- 10 ... Since 2002 Maryland has won 110 of the 119 games in which the Terps have scored 10 or more goals for a .924 winning percentage.
- 9 ... Maryland is 128-27 in games since 2002 when it allows nine goals or less, for an .826 winning percentage.
- 8 ... Niko Amato's .572 save percentage ranks eighth in the NCAA.
- 7 ... The Terps rank among the Top 10 in seven team statistics according to the NCAA.
- 6 ... Six Maryland freshmen have combined to score 53 goals this season.

**FACING OFF**

**#7 TERPS WRAP UP REGULAR SEASON WITH SENIOR DAY VS. NAVY**

- The No. 7 Maryland men's lacrosse team closes out its regular season slate by hosting Navy on Saturday, May 3, at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium. Faceoff is scheduled for 1 p.m.
- The game will mark the final regular season game for nine Terrapin seniors: **Tyler Adelsberger, Niko Amato, Rustin Bryant, Emmett Cahill, Mike Chanenchuk, Brian Cooper, Michael Ehrhardt, Thomas Guarino and Quinn Haley**. This senior class has a four-year record of 45-18 (.714), won an ACC championship and competed for another one, made it to two NCAA Final Fours and played in two NCAA championship games.
- The game is the fourth of five that are scheduled to be broadcast live on TerpsTV, which is a subscription service that offers exclusive video and audio content for numerous Maryland athletic events. The service is available for an annual subscription price of \$79.95, a four-month subscription of \$29.95 or a monthly subscription of \$9.95 per month.
- The game between the Terps and the Midshipmen can also be heard on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network's flagship station, CBS Sports Radio 1300 AM in Baltimore and surrounding areas. Steve Stofberg (Maryland '94), the voice of Terrapin lacrosse, will handle the play-by-play, while 2004 All-American Tim McGinnis provides the analysis.
- Maryland is 10-4 following its 6-5 loss to Notre Dame in the ACC Semifinals on April 25. Senior **Mike Chanenchuk** continues to lead the team this season with 44 points on 28 goals and 16 assists. He is followed by freshman **Matt Rambo**, who has 29 points on 24 goals and five assists. Junior **Charlie Raffa** has won 142-of-212 (.670) faceoffs this season, which ranks third in the nation, with a team-best 89 groundballs. Senior **Michael Ehrhardt** has made a seamless transition to the long-stick midfield spot and has 47 groundballs, which leads all non-faceoff men, and a team-best 24 caused turnovers to go along with two goals and an assist. Senior **Niko Amato** has started every game of his college career (63 straight) and boasts a 7.27 goals-against average (4th in the NCAA) with a .573 save percentage (8th in the NCAA) this season.
- Navy is 4-9 on the season following a 10-6 loss at Lehigh in the Patriot League tournament quarterfinals on April 22. Senior attackman Sam Jones leads the Mids' offense with 41 points on 23 goals and 18 assists. Sophomore John Connors has started all 13 games in net and has an 8.98 goals-against average with a .540 save percentage. Freshman Brady Dove has won 158-of-270 draws for a .585 winning percentage with 80 groundballs.

**GAME NOTES**

**COACHING MATCH-UP**

- John Tillman** is in his seventh season as a head coach, and fourth with the Terps, with a 65-37 career record for a 63.7 winning percentage. Tillman is 45-18 (.714) as Maryland's head coach. He had a 20-19 record in three seasons as the head coach at Harvard.
- Rick Sowell is in his third season as the head coach of Navy and has a 13-26 (.333) record coaching the Mids. Overall, he is in his 15th season as a head coach with a record of 99-106 (.482).
- Tillman has a 3-0 career record against Navy, with the 2011, 2012 and 2013 meetings as the Terps' head coach being the only decisions. He has a 5-0 record vs. Sowell-coached teams, having won both meetings vs. Sowell's Stony Brook teams while Tillman was at Harvard.

**ANNAPOLIS, Md.** - Six Terps registered multiple points, including a game-high four by junior Mike Chanenchuk, to lead the No. 1 University of Maryland men's lacrosse team to an 11-8 victory at Navy Friday night in front of 6,961 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

The Terrapins are now 8-1 on the season, marking the program's best record through nine games since 2004. The Midshipmen fall to 3-8 with the defeat. Maryland has now won four-straight in the series with Navy.

Maryland got on the board quickly, just 43 seconds into the game when senior John Haus found senior Jake Bernhardt in the left alley and Bernhardt ripped a shot into the net for a 1-0 lead.

Haus was on the other end of the Terps' second goal, taking a feed from senior Owen Blye in the right alley and stepped into a shot that beat Navy goalie Nolan Hickey to make it a 2-0 lead with 7:13 left in the first.

The lead grew to 3-0 at the 6:47 mark when sophomore Joe LoCascio dodged down the left alley and laced a shot into the upper right corner.

Navy started the second quarter with a two-man advantage with penalties on Maryland's Matt Dunn and Jesse Bernhardt and Tucker Hull gave the Mids their first goal of the game just 16 seconds into the second.

That goal started a five-goal run that gave the Midshipmen a 5-3 lead with 8:34 left in the second. T.J. Hanzsche scored the second and fifth goals of the run, while Sam Jones put in goals three and four for Navy.

The Navy scoring run ended just as it began, with a penalty, except this time it was the Terps converting on the extra-man opportunity. Hanzsche was called for a push at the 7:55 mark and Chanenchuk made a good look inside to find Haus on the crease and Haus slipped a shot past Hickey to pull the Terps to within a goal with 7:26 left in the second.

Maryland tied the game at 5-5 less than three minutes later with a transition opportunity that started when sophomore Casey Ikeda stripped Navy's Gabe Voumard. Haus scooped up the groundball and started the break. Sophomore Jay Carlson got the ball on the left side of the crease, but moved it on to senior Kevin Cooper, who scored easily to tie the game.

Navy opened up the second half with an unassisted goal by Bryce Dabbs less than two minutes into the third, but Maryland tied the game at 6-6 when Chanenchuk slipped a slick pass into Blye on the crease with 11:50 to play, which was the beginning of a 5-0 scoring spurt for the Terps.

The Terps regained the lead for the first time since the Mids tied the game at 3-3 with 11:29 left in the second quarter when they converted on their second extra-man chance of the night. Senior Billy Gribbin found Chanenchuk at the top of the formation and Chanenchuk scored on a big top-shelf shot to give Maryland a 7-6 lead with 10:03 to go in the third.

Maryland's extra-man unit poured in its third goal of the game to give the Terps an 8-6 lead at the 3:17 mark. This time it was Gribbin hitting a shot from the right wing off of a feed from Blye.

The Terps opened the fourth quarter with another inside goal as Cooper found Carlson on the crease to make it a 9-6 Maryland lead.

Maryland's lead was upped to 10-6 with an unassisted goal by Cooper. He split a double-team and managed to get a shot past Hickey inside the near post with 7:30 left to play.

Navy ended the 5-0 Terrapin run with an unassisted goal by Pat Durkin with 5:59 left on the clock, but Chanenchuk made it a four-goal lead once again when he hit on a runner down the right alley 49 seconds later.

The Mids trimmed the Maryland lead back to three when Dabbs scored his second of the game with 4:21 remaining, but that would all Navy could muster and the Terps were able to pull out the victory.

Sophomore Charlie Raffa dominated the faceoff X, winning 14-of-21 draws with seven groundballs. Senior long pole Jesse Bernhardt led the Maryland defense with six groundballs to go along with one caused turnover.

Junior goalie Niko Amato finished with six saves for the Terps, while Hickey was credited with 15 for the Mids.

- With today's 11-8 win, Maryland is now 54-33-1 all-time vs. Navy.
- With three points on two goals and an assist, senior John Haus now has 25 multi-point and 13 multi-goal games for his career.
- With three points on two goals and an assist, senior Kevin Cooper now has 18 multi-point and nine multi-goal games for his career.
- With three points on a goal and two assists, senior Owen Blye now has 29 multi-point and 12 multi-assist games for his career.
- With four points on two goals and two assists, junior Mike Chanenchuk now has 23 multi-point, 16 multi-goal and six multi-assist games for his career.
- With two points on a goal and an assist, sophomore Jay Carlson now has 10 multi-point games for his career.
- With two points on a goal and an assist, senior Billy Gribbin now has 11 multi-point games for his Maryland career.

## SERIES HISTORY VS. NAVY

- The Maryland-Navy rivalry is the second-longest in Terrapin lacrosse history with Maryland holding a 54-33-1 advantage, dating to 1924. The 54 wins are the second-highest number of victories Maryland has against any team. Maryland has defeated Duke 62 times.
- Maryland has won 16 of the last 21 meetings. Prior to Maryland's current four-game winning streak in the series, the Mids had won five of the previous six meetings.
- When Navy and Maryland get together it's fair to assume it is going to be a close game. During the past 33 meetings, 17 have ended with a winning margin of one or two goals, including four straight 6-5 Terp victories from 1999-2002.
- The 2013 meeting saw six Terps put up multiple-point games, including a four-point effort on two goals and two assists by junior **Mike Chanenchuk**, in Maryland's 11-8 win over Navy on April 5 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. Sophomore **Charlie Raffa** dominated the faceoff X, winning 14-of-21 draws with seven groundballs.
- The 2012 game was tied at 5-5 late in the second quarter, but Maryland scored eight of the game's final nine goals to earn a 13-6 victory over Navy at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium on April 6. Senior Joe Cummings led the Terps with five points on three goals and two assists, while Owen Blye, Billy Gribbin and Drew Snider each chipped in two goals apiece. Curtis Holmes won 15-of-20 faceoffs with seven groundballs for the Terrapins.
- The 2011 meeting saw the Terps outscore the Mids 6-1 in the first quarter en route to a 10-4 victory at a rain-soaked Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis. A balanced-scoring attack was led by long pole Brian Farrell, midfielder Jake Bernhard and attackman Owen Blye, who each scored two goals. Leading the defense was Max Schmidt with three caused turnover and two groundballs. Dan Burns and Curtis Holmes also finished with three groundballs. Redshirt freshman goalie **Niko Amato** finished the game with four saves. Aiding in the defensive effort was another solid face-off effort from Holmes, who won 10-of-18 draws.
- In 2010 the Terps got back on the winning side of the ledger with an 11-9 home win. The attack unit of Grant Catalino, Travis Reed and Ryan Young combined for eight goals and five assists to pace the Terps. Maryland dominated the Mids when the ball was on the ground, winning the groundball battle 47-26. Brian Farrell and Max Schmidt led the way for the Terps with five groundballs each. Brian Phipps finished the afternoon with 10 saves, to go along with four groundballs
- The one-goal game streak came to an end with a one-sided 10-4 Navy victory in Annapolis in 2009. Will Yeatman and Ryan Young scored two goals apiece for the Terps, but that was all the offense could muster. Maryland had a 2-1 lead after the first quarter, but Navy outscored the Terps 6-0 in the second and third quarters combined to take control of the game.
- The run of one-goal games was pushed to four in 2008 with a game that could have been dubbed "A Tale of Two Halves." The Mids scored all five of their goals in the first half, while the Terps did the same in the second half, but could only muster four scores to give Navy a 5-4 decision. Jason Carter was tremendous in the second half for Maryland in cage, stopping six Navy shots. Offensively the Terps were led by Dan Groot and Max Ritz, who each had a goal and an assist and Ryan Young, who had a pair of assists.
- In a double-overtime thriller on April 6, 2007 in Annapolis the Terps pulled out a miraculous 8-7 win over the Mids, thanks in large part to three tremendous individual efforts. All-America defender Ray Megill provided the initial spark, getting the Terrapins back in the game after the Mids went on a three-goal run to build a two-goal lead. Megill took his first-ever collegiate face-off, won the ball clean and scored to cut the Navy advantage to one. Navy maintained a one-goal lead as the seconds dwindled down. As the clock neared 0:00, junior midfielder Drew Evans laced a low-to-high shot from 16 yards to send the game into overtime. After the game went to a second OT, sophomore midfielder Dan Groot snapped Navy's three-game winning streak with a tough shot from the left alley.
- The one-goal games continued in 2006 as the Mids pulled out a 7-6 victory at Byrd Stadium on April 8. The game, which was scheduled for April 7, was pushed back a day due to a large thunderstorm. It was another last-second goal that lifted Navy to the win over the Terps. This time it was attackman Ian Dingman scoring the game-winner with just eight seconds left in the game. Joe Walters scored a pair of goals for Maryland, while Bill McGlone, Max Ritz, Dan Groot and Xander Ritz scored the remaining Maryland goals.
- The 2005 game was another of those one-goal affairs as the Mids and Terps battled into the game's final seconds before Navy emerged with a 9-8 win on Graham Gill's game-winning goal with 14 seconds left in the contest.
- The most goals the Terps have ever scored on the Mids in a single game came in 1998's 21-7 Maryland victory.
- Maryland has also won all four meetings in the NCAA Tournament. The Terps captured their last national championship in 1975 with a 20-13 win over Navy. Maryland also defeated Navy in NCAA semifinal games in 1971, 1976 and 1979.

## GET TO 10 AND WIN

- One axiom of lacrosse is that if you score 10 goals or more your chances of winning are pretty good. Well, a look at the results since 2002 shows that when Maryland scores 10 or more goals there's not just a pretty good chance the Terrapins will win; it's an almost certainty. Since 2002 Maryland has won 110 of the 119 games in which the Terps have scored 10 or more goals for a .924 winning percentage.
- Maryland scored 10, but fell at North Carolina, 11-10, on March 24, 2012 and again came out on the losing end, despite scoring 11 in a 13-11 loss at Colgate on May 5, 2012. The Terps scored 11 vs. Johns Hopkins on April 16, 2011, but the Blue Jays won the game in overtime, 12-11. On April 3 of last season the Terps lost to No. 1 Virginia by a final of 11-10, giving Maryland its only loss when scoring 10 or more goals in 2010. In 2009 the Terps lost to Georgetown, 13-10 on Feb. 21 and lost again when scoring 10 in the ACC Semifinals in a 16-10 defeat at North Carolina. Prior to that, Maryland had not lost when scoring 10 or more goals since dropping an 11-10 decision to Virginia in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament in Durham, N.C. The Terrapins got to 10 goals in the 100th game against Johns Hopkins, but the Blue Jays took the game 14-10. Virginia is the only team to beat the Terps twice when allowing 10 or more goals. The Wahoos did it first in 2002 with another 11-10 decision.

## HOLDING OPPONENTS TO SINGLE-DIGITS

- The Terps have been extremely impressive (winning 92.4 percent of its games since 2002) when it scores 10 or more goals, they have been nearly as impressive when holding opponents to less than 10 goals during that span.
- Since 2002 Maryland is 128-27 in games, for a .826 winning percentage, when it has held opponents under 10 goals. The Terps have played 206 total games since 2002. Maryland has held opponents to nine goals or less 75.2 percent of the time.

## FAST STARTS THROUGH 13 GAMES

- Since 2002 only nine players (for a total of 11 times) have totaled 40 points or more in the first 13 games of a season. Only one of those is on the 2014 team.
- Mike Chanenchuk** has been the model of consistency during his tenure as a Terp and has scored at least one point in 35 of the past 36 games. Through 13 games this season Chanenchuk has 44 points on 28 goals and 16 assists. Overall, Chanenchuk is fifth on the points list through the first 13 games of a season.

## SHOOTING TELLS THE STORY

- Since 2005 the Terps are a remarkable 68-4 (.944) when shooting 30% or better in a game. The only four losses were: 13-10 to Georgetown in 2009 (the Terps shot 10 of 30 for 33.3% vs. the Hoyas), 11-10 to No. 1 Virginia on April 3, 2010 (10 of 33 for 30.3%), 12-11 in overtime on April 16, 2011 to No. 3 Johns Hopkins (11 of 28 for 39.3%) and 13-11 at Colgate on May 5, 2012 (11 of 31 for 35.5%).
- Maryland is 10-3 on the year and shot 30% or better in six of its 10 victories and just barely missed that mark in the win at Syracuse.

- If 30% is the benchmark, then 40% shooting is in a class all to itself and Maryland has shot 40% or better in 16 games since the start of the 2008 season. Out of those 16 games, Maryland shot 50% or better in five of them.

## STREAKING TERPS

- Thirteen proved to be an unlucky number for senior **Mike Chanenchuk**, who saw his 35-game point scoring streak, which dated back to the Johns Hopkins game on Apr. 14, 2012, come to an end in the Terps' 6-5 loss to Notre Dame in the ACC semifinals. Overall, for his Maryland career Chanenchuk has tallied at least one point in 41 of 44 games.
- Chanenchuk's point-scoring streak was the second longest since the 2004 season. The only other point-scoring streak longer belongs to Joe Walters, who had at least one point in 45 straight from Feb. 2004 to April 2006. Here's a look at the Terps' 20+ game point-scoring streaks since 2004.

- In conjunction with his point-scoring streak, Chanenchuk also had an impressive 23-game goal-scoring streak going, but that came to an end in the 11-6 loss at Johns Hopkins on April 12 when he registered three assists, but didn't score a goal. Prior to the Hopkins game, the last time Chanenchuk did not score a goal for the Terps was in the 23-6 season-opening win over Mount St. Mary's on Feb. 8, 2013.
- The Terp with the longest current point-scoring streak is now junior **Joe LoCascio**, who has had at least one point in six straight games.

## 50 PERCENT OR MORE

- Senior midfielder **Mike Chanenchuk** scored five of the Terps' 10 goals in the team's 10-6 win over No. 1 Duke on March 1, 2014. That performance marks just the ninth time since 1998 that a Maryland player scored at least 50 percent of the team's goals in a victory (with a five-goal minimum). Chanenchuk is the first Maryland player since 1998 to accomplish the feat at home.

# JOHN TILLMAN

HEAD COACH • FOURTH SEASON AT MARYLAND • CORNELL '91

John Tillman was hired as the University of Maryland's head men's lacrosse coach on June 16, 2010, becoming the ninth coach in the 85-year history of the program. Tillman came to College Park after three years returning Harvard lacrosse to national prominence and twelve seasons as the top assistant at Navy, during which the Midshipmen experienced some of the best years in their storied history.

In his first season in College Park Tillman guided the Terps to a 13-5 record, the 2011 ACC championship (the program's first since 2005) and a berth in the NCAA championship game (the first for the Terps since 1998). Eight Terrapins earned All-America honors in Tillman's first season, which is the most Maryland players selected in a single-season since 2004.

The 2012 season was viewed by many as a rebuilding year after Maryland graduated 17 seniors in 2011, but Tillman rallied the team and the Terrapins returned to the NCAA championship game with sensational postseason performances from seniors Joe Cummings and Drew Snider among others. Five Terps earned All-America honors following Maryland's 12-6 campaign and junior Jesse Bernhardt was selected as co-recipient of the ACC's first-ever Defensive Player of the Year award.

Tillman's third season in College Park saw the Terps ascend to the top of the national rankings for the first time since 2006, following a 12-10 win at then-No. 1 Loyola on Feb. 21. Maryland earned a bid to the NCAA tournament for the 11th consecutive season, which is the longest active streak in Division I men's lacrosse. Seniors Jesse Bernhardt and John Haus became the first Terrapins since 2006 to earn first-team All-America honors, leading a group of seven Maryland honorees.

Widely considered one of the top young coaches in the country and a dynamic recruiter, Tillman was the head men's lacrosse coach at Harvard for three seasons prior to his arrival in College Park. His last recruiting class for the Crimson was rated No. 3 in the nation, according to Inside Lacrosse.

During his three seasons at Harvard, Tillman compiled an overall record of 20-19, including an 8-5 mark in 2009, which was the Crimson's highest win total since 1999.

Tillman's time at Harvard produced a number of the most memorable wins in the program's history. This past season, during which Harvard climbed as high as No. 11 in the national polls, Tillman guided the Crimson to an 11-8 victory over No. 6 Princeton, which was the first time Harvard had defeated the Tigers in 20 years. In 2009, Tillman led the Crimson to a season-opening 9-6 upset victory at No. 5 Duke.

Tillman improved his teams in every aspect over the past three seasons. Prior to his arrival in Cambridge, Mass., the Crimson ranked 40th and 42nd, respectively, in total offense and defense. Tillman's defense ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation, while his offense rose to No. 15 in the country. He also dramatically improved Harvard's extra-man offense, from the 51st-ranked unit before he arrived, to a perennial top 15 unit.

Prior to Harvard, Tillman spent 12 seasons at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md. After six seasons as an assistant coach, he was promoted to head assistant coach and offensive coordinator prior to the 2002 season. From 2004 through 2007, Tillman helped lead the Midshipmen to some of the most successful seasons in program history, including four straight NCAA tournament berths, four consecutive Patriot League tournament titles and four straight Patriot League regular season championships.

In 2004, with Tillman at the helm of the Navy offense, the Mids made a remarkable run through the NCAA tournament, defeating three Ivy League teams (Penn, Cornell and Princeton) en route to a spot in the national championship game. Tillman's offense was a key component of Navy's success that season, ranking third in the nation in scoring offense. Following the Mids' tremendous 2004 season, Tillman was awarded the first of his two Collegiate Lacrosse Assistant Coach of the Year Awards by the Maryland State Lacrosse Coaches Association.

During his 12 season at the Naval Academy, Tillman was responsible for helping develop first team All-America midfielders Graham Gill and Billy Looney and second team All-America attackman Jon Birsner. In his 12 seasons in Annapolis, the Mids compiled an overall record of 104-63.

Tillman started his coaching career as an assistant coach at Ithaca College. He spent four seasons (1992-95) with the Bombers, helping lead them to the Division III national semifinals in 1992.

In addition to his extensive coaching experience, Tillman also serves as a member of the Tewaaron Award Men's Selection Committee.

A 1991 graduate of Cornell University's School of Hotel Administration, Tillman was a three-year member of the school's Dean's list. He had the opportunity to play for legendary coach Richie Moran and was a member of the 1989 squad that earned a berth in the NCAA tournament. Tillman was a goalie when he entered college, but played a number of positions for the Big Red, giving him a great appreciation and understanding for the overall game of lacrosse.

Tillman played professionally for the Baltimore Thunder and the Washington Power of the National Lacrosse League. During his final two seasons in Baltimore, he helped the Thunder reach the NLL Championship and Semifinals. Tillman also played for the Toyota Lacrosse Club, who won five-consecutive Southern Division Championships, including a world championship in 2000.

A native of Corning, N.Y., Tillman was previously commissioned into the U.S. Navy as a fleet support officer and was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal.

## FRESHMAN HAT TRICKS

- With four goals in his first college game, a 16-3 win over Mount St. Mary's (Feb. 8), **Matt Rambo** became just the ninth Maryland men's lacrosse freshman to record a hat trick since 1998. He followed that up with another hat trick in the 14-3 win over UMBC (Feb. 15) to become the first Terp to record back-to-back hat tricks in his first two collegiate games since Grant Catalino in 2008. Rambo netted his third hat trick of the season with four goals in the Terps' 13-5 win at Michigan (March 18) and then added his fourth with three goals in the 19-6 win over Robert Morris (April 2).
- Connor Cannizzaro** scored his first hat trick with three goals in the Terps' 16-8 win at Syracuse to become the 10th Terp freshman with a hat trick since 1998. This marks just the second time since 1998 that two freshman have recorded hat tricks in the same season. Cannizzaro netted his second career hat trick vs. Villanova on March 14 and added his third at Notre Dame on April 20.

## TERPS' 89TH SEASON OF LACROSSE

- The Terps boast an all-time record of 757-256-4 (.746), dating back to the first varsity team in 1924 (a team was not fielded in 1944 and 1945 due to World War II). Maryland has finished every one of its previous 88 seasons with a .500 or better record, including last season when the Terps went 12-6. The program reached the 700-win milestone with a 15-6 victory over Penn on April 14, 2009 at Ludwig Field and became just the fourth program with 750 wins with a 16-8 win at No. 2 Syracuse on Feb. 22, 2014.
- During the decade of the 2000s, Maryland went 111-49 for a .694 win percentage, making it the winningest decade in Terrapin lacrosse history. In the decade of the 1990s, Maryland posted a 95-47 record. The .669 winning percentage matched Maryland's win percentage of the 1980s when the Terps went 83-41 and also compiled a .669 win percentage. So far, Maryland is 57-22 in the 2010's for a .722 winning percentage.

## THE 700 CLUB

- Maryland's 15-6 victory over Penn on April 14, 2009 was the program's 700th victory in 84 seasons of varsity men's lacrosse. The Terps join Johns Hopkins, Syracuse, Navy, Army and Cornell as the only programs with 700 or more Division I wins.
- Two things that make Maryland's accomplishment all the more impressive is that the Terps reached the 700-win plateau in just their 84th season. Only Syracuse reached win No. 700 in as few seasons, but it took the Orange 53 more games than Maryland. In fact, Maryland needed only 940 games to reach 700 wins and only Johns Hopkins needed fewer games (932) to hit the historic number, but the Blue Jays did so in their 105th season.

## LEAGUE-BEST FIVE TERPS NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

- Senior goalie Niko Amato became the first goalie in the history of the ACC to be named to the all-conference team for the fourth time in his career. He is just the sixth player ever to be a four-time honoree with Duke attackman Jordan Wolf joining him as the seventh player with his fourth selection this season.

- Senior midfielder Mike Chanenchuk, senior defender Michael Ehrhardt, junior defender Goran Murray and junior faceoff specialist Charlie Raffa are all first time honorees.
- The five All-ACC selections are the most for the Terps since 2006 when they also placed five on the all-conference team.

## TERPS ON ESPNU

- Maryland has had 52 games on ESPNU since 2006. Maryland is 28-24 (.538) all-time in games broadcast on ESPNU.
- The Terps are scheduled to play five games (at North Carolina, vs. Virginia, at Johns Hopkins, at Notre Dame and the ACC tournament semifinals) on ESPNU in 2014.

## FIRST-TIME OPPONENTS

- Maryland has played 80 different opponents in its 89 seasons, including the first-ever meeting between the Terps and Michigan and then vs. Robert Morris earlier this season. In the Terps' 80 first-time meetings Maryland is 76-4 (.950) in those games. Adelphi (12-13, 1982), Army (0-3, 1923), Syracuse (3-10, 1927) and Yale (3-5, 1925) are the only schools to beat the Terps the first time the schools met on a lacrosse field.

## CONSECUTIVE 10-WIN SEASONS

- Maryland's 12-8 win at Notre Dame on April 20, 2014 extended the Terps' streak of double-digit win seasons to 12, which is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse. (Special thanks to Patrick Stevens of the *D1source.com*).
- There are only four programs with a current streak of at least five-straight 10-win seasons:  
**Maryland (12): 2014 (10-2), 2013 (10-4), 2012 (12-6), 2011 (13-5), 2010 (12-4), 2009 (10-7), 2008 (10-6), 2007 (10-6), 2006 (12-5), 2005 (11-6), 2004 (13-3), 2003 (12-4)**  
 Notre Dame (8): 2013 (11-4), 2012 (13-3), 2011 (11-3), 2010 (10-7), 2009 (15-1), 2008 (14-3), 2007 (11-4), 2006 (10-5)  
 Duke (8): 2014 (12-2), 2013 (16-4), 2012 (15-5) 2011 (14-6), 2010 (16-4), 2009 (15-4), 2008 (18-2), 2007 ( 17-3)  
 North Carolina (6): 2014 (10-3), 2013 (13-4), 2012 (11-6), 2011 (10-6), 2010 (13-3), 2009 (12-6)
- Cornell's string of seven-straight 10+ win seasons came to an end in 2012 with a 9-4 final mark. Virginia's streak of eight-consecutive seasons with 10+ wins ended in 2013 with a 7-8 record, while Siena saw its run of six 10-win seasons end with an 8-9 mark in 2013.

## MARYLAND IN SEASON OPENERS

- Maryland has an 85-3-1 (.961) lifetime record in season openers dating back to the 1924 season. The Terps have won their last 21 openers and 28 of the last 29, with the only loss coming to Duke in 1993, when they fell to Duke 9-5 on March 6.
- After losing their 1925 opener to Yale, 5-3, the Terps went on to win 40 consecutive season openers from 1926 through 1967. The streak was broken when Maryland tied Princeton, 6-6, in the 1968 opener. Following the deadlock, Maryland went on to win its next 14 openers, giving the Terps a 54-0-1 record over a 57-year span (Maryland did not field a team in 1944 and 1945 due to World War II.)

## 21 STRAIGHT IN SEASON OPENERS

- After beating Mount St. Mary's to open the 2014 season the Terps have an 21-game winning streak in season openers. Five of those wins came against Villanova (1994-98) and the last nine over Denver, Mount St. Mary's (three times), Air Force, Hobart, Duke, Georgetown (four times), Bellarmine (twice), Presbyterian, Detroit Mercy and Hartford. Over the 21-year stretch, Maryland outscored its foes 306-108 (an average score of 14.6-5.1) in those games.
- The Terps have not allowed more than seven goals to any opponent in a season opener over the last 21 years. Maryland has not allowed an opponent to score 10 or more goals in a season opener since Syracuse beat the Terps, 16-13 on March 9, 1983.

## A FAMILY AFFAIR

- Many school's refer to their sports programs as families, but the Maryland men's lacrosse program is truly a family affair. Since 2001, the Terps have had 13 sets of brothers, including three on this season's roster, don the red and black together for at least one season.

- The 2014 season is the first since 2000 that the Terps have not had a brother combination on the roster.

## FOUR TERPS TAKEN IN MLL DRAFT

- Led by senior defender Michael Ehrhardt, four Maryland men's lacrosse student-athletes were chosen in the 2014 Major League Lacrosse collegiate draft.
- Ehrhardt was chosen seventh overall by the Charlotte Hounds, becoming the eighth Maryland player to be taken in the first round, joining Lee Zink (2004, 5th), Chris Passavia (2004, 6th), Joe Walters (2006, 1st), Bill McGlone (2006, 5th), Ray Megill (2007, 9th), Joe Cinosky (2008, 9th) and Jesse Bernhardt (2013, 4th).
- Senior midfielder Mike Chanenchuk was the next Terrapin off the board, also joining the Hounds as the 11th overall selection.
- The third Terp to be selected was senior goalie Niko Amato, becoming the first Terp to join the Florida Launch, with the 29th overall selection.
- The final Terp to be drafted was senior short-stick defensive midfielder Brian Cooper, who earned the distinction of being 2014's MLL equivalent of "Mr. Irrelevant" as the final selection of the draft, going with the 64th overall selection to the Chesapeake Bayhawks.

## 2014 CAPTAINS

- Four players have been named team captains for the 2014 season. The quartet, which was selected by a combination of team vote and coaches' input, consists of seniors **Tyler Adelsberger, Niko Amato, Mike Chanenchuk** and **Michael Ehrhardt**.

## BIG TEN LACROSSE STARTS IN 2015

- The University of Maryland's men's lacrosse team will compete in the Big Ten Conference beginning with the 2015 season, following an announcement from the conference office on June 3, 2013 that the Big Ten has secured six men's teams when Johns Hopkins was accepted as a sport affiliate member for men's lacrosse only beginning with the 2014-15 academic year to give the Big Ten six men's programs, joining Maryland, Michigan, Ohio State, Penn State and Rutgers.
- The six programs that will comprise Big Ten men's lacrosse boast 56 national championships, with schools that have competed for more than a century. Johns Hopkins has been an independent since 1883 and leads all schools with 44 national championships. Maryland has claimed 11 national titles, while Rutgers has also won a national championship. The Scarlet Knights launched men's lacrosse in 1887, followed by programs starting in 1913 for Penn State, 1924 for Maryland and 1953 for Ohio State. Michigan instituted a men's lacrosse program in 2012. Maryland, Ohio State and Penn State each qualified for the 2013 NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship this season, with the Buckeyes advancing to the quarterfinals.

## 2014 GAME RECAPS

### GAME 1 NO. 6 MARYLAND . . . 16 MOUNT ST. MARY'S . . . 3 FEBRUARY 8, 2014 CAPITAL ONE FIELD AT BYRD STADIUM

**COLLEGE PARK, Md.** - Freshman Matt Rambo made his Terrapin debut a memorable one with four goals and two assists to lead the No. 6 University of Maryland men's lacrosse team to a 16-3 victory over Mount St. Mary's Saturday afternoon in front of 1,203 at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium.

Senior midfielder Mike Chanenchuk had three goals and an assist, while junior attackman Jay Carlson also chipped in with a hat trick for the Terps (1-0), who opened the season with a victory for the 21st-straight season.

Rambo's six-point effort is the most points for a Terrapin making his Maryland debut since 2004 when sophomore Xander Ritz had seven points on three goals and four assists in his first game after transferring from Delaware. Rambo's four goals were the most for a Maryland freshman in his collegiate debut since 2008 when Grant Catalino score four times in an 11-6 win at Georgetown.

Maryland jumped on the Mount (0-1) right from the start as Chanenchuk opened the scoring just 1:05 into the game with his first goal of the game. That kick-started a 5-0 run for the Terps.

The 2014 season got off to a good start for the Terrapin extra-man unit when senior Rustin Bryant found freshman Connor Cannizzaro open inside on the crease for an easy one-timer just 13 seconds into the first extra-man opportunity of the season to give Maryland a 2-0 lead.

Carlson scored his first of the season to up the lead to 3-0 at the 10:49 mark off of a nice inside feed from junior Kevin Forster, who made is return to the field after missing all of 2013 due to injury.

Rambo picked up his first collegiate goal just 19 seconds later with an unassisted effort.

The 5-0 run was capped off by sophomore Henry West, who picked up his first goal as a Terp with 5:35 left in the first quarter on a bounce shot from the right alley.

The Mount rallied near the end of the first quarter with goals from Ryan Lamon and Bubba Johnson to close the gap to 5-2 heading into the second quarter.

But the Terps scored six unanswered goals in the second to blow the game wide open.

Rambo and Chanenchuk scored back-to-back unassisted goals to give Maryland a 7-2 lead with just over 12:00 to play in the first half.

The extra-man unit cashed in again with 10:52 on the clock when junior midfielder Joe LoCascio ripped a laser into the top corner from the left alley to make it an 8-2 game.

Carlson netted his second of the game to put the Terps up by seven with 9:54 to play. Junior midfielder Bryan Cole made a nice move to dip under his defender and finish in close to up the Terps' lead to 10-2 48 seconds later.

The first-half scoring was capped off with a transition goal that began with a terrific ride by senior midfielder Brian Cooper, who caused a Mountaineer turnover and picked up the groundball to begin the play. Cooper then pushed the ball into the box and found Rambo open for the easy shot and score with 6:13 to play.

The second half saw the Terps extend their scoring run to eight straight goals, beginning with Chanenchuk's third of the game at the 14:904 mark. This one came on a big-time shot from the left top slot off of a feed from Cannizzaro.

Rambo closed out the run with his fourth of the game with 9:27 left in the third to make it a 13-2 Maryland lead.

Robert Jones scored an extra-man goal for Mount St. Mary's with 3:39 remaining in the third to close the game to 10 goals, but Maryland responded with a goal by Cannizzaro off an assist from Rambo to up its lead to 14-3 at the 2:39 mark.

With time running down in the third, senior Michael Ehrhardt, who finished with three groundballs and three caused turnovers, caused a Mountaineer turnover and picked up the groundball to give the Terps the ball back. Carlson made the effort pay off with a

spectacular underhand, back-handed sweeping shot off of a quick feed from Rambo with just two seconds left on the clock to make it a 15-3 Maryland advantage.

That's the way it would stay until just two seconds remained in the fourth quarter when freshman midfielder Ben Chisolm scored his first collegiate goal on a rip from the right wing off of a feed from junior midfielder Zack Wholley.

Maryland's defense was stout all day, allowing just 22 shots. Senior goalie Niko Amato played the first three quarters and made seven stops. Junior Kyle Bernlohr came in for the fourth quarter and recorded four saves for the Terps.

Maryland dominated possession thanks in large part to junior Charlie Raffa winning 8-of-12 faceoffs and picking up a game-high seven groundballs. Sophomore Jon Garino relieved Raffa as the team's primary faceoff man in the second half and he won 4-of-6 draws with three groundballs and one caused turnover.

**COLLEGE PARK, Md.** - Senior Mike Chanenchuk paced the Terrapins with two goals and a career high three assists to lead the No. 6 University of Maryland men's lacrosse team to a 14-3 win over UMBC Saturday afternoon at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium.

Maryland (2-0) scored the first six goals of the game and held the Retrievers (0-1) scoreless for the first 37:05 minutes of the game.

Junior attackman Jay Carlson got the Terps on the board first when he beat his man around the cage and scored from the left side just under five minutes into the game.

Maryland added five goals in the second quarter including a second on the day from Carlson and two from freshman attackman Matt Rambo. Rambo started out the second quarter scoring just 1:18 into the period when he wrapped around the left side of the cage and beat the keeper with a bounce shot.

Freshman Connor Cannizzaro scored his third goal of the year just over three minutes later when he beat his defender with a slick dodge and then got a low angle shot past the goalie from the left side of the crease.

Rambo added his second of the day, which proved to be the game-winner, with a man-up goal at the 9:23 mark shooting from the right alley to the top left corner off of a feed from Chanenchuk.

Maryland extended its lead to 5-0 with 8:22 remaining in the half when Carlson added his second of the day; diving across the crease to beat the keeper off of his left hip for the goal.

Junior midfielder Joe LoCascio finished off the first half scoring with an unassisted goal from ten yards out dead center in front of the goal.

UMBC stopped the Maryland scoring streak with 7:55 remaining in the third quarter on a goal by Pat Young, but Maryland answered back with two of its own. Both goals came from Chanenchuk; the first an unassisted goal and the second off of a feed from LoCascio.

The Retrievers finished out the third quarter scoring with two goals of their own to make it 8-3, but that would be all the offense they could muster as the Terrapin defense held them scoreless for the final 16:41 of the contest.

The final six goals of the game came from six different Terps, including four who scored their first goal of the season.

Senior attackman Rustin Bryant and redshirt-sophomore attackman Kevin Forester scored their first goals of the season with freshman midfielder Lucas Gradinger and senior midfielder Tyler Adelsberger notching their first career goals in the fourth quarter. The other two goals in the quarter came were scored by Rambo, his third of the day, and sophomore midfielder Henry West to make the final tally 14-3 in favor of the Terps.

**COLLEGE PARK, Md.** - Senior Mike Chanenchuk tied his career high with five goals to pace the offense, while senior Niko Amato made 17 saves to anchor the defense in the No. 2 University of Maryland men's lacrosse team's 10-6 win over No. 1 Duke Saturday afternoon in front of 5,055 at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium.

Maryland (4-0, 2-0 ACC) scored seven straight goals and held the Blue Devils (4-1, 0-1 ACC) scoreless for 26:26 starting in the middle of the second quarter until the fourth quarter.

Duke started off the scoring at 10:41 when Jordan Wolf scored his first of two goals on the day.

The Terrapins responded on the ensuing faceoff. Junior Charlie Raffa pushed the draw and took a quick shot that was backed up by junior Jay Carlson. Carlson then found Chanenchuk on the left alley for the easy finish to tie things at 1-1.

Chanenchuk added his second of the day just over a minute later. Freshman Matt Rambo found Chanenchuk with a good pass and Chanenchuk finished with the top shelf shot to give the Terps a 2-1 lead with 9:16 to go in the first.

Duke tied things up to close out the first quarter with a Josh Dionne goal to make it a 2-2 game.

Maryland opened up the second period with an extra man goal after a pushing foul on Duke's Brendan Fowler on the opening faceoff of the quarter. Freshman Connor Cannizzaro had his shot blocked, but Carlson picked up the loose ball and finished the rebound to give the Terps a 3-2 advantage.

The Blue Devils then went on a three goal run, making the score 5-3 with 7:38 remaining in the half. That would be their final lead of the day as the Maryland defense began their stretch of 26:26 without allowing a goal.

Freshman Colin Heacock scored his first career goal with 4:40 remaining in the first half on a step down shot off an assist from Chanenchuk to start the 7-0 scoring run for the Terps.

Just over a minute later Chanenchuk scored his third goal of the day after dodging down the right alley and finishing with a low shot to the left corner.

The Terps finished out the half when Rambo scored his lone goal of the day, an unassisted tally after coming off a big screen from Heacock behind the cage to make it 6-5.

Maryland added three unassisted goals in the third quarter to make it 9-5 heading into the final period. Chanenchuk had two goals in the period and Raffa added his third goal of the year.

Junior Joe LoCascio finished off the Maryland scoring with 14:17 remaining in the game to extend the lead to 10-5. LoCascio dodged down the right alley and finished inside the left pipe.

The Terrapin defense only allowed single Duke goal in the final 14:17. Maryland's defense forced 10 turnovers on the day led by four from senior Michael Ehrhardt.

Amato's 17 saves was a season-high and helped him improve to 39-15 in his career. The 17-save total was also his highest single-game total since stopping 24 shots last season in a 8-7 win over Yale on April 20.

Maryland won the ground ball battle scooping up 32 loose balls on the day. Raffa led the way with seven groundballs for the Terps, while Ehrhardt chipped in with six and Carlson had five.

Maryland returns to non-conference play next weekend, hitting the road to take on Stony Brook. Faceoff between the Terps and Seawolves is scheduled for 1 p.m. on Saturday, March 8 at LaValle Stadium.

Maryland improves to 5-0 on the season, while Stony Brook falls to 2-3.

After a bit of a shaky start for both teams Maryland scored first when Chanenchuk connected on a runner down the left alley for a 1-0 Terrapin lead at the 10:42 mark.

**NOTRE DAME, Ind.** – Senior Mike Chanenchuk and freshman Connor Cannizzaro each had four points on three goals and an assist to lead the No. 7 University of Maryland men's lacrosse team to a 12-8 victory over No. 8 Notre Dame to win the regular season championship of the ACC Saturday afternoon at Arlotta Stadium.

The Terrapins improve to 10-2 on the season and are 4-1 in ACC play. The Fighting Irish fall to 6-5 overall and are 2-3 in the league.

Maryland opened the scoring with patient offense after winning the game's opening faceoff via a violation. With the timer-on call on, sophomore Henry West took the ball on the left alley and buried a quick turn-and-shoot at the 13:38 mark.

The quick start continued for the Terps as senior Mike Chanenchuk scored from the left alley off a good feed from freshman Connor Cannizzaro with 12:04 left on the clock to make it a 2-0 lead.

Notre Dame cut the Terrapin lead in half at the 10:54 mark when Matt Kavanagh fed Conor Doyle behind the net and Doyle scored around the left side.

The game remained a 2-1 contest, with both teams struggling with turnovers, until the Terps' extra-man unit got on the field thanks to a cross check penalty called on Matthew Collins. The Irish tried to force the issue, pressing out on Chanenchuk, but when Notre Dame tried to recover back into its shape, it left too much room for Chanenchuk, who was able to step into a shot and bury it into the top left corner with 38 seconds left in the first.

Maryland's lead grew to three early in the second quarter with Chanenchuk making things happen again. This time he got past his defender and drove down the left alley, drawing an Irish slide. The slide opened up the crease and Chanenchuk found a wide open Matt Rambo and the freshman scored on the one-timer at the 13:36 mark.

The Irish extra-man unit got its first chance of the game with 11:01 on the second quarter clock when junior Casey Ikeda was called for an illegal body check. The Terps forced the ball to the ground, but another illegal body check call on senior Emmett Cahill put Maryland down two men. Raffa won his 14th faceoff of the day on the ensuing faceoff, but an unforced turnover gave the Irish the chance to make it a one-goal game heading into the fourth. Kavanagh took a good rip from the right alley, but Amato was right there with his eighth save of the day with just three seconds remaining on the clock.

LoCascio seemed to be pushed with possession on the opening possession of the fourth quarter, but no call came from the officials and Notre Dame capitalized on the turnover as Jack Near scored in transition to make it an 8-7 game at the 13:45 mark of the fourth.

Notre Dame tied the game with its fourth straight goal as Kavanagh found Doyle with 11:36 on the clock.

But Maryland responded at the 8:15 mark. West had a good look from the left alley, but he was unlucky this time as his shot rang off the pipe. The Terps however were lucky as the rebound went right to LoCascio and he snuck a shot inside the right pipe to give the Terrapins the lead back at 9-8.

The lead grew to two goals 31 seconds later when freshman Connor Cannizzaro got under his defender and tip-toed the crease and finished past Kelly.

Cannizzaro then gave Maryland an 11-8 lead with an unassisted goal from little-to-no angle off of a time out with the timer on call on with 1:35 on the clock.

He then finished his natural hat trick with an empty-net goal at the 1:16 mark off of a long pass from sophomore Matt Dunn to make the final score 12-8.

Amato finished the game with nine saves, while Raffa won a career-best 20-of-24 faceoffs and had nine groundballs.

Ikeda had a career-high six groundballs, while senior Michael Ehrhardt also finished with six groundballs. Cooper finished with two groundballs and had a team-high three caused turnovers.

**CHESTER, Pa.** - The No. 7 University of Maryland men's lacrosse team trailed for only 6.5 seconds, but it was the final 6.5 seconds in a 6-5 loss to No. 9 Notre Dame Saturday night in the ACC semifinals at PPL Park.

The Terrapins are now 10-3 overall on the season, while the Fighting Irish improved its mark to 7-5.

The first quarter was scoreless through the first 12:50 of the period, but at the 2:10 mark freshman Tim Rotanz dodged past his defender from right goal line extended and scored from in close to give Maryland a 1-0 lead.

The lead doubled to 2-0 at the 12:23 mark of the second quarter when freshman Matt Rambo, who was victimized by two pipes early in the game, ripped one from 12 yards out straight away into the upper left corner.

Junior Joe LoCascio pushed the Maryland lead to 3-0 with 10:45 on the second quarter clock when he went with some high heat into the top left corner of the net.

Notre Dame finally broke through at the 5:38 mark of the second when a Terrapin turnover created a transition opportunity and Jack Near found a wide open Westy Hopkins breaking for the Maryland goal and Hopkins ended the Irish's scoreless streak at 29:22.

The second half opened with another unassisted goal for the Terps. This time it was freshman Connor Cannizzaro scoring after dodging down the left alley and stinging the top right corner to give Maryland a 4-1 advantage.

Notre Dame cut the Terrapin lead in half with another transition score, this one coming from John Scioscia off a feed to the crease by Nick Ossello at the 8:46 mark of the third.

The Irish made it a one-goal game with 3:17 left in the third when Jim Marlatt scored off a feed from Sergio Perkovic.

The Notre Dame extra-man unit tied the game at 4-4 when Eddy Lubowicki scored unassisted at the 13:06 mark of the fourth quarter.

Maryland regained the lead when the Terps' extra-man unit cashed in on an illegal body check by Stephen O'Hara. Junior Jay Carlson took a pass in the high slot and threaded the ball to right goal line extended where senior Rustin Bryant was able to slip the ball past ND goalie Conor Kelly at the 9:31 mark of the fourth.

The lead was short-lived as the Irish evened the game at 5-5 a minute later when Conor Doyle scored unassisted.

The Terps had the ball with just about a minute left in the game and looked to try to get the last shot, but Notre Dame forced a turnover in the waning seconds and pushed the ball in transition. Near found Matt Kavanagh on the right side of the crease and the Irish's leading scorer netted his lone goal of the game to give ND its only lead of the game, 6-5, with 6.5 seconds left.

Junior Charlie Raffa won his 10th faceoff of the day to give Maryland a last-second opportunity, but LoCascio's shot went over the crossbar.

Senior goalie Niko Amato made nine saves in the game for the Terps. Raffa and Cannizzaro each had six groundballs, while senior Michael Ehrhardt and junior Casey Ikeda each had two caused turnovers.
