Storylines

• **Melo Trimble** had 21 points and Maryland extended its winning streak to five games with an 88-72 victory over Charlotte on Dec. 20 the last time out at Royal Farms Arena in Baltimore. **Anthony Cowan** scored 16 for the Terrapins, who made 10 3-pointers in the second half. **Michal Cekovsky**, **Kevin Huerter** and **Ivan Bender** had 10 points apiece for the Terrapins who had five or more players in double figures for the second time in as many games.

• With his 21-point outing versus Charlotte, **Melo Trimble** now has seven games of 20 or more points this season. He went 4-for-4 from the charity stripe against the 49ers, giving him 434 career made free throws, passing Terrapin legend Lonny Baxter for fifth all-time. He needs six to pass Greivis Vasquez for sole possession of fourth all-time. Maryland is 30-4 when Trimble gets to the line at least seven times.

• The Terps are 2-0 in Big Ten home openers, defeating Penn State, 70-64, last season, and Minnesota, 70-58, in Maryland's inaugural season. Maryland also topped Michigan State in a double overtime thriller in East Lansing to begin the 2014-15 campaign.

• Maryland is 26-10 in its first two years in the Big Ten Conference, including a 34-2 mark in conference play at XFINITY Center. Only Wisconsin has more wins in Big Ten action the past two seasons (28-8). Head coach **Mark Turgeon** guided the Terrapins to a 24-6 record through their first 30 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest coach Big Ten coach to reach 20 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 20 wins in his first 23 games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons.

• The Terps have started the last three seasons on a tear, racking up a 12-1 record in each season through 13 games. Maryland was 14-1 to begin the 2014-15 campaign and 15-1 to kick off the 2015-16 season.

• **Melo Trimble** and **Jake Layman** each scored 18 points as Maryland routed Illinois, 81-55, on Senior Night at XFINITY Center March 3, 2016, in the last meeting between the two programs. The Terps lead the all-time series, 6-5.

Maryland's freshman trio of **Justin Jackson**, **Anthony Cowan** and **Kevin Huerter** has been stellar this season.

Cowan and Huerter have started every game for Maryland and Jackson has started in 12 for Maryland, which is off to a 12-1 start this season.

Maryland Captures 2016 Barclays Classic

Melo Trimble converted a layup with 6.6 seconds remaining as Maryland survived a stiff challenge from Kansas State in a 69-68 victory in the Barclays Center Classic title game on Nov. 26.

Trimble scored 18 points and his biggest hoop came on Maryland's final possession. He drove through the lane and got by Kansas State forward D.J. Johnson for the basket. It was Maryland's fourth straight holiday tournament title (Paradise Jam, 2013; CBE Classic, 2014; Cancun Challenge, 2015).

Maryland and The B1G - The First Two Years

Maryland is 26-10 in its first two years in the Big Ten Conference, including a 34-2 mark in conference play at XFINITY Center. Only Wisconsin has more wins in Big Ten action the past two seasons (28-8). The Terps have advanced to the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament in each of their first two seasons in the Big Ten Conference.

Cardiac Terps

Maryland has won six games this season - including a thrilling 71-70 victory over Oklahoma State its last time out - by six points or less.

The Terps have won three contests by one point, with a 76-75 win over Georgetown (11/15) and a 69-68 triumph over Kansas State (11/26) in addition to the win against OSU on Dec. 3. Maryland is 26-5 in contests decided by six points or less over the past three seasons.

Melo Trimble hit two game-winning free throws with 7.6 seconds remaining against Georgetown, converted a game-winning layup with 6.6 seconds to go against Kansas State and nailed two clutch free throws with 9.4 seconds to play to give the Terps the win over Oklahoma State.

Don't Call 'Em Rookies

Mark Turgeon's lineup features three freshman starters: guard **Anthony Cowan** (Bowie, Md.), forward **Kevin Huerter** (Clifton Park, N.Y.) and forward **Justin Jackson** (East York, Ontario, Canada). The trio has been instrumental in Maryland's 12-1 record to start the 2016-17 campaign.

Jackson, who totaled 17 points and seven rebounds in the 76-75 win over Georgetown, is second on the team in scoring (11.3 points per game) and is averaging a team-best 6.0 rebounds per game.

Huerter has started all 13 games and has averaged 7.2 points and has been one of the better perimeter defenders for the Terps. Huerter's blocked shot on a game-winning layup attempt by Georgetown's Jagan Mosley led the Terps to a 76-75 dramatic come-from-behind win over the Hoyas.

Cowan is making an immediate impact - averaging 10.6 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.9 assists while averaging 28.1 minutes per game. He has teamed up with junior guard **Melo Trimble** (17.9 points per game) to form a dynamic backcourt.

Trimble Named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week (11/29)

Melo Trimble was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Nov. 29.

He tied his career-high with 31 points in an 88-82 overtime win over Richmond and followed with 18 points, including a game-winning acrobatic layup with 6.6 seconds left to defeat Kansas State, 60-59, to lead the Terps to the Barclays Center Classic championship. The Upper Marlboro, Md., native averaged 24.5 points and connected on 16-of-31 field goal attempts en route to earning Most Valuable Player honors.

Terps Defeat Georgetown in Gavitt Games

Melo Trimble scored 22 points, including two free throws with 7.6 seconds left, and Maryland made up a nine-point deficit in the closing minutes to beat Georgetown 76-75 on Nov. 15 at Verizon Center.

Freshman **Justin Jackson** scored a career-high 17 points and added a team-high seven rebounds while classmate **Anthony Cowan** posted 11 points and added a game-high five assists. Freshman **Kevin Huerter** made a block on the final play of the game to preserve the win as the Terps moved to 2-0 in Gavitt Games play.

Trimble Lands on Wooden Award Watch List

Junior guard **Melo Trimble** was named to the Wooden Award Watch List, announced Nov. 15. He led the Terps in scoring (14.8 ppg), assists (5.0 apg), free throw percentage (.868) and steals (4.4) last season as Maryland advanced to the Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 2003.

The Upper Marlboro, Md., native joins Naismith National Player of the Year Joe Smith as one of only two Terrapins to notch 500 or more points in each of their first two seasons in College Park.

Trimble - a Preseason All-Big Ten selection - has been named to the Bob Cousy and Lute Olson Award Watch Lists.

Terps Surging Under Turgeon

Maryland head coach **Mark Turgeon**, the 2014-15 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has a resume which features a myriad of outstanding accomplishments during his first five seasons at Maryland:

- Won 114 games in his first five seasons
- Posted its best start in school history (15-1) in 2015-16 - previous best start was 14-1 (in 2014-15, 1996-97 and 1972-73)
- Led Maryland to open the 2015-16 season with a 4-0 record in conference play - the program's best start since 1996-97 season
- Maryland had a school-record 26 regular season wins in 2014-15
- Terps boasted a 34-2 home record and a 17-1 mark in the Big Ten at XFINITY the past two seasons
- Maryland advanced to the Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 2003

#Doddzilla

Senior forward **Damonte Dodd** will look to lead the Terps in his fourth season in College Park in 2016-17.

The Centerville, Md., native has appeared in 97 games, making 49 starts. He's registered 98 blocks, including a career-high 51 as a sophomore. He led all players with four blocks at Georgetown on Nov. 15 and posted his first career double-double against St. Mary's College (13 pts, 10 rbs) on Nov. 17.

With three blocks against Kansas State, he became the 14th player in Maryland history to record 100 or more career blocks and now sits at No. 13 with 107.

Big Game Melo

Melo Trimble was stellar in the Terps' biggest matchups last season and he appears to have picked up right where he left off a year ago. An Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American in 2016, Trimble scored 24 points against Georgetown, 23 at North Carolina, 25 versus UConn at Madison Square Garden and 24 at Michigan State. He also put up 24 against Hawaii in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This season, he notched a game-high 22 points in Maryland's dramatic come-from-behind win at Georgetown Nov. 15 and matched a career-high with 31 in an overtime contest with Richmond at the Barclays Classic. The Terps are 30-4 when Trimble gets to the charity stripe at least seven times. Trimble already has seven games in which he has posted 20 or more points this season.

He was named Most Valuable Player at the Barclays Classic (2016), Cancun Challenge (2015) and the CBE Classic (2014) while leading the Terps to all three titles.

Turgeon, The Terps and The B1G

Mark Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 15 of his 18 seasons, including a current streak of 14 consecutive winning seasons. Turgeon has 376 career wins, with 126 coming at the helm of the Maryland program.

Turgeon guided the Terrapins to a 24-6 record through their first 30 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest coach Big Ten coach to reach 20 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 20 wins in his first 23 games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons.

Maryland has won 24 regular season games on five occasions in program history, including the past two seasons under Turgeon (26 regular season games in 2014-15 and 24 regular season games in 2015-16). He has guided Maryland to back-to-back 27-plus win seasons for the first time in program history (28 total wins in 2014-15, 27 total wins in 2015-16).

Stone, Layman Selected in the 2016 NBA Draft

Maryland's Jake Layman and Diamond Stone were selected in the second round of the 2016 NBA Draft on June 24.

Layman, a four-year letter winner who played in 141 games for the Terps, became a member of the Portland Trailblazers after the western conference squad acquired the 47th pick from the Orlando Magic.

Layman finished with 17 points in less than eight minutes in his official NBA debut on Nov. 1. His five treys tied him with Donyell Marshall for the most in NBA history in a rookie debut.

Stone was drafted with the 40th overall selection and headed to the LA Clippers after the squad acquired the pick from New Orleans in a proposed trade.

Turgeon has developed seven former players into the NBA: Gal Mekel (formerly of the Dallas Mavericks and New Orleans Pelicans), Donald Sloan (formerly of the Brooklyn Nets), Khris Middleton (Milwaukee Bucks), DeAndre Jordan (Los Angeles Clippers), Alex Len (Phoenix Suns), Jake Layman (Portland Trailblazers), and Diamond Stone (Los Angeles Clippers).

Huerter, Turgeon win FIBA U-18 Gold

Head coach **Mark Turgeon** and freshman **Kevin Huerter** led Team USA to a FIBA U-18 Gold Medal this past July in Chile.

Huerter averaged 6.8 points, 1.6 rebounds and one steal per game while boasting a team-high 14 points to lead Team USA to a win over Chile to advance to the semifinals. Turgeon served as an assistant coach as Team USA went a perfect 5-0 in the tournament.

Mark Turgeon is entering his sixth season at the helm of the University of Maryland men's basketball team after leading the Terrapins to their second consecutive NCAA Tournament and their first berth in the Sweet 16 since 2003. Turgeon, who has won 25 or more games in three different seasons with the Terrapins, owns a 376-219 (.632) overall record in 18 seasons as a Division I head coach. He signed a four-year contract extension through the 2022-23 season on Oct. 27, 2016.

In his first five seasons at Maryland, Turgeon has compiled a 114-59 (.659) record – the most wins for a head coach in his first five years in program history. Turgeon's last two campaigns have added up to the second-most wins in school history over a two-year span (55). He had the Terrapins ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10. Maryland had previously not been ranked in the top-10 since Feb. 3, 2003, a span of 12 seasons.

Under Turgeon, Maryland has also thrived in its first two seasons as members of the Big Ten Conference, earning a pair of top-3 finishes and compiling a 26-10 (.722) conference record. Turgeon's teams boast a 17-1 home record in conference play, including a perfect 9-0 mark in its inaugural season. He was named the 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year.

Since taking over the program in 2011-12, Turgeon's Terrapins have amassed a 77-13 home record overall. Under his direction, Maryland recorded the most consecutive wins at home in program history (27) from Dec. 6, 2015 - Feb. 13, 2016.

Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 24-6 record through their first 30 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 20 conference wins since former Illinois head coach Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 20 wins in his first 23 games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons.

Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 15 of his 18 seasons, including a current streak of 14 consecutive winning seasons. The Terps won 27 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history during the 2014-15 and 2015-16 campaigns.

Under Turgeon's direction the 2015-16 team finished with 27 victories and opened the regular season with a 15-1 record – the best start in program history. Maryland featured five All-Big Ten performers, including guard Melo Trimble (Second Team All-Big Ten) who was also named to the Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America Team. Center Diamond Stone was a Third Team All-Big Ten selection and was named Associated Press Big Ten Newcomer of the Year. Forwards Jake Layman and Robert Carter, Jr., as well as guard Rasheed Sulaimon each earned Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors.

Maryland posted victories over five teams that advanced to the 2016 NCAA Tournament. In addition, the Terrapins also defeated rival Georgetown in a monumental game played on the College Park campus for the first time in four decades.

Maryland, ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press and No. 12 in the final USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll, finished 27-9, marking the first time in program history the Terps have put together back-to-back 27-plus win seasons. Maryland's 4-0 start in conference play marked the best start since 1996-97.

The Terrapins also led the Big Ten and ranked fifth nationally in attendance in 2015-16, averaging 17,863 fans per game.

Maryland posted a school-record 26 wins during the regular season in 2014-15 and notched 28 total, an eight-game improvement from its 17 victories during the 2013-14 season. The 11-game win total was the second-highest improvement among all Power Five schools. Maryland also advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Terps finished their inaugural season in the Big Ten with an aforementioned 9-0 home record, which included victories against then-No. 5 Wisconsin, Michigan State and Indiana.

Overall, Maryland concluded with an 18-1 home mark at XFINITY Center. Maryland's 14-1 record in 2014-15 marked its best start in 18 years (1996-97). Turgeon posted 25 or more wins in a season for the fourth time in his career.

Since arriving in College Park, Turgeon has signed six consecutive nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including a top-10 class in 2016. He played a lead role in signing center Diamond Stone (Milwaukee, Wisc.) – a McDonald's All-American who was one of the highest-rated recruits to sign with the Terps in program history.

Under Turgeon, the men's basketball team posted its highest single year APR score of a perfect 1,000 in 2012-13 and has also graduated all 10 of his student-athletes who have exhausted their eligibility at Maryland.

In 2013, he captured his 300th career victory with an 85-74 defeat of Tulsa on Dec. 29, before leading the Terps to a thrilling overtime win against No. 5 Virginia in Maryland's final ACC regular season game.

Turgeon's winning percentage of .600 (42-28) was the best mark by a Maryland coach in his first two seasons, ahead of Bud Millikan (.592) and Gary Williams (.574). After bringing in a top-15 recruiting class in 2012, he led the Terrapins to a 25-13 record (most wins in six seasons) and appearances in the ACC Tournament semifinals and the NIT semifinals in 2012-13.

Turgeon directed Maryland to three wins over a ranked team in 2012-13 after Maryland had gone two seasons without one. The Terps were the only team in the nation to beat Duke twice, while also knocking off then-14th ranked NC State at home in January. Maryland's win over Duke at home on Feb. 16 was its first over a No. 1 ranked opponent in five years.

Turgeon, who came to College Park after directing Texas A&M to four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, led Maryland to a 17-15 record in 2011-12. At A&M, he posted a 97-40 record in four seasons and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2011. He is the only coach in Big 12 history with at least 24 victories in each of his four seasons.

In seven years at Wichita State, he built the Shockers into a power in the Missouri Valley Conference, earning the league title and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2006. In that NCAA Tournament, Wichita State beat Seton Hall and Tennessee before losing to eventual Final Four participant George Mason.

Turgeon has developed seven former players into the NBA: Gal Mekel (formerly of the Dallas Mavericks and New Orleans Pelicans), Donald Sloan (formerly of the Brooklyn Nets), Khriston Middleton (Milwaukee Bucks), DeAndre Jordan (Los Angeles Clippers), Alex Len (Phoenix Suns), Jake Layman (Portland Trailblazers) and Diamond Stone (Los Angeles Clippers). Len was selected in the first round (fifth overall) by the Suns in the 2013 NBA Draft while Stone and Layman were both picked up in the second round of the 2016 NBA Draft, and Sulaimon was signed as a free agent.

Turgeon amassed a 128-89 record at Wichita State (2000-07), posting the third-most wins in school history. The Shockers advanced to three straight NITs from 2003 to 2005 in addition to the 2006 NCAAAs, the first time WSU had four straight postseason appearances in 40 years.



He began his head-coaching career at Jacksonville State, going 17-11 in his final season there (1999-2000) after going 8-18 in his first year.

Turgeon was an assistant at Kansas for five seasons, first under Larry Brown (1987-88) and then under Roy Williams (1988-92). The Jayhawks made the NCAA Tournament in four of those seasons, winning the national championship in 1988 and finishing second in 1991. KU also won Big Eight titles in 1991 and 1992 with Turgeon on staff.

He was the top assistant under Jerry Green at Oregon from 1992-97 and was an assistant coach under Brown with the Philadelphia 76ers in 1997-98 before taking the head coaching position at Jacksonville State.

A point guard at Kansas from 1984-87, Turgeon was the first player in Jayhawks history to play in four straight NCAA Tournaments. KU went 108-33 under Brown in that stretch. Turgeon served as team captain in his junior and senior seasons, leading the Jayhawks to the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

As a student-athlete, he was selected to the Big Eight All-Academic Team in 1986 and was a Big Eight All-Freshman pick in 1984. He earned a bachelor of science degree in personnel administration from Kansas in 1987.

A native of Topeka, Kan., Turgeon led Hayden High School to back-to-back Class 4A state titles in 1982 and 1983, earning all-tournament honors each year. A first team all-state pick as a senior, Hayden went 47-3 in his high-school career.

In the summer of 2008, Turgeon was inducted into the Topeka Sports Hall of Fame. He was also honored as the 2015 Kansan of the Year in June, 2015.

Additionally, Turgeon was selected as a court coach for the USA Basketball Pan-American Team in preparation for the Pan-Am Games in the summer of 2015. The following year, Turgeon served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Under 18 Team, working with head coach Shaka Smart and assistant coach Kevin Ollie, and helping guide the squad to a gold medal. On June 13, 2016, he was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) ad hoc committee on NCAA men's basketball tournament selection, seeding and bracketing.

Turgeon is active in the College Park community and has hosted the Coaches vs. Cancer Season Tip-Off Breakfast in conjunction with the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches the past five years. Over the past two seasons, Turgeon worked with the Infiniti Coaches Charity Challenge to raise money and awareness for the Alzheimer's Association. In addition, Turgeon and his team worked with the Special Olympics of Maryland and hosted a basketball clinic for athletes in the organization along with inviting them to home games during the 2016 season. Turgeon also participated in the Special Olympics Relay Across America carrying the Flame for Hope through the College Park campus.

Turgeon ("TURGE-in") is married to the former Ann Fowler of Chicago, Ill., and they have two sons - William Harris and Leo - and a daughter, Ella.
