THE OPENING KICK

AMONG THE BEST IN THE BIG TEN AND NATIONALLY

- Maryland leads the FBS in turnover margin with a +10 differential, forcing 13 turnovers while committing only three on offense.
- The Terps defense ranks second in the Big Ten and seventh nationally in sacks, averaging 3.33 per game.
- Maryland's red zone defense has been among the most effective in the country, ranking third in the Big Ten and 17th nationally with a .722 opponent success rate.
- On third down, the Terps are holding opponents to just a 29.5% conversion rate, which ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 17th in the FBS.
- Maryland's secondary has been dominant, leading both the Big Ten and the nation with 12 interceptions through six games.
- The Terps offensive line has allowed just three sacks this season, the second fewest in the Big Ten and fourth best nationally.
- Maryland is one of only two Big Ten teams that have yet to allow a score on an opponent's opening drive (Nebraska).
- The Terps rank fifth in the Big Ten and 13th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 16.8 points per game.
- Junior linebacker **Daniel Wingate** is second in the Big Ten and tied for 17th nationally in tackles per game with 9.33.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

- Maryland has won 18 straight non-conference games, which is the longest active streak in the FBS. In all 18 games, the Terps have allowed less than 30 points. That is the longest such streak by any Big Ten team over the last 45 years.
- Maryland also owns the longest active winning streak in non-conference games vs. power conference teams with nine consecutive victories. The streak started with a 34-29 victory over Texas in 2018 and includes wins against Auburn, West Virginia, Virginia Tech, NC State, Syracuse, SMU and Virginia (twice).

TERRAPIN TEAM NOTES

MARYLAND-UCLA SERIES HISTORY

- Maryland and UCLA will play for the first time since a home-and-home series in 1954 and 1955. This will be Maryland's first-ever visit to the Rose Bowl.
- The first meeting between the teams came on Oct. 1, 1954 when No. 4 UCLA beat the defending National Champion, No. 6 Maryland, 12-7 at the Los Angeles Coliseum.
- The following year in College Park, No. 6 Maryland beat No. 1 UCLA, 7-0 on Sept. 24, 1955. Halfback Ed Vereb scored the game's only touchdown on the opening series of the second half on a 17-yard run on 4th-and-1. Maryland held UCLA to minus-21 rushing yards in the game.

MALIK WASHINGTON'S HISTORIC START

- **Malik Washington** is one of four Power Conference True Freshman QBs with 200+ passing yards in each of his first six career games since 2000. He's joined by Philip Rivers (NC State, 2000), Sam Ehlinger (Texas, 2017) and Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele (Cal, 2025).
- Washington's 137 completions through six-career games are the most by a true freshman quarterback since Mississippi State's Will Rogers in 2020. This mark also places him fourth in the Big Ten currently this season.
- Washington's 1,506 passing yards through six-career games rank third-most among true freshman quarterbacks since 2019 (Jayden Daniels had 1,610 at Arizona State, Sam Howell had 1,544 for UNC).
- Washington's 10 passing touchdowns through six-career games are tied for third-most among true freshman quarterbacks since 2019. Only Sam Howell (15 in 2019) and Caleb Williams (14 for OU in 2021) had more.
- Washington is currently second in the country in total touchdowns among true freshman, with 13 total. He trails only BYU's Bear Bachmeier who has 15.
- Washington has thrown at least one passing touchdown in all six games this season. That is the longest streak to begin a career by any Maryland QB over the last 30 seasons.

TERRAPIN TEAM NOTES

BALL HAWKS

- ▶ Maryland leads the country with 12 interceptions on the year and interception yardage with 282.
- ▶ Maryland has three pick-sixes this season, its most in a season since 2018.
- ▶ **Dontay Joyner** (vs. Nebraska), **La'Khi Roland** (vs. Towson) and **Daniel Wingate** (vs. FAU) account for Maryland's three pick-sixes
- ▶ Joyner's pick-six against Nebraska was Maryland's first in a Big Ten game since 2018 when RaVon Davis accomplished the feat against Ohio State. It is also already tied for the Terps' second-most interception return touchdowns in a single season over the last 30 years (2010, four).
- ▶ Maryland is one of four teams in the nation with three pick-sixes this season along with Louisiana Tech, Oregon and SMU.

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

- ▶ Maryland leads the FBS with a +10 turnover differential. The Terps have forced 13 opponent turnovers, while only committing three turnovers.
- ▶ Maryland is one of seven FBS teams to not allow a single point off its giveaways this season (Arizona State, Boise State, UConn, Miami-FL, San Diego State and Temple).
- ▶ Maryland has also not allowed its opponent to score on its first drive of the game this season. The Terps are just one of two Big Ten teams to have accomplished this feat (Nebraska).
- ▶ Senior linebacker **Daniel Wingate** is a large part of the defense's success as he leads the team and is second in the Big Ten with 56 tackles this season.

STACKING SACKS

- ▶ Maryland has 20 sacks on the season. The number ranks second in the Big Ten and seventh in the FBS.
- ▶ Maryland is averaging 3.33 sacks per game this season after averaging 1.17 per contest in 2024. This improvement of 2.16 sacks per game from last season to this season is the second largest of any FBS team (Western Michigan, +2.54).
- ▶ Freshmen **Zahir Mathis** and **Sidney Stewart** have each recorded at least half a sack in five of Maryland's six games this season.
- ▶ Mathis and Stewart are both tied for third in the Big Ten in total sacks, with 4.5 so far this season

PASS CATCHERS

- ▶ Maryland pass catchers **Jalil Farooq**, **Dorian Fleming**, **Shaleak Knotts**, and **Octavian Smith Jr.** each have over 22 receptions this season.
- ▶ The Terrapins are one of only four FBS programs with four or more players who have recorded 22 or more catches.

PASSING SUCCESS VS. NEBRASKA

- ▶ Maryland had three passing plays over 20 yards against Nebraska. In the Cornhuskers first five games, they only allowed one pass play over 20 yards.
- ▶ Nebraska led the nation in pass defense coming into the game against the Terps, only allowing 91.8 yards per game through the air. Maryland threw for 249 yards against the Cornhuskers.
- ▶ Malik Washington completed 73% of his passes (27/37) against Nebraska. It marked a season-best completion percentage for the true freshman.

ONE OF THE NATION'S BEST IN PASS PROTECTION

- ▶ The Terps's offensive line has only allowed three sacks through six games in 2025. Only two were sacks against Malik Washington.
- ▶ Maryland is tied for fourth nationally in fewest sacks allowed.

TERPS IN THE NFL

- ▶ The Terps have 25 former players currently on NFL rosters. Since Head Coach Michael Locksley arrived in College Park in 2019, Maryland has produced 22 draft picks, including 13 in the last three years alone.
- ▶ Maryland had six players selected in the 2025 NFL Draft, the fourth most in the Big Ten and 11th most nationally.

GRADUATES

COMMUNITY IMPACT

- ▶ **Dillan Fontus**
 - ▶ Maryland football defensive lineman Dillan Fontus was selected as the inaugural winner of the Big Ten Jackie Robinson Community & Impact Award. Fontus was presented the award by Big Ten Commissioner Tony Petitti during a team meeting.
 - ▶ The Big Ten Jackie Robinson Award recognizes student-athletes whose significant community service contributions align with Jackie Robinson's legacy of courage, determination, teamwork, persistence, integrity, citizenship, justice, commitment, and excellence.
 - ▶ Fontus's community service work revolves around supporting local youth. The junior defensive lineman has packed lunches for elementary school students and their families with Brighter Bites, read to K-2 classes for Big Ten Reading Week, made motivational videos for young athletes for Twin Bridge Sports and participated in charity walks and weightlifting challenges, among other activities.
- ▶ **Ethan Gough**
 - ▶ Senior long snapper Ethan Gough has been named an Allstate AFCA Good Works Team nominee. Established in 1992, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team recognizes college football athletes for their unwavering commitment to community service and their "good works" off the field.
 - ▶ Gough is heavily involved in the community, working on the Gossett Fellows community service project where he served as the point person for a group of student-athletes that was able to raise \$1,200 to provide hygiene kits for fifth grade children at an under-resourced local elementary school. Gough has also volunteered his time at the Children's National Hospital and played a big role in the SAAC canned food drive in November 2024.
 - ▶ This summer, Gough and teammate Daniel Owens partnered with Uplifting Athletes for Maryland's Life For Life event to raise money for rare disease research. Both players volunteered to shave their heads if the team raised \$10,000 and because of Gough's leadership, the team raised double their goal.

TERRAPIN TEAM NOTES

NEW ADMINISTRATION LEADERSHIP

- ▶ Maryland welcomed new athletic director James E. (Jim) Smith ahead of the 2025 football season, signaling new era for Terrapin Athletics.
- ▶ Smith brought with him two key leadership additions to his Maryland executive team: **Diana Sabau** and **Joe LaBue**.

BARRY P. GOSSETT DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

- ▶ Jim Smith was named Maryland's Director of Athletics on May 15, 2025, and officially began duties on July 15.
- ▶ He joined from the Atlanta Braves, where he served as Senior Vice President of Business Strategy.
- ▶ Smith brings over 30 years of experience in college and professional sports, including leadership roles at Ohio State, the Atlanta Falcons, and Atlanta United.
- ▶ Smith is a graduate of Northwestern and Ohio State and serves on multiple nonprofit boards.



DIANA SABAU
SENIOR DEPUTY ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

- ▶ Sabau was named Senior Deputy Athletic Director in July 2025.
- ▶ She leads day-to-day operations and oversees revenue strategy, contracts, football scheduling, and Big Ten relations.
- ▶ Previously, she was Athletic Director at Utah State, where she led the school's move to the Pac-12 and launched a \$125M fundraising campaign.
- ▶ Sabau also served as Deputy Commissioner and Chief Sports Officer for the Big Ten and spent over 20 years at Ohio State, including oversight of football.

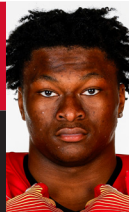

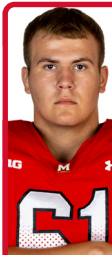

Johnny has broadcast more than 1,600 Maryland football and basketball games over his career, including 16 bowl games, 13 Sweet 16's, two final fours and Maryland's basketball national championship. Holliday is the eighth longest tenured broadcaster in the country for NCAA Football and Basketball and the second-longest serving play by play man in the Big Ten behind Indiana's Don Fisher. Holliday has received a plethora of honor's throughout his career including the Chris Schenkel Award presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, The All American Football Foundation Lindsey Nelson Outstanding Sportscaster Award, The Woody Durham Voice of College Sports Award and is in the Washington DC Sports Hall of Fame and Radio-Television Broadcasters Hall of Fame.
- **Steve Suter** is in his fifth season as the analyst for Maryland football. HEAD COACH MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

Towson '92 - 17th Year at Maryland, 7th as Head Coach



Michael Locksley returned home to become the University of Maryland's 37th head football coach in December 2018. Locksley, a Washington, D.C. native with deep personal and professional connections to the area, has over 30 years of coaching experience and 2025 is 17th season with the Terps over three separate stints at Maryland.

The winner of the 2018 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach, Locksley spent three years working under **Nick Saban** at the University of Alabama before taking the head coaching job at Maryland. He served as the Crimson Tide's co-offensive coordinator and won a national championship in 2017 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2018 and helping Alabama return to the College Football Playoff.

Maryland has made major strides since Locksley took over the program. The Terps posted three consecutive winning seasons from 2021-23 and won bowl games in each of those seasons, marking the first time in program history that Maryland won bowl games in three straight seasons. The Terps won a combined 16 games under Locksley during the 2022 and 2023 season, giving Maryland the fifth most wins among Big Ten teams during that time period.

In 2024, Maryland posted key wins over rival Virginia and Big Ten newcomer USC. The Terps won in Charlottesville, 27-13, in the 80th all-time meeting between the programs. Later in the season, Maryland had a thrilling come-from-behind victory over the Trojans, 29-28. It was the first all-time meeting between the teams and the Terps scored the final 15 points, including a touchdown with just 53 seconds remaining to seal the win. The 2024 season also saw Maryland wide receiver Tai Felton earn AP and AFCA All-America recognition to go along with his First Team All-Big Ten selection. The Terps also saw six players get selected in the 2025 NFL Draft, 23 players were named Academic All-Big Ten and Maryland hauled in a Top 25 signing class in February of 2025.

During the 2023 season, Locksley guided the Terps at an 8-5 record and a 31-13 win over Auburn in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl. It marked the first time the Terps had won eight or more games in back-to-back seasons since 2002-03. Maryland had 16 All-Big Ten selections in 2023, the most for the program since joining the Big Ten in 2014.

In 2022, Locksley propelled the Terps to an 8-5 record and a win over No. 23 N.C. State in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. Thirteen

Terps garnered All-Big Ten recognition, highlighted by kicker Chad Ryland and quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa being named Second Team All-Conference. In 2021, Locksley led the Terps to their first winning season in seven years. The season was capped off with a 54-10 win over Virginia Tech in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl. Maryland's 54 points in the game marked the most ever for a Terrapin team in a bowl game and it was the most points ever scored by any team in Pinstripe Bowl history.

Maryland's offense has flourished under Locksley's leadership, ranking top-five in the Big Ten in seven major statistical categories in 2023: points per game (29.7), touchdowns (49), passing yards (3,626), completions (307), total yards (5,035), yards per game (387.3) and yards per play (5.9). The Terrapins potent offensive attack set numerous records in 2021, including the single-season marks for total yards (5,740) and passing yards (3,960).

Prior to Maryland, Alabama's Locksley-led offense averaged 45.6 points and 522.0 yards per game in 2018. The Tide set school records for points scored (684), single-season total offense (7,830 yards) and passing yards (4,854) in a season. Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa threw for 3,966 yards and a school-record 43 touchdowns in 2018.

In 2017, Locksley coached the Alabama wide receivers, who combined to catch 128 passes for 2,059 yards and 19 touchdowns led by First Team All-SEC selection Calvin Ridley. Ridley hauled in 63 passes for 967 yards and five touchdowns in his junior season. Locksley spent the 2016 season on the Crimson Tide's staff as an offensive analyst.

Prior to Alabama, Locksley served as Maryland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15. He was named the Terps interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season. During his time as Maryland's offensive coordinator, the Terrapins produced balanced and effective results. Locksley's attack was led by quarterback C.J. Brown, who became Maryland's all-time leader in touchdowns responsible (58) after totaling 13 passing touchdowns and eight rushing touchdowns in 2014. Locksley also mentored wide receiver, Stefon Diggs, who hauled in 62 passes for 792 yards and five touchdowns en route to second team All-Big Ten honors.

Prior to Maryland, Locksley served as the head coach at the University of New Mexico from 2009-11. Before that, Locksley also served as the offensive coordinator at the University of Illi-

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nois from 2005-08. The Illini went from No. 72 nationally in total offense in 2005 to 19th following the 2008 season. They led the Big Ten in rushing in 2006 and 2007 and then led the league in passing in 2008.

Locksley spent the 2003 and 2004 seasons at the University of Florida as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. In 2004, Gators' running back Ciatrick Fason led the SEC and ranked 19th in the NCAA in rushing (105.6 yards a game) on his way to second-team all-league honors.

In his first stint at Maryland from 1997-2002, Locksley enjoyed success both recruiting and grooming players in College Park. He oversaw the running backs during his entire tenure, including the final five as recruiting coordinator. Three different running backs - Chris Downs, Bruce Perry and LaMont Jordan - gained more than 1,000 yards and were named First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference.

He began his coaching career at Towson in 1992, where he coached defensive backs and special teams, followed by two seasons at the U.S. Naval Academy Preparatory School. He coached outside linebackers at the University of the Pacific in 1995 and then coached wide receivers and tight ends at Army in 1996.

In August 2020, Locksley announced the formation of the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches (NCMFC). The NCMFC was formed as a multi-pronged effort to remove roadblocks, increase awareness and spur action toward fair and equitable hiring at all levels of football. The non-profit organization seeks to prepare, promote and produce qualified minority coaches to ascend in the ranks of college and professional football.

- Maryland had six players selected in the 2025 NFL Draft—Tai Felton (3rd round, Vikings), Ruben Hyppolite II (4th, Bears), Jordan Phillips and Dante Traylor Jr. (5th, Dolphins), Kaden Prather (7th, Bills), and Tommy Akingbesote (7th, Cowboys). It was the program's most selections in a single draft since 1986 and ranked fourth among Big Ten schools, 11th nationally. Maryland continues to show consistent NFL development, with a player drafted in eight straight and 29 of the last 31 years. The Terps have had multiple players taken in four straight drafts and seven of the last eight.

NEW ENGLAND DIGGS IN

- Stefon Diggs begins his 11th NFL season with the New England Patriots after signing a three-year deal. Despite a torn ACL that cut short his 2024 season with Houston, he still produced 47 catches for 496 yards and three touchdowns in just eight games. Fully recovered, Diggs is expected to be a primary target for second-year QB Drake Maye. During his four-year run with the Bills, Diggs topped 1,100 yards each season and earned four Pro Bowl nods.

MOORE THAN CONSISTENT

- DJ Moore continued his consistent production in 2024, setting a career-high with 98 receptions for 966 yards and six touchdowns in his second season with the Bears. Now entering his eighth NFL campaign, Moore remains one of the league's most reliable receivers, having been a steady contributor since his time in Carolina.

CROSSING INTO ELITE TERRITORY

- Nick Cross took on a full-time starting role in 2024 and delivered for the Colts. He racked up 146 total tackles (87 solo), one sack, three interceptions, and five pass deflections while starting all 17 games. His run-stopping ability stood out, earning him a strong 80.4 grade from Pro Football Focus and positioning him among the league's top-performing safeties.

STILL MAKING NOISE

- Rookie corner Tarheeb Still made an immediate impression for the Chargers. In 14 games (12 starts), he totaled 62 tackles, 10 pass breakups, four interceptions—including a pick-six—and 0.5 sacks. His Week 13 performance against Atlanta, featuring two interceptions and a touchdown return, earned him AFC Defensive Player of the Week. Still tied for second-most interceptions among all rookies and recorded the most by a Chargers rookie since 1985.

Maryland 39, FAU 7

COLLEGE PARK, MD – Maryland's defense scored twice in the first half, setting the tone for the Terps' 39-7 win over Florida Atlantic at SECU Stadium.

The victory marked Maryland's 14th consecutive season-opening win over a non-conference opponent and its nation-leading win streak over non-conference opponents to 16 games. The Terps recorded six interceptions (the program's most since 1998) as the defense smothered the Owls' offense from start to finish.

The Terps' defense outscored Florida Atlantic in the first half on a pick-six and a safety in consecutive quarters while the offense found its rhythm under true freshman quarterback Malik Washington, who picked up his first-career win in his debut.

An early pick-six by Daniel Wingate gave Maryland its first points of the season midway through the first quarter. Wingate's first-career interception led to Maryland's first defensive score since 2023. Sidney Stewart broke through the Owls' offensive line in the second quarter for the Terps' first safety since 2019 while Maryland posted three 4th-down stops in the first half.

A trio of touchdown passes in the second quarter from Washington featured scores from three different targets as a part of a 26-point second quarter, Maryland's highest total in a single quarter since 2018. The Terps took a 33-7 lead into the half.

Washington found his groove as his debut progressed. After starting 3-11 for 19 yards, he finished the first half with 200 yards on 22 completions. He finished with 258 yards and three touchdowns and didn't turn the ball over.

Shaleak Knotts was Washington's favorite target. The senior led the team with 59 yards on five receptions while Dorian Fleming also hauled in six catches for 36 yards. Washington's three touchdown passes were the most in a true freshman's debut in the Big Ten since 2009 (Michigan's Tate Forcier), the most by a true freshman in a Power Conference since 2018 (Clemson's Trevor Lawrence) and the most by a true freshman in a debut against an FBS school since UCLA's Josh Rosen in 2015.

Six different Terps snagged interceptions and Wingate led the defense with 10 tackles while an abundance of new faces made immediate impacts in their first game with Maryland as the Terrapins started their season with a dominant win in their first-ever meeting with FAU.

COLLEGE PARK, MD – Malik Washington's 42-yard touchdown pass to Shaleak Knotts on 4th-and-5 early in the fourth quarter put the Terps comfortably ahead on the way to a 20-9 victory over Northern Illinois. With the win, the Terps moved to 2-0 for the fourth time in five seasons and pushed their non-conference winning streak to a nation-leading 17 games.

The Maryland special team's unit sniffed out a fake punt in the second quarter to set the offense up for a six-play, 47-yard scoring drive that Washington capped off with a 12-yard dime to Dorian Fleming, who finished the night with four catches for 70 yards.

By holding NIU to just nine points and Florida Atlantic to seven on Aug. 30, Maryland has allowed its fewest points in the first two games of a season since 2001, when the Terps their first two opponents to a combined 10 points.

Northern Illinois broke off a 74-yard touchdown run in the third quarter to pull within four as Maryland took a 13-9 lead into the final frame. Two big kicks from Sean O'Haire earned the Terps six crucial points that ensured they never trailed in their second straight game to open the season.

Daniel Wingate led a defensive effort with a career-high 14 tackles while Trey Reddick added a career-high 11 tackles.

Washington found Knotts behind the NIU defense on 4th-and-5 for a 42-yard touchdown strike. The six-play, 77-yard touchdown drive put the Terps ahead by two scores with under 10 minutes to play. As it's done consistently in the young season, the Maryland defense proved steady, locking down the 20-9 win.

COLLEGE PARK, MD — Maryland (3-0) extended its winning streak over non-conference opponents to a nation-leading 18 games as the Terps defeated the Towson Tigers (2-1) 44-17 at SECU Stadium.

Malik Washington brought his career passing yard sum to 773 — the most for a true-freshman quarterback through his first three career games in a Power Conference since 2018 — while the defense put together another stout performance that included its first 100-yard pick-six since 1962. The defense's 33 points allowed through three games are its fewest since allowing 30 to start the 2001 season.

Maryland scored on its first six drives of the game. Sean O'Haire hit a 37-yard field goal on the Terps' opening possession and DeJuan Williams scored a two-yard rushing touchdown to cap off Maryland's second scoring drive in the game's first seven minutes.

Washington finished off a seven-play 78-yard drive with his first-career rushing touchdown to put Maryland ahead 17-0 in the first quarter. On the following drive, he hit Shaleak Knotts in stride for a 32-yard touchdown to punctuate a six-play, 73-yard scoring drive to extend the lead.

Eyan Thomas forced the game's first turnover, punching the ball out from Towson's Kahseim Phillips. It was picked up by Messiah Delhomme, setting the offense up on the Tigers' 25-yard line. Four plays later, Maryland was in the endzone again as Nolan Ray powered forward for a five-yard score. The Terps scored 31 points in the game's first 19 minutes.

La'khi Roland picked off Towson quarterback Andrew Indorf early in the third quarter in the Maryland end zone and returned it 100 yards for the Terps' second pick-six of the season and their first 100-yard pick-six since 1962.

Maryland blocked a punt early in the fourth — its first since 2018 — setting the offense up on the Tigers' 15-yard line and prompting a 28-yard field goal from O'Haire to extend the lead to 44-7. The Terps were able to flex their depth and utilize a number of bench options as the clock wound down on Maryland's fourth 3-0 start in the past five seasons.

MADISON, WI — A 62-yard touchdown connection from Malik Washington to Shaleak Knotts in the fourth quarter sealed a dominant 27-10 win for the Terps (4-0, 1-0 Big Ten) as they topped Wisconsin (2-2, 0-1 Big Ten) on the road.

Washington's historic start to his collegiate career continued with his 265-yard, two-touchdown day on 18/34 passing. With his 1,038 yards on the season, he has the most passing yards by a Power Conference true freshman through his first four games since 2020, the fourth-most since 2018 and fifth-most since 2015. Washington's total is the most since Jayden Daniels had 1,073 in 2019.

Just as it had in the previous three games, the Terps' defense and special teams provided an early spark. Zahir Mathis got his hands on a 38-yard field goal attempt on Wisconsin's opening drive to turn the Badgers away empty.

On the Badgers' following possession, Jalen Huskey picked off Danny O'Neil and returned it 46 yards to the Wisconsin 4-yard line, setting Washington up for his second rushing touchdown of the season to put Maryland up 7-0.

Messiah Delhomme blocked his second punt in his last two games in the final seconds of the first quarter, setting Maryland up on the Badgers' 28-yard line. Washington hit Knotts on 3rd down for a nine-yard touchdown to extend the Terps' lead to 14-0.

Sean O'Haire hit a pair of field goals in the second quarter — one from 49 yards and the other from 26 yards out — to put Maryland ahead 20-0, a lead the Terps would take into the half.

Their 20-point advantage was their largest shutout halftime mark in a road Big Ten game since joining the conference in 2014 and their largest halftime shutout mark in a road conference game since leading NC State 24-0 at the half in 2007.

The third quarter's only points came via a Wisconsin field goal, but Maryland took a 17-point lead into the final frame. The Terps' three points allowed in the first three quarters of a road conference game were their fewest allowed since joining the conference in 2014.

Cam Rice came up big on a 3rd down in the 4th quarter with a 19-yard sack to force a punt on a drive that at one point was down within the Terps' 20-yard line. Plays later, Washington found Knotts behind the Badgers' secondary for a 62-yard touchdown pass, icing one of Maryland's most dominant conference games in its Big Ten tenure.

Maryland 20, Washington 24

COLLEGE PARK, MD –The Washington Huskies (4-1, 1-1 Big Ten) used a 21-point fourth quarter to erase a sizable deficit and hand Maryland (4-1, 1-1 Big Ten) its first loss of 2025 at SECU Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Terrapins used a great first half to build a lead, but a late surge from the Huskies resulted in a Washington comeback as the Terps were defeated for the first time in 2025.

Just as it has all season, the Maryland defense provided the early spark, intercepting Demond Williams Jr. on the Huskies' opening drive. The Terps turned the turnover into three quick points to break the ice.

On their next possession, Malik Washington and the Terrapin offense orchestrated a 16-play, 71-yard scoring drive on which they converted five 3rd downs and used over eight minutes. The Terps led 10-0 after the first frame and a dominating offensive drive.

The Terps turned the Huskies over on downs early in the 2nd quarter, setting Maryland's offense back up for another field goal drive after consuming eight more minutes. They forced another incompletion on a UW 4th-and-9 in the first half's final minutes to preserve the 13-0 Maryland halftime lead. Through five games, the Terps have only allowed 10 points in the first half of their games, their lowest mark since at least 1996.

Maryland opened the second half with another crushing drive, moving 75 yards in nine plays to set up a two-yard passing touchdown from Washington to AJ Szymanski. The Terps took a 20-0 lead early in the second half on Washington's ninth passing touchdown of the season.

A flurry of UW scoring drives erased the Terps' lead and put Maryland behind for the first time all season with 3:21 remaining in the fourth quarter. Maryland's comeback efforts fell short in its first defeat of the season.

Maryland 31, Nebraska 34

COLLEGE PARK, MD –A last-minute touchdown drive from the Nebraska Cornhuskers (5-1, 2-1 Big Ten) earned them a 34-31 win over Maryland (4-2, 1-2 Big Ten) at SECU Stadium on Saturday. The Terps intercepted Nebraska quarterback Dylan Raiola thrice, but were unable to close out the Huskers out in the final minutes of action and fell for a second straight week.

An incredible football game with an abundance of lead changes eventually fell the Huskers way despite Malik Washington joining exclusive company and the Maryland defense reaching a certain mark for the first time since 2018.

Nebraska became the first Big Ten team to score on Maryland in the first half all season with a 64-yard touchdown in the first quarter that put the Huskers ahead early. Drives later, Nolan Ray found the endzone for the Terps with a 28-yard rushing touchdown for his second score of the year.

The ensuing Nebraska play lasted just one play as Messiah Delhomme snagged his first-career interception, setting the Terps up in Husker territory.

Maryland took the lead just seconds later as Washington hit Leon Haughton Jr. for a 21-yard touchdown strike. Haughton Jr.'s third catch of his career resulted in his first-career score and a 14-10 Maryland lead.

Despite an interception by Maryland's Jamare Glasker and a 37-yard Sean O'Haire field goal in the waning seconds of the second quarter, a pair of Nebraska scoring drives before the half gave the Huskers a 24-17 lead at the break.

The Terps started the second half with a commanding 10-play, 75-yard drive to knot the game up on a DeJuan Williams rushing score. A few plays later, the Terps picked off Raiola and Dontay Joyner brought it back 67 yards for Maryland's third defensive touchdown of 2025.

Nebraska conducted a seven-play, 81-yard scoring drive to take a 34-31 lead with just over a minute left to play. The Terps final drive came up short as they fell to 4-2 on the season.
