**STORYLINES**

**MARYLAND HITS THE ROAD FOR THREE AT ILLINOIS**

- The Maryland softball team (15-20, 5-1 B1G) will be back on the road April 6-8 for a three-game series at Illinois.
- Maryland will look to build off the program's best-ever start in Big Ten competition, as the Terps have started 5-1 after a 2-1 weekend at Penn State and sweep over Iowa.
- Illinois (22-13, 3-4 B1G) is coming off a 1-3 week in conference action, splitting two games with Northwestern before dropping two at Minnesota.

**HISTORIC START**

- Maryland's 5-1 start in Big Ten play is the best since joining the conference in 2014-15, and is the second-best start ever in conference competition in program history.
- Maryland's last 5-1 start in conference action came during the 1999 season, when the Terps started ACC competition 6-1 before winning the conference regular season and advancing to the NCAA Regional Finals.

**TERPS ON THE UPSWING**

- Maryland has posted nine wins in its last 12 games dating back to March 10, which has included six one-run victories and two extra-innings wins.
- Maryland bounced back from a loss in the first leg of its doubleheader against Penn State, run-ruling the Nittany Lions in five innings to take the second game 8-0. It was Maryland's first conference series win since 2016.
- Maryland then clinched back-to-back Big Ten series victories for the first time ever with a sweep of Iowa March 30-April 1. It was Maryland's first conference sweep since 2015 as the Terps are in the midst of their first five-game winning streak since 2015.

**GOOD AS GOLDEN**

- Junior Sydney Golden has been outstanding during the first two weeks on conference play, holding a 0.84 ERA in 25.0 innings.
- Golden in 4-0 in four appearances the past two weeks, and has struck out 11 while throwing 24 shutout innings during the stretch.
- Golden went 6.0 innings in relief to earn the win against Iowa on March 30, fanning six batters, including a three-strikeout inning in the seventh, to keep Maryland alive in a one-run game. She followed in up with a complete game win over the Hawkeyes on April 1, to complete a 0.00 ERA weekend.

**SKY HIGH**

- Senior Skylynn Ellazar came through in a crucial moments for the Terps in their first two Big Ten series of the season, launching a go-ahead solo shot in the top of the seventh to help the Terps clinch the series over Penn State on March 25. She went 6-for-9 from the plate while slugging 1.111 on the weekend.
- Ellazar was the hero again against Iowa on April 1, scoring the only run of the game with a solo homer in the fourth inning. It was the fourth home run of the season for the Kahului, Hawaii native, who has hit .524 in conference play with six RBIs and five runs.

**HAWAIIAN HOMECOMING FOR ELLAZAR**

- Senior Skylynn Ellazar played in her home state for the first time in her collegiate career at the Wahine Rainbow Classic March 16-18, helping Maryland to a 3-2 record on the weekend.
- The Kahului, Hawaii native played her high school ball at Baldwin on the island of Maui, before committing to play nearly 5,000 miles away at Maryland.
- Ellazar has paced Maryland's offense as one of the team's top of the lineup hitters during her senior season, holding a team-best .313 average while notching two home runs, 12 runs and seven RBIs.

## **FIVE-RUN FIFTH PROPELS TERPS TO WIN VS. HAWAII**

- Maryland tallied a season-high 12 hits to score seven runs and knock off host Hawaii 7-6 in the finale of the Rainbow Wahine Classic on March 19.
- A five-run fifth inning made the difference for the Terrapins, as the squad battled back from a three-run deficit to plate the eventual game-winning run.
- It was the most hits in a single inning for Maryland this season, and tied the team's single inning high for runs (5) with the five scored in the Terps' 9-5 win over Iowa State on February 23.

## **BRIGETTE BALLIN' OUT**

- Sophomore Brigette Nordberg has put together a solid season at the plate in her second collegiate campaign, ranking second on the team in slugging percentage (.418) with a team-high eight doubles.
- The Exton, Pa. native surpassed her hits total from last season in 19 games this year, and has cemented herself as a top of the lineup hitter.

## **DENHART DEALING**

- Freshman Ryan Denhart has made an immediate impact for the Terrapins in her first collegiate season, holding a team-best 2.49 ERA in 115.1 innings pitched.
- The Los Alamitos, Calif. native posted a career-high nine strikeouts in a complete game effort against Jacksonville on March 9 at the Maryland Invitational, finishing with a 1.31 ERA and 17 strikeouts on the weekend.
- Denhart had a standout weekend at the Black & Red Classic, holding a 0.75 ERA through 18.2 innings while earning two wins and a save.
- She threw two complete games at the Tiger Invite, including a three-hit effort in 7.0 innings to help the Terps clinch a 4-1 win over Delaware on February 17.

## **ESLICK MAKES HER MARK**

- Freshman Hannah Eslick made her first career hit count, driving in the game-winning RBI against Middle Tennessee on February 11.
- It was just the second career at bat for the Glen Burnie, Md. native, who may see some time at third base and in pinch hit opportunities this season.
- She then connected on her first career home run on February 23 vs. No. 2/1 Florida, getting a solo shot off of the Gators' Kelly Barnhill, the reigning USA Softball Collegiate National Player of the Year.

## **2017 REWIND**

- Maryland is coming off a 11-39-1 season which saw the team earn three wins over ranked opponents.
  - The Terps knocked off #1 Florida, #24 Missouri and #18 Michigan over the course of the 2017 campaign, the most wins in a season over ranked teams for Maryland since 2010.
  - The win over top-ranked Florida marked the first time since the program's inception in 1995 that Maryland defeated a No. 1 team in the NFCA Coaches Poll.
- Maryland only other win over a top-5 team came back in 1995, when the Terps defeated No. 3 ranked Arizona 7-3 on May 22 during the NCAA Tournament.
- Maryland saw six seniors depart to graduation last season in Jordan Aughinbaugh, Sarah Calta, Hannah Dewey, Kristina Dillard, Madison Martin and Juli Strange.

## **WRIGHT REACHES 200 WINS IN FRONT OF RECORD CROWD**

- Head coach Julie Wright won her 200th career game on April 15, 2017 as the Terps defeated No. 18 Michigan at Maryland Stadium.
- To add to the excitement of the day, Maryland Softball Stadium set a new attendance record with an announced crowd of 1,015 to see Maryland clinch its third ranked win of the year.
- After amassing 53 wins during her two-year stint at Akron, Wright put together 126 victories at Idaho State, which included three consecutive Big Sky Regular Season titles. She enters 2018 with 23 wins at the helm for UMD.

## **TERPS ADD THREE TRANSFERS FOR 2018**

- Head coach Julie Wright bolstered her roster with three transfers for the 2018 season, adding a pitcher and two position players to the fold.
- Junior Pitcher Sydney Golden comes to College Park after two seasons at Cal State Fullerton, where she was named the 2016 Big West Conference Freshman Pitcher of the Year. Golden saw 80.0 innings of work this past season, winning seven times while notching 48 strikeouts and a 2.98 ERA. Golden helped lead the Titans to two straight NCAA Regional appearances and two Big West Conference Championships during her time in Fullerton, and was an understudy of new Terrapin pitching coach Tori Tyson.
- Junior Mikayla Werahiko comes to Maryland after a successful two-year stint at Florida Southwestern State College in Fort Myers, Fla. Werahiko is a two-time Suncoast Conference First Team honoree, and helped lead FSW to its first-ever FCSAA State Championship and second consecutive berth to the NJCAA Division I Softball Championship last season.
- Junior Bailey Boyd will play her first season at Maryland after transferring from Towson, where she appeared in 55 career games while making 45 starts. The Silver Spring Md. had her most productive season as a freshman, where she was the CAA Rookie of the Week honors twice in consecutive weeks (March 14 & 21).

# 2018 MARYLAND SOFTBALL

## OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- Maryland softball head coach Julie Wright announced her squad's four team captains for the upcoming 2018 season on February 6. Senior Skylynn Ellazar, senior Destiney Henderson, junior Sydney Golden and sophomore Anna Kufta have been selected as this year's captains.  
 - "I am proud to announce these four outstanding young women as our 2018 captains," said Wright. "They all bring something a little different that will help our young team stay on the right track through the typical grind of the season. Leadership is hard and I feel confident these 4 are ready for the challenge."

## GOING INTERNATIONAL

- Junior Skylynn Ellazar has been busy on the diamond since the end of last season competing for the Philippines National Team.  
 - Ellazar's journey with the Philippines began last summer, playing in the Canada Cup and World Cup of Softball in Oklahoma, City Oklahoma.  
 - Her most recent stint with the Philippines Blu Girls took her to Taiwan, where she took part in the Asian Softball Championships. Ellazar helped the Philippines to a silver medal finish, while the team has qualified for the 2018 Asian Games in Indonesia and the 2018 World Championship in Chiba, Japan.  
 - Junior transfer Mikayla Werahiko also brings international playing experience to the fold, representing New Zealand at the 2016 World Cup of Softball in Oklahoma City.  
 - She also competed for Team New Zealand at the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship in Surrey, B.C. At the World Championships, Werahiko hit .474 with four doubles and nine hits in seven games.

## VIC + TORI = VICTORY!

- Maryland head softball coach Julie Wright announced the addition of Tori Tyson and Victoria Hayward as assistant coaches for the 2017-18 season on June 27.  
 - Tyson will serve as the Terrapin pitching coach after two-year stint at Cal State Fullerton, while Hayward will coach Maryland's hitters after serving two years on the UMass staff. Tyson joins Maryland after helping lead the Titans to two straight NCAA Regional appearances and two Big West Conference Championships. Fullerton's pitchers thrived under Tyson, pitching 46 complete games with 24 shutouts while posting a team ERA under 2.70 the past two seasons.  
 - Hayward comes to College Park after guiding UMass to back-to-back winning seasons in 2016 and 2017. UMass was one of the top hitting teams in the Atlantic 10 in 2017, as the Minutewomen advanced to the conference title game while finishing second in the regular season standings. Batters/position players earned nine all-conference selections under her guidance, while three UMass hitters garnered NFCA All-Region selections during her tenure.

## YOUTH MOVEMENT

- Maryland will sport a young roster in 2018, with five sophomores returning and six freshmen that made their collegiate debuts during opening weekend at UCLA February 9-11.  
 - Sophomores Anna Kufta and Amanda Brashear were mainstays in the lineup as freshmen, as they both started in all 51 games.  
 - Kufta ranked first on the team in slugging percentage (.484), RBIs (26), home runs (6), triples (4), total bases (77) and second in runs scored (24). Brashear ranked first on the team in batting average (.304), hits (52), sac bunts (6), at bats (171), and total plate appearances (184) and finished with 15 multi-hit games.  
 - Wright's freshmen class features four players who earned All-American honors throughout their high school careers, with several in line for early playing time as the 2018 season gets underway.

wins in program history (98) in that span.

Wright led the Bengals to new heights as Idaho State student-athletes won three conference MVP honors during her tenure. Wright saw 34 players earn all-conference honors, and the Bengals boasted the program's first-ever first team Academic All-American in Terah Blackwell, as well as NFCA All-Region team members for the first time.

The Bengals' turnaround began in 2013 as ISU won the first-ever Big Sky regular season title while winning a program record 29 games. The win total was eclipsed a year later when Idaho State finished 35-20. Under Wright, Idaho State has become one of the most potent offensive teams in the nation, posting the fourth-ranked batting average and fifth-ranked scoring in 2014.

Prior to Idaho State, Wright spent four seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Wisconsin. While with the Badgers, she was primarily responsible for recruitment and scheduling while serving as the team's academic liaison.

Wright served as head coach at Akron for two seasons from 2004-06, leading the team to a 53-52 record and the Zips' first appearance in the Mid-American Conference Tournament in four years.

She also has spent time as an assistant at the University of Kansas (1999-04) and Ohio (1996-99). At Kansas, she was the primary coach offensively and defensively for All-American Christi Musser.

Wright graduated from Ohio University in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in sociology/criminology and a minor in psychology.

Julie Wright was announced as the head coach of the Maryland softball program July 17, 2015. Wright came to Maryland after five years as the head coach at Idaho State, where she led the program to three straight Big Sky titles.

Wright's 2017 Terrapin squad will forever be etched in the program's history books, after Maryland earned its first-ever win over a top-ranked team with a 4-2 victory over No. 1 Florida. The upset made national headlines, giving Wright her first marquee victory at Maryland in a season that saw the Terps earn three wins over ranked opponents. Wright notched her 200th career victory as a head coach in conference play in 2017, when the Terps knocked off No. 18 Michigan in front of a record crowd at Maryland Softball Stadium.

In her first season at the helm for the Terps, Wright led Maryland to 12 wins including victories over three NCAA Tournament teams. The Terps also knocked off a pair of eventual top-25 opponents, notching wins over Florida Atlantic and Nebraska.

Sarah Calta and Skylynn Ellazar had career years during Wright's inaugural 2016 season. Calta earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors by batting .408 in Big Ten play. Against NCAA Tournament teams Ohio State and Nebraska, the junior hit .632 with two triples and five RBIs. Ellazar hit .399 on the season, which stands as the third best single season average in school history.

Prior to coming to Maryland, Wright spent the last five seasons as the head coach at Idaho State, accumulating 126 wins in that time. Through Wright's leadership, the Bengals captured Big Sky regular-season championships in the conference's first three seasons sponsoring softball as she secured the most

**TORI TYSON**

1st Season • Nebraska ('12)

Tyson joined Maryland in the summer of 2017 as the squad's pitching coach after helping lead Cal State Fullerton to two straight NCAA Regional appearances and two Big West Conference Championships. Fullerton's pitchers thrived under Tyson, pitching 46 complete games with 24 shutouts while posting a team ERA under 2.70 the past two seasons.

Fullerton's Kelsey Kessler was named a 2017 first team All-Big West and second team NFCA All-Region selection, holding a league-best 1.02 ERA in 75.1 innings while leading the conference in wins.

Titans Sydney Golden and Desiree Ybarra benefited mightily from Tyson joining the coaching staff in 2016, as they were named Big West Freshman Pitcher of the Year and Big West Pitcher of the Year.

Golden was only the second Fullerton player to receive the honor in program history as she finished the year with a 17-5 record while posting the second-lowest ERA in the conference at 1.79. Fifth-year senior Ybarra posted a 1.80 ERA over 35 games and logged 151.1 innings of work while striking out 133 batters and walking just 55 to finish the year with a 15-6 record.

Before her time at Fullerton, Tyson served as an assistant coach at Bethune Cookman for the 2014 season. Tyson helped guide the Wildcats to 19 victories during the season and the pitching staff posted a 3.94 ERA under her tutelage. She also produced the 2015 Mid-Eastern Conference Pitcher of the Year who posted 19 wins and a 3.61 ERA in 256.0 innings.

Prior to her time there, Tyson was an assistant coach at Doane College in Crete, Neb. and helped lead the Tigers to a 25-22 overall record and a 13-5 mark in league play.

A 2012 graduate of the University of Nebraska, Tyson played three years of softball with the Cornhuskers and pitched in her first two seasons at Nebraska. Tyson made an appearance in the 2009 NCAA Regional for the Cornhuskers. She made 47 starts in 2010 and served as a team captain during the 2011 season when she played in the outfield.



**VICTORIA HAYWARD**

1st Season • Washington ('14)

Hayward joined the Maryland staff in the summer of 2017 after guiding UMass to back-to-back winning seasons in 2016 and 2017. UMass was one of the top hitting teams in the Atlantic 10 in 2017, as the Minutewomen advanced to the conference title game while finishing second in the regular season standings. Batters/position players earned nine all-conference selections under her guidance, while three UMass hitters garnered NFCA All-Region selections during her tenure.

Hayward spent the 2015 season as a graduate assistant at LSU under head coach Beth Torina. The Tigers opened the year with 25-consecutive victories and spent three weeks as the No. 1 ranked team in the country, before ending the season with a 52-14 record and a third-place finish at the Women's College World Series. LSU's coaching staff was named the Division I South Region Staff of the Year by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association.

Hayward has been a member of the Canadian Senior National Team since 2009. When she made the squad in 2009 at 16 years old, she became the youngest player ever to join the senior team. She has been a mainstay in the outfield and has won six medals in international competition. Hayward was the 19th overall selection in the 2014 National Pro Fastpitch Draft by the Pennsylvania Rebellion.

Hayward participated in four NCAA Tournaments at the University of Washington. She was a 2014 All-American, a four-time All-Pac-12 selection and a three-time Academic All-Pac-12 honoree (2011-14). UW won four NCAA Regional Championships during her career and advanced to the Women's College World Series in 2013. She finished her career ranked 12th in average (.351), 10th in triples (7) and seventh in runs (176) while stealing a league-best 28 bases as a senior without committing an error all season.
