MARYLAND BLANKS MASON IN 1,000th MATCH

• The No. 5 Maryland men's soccer team celebrated the 1,000 match in its program history with a win against George Mason, 2-0, Tuesday night at Ludwig Field.

• Sophomore defender London Woodberry netted his first career goal and the Terps benefited from an own goal to move to 4-1-1 on the year. Maryland has won three consecutive matches after going 1-1-1 to start the year.

• The win avenged a tough loss in Fairfax, Va., against George Mason (4-2) in 2009. The shutout performance is Maryland's third in 2010 as a strong defensive effort held the Patriots to a mere three shots in the match.

THE 2010 SEASON - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

• Maryland made its 29th appearance in the NCAA Tournament last season. It was the 15th under head coach Sasho Cirovski.

• In addition to returning the most experience since the 2008 national championship squad, the Terps boast the fifth-best recruiting class in the nation this season.

• The Terps return nine starters from 2009, including All-ACC honorees Jason Herrick and Zac MacMath. Maryland has five seniors and six juniors on its roster this season.

• Maryland, which plays in the always-tough ACC, once again faces one of the toughest schedules in the country, battling nine teams that participated in the 2007 NCAA Tournament and five that are ranked in the NSCAA Preseason Top 20.

• Seven of the first nine teams the Terps face in 2010 advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season.

2010 MARYLAND MEN'S SOCCER

SCOUTING THE TAR HEELS...

- North Carolina's (4-1-0) only blemish this season came in the season opener against No. 1 Akron.
- Offensively, Carolina has scored the majority of its eight goals this season in the second half, netting five in the final 45. Enzo Martinez and Eddie Ababio are the only two multiple goal-scorers with two each in 2010.
- Senior defender Jalil Anibaba was named the ACC Player of the Week on Tuesday after shutting down Duke's high-powered offense last weekend. Scott Goodwin (.099 GAA) has had to make only six saves this season.
- The rivalry has heated up in the last few seasons, as Maryland topped the Tar Heels in the national championship game in 2008. The Terps lead the all-time series, 43-21-6.

TERPS NOTCH FIRST ACC WIN OF THE YEAR, TOP NC STATE

- The No. 7 Maryland men's soccer team continued its torrid offensive pace, trouncing NC State, 3-1, at Ludwig Field in Atlantic Coast Conference action.
- Senior Jason Herrick paced Maryland with two goals. Freshman Patrick Mullins tacked on his first two career assists as the Terps notched their first win in conference play in 2010.
- Maryland, which outshot the Wolfpack, 16-8, has now notched 16 goals through five matches, its best offensive start since 2005.

MARYLAND NETS TIE AT NO. 5 BOSTON COLLEGE

- After giving up an early penalty kick goal, senior Billy Cortes tied the match in the 60th minute and junior goalkeeper Zac MacMath led the defense with a career-high six saves to preserve a tie at Boston College.
- The Terps gave BC its first blemish of the season and picked up a valuable point in the always-challenging ACC standings.

GOALLLLLLLLLLLLLLLLLLL...

- Maryland has scored 17 goals through its first six matches.
- That number is the highest total since 2005, when the squad scored 19 through its first six games. The Terps went on to win their first national championship since 1968 that season.

CIROVSKI RETURNS FOR 18th SEASON

- The winningest head coach in Maryland men's soccer annals, **Sasho Cirovski** returns for his 18th season at the helm of the prestigious Terp program.

KING OF THE KASSEL

- Matt Kassel has emerged as a point-scoring machine for the Terps. Last season, the midfielder totaled eight points on one goal and six assists.
- The junior from Bridgewater, N.J., has already amassed eight points this season and has doubled his goal output from a year ago.
- Kassel is also Maryland's main corner kick specialist.

DISHIN' IT OUT

- Maryland boasts two of the top assist men in the country as Matt Kassel and Doug Rodkey have teamed up for seven this season.
- Kassel leads the Terps with four assists, including one against George Mason Tuesday. Rodkey, a sixth-year senior, has 14 in his career and is looking to top his single-season high of nine as a member of the 2008 national championship squad.

MOVING FORWARD

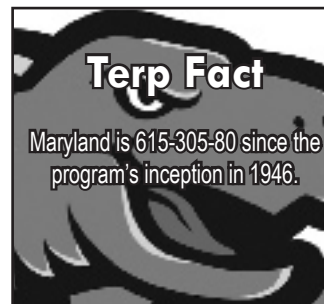
- Casey Townsend and Jason Herrick are in the middle of their third season working together up-top for the Terps.

- Tuesday's match against George Mason was the 1,000th in men's soccer program history.
- The Terps will celebrate the milestone match on the national stage when they play host to Duke Oct. 1 in front of a live FSC audience.

THE TOURNEY STREAK

- Maryland has been to the NCAA Tournament nine consecutive seasons and 15 out of the last 16 seasons.
- In those nine seasons, Maryland has advanced to the College Cup five times (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2008), racking up national titles in 2005 and 2008.
- The Terps saw their nation-best streak of seven straight seasons with a first-round bye snapped in 2009.
- Maryland is 42-24-4 in 29 NCAA appearances.

A GREAT HOME SLATE

- In addition to its always challenging conference schedule which features home matches against NCAA Tournament participants N.C. State, Wake Forest and Duke, the Terps' non-conference slate is highlighted by contests against Michigan State (Sept. 3) and Connecticut (Oct. 5).

BACK ON TRACK

- After missing the majority of the 2009 season, junior Casey Townsend, one of the most prolific goal scorers in all of college soccer, returns to the starting lineup in great shape this season. The junior already has two goals in three games for the Terps in 2010. He teams up with First Team All-ACC selection Jason Herrick up front.
- In addition, Doug Rodkey returns after missing the majority of the season with a foot injury. Starting defender Alex Lee is also back in the lineup.

NO. 5 RECRUITING CLASS

- Head coach Sasho Cirovski and his staff has assembled one of the top recruiting classes in the nation. In addition to Patrick Mullins and Gordon Murie, who enrolled early this spring, Maryland will also welcome Marquez Fernandez, Tsotleho "Sunny" Jane, Jereme Raley and Helge Leikvang this season.

RODKEY BACK FOR MORE

- Maryland senior Doug Rodkey returns for a sixth season after an injury sidelined the midfielder in his sophomore and senior campaigns.
- He will be aiming to be the first male athlete in Maryland history to win three NCAA championships.

U.S. WINS U-20 MILK CUP TITLE

- Zac MacMath and Ethan White headed up the U.S. under-20 national team this July for the Milk Cup in Northern Ireland, ultimately taking home a title in the annual international youth soccer tournament.
- MacMath posted a clean sheet in goal in a 1-0 victory against China while White started and played almost the entire match in a 3-2 victory against Denmark two days later.

- Herrick, who was also recently tabbed to the MAC Hermann Trophy watch list, led Maryland in scoring as a junior last season with nine goals. The Accounting major from Elmhurst, Ill., is a two-time captain for the Terps and has spent two years as a representative for men's soccer on the Student-Athlete Athletic Council.

WELCOME TO FAN-FRIENDLY LUDWIG FIELD

- The Maryland men's soccer team has increasingly attracted more and more fans to Ludwig Field season after season. More than 325,000 fans have filled the stands to take in exciting Terrapin soccer action since the facility opened in 1995.
- A program-high crowd of 6,946 watched Maryland top No. 2 North Carolina in 2009, as the Terps were second nationally in overall attendance.

HERRICK, MACMATH TABBED TO HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Senior Jason Herrick and junior Zac MacMath have been tabbed to the 2010 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List.
- Herrick led the Terps with nine goals in 2009 and has been a mainstay up front for the Terps for three seasons. The Elmhurst, Ill., native was selected as a First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference pick in 2009.
- MacMath was an NSCAA Third Team All-American and First Team All-ACC selection as a sophomore last season. He helped lead the U.S. to a Milk Cup title in Northern Ireland as a member of the U-20 team.

TERPS IN THE COMMUNITY

- Maryland spent the spring semester not only prepping for the upcoming 2010 fall slate, but also making a difference in the community.
- The team raised \$1,500 for Justin's Quest in ticket sales at its spring match against Virginia in addition to shooting baskets with Justin Friedlander to raise awareness for brain tumors.
- The Terps also teamed up to help raise over \$3,000 for the relief effort following the devastating earthquake in Haiti by selling t-shirts. The effort, which corresponded with former Maryland great Seth Stammer's 'The Sporting Chance Foundation' hit close to home for the Terps, as sophomore midfielder Widner Saint Cyr grew up in Port-Au-Prince.

YOUNG GUNS

- Maryland has picked up some vital points from its underclassman group.
- Freshman Patrick Mullins and sophomore London Woodberry leads the unit with four points on a goal and two assists each. Sunny Jane (one assist) and Paul Torres (one assist) have also made point contributions this season.

TAIL OF TWO GAMES

- Terrapin goalkeeper Zac MacMath had a rollercoaster opening weekend.
- After giving up a career-high four goals (he surrendered only nine his entire freshman campaign), the junior U-20 team member rallied to post his 20th career shutout against Northeastern.

AIM AND SHOOT

- Maryland leads the ACC in shots this season, averaging a hefty 18.20 per game.
- The Terps are outshooting their foes a staggering 108-54.

Michigan native Casey Townsend had six shots for the Terps to lead all players as Maryland outshot MSU a staggering 22-7.

Head Coach Sasho Cirovski

Upon his arrival in College Park in 1993, Sasho Cirovski has transformed Maryland into a national soccer power, leading the Terps to the 2008 and 2005 NCAA titles, six College Cup appearances, and three ACC titles, all the while producing numerous top-level professional players. After 17 seasons at Maryland, the 2005 NSCAA National Coach of the Year has instilled his passion for excellence in a soccer program that expects to compete for the national title every season.

During his tenure with the Terps, Maryland has been to the NCAA Tournament 15 times, advancing to the Final Four in six of those years, including four-straight appearances from 2002-05, culminating in the NCAA title in 2005. The Terps have also captured three ACC Tournament titles (1996, 2002 and 2008) and two ACC regular season titles (2003 and 2005) during his stay in College Park.

Sporting a youth-laden squad in 2009, Maryland advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth straight year. An unseeded Maryland squad cruised past both Penn State and Harvard on the road to reach the Elite Eight where it eventually fell to national champion Virginia.

In 2008, the Terps established the 'Gold Standard', capturing the program's third national title and winning more games (23) than any other squad in program history. The team also set program-bests in shutouts (15) and consecutive wins (16) as well as registering a Ludwig Field-record crowd of 6,500 in Maryland's bout with then-No. 1 Wake Forest. The 2008 season marked the first time in the Cirovski-era that the Terps won both the NCAA Tournament and the ACC Tournament. To top it off, Cirovski eclipsed long-time head coach Doyle Royal to become Maryland men's soccer winningest coach in a win against Duke on Sept. 19.

For the second straight season, Cirovski's Terps had their fair share of critics in the preseason as Maryland lost two of the top players in the nation in 2007. Maurice Edu, a junior midfielder, was the No. 1 overall pick in the MLS SuperDraft on January 12. He was the second Maryland player to ever be taken with the first pick. Sophomore keeper Chris Seitz also decided to turn to the professional ranks and was chosen No. 4 overall in the SuperDraft. It marked just the fourth time in MLS SuperDraft history that two student-athletes from the same school were selected in the top five.

Even with the loss of arguably the best midfielder and goalkeeper in the country, the Terps finished 10-6-5 and earned a seed in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth straight season. Maryland is the only team in the nation that can claim that feat. The Terps advanced to the third round of the championship and was the only squad to do so every year for the past six seasons.

Despite losing six student-athletes from the national championship team in 2005, Cirovski led the Terps back to the NCAA Tournament in 2006, marking the sixth-straight season that Maryland advanced to the postseason. The Terps advanced to the Sweet Sixteen and finished the season with a 16-5-1 record.

The 2005 championship run did not mark the arrival of the Maryland program, but helped validate its place alongside the nation's elite. In addition to a fourth-straight College Cup appearance, the Terps won the ACC regular season title and posted a 19-4-2 mark. In addition, Cirovski helped mentor Maryland's first Hermann Trophy winner in Jason Garey, who left Maryland as the school's all-time leader in goals (60) and points (140) and was the third pick in the MLS SuperDraft. Cirovski was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in his career, and was the NSCAA National Coach of the Year for the first time in his career as the Terps brought home their first national title since 1968.

Under Cirovski's guidance, the Terps have brought fans out to Ludwig Field in record numbers. Maryland has averaged over 2,000 fans per match in each of the last seven seasons. In 2009, the Terps ranked second nationally in overall attendance and a program-record crowd of 6,946 watched Maryland trump No. 2 North Carolina. Cirovski's efforts to build a winning team that plays an exciting brand of soccer are only matched by his efforts to build Ludwig Field into one of the top soccer venues in the country.

In addition to his leadership on the sidelines, Cirovski is also a leader as the chairman of the men's soccer NSCAA Division I committee. As chairman, Cirovski was the architect in creating the position of NSCAA Program Director, a major triumph for the sport. This position will be the singular voice of college soccer in dealing with NCAA legislative issues, overseeing College Cups and elevating the significance and status of the sport. He was also vital in brokering the television partnership between Fox Soccer Channel and the NSCAA, guaranteeing a weekly spot for college soccer on television.

"Sasho has not only a vision and a passion to improve and promote college soccer but he has the knowledge and the dedication to pursue new ideas," North Carolina head coach Elmar Bolowich said. "His enthusiasm for our sport is infectious and it will unite Division I college coaches to pursue our objectives and achieve them."

Cirovski has brought success to every program he has been a part of. After helping his alma mater, Wisconsin-Milwaukee, to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in a decade as an assistant coach under Bob Gansler, he assumed the top spot at Hartford in 1991. In his two seasons with the Hawks, he took the team to back-to-back 13-6-3 records and consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in school history. He then came to Maryland in 1993 to help resurrect a once-proud program that had been to only one NCAA Tournament in the last 16 years.

Achieving a level of excellence again at Maryland, Cirovski has added the respect of more people than ever for the Terrapins. He has combined an unparalleled ability to motivate and teach with exceptional mastery of technique to become one of the most talented and versatile soccer coaches in the nation. And whether it's on the field or in the classroom, Cirovski's student-athletes give it all they've got, and it shows.

In addition to the accomplishments of his 18-year coaching career with the Terps, Cirovski was also a standout student-athlete himself. He began his career at Wisconsin-Milwaukee where he was a four-year letterwinner. As a senior, he won the Herman Kluge Award for Male Athlete of the Year, and, in 1998, he was inducted into the UWM Athletic Hall of Fame. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1985 and his master's in 1989. He then spent parts of three seasons as a professional player and coach with the teams in the Canadian Soccer League, and the National Professional Soccer League. His first taste of coaching came in 1987 in the Canadian Soccer League.
