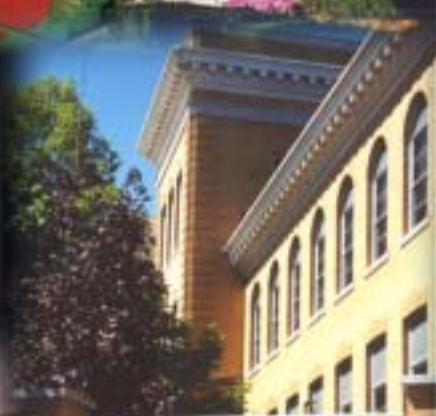

# 2007 OUTLOOK

With change ever-present within college athletics, there is a distinct message brought forth in the UMass Lowell soccer program: Players – newcomers and veterans – better be ready to play.

With a 73-27-16 record over the last six seasons, that message is being received.

As UML graduated three of the better players ever to brandish the River Hawk last season, there will be plenty of opportunity and competition for positions.

Gone are midfielder **Christian Figueroa** (now an assistant coach), a four-time Northeast-10 Conference all-star; forward **Andrew Doherty**, No. 3 on UML's all-time scoring list; and defender **Michael Cafeteiro**, who helped set a plethora of defensive records.

The River Hawks had one of their best years defensively in 2006 – nine shutouts and just 16 goals allowed. Head Coach **Ted Priestly**, however, would like to see a few more goals this season.

"Last year we proved that we were extremely difficult to beat, but we didn't do enough to win some of those games, and we ended up tying some games that we should have won," he said.

Despite having 16 freshmen and sophomores, the 2007 River Hawks are playing like a veteran unit.

"We started six or seven freshmen throughout (last) season," he noted. "That year's worth of experience should really help us turn those ties and losses into wins this season."

## ***Defensively In Tact***

The River Hawks remain well-manned in the back as four starters, led by sophomore goalkeeper **Ryan Richards**, return.

Richards matched former standout Bobby Ritter's single season shutout record

(nine) and was very close to the single season goals against average mark (0.81) with a 0.85 clip.

Also noteworthy is the fact that Richards thwarted two penalty kicks in the regular season as well as one in UML's first scrimmage game against the University of New Hampshire.

Backing up Richards will be sophomores **Michael Ferrari** and **Carlos Antunes**, both of whom sat out 2006 but enjoyed solid high school careers.

Ferrari was a four-year player at Melrose H.S. and a Middlesex League all-star as a senior while Antunes is a

former standout at Brockton H.S.

Richards will also be well-supported by sophomore defenders **Rudy Kocandrie** and **Mike Clem**, as well as junior **Tim Bengston**.

At 6-foot-4, Kocandrie will give UML a sizeable target on set pieces while the speedy Clem will continue to give opposing forwards fits.

Bengston, who assisted on four goals last season, will again be a creator on the left side.

Priestly can also tab sophomore **Corey Samuelson**, who made seven appearances last year; as well as freshmen **Evan Spann** (Acton, MA), **Derek Bamberg** (Stoneham, MA) and **Matt Orsini** (Dudley, MA), each fresh off stellar high school careers.

Spann was a league all-star at Acton-Boxborough H.S., where he helped the Colonials to the state championship last year. Bamberg was a two-time all-state standout at Stoneham H.S., enjoying a pair of state championships.

Orsini was a conference all-star at Shepherd Hill Regional H.S.

## ***Veteran Midfield***

UML welcomes back four players who either started or saw significant action in the midfield a year ago. Junior **Matias**

**Pietropinto**, the 2005 NE-10 Freshman of the Year, and All-NE-10 senior **Edens Chery** could emerge as two of the better attacking midfielders in the conference and may also see minutes up front.

Pietropinto and Chery combined for four goals and five assists and will aim for more of the same.

UML will also be bolstered by sophomores **Jhony Valencia** and **Guillermo Cisneros**. Valencia, limited to nine matches last year due to an injury, but often showed brilliance and will provide UML forwards with plenty of opportunities.

Cisneros saw action in 11 matches and could emerge a starter this season.

Junior **Jose Esteves** (Fall River, MA) and freshmen **Terrence Richardson** (Auburn, MA) are both expected to have an immediate impact. Esteves transfers from renowned junior college power Massasoit Community College, where he helped the Warriors to the 2005 New England region championship.

Richardson could also see immediate minutes and enters the year hungry after redshirting the 2006 season. A graduate of Auburn H.S., Richardson was an all-conference and all-state standout and led Auburn to the 2005 state championship match.

## ***Depth and Firepower Up Front***

With Chery and Pietropinto in attacking midfielder roles, UML still has a wealth of firepower. With one or both up front, the River Hawks will surely score.

Back from last season is sophomore **Brendan Horne**, who looks to build upon his five goals (tied with Doherty for the team lead) and one assist. Also waiting in the wings is sophomore **Jesse Arredondo**, who played in 11 matches last year (one goal) and gives UML uncanny speed up front.



***Senior Edens Chery***

Heading the list of newcomers is senior **Matt Dubois** (Dracut, MA), who played the 2004 and 2005 seasons at Merrimack and has two years of eligibility.

Dubois, who may also play attacking midfielder, compiled 13 goals and eight assists in his two seasons with the Warriors and looks to do even better at UML.

Priestly can also call upon freshmen **Kevin Hart** (Lynn, MA) and **Stephen Potcner** (Wilmington, MA), both of whom will push for minutes right away.

Hart scored UML's goal in a

preseason 1-0 victory at the University of Maine. Previously, Hart was a four-year starter, three-time league all-star and league player of the year as a senior at St. Mary's H.S. who compiled 81 goals and 58 assists.

At 6-3, Potcner gives UML an immediate target up front and also comes to UML as a proven goal scorer. An all-conference and all-state standout at Wilmington H.S., Potcner amassed a school-record 28 goals in his senior season.

Giving UML immediate quickness up front is first-year senior **Lawrence Aidoo** (Pawtucket, RI), a former standout at Pawtucket H.S. who was a sprinter on the UML track and field teams the last two years. A two-time All-New England standout in both the 55 and 200 meter dashes, Aidoo gives UML plenty of speed up front.

"We have had a very strong camp, and the competition for positions has never been better," said Priestly. "We expect that daily competition to translate into on-field success."

# THE COACHING STAFF



## Ted Priestly, Head Coach

UMass Lowell head coach Ted Priestly enters his 11th season at the helm of the men's soccer team, having turned the program into a regional and national contender.

Over the last seven years, Priestly has guided UMass Lowell to seven postseason berths as well as two Northeast-10 Conference Tournament championships and the program's first-ever trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2003 and 2004. In 2003, the River Hawks won the NCAA New England Region Championship and advanced to the quarterfinal.

The River Hawks highlighted the 2004 season with their second straight Northeast-10 Conference Tournament championship, defeating Franklin Pierce, 6-5, on penalty kicks following 110 minutes of scoreless play. Along the way, UML shattered school records for fewest matches lost (three); goals surrendered (14, previously 21) and shutouts (10).

Since Priestly's arrival in 1997, the men's soccer program has consistently improved with each season and is regarded as one of the premier Division II teams in the New England Region and the country. After finishing 7-12-0 and 5-14-1 in his first two seasons, he has guided UML to a sterling clip of 94-42-19 (.606) over the last eight years.

Priestly has compiled an all-time record of 106-68-20 (.546). Additionally, he has guided UML players to All-America status four times (Brandon Curran in 2002; Jason Paige in 2003; Jonathan Curran in 2003 and 2004); All-New England Region honors 16 times; and all conference accolades 30 times, including 22 over the last four seasons.

A native of Westford, MA, Priestly graduated from UMass Amherst in 1994 with a degree in political science and was a three-year standout defender for the Minutemen.

Priestly lives in Chelmsford, MA, with his wife, Melanie, and their son Luke (6) and daughter Madeline (3).

# THE COACHING STAFF



## Marc Connolly

Marc Connolly enters his second year as an assistant coach with the UMass Lowell soccer program while doubling as the

managing editor of [ussoccerplayers.com](http://ussoccerplayers.com), the official website of the U.S. Soccer Players Association.

A longtime soccer columnist for entities such as ESPN.com and MLSNet.com, Connolly is no stranger to successful coaching. Prior to joining the UML staff, he was the head coach in the nationally renowned Oakwood Soccer Club system in Glastonbury, CT, for four years where he coached at the U-15, U-16 and U-19 levels.

In the summer of 2007, Connolly led the Stars of Massachusetts U-16 boys team to the Massachusetts State Cup final.

During his tenure, he guided the U-15, U-16 and U-19 teams to Connecticut State Cup championships as well as two bronze medals in Region I competition which pairs teams from Maine to Virginia following state competition.

Last summer, Connolly was a member of ESPN/ABC's broadcast team at the World Cup, serving as the chief researcher for on-air talents J.P. Dellacamera and former U.S. National Team standout John Harkes. Over the course of the World Cup, the trio broadcast 18 matches in 36 days.

Connolly spent nine years covering the U.S. National Team for ABCSports.com and ESPN.com, and was a contributor to *USA Today*, *ESPN The Magazine*, *Boston Magazine* and *Four Four Two*. He has been the recipient of the NSCAA's Deadline Game Story Award on three occasions.

In May of 2006, Connolly received the Distinguished Alumni Award from his alma mater, Ithaca College, from where he graduated in 1996. A Dean's List student, he graduated with a degree in sports information and communication.

A former standout and teammate of Ted Priestly's at Westford Academy, Connolly lives in Lowell, MA.

## Brackie Reyes

Entering his fifth season at UMass Lowell, Brackie Reyes returns as the goalkeeper coach after a two-year hiatus.

A native of Scotch Plains, NJ, Reyes was a two-year goalkeeper at the University of Massachusetts where he, along with UML head coach Ted Priestly, led the Minutemen to the 1994 Atlantic 10 regular season championship and tournament final.

In addition to his coaching duties, Reyes has been active in local club soccer, and has appeared at numerous camps and clinics throughout the northeast. He served as the director of public relations for the Phantoms of New Hampshire of the USL League Two for two years.

Reyes lives in Nashua, NH, with his wife, Andrea.



## Christian Figueroa

Christian Figueroa enters his first season on the UMass Lowell staff following an honor-filled career from 2003-06. During his tenure, he helped the River Hawks to a 47-17-14 record (.603), two NCAA Tournaments – including the quarterfinal round in 2003 – and two Northeast-10 Conference Tournament championships.

Along the way, Figueroa was the 2003 NE-10 Freshman of the Year and went on to earn all-conference honors and NSCAA All-Northeast Region status three years, culminating with first team honors in 2005 and 2006.

A two-year captain, Figueroa was one of 25 Division I, II and III players invited to tryout for the New England Revolution last February. He currently ranks in a tie for 13th on UML's all-time scoring list with 12 goals and 14 assists (38 points).

A native of North Andover, MA, Figueroa lives in Lowell, MA.
