at the University of

Massachusetts.

A center midfielder, Eicher was a four-year starter and helped guide the Minutemen to the Atlantic 10 regular season championship in 2002 and the A-10 tournament title in 2001. The Minutemen also earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and advanced to the second round before losing to eventual finalist St. John's.

The Minutemen posted a four-year record of 50-25-6, including a 29-10-4 clip in the A-10.

A 2000 graduate of Billerica H.S., Eicher was an All-Conference and All-Eastern Mass standout as a senior.

Eicher lives in Lowell, MA.



**T.J. Tomasso**

Currently a goalkeeper with the New England Revolution, T.J. Tomasso enters his first season on the sidelines and will serve as UMass

Lowell's goalkeeper coach.

Tomasso is currently in his first year with the Revolution following a splendid career at Southern Methodist University.

While at SMU, Tomasso was the 2004 Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Defensive Player of the Year and an All-Midwest Region selection as a senior at SMU. He was also a first team all-MVC pick as a senior where he posted a 14-3-1 record with a MVC-best 0.81 GAA and

eight shutouts.

In 57 appearances with the Mustangs, Tomasso recorded 26 shutouts. As a senior, he backstopped SMU to the MVC regular season championship (8-0, 16-4-1 overall) and to the NCAA Tournament round of 16.

Tomasso is a native of Canton, MI, and resides in Foxboro, MA.
