THE OPENING KICK

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- ▶ QB Taulia Tagovailoa has established himself as one of the top quarterbacks in the country. Last week against #2 Ohio State (11/19), Tagovailoa put forth one of the best outings of his career, breaking the Maryland passing yards record in the process, passing Scott Milanovich (1992-95) on a 49-yard pass to Rakim Jarrett in the fourth quarter to now have 7,316 career yards.
- ▶ Tagovailoa is one of two current FBS QBs who holds his school's career passing yards record despite playing only three seasons (or fewer) at that school. The other is Mississippi State's Will Rogers, who broke Dak Prescott's school career passing yards record earlier this year (Note via Press Box Live).
- ▶ The Ewa Beach, HI native also tied Milanovich for the all-time program passing touchdown record with 49 and can take sole possession of the record with one passing touchdown against Rutgers. Tagovailoa also stands first all-time in program history in 300-yard passing games (11), career completion percentage (68.0), passing efficiency (148.1) and total offense (7,503). With 30 completions against Rutgers, Tagovailoa will also pass Milanovich for the school's completions record.
- ▶ Tagovailoa has thrown for 3,935 yards in the 13 home games he's played for the Terrapins (302.7 yards per game). He is one of only three Big Ten quarterbacks in the past 25 years to average more than 300.0 passing yards at home, with a minimum of 10 games, joining Ohio State's C.J. Stroud (317.8) and Purdue's Drew Brees (314.2).
- ▶ Tagovailoa's 68.1 career completion percentage (including Alabama) is currently seventh among all active FBS quarterbacks, trailing only Mississippi State's Will Rogers (70.9), Coastal Carolina's Grayson McCall (70.4), Ohio State's CJ Stroud (69.7), Missouri's Jack Abraham (69.0), South Carolina's Spencer Rattler (69.0) and Fresno State's Jake Haener (68.5). He also stands 14th among all FBS quarterbacks in career completions per game (19.69), 15th in passing yards per game (231.8) and 24th in passing efficiency (148.1).

TURNOVER & RED ZONE PROWESS

- ▶ Maryland has had one or fewer turnovers in each of their last seven games, their longest streak in the last 25 years.
- ▶ The Terps have been one of the best teams in the nation in the red area, scoring on 35-of-38 of their trips to the opponent's 20-yard line, the 11th-best red zone percentage in the nation (92.1). Maryland has scored touchdowns on 29 of those 35 scores, good for 76.3-percent of their red zone scores, the sixth-highest percentage in the country (Mississippi State, Ohio State, Charlotte, Tennessee & Penn State).

TERPS VS. RUTGERS

- ▶ Last season, in a matchup of two 5-6 teams with the winner becoming bowl eligible, the Terps went to Piscataway in the regular season finale and dominated Rutgers, winning 40-16. QB Taulia Tagovailoa broke the Maryland single-season passing yardage record in the game, throwing for 312 yards on 21-of-30 with three passing touchdowns and a rushing touchdown. Two of those touchdowns went to Corey Dyches for 25 and 11 yards - his first-career multi-score game. WR Rakim Jarrett finished with a team-high seven catches for 111 yards - his third 100-yard game this season. LB Ruben Hyppolite II and CB Tarheeb Still led Maryland seven tackles apiece.
- ▶ Maryland has averaged 264.8 rushing yards per game against Rutgers since the two schools joined the Big Ten in 2014, the fourth-most by any Big Ten team against a single opponent over that time (minimum 5 games) behind Wisconsin against Nebraska (310.1), Wisconsin against Purdue (266.5) and Ohio State against Rutgers (266.1) (Note via Press Box Live).

THE ROMAN EMPIRE

- ▶ **RB Roman Hemby** has been one of the best running backs in the nation through 11 games, standing 26th in the nation and fourth in the Big Ten with 5.89 yards per carry (854 yards on 145 carries).
- ▶ Hemby stands second among all FBS freshmen in yards from scrimmage with 1,130 (854 rushing, 276 receiving), only trailing Ole Miss' Quinshon Judkins (1,495). Against SMU (9/17), Hemby became the first Terrapin in the last 25 years to have 150+ rushing yards and 50+ receiving in a game (151 rushing, 62 receiving).
- ▶ Hemby has accounted for 25.9 percent of the team's scrimmage yards this season (rushing and receiving), the highest percentage by any freshman in the FBS.
- ▶ Hemby has four rushes over 40 yards this season, tied for the seventh-most in the nation and second-most in the Big Ten (Nicholas Singleton, Penn State). His two rushes over 70 yards is tied with seven other players for the most in the FBS.
- ▶ The Edgewood, MD native has rushed for 100 yards in four of Maryland's six wins (114 vs. Buffalo, 151 vs. SMU, 107 at Indiana & 179 vs. Northwestern), already tied with Anthony McFarland Jr. for the most in a single season of any freshman in Maryland history. He is the first Terp ever to earn multiple Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors (9/19 & 10/24) and leads all Big Ten freshmen in rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ Hemby has played a huge role in each of Maryland's last two wins, scoring the winning touchdown in each game, a six-yard run to put the Terps up 31-27 with 5:35 left at Indiana (10/15) and a 75-yard run with the game tied and 3:22 on the clock vs. Northwestern (10/22). Against Northwestern, he was the first Terp with three rushing touchdowns in a game since 2018 and is the first Maryland player to rush for 179 yards since Jake Funk had 180 against Rutgers in 2020.



J-(P)-B-(U)

- ▶ **DB Jakorian Bennett** is tied for the FBS lead in passes defended since the beginning of the 2021 season with 27 (16 in 2021, 11 in 2022) and has the most career passes defended per game of any active FBS player (1.12). Bennett has 25 pass breakups and four interceptions over his career as a Terp, with 27 of them coming since the beginning of last year.
- ▶ Bennett is the only player in the Power Five this season to have two games with four-plus passes defended (five vs. Buffalo, 9/3 & four vs. Purdue, 10/8). His five against Buffalo (9/3) were the most by a Terp since Tino Ellis in 2018 and tied for the second-most by any Big Ten player since 2015. Against Purdue (10/8), Bennett added three pass breakups and his first interception of the season, his seventh career game with at least two passes defended.
- ▶ In 12 games played last season, Bennett had 13 pass breakups and three interceptions, for an average of 1.3 pass breakups per game. The senior had five games with at least two pass breakups, tied for the third-most in the country. Bennett's 16 pass breakups were the most by a Terp since Dominique Foxworth had 22 in 2002.

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** currently has the **fifth**-best career completion percentage in Big Ten history at 68.0 (621-for-913), only trailing Northwestern's Dan Persa (72.7), Ohio State's Dwayne Haskins (70.0), Ohio State's CJ Stroud (69.7) and Wisconsin's Scott Tolzien (68.1).

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** had the **sixth**-most single season passing yards in Big Ten history last season, only trailing Dwayne Haskins (Ohio State, 2018), CJ Stroud (Ohio State, 2021), Curtis Painter (Purdue, 2006) and Drew Brees (Purdue, 1998 & 1999).

Maryland is one of only **eight** teams in the FBS and the only team in the Big Ten that return all five starters on the offensive line from a year ago (Cincinnati, Oregon, Pittsburgh, Stanford, Syracuse, Wake Forest & West Virginia). The Terps bring back All-Big Ten performers **Spencer Anderson** and **Jaelyn Duncan** as well as center **Johari Branch**, tackle **DJ Glaze** and guard **Mason Lunsford**.

Maryland has eight players that have amassed **10+** receptions this season (**Rakim Jarrett**, 40; **Jeshaun Jones**, 31; **Roman Hemby**, 31; **Corey Dyches**, 30; **CJ Dippre**, 28; **Jacob Copeland**, 26; **Dontay Demus Jr.**, 19, & **Tai Felton**, 16) trailing only Indiana (10) for the most in the Big Ten.

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has **11** 300-yard passing games in his career, the most in program history, breaking the record vs. Purdue (10/8). Last season, Tagovailoa set the single-season program record for 300-yard games with eight.

WR **Rakim Jarrett** stands top-**13** in Maryland history in career touchdowns (10), receptions (119) and yards (1,552).

WR **Dontay Demus Jr.** caught his **14th** career touchdown pass in the win at Indiana (10/15), tying him with Stefon Diggs (*14) for the fifth-most in program history.

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has thrown at least one touchdown pass in **24**-of-27 games as a Terp, including 17-straight from October 30, 2020 to December 27, 2021. Tagovailoa has seven games of at least three passing touchdowns, most recently a career-best four at Charlotte (9/17).

Maryland has averaged **35.6** points per game against Rutgers in eight meetings since the Terps and Scarlet Knights joined the Big Ten in 2014, six times scoring over 30 points, three times scoring over 40 points and never scoring fewer than 24.

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has a **91.3** grade in the red-zone via Pro Football Focus, the highest among all Power Five quarterbacks.

WR **Dontay Demus Jr.** is just five yards away from becoming the seventh Terp all-time to reach the **2,000** career receiving mark. He will join Jermaine Lewis, 2,932; Stefon Diggs, 2,227; Torrey Smith, 2,215; Darrius Heyward-Bey, 2,089; Geroy Simon, 2,059 and DJ Moore, 2,027.

K **Chad Ryland** has **three** made field goals of over 50 yards this season (a 52 and 53 yarder at #4 Michigan and a 51 yarder vs. Michigan State), tied for the most in program history (Nick Novak, 2002) and the second-most in the nation (Harrison Mevis, Missouri).

S **Beau Brade** is the **seventh**-highest rated safety in pass coverage among all Power Five defenders with over 600 snaps at that position, earning an 84.4 grade via Pro Football Focus.

P **Colton Spangler** is averaging 45.5 yards per punt this season (2136 yards on 47 punts), the **11th**-best punting average in the nation (min. 3.6 punts per game) and second-best in the Big Ten. Spangler has pinned 14 punts inside the 20-yard line and booted 12 over 50 yards. Spangler was added to the Ray Guy Award Watch List on October 11.

K **Chad Ryland** set the Big Ten record for most consecutive made field goals (**24**) with a 43-yarder in the third quarter of the win against Michigan State (10/1). The senior tied Maryland's Brad Craddock (2013-14) and Ohio State's Mike Nugent (2001-02) as part of a streak which spanned 14 games between October 2, 2021 and October 1, 2022.

Maryland has had **41** different players start a game (offense or defense) this season, the seventh-most of any school in the FBS and the most in the Big Ten. The Terps have had 16 different players start on the offensive side of the ball and 25 on defense. OL **Spencer Anderson**, OL **Johari Branch**, TE **CJ Dippre**, OL **DJ Glaze**, RB **Roman Hemby**, S **Beau Brade**, LB **Durell Nchami** and S **Dante Trader Jr.** have started all 10 games.

CB **Deonte Banks** is only allowing a **42.9**-percent completion percentage when targeted this year by opposing offenses (24-for-56), the 22nd-best mark in the nation and fifth-best in the Big Ten via Pro Football Focus. Banks has nine pass breakups and an interception.

LB **Jaishawn Barham** has **48** tackles through 11 games, the most of any Big Ten freshman. Barham was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after tallying five tackles (four solo), two sacks, two tackles for loss and a fumble recovery against Purdue (10/8), only the third Terp freshman in the last 12 years to have two-plus sacks in a game (Ruben Hyppolite vs. Penn State in 2020 & Andre Monroe vs. Wake Forest in 2011).

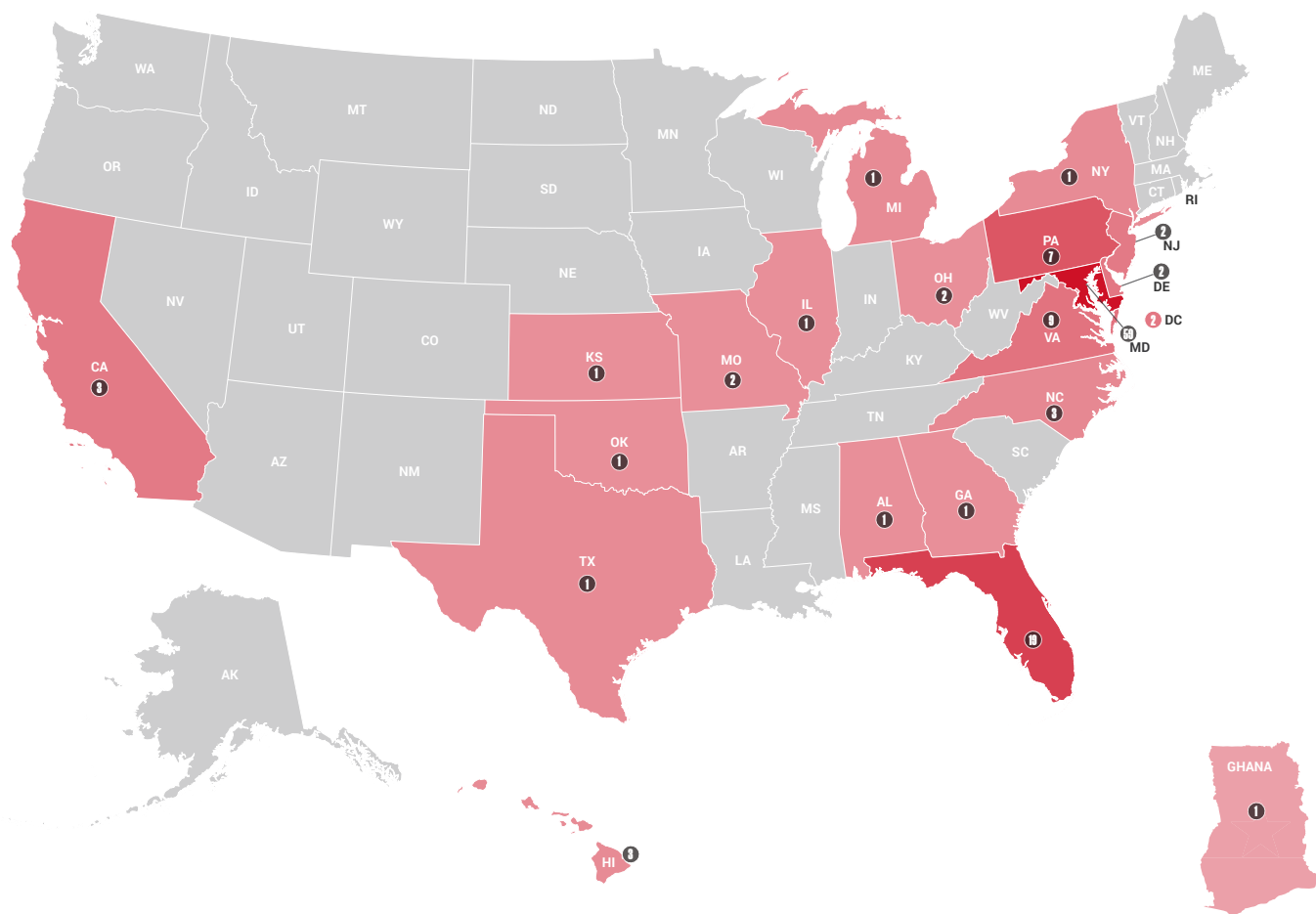

HEAD COACH MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

Towson '92 • 14th Year at Maryland, 4th as Head Coach



Michael Locksley returned home to become the University of Maryland's 37th head football coach in December 2018. Locksley, a Washington, D.C. native with deep personal and professional connections to the area, has 30 years of coaching experience and 2022 will be his 14th season with the Terps over three separate stints at Maryland.

The winner of the 2018 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach, Locksley spent three years working under Nick Saban at the University of Alabama before taking the head coaching job at Maryland. He served as the Crimson Tide's co-offensive coordinator and won a national championship in 2017 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2018 and helping Alabama return to the College Football Playoff.

Maryland has made major strides since Locksley took over the program. In 2021, the Terps posted their first winning season since 2014 and won their first bowl game since 2010. Maryland's potent offensive attack was on full display this past season, setting numerous school records, including the single-season marks for total yards (5,740) and passing yards (3,960).

Under Locksley's tutelage, quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa has developed into one of the best quarterbacks in the Big Ten. The Locksley and Tagovailoa connection has elevated Maryland's passing game to heights it has never seen before. Tagovailoa set seven single-season Maryland records in 2021, including program best marks for passing yards (3,860), completions (328), completion percentage (69.2) and passing touchdowns (26 – ties school record).

Locksley's Terps capped off their 2021 season with a 54-10 win over Virginia Tech in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl. Maryland's 54 points in the game marked the most ever for a Terrapin team in a bowl game and it was the most points ever scored by any team in Pinstripe Bowl history.

Locksley, known for his strong recruiting skills, was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com. He also engineered top-10 recruiting classes during each of his two seasons (2003-04) as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida.

Locksley has signed 33 four or five star recruits over his coaching career (according to 247sports), 21 of which came from the DMV

area, in addition to coaching 107 NFL Draft selections. Among Locksley's successful signings to Maryland were future NFL stars Vernon Davis, Shawne Merriman, LaMont Jordan, D'Qwell Jackson, EJ Henderson, Yannick Ngakoue and Stefon Diggs.

Alabama's Locksley-led offense averaged 45.6 points and 522.0 yards per game in 2018. The Tide set school records for points scored (684), single-season total offense (7,830 yards) and passing yards (4,854) in a season. Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa threw for 3,966 yards and a school-record 43 touchdowns in 2018.

In 2017, Locksley coached the Alabama wide receivers, who combined to catch 128 passes for 2,059 yards and 19 touchdowns led by First Team All-SEC selection Calvin Ridley. Ridley hauled in 63 passes for 967 yards and five touchdowns in his junior season. Locksley spent the 2016 season on the Crimson Tide's staff as an offensive analyst.

Prior to Alabama, Locksley served as Maryland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15. He was named the Terps interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.

During his time as Maryland's offensive coordinator, the Terrapins produced balanced and effective results. Locksley's attack was led by quarterback C.J. Brown, who became Maryland's all-time leader in touchdowns responsible (58) after totaling 13 passing touchdowns and eight rushing touchdowns in 2014. Locksley also mentored wide receiver, Stefon Diggs, who hauled in 62 passes for 792 yards and five touchdowns en route to second team All-Big Ten honors. Diggs is now an NFL superstar for the Buffalo Bills.

In 2013, Locksley guided an offense that eclipsed 5,000 yards (5,160) for only the fourth time in program history and the first time since 2003. The passing game excelled that season, totaling 3,231 yards for the third-highest total in school history.

Prior to Maryland, Locksley served as the head coach at the University of New Mexico from 2009-11. Before that, Locksley also served as the offensive coordinator at the University of Illinois from 2005-08. The Illini went from No. 72 nationally in total offense in 2005 to 19th following the 2008 season. They led the Big Ten in rushing in 2006 and 2007 and then led the league in passing in 2008. The rushing attack was twice ranked in the top-10 nationally (No. 10 in 2006 and No. 5 in 2007).

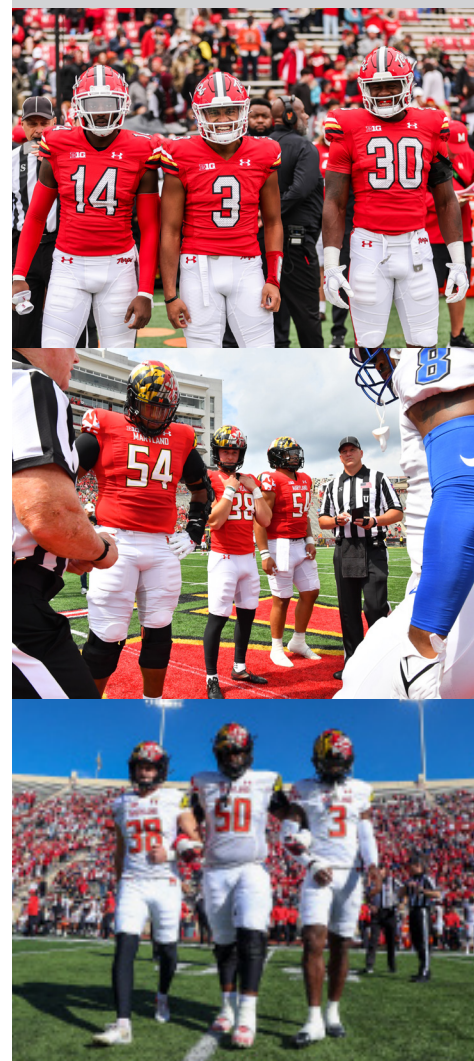

TERRAPIN NFL NEWS & NOTES

RIDIGGULOUS

- ▶ Through 11 weeks of the NFL season, Stefon Diggs has proven himself even further as one of the best wide receivers in the NFL, standing second in the league in receptions (76), and third in receiving yards (1,033), receptions (72) and touchdowns (seven). Diggs is on one of the the best teams in the NFL, the Buffalo Bills, who currently stand at 7-3.

DRAFT SUCCESS

- ▶ Maryland has a long history of being well represented in the National Football League, including 18 former players who are currently on NFL rosters as the 2022 season begins.
- ▶ The Terrapins continued their yearly tradition of having players chosen in the NFL Draft in 2022 with S Nick Cross (Indianapolis Colts) and TE Chigoziem Okonkwo (Tennessee Titans) both getting drafted in the third and fourth rounds respectively, giving Maryland at least one player drafted in eight of the last nine drafts.

ALL-PRO J.C.

- ▶ Defensive back J.C. Jackson was the star of the Terps in the NFL in 2021, putting together an All-Pro season, leading the league with 23 pass breakups, standing second in the league with eight interceptions and setting career-highs with 58 tackles (44 solo). Jackson has the most interceptions since entering the NFL in 2018 and became the first Maryland defensive starter in the Pro Bowl since Kris Jenkins ('00) started at defensive tackle in 2009. Jackson signed a five-year, \$82.5 million contract with the Los Angeles Chargers in the offseason.

WRU

- ▶ Some of the best wide receivers in the country continue to be developed at Maryland with Stefon Diggs and DJ Moore standing among the upper echelon of pass catchers in the league, last year combining for 196 receptions for 2,382 yards and 14 touchdowns, becoing the only two wide receivers in the NFL with 1,100 receiving yards in each of the last two seasons.
- ▶ Diggs electrified the NFL yet again in 2021, becoming the first Bills wide receiver ever to have 100 receptions in back-to-back seasons. In his third year in Buffalo, Diggs stood top-10 in the league in every receiving category, totaling 103 receptions for 1,225 yards and a career-high 10 touchdowns. Diggs made his second straight Pro Bowl while helping lead Buffalo to the AFC Divisional Round, and signed a four-year, \$96 million contract extension with the Bills through the 2026 season in the offseason.
- ▶ Moore stood 11th in the NFL with 1,157 receiving yards and 12 with 93 receptions to go with four touchdowns in 2021, becoming the first Carolina Panthers wide receiver ever to have three straight 1,100 yard seasons. The former Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year signed a three-year, \$61.9 million contract extension with the Panthers through the 2025 season.

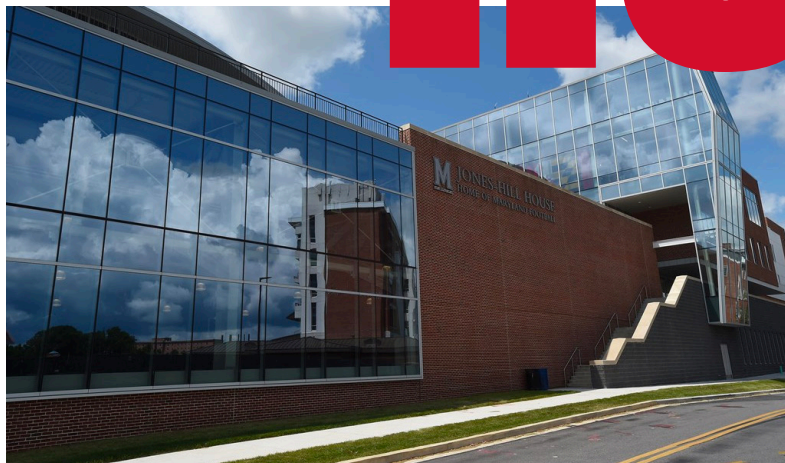
SUPER BOWL CHAMPS

- ▶ Two Terps, both in their rookie season, were crowned as Super Bowl Champions as RB Jake Funk and S Antoine Brooks Jr. both won Super Bowl LVI with the Los Angeles Rams. Funk ('20) and Brooks ('19) became the first Terp teammates to both win the Super Bowl since Torrey Smith and LaQuan Williams did so for the Baltimore Ravens in Super Bowl XLVII and the 12th and 13th Maryland players to ever hoist the Lombardi Trophy. Linebacker Keandre Jones ('19) was also in the game for the Cincinnati Bengals.

DEFENSIVE STARS

- ▶ Defensive linemen Quinton Jefferson and Yannick Ngakoue helped lead the Las Vegas Raiders to a playoff berth, combining for 75 tackles (34 solo), 14.5 sacks and four forced fumbles, with Ngakoue leading the Raiders in quarterback takedowns.
- ▶ Safety Darnell Savage Jr. continued to impress for the NFC North Champion Green Bay Packers, starting in every game and totaling 58 tackles (43 solo), seven pass breakups and two interceptions.

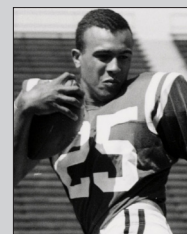
HONORING ATHLETIC AND SOCIAL JUSTICE TRAILBLAZERS

The legacies of Billy Jones and Darryl Hill are commemorated with the naming of Jones-Hill House.



Jones debuted for the Terps on December 1, 1965, against Penn State, becoming the first Black men's basketball scholarship player to play in a game with the Terps. He served as a team captain in his senior year of 1967-68. Jones went on to be an assistant coach at American, UC-Santa Barbara and Stanford and head

coach at UMBC for 12 seasons. Following his coaching career, he went to work in human resources at Lockheed and Tupperware and as a manager for cast services at Walt Disney World for 15 years before retiring in 2011.



Hill first played for the Terrapins in 1963 as he set Maryland's then-single-game record for receptions with 10 against Clemson, set an ACC season-record for touchdown catches with seven and threatened the school's single-season record for receptions with 47 that season. Hill spent time with the New York

Jets in the NFL before beginning his post-playing career. Hill has been a successful businessman and entrepreneur for decades in addition to serving as Director of Major Gifts for the Terrapin Club at Maryland from 2003-09. He is also on the Maryland State Athletic Hall of Fame Board of Directors.

Maryland 31, Buffalo 10

COLLEGE PARK, MD --Behind two rushing touchdowns each by Roman Hemby and Antwain Littleton II, Maryland defeated Buffalo 31-10 in its first game of the 2022 season, the 17th consecutive home opener win for the Terps.

Hemby and Littleton combined for 148 rushing yards and Hemby registered his first-ever 100-yard rushing performance. The two touchdowns marked a career high for both redshirt freshmen.

Building off his record-setting 2021 season, Taulia Tagovailoa went 24-for-34 for 290 yards.

Rakim Jarrett had his fifth career 100-yard receiving game with 110 yards on six catches.

A pair of Terp receivers returned to action after season-ending injuries last year as Jashaun Jones had four catches for 70 yards and Dontay Demus Jr. hauled in three balls for 23 yards.

The Maryland defense was stifling all game, holding the Bulls to 268 yards while recording four sacks (two by Henry Chibueze in his Terp debut) and seven tackles for loss. Jakorian Bennett, who led the Power 5 in pass break-ups last season, had a career-high five PBUs on Saturday.

CHARLOTTE, NC -- Behind Taulia Tagovailoa's dominance, the Terps scored five touchdowns on their first five drives and rolled to a 56-21 victory over Charlotte.

Taulia Tagovailoa threw a career-best four touchdown passes and added a rushing score. Departing in the middle of the third quarter, he finished with 391 yards on 27-31 passing for the highest completion percentage in program history.

Jacob Copeland and Jashaun Jones each caught two touchdowns in the first half. The two wideouts combined for 181 yards.

Maryland's 56 points was its most since a 62-0 victory over Howard on Sept. 11, 2021. The Terps also recorded 619 total yards, the most since 675 against Minnesota game on Oct. 30, 2020.

The Terp defense buckled down after halftime, holding the 49ers to just one score in the second half.

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- The Terps (3-0) turned a key Dante Trader Jr. interception in the fourth quarter into a touchdown, putting them ahead of SMU (2-1) for good in a 34-27 comeback victory.

The two teams went punch-for-punch all game with neither able to create much separation until Maryland broke the 27-27 tie when Taulia Tagovailoa connected with Corey Dyches with 7:30 left in the fourth quarter. The game featured five lead changes and three ties.

Roman Hemby was the star for the Terps on offense, finishing with a 213 total yards, including a career-high 151 on the ground on 16 carries, and a score. Taulia Tagovailoa was 17-of-23 for 214 yards with two passing touchdowns.

The Mustangs had a chance to even it up, but the Terps forced an incompletion from Tanner Mordecai with 46 seconds left to seal the game.

The Terps were boosted by several momentum-swinging plays by the defense throughout the night to keep the potent Mustang offense in check. Maryland forced two interceptions, one fumble, three turnovers on downs and one missed field goal. Beau Brade, who had the Terps' other interception, piled up a career-high 15 tackles, the most by a Terp since 2020. The Terps held the Mustangs to just seven points in the second half.

The game saw 959 yards of total offense as the Terrapins gained 439 while the Mustangs had 520.

With the win, the Terps have won five straight games, dating back to last season, for the first time since 2015-16. Maryland is also 3-0 for the second year in a row, setting up a huge showdown with No. 4 Michigan in Ann Arbor next week for FOX's Big Noon Kickoff Game.

ANN ARBOR, MI -- Maryland battled No. 4 Michigan for four quarters before dropping a 34-27 decision before 110,225 at Michigan Stadium on Saturday. The Terps (3-1, 0-1 Big Ten) led 13-10 in the second quarter, marking the first time the Wolverines (4-0, 1-0) trailed this season.

Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa was 20-of-30 for 207 yards with a touchdown pass. On the ground, the Terps picked up 128 yards led by Antwain Littleton II (39 yards and a rushing touchdown) and Roman Hemby (48 yards).

Rakim Jarrett and Jacob Copeland led the Terps with four receptions each. Corey Dyches had three catches for a career-high 60 receiving yards. Tai Felton scored his first-career touchdown to draw the Terps within 24-19 with 9:10 left in the fourth quarter.

Billy Edwards Jr. orchestrated a late touchdown drive to get the Terps back within eight points, but their subsequent onside kick was recovered.

Kicker Chad Ryland continued to add to his nation-leading field-goal streak, connecting on long kicks of 53 and 52 yards. He has now made 23 consecutive kicks in his career.

The Terp defense held the Wolverines to a season-low 34 points. Entering today's game, the Wolverines were averaging 55.3 points a game and had crossed the 50-point threshold in each of their three matchups.

Maryland 27, Michigan State 13

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- Behind big games from running back Antwain Littleton II and quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa, the Terps (4-1, 1-1) defeated Michigan State (2-3, 0-2) for the first time since 2016 in the first-ever game at newly-named SECU Stadium.

Tagovailoa continued his season-long dominance with yet another impressive outing, completing 32-of-41 passes for 314 yards and a score. Tagovailoa also crossed the 6,000 passing yards threshold, becoming the fastest quarterback to do so in program history. Additionally, he surpassed Terp legend Boomer Esiason (6,259) on the career passing yards list as Tagovailoa now has 6,287 in his career to stand third all-time in Maryland history. He also threw for 300 or more yards for the tenth time in his career, tying Scott Milanovich's school record of 10, set from 1992-95.

The Terps continued to be boosted by their young running backs as both Littleton II and Colby McDonald notched rushing scores on the day. Littleton finished with a career-high 120 yards on the ground to become the seventh different back under Michael Locksley to gain 100-plus yards in a game.

Maryland's special teams came up with several momentum-swinging plays including a blocked field goal by Jakorian Bennett and a 56-yard punt from Colton Spangler. The blocked field goal was Maryland's third since the start of last season, the second-most among all FBS teams in the nation. Chad Ryland connected on field goals of 43 and 51 yards, as he tied the Big Ten record for most consecutive field goals made at 24.

The Terps' defense, led by Tarheeb Still (career-high nine tackles), Beau Brade (eight tackles), and Ahmad McCullough (career-high eight tackles), held Michigan State to zero points and just 75 yards in the second half, including just eight yards in the third quarter. At one point in the half, the Spartans were forced to punt four times in a row, three of which were off three-and-outs.

Purdue 31, Maryland 29

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- Taulia Tagovailoa connected with Corey Dyches in the end zone to pull Maryland to within two points of Purdue with 35 seconds remaining, but the ensuing two-point conversion failed after the initial attempt was called back and the Terps fell in a heartbreaker, 31-29, at SECU Stadium on Saturday.

Purdue scored the go-ahead touchdown with 3:19 left in regulation and then added another touchdown with 1:20 remaining. The first of those touchdowns came on the following drive after the Terps took a 23-17 lead as Tagovailoa hit Roman Hemby on a screen pass and Hemby took it 11 yards to the house with 7:47 left in the fourth. The Maryland extra point attempt was blocked.

On the final possession, Tagovailoa orchestrated a beautiful drive down the field with 1:20 left in regulation and connected with Dyches for his second receiving score of the day. He appeared to find Rakim Jarrett in the back of the end zone on the two-point conversion, but the officials called it back on an ineligible receiver downfield penalty and the ensuing attempt was no good.

The Terps are now 4-2 overall and 1-2 in the Big Ten while Purdue moved to 4-2 and 2-1 in the conference.

Tagovailoa had another big game, completing 26-of-38 passes for 315 yards and three scores. He moved to second in career passing yards with 6,702, passing Chris Turner (6,543 from 2007-09). Scott Milanovich holds the school record with 7,301 career passing yards. His 315 yards were the 11th time he surpassed the 300-yard threshold, setting a program record.

Dyches had a career-high 106 yards receiving with two touchdowns, both in remarkable fashion. The second inched the Terps to within two points.

The defense was strong throughout the game. True freshman Jaishawn Barham had five tackles, two sacks, two tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Durrell Nchami had two sacks, three tackles for a loss and forced a fumble.

Overall, Maryland had a season-high five sacks and eight tackles for loss. Jakorian Bennett had an interception and racked up three pass break-ups to add to his total of 25 over the last two seasons, the most of any player in FBS football. Fa'Najae Gotoy led the Terps with seven tackles.

In allowing just 14 Purdue rushing yards, it was the second-fewest the Terps defense has allowed in a conference game since joining the Big Ten. The fewest the Terps was when Purdue rushed for just 10 yards in 2016. Overall, the 14 rushing yards are the fewest allowed by Maryland since limiting Howard to one rushing yard in 2019.

Maryland continued its season-long third quarter defensive dominance, holding Purdue scoreless and creating three turnovers in the quarter. The Terps have only allowed seven third-quarter points all year, posting its fifth third-quarter shutout on Saturday.

In scoring 27 or more points, the Terps set a school record for most consecutive games with 27 or more points in eight games in a row, dating to last season's final two games.

BLOOMINGTON, IN -- Maryland moved to 5-2 for the first time since 2016 with a 38-33 comeback victory at Indiana on Saturday at Memorial Stadium. Backup quarterback Billy Edwards Jr., engineered two scoring drives in the final seven minutes of the game, the first of which brought the Terps down the field and finished with a Roman Hemby 6-yard touchdown run with 5:35 left in the fourth quarter, putting the Terps up 31-27.

The Terps' defense came up with a huge sequence just seconds later as Mosiah Nasili-Kite recovered a fumble with 5:02 remaining to give the Terps the ball back. Hemby (107 rushing yards) secured the game with a 46-yard rush on 3rd-and-nine with less than three minutes remaining. It was Hemby's third 100-yard game of the season.

Maryland took a commanding 38-27 lead as Edwards scored on a 3-yard touchdown run with 2:11 left in the game. Edwards ran for 53 yards, all in the decisive final minutes.

Indiana added a late touchdown with 54 seconds remaining, but the Terps defense got pressure on Connor Bazalak to disrupt the two-point conversion attempt. The Terps covered up the Hoosiers' onside kick attempt to officially come away with the road victory.

Starting quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa, who suffered a fourth-quarter injury, finished with 270 passing yards on 25-of-39 with two passing touchdowns and a rushing score. He connected with Dontay Demus Jr. and CJ Dippre on scoring receptions. Jashaun Jones led the Terps with five catches for 41 yards while Jacob Copeland added 62 yards on four receptions.

The Terps finished with 442 yards of total offense.

On defense, Maryland got a big boost from interceptions by Tarheeb Still and Deonte Banks. Both picks came on Indiana's first play from scrimmage of each half. The Terps also held Indiana to just 36 rushing yards.

In scoring 38 points, the Terps added to their school record for most consecutive games with 27 or more points in nine games in a row, dating to last season's final two games.

Maryland 31, Northwestern 24

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- The Terps are bowl eligible on the earliest date in more than 20 years after a 31-24 victory over Northwestern on Homecoming at SECU Stadium. This is the second consecutive year the Terps (6-2, 3-2 Big Ten) have reached bowl eligibility.

On the first play after Northwestern scored to tie the game at 24-24, Roman Hemby broke off a career-long 75-yard touchdown run with 3:22 left to play to put the Terps ahead for good.

Beau Brade came up with a big interception on the Wildcats' ensuing drive to seal the victory. With the win, Maryland moved to 6-2 overall for the first time since the 2010 season. Northwestern is now 1-6 and 1-3 in the Big Ten.

Hemby rushed for a career-high 179 yards, his fourth-career 100-yard game, and scored three touchdowns in the Terrapins' victory. His three rushing TDs in a game are the most by a Terp since Javon Leake had three rushing TDs vs. Illinois in 2018. His rushing total was the most by a Terp since Jake Funk had 180 vs. Rutgers in 2020.

Maryland scored 17 unanswered points after falling behind 17-7 late in the second quarter to take a 24-17 lead before the Wildcats tied it.

With record-setting signal caller Taulia Tagovailoa sidelined due to injury, redshirt freshman Billy Edwards Jr., drew his first-career start at quarterback. Edwards Jr., threw for 166 yards on 18-of-28 passing and a touchdown while rushing for 66 yards.

Receiver Rakim Jarrett had a season-high eight catches with 82 receiving yards and a go-ahead touchdown grab in the third quarter. His reception total was the highest by a Terp in a game this season.

The Terp defense came up big in the third quarter yet again, getting a key interception from Dante Trader Jr. and holding the Wildcats scoreless in the period. Maryland has only allowed 10 total points in the third quarter all season, tied for the third-lowest amount in the FBS. Gereme Spraggins had a career-high eight tackles and a TFL. Jakorian Bennett, Ahmad McCullough, and Tarheeb Still each added six tackles.

In scoring 31 points, the Terps added to their school record for most consecutive games with 27 or more points in 10 consecutive games, dating to last season's final two games. They have also won 16 games in a row when scoring 30 or more points.

#2 Ohio State 43, Maryland 30

COLLEGE PARK, MD – Maryland led No. 2 Ohio State at halftime and battled the Buckeyes to the very end as the Terps suffered a 43-30 defeat at SEC Stadium.

Deonte Banks blocked a Buckeye extra point and Jakorian Bennett returned it for two points to bring the Terps within 33-23 with 12:29 left in the fourth. The Terp offense took advantage of that momentum and drove 74 yards down the field in seven plays, highlighted by a beautiful ball from Taulia Tagovailoa to Rakim Jarrett for 49 yards – a pass that made Tagovailoa the program leader in career passing yards. The Terps faced a fourth-and-goal from the one-yard line that looked like it was going nowhere until Tagovailoa extended the play and found Jashaun Jones in the back of the end zone, making it a 33-30 game with 9:49 left to play.

Ohio State knocked in a successful 45-yard field goal with 42 seconds remaining to bring its lead to 36-30 and then came up with a defensive score on the Terps' attempt to drive down the field for the winning touchdown.

Tagovailoa, who became Maryland's leader in career passing yards in the game, threw for 293 yards on 26-of-36 with two passing touchdowns, as he also tied the school record for passing scores in a career.

Dontay Demus Jr., had a season-best five receptions for 67 yards. C.J. Dippre set a career-high with four catches for 30 yards with a touchdown reception. The Terps had 402 of total offense.

Defensively, safeties Beau Brade and Dante Trader Jr. led the way with eight and seven tackles, respectively. Deonte Banks notched four tackles, two PBUs and a blocked extra point.

Maryland's 402 yards of total offense was the second-most allowed by Ohio State all season (Penn State 482) and the Terps were the second team to score 30 points against the Buckeyes this year as Penn State tallied 31.

In the first half, the Terps got the better of the Buckeyes on both sides of the ball, outgaining them 211-159 en route to a 13-10 advantage. Tagovailoa completed his first 11 passes of the night and finished the half 16-of-18 with 180 yards and a score. On the other side, Maryland's defense was all over the field, holding Heisman hopeful C.J. Stroud to 131 yards on just 9-of-18 passing.
