- Maryland has averaged 35 points per game in seven meetings since the Terps and Scarlet Knights joined the Big Ten in 2014, five times scoring over 30 points and never scoring fewer than 24.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The University of Maryland football team will travel to Rutgers for its regular season finale on Saturday, Nov. 27. The game is set to kick at Noon and will be broadcast on Big Ten Network and the Maryland Sports Radio Network.

1

DB **Jakorian Bennett** leads all Power Five players with 14 pass breakups this season. In 10 games played, Bennett has 12 pass breakups and two interceptions, for an average of 1.4 pass breakups per game. The senior has a pass breakup in four straight games, with six deflections over that span and has four games this season with at least two pass breakups, the second-most in the country. Bennett's 14 pass breakups are the most in a season since Will Likely had 15 in 2014. If Bennett passes Likely in Saturday's game, he will have the most in a season since Domonique Foxworth had 22 in 2002.

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** is rewriting the Maryland record books this season, this past week breaking the 29-year old single-season completion record with 19 completions against #8 Michigan to give him 287 on the season. The signal caller is also third all-time in single-season passing yards, only 109 yards behind John Kaleo (1992) for second all-time and 216 yards behind Scott Milanovich's program record of 3,499 set in 1993. The junior's 21 passing touchdowns is tied with Milanovich (1994) for third all-time, one behind Danny O'Brien (22 in 2010) for second all-time and five behind Milanovich (1993) for the program record. Tagovailoa is also seventh all-time in career completions (362), eighth in career passing touchdowns (28) and ninth in career passing yards (4,294).

In his time as a Terp beginning in 2020, QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has averaged 286.2 passing yards per game, the fifth-highest over that time span of any Power Five quarterback that has played in 2020 & 2021 and the most in the Big Ten. Tagovailoa, who has totaled 4,294 yards in 15 games as a Terp, trails only Virginia's Brennan Armstrong (324.3 per game), Pittsburgh's Kenny Pickett (313.3 per game), Ole Miss' Matt Corral (306.5 per game) and Mississippi State's Will Rogers (304.6). Tagovailoa is 13th in the country and second in the Big Ten, averaging 298.5 passing yards per game this season and is on pace to set the all-time Maryland record for passing yards in a season (Scott Milanovich, 3,499 in 1993).

Over the past three weeks, TE **Chigoziem Okonkwo** has 25 receptions for 233 yards, the most receptions ever by a Maryland tight end over a three game span and the most by any Maryland player since Torrey Smith tallied 28 against Virginia (11/13), Florida State (11/20) and NC State (11/27) in 2010. The senior's 233 yards are the most yards by a Maryland tight end over three consecutive games since Vernon Davis had 326 against Clemson (9/10), West Virginia (9/17) and Wake Forest (9/24) in 2005. Okonkwo recorded 12 receptions vs. #22 Penn State (11/6), the second-highest reception total ever by a Maryland tight end, only trailing Frank Wycheck's 14 vs. Virginia Tech in 1990 (9/1). Okonkwo's 112 yards at #8 Michigan State (11/13) were the most by a Maryland tight end since Davis had 139 yards at North Carolina in 2005 (11/12).

ON THE OFFENSE

By The Numbers

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has been one of the best quarterbacks in the Big Ten through 11 weeks of play, standing **second** in the conference and ranking 12th in the country with 3,283 passing yards. Tagovailoa also stands second the Big Ten and sixth in the country in completions per game (26.09) and ranks third in the league and top-30 in the FBS in completion percentage (68.3%), passing touchdowns (21) and total offense (300.5).

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** threw for 1,140 passing yards over the three game span of Indiana-Michigan State (10/30-11/13) (419 vs. Indiana, 371 vs. #22 Penn State and 350 at #8 Michigan State), the most of his career and the most by a Maryland quarterback over a three game span since Scott Milanovich passed for 1,354 yards over three games in 1993 (405 at North Carolina, 498 at Virginia Tech & 451 vs. West Virginia). Over those three weeks, Tagovailoa had the **fourth**-most passing yards among all Power Five quarterbacks and the second-most in the Big Ten only trailing Pittsburgh's Kenny Pickett (1,281), Mississippi State's Will Rogers (1,176) and Purdue's Aiden O'Connell (1,159). Tagovailoa has six of the top-25 passing games in the Big Ten this season, the most in the conference.

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has tallied **six** 300-yard passing games this season (419 vs. Indiana, 384 vs. Kent St., 371 vs. #22 Penn State, 350 at #8 Michigan State, 350 at Illinois & 332 vs. West Virginia), the most in program history and the second-most in the Big Ten this season. Tagovailoa has thrown for 300-plus yards in just about half of his starts as a Terp (seven out of 15) and is three away from tying Scott Milanovich for the career program record (10).

WR **Rakim Jarrett** has **seven** touchdown receptions in his first 15 games as a Terp, the most since Stefon Diggs (2012-14) had nine. Jarrett has caught a touchdown pass in five-of-11 games this season, a 43-yard touchdown at #7 Ohio State (10/9), a seven-yard score vs. #5 Iowa (10/1), a six-yard grab against Kent State (9/25), a 36-yard pass against Howard and a 60-yard game-sealing touchdown in the fourth quarter against West Virginia (9/4). The sophomore's 910 career yards are also the most since Diggs had 1,278 in his first 15 games in 2012-13.

Maryland has **14** college graduates on its current roster who will be wearing a special commemorative patch on their uniforms for the remainder of their careers: OL **Spencer Anderson**, WR **Carlos Carriere**, WR **Brian Cobbs**, RB **Tayon Fleet-Davis**, OL **Evan Gregory**, WR **Darryl Jones**, WR **Jeshaun Jones**, LB **Ahmad McCullough**, TE **Chigoziem Okonkwo**, DL **Sam Okuayinonu** and DL **Lawtez Rogers** have all graduated from Maryland and are pursuing graduate degrees while LS **John Berard** graduated from Texas Tech, DL **Ernest Shockley III** graduated from Indiana (Pa.) and QB **Reece Udinski** graduated from VMI last year and are all taking a fifth year with the Terps.

The Terps are averaging 306.6 yards per game in the air, the **15th**-best passing yards per game total in the FBS and third-highest in the Big Ten, trailing only Ohio State (362.3) and Purdue (345.9). Maryland has over 250 yards passing in eight-of-11 games this season and is one of only three Big Ten teams (Ohio State & Purdue) with at least one passing touchdown in every game.

ON THE DEFENSE/SPECIAL TEAMS

Maryland has had 21 different players record at least one tackle for loss this season, the **most** in the Big Ten. The Terps are led by DL **Sam Okuayinonu** who has 8.5 tackles for loss, while nine additional players: LB **Durell Nchami**, DL **Ami Finau**, DL **Lawtez Rogers**, DL **Mosiah Nasili-Kite**, LB **Deshawn Holt**, DL **Greg Rose**, DB **Tarheeb Still**, LB **Ruben Hyppolite II**, DB **Isaiah Hazel**, DL **Tyler Baylor** and S **Nick Cross** all have at least two tackles for loss.

The Terps have blocked **two** field goals this season (**Ami Finau** at Illinois, 9/17 & **Tarheeb Still** at Minnesota, 10/23), the 20th-most in the country and tied with Indiana, Michigan, Nebraska and Penn State for most in the Big Ten. It is the fifth time in the last six seasons that Maryland has blocked at least two field goals over the course of a season.

4

Maryland ranks **fourth** in the Big Ten with 29 sacks through 11 games, an average of 2.64 per game. The 29 sacks have been for a loss of 209 yards, the 25th-most sack yards in the country and third-most in the Big Ten, trailing only Ohio State's 240 and Michigan State's 221. The Terps 29 sacks are the most through the first 11 games of a season since totaling 35 in 2015.

K **Joseph Petrino** is currently **eighth** all-time in Maryland history with 207 career points (27 field goals, 120 PATs). Petrino is 11 points behind Brian Kopka (1997-2000) for seventh all-time. The senior kicker is also fourth all-time in career PATs with 120 and sixth all-time in career points kicking. Petrino has knocked through 11 field goals this season, including a 32-yard game winner to beat Illinois as time expired (9/17), earning him Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

CB **Tarheeb Still** has **17** pass breakups through only 15 games as a Terp, the most by a player over his first 15 games since Domonique Foxworth had 18 over the first 15 games of his career in 2001-02. As a freshman in 2020, Still led the nation in pass breakups per game, averaging two per game and eight on the season, the highest per game mark in program history. Still was selected to The Athletic's Freshman All-America Team, one of five defensive backs named to the team. The now-sophomore has nine so far this season, the second-most on the team and eighth-most in the Big Ten, and has one in seven of the last nine games.

P **Anthony Pecorella** currently stands third all-time in Maryland history, averaging **42.4** yards per punt (3,134 yards on 74 attempts), behind only two former NFL punters in Brooks Barnard (1999-2002) and Adam Podlesh (2003-06). Pecorella is averaging 43.8 yards per punt this season (1,183 yards on 27 punts), which would be the third-highest single-season average in program history. The junior has booted 10 of his 27 punts over 50 yards with two 56-yard punts and has pinned 11 inside the 20.

MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

Head Coach

Towson '92 • 12th Year at Maryland, 2nd as Head Coach

Michael Locksley returned home to become the University of Maryland's 37th head football coach in December 2018. Locksley, a Washington, D.C. native with deep personal and professional connections to the area, has nearly 30 years of coaching experience and 2020 will be his 12th season with the Terps over three separate stints at Maryland.

The winner of the 2018 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach, Locksley spent three years working under Nick Saban at the University of Alabama before taking the head coaching job at Maryland. He served as the Crimson Tide's co-offensive coordinator and won a national championship in 2017 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2018 and helping Alabama return to the College Football Playoff.

Locksley, known for strong recruiting skills, was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com. He also engineered top-10 recruiting classes during each of his two seasons (2003-04) as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida.

Locksley has signed 24 four or five star recruits over his coaching career (according to 247sports), 15 of which came from the DMV area, in addition to coaching 98 NFL Draft selections. Among Locksley's successful signings to Maryland were future NFL stars Vernon Davis, Shawne Merriman, LaMont Jordan, D'Qwell Jackson, EJ Henderson, Yannick Ngakoue and Stefon Diggs.

Alabama's Locksley-led offense averaged 45.6 points and 522.0 yards per game in 2018. The Tide set school records for points scored (684), single-season total offense (7,830 yards) and passing yards (4,854) in a season. Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa threw for 3,966 yards and a school-record 43 touchdowns in 2018.

In 2017, Locksley coached the Alabama wide receivers, who combined to catch 128 passes for 2,059 yards and 19 touchdowns led by First Team All-SEC selection Calvin Ridley. Ridley hauled in 63 passes for 967 yards and five touchdowns in his junior season. Locksley spent the 2016 season on the Crimson Tide's staff as an offensive analyst.

Prior to Alabama, Locksley served as Maryland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15. He was named the Terps interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.

During his time as Maryland's offensive coordinator, the Terrapins produced balanced and effective results. Locksley's attack was led by quarterback C.J. Brown, who became Maryland's all-time leader in touchdowns responsible (58) after totaling 13 passing touchdowns and eight rushing touchdowns in 2014. Locksley also mentored

wide receiver, Stefon Diggs, who hauled in 62 passes for 792 yards and five touchdowns en route to second team All-Big Ten honors. Diggs is now an NFL superstar for the Minnesota Vikings.

In 2013, Locksley guided an offense that eclipsed 5,000 yards (5,160) for only the fourth time in program history and the first time since 2003. The passing game excelled that season, totaling 3,231 yards for the third-highest total in school history.

Prior to Maryland, Locksley served as the head coach at the University of New Mexico from 2009-11. Before that, Locksley also served as the offensive coordinator at the University of Illinois from 2005-08. The Illini went from No. 72 nationally in total offense in 2005 to 19th following the 2008 season. They led the Big Ten in rushing in 2006 and 2007 and then led the league in passing in 2008. The rushing attack was twice ranked in the top-10 nationally (No. 10 in 2006 and No. 5 in 2007).

Under Locksley's offensive plan, wide receiver Arrelious Benn was a first team all-conference pick as a sophomore in 2008 after leading the league in receiving yards (1,055). He went on to become a second-round pick of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2010 NFL Draft.

The 2007 Illinois offense became just the third unit in school history to surpass the 5,000-yard mark and first to top 3,000 rushing yards. Led by Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year Rashard Mendenhall, the Illini led the league in rushing for the second straight year and finished fifth nationally at 256.7 yards a game.

Illinois played USC in the 2008 Rose Bowl and finished the season ranked 18th in the nation in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press following a 9-4 season. In 2006, Locksley led an Illinois offense that paced the Big Ten and ranked 10th in the nation in rushing, averaging 188.8 yards.

Locksley spent the 2003 and 2004 seasons at the University of Florida as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. In 2004, Gators' running back Ciatrick Fason led the SEC and ranked 19th in the NCAA in rushing (105.6 yards a game) on his way to second-team all-league honors.

In his first stint at Maryland from 1997-2002, Locksley enjoyed success both recruiting and grooming players in College Park. He oversaw the running backs during his entire tenure, including the final five as recruiting coordinator. Three different running backs - Chris Downs, Bruce Perry and LaMont Jordan - gained more than 1,000 yards and were named First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference.

He began his coaching career at Towson in 1992, where

he coached defensive backs and special teams, followed by two seasons at the U.S. Naval Academy Preparatory School. He coached outside linebackers at the University of the Pacific in 1995 and then coached wide receivers and tight ends at Army in 1996.

Locksley played safety at Towson University, where he was the team's defensive MVP as a senior in 1991. He finished his career ranked 19th on the school's all-time tackles list and graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing.

In August 2020, Locksley announced the formation of the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches (NCMFC). The NCMFC was formed as a multi-pronged effort to remove roadblocks, increase awareness and spur action toward fair and equitable hiring at all levels of football. The non-profit organization seeks to prepare, promote and produce qualified minority coaches to ascend in the ranks of college and professional football.

Locksley and his wife, Kia, have four children: Mike Jr., Kai, Kori and the late Meiko.

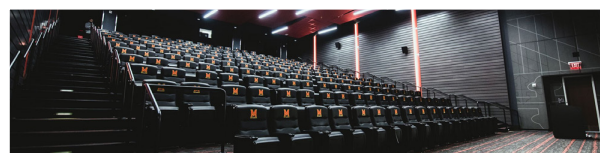

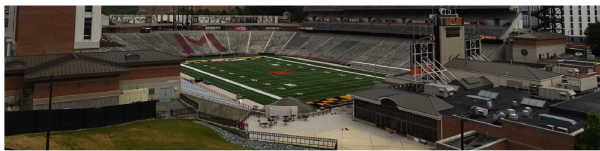

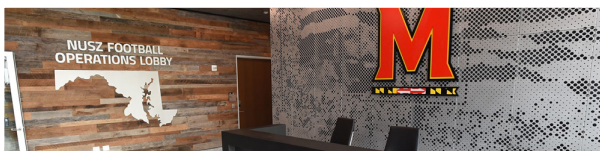

GAME 1

Sept. 4, 2021

Maryland 30, West Virginia 24

COLLEGE PARK, MD – Big plays on both sides of the ball helped Maryland take down West Virginia, 30-24, as the Terps won their home opener for the 16th consecutive time in front of a raucous crowd of 43,811. Taulia Tagovailoa threw for 332 yards with three touchdowns. Both Dontay Demus Jr. and Rakim Jarrett had six catches and more than 100 yards receiving and a touchdown apiece. Tayon Fleet-Davis ran for a career-high 123 yards. The defense showed out as well with four caused turnovers and four sacks.

The Terps trailed 21-20 in the fourth quarter before Joseph Petrino put them ahead for good at 23-21 with a 26-yard field goal with 9:16 left in the game. A 60-yard dart and run from Tagovailoa to Jarrett gave the Terps a two-score lead at 30-21 with 6:25 left in the game.

An explosive first quarter saw the Terps jump out to an early lead thanks to a 45-yard field goal from Petrino. The Mountaineers answered with a touchdown drive but the Terps remained poised. Tagovailoa connected with both Demus Jr. and Chigoziem Okonkwo to put Maryland up 17-14 at the end of the first quarter. The offense ended up with 192 yards of total offense in the first quarter alone.

The Terps defense and special teams started making plays in the second quarter as Nick Cross hauled in his fourth career interception and Darryl Jones recovered a muffed punt. The Terps ended the half with a two-minute drill resulting in Petrino's second field goal of the game.

Coming out of halftime down 21-20, the two teams battled with neither coming away with any points. As the Mountaineers were driving late in the third, freshman Branden Jennings forced a fumble late with Lawtez Rogers falling on it, igniting the Maryland sideline and raucous student section. Now with the ball, Tagovailoa and the rushing of Isaiah Jacobs led the Terps down the field for a 14-play drive that was punctuated by another Petrino field goal which gave the Terps the lead back, 23-21.

After Jakorian Bennett's interception in his own end zone, Tagovailoa and the offense had a chance to expand the lead and they didn't let the opportunity pass them. After a few runs by Fleet-Davis, Tagovailoa launched a pass deep down the right sideline and found Jarrett in stride. Jarrett breezed into the end zone with his teammates following in tow to celebrate. With Maryland now up 30-21, West Virginia marched down the field but were stopped on the goal line and forced to kick a field goal to make the score 30-24. They would never see the ball again as Isaiah Jacobs and Tayon Fleet-Davis iced the game with multiple first downs and Tagovailoa taking the final kneel downs.

Maryland 62, Howard 0

COLLEGE PARK, MD – Maryland scored early and often and cruised to a 62-0 victory over Howard to move to 2-0 on the season. Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa was 22-of-27 for 274 yards with three scoring passes. Dontay Demus Jr. had six catches for 128 yards and scored a touchdown for the sixth game in a row. Eight different players scored a touchdown, including three who scored the first of their careers.

The Terps' defense limited Howard (0-2) to just nine first downs and 145 total yards in the win. Howard was 0-for-13 on third-down conversions. It was the Terps' first shutout since the 79-0 blanking of Howard in 2019. The Terps have only allowed three points in the last 101:30 of game action dating back to last week's win over West Virginia.

The offense racked up 574 yards, with 347 through the air and 227 on the ground.

A quick three-and-out by the defense and a surgical drive from Tagovailoa quickly gave the Terps a 7-0 lead on a 14-yard strike to Demus. A rushing touchdown from Tayon Fleet-Davis on the next drive gave the Terps a 14-0 lead that they took into the second quarter.

Just 39 seconds into the second quarter Tagovailoa found Chigoziem Okonkwo in the back of the end zone for another score to make it 21-0. Maryland's defense continued to suffocate the Bison offense, only allowing them across the 50-yard line once in the first half. Freshman Colby McDonald and sophomore Penny Boone both collected their first career touchdowns in the second quarter, ballooning Maryland's lead to 35-0. Jakorian Bennett's interception with 37 seconds left set Joseph Petrino up for a 38-yard field goal.

Leading 38-0 heading into the second half, Terps picked up right where they left off as Tagovailoa found Rakim Jarrett on a slant for a 36-yard touchdown. It was after that when graduate quarterback Reece Udinski took over and was a perfect 3-for-3 with a touchdown pass to Carlos Carriere.

A Harrison Beattie field goal and a healthy dose of the running game by players like Challen Faamataua and Antwain Littleton II allowed the Terps to bleed the clock and come away with the win.

Maryland 20, Illinois 17

CHAMPAIGN, IL – Down 17-10 with less than five minutes to go in the fourth quarter, Maryland rallied for a dramatic 20-17 victory over Illinois to stay perfect at 3-0. The Terps scored twice in the final 2:13 to continue its best start to a season since 2016 when they started 4-0.

Joseph Petrino kicked his first-ever game-winning field goal as his 32-yard field goal gave the Terps the conference road win. It was Maryland's first walk-off win since Dan Ennis' game-winner against Clemson in 2006.

The Terps tied the game with 2:13 as quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa found Tayon Fleet-Davis for a 10-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at 17-17.

Greg Rose single-handedly derailed Illinois' ensuing drive with two sacks for losses of 11 and seven yards in the final 1:13. Intentional grounding on the Illini forced punt and the 38-yarder gave the Terps the ball at Illinois' 45-yard line with 47 seconds left, setting the stage for the winning play.

Tagovailoa threw for 350 yards on 32-of-43. Dontay Demus Jr. had eight catches for 77 yards, extending his consecutive game streak with a reception to 25. Fleet-Davis carried the ball 11 times for 62 yards and two total touchdowns (1 rushing & 1 receiving).

Illinois took a 17-10 lead 47 seconds into the fourth quarter when Casey Washington scooped up a loose ball that Jordan Mosley punched out of Reggie Love's hands and rumbled 30 yards to give the Illini their first lead.

A penalty negated what appeared to be the tying play for the Terps. Tagovailoa's 41-yard scoring pass to Demus Jr. with 11:15 left was called back, putting the Terps in a 3-and-25 situation, where Illinois sacked Tagovailoa.

The Illini ran the clock, converting a pair of third downs, but eventually, the Terrapin defense held, giving Maryland the ball back with less than five minutes left in the fourth.

Not done yet, Tagovailoa led the offense down the field. He found Fleet-Davis in the flat. Fleet-Davis made two defenders miss before finding the endzone, tying the game.

Maryland came out in the third quarter with a purpose as Tagovailoa methodically moved his team down the field in just five plays, punctuating the drive with a rushing touchdown by Fleet-Davis. Now leading 10-3, Maryland's defense forced a quick three-and-out putting Tagovailoa and the offense quickly back on the field. The Terps again used chunk plays to move down into Illini territory, but a fumble on the goal line stalled the drive.

An Illinois touchdown on a 38-yard rush by Josh McCray tied the game at 10-10 with 6:15 left in the third quarter.

A second Terps fumble set the Illini up deep in Terps' territory, but safety Nick Cross intercepted the ball on the very next play to swing the momentum back towards Maryland. However, neither team could crack the end zone before the fourth quarter.

The first quarter was a defensive battle as neither offense could get into a rhythm. Illinois began marching late into the frame, but a goal-line stand led by freshman linebacker Branden Jennings forced the Illini to attempt a field goal. Defensive lineman Ami Finau didn't let the kick have a chance sticking his hand up and blocking it, keeping the game scoreless.

The second quarter started with a bang as Tagovailoa hit Rakim Jarrett for a 37-yard pass play on the first play of the quarter. The Maryland offense continued to move the ball down the field. Petrino capped the drive off with a 32-yard field goal.

Sacks by Sam Okayinonu and Durrell Nchami kept Illinois at bay, but the Illini tied the game 3-3 heading into halftime.

Maryland 37, Kent State 16

COLLEGE PARK, MD – Maryland stayed perfect with a 37-16 victory over Kent State on a sunny Saturday afternoon at Capital One Field at Maryland Stadium. The Terps are now 4-0 for the first time since 2016 heading into a huge match-up with #5 Iowa next Friday night. Tickets are available here.

Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa continued his hot start, throwing for 384 yards on 31-of-41 with three touchdown passes. Tagovailoa has thrown for 300-yards in three of four games this season and four of his eight career games as a Terp.

Dontay Demus Jr. (game-high four catches for 108 yards), Rakim Jarrett, and Corey Dyches each hauled in scoring receptions. It was the third time in four games this season Demus and Jarrett have scored touchdowns in the same game. Overall, the Terps had 12 different players catch a pass.

Tayon Fleet-Davis rushed for 60 yards and two touchdowns - his second-consecutive multi-touchdown game and third of his career.

The Terps' defense pressured Kent State (1-3) all afternoon as they had five sacks including the first career sacks for Beau Brade, Demeioun Robinson, and Kobi Thomas – all in the fourth quarter.

After a Kent State field goal, the Terps offense came alive as passes to Jeshawn Jones and Fleet-Davis set Maryland up in Golden Flashes territory. Tagovailoa then found Demus Jr. for a 33-yard strike over the middle for the Terps' first touchdown of the afternoon, giving the Terps a 7-3 lead.

After another Kent State field goal, Maryland once again marched down the field after passes to Chigoziem Okonkwo and Challen Faamatau brought them to the goal line. The first play of the second quarter was a third-and-goal pass to Jarrett which was good for another touchdown. The receiver contorted his body in order to make the diving 6-yard catch, allowing the Terps to extend their lead to 14-6.

A defensive stand and a fair-catch interference penalty followed by a 64-yard catch and run by Demus Jr. set the Terps up with yet another goal-line opportunity. Fleet-Davis punched the ball in from three yards out to give Maryland a two-possession lead at 21-6. It was the third consecutive game with a rushing score for Fleet-Davis. When the Golden Flashes began to gain a little momentum, it was quickly taken away as Ruben Hyppolite II forced a fumble that was recovered by Tarheeb Still. The team's traded field goals towards the end of the half to make it 24-9 Maryland heading into halftime.

Maryland opened the scoring in the second half with a 29-yard rushing touchdown by Fleet-Davis, his second of the game and third time in his career he's achieved that feat. The offense kept it rolling on the next drive as bruising runs by Isaiah Jacobs allowed Tagovailoa to later find Dyches for a nine-yard score, the first of Dyches' career, extending the Terp lead to 37-9.

A Kent State touchdown cut the lead to 37-16 but Head Coach Michael Locksley still decided to empty his bench late in the game, allowing some of his younger players to get meaningful game action.

Maryland 38, Indiana 35

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa threw for a career-high 419 yards in leading Maryland to a 38-35 win over Indiana on Homecoming Saturday at Capital One Field at Maryland Stadium. Tagovailoa connected with Carlos Carriere for two touchdowns as the receiver had a career day with eight catches and 134 receiving yards -- both new personal bests.

Tagovailoa completed 26-of-40 as he became the first Terps quarterback to throw for 400 yards in a game since Danny O'Brien threw for 417 vs. NC State in 2010. His single-game passing yardage, ranks third all-time in Maryland history.

The Terps (5-3 overall, 2-3 Big Ten) scored three 1-yard rushing touchdowns as Challen Faamatau scored the first two touchdowns of his career and Tayon Fleet-Davis added another score from a yard away.

Facing a third and 13 with just over six minutes remaining and up 35-28, Tagovailoa stepped up into a collapsing pocket and fired a pass to Marcus Fleming for 22 yards and a key first down for the Terps. The play allowed Maryland to kick a field goal, making the game 38-28. When the Hoosiers cut it to a three-point game, Darryl Jones recovered an onside kick, allowing the Terps to secure their fifth win of the season.

A quick three-and-out and a short punt by Indiana to open the game gave the Terps a short field and after a seven play, 35-yard drive, Tayon Fleet-Davis punched the ball into the end zone on a one-yard rush.

Up 7-0, another defensive stop allowed Maryland to drive 90-yards in 10 plays, with Faamatau punctuating the drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown of his own, putting the team up 14-0.

The Hoosiers would respond with 17 unanswered points, but the Terps found their groove again after a 42-yard pass from Tagovailoa to Rakim Jarrett, and Faamatau's second one-yard rushing touchdown of the day. A 14-yard pass from Tagovailoa to Carriere would extend the lead to 28-17, but a fake punt allowed the Hoosiers to kick a field goal, making it 28-20.

Carriere would continue his career-day with his second touchdown, a 45-yard pass from Tagovailoa early in the fourth quarter.

Indiana is now 2-6 and 0-5 in the Big Ten.

Maryland 14, #22 Penn State 31

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- No. 22 Penn State handed Maryland a 31-14 defeat on Saturday afternoon at Capital One Field at Maryland Stadium. The loss dropped the Terps to 5-4 overall and 2-4 Big Ten while Penn State moved to 6-3 to 3-3 in conference action.

Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa continued his strong play with 371 passing yards, on the heels of a career-high 419 passing yards last week. He completed 41-of-57 with a touchdown. The 41 completions are the second-most in a game school history and the 57 attempts are tied for the third-most in a game in history.

Chigoziem Okonkwo set career-highs with 12 catches and 85 receiving yards. Rakim Jarrett had career-high tying six catches for 70 yards. Marcus Fleming had a career-high tying five catches for 38 yards. Challen Faamatau totaled 54 yards from scrimmage and scored a touchdown.

The defense was stout for much of the game. Jordan Mosley led the Terps with career-high 13 tackles. Greg Rose had two sacks and Tyler Baylor added the first of his career.

After the Terps rallied to tie the game, Penn State quickly regained the lead on an 86-yard strike from Sean Clifford to Jahan Dotson, making it 21-14. The Nittany Lions added a field goal and returned an interception for a touchdown to seal the game.

Maryland tied the game at 14-14 on a 13-yard touchdown pass from Tagovailoa to Corey Dyches and converted the ensuing 2-point conversion as Okonkwo caught a pass from Tagovailoa, four seconds into the fourth quarter.

The Nittany Lions took a 14-6 lead midway through the third quarter on a 21-yard pass from Clifford to Dotson.

Penn State led 7-0 after the first quarter. A defensive stand gave the Terps the ball with just under three minutes remaining where Tagovailoa took them down the field, highlighted by two catches each by Okonkwo and Tai Felton. Faamatau punctuated the drive with a two-yard touchdown run, but a missed extra point kept the score at 7-6 in favor of Penn State at the half.

EAST LANSING, MI -- No. 8 Michigan State handed Maryland a 40-21 defeat on Saturday at Spartan Stadium. The loss dropped the Terps to 5-5 overall and 2-5 Big Ten while Michigan State moved to 9-1 and 6-1 in conference action.

Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa set a Maryland record with his sixth game this season with more than 300 passing yards as he threw for 350 on Saturday. He has 1,140 passing yards in his last three games (380 per game) as he became the third passer in Maryland history to throw for 3,000 yards in a single-season. Tagovailoa was 29-of-48 with a pair of 32-yard touchdown passes to Chigoziem Okonkwo.

Rakim Jarrett set his career-high with 10 receptions for 105 yards, his third-career game with 100-plus receiving yards. Okonkwo had eight catches for a career-high 112 yards, the most by a Terps tight end since Vernon Davis in 2005.

In his return to his home state, Detroit native Peny Boone ran for a career-high 42 yards and scored the second touchdown of his career.

Jordan Mosley and Ami Finau, who set a career-high in tackles, led the Terps on defense, as each had 11 stops.

Maryland battled back after falling behind 27-7 as each of the touchdown passes from Tagovailoa to Okonkwo brought the Terps to within two scores as the Terps trailed 34-21 after the third quarter. The Terps continued to have opportunities to cut it to a one-score game, but couldn't convert in several situations.

The Terps got on the board late in the first quarter after converting a pair of third downs, on a 19-yard pass to Jarrett and a 45-yard run by Tagovailoa, before Boone scored on a 4-yard rush to cut Michigan State's lead to 13-7 after the first quarter. Michigan State led 27-14 at halftime.
