

**TERRY RUPP**  
**Head Coach**  
**Fourth Season at Maryland**  
**Ninth season overall**  
**Tampa '88**

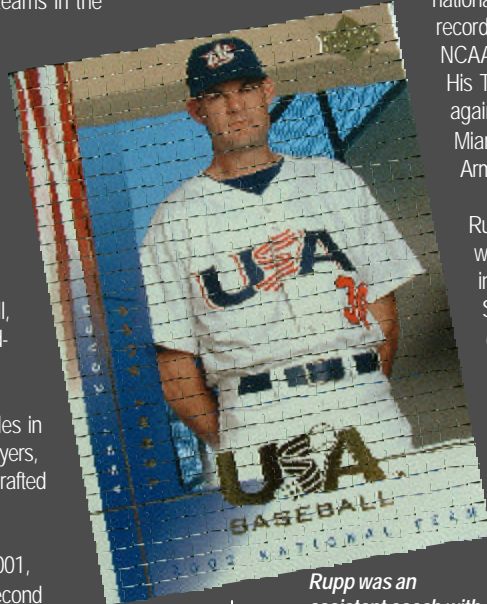
Terry Rupp is entering his fourth season as the head coach of the Terrapin baseball team. In each of his previous three seasons, Rupp has overseen improvements in many aspects of the baseball program. His philosophy of discipline and hard work has started moving this team in the right direction. During the 2003 season, Rupp took a very young group of players and helped them set several individual and team records. Despite having five freshmen and sophomores in the lineup, the Terps won three consecutive ACC series for the first time since they began playing three-game sets in 1990. The 2003 season saw the Terps facing some very tough opponents. With Rupp, they were able to come away with four victories over teams in the top 15.

Throughout his four seasons atop the Maryland program, Rupp has shown the ability to help develop the skills of his players to their full potential. He helped develop pitcher Steve Schmoll into one of Maryland's all-time great pitchers after he had a 7.35 ERA as a junior. In 2003, Schmoll became Maryland's all-time and single season strikeout leader. Rupp has also overseen the development of junior Justin Maxwell, from a .239 hitter as a freshman to a 2004 second-team preseason All-American.

The drafting of Kyle George by the Baltimore Orioles in 2003 marked the 13th time that one of Rupp's players, on both Maryland and his alma mater, has been drafted in the past seven amateur baseball drafts.

After adjusting to ACC play in his first season in 2001, Rupp brought home 34 wins in 2002. In just his second year in charge of the program, he led the Terps to the most victories in Maryland history. This marked the first time that a Terrapin baseball team had even brought home 30 wins in a season. During his 2002 campaign, Rupp also saw numerous team records shattered, including runs scored, hits, doubles, RBI, strikeouts and saves.

In the summer of 2002, Rupp took advantage of a unique experience and represented Maryland as an assistant coach with Team USA Baseball. Rupp helped guide the team on its summer Red, White and Blue Tour, before helping the Stars & Stripes capture the Honkbal Classic Championship in The Netherlands. Rupp and Team USA went on to earn the silver

medal at the FISU World University Baseball Championship in Messina, Italy. It is clear that Rupp has the Terrapins pointed in the right direction to be a competitor in the region, and in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Rupp and his staff continue to attract talented recruits, and continue to strive toward the program's ultimate goals of being a perennial contender and consistently reaching the NCAA tournament.

Rupp, 37, led his alma mater Tampa to a 215-80 (.729) record in five years before coming to Maryland, including four 40-win seasons. Rupp guided the 1998 Spartans to the program's third national championship with an impressive 46-14 record. In 2000, his team was ranked No. 2 in the NCAA Division II poll heading into postseason play. His Tampa teams posted a 15-5 cumulative record against Division I opposition, including wins over Miami, Oral Roberts, Southwestern Louisiana and Army.

Rupp is a graduate of the University of Tampa where he earned a bachelor of science degree in marketing. At Tampa, he was a two-time All-South Regional baseball selection who played on teams that made a pair of national championship appearances. He was a teammate of St. Louis Cardinals' first baseman and four-time world champion Tino Martinez. He also was a two-time all-conference selection in basketball and a two-time conference all-academic selection, and was inducted into Tampa's Sports Hall of Fame in the Fall of 2002.

Before college, Rupp was a Parade and McDonald's All-American in basketball after helping lead Jesuit High of Tampa to the class 3A state championship. In 1989, he was voted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

Rupp was a 16th-round draft choice of the San Diego Padres in 1989 and played two seasons in the Padres' minor league organization. From 1993-95 he was a minor league coach for the short season Class "A" Oneonta Yankees of the New York-Penn League.
