Maryland Volleyball History

1971

• Under the leadership of first-year head coach **Barb Drum**, the Terps finish the season 18-5 and advance to the national tournament after an undefeated regular season (17-0).

1974

• With a record of 39-4, Maryland advances to the AIAW Tournament for the first time in program history.

1975

• Maryland wins a school-record 46 matches during the season and advances to the AIAW National Tournament for the second consecutive season.

1977

• Maryland makes its fourth straight trip to the AIAW National Tournament, setting the school record for the most consecutive appearances in a national tournament.

1980

• **Mary Ann Marley** becomes the first Maryland player to earn All-ACC honors.

1983

• **Sue Vance** becomes the first Terp ever to earn All-ACC honors three times during her career (1981-83).

1985

• **Sheila Fearnow** sets the Maryland single-season records for service aces (65), solo blocks (66) and total blocks (187).

1989

• **Kelli Myers** concludes her Maryland career with the all-time program records for solo blocks (83), block assists (219) and total blocks (438).

1990

• Maryland wins its first-ever ACC Tournament and advances to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history.

• **Janice Kruger** is named the ACC Coach of the Year and **Colleen Hurley** becomes the first Maryland player to be named the ACC Player of the Year and the ACC Tournament MVP.

1991

• **Colleen Hurley** concludes her Maryland career with the school records for kills in a career (1,238) and attack attempts (3,203).

• **Andrea Mandella** concludes her career at Maryland with the program records for matches played (125) and service aces (169).

1993

• **Nicole Lantagne** concludes her Maryland career with the all-time school records for games played (459) and digs (1,668).

1995

• Maryland makes its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament in five years.

1996

• Maryland wins its second-ever ACC championship and becomes the first team in the conference to finish the regular season 16-0.

• The Terps advance to the NCAA Tournament for a school-record second consecutive year.

• **Janice Kruger** is named the ACC Coach of the Year, **Daune Koester** is named the ACC Player of the Year and **Elizabeth Efron** captures ACC Tournament MVP honors.

1997

• Maryland finishes the regular season 25-0, becoming just the eighth team in NCAA history at the time to attain a perfect record.

• **Eden Kroeger** becomes the first Maryland player ever to earn All-America honors and ends her career with the most assists (5,259) in Maryland history.

• **Elizabeth Efron** ends her career at Maryland with the highest all-time attack percentage in school history (.299).

• Maryland goes undefeated in the ACC for the second consecutive season (16-0).

• **Janice Kruger** is named the ACC Coach of the Year for the third time in her career.

1999

• **Carey Brennan** becomes the third Maryland player ever selected to the ACC All-Freshman team.

2000

• The Terps defeated NC State (3-1) 6-15, 15-3, 15-13, 15-10, Oct. 7 at Ritchie Coliseum for win number 700 in the program's history. Since 1971, Maryland has totaled an impressive mark of 704-388 (.645) in NCAA volleyball action.

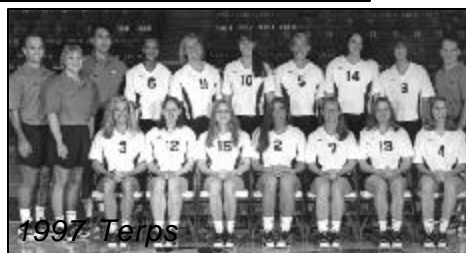

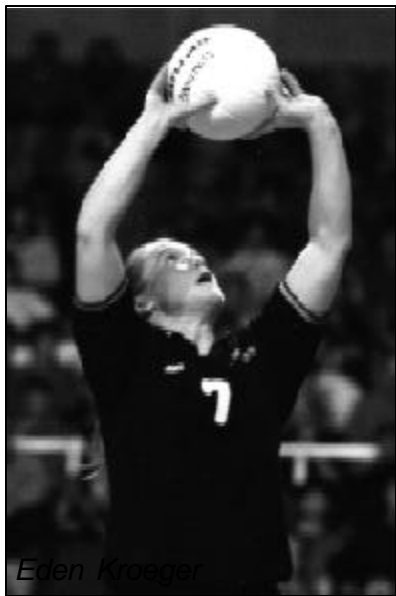

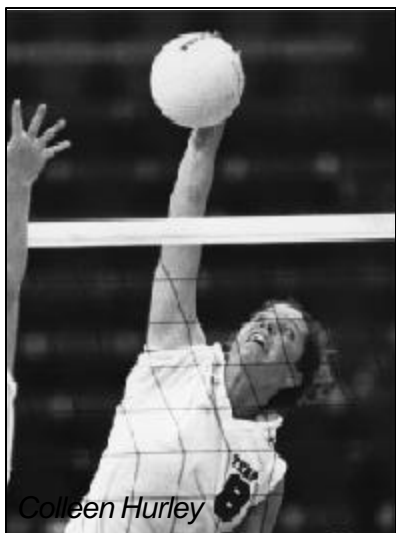
