Terps to Play Five in Cajan Country

The Maryland softball team (1-8) will hit the road for the third straight weekend when the squad travels to Lafayette, La. to play in the Mardi Gras Invitational presented by DoubleTree Feb. 24-26.

- The tournament, hosted by Lousiana Lafayette at Lamson Park, will also feature Drake, Bowling Green, Bradley and Dartmouth.
- Maryland will attempt to build momentum from its stunning 4-2 upset over No. 1 Florida last weekend in the team's final game of the Aquafina Invitational.
- Maryland's game vs. ULL will be streamed via ragincajuns.com.

Maryland Sends Shockwaves Throughout College Softball

- Maryland's upset over No. 1 Florida on Feb. 18 was one of the top stories in college softball on the weekend, as the Terps defeated the Gators 4-2 in Gainesville.
- The Terps (1-8) entered the game winless on the season, but erased a two-run deficit in the first inning with four unanswered runs in the fourth and fifth to knock off the previously unbeaten Gators (8-1).
- The win was the first for Maryland over a ranked opponent since May 12, 2012 when the team topped Florida State 4-3 in College Park.
- The four earned runs forced off of senior Florida pitcher and All-American Delanie Gourley were the first she had surrendered all season, entering the game 4-0 on the year with a 0.00
- The loss was the first for Florida at the Aquafina Invitational (or its home tournament) since
- Florida's only regular-season non-conference losses the past four seasons came against Missouri (then in the Big 12) and Florida State teams ranked in the top 10 at the time. Both losses were in extra innings. Even then, neither opponent managed to score as many as four runs in the regulation seven innings.

Martin Steps Up

- Senior Madison Martin was instrumental in Maryland's win over Florida, going 3-for-4 at the
 plate with a run and RBI while earning the save in the 4-2 victory.
- She came through clutch in the circle for the Terps in the bottom of the 6th inning, getting out of a bases loaded jam with a strikeout and ground out. She then closed out the Gators in the bottom of the 7th to hand the No.1 -ranked hosts their first loss of the year. She hit .583 for the weekend overall at the Aquafina Invitational and tallied 5 strikeouts from the circle.
- Martin now leads the team in batting average (.529), on base pct. (.600), ERA (4.05) and strikeouts (13).

Dewey Gets it Done

- Senior Hannah Dewey turned in her best performance of the season against Florida, tying her season high for innings pitched (5.1) while allowing only one earned run and four hits.
- After two runs crossed in the first inning, Dewey allowed just two more hits and no runs to set Maryland up for the upset victory.

Historic Win

- The win over top-ranked Florida marked the first time since the program's inception in 1995 that Maryland defeated a No. 1 team in the NFCA Coaches Poll.
- Maryland only other win over a top-5 team came back in 1995, when the Terps defeated No 3 ranked Arizona 7-3 on May 22 during the NCAA Tournament.

Freshmen Firepower

- Freshmen Amanda Brashear and Anna Kufta have turned in a pair of solid weekends in their first taste of college softball this month.
- Brashear led Maryland in hitting at the Texas Invitational, knocking a team-best eight hits for a .500 average while starting in every game in the outfield. The Chino Calif. has a team-best 12 hits and two triples.
- Kufta flashed her power potential in nine starts, as she leads the team in slugging pct. (759), home runs (3) and RBIs (5). After starting her first eight games at 3B, she played short stop for the Terps in the team's 402 upset win over No. 1 Florida.

Sky is the Limit

- Junior Skylynne Ellazar will look to build off her tremendous sophomore season in 2016 for the Terps, where she finished with the third highest season batting average ever (.399) for a Terrapin.
- Ellazar is second on the team in batting average (.393) and is tied for the team lead in runs scored (5).
- Ellazar also currently holds the career batting average record at Maryland (min. 80 at-bats) with a .381 mark through two collegiate seasons. She is a full .40 points above the No. 2 player on the list (Vangie Galindo 09-12) and will again be a staple in the lineup for the Terps this season.
- "Sky" led team in batting average (.399), slugging percentage (.574), on base percentage (.458), runs scored (32), hits (59), doubles (12), total bases (85) and assists (103) and was second in RBIs (29) and home runs (4) last year.
- Ellazar was named one of "10 NCAA Softball Juniors to Watch in 2017" by fastpitchnews. com on January 30.

Coach of the Week

- Head coach **Julie Wright** received recognition in the Washington, DC local sports scene, as she was named the coach of the week on Feb. 22 by ABC-7 WJLA.
- The accolade comes after Wright and her squad's upset win over No. 1 Florida on Feb. 18.

200 on the Horizon for Wright

- Head coach Julie Wright is within striking distance of 200 career wins, coming into the 2017 with 191 career victories in her eighth season as a Division I head softball coach.
- After amassing 53 wins during her two-year stint at Akron, she put together 126 victories at Idaho State, which included three consecutive Big Sky Regular Season titles.

2016 Rewind

- Maryland is coming off a 12-40 season which saw the team win four games in the Big Ten.
- The team bid farewell to its graduating seniors Corey Schwartz and Lindsey Schmeiser. Schmeiser was an All-Big Ten selection and holds the program record for home runs (32), runs scored (138) and single season RBIs (59) and doubles (21).
- The Terps return 13 letterwinners from last season and six starters.



INFIELD PREVIEW


The Maryland Terrapin infield will be a mixed bag of new and familiar faces when the team hits the diamond in 2017.

Three of the four positions will feature players who did not start at that position for the majority of last season. With the graduation of four-year starters Lindsey Schmeiser and Corey Schwartz in the middle infield, the two Terrapin greats will be replaced by former teammates. On the outside of the infield, a freshman will get the role of the hot corner while a two-horse competition will be the story at first base leading up to opening day on Friday, Feb. 10 against No. 16 Minnesota.

Junior **Skylynne Ellazar** had one of the best seasons ever in a Terrapin uniform last season. The Kahului, Hawaii native started in all 49 games she appeared in, hitting a tremendous .399 with a .458 on base percentage and .574 slugging percentage. Ellazar's .399 mark ranks as the third best single-season batting average in Maryland softball history. After starting most of the season at third base last year, Ellazar will make the move to shortstop for her junior season, anchoring an infield of which she was voted the captain by her teammates earlier this offseason.

"Sky Ellazar has really found a home at short," said head coach Julie Wright. "She's worked hard on her game, on her footwork and her throwing. She was our leading hitter last year and brings a huge element. Sky also brings passion and energy to the infield as well nad great leadership. She has really settled in and done a nice job in preseason."

Right next to her in the infield will be fifth-year

senior **Juli Strange**, who spent the offseason recovering from an ACL-tear inflicted in October of 2015. The Valencia, Calif. native is no stranger to the infield, with a solid history of contributions the three seasons prior to last, with 145 starts. In 2015, Strange started all 54 games at third base, hitting .264 with a .383 on base percentage. The redshirt senior is back and ready to contribute.

"Juli is excited to be back. She's in her fifth year," said Wright. "She brings a lot of experience and talent. I don't think anyone's seen her play in a long time so it's been great. I hadn't even had the ability to really coach her yet since we've only been here a few years. It's been fun to watch her play. She brings wonderful defense to second base. She's going to do a great job over there and brings great leadership to the infield."

Over at third base there will be a new face to Terrapin fans, but one that Coach Wright believes they are going to get to know very quickly.

"Anna Kufta is going to be an outstanding player and have a wonderful career here at Maryland," praised Wright. "She's going to be well known by our fans both offensively and defensively."

Kufta is the third west-coast native projected to start in Maryland's infield, hailing from Huntington Beach, Calif. The freshman comes to College Park with a plethora of experience and confidence, having won the 2016 Premier Girls Fastpitch National Championship with her club team last summer. After an impressive fall season, Kufta is ready for a dynamite freshman campaign at third base.

Unlike the other three positions on the diamond, first base is still an open competition between junior Jacqui Pascual and senior Jordan Aughinbaugh. Both saw time at first base last season, with Aughinbaugh getting the call in 28 games. Both Terrapins will be ready when they hear their number called. "At first base right now we've got two kids competing," said Wright. It's between Jacqui Pascual and Jordan Aughinbaugh. They're toe-to-toe, head-to-head every day. Working hard both offensively and defensively. They both bring different traits to it that are really good. Both are really competing hard to see who gets the job."

With Ellazar and Strange up the middle and Kuf-

ta and Aughinbaugh or Pascual at the corner, the Maryland infield will provide strong offense and dynamic defense in 2017.

OUTFIELD PREVIEW

Just like the infield, a mix of old and new will be the case for the Maryland outfield in 2017 as six Terrapins fight for three spots. Three freshman and three returning starters will be in contention for playing time, but no matter who takes the field, the group will be a position of strength for Maryland in 2017.

"It's interesting," said head coach Julie Wright. "We have a very talented outfield. We have three freshmen that can play it and three returners that have been starters."

Out of the five in the freshman class, three will see time in the outfield, including Maryland native Kassidy Cross, who started a majority of the fall season in center field.

"Kassidy Cross is a Maryland product who's done a nice job in center field for us and has done a nice job at the plate as well," said Wright.


Cross comes from nearby Northern, Md. where she contributed to three 3A Maryland State Championships. Northern is the same school that former Terrapins Kaitlyn and Lindsey Schmeiser came from. Joining Cross is fellow freshman Amanda Brashear.

"Then we have **Amanda Brashear**, who's also a freshman from California," said Wright. "She has a great arm, a great sense of the game too. She was raised by a coach. Amanda does a nice job out there."

Brashear also comes from a line of winning, posting four top-five national finishes and a 2011 national championship with her club team, the Firecrackers. Rounding out the freshman in the outfield is **Brigette Nordberg**, who hails from nearby Pennsylvania.

"Brigette has a powerful arm and she can get out and run," said Wright." She's doing a nice job as well."

The three freshmen have been able to learn and take pointers from the three upperclassmen in the



outfield, who have combined for 152 starts in the Maryland red and black.

Destiney Henderson started all 52 games in the outfield last season, a majority of them in left field. Voted the captain of the outfield by her teammates before this season, the Fontana, Calif. native knows what it takes to get it done on the grass.

Henderson ranked third on the team in runs scored (23) and led the team in three-hit games (4) a year ago. Nothing got by her in the outfield either, adding 57 putouts.

"Destiney anchored left field for us most of last year," said Wright. "She does a really nice job and is feisty at the plate."

The lone All-Big Ten selection from a year ago, Sarah Calta is recovered and eager to return after an ACL-injury halted her career 2016 season. The Maryland product lit it up in conference season, batting .408 from the plate and added four triples. "Sarah Calta was one of our leading hitters," said Wright. "She played right field for us most of last year before she got hurt at Michigan. Sarah is pretty much back and she's worked her tail off to rehab that ACL. She's done a really nice job in preseason."

A familiar face to Terrapin fans, **Hannah Dewey** will also see time in the outfield, as well as in the pitching circle. Dewey is also a force at the plate, posting a .311 combined batting average through her three years in College Park.

"Hannah plays a mean outfield and can really swing

it at the plate," said Wright. "She's a huge asset for us."

Wright and staff will not be short of options in the outfield in 2017, as the position is primed to provide excitement both in the grass and at the plate.

BULLPEN PREVIEW

The foundation of any softball team lies in the bullpen, the battery of the squad. Piecing that puzzle together will be the key for the Terrapin bullpen in 2017. For Maryland, this puzzle starts with the team's leader, senior catcher **Kristina Dillard**.

"Kristina Dillard is our anchor," said head coach Julie Wright. "She's our overall captain, our leader. KD is the one that everyone's drawn to because she has great energy and good vibes. Just a wonderful personality. Everybody looks to her, she just has a magnetic personality."

Dillard, who transferred from Louisville before last season, made an immediate impact during her first season for her home state school. The Hanover, Md. native had the second highest batting average at .342 last season and led the team in RBI's with 30. Defensively, Dillard led the Big Ten in runners caught stealing with 16.

"KD" as her teammates call her was voted the overall team captain this season and will look to lead her squad both at the plate, behind it and in the dugout.

Freshman Anna Kufta and sophomore Andi Jarvis will also be in line to provide some innings behind the dish for the Terps. Throwing to the catcher will be Madison Martin, Lauren Graves, Hannah Dewey, Ari Jarvis and Sami Main.

Martin, one of three seniors in the bullpen, was voted the captain of the group. The Edmond, Okla. native was a mainstay on the staff last year as well, posting the lowest ERA and 60 strikeouts.

"The key for Madison is she's back healthy," said Wright. "That's going to be huge for us. That kid can spin it and she's quite the player. You can look for her offensively as well."

Joining the staff this year as someone that Wright expects to make an impact right away is freshman Lauren Graves. Making the trip up north from

Arkansas, Graves has taken a lot in this fall and spring training period as she gets ready to make her collegiate debut.

"Lauren Graves has learned a ton from our pitching coach Lisa Norris," said Wright. "Lauren has really grown a lot in the game. This has been a learning year for her no doubt. She brings a nice element to us that we haven't had before. She can spin it and throws higher velocity pitches."

A threat at the plate, the circle and the outfield, senior Hannah Dewey brings a load of experience to the bullpen, having pitched over 200 innings and striking out over 100 batters in her career.

"Hannah Dewey is going to bring some nice innings for us," said Wright. "Lefty-lefty matchups. She does really well against lefties. We're pleased to see how she has continued her growth on the mound."

Rounding out the staff will be sophomores Ari Jarvis and Sami Main. Both saw limited action in their freshman years, but look to expand their roles in their second go-around.

"Ari has done some nice stuff so far as a sophomore," said Wright. "I've really been impressed with her in scrimmages this so far. She's done a nice job developing some pitches this year that she didn't have last year. Sami, that young lady is one of the hardest working players I've ever coached and because of that she is pushing everyone," said Wright. "I'm proud of all the work she's done."

Depth will be essential to the Terrapin bullpen in 2017. These five pitchers and Dillard will all play a part in keeping opposing teams off the scoreboard this season.

Julie Wright was announced as the head coach of the Maryland softball program July 17, 2015. Wright came to Maryland with five years of head coaching experience at Idaho State, where she led the program to three straight Big Sky titles.

"We are excited to welcome Julie to our Maryland Athletics family," director of athletics Kevin Anderson said. "She has done a remarkable job at Idaho State, leading the program to three consecutive conference championships. Julie brings outstanding energy and passion to our program. Throughout her accomplished coaching career, she has been committed to successfully developing students both academically and athletically. We are excited to have Julie lead our softball program in the highly competitive Big Ten Conference."

In her first season at the helm for the Terps, Wright led Maryland to 12 wins including victories over three NCAA Tournament teams. The Terps also knocked off a pair of eventual top-25 opponents, notching wins over Florida Atlantic and Nebraska.

Sarah Calta and Skylynne Ellazar had career years during Wright's inaugural 2016 season. Calta earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors by batting .408 in Big Ten play. Against NCAA Tournament teams Ohio State and Nebraska, the junior hit .632 with two triples and five RBIs. Ellazar hit .399 on the season, which stands as the third best single season average in school history.

Prior to coming to Maryland, Wright spent the last five seasons as the head coach at Idaho State. accumulating 126 wins in that time. Through Wright's leadership, the Bengals captured Big Sky regularseason championships in the conference's first three seasons sponsoring softball as she secured the most wins in program history (98) in that span.

"I would like to thank Kevin Anderson, Kristen Brown, Damon Evans and the rest of the hiring committee for this amazing opportunity," Wright said.

Wright led the Bengals to new heights as Idaho State student-athletes won the last three conference MVP honors. Wright has seen 34 players earn allconference honors, and the Bengals boasted the program's first-ever first team Academic All-American in Terah Blackwell, as well as NFCA All-Region team members for the first time.

The Bengals' turnaround began in 2013 as ISU won the first-ever Big Sky regular season title while winning a program record 29 games. The win total was eclipsed a year later when Idaho State finished 35-20. Under Wright, Idaho State has become one of the most potent offensive teams in the nation, posting the fourth-ranked batting average and fifth-ranked scoring in 2014.

Prior to Idaho State, Wright spent four seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Wisconsin. While with the Badgers, she was primarily responsible for recruitment and scheduling while serving as the team's academic liaison.

Wright served as head coach at Akron for two seasons from 2004-06, leading the team to a 53-52 record and the Zips' first appearance in the Mid-American Conference Tournament in four years.

She also has spent time as an assistant at the University of Kansas (1999-04) and Ohio (1996-99). At Kansas, she was the primary coach offensively and defensively for All-American Christi Musser.

Wright graduated from Ohio University in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in sociology/criminology and a minor in psychology.
