FIRST-AND-10...

• The University of Maryland football team renews its boarder rivalry with West Virginia at 3:32 p.m. on Saturday at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore, Md. The Terps are coming off of a 32-21 victory at Connecticut behind 501 yards of total offense. With the win, the Terps improved to 3-0 for the first time since 2001. That year, Maryland won its first seven games of the season en route to a 10-2 record, an ACC championship and a spot in the Orange Bowl. In the Terps' three wins, the offense has totaled over 500 yards each time becoming one of only three schools in the nation to eclipse 500 yards of total offense in as many games. Defensively, the Terps applied constant pressure to UConn quarterback Chandler Whitmer. Maryland sacked Whitmer six times and forced him to throw two interceptions, while holding the Huskies to 25 yards rushing. The six sacks by the Terrapin defense are the most since totaling six against Virginia on Oct. 1, 2005.

• The usual suspects played a major role in the Terps' offensive performance at UConn as Maryland showed good balance with 277 yards passing and 224 yards rushing. Quarterback **C.J. Brown** continues to be a dynamic run-pass threat. Brown threw for 277 yards on 15-of-28 passing and one touchdown, and rushed for a season-high 122 yards and one score. The 399 yards accounted for by Brown is tied for the 19th-highest single-game total in the nation this season and is the most by a Maryland player since Danny O'Brien accounted for 408 total yards against NC State on Nov. 27, 2010. For the second consecutive game, wide receiver **Stefon Diggs**, who ranks 13th nationally in all-purpose yards (176.67), went over 100 yards receiving finishing with five catches for 110 yards and one touchdown. On the score, Diggs took a bubble screen from Brown, and with blocking in front, worked his way into the end zone from 21 yards out. Diggs has at least one receiving touchdown in five of his last seven games played dating back to last season. Wide receivers **Levern Jacobs** and **Deon Long** finished with 60 and 39 yards receiving, respectively. One of Jacobs' two receptions was a career-high 48-yard sprint down the right sideline to set up a **Brad Craddock** field goal just before halftime.

• Maryland's 3-4 defensive scheme consistently applied pressure on Connecticut quarterback Chandler Whitmer totaling a season-high six sacks, forcing two interceptions and holding the Huskies to 25 yards rushing. Through three games, the Terps are holding opponents to 96.7 rushing yards per game, which ranks third in the ACC and is tied for 14th nationally. Despite three Maryland turnovers, including two in the third quarter, the defense held the Huskies to just three points off of those turnovers. Linebacker **Marcus Whitfield**, who leads the nation with 5.5 sacks, led the team with a career-high three sacks. Whitfield's final sack led to a safety as the senior applied pressure off the right side causing an intentional grounding call against Whitmer in the end zone. Whitfield was joined by linebacker **Yannik Cudjoe-Virgil**, who also had a career high with 2.5 sacks. Senior defensive back **Dexter McDougale** had both of the Terrapin interceptions, returning one for his second career touchdown weaving his way through the Huskies offense for a 49-yard score. McDougale's effort earned him Athlon Sports ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors and ACC Defensive Back of the Week. Linebacker **Cole Farrand** led the team in tackles with a personal-best 12.

• Special teams played an important part in the Maryland win. For the first time this season, defensive back **William Likely** was the focal point of the return game. Likely had three kick returns for 110 yards including a long of 45 yards. Place kicker **Brad Craddock** made 3-of-4 field goal attempts including a season-long 40-yard attempt. On the season, the sophomore has made 7-of-8 fieldgoal attempts. Punter **Nathan Renfro** averaged 43.4 yards per attempt on Saturday including two punts downed inside the 20-yard line.

QUICK HITTERS...

• With 501 yards of total offense against Connecticut, Maryland has recorded over 500 yards of total offense in all three games this season. Since the 1983 season, no other Maryland team has eclipsed the 500-yard mark in three or more consecutive games.

• Additionally, Maryland is one of only three teams nationally who have played three games this season to have totaled 500 or more yards of total offense in every contest joining Oregon and California.

• Maryland has had a player rush for over 100 yards and a player with over 100 yards receiving in all three games. Dating back to the 1987 season, no other Terrapins have accomplished the feat in three consecutive games. Quarterback **C.J. Brown** rushed for 105 yards, while wide receiver **Deon Long** had 110 yards receiving in the season opener against FIU. Against ODU, running back **Brandon Ross** totaled 149 rushing yards and wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** had 179 receiving yards. On Saturday, Brown had 122 yards rushing and Diggs totaled 110 yards receiving.

• When linebacker **Marcus Whitfield** forced an intentional grounding call in the end zone on UConn quarterback Chandler Whitmer, the Terps tallied their second safety in as many games. The last time the Terps had two or more safeties in a season came in 1985. Maryland scored a safety against Penn State on Sept. 7 and one against Duke on Oct. 26.

• Wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** has 16 catches for 387 yards to lead the team and is averaging 24.2 yards per catch. His per catch average is the fourth highest nationally among receivers with 10 or more receptions and his 129.0 receiving yards per game average leads the ACC and ranks sixth nationally.

• As part of Maryland's six-sack barrage at UConn, linebacker **Marcus Whitfield** recorded a career-high three, tied with five other players nationally for the most in a single-game this season. In addition, his 5.5 sacks on the year lead the nation. Shawne Merriman had three sacks against North Carolina on Nov. 2, 2002, and was the last Terp to reach that total. Whitfield was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for his effort.

• Led by **Whitfield**, the six sacks totaled by the Maryland defense are the most in a single-game for the Terps since recording the same number on Oct. 1, 2005, against Virginia.

• Senior quarterback **C.J. Brown** accounted for 399 yards of total offense on Saturday (277 pass/122 rush). That mark is tied for the 19th-highest single-game total this season.

• Defensive back **Dexter McDougale** had a career-high two interceptions returning one 49 yards for his second career touchdown. He is the first Maryland player to return an INT for a touchdown since A.J. Hendy returned one 32 yards against NC State on Nov. 26, 2011. His two picks increased his season total to three, which is tied for the most in the nation.

• McDougale's 49-yard interception return for a touchdown is the first non-offensive touchdown for Maryland this season. Since 2009, the Terps have 18 non-offensive touchdowns, that total is the most in the ACC.

• Through three games, Maryland is one of the least penalized teams in the country. The Terps are averaging 2.33 penalties a game, a mark that is tied for fifth nationally. Its seven total penalties have cost Maryland 79 yards, an average of 26.3 yards per game, an average that is the 11th-lowest nationally.

• The Terps have made their mark in the first half so far this season. Maryland has outscored its first three opponents 84-23 in the opening two quarters. The Terps have been particularly strong in the second quarter outscoring the three opponents, 54-10.

• With the 32-21 win on Saturday, Maryland improved to 3-0 for the first times since the 2001 season. That season, the Terps won their first seven games en route to a 10-2 record, an ACC championship and a spot in the Orange Bowl.

• During that seven-game winning streak to open the 2001 season, Maryland's fourth win came at home against West Virginia. The Terps defeated the Mountaineers 32-20.

• Head coach Randy Edsall awarded game balls for the win over Connecticut. Wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** received the award for the offense, defensive back **Dexter McDougale** on defense, and place kicker **Brad Craddock** for special teams.

• Maryland's offense totaled 576 and 587 yards in the first two contests, respectively. It marked the first time since at least the 1982 season that the Terps

have opened the season with back-to-back 500-yard performances.

• The high-octane offense netted 43 points in the season opener against FIU and 47 against Old Dominion. It is the first time in program history the Terps have eclipsed the 40-point plateau in consecutive games to begin the season.

• The 47 points scored by the Terps against the Monarchs is the most points scored by the Terrapins since totaling 51 against East Carolina in the Military Bowl on Dec. 29, 2010.

• Wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** has totaled back-to-back 100-yard receiving games. Diggs is the first Maryland receiver to eclipse 100 yards receiving in consecutive weeks since Torrey Smith in 2010. Smith had 149 rec. yards at West Virginia (9/18) and 159 rec. yards against FIU (9/25). Diggs had a career-

high 179 rec. yards against ODU (9/7) and had 110 at UConn on Saturday.

- After being held to 30 rushing yards in the opener, running back **Brandon Ross** rushed for a career-best 149 yards and one score against Old Dominion. Ross was one yard short of becoming the first Maryland player to rush for 150 yards since C.J. Brown ran for 162 at Clemson (10/15/11).

- The Maryland defense held Old Dominion to 10 points, its lowest offensive output since football returned to the university in 2009 and held 2012 Walter Payton Award winner Taylor Heinicke to a career-low 166 passing yards.

- Maryland had three first-half interceptions against ODU marking the first time the Terrapins had three picks in a game since Nov. 21, 2009, at Florida State.

- A trio of Terrapins recorded their first interceptions against the Monarchs. Defensive back **Isaac Goins'** interception on the opening possession of the game, defensive back **Sean Davis'** pick late in the first quarter, and linebacker **Yannick Ngakoue's** third-and-goal interception early in the second quarter are career firsts.

- Against FIU (8/31), Maryland held the Panthers to just 171 yards of total offense. That's the best total defensive performance since surrendering 115 to Wake Forest on Oct. 30, 2010.

- In addition, the Terps held the Panthers to just 91 yards rushing and 80 yards passing. The last time Maryland held an opponent under 100 yards in both categories came against Morgan State on Sept. 11,

2010. The Terps held the Bears to 37 yards rushing and 48 yards passing.

- The Terrapin defense held FIU to 2.3 yards per rushing attempt. Of the Panthers 15 rushing attempts in the first half, 11 of them went for three yards or less.

- Of the 43 points scored by Maryland against FIU, 40 came in the first half. It is the most points scored in the opening half since the Terps scored 45 against Morgan State on Sept. 11, 2010.

- Against the Panthers, Maryland scored on its first four possessions with two field goals and two touchdowns. The last time the feat was accomplished came against Wake Forest on Oct. 30, 2010.

- Quarterback **C.J. Brown** completed 87 percent of his passes against FIU (20-for-23). With a minimum of 20 attempts, that mark is a single-game program record.

- In addition, with **Caleb Rowe** going 5-for-6, Maryland quarterbacks completed 86.2 percent of their passes, the best performance in team history. The previous record was 83.3 percent at NC State on Nov. 4, 1995.

- Brown threw for three touchdowns and rushed for two accounting for five touchdowns against FIU. That total is the most by a Terrapin since Scott McBrien accounted for six touchdowns against North Carolina on Nov. 1, 2003.

- The Terps should benefit from consistency in the coaching staff this fall. With offensive coordinator **Mike Locksley**, defensive coordinator **Brian Stewart** and special teams coordinator **Andre Powell**, Maryland is one of just 18 FBS programs to retain its entire coaching staff from last season.

- Six bowl teams from last year appear on Maryland's 2013 schedule: West Virginia (New Era Pinstripe Bowl), Florida State (Discover Orange Bowl), Clemson (Chick-Fil-A Bowl), Syracuse (New Era Pinstripe Bowl), Virginia Tech (Russell Athletic Bowl), and North Carolina State (Music City Bowl).

BROWN A THREAT THROUGH THE AIR AND ON THE GROUND...

- After missing all of the 2012 season with an ACL injury, quarterback **C.J. Brown** has made a marvelous return to the playing field. The senior has completed 67.1 percent of his passes (49-of-73) for 833 yards and six touchdowns. In addition, Brown has rushed for five touchdowns in three games. For his career, Brown has accounted for 23 touchdowns, which is tied for 22nd all-time at Maryland.

- At UConn on Saturday, Brown threw for 277 yards on 15-for-28 passing and one touchdown, and rushed for an ACC single-game season-high 122 yards and one touchdown. His 122 yards on the ground, is the seventh-best rushing performance by a quarterback in school history and Brown now holds five of the top 10 rushing performances by a quarterback in school

1...The Maryland defense is ranked No. 1 nationally in sacks with 15. Against Connecticut, the Terps recorded six sacks, the most in a game for Maryland since Oct. 1, 2005 against Virginia.

14...The Maryland defense ranks 14th nationally in rushing defense allowing 96.7 ypg, an average that ranks third in the ACC.

122...Quarterback **C.J. Brown** rushed for a season-high 122 yards against UConn. That total is also highest single-game rushing total in the ACC this season.

363.3...QB **C.J. Brown's** average for total offensive yards after three games. Brown is second in the ACC in total offense and ranks ninth nationally.

937...The program's Academic Progress Rate (APR), which measures eligibility and retention, has trended upward in **Randy Edsall's** two seasons after previously declining for five straight years. The multiyear score has increased from 922 (2009-10) to 931 (2010-11) to 937 (2011-12).

• The senior signal caller accounted for 399 yards of total offense on Saturday. That total is tied for the 19th-highest single-game total in the nation so far this season.

• In addition to his yardage numbers, Brown has been extremely efficient in the pocket. He currently has the 10th-best quarterback efficiency rating (187.4) nationally, second in the ACC, and is on pace to break the Maryland single-season record. Frank Reich holds the Maryland record with an efficiency rating of 147.43 during the 1984 season.

• For the second time this season, Brown threw for over 275 yards and rushed for over 100 yards on Saturday. Prior to this season, a Terrapin quarterback had not achieved that mark since Shaun Hill threw for 323 yards and rushed for 105 yards against Duke on Oct. 20, 2001. For Brown, he threw for 281 yards and rushed for 105 against FIU (8/31) before throwing for 277 yards and rushing for 122 against Connecticut on Saturday.

• Against FIU, Brown completed 20-of-23 passes (.870), a single-game program record with a minimum

of 20 attempts, for 281 yards and three touchdowns. He also rushed for 105 yards and two scores. The five touchdowns Brown accounted for is most by a Maryland player since Scott McBrien accounted for six against North Carolina on Nov. 1, 2003. For his efforts, Brown was named College Football Performance's National Quarterback of the Week.

DIGGS CONTINUES TO BE A BIG PLAY THREAT...

• After an electrifying freshman season, wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** has continued to provide the Maryland offense with a dynamic playmaking threat. The sophomore wideout ranks highly in several categories nationally and within the ACC. After his five-catch, 110-yard performance at UConn on Saturday, Diggs leads the ACC and ranks sixth nationally in receiving yards (387) and also leads the conference and ranks sixth nationally in receiving yards per game (129.0). Additionally, Diggs is averaging 24.2 yards per catch, which leads the ACC and ranks fourth among receivers with 10 or more receptions nationally.

• Diggs has been quarterback **C.J. Brown's** go-to receiver the past two games as the sophomore has gone over 100 yards receiving in the last two contests. Diggs is the first Maryland receiver to eclipse 100 yards receiving in consecutive weeks since Torrey Smith in 2010. Smith had 149 rec. yards at West Virginia (9/18) and 159 rec. yards against FIU (9/25). Diggs had a career-high 179 rec. yards against ODU (9/7) and had 110 at UConn on Saturday. Diggs' 179 yards against the Panthers are the most by a Maryland receiver since Smith had 224 against NC State on Nov. 27, 2010.

• Combined with his work on special teams, Diggs is averaging 176.67 all-purpose yards per game, which ranks 13th nationally, and leads the ACC.

• With 110 yards on Saturday, the sophomore wideout moved up to 18th all-time in career receiving yards with 1,235 and now has 2,426 all-purpose yards, which ranks 20th all-time.

• Maryland's defense has not missed a beat so far this year after replacing six starters off of a unit that ranked 21st in total defense a year ago. The Terps are tied for 17th nationally and tied for fourth in the ACC. The Terps lead the nation in sacks (15) and

on Oct. 1, 2005.

- Including defensive back **Dexter McDougale's** two interceptions against the Huskies, Maryland now has six interceptions on the year already trumping the unit's total from the 2012 season (4). McDougale's last pick resulted in a 49-yard touchdown return for the Terps' first interception return for a touchdown since defensive back **A.J. Hendy** did it against NC State on Nov. 26, 2011. Hendy returned his interception 32 yards.

- The Maryland defense did a terrific job of limiting the costliness of the Terrapin's three turnovers. The Huskies were only able to score three points off of the Maryland miscues.

- Against Old Dominion (9/7), the Terps held the Monarchs to their lowest point total since football was reinstated at the university in 2009 and held quarterback Taylor Heinicke, the 2012 Walter Payton Award winner, to a career-low 166 yards passing as a starter.

- Against FIU (8/31), defensive coordinator **Brian Stewart's** group held the Panthers to 171 total yards of offense marking the first time the Terps held an opponent under 200 yards since holding Wake Forest to 115 on Oct. 30, 2010.

- In addition, the Terps held the Panthers to just 91 yards rushing and 80 yards passing. The last time Maryland held its opponent under 100 yards in both categories came against Morgan State on Sept. 11, 2010. The Terps held the Bears to 37 yards rushing and 48 yards passing.

- The Terrapin defense held FIU to 2.3 yards per rushing attempt. Of the Panthers 15 rushing attempts in the first half, 11 of them went for three or less yards.

- The 10 points scored by the Panthers all came off of turnovers and of FIU's eight first-half possessions six of them ended with three-and-outs.

- The 171 yards of total offense surrendered is the

seventh-best defensive performance since the 2000 season.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

- After totaling three sacks in three seasons in College Park, linebacker **Marcus Whitfield** has become a defensive presense along the Terrapin front seven. The senior from Germantown, Md., doubled his career sack output with three at UConn on Saturday. The three sack outburst is tied for the most by any player nationally this season in a single-game and his final sack of the contest resulted in Maryland's second safety of the season after Huskies' quarterback Chandler Whitmer was called for intentional grounding in the end zone to avoid the on-coming Whitfield. For the season, Whitfield leads the nation with 5.5 sacks.

- Whitfield's counterpart, linebacker **Yannik Cudjoe-Virgil** finished with a career-best 2.5 sacks against the Huskies. He now has 3.5 on the season, which is tied for the seventh-most sacks in the nation.

- In the ACC, Whitfield and Cudjoe-Virgil rank one and two, respectively, in total sacks.

FIRST IMPRESSION...

- Wide receiver **Deon Long** made his debut with the Terps by catching nine passes for 110 yards and a touchdown against FIU. Long became the first Maryland receiver to go over 100 yards receiving since Stefon Diggs finished with 152 at Boston College on Oct. 27, 2012.

- Long's 110 yards receiving are the most yards for a Terrapin wide receiver in a season opener since Kevin Dorsey went for 124 yards against Miami on Sept. 5, 2011.

- In addition, Long is one of only four players to surpass 100 yards receiving in a season opener since 1990. Dorsey had 124 yards against Miami on Sept. 5, 2011, Geroy Simon had 124 at Duke on Sept. 3, 1994, and Frank Wycheck had 106 yards against Virginia Tech on Sept. 1, 1990.

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MARYLAND-WEST VIRGINIA SERIES
HISTORY...

- The Terps and Mountaineers will meet for the 49th time on Saturday, but it's only the second time Maryland and WVU have met at a neutral site. The previous meeting was at Alltel Stadium in Jacksonville, Fla., for the 2003 Gator Bowl, a game won by the Terps 41-7.

- Maryland trails the all-time series with WVU, 21-26-2, and the Mountaineers have won seven straight meetings with the Terps.

- The Terps' last win over the Mountaineers during the regular season also came in 2003 as Maryland defeated WVU, 34-7, in College Park (9/20).

NATIONAL HONORS...

- With his superb performance against FIU, **C.J. Brown** was named College Football Performance's National Quarterback of the Week.

- Brown was joined by two teammates. Wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** and place kicker **Brad Craddock**. Diggs earned Honorable Mention Associated Press Performer of the Week. Diggs had five catches for 98 yards and one touchdown, and returned three kickoffs for 70 yards to finish with 194 all-purpose yards. Craddock earned Honorable Mention Specialist of the Week honors. The sophomore drilled all three of his field goal attempts with a long of 25 yards.

WALK-ONS REWARDED...

- On Aug. 25, head coach Randy Edsall announced that he would award four walk-ons scholarships for the 2013-14 academic year for their hard work,

dedication and commitment to the football program. The four walk-ons that earned scholarships for the season are: redshirt freshman offensive lineman Michael Dunn, senior offensive lineman G.T. Harraka, senior defensive back Tony Perry and senior wide receiver Regis Whittington. "That is something that is always very, very special to do and again knowing that those young men have worked extremely hard," said head coach Randy Edsall. Michael has earned himself a starting job, and the others have been in the program a number of years, working out there each and everyday, and to have the opportunity to do that is really special."

TALENT AT THE SKILL POSITIONS...

- Unlike last season, where the Terps needed to replace their leading rusher and second-leading receiver, Maryland returns three of its top five rushers and its leading receiver in **Stefon Diggs** this fall. **Brandon Ross** and **Albert Reid** will be the Terps one-two punch in the backfield. Ross led all rushers with 390 yards on 85 carries with one touchdown. The sophomore from Newark, Del., excelled at the end of last season taking over the starting role for the final three contests and rushing for 100 yards or more in two of those games. After totaling 100 yards against Clemson on Nov. 10, Ross rushed for a season-high 141 yards at North Carolina (11/24). Ross solidified his hold on the starting spot with an impressive spring camp that included a 122-yard performance in the spring game. Reid began last season as the starter and also enjoyed a solid spring and rushed for 135 yards in the spring game. **Joe Riddle** and **Jacquille Veii** will push for time and add competitiveness to the position. Riddle redshirted the 2012 season, while Veii has been impressive in preseason camp.
- After a record-setting freshman campaign, Diggs will continue to be a play-making threat at wide receiver. Diggs set a single-season ACC freshman record for all-purpose yards per game last season, averaging 172.4, a number that ranked eighth nationally. The six-foot, 195-pound wideout also finished with 848 yards receiving, a single-season Maryland record and the third most by a ACC rookie all-time. Diggs also hauled in 54 receptions and six touchdowns, a Maryland single-season freshman record. The addition of five-star recruit and junior-college transfer **Deon Long** will bolster the unit. Long, who spent last season at Iowa Western, earned first team All-America honors while leading the NJCAA in receptions (100), receiving yards (1,625) and touchdowns (25). **Nigel King**, who appeared in all 12 games and started three of the final four, provides a big, physical presence to the receiving corp. King finished with nine catches for 129 yards and a touchdown last season. He recorded a season-high four catches for 72 yards in the season finale at North Carolina. **Levern Jacobs** has received extensive work with the first-team offense during preseason camp. Jacobs appeared in 11 games last season and totaled 50

yards on seven receptions. Special teams standout **Tyrek Cheeseboro** along with **Amba Etta-Tawo** and **Malcolm Culmer** will compete for playing time along with highly-touted freshman **Taivon Jacobs**. Two-year starter **Tyler Cierski** returns at fullback. The 255-pound junior saw action in 11 games, seeing time on special teams as well. Redshirt freshman **Kenneth Goins** and freshman **Andrew Stefanelli** will back up Cierski.

BROWN BACK UNDER CENTER...

- After missing last season with a knee injury sustained in preseason camp, senior **C.J. Brown** is back under center for the Terps. A dual-threat quarterback, Brown set a Maryland single-season rushing record (574) for a quarterback and threw for 842 yards in 10 games (five starts). Brown boasts four of the top 10 rushing performances by a quarterback in school history including his record-setting 162-yard performance against Clemson on October 15, 2011.
- While sitting out with the ACL injury, Brown spent last season learning offensive coordinator **Mike Locksley's** system, which provided a different perspective. "It was good to be able to step back from the game and kind of see things from a different angle, a different perspective, and have a better appreciation for the game as well as developing more knowledge of the offense," said Brown.
- After suffering the second season-ending injury of his career prior to last season, Brown applied for and was awarded with a sixth year of eligibility in April. Brown redshirted in 2009 before playing in one game in 2010, when he fractured his right shoulder and missed the season's final 11 games. He will have eligibility for the 2013 and 2014 seasons.
- Behind Brown, the Terps have a number of able signal-callers. Sophomores **Perry Hills** and **Caleb Rowe** both gained experience last season, with Hills starting the first seven games and throwing for 1,336 yards before suffering a season-ending knee injury. Rowe played in two games, including a start at Boston College, before also suffering a season-ending knee injury. Transfer **Ricardo Young** gives the Terps another dual-threat and gained experience while serving as the No. 1 QB during spring camp. Young was the 2010 Washington D.C. Gatorade Player of the Year out coming out of H.D. Woodson High School, but has yet to take a snap in college after stops at Virginia Tech (2010) and New Mexico (2011).

YOUTH IS SERVED AT TIGHT END...

- The tight end position will feature several new faces after the departure of three seniors last season. **Dave Stinebaugh** is the veteran of the group. Though a senior, Stinebaugh has missed the majority of the last three seasons due to knee and shoulder injuries. In 2012, Stinebaugh appeared in 11 of 12 games mostly on special teams and is atop the two-deep to start the season. Four freshmen are fighting for playing time

behind Stinebaugh with **P.J. Gallo** earning the nod on the depth chart. **Andrew Isaacs**, a two-time all-state and all-conference selection, provides an imposing target and will compete with **Derrick Hayward**, m **Brian McMahon** and **Eric Roca** for playing time.

CONSISTENCY ON THE O-LINE...

- The Terps utilized four different starting rotations along the offensive line in 2012. As a result, Maryland enters the campaign with six players who have starting experience including returning starters **Mike Madaras**, **De'Onte Arnett** and **Sal Conaboy**. Joining them on the two-deep is center **Evan Mulrooney** and right guard **Andrew Zeller**. As a group, the returnees have 38 starts combined. But throughout preseason camp, head coach Randy Edsall strived to find the five best players regardless of position. As a result, sophomore **Ryan Doyle** has moved to the right side of the line and is slated to start at right tackle. Doyle will be joined on the right side by redshirt freshman **Michael Dunn** at right guard. Junior **Jake Wheeler** is penciled in at left tackle behind Madaras, while junior-college transfer **Silvano Altamirano** will slide in behind behind Arnett. Mulrooney will slot in behind Conaboy at center with Zeller backing up Dunn at right guard and freshman **Moise Larose** backing up Doyle at right tackle.

NEW LOOK D-LINE...

- Maryland will have to replace two stalwarts along the defensive line after the graduation of All-American Joe Vellano and A.J. Francis, a pair which combined to start 72 games in their careers. Junior nose tackle **Darius Kilgo** is the lone returning starter and after a solid season in 2012, has stepped into a leadership position, representing the defensive line on Maryland's newly-formed leadership council. After battling injuries last season, junior **Keith Bowers** hopes to return to his 2011 form, when he was an honorable mention freshman All-America selection. Sophomore **Quinton Jefferson**, one of the top defensive end prospects nationally coming out of high school, has secured the other end position after an impressive spring and will be backed up by **Roman Braglio**. Behind Kilgo, **Nate Clarke** provides depth, while 2011 freshman All-American **Andre Monroe** and **Alex Walker** are listed as the backups behind Bowers.
- The defensive line's depth received a boost with the arrival of **Zeke Riser**. A graduate transfer, Riser joined the Terps just prior to the start of fall camp and brings a familiarity with the defensive system having played for defensive coordinator **Brian Stewart** in 2010 and 2011 at Houston.

REVAMPED LINEBACKING CORPS...

- Similar to the defensive line, Maryland will be faced with replacing several stalwarts in the linebacking

corps, though a new crop of talented playmakers is ready to step in. Perhaps one of the deepest positions on the team, the Terps have a first and second unit established despite the loss of Demetrius Hartsfield, Kenneth Tate and Darin Drakeford. On the inside, **Cole Farrand** and **L.A. Goree** give Maryland a pair of established veterans to help direct the unit. Farrand tied for the team lead in tackles as a sophomore last season, his first as a starter, while making six tackles for loss and forcing three fumbles. Goree was one of the most consistent players on defense during the stretch last year. He totaled double-digit tackles in the final three games including a career-best 14 against North Carolina and averaged 12.3 tackles per game in his three starts. Behind Farrand is sophomore **Shawn Petty**, who has moved back to his natural position after starting the final four games at quarterback last season. Redshirt freshman and former four-star recruit **Abner Logan** will be ready to step in behind Goree.

- Converted safety **Matt Robinson**, healthy after battling injuries in each of the last two seasons, solidified one of the outside linebacker positions with a strong fall camp with depth provided by **Alex Twine**. Senior **Marcus Whitfield** is penciled in as the starter at the other outside spot, and will be pushed by **Yannik Cudjoe-Virgil**. The transfer from Seton Hall University impressed the coaching staff during fall camp with his high motor and quickness off of the edge.

EXPERIENCED SECONDARY...

- The secondary should be Maryland's most stable unit as it returns cornerbacks **Dexter McDougle** and **Jeremiah Johnson**, and safeties **Anthony Nixon**, **Sean Davis** and **A.J. Hendy**. Maryland ranked 30th nationally in passing defense a year ago, allowing just 207.5 yards per game through the air, third best in the ACC. This season the unit adds talented freshman **William Likely** in addition to the aforementioned group. Likely, who enrolled in classes in January, impressed in spring practice and throughout preseason camp. McDougle and Johnson, though, have the potential to be one of the better defensive back duos in the ACC. McDougle, who has played in 25 consecutive games, led all defensive backs with 71 tackles last year including a team-best 58 solo stops. Meanwhile, Johnson had a team-high eight pass breakups, a total which tied for 18th in the ACC. Senior **Isaac Goins** will also be in the mix at corner behind McDougle.

- Last year, Nixon played in all 12 games with five starts and led all freshmen on the team with 41 tackles including 26 solo stops. The Pittsburgh native also had one interception, three passes defended and two fumble recoveries and will start opposite of Davis, who edged out Hendy in preseason camp for the starting spot. Davis played in all 12 games with two starts as a true freshman last year. Hendy was somewhat limited last season due to a nagging ankle

injury, but played in nine games as a freshman in 2011 and averaged 8.3 tackles per game in his three starts. The 205-pound junior will still see significant playing time particularly in dime package and on special teams. Sophomore **Undray Clark** will be in the mix behind Nixon.

SPECIAL TEAMS REPEAT...

- After entering last season with few known quantities, the Terps hope the return of all their special teams performers from 2012, combined with the addition of several new playmakers, makes for more stability in the unit in 2013. Rising sophomores **Brad Craddock** and **Nathan Renfro** are expected to anchor the kicking game, with Craddock handling kickoff and place-kicking duties and Renfro handling the punting. **Stefon Diggs** was a constant threat in the return game last season, returning two kickoffs for touchdowns and averaging 10 yards per return on punts. Freshman **William Likely** adds another speedy option to the return game.

ALL-PURPOSE PERFORMER...

- Stefon Diggs** had a record-breaking freshman season a year ago, setting the ACC Freshman All-Purpose Yardage record by averaging 172.4 per game, a mark which also ranked eighth nationally. Until recently, it was a mark that hadn't been broken in more than 20 years; Robert Lavette of Georgia Tech set the previous record of 142.0 yards per game in

COACHING STAFF AT A GLANCE...

• **Mike Locksley** was hired in December 2011 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Locksley, a native of Washington, D.C., returned to Maryland after previously spending six years (1997-2002) as an assistant coach on the Terrapins staff. A veteran coach with over 20 years experience, Locksley most recently spent four years (2005-08) as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for the University of Illinois and two-plus years (2009-2011) as head coach at the University of New Mexico. Locksley helped the Fighting Illini offense improve from No. 86 nationally in total offense (338.1 yards per game) in 2005 to No. 19 (438.3 yards per game) in 2008. The Illinois offense ranked in the top 10 nationally (No. 10 in 2006; No. 5 in 2007) in rushing yards. Known for strong recruiting skills, Locksley was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com.

• **Brian Stewart** was hired in January 2012 as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach. In his first season in College Park, Stewart's unit improved 87 spots in the national rankings for total defense, moving from No. 108 in 2011 to No. 21 in 2012. In addition, the Terrapin defense finished the 2012 season ranked third in total defense in the ACC. A former NFL defensive coordinator, Stewart recently completed a successful two-year stint with the Houston Cougars, who ended 2011 with a 13-1 record and a No. 14 ranking in the final USA Today poll. The Cougars had one of the best defenses in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2011, ranking in the top 15 in five categories: red-zone scoring (second – 67 percent), interceptions (t-third – 21), tackles for loss (sixth – 7.7 per game), turnovers gained (t-10th – 31) and opponent passing efficiency (12th – 111.75 rating). Houston also improved from 96th nationally in scoring defense (32.2 points per game) in 2010 to 35th (22.4) this past year. Stewart went to Houston after an eight-year run as an NFL assistant, including two years (2007-08) as the defensive coordinator with Dallas.

• **Andre Powell** is in his second season as special-

teams coordinator, in addition to his running back chores. Powell was a special-teams coordinator during each of his last two stops – Clemson (2007-10) and North Carolina (2001-06). He handled both running backs and special-teams duties the final three seasons at each job.

• Defensive line coach **Greg Gattuso** was elevated to assistant head coach prior to last season. The former head coach of Duquesne (1992-2004), Gattuso spent six seasons (2005-2010) as the defensive line coach at Pittsburgh. Two of Gattuso's recent pupils, A.J. Francis and Joe Vellano, signed with the Miami Dolphins and New England Patriots, respectively, in 2013.

• The rest of the staff remains in tact, with **Tom Brat-tan** entering his 13th season coaching the offensive line, **Lyndon Johnson** entering his third year on staff and second overseeing both outside linebacker positions (Sam and Will), while **Lee Hull** entering his sixth season coaching the wide receivers, **Keith Dudzinski** entering his third year coaching the inside linebackers and **John Dunn** entering his third year coaching the tight ends and serving as the recruiting coordinator.

• This offseason, Maryland established a leadership council for the 2013 season. RANDY EDSALL

Head Coach
Syracuse '80 • Third Year

Randy Edsall enters his third season as head football coach at the University of Maryland, leading a program that continues to make great strides both on and off the field.

Edsall was named the 34th coach in Maryland football history in January 2011. Since taking over, Edsall and his staff have placed a great emphasis on recruiting the local Maryland/Washington, D.C. market which is heavily recruited by schools across the nation and is considered a football hotbed. The result of this focus was the signing of 22 athletes, 14 from the area. Edsall and his staff have recruited classes ranked in the top 35 nationally by Rivals the last two years, including the 31st overall in 2013.

In addition, under Edsall's command and following a pattern he started at the University of Connecticut, the football program's Athletic Progress Rate (APR) moved significantly upward after a five year decline. The football team's APR, which measures eligibility and retention, increased its multi-year score from 922 (2009-2010) to 937 and its single year score from 905 to 948. The football team's cumulative GPA has risen each semester since Edsall took over the program.

The Maryland program continued to improve in 2012, a year in which they played 15 true freshmen (third most in the Football Bowl Subdivision). The defensive unit finished the season ranked second in the ACC and 21st in the nation in total defense (336.8 ypg), second in the ACC and 26th nationally against the run (129.3 ypg) and third in the ACC and 32nd nationally in pass defense (207.5 ypg). The Terrapins also held five of their opponents under 100 rushing yards.

On the offensive side of the ball, injuries forced the Terrapins to play four different quarterbacks, including three true freshmen and a converted linebacker. Edsall and his staff utilized the talents of a young group of offensive standouts. True freshman Stefon Diggs led the team with 54 receptions for 848 yards (15.7 ypc), the most ever by a Maryland freshman. Diggs also caught six touchdowns and was named ACC Rookie of the Week three times. Maryland also rotated carries among a talented group of backs, with four different players earning a start. Redshirt freshman Brandon Ross set career highs, rushing for at least 100 yards in two of the final three games, including 141 yards in the final contest at North Carolina.

Prior to coming to College Park, Edsall, a native of nearby Glen Rock, Pa, spent twelve seasons coaching the University of Connecticut Huskies where he took the program from FCS (formerly I-AA) to five bowl games, including a BCS bowl. The 2010 Big East Coach of the Year led the Huskies to a 33-19 record

over his last four seasons there, including two bowl victories and his leadership resulted in UConn being the first program ever to go from FBS newcomer to BCS bowl participant in just seven seasons.

Edsall departed UConn as the school's all-time leader in career wins (74) and most games coached (144). He was a two-time recipient of the prestigious Bowl Championship Division Head Coach of the Year in New England by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston (2007, 2010).

During his tenure at UConn, the Huskies finished in the top twenty nationally for total offense twice (2003, 2004) and total defense three times (2002, 2005, 2008). Under Edsall's guidance Connecticut defeated teams from the ACC, Big Ten, Big East, Big 12, Conference USA and the SEC.

In 2007, as Edsall continued to grow the program to prominence, the Huskies earned their first-ever national rankings peaking at #13 in the BCS standings in November. That year they became just the second Big East team ever to go 7-0 at home and defeat three teams at home that were ranked in the top ten during the season.

Off the field, just as he is doing at Maryland, Edsall's teams were strong in the classroom as well. In 2007, 2008 and 2009 UConn was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its high graduation rate. In 2003 UConn was the only public Division I-A school to graduate at least 90% of its football players and in 2005, it was one of only eight schools to both graduate 70% and win a bowl game.

When Edsall was named the head coach at Connecticut on December 21, 1998 he brought 19 years of coaching experience with him. He earned the job at Connecticut after a year as the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech where the 14th ranked Yellow Jackets went 9-2.

Prior to his season at Georgia Tech Edsall spend three seasons under two-time Super Bowl Champion coach Tom Coughlin as the secondary coach for the NFL Jacksonville Jaguars. During his time in Jacksonville the expansion Jaguars reached the playoffs twice, including a berth in the 1996 AFC Championship Game.

Edsall began his coaching career in 1980 at his alma mater, Syracuse University. The former quarterback at Syracuse started as a graduate assistant (1980-82) before joining the staff in 1983 overseeing the running backs under head coach Dick MacPherson. Edsall oversaw the running backs for three years (1983-84 and 1986) and oversaw the tight ends in 1985 before making the switch to defense.

He coached the Syracuse defensive backs from 1987-90 and during that time the Orangemen were ranked among the Division I-A leaders in pass defense. After the 1990 season Tom Coughlin, then coach of Boston College, hired Edsall to coach the defensive backs at BC.

Edsall was a three-year letter winner in football, basketball and baseball at Susquehannock High School (Pa.) and was an all-state selection in all three sports as a senior which led to induction into the York Area Sports Hall of Fame.

At Syracuse he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Syracuse in 1980 and a master's degree in health and physical education in 1982.

Edsall and his wife, Eileen met at Syracuse University where she was a basketball and volleyball standout who was later inducted into the Syracuse University Hall of Fame. They have a daughter, Alexi and a son, Corey.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - C.J. Brown celebrated his return from injury with a marvelous performance, throwing for three touchdowns and running for two scores to lead Maryland over Florida International.

Brown missed all of last year after tearing his left ACL in preseason practice. The senior made up for lost time during a torrid first half, completing 15 of 16 passes and running for 99 yards to help the Terrapins go up 40-10.

Brown finished 20 for 23 for 281 yards passing and ran for 105 yards on 11 carries before being removed in the third quarter. His touchdown runs were 29 and 11 yards, and he threw for scores of 25, 17 and 66 yards.

FIU gave up 399 yards before halftime and managed only 59 yards and three first downs over the opening 30 minutes.

The Maryland offense amassed 576 yards and the only scores against the defense came after turnovers.

Maryland moved 50 yards on its first possession before Brad Craddock made a short field goal. Sam Miller fumbled the subsequent kickoff, setting up another field goal for a 6-0 lead.

Florida International's first score came when Sergio Sroka kicked a 32-yard field goal after Maryland William Likely mis-handled a punt.

Brown answered with a 29-yard touchdown run around left end, the final play of an 86-yard drive in which Diggs ran for 26 yards with a pitch from Brown off the option.

On the first snap of the second quarter, Brown put a nice touch on a 25-yard toss to Long in the right side of the end zone, making it 20-3.

Later, Brown fumbled in the pocket and FIU recovered on the Maryland 25. That led to a 1-yard run on fourth down by fullback Lamarq Caldwell.

Brown quickly made amends. He ran for 64 yards around left end before lofting a 17-yard touchdown pass to Kenneth Goins to put Maryland up 26-10.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - C.J. Brown threw for two touchdowns and ran for two, Brandon Ross rushed for 149 yards and Maryland capitalized on three interceptions in a 47-10 rout of Old Dominion.

Brown directed touchdown drives of 77, 46, 97 and 80 yards to stake the Terrapins (2-0) to a 31-3 halftime lead. Ross had 126 yards rushing during a first half in which Maryland amassed 392 yards and 20 first downs.

The fifth-year senior completed 14 of 22 passes for 275 yards and ran four times for 30 yards in three quarters of work.

Stefon Diggs caught six passes for 179 yards and a touchdown for Maryland.

Old Dominion (0-2) compiled 335 yards in offense but didn't get in the end zone until Cam Boyd scored on a 3-yard run with 5:05 left. Taylor Heinicke went 18 for 34 for 166 yards before being removed late in the third quarter.

After throwing an interception on the opening drive to set up a Maryland field goal, Heinicke took the Monarchs 66 yards in 10 rapid-fire plays to set up a field goal.

The Terrapins went up 10-3 on a 5-yard run by Ross, and the next series started with Heinicke getting sacked for a 16-yard loss. Two plays later, Sean Davis picked off a third-down pass.

Brown then completed a 41-yard pass to Diggs before running it from the 5 for a 17-3 lead.

Early in the second quarter, ODU had a third-and-goal at the Maryland 2 before Yannick Ngakoue intercepted a deflected pass.

The frenzied pace was interrupted by a couple of punts before Brown directed a nine-play, 97-yard drive that featured six runs by Ross and ended with Diggs grabbing a short pass, high-stepping along the right sideline and diving into the end zone with a somersault for a 41-yard touchdown.

Minutes later, backup running back Albert Reid scored on a 27-yard run to make it 31-3.
