The No. 1 overall seed Maryland men's lacrosse team is set open its 39th NCAA Tournament appearance Sunday at 12:30 pm as it hosts Quinnipiac at Capital One Field at Maryland Stadium. The Terps (53-36 all-time in NCAA) are the top-seed for the sixth time in their history, and first time since 1987.

FACING OFF

1

Maryland won its first Big Ten Tournament with a 16-9 defeat of Penn State in the semifinals and 14-8 victory over Rutgers in the championship game. It was just the third time in history the Terps had swept conference regular season and tournament titles.

1

Sunday's meeting marks the first matchup in history between Maryland and Quinnipiac. The Terps have a short history against teams currently in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, compiling a 2-0 record with wins over Detroit (2011) and Marist (2012).

8

Maryland has protected the ball well over its last six games, averaging just 8.0 turnovers during that span. The Terps have not committed more than nine turnovers in the stretch, highlighted by just five turnovers against Johns Hopkins on April 30.

13

Maryland stretched its winning streak to 13 games with its win against Rutgers, surpassing the 1987 team for the single-season program record. The Terps are scoring 12 goals per game during the streak, while allowing just 7.5 goals per game.

16

The Terps are 16-4 (.800) all-time in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, including wins in seven of their last eight such contests. Maryland is also 32-6 at home in the NCAA Tournament. Head coach John Tillman is 11-5 as a head coach in the NCAA Tournament - all at Maryland.

19

Junior Matt Rambo has totaled 19 points over his last four games, including 11 points in the Big Ten Tournament to claim Most Valuable Player honors. His versatility has been on full display in those four games, posting 10 goals and nine assists.

30

The Maryland offense exploded for 30 goals (19 in the first half) in its pair of victories in the Big Ten Tournament. It was the most goals in a two-game span for the Terps since February of 2014. Sophomore Connor Kelly had a career-high four goals in both games to lead the way.

49

Maryland's seven-man defensive starting unit has played an average of 49 career games, led by Greg Danseglio (61) and Matt Dunn (59). Including the starting six on offense, the Terps have played a collective 703 career games - an average of 46 games per player.

63

The Terrapins are 63-4 under John Tillman when scoring at least 10 goals in a game, including a spectacular mark of 44-1 over the last four seasons. That trend has continued this season with a perfect 13-0 mark. Maryland is also 61-4 when leading at halftime under Tillman.

100

Junior Matt Rambo became just the 13th player in Maryland history to reach 100 career goals Saturday against Rutgers. He is the first Terp to accomplish the feat since Grant Catalino in 2010. Rambo has also tallied a point in 35 straight games and ranks 23rd in Maryland history with 141 points.

GAME NOTES

COACHING MATCHUP

- **John Tillman** is in his ninth season as a head coach, and sixth with the Terps, with a .688 winning percentage. Tillman is 77-25 (.755) as Maryland's head coach.
- Quinnipiac's Eric Fekete is in his 15th season with the Bobcats.

TILLMAN IN THE NCAA'S

- The meeting with Quinnipiac will be **John Tillman's** 17th NCAA tournament game as a head coach, compiling an 11-5 overall record. He has led Maryland to four final fours and three championship game appearances in five seasons.
- Tillman is 4-1 in first round games, 4-0 in quarterfinal games and 3-1 in semifinals.
- Tillman is the only coach in NCAA history to guide two unseeded teams to back-to-back appearances in the Final Four (2011-12).
- As an assistant coach, Tillman helped guide Navy to four consecutive NCAA tournaments from 2004-07, including a run to the 2004 championship game.

MARYLAND IN THE NCAA'S

- Maryland is playing in its 39th NCAA Tournament - the second-most since the inception of the NCAA Tournament in 1971. The Terps have also qualified for 14 straight NCAA Tournaments - the longest active streak in the nation.
- The Terps have won the third-most Division I NCAA Tournament games, compiling a 53-36 overall record in 87 games. Only Johns Hopkins (70-34) and Syracuse (63-24) have won more Division I tournament games.
- The Terps have captured two titles. Only nine other schools have ever won the NCAA Championship: Syracuse (10), Johns Hopkins (9), Princeton (6), North Carolina (4), Virginia (5), Cornell (3), Duke (3), Loyola (1) and Denver (1).

MARYLAND WINS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- Maryland defeated Rutgers, 14-8, to claim the Big Ten Conference Tournament title May 7 at Homewood Field. The championship marked Maryland's fifth conference tournament title in history, and third regular season and conference tournament sweep.
- With the win, Maryland (14-2) earned the Big Ten Conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, marking the Terps' NCAA-best 14th straight NCAA Tournament appearance.
- Junior **Matt Rambo**, who finished with 11 points (6G, 5A) in the tournament, was named Big Ten Tournament MVP. Joining Rambo on the Big Ten All-Tournament team were seniors **Kyle Bernlohr**, **Bryan Cole** and **Greg Danseglio** and sophomore **Connor Kelly**.

TERPS ADVANCE TO BIG TEN FINAL

- The top-seed Maryland men's lacrosse team opened with six straight goals and never looked back as it defeated 4-seed Penn State, 16-9, in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals May 5 at Homewood Field
- The win marked the Terrapins' 12th consecutive victory, matching the single-season program record set by the 1987 team.
- Sophomore **Connor Kelly** scored a career-high four goals and **Matt Rambo** added three goals and two assists, while **Kyle Bernlohr** made 12 saves in net for the Terrapins.

MARYLAND BEATS HOPKINS; CLAIMS BIG

- Maryland used a complete team effort to defeat No. 8 Johns Hopkins, 11-8, and claim the 2016 Big Ten Title outright in lacrosse's greatest rivalry on April 30.
- Despite just a 5-for-22 effort at the faceoff X, the Terps found a way to win. Senior **Bryan Cole** led the offense with four points (1G, 3A), while **Matt Rambo** and **Connor Kelly** each added two goals and an assist. Goalie **Kyle Bernlohr** made three big time saves in the fourth quarter.

GET TO 10 AND WIN

- Since **John Tillman** took over the program in 2011, Maryland has won 63 of the 67 games in which it has scored 10 or more goals for a .940 winning percentage.
- The Terps have won 46 of their last 47 games when scoring at least 10 goals, only falling to Johns Hopkins during that streak in 2015.

HOLDING OPPONENTS TO SINGLE-DIGITS

- Maryland is 69-10 since Tillman took over the program in 2011 when it allows nine goals or less, for an .873 winning percentage.
- The Terps are 46-5 over the last four seasons when allowing less than 10 goals.

CONSECUTIVE 10-WIN SEASONS

- Maryland's 10-5 win over 7th-ranked Navy on April 19, 2016 extended the Terps' streak of double-digit win seasons to 14, which is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse.

TERPS' 91ST SEASON OF LACROSSE

- The Terps boast an all-time record of 775-261-4 (.740), dating back to the first varsity team in 1924 (a team was not fielded in 1944 and 1945 due to World War II). Maryland has finished every one of its previous 90 seasons with a .500 or better record, including last season when the Terps went 15-4. The program reached the 700-win milestone with a 15-6 victory over Penn on April 14, 2009 at Ludwig Field.
- During the decade of the 2000s, Maryland went 111-49 for a .694 win percentage, making it the winningest decade in Terrapin lacrosse history. In the decade of the 1990s, Maryland posted a 95-47 record. The .669 winning percentage matched Maryland's win percentage of the 1980s when the Terps went 83-41 and also compiled a .669 win percentage.
- Through the 2015 season, Maryland is 53-17 in the 2010's for a .757 winning percentage - on pace for the best decade in Maryland history.

THE 700 CLUB

- Maryland's 15-6 victory over Penn on April 14, 2009 was the program's 700th victory in 84 seasons of varsity men's lacrosse. The Terps join Johns Hopkins, Syracuse, Navy, Army and Cornell as the only programs with 700 or more Division I wins.
- Two things that make Maryland's accomplishment all the more impressive is that the Terps reached the 700-win plateau in just their 84th season. Only Syracuse reached win No. 700 in as few seasons, but it took the Orange 53 more games than Maryland. In fact, Maryland needed only 940 games to reach 700 wins and only Johns Hopkins needed fewer games (932) to hit the historic number, but the Blue Jays did so in their 105th season.

JOHN TILLMAN

HEAD COACH • SIXTH SEASON AT MARYLAND • CORNELL '91

John Tillman was hired as the University of Maryland's head men's lacrosse coach on June 16, 2010, becoming the ninth coach in the 85-year history of the program. Tillman came to College Park after three years returning Harvard lacrosse to national prominence and twelve seasons as the top assistant at Navy, during which the Midshipmen experienced some of the best years in their storied history.

Tillman has experienced immense success since taking the reins in College Park, leading the Terps to four NCAA Final Fours in five seasons. He has garnered a 63-23 (.733) overall record at Maryland - the most wins ever by a Maryland coach through their first five seasons. The Maryland defense has ranked in the nation's top-10 in scoring defense all five seasons of his tenure.

Maryland put together one of its best seasons in program history in 2015 when Tillman led the team to a Terrapin single-season record 15 victories and a berth in the NCAA national title game. The Terps featured the top-ranked scoring defense (7.1 goals allowed/g), as junior Kyle Bernlohr claimed the Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award. Additionally, five players earned USILA All-America honors and Casey Ikeda was a USILA Scholar All-American.

Tillman captured his first career ACC Coach of the Year honor by leading the Terps to the 2014 ACC regular season championship and the program's third Final Four appearance in four seasons. Senior Niko Amato earned the Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award as the nation's most outstanding goalie, as five Maryland players earned USILA All-America honors.

Tillman's third season in College Park saw the Terps ascend to the top of the national rankings for the first time since 2006, following a 12-10 win at then-No. 1 Loyola on Feb. 21. Maryland earned a bid to the NCAA tournament for the 11th consecutive season, which is the longest active streak in Division I men's lacrosse. Seniors Jesse Bernhardt and John Haus became the first Terrapins since 2006 to earn first-team All-America honors, leading a group of seven Maryland honorees.

The 2012 season was viewed by many as a rebuilding year after Maryland graduated 17 seniors in 2011, but Tillman rallied the team and the Terrapins returned to the NCAA championship game with sensational postseason performances from seniors Joe Cummings and Drew Snider among others. Five Terps earned All-America honors following Maryland's 12-6 campaign and junior Jesse Bernhardt was selected as co-recipient of the ACC's first-ever Defensive Player of the Year award.

In his first season in College Park Tillman guided the Terps to a 13-5 record, the 2011 ACC championship (the program's first since 2005) and a berth in the NCAA championship game (the first for the Terps since 1998). Eight Terrapins earned All-America honors in Tillman's first season, which is the most Maryland players selected in a single-season since 2004.

Widely considered one of the top young coaches in the country and a dynamic recruiter, Tillman was the head men's lacrosse coach at Harvard for three seasons prior to his arrival in College Park. His last recruiting class for the Crimson was rated No. 3 in the nation, according to Inside Lacrosse.

During his three seasons at Harvard, Tillman compiled an overall record of 20-19, including an 8-5 mark in 2009, which was the Crimson's highest win total since 1999.

Tillman's time at Harvard produced a number of the most memorable wins in the program's history. This past season, during which Harvard climbed as high as No. 11 in the national polls, Tillman guided the Crimson to an 11-8 victory over No. 6 Princeton, which was the first time Harvard had defeated the Tigers in 20 years. In 2009, Tillman led the Crimson to a season-opening 9-6 upset victory at No. 5 Duke.

Tillman improved his teams in every aspect over the past three seasons. Prior to his arrival in Cambridge, Mass., the Crimson ranked 40th and 42nd, respectively, in total offense and defense. Tillman's defense ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation, while his offense rose to No. 15 in the country. He also dramatically improved Harvard's extra-man offense, from the 51st-ranked unit before he arrived, to a perennial top 15 unit.

Prior to Harvard, Tillman spent 12 seasons at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md. After six seasons as an assistant coach, he was promoted to head assistant coach and offensive coordinator prior to the 2002 season. From 2004 through 2007, Tillman helped lead the Midshipmen to the some of the most successful seasons in program history, including four straight NCAA tournament berths, four consecutive Patriot League tournament titles and four straight Patriot League regular season championships.

In 2004, with Tillman at the helm of the Navy offense, the Mids made a remarkable run through the NCAA tournament, defeating three Ivy League teams (Penn, Cornell and Princeton) en route to a spot in the national championship game. Tillman's offense was a key component of Navy's success that season, ranking third in the nation in scoring offense. Following the Mids' tremendous 2004 season, Tillman was awarded the first of his two Collegiate Lacrosse Assistant Coach of the Year Awards by the Maryland State Lacrosse Coaches Association.

During his 12 season at the Naval Academy, Tillman was responsible for helping develop first team All-America midfielders Graham Gill and Billy Looney and second team All-America attackman Jon Birsner. In his 12 seasons in Annapolis, the Mids compiled an overall record of 104-63.

Tillman started his coaching career as an assistant coach at Ithaca College. He spent four seasons (1992-95) with the Bombers, helping lead them to the Division III national semifinals in 1992.

In addition to his extensive coaching experience, Tillman also serves as a member of the Tewaaraton Award Men's Selection Committee.

A 1991 graduate of Cornell University's School of Hotel Administration, Tillman was a three-year member of the school's Dean's list. He had the opportunity to play for legendary coach Richie Moran and was a member of the 1989 squad that earned a berth in the NCAA tournament. Tillman was a goalie when he entered college, but played a number of positions for the Big Red, giving him a great appreciation and understanding for the overall game of lacrosse.

Tillman played professionally for the Baltimore Thunder and the Washington Power of the National Lacrosse League. During his final two seasons in Baltimore, he helped the Thunder reach the NLL Championship and Semifinals. Tillman also played for the Toyota Lacrosse Club, who won five-consecutive Southern Division Championships, including a world championship in 2000.

A native of Corning, N.Y., Tillman was previously commissioned into the U.S. Navy as a fleet support officer and was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal.
