### THE OPENING KICK

#### GOING BOWLING

- ▶ With a win at Nebraska (11/11), Maryland is bowl eligible for the third season in a row for the first time since 2006-08. The Terps have won each of their previous two bowl games, the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in 2021 and the Duke's Mayo Bowl in 2022. Maryland will look to win a bowl game in three straight seasons for the first time in program history this year.

#### MATCHING UP VS. RUTGERS

- ▶ Maryland has beaten Rutgers by a combined score of 77-16 over the last two seasons, 37-0 last year in College Park and 40-16 the year prior in Piscataway. QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has completed 46-of-67 passes over the last two games vs. the Scarlet Knights for 654 yards and four touchdowns in the two wins. Tagovailoa became Maryland's all-time leader in career touchdown passes last season, Maryland's all-time single-season passing leader in the game two years ago and this year has the chance to become the all-time Big Ten passing leader with 268 yards.
- ▶ Since joining the Big Ten, Maryland is 6-3 against Rutgers and has averaged 35.8 points per game in those contests. The Terps have scored more than 24 points in each of the nine games against the Scarlet Knights with seven games over 30 points. Each of the last four Terrapin victories over Rutgers have been by at least 24 points.
- ▶ Maryland has averaged 250.2 rushing yards per game against Rutgers since the two schools joined the Big Ten in 2014, the sixth-most by any Big Ten team against a single opponent over that time (minimum nine games) behind Wisconsin against Nebraska (293.0), Wisconsin against Purdue (258.6), Ohio State against Rutgers (253.4), Ohio State vs. Indiana (251.6) and Northwestern vs. Illinois (251.6).

#### REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- ▶ QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has helped ascend the Terps' passing game to new heights during his four-year career. The quarterback has set Maryland career records for passing yards (10,895), passing touchdowns (73), total touchdowns (85), completions (931), completion percentage (66.8), 300-yard passing games (14), passing efficiency (144.9) and total offense (11,115).
- ▶ Tagovailoa has been one of the best quarterbacks in the Big Ten through 11 games, currently leading the conference and standing top-20 in the country in passing yards (3,016), passing touchdowns (22), completions (266), points responsible for (158). He leads the Big Ten and stands top-30 in the nation in total offense (276.1).
- ▶ The redshirt senior is one of only two FBS quarterbacks with at least 2,500 passing yards in each of the last three seasons, along with Memphis' Seth Henigan. He's also thrown at least one touchdown in 33 games, tied for the second-most among FBS quarterbacks in that time with Sam Hartman (Notre Dame). Seth Henigan (Memphis) has thrown a TD in 34 games over the last three seasons.
- ▶ Tagovailoa is only 268 yards away from becoming the all-time Big Ten passing leader. Currently, he stands fourth all-time and is only 14 yards behind Purdue's Drew Brees and only 22 yards behind Minnesota's Adam Weber. Purdue's Curtis Painter currently stands atop the all-time list with 11,163 passing yards. Tagovailoa's current career completion percentage (.668) is the fourth-best of any Big Ten quarterback all-time. He is also eighth in career passing touchdowns in Big Ten history with 73 in his Maryland career. Next on the list with 74 is Chuck Long of Iowa from 1981-85.
- ▶ The Ewa Beach, Hawaii native has now thrown multiple touchdown passes in 23 career games, the most of any active Big Ten player. Maryland has gone 15-8 in those games.
- ▶ Tagovailoa currently stands top-15 among all FBS QBs in career completion percentage (fifth), completions (eighth), passing yards (10th) and total offense (12th).

## INTERCEPTIONS ON INTERCEPTIONS

- ▶ Maryland has been one of the best teams in the nation at intercepting passes this season, currently standing sixth in the nation and first in the Big Ten with 14.
- ▶ CB **Tarheeb Still** has recorded five of those 13 interceptions, good for second in the nation, trailing only Notre Dame's Xavier Watts. Still is one of only two Big Ten players (Ricardo Hallman, Wisconsin) to have at least five interceptions.
- ▶ Still was last week's National Jim Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week and the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after a two-interception performance at Nebraska (11/11), both in the end zone and one with a tie game late in the fourth quarter to give Maryland the ball back for the game winning drive.
- ▶ The senior is one of only three players in the FBS to have two games with two interceptions this season (Virginia, 9/15 & Nebraska, 11/11), joining Elijah Jones (Boston College) & Xavier Watts (Notre Dame).
- ▶ Still's five interceptions this season are the most by a Terp since Tre Watson in 2018 (also five). With one more interception, he'd have the most in a season by a Terp since Will Likely had six in 2014.
- ▶ S **Dante Trader Jr.** also had two interceptions in Maryland's win over Nebraska, marking the first time this season an FBS team had two players with at least two interceptions in the same game.
- ▶ Maryland's defense has intercepted three or more passes in three different games this season (Virginia, 9/15, Michigan State 9/23 & Nebraska, 11/11), tied with Notre Dame and Coastal Carolina for most such games this season in the FBS. It is the Terps' first season with three such games since having three in 2002.



## DOMINANT DYCHES

- ▶ TE **Corey Dyches** has 86 receptions over the last two seasons, tied for the second most among FBS tight ends in that time. The only tight end with more since the beginning of last season is Georgia's Brock Bowers (114).
- ▶ This season, Dyches' 47 receptions are the fourth-most among all FBS tight ends, only trailing Colorado State's Dallin Holker (59), Georgia's Brock Bowers (51) and UConn's Justin Joly (50).
- ▶ Dyches is the eighth-highest rated receiving tight end in the FBS (over 400 snaps) via Pro Football Focus with a 74.9 grade. He is the highest-rated receiving tight end in the Big Ten and fifth-highest in the nation (over 300 snaps) with a 83.9 grade.
- ▶ The redshirt junior has at least four receptions in all 10 games played this season and has caught a reception in 24-straight games, the longest streak on the team.
- ▶ Over the last two-plus seasons, Maryland tight ends as a unit have combined for 205 receptions, 2,052 yards and 17 touchdowns, the most receptions, receiving yards and second-most touchdowns of any tight end unit in the Big Ten over that span.

## ON THE OFFENSE: BY THE NUMBERS

2

WR **Tai Felton**, WR **Jeshaun Jones** and WR **Kaden Prather** are one of **two** FBS trios this season to each record at least 40 receptions, 550 receiving yards and four receiving touchdowns. The other is Washington State's Josh Kelly, Lincoln Victor and Kyle Williams..

2

Maryland went **2-for-2** on fourth-down attempts last week against Michigan, its fourth game this season in which it went 2-for-2 or better on fourth down. This is tied for the most such games in the FBS this season (Boston College, Minnesota, Penn State) and is the most for the Terrapins in a season over the past 25 years.

As a team, Maryland ranks top-**three** in the Big Ten in third down percentage (44.7), team completion percentage (.650), passing offense (277.9) and team passing efficiency (138.2).

3

**Three** offensive linemen: G **Corey Bullock**, T **DJ Glaze** and C **Aric Harris** rank among the top offensive linemen at their respective positions in the Big Ten and nation according to Pro Football Focus. Glaze is the second-highest rated pass blocking tackle in the Big Ten with a 81.5 grade, Harris is the fourth-highest rated center in the league with a 70.5 grade and Bullock is the fourth-highest rated guard in the conference with a 71.9 grade.

Against #2 Michigan (11/18), QB **Billy Edwards Jr.** became the third FBS player over the past 25 seasons to record at least three rushing touchdowns on four or fewer rushes and three or fewer rushing yards in a single game. The others were Tulsa's Courtney Tennial in 2008 against Central Arkansas and Texas A&M's Joe Weber against Wyoming in 2001. Edwards became the first Terp QB to have three rushing touchdowns in a game since C.J. Brown in 2014 and only the third player since 2019 to have at least three rushing TDs vs. Michigan, joining Kenneth Walker III (Michigan State, 2021) and J.K. Dobbins (Ohio State, 2019).

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has **14** 300-yard passing games in his career, the most in program history. In 2021, Tagovailoa set the single-season program record for 300-yard games with seven in 2021. Tagovailoa's most recent 300-yard game came with 352 yards against Indiana (9/30).

Against #9 Penn State (11/4), QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** completed his first **17** consecutive passes in the game, the longest to begin a game in the country this season, equaling South Carolina's Spencer Rattler vs. Mississippi State (9/23/23). His streak was the longest by any Big Ten player since Michael Penix, then with Indiana, had 20 completions in a row on Sept. 28, 2019.

Dating back to last season, Maryland has attempted at least **30** passes in 14 consecutive games. The only FBS team with a longer such active streak is Washington State (21)

36

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** has thrown at least one touchdown pass in **36**-of-40 games as a Terp, including 17-straight from October 30, 2020 to December 27, 2021. Tagovailoa has 11 games of at least three passing touchdowns, most recently three against Northwestern (10/28).

Maryland has **51** offensive plays of 20+ yards this season, the third-most in the Big Ten (trailing #3 Ohio State & #2 Michigan)

Over the course of his career, Maryland is 11-2 when WR **Jeshaun Jones** has **70** or more yards receiving. Jones currently stands fifth in program history in career receiving touchdowns (14), sixth in program history in career receptions (142) and eighth in receiving yards (1930).

## ON THE DEFENSE/SPECIAL TEAMS: BY THE NUMBERS

The win over Nebraska (11/11) was the second time this season Maryland has allowed **10** or fewer points against a conference opponent (also vs. Michigan State). It is the first time the Terrapins have had two such games in conference play since doing so in the ACC in 2004.

DL **Donnell Brown** is the **ninth**-highest rated edge defender in the FBS and the top-rated in the Big Ten (over 300 snaps), via Pro Football Focus earning a 86.1 grade. He is the second-best edge defender in the nation in pass coverage, earning a 92.2

98

WR **Braeden Wisloski** returned a kickoff **98** yards to put the Terrapins on the board in the first quarter against Virginia (9/15), the 10th-longest kick return in college football this season. It marked the longest return by a Maryland player since Javon Leake equaled a school record with a 100-yard return at Rutgers on Oct. 5, 2019 and the longest by any Big Ten freshman since Stefon Diggs against North Carolina in 2012. Wisloski is the first Maryland player to garner Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors since kicker Chad Ryland on Nov. 28, 2022. Wisloski currently leads the Big Ten and stands 18th in the FBS, averaging 25.4 yards per kickoff return.

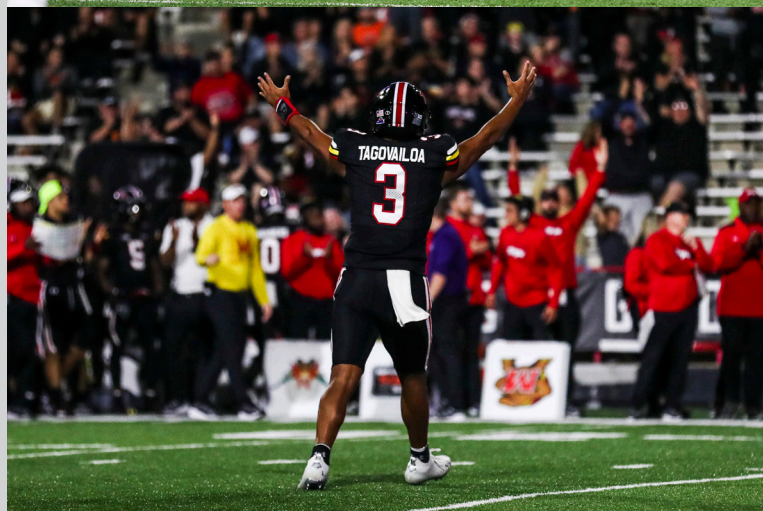

# HEAD COACH MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

Towson '92 • 15th Year at Maryland, 5th as Head Coach



Michael Locksley returned home to become the University of Maryland's 37th head football coach in December 2018. Locksley, a Washington, D.C. native with deep personal and professional connections to the area, has 30 years of coaching experience and 2023 will be his 15th season with the Terps over three separate stints at Maryland.

The winner of the 2018 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach, Locksley spent three years working under Nick Saban at the University of Alabama before taking the head coaching job at Maryland. He served as the Crimson Tide's co-offensive coordinator and won a national championship in 2017 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2018 and helping Alabama return to the College Football Playoff.

Maryland has made major strides since Locksley took over the program. The Terps have posted back-to-back winning seasons in 2021 and 2022, a first for the football program since 2013-14. Locksley has also guided Maryland to bowl wins in each of the last two years, the first time Maryland has accomplished the feat since winning the Peach Bowl (2002) and Gator Bowl (2003) nearly 20 years ago.

During the 2022 season, Locksley propelled the Terps to an 8-5 record and a win over No. 23 N.C. State in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. It marked the most wins for the Terps in a single season since 2010. Thirteen Terps garnered All-Big Ten recognition, highlighted by kicker Chad Ryland and quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa being named Second Team All-Conference.

In 2021, Locksley led the Terps to their first winning season in seven years. The season was capped off with a 54-10 win over Virginia Tech in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl. Maryland's 54 points in the game marked the most ever for a Terrapin team in a bowl game and it was the most points ever scored by any team in Pinstripe Bowl history.

Maryland's potent offensive attack was on full display in 2021, setting numerous school records, including the single-season marks for total yards (5,740) and passing yards (3,960).

Under Locksley's tutelage, Tagovailoa has developed into one of the best quarterbacks in the country. The Locksley and Tagovailoa connection has elevated Maryland's passing game to heights it has never seen before. Tagovailoa set seven single-season Maryland records in 2021, including program best marks for passing yards (3,860), completions (328), completion percentage (69.2) and passing touchdowns (26 – ties school record). At the conclusion of the

2022 season, Tagovailoa owns eight Maryland career passing records, including most passing yards, passing touchdowns and most completions.

Locksley, known for his strong recruiting skills, was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com. He also engineered top-10 recruiting classes during each of his two seasons (2003-04) as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida.

Locksley has signed 37 four or five star recruits over his coaching career (according to 247sports), 23 of which came from the DMV area, in addition to coaching 114 NFL Draft selections. Among Locksley's successful signings to Maryland were future NFL stars Vernon Davis, Shawne Merriman, LaMont Jordan, D'Qwell Jackson, EJ Henderson, Yannick Ngakoue and Stefon Diggs.

Alabama's Locksley-led offense averaged 45.6 points and 522.0 yards per game in 2018. The Tide set school records for points scored (684), single-season total offense (7,830 yards) and passing yards (4,854) in a season. Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa threw for 3,966 yards and a school-record 43 touchdowns in 2018.

In 2017, Locksley coached the Alabama wide receivers, who combined to catch 128 passes for 2,059 yards and 19 touchdowns led by First Team All-SEC selection Calvin Ridley. Ridley hauled in 63 passes for 967 yards and five touchdowns in his junior season. Locksley spent the 2016 season on the Crimson Tide's staff as an offensive analyst.

Prior to Alabama, Locksley served as Maryland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15. He was named the Terps interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.

During his time as Maryland's offensive coordinator, the Terrapins produced balanced and effective results. Locksley's attack was led by quarterback C.J. Brown, who became Maryland's all-time leader in touchdowns responsible (58) after totaling 13 passing touchdowns and eight rushing touchdowns in 2014. Locksley also mentored wide receiver, Stefon Diggs, who hauled in 62 passes for 792 yards and five touchdowns en route to second team All-Big Ten honors. Diggs is now an NFL superstar for the Buffalo Bills.

In 2013, Locksley guided an offense that eclipsed 5,000 yards (5,160) for only the fourth time in program history and the first time since 2003. The passing game excelled that season, totaling 3,231 yards for the third-highest total in school history.

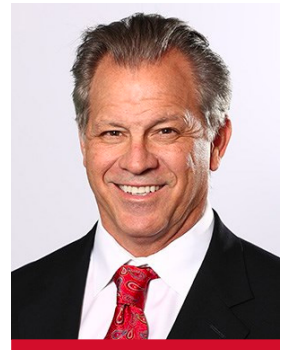

## TERRAPIN NFL NEWS & NOTES

### RIDIGGULOUS

- ▶ In his ninth NFL season, Stefon Diggs continues to stand as one of the top receivers in the league coming off a massive 2022 season. Through ten weeks, Diggs is tied for the most receptions in the NFL at 73, is fifth in receiving yards with 868 and tied for second in receiving touchdowns with seven. Last year, Diggs finished top-five in the NFL among receivers in touchdowns (11-13rd), 40+ yard catches (6-13rd), receptions (108-4th), receiving yards (1,429-5th) and targets (154-5th). Diggs was also a vital piece in helping the Buffalo Bills make the playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

### DRAFT SUCCESS

- ▶ Maryland has a deep history of being well represented in the National Football League, including 20 former players who are currently on NFL rosters
- ▶ Five Terrapins were selected in the 2023 NFL Draft (Deonte Banks, Jakorian Bennett, Chad Ryland, Jaelyn Duncan and Spencer Anderson), the most for the program since 2009.

### BANK ON HIM

- ▶ Defensive back Deonte Banks was selected 24th overall in the 2023 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, becoming the 18th player in program history to be selected in the first round. Over the last six NFL Drafts, Maryland has had three first round selections (DJ Moore, Darnell Savage Jr.), the fifth most of any Big Ten program. Banks and former teammate Jakorian Bennett (No. 104 overall pick in the 2023 Draft) were the highest-drafted cornerback duo in the draft. Appearing in all 10 games in the 2023 season, Banks has tallied 36 combined tackles (29 solo), nine passes defended and an interception for the Giants.

### WRU

- ▶ DJ Moore has had a strong 2023 season with the Bears, over 10 weeks Moore sits in ninth in NFL for receiving yards (796) and receiving touchdowns (5). Moore won NFC Offensive Player of the Week after a stellar showing against the Commanders in week 5, tallying 230 yards over 8 receptions and three touchdowns.
- ▶ Rakim Jarrett made the Tampa Bay Buccaneers 53 man roster as an undrafted free agent after standing 11th in program history in career receptions (119), 12th in career touchdowns (10) & 13th in career yards (1,552) as a Terp. So far in 2023, Jarrett has appeared in eight games for Tampa Bay.

### CHIG OKONK-WOW

- ▶ Chig Okonkwo starred for the Tennessee Titans last season and was named PFWA First Team All-Rookie, cementing himself as the best rookie tight end in the league in 2022. In 2023, Okonkwo is on third the Titans in receiving yards (200), leading tight ends on the team. Okonkwo is averaging 7.4 yards per catch so far.

### DEFENSIVE STARS

- ▶ Standout safety Darnell Savage Jr. has built off of a strong 2022 season. So far in the 2023 season, Savage has tallied 22 solo tackles (seventh on the team) and a tackle for a loss over six games played.
- ▶ In his Eighth professional season, Quinton Jefferson has played in all 9 games of the season. Jefferson is having a strong season for the Jets and has tallied 22 combined tackles (10 solo) and 4.5 sacks so far. In the offseason, Jefferson signed with the New York Jets on April 6, signing for one year and \$3.6 million.

## Maryland 38, Towson 6

**COLLEGE PARK, MD** -- Maryland opened its 2023 season with a resounding 38-6 victory over Towson on Saturday at SECU Stadium. The Terps have now won 18 consecutive home openers and 12 consecutive non-conference openers, the second-longest streak in the nation.

Maryland raced out to a 21-0 first-quarter lead and never looked back piling up 449 yards of offense with 283 through the air and 166 on the ground.

The Terps' defense hasn't allowed a touchdown in its last three games (covering 12 quarters) dating to last season. The last time the Terps had three games in a row without allowing a touchdown came from Nov. 6-20, 1976, when the Terps posted three consecutive shutouts.

Preseason All-Big Ten selection Taulia Tagovailoa surpassed the 8,000-yard mark for career passing yards as he threw for 260 on 22-of-33 with three passing touchdowns, along with a rushing score. He connected with Corey Dyches, Jashaun Jones and Kaden Prather on scoring receptions.

Playing with a new jersey number (No. 2), Dyches had the best game of his career with a career-high 108 receiving yards on a career-high tying six catches.

Jones added five catches for 57 yards. Ocatvian Smith Jr., had four receptions for 42 yards.

On the ground, Roman Hemby ran for 58 yards on 12 carries with a rushing score.

## GAME 2

Sept. 9, 2023

## Maryland 38, Charlotte 20

**COLLEGE PARK, MD** -- Maryland started the season 2-0 for the eighth time in the last nine seasons with a 38-20 victory over Charlotte on Saturday night at SECU Stadium and before an NBC Saturday Night audience.

The Terps recovered from an early 14-0 deficit, scoring 38 unanswered points. It was the first time Maryland won a game it trailed by 14+ points entering the second quarter since a 38-31 win over North Carolina State on November 27, 2010. The Terps piled up 515 yards over the final 45 minutes of game time, scoring on seven of their last eight complete drives.

Taulia Tagovailoa threw for 287 yards on 25-of-36 with a touchdown pass. Backup quarterback Billy Edwards Jr., scored the Terps' first touchdown with a 1-yard plunge up the middle.

Roman Hemby had 217 yards of total offense with 162 rushing yards and 55 receiving yards with a rushing touchdown. It was Hemby's fifth career 100-yard game. Colby McDonald added 73 yards on the ground with eight carries and a 23-yard rushing score.

Kaden Prather had four catches for 80 receiving yards and scored a touchdown for the second week in a row with his new team after transferring from West Virginia.

Jashaun Jones had three catches for 45 yards as he became the 17th player in Maryland history to record 100 career receptions.

After allowing a touchdown on the first drive, the Maryland defense was exceptional for the rest of the game, forcing six consecutive punts followed by two straight turnovers. After Charlotte gained 105 yards in the first quarter, the 49ers (1-1) were held to 209 yards for the remainder of the contest.

## GAME 3

Sept. 15, 2023

## Maryland 42, Virginia 14

**COLLEGE PARK, MD** -- In a game that saw a long-standing rivalry renewed, Maryland defeated Virginia 42-14 on Friday evening at SECU Stadium to move to 3-0 for the third straight season. It's Maryland's largest win in the series since 1986, a 42-10 win.

In front of an enthusiastic 'Black Out' crowd, Maryland won its 11th consecutive non-conference game as the team debuted its new script Terps black helmets and uniforms.

For the second week in a row, Maryland rallied from a 14-0 first-quarter deficit, this time scoring 42 unanswered points to take control of the game. Taulia Tagovailoa's 64-yard bomb to Jashaun Jones put the Terps in front for the first time, 21-14, with 9:47 left in the third quarter.

Tonight marked the first time the former ACC foes met since 2013 and the 79th time overall, the most meetings of any team the Terps have played. Maryland now leads the series 45-32-2 and has won four of the last five against the Cavaliers.

Tagovailoa threw for 342 yards on 19-of-30 with a touchdown. It was the 13th 300-yard passing game of his career.

Jones had five catches for 96 yards with that long touchdown. The Terps also got four touchdowns on the ground from three different running backs: Roman Hemby (two), Antwain Littleton II and Colby McDonald.

The Terps' defense buckled down after the first quarter, holding the Cavaliers scoreless for the game's final 49:16. Maryland had a third-quarter shutout for the 10th time in 16 games, allowing just 2.3 points per game dating back to last season. Tarheeb Still's interception in the end zone early in the fourth quarter – his first of two in the game – preserved the Terps lead and thwarted the Cavaliers' chance to tie the game. Donnell Brown picked off a pass for the second week in a row, also in the fourth quarter. The Terps had three fourth-quarter interceptions as well as a forced fumble.

In three games this season, Maryland is outscoring opponents 67-9 in the second half.

## GAME 4

Sept. 23, 2023

## Maryland 31, Michigan State 9

**EAST LANSING, MI** – In its Big Ten opener, Maryland passed its first road test of the season, defeating Michigan State 31-9 to move to 4-0 for the second time in the last three years.

Dating back to last season, the Terps have won six consecutive games for the first time since 2003-04. Maryland is 14-5 in its last 19 games dating to the 2021 season.

Maryland started fast, jumping out to a 21-0 lead early and never looked back.

Taulia Tagovailoa threw for 223 yards on 21-of-36 passing and three touchdowns. He also rushed for an additional score.

The Terps got contributors across the board on offense, with 11 different players catching at least one pass. Kaden Prather led the way with six grabs for 45 yards. Tai Felton added three yards on 67 catches. The touchdown receptions came from Tyrese Chambers, Octavian Smith Smith and linebacker Sean Greeley – the first defensive player to catch a touchdown in Maryland history.

Maryland's offense scored touchdowns on its first three drives while the Terp defense forced an interception, a turnover on downs and a forced fumble on the Spartans' first three possessions. Overall, the Terps forced five total turnovers (three interceptions, two fumble recoveries) to go along with three sacks. Beau Brade led the defense with 10 tackles along with an interception. Dante Trader Jr. had nine stops and had a career-high three pass breakups.

It marked the second week in a row the Terps forced at least four turnovers, the first time since 2005 Maryland had back-to-back weeks with four or more forced turnovers. With three interceptions in each of the last two games, its the first time since 2001 that Maryland achieved that.

## Maryland 44, Indiana 17

**COLLEGE PARK, MD** -- Maryland continued its impressive start to the season, besting Indiana 44-17 on Saturday afternoon on Family Weekend at SECU Stadium. The win brought the Terps to 5-0 for the first time since 2001.

This is the ninth time in the 131-year history of the Terrapins that Maryland started a season 5-0. Maryland has won seven games in a row overall dating to last season, its longest win streak since winning seven in a row bridging the 2003-04 seasons. Maryland is now 15-5 in its last 20 games.

The Terps got off to another fast start, putting up 21 points in the first quarter, and never looked back. Maryland (5-0, 2-0) has now beat the Hoosiers (2-3, 0-2) three straight times.

Tai Felton had a career day, finishing with three first-half touchdowns receptions, as part of career-highs of seven catches and 134 yards. Felton became the first Terp in history to have three receiving touchdowns in the first half. He became just the sixth – and first since Torrey Smith (four) in 2010 – to have three receiving touchdowns in a game in Maryland history.

Taulia Tagovailoa had another big day, throwing for 352 yards on 24-of-34 and a career-high five touchdown passes. His first completion of the day, a 62-yard bomb to Jeshuan Jones down the sideline, gave him over 9,000 career passing yards. It was his 14th career 300-yard passing game. His five-touchdown passing game was the first by a Terp since Scott Milanovich had five passing touchdowns vs. NC State in 1994.

Jones finished with 121 receiving yards on six catches. He had his third career 100-yard game. His first catch of the day put him over the 1,500 career passing yards mark. He's now 13th in career receiving yards with 1,569.

The defense piled up a season-best eight tackles for loss and three sacks. Caleb Wheatland had two TFLs and a sack. Tarheeb Still led the Terps with six tackles. Fa'Naje Gotay had his second career interception along with five tackles and a TFL.

The Maryland defense was impressive for most of the afternoon, holding Ohio State to just 62 rushing yards. The Terps didn't allow the Buckeyes to score in their first five drives. Other defensive highlights for the Terps, including holding Ohio State to just 3-of-12 on third-down conversions. Maryland had three sacks, the most Ohio State has allowed in a game this season.

Maryland, which started the year 5-0, for its best start since the 2001 season, fell to 5-1 overall and 2-1 in the Big Ten. Ohio State improved to 5-0 and 2-0 in the conference.

**EVANSTON, IL** -- Maryland took an early lead, but Northwestern captured a 33-27 victory over the Terps at Ryan Field on Saturday afternoon. The Terps have lost three games in a row and stand at 5-3 overall and 2-3 in Big Ten action. Northwestern moved to 4-4 overall and 2-3 in conference play.

Taulia Tagovailoa became the seventh quarterback in Big Ten history to reach 10,000 passing yards as he finished with 274 yards in the game to give him 10,079 as he was 30-of-47 with three touchdown passes in the game.

Jeshaun Jones had a career-high tying nine receptions for 78 yards to top the receiving charts for the Terps. Roman Hemby caught a 24-yard touchdown pass as he gained 68 all-purpose yards. Tai Felton also hauled in a touchdown.

Colby McDonald led the Terps' ground game with 43 yards on five carries.

## Maryland 13, Nebraska 10

**LINCOLN, NE --** The Terps are headed to a bowl game for the third year in a row after beating Nebraska, 13-10, at Memorial Stadium on Saturday afternoon. Maryland is now 6-4 overall and 3-4 in Big Ten play as the Terps will play in bowl games in three consecutive seasons for the first time since 2006-08. Maryland beat Nebraska for the first time in history.

Jack Howes kicked the game-winning 24-yard field goal as time expired for the walk-off win. It was the Terps' first walk-off win since beating Illinois on Sept. 17, 2021 on a Joseph Petrino 32-yard field goal as time expired.

Maryland's defense created five turnovers in the game with four interceptions and a fumble recovery. Both Tarheeb Still and Dante Trader each had two interceptions to key the defense, which held Nebraska to just 269 yards and shutout the Huskers in the first half. Maryland has won 15 games in a row when allowing less than 20 points. Maryland became the first team in the nation this season to have two players with two interceptions in the same game.

Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa finished with 283 yards on 27-of-40 passing and one touchdown.

Tagovailoa connected with Tai Felton for consecutive passes to set up the Terps' first score of the game to put Maryland up 7-0 late in the first half.

Jeshaun Jones had five catches for 86 yards. Felton finished with five catches for 73 yards and a touchdown and Corey Dyches also have five catches for 40 yards.

Roman Hemby ran for 74 yards on the ground -- all in the second half -- as the Terps went to the ground game in the second half.

This was Maryland's first-ever win against Nebraska and first-ever win in Lincoln. Nebraska is now 5-5 and 3-4 in the Big Ten. The Huskers turned the ball over five times, four via interception and one by fumble.

**COLLEGE PARK, MD --** Maryland was within a possession late in the fourth quarter against No. 2 Michigan and scored the most points against the Wolverines this season as the Terps gave Michigan all they could handle in a 31-24 loss on Saturday afternoon at SECU Stadium.

The Terps have scored the two highest point totals against Michigan in the regular-season over the last two seasons with 27 last year and 24 on Saturday.

The Terp defense forced three consecutive punts late in the second half, the third of which took a Wolverine bounce and gave Maryland the ball back on the one-yard line with 4:10 left to play down five, but an intentional grounding call in the end zone resulted in a safety.

Back-up quarterback Billy Edwards Jr., scored all three of the Terps' touchdowns on 1-yard rushing plunges.

Taulia Tagovailoa threw for 247 yards on 21-of-31 passing on his Senior Day. It was the most passing yards allowed by Michigan this season.

The Maryland defense came to play, holding the Wolverines to just six points over 38 minutes of game action, spanning from midway through the second to the end of the game. On his Senior Day, Beau Brade led the Terps' defense with 11 tackles, along with a tackle for loss and a pass break-up. Jaishawn Barham had his first career interception. Ruben Hyppolite II, also celebrating his Senior Day, had 10 tackles.

Prior to Maryland scoring 24 points, the most allowed by Michigan this season was 15 by Penn State. The Terps became the first team to score against the Wolverines in the third quarter all season long as the Wolverines had also outscored opponents 117-0 in the third stanza this season entering the game.
