### WHERE WE ARE ...

- ▶ No. 9 Maryland (5-4, 2-1 B1G) returns home for its final regular-season home game against Big Ten opponent Rutgers (8-4, 1-2 B1G) at 6 p.m. at SECU Stadium. Coverage will be available on BTN and the Maryland Sports Radio Network.
- ▶ The Terps have an opportunity to clinch a share of the Big Ten regular-season title on Saturday with a win, provided Ohio State (1-2 B1G) defeats Johns Hopkins (2-1 B1G) at noon and Michigan (1-2 B1G) defeats Penn State (2-1 B1G) at 1 p.m.
- ▶ The 2026 campaign represents the 101st season of Maryland men's lacrosse. The program has produced 532 All-Americans, appeared in 30 Final Fours, and captured four NCAA national championships. The Terps have finished .500 or better in every season.

### WHERE WE'VE BEEN ...

- ▶ The reigning national runner-up Terrapins are coming off an NCAA-best 22nd consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and their 30th Final Four overall, the most of any program. Maryland advanced to the NCAA Championship game for the ninth time in the last 14 tournaments and the 18th time in program history, beating Syracuse 14-8 in the NCAA Semifinal. The Terps finished 14-4 and recorded double-digit wins for the 22nd straight season, the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse.
- ▶ Maryland heads into its final Big Ten home matchup of the 2026 campaign following an 8-7 overtime victory against No. 9 Ohio State. Senior defenseman Riley Reese scored his first career goal to give the Terps the win, marking Maryland's first ranked victory of the season. The Terps jumped out to a 4-0 first-quarter lead with goals from four different players, including Aidan Aitkens, who notched his first multi-goal game. Leo Johnson finished with a game-high four assists, and Eric Spanos assisted Reese's game-winning tally in overtime. Goalie Brian Ruppel made 10 saves, including several key stops in the fourth quarter, to keep Maryland in the game. It was also head coach John Tillman's 200th career win at Maryland.

### ABOUT THE COACHES

- ▶ **John Tillman** is in his 19th season as a head coach and his 16th with the Terps, owning a 220-79 career record for a .736 winning percentage, the highest among all active Division I coaches. Highlighted by an undefeated 2022 campaign, Tillman is 200-60 (.769) as Maryland's head coach.
- ▶ **Brian Brecht** is in his 15th season as head coach of the Rutgers men's lacrosse team in 2025, having led the program since 2012. He has guided the Scarlet Knights to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2021 and 2022, including a Final Four in 2022, three NCAA Tournament victories, and two Big Ten Coach of the Year honors. Brecht has developed 35 All-Americans and 33 PLL players.

### SERIES HISTORY

- ▶ The Terps and Rutgers will meet for the 39th time in program history and the 11th consecutive season, with the first matchup dating back to 1931. Maryland leads the all-time series 36-2 and has not lost to the Scarlet Knights in College Park since 1980.
- ▶ Last season, Rutgers defeated Maryland 9-7 in Piscataway, marking the Terps' first loss to the Scarlet Knights since joining the Big Ten. Prior to that, Maryland had won 19 straight games against Rutgers dating back to 1981, outscoring the Scarlet Knights 259-169 during that span.

## TERRAPIN TEAM NOTES

### MAN-DOWN DEFENSE SUCCESS

- ▶ The Terps' man-down unit currently leads the country and the Big Ten with a 94.4% success rate in killing opponent penalty opportunities.
- ▶ Maryland has allowed just one man-down goal this season on 18 opponent attempts.

### SUCCESS AT FACE-OFFS

- ▶ The Terps' faceoff unit, featuring **Henry Dodge** and **Jonah Carrier**, is one of the most successful in the country, boasting a .608 win percentage, that ranks sixth nationally and first in the Big Ten.
- ▶ Senior faceoff specialist Dodge is fourth in the country and leading the Big Ten winning 67.5% of his draws.

### ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS

- ▶ Terp newcomers **Leo Johnson**, **Chris Lyons**, and **Henry Dodge** all rank on the national active career leaderboards in several categories.
- ▶ Lyons is currently third in the the nation in career goals and in goals per game, totaling 142 career goals and averaging 2.84 goals per game.
- ▶ Johnson ranks among the top five nationally in total points with 210 and is also eighth in career goals with 122.
- ▶ Dodge is tied for second among active players nationally in career faceoff win percentage, having won 63.0% of his draws.

### BIG LEADERS

- ▶ Several Terps rank among the top five in the Big Ten in key statistical categories.
- ▶ On offense, Leo Johnson is tied for second in total points (38) and is second in points per game (4.2). He also sits tied for third in total assists (17) and second in assists per game (1.9).
- ▶ Attacker Eric Spanos is second in the conference in goals per game (2.8).
- ▶ In goal, Brian Ruppel is third in the conference in saves per game (10.3) and third in total saves (91) and save percentage (50.8%)

### TERPS' 101ST SEASON OF LACROSSE

- ▶ The Terps boast an all-time record of 909-298-4 (.751), dating back to the first varsity team in 1924 (a team was not fielded in 1944 and 1945 due to World War II). Maryland has finished with a .500 or better record in all previous 99 seasons. The program reached the 800-win milestone with a 12-6 victory on April 12, 2017, at Albany and became just the third school with 900 wins on March 29, 2025, with a 13-8 win over Penn State.
- ▶ Maryland finished the decade of the 2010s 134-42 for a .761 winning percentage, making it the winningest decade in Terrapin lacrosse history. Nine of those seasons came under the direction of head coach John Tillman, who has posted a 122-38 record and a .763 winning percentage at the helm for Maryland.
- ▶ During the decade of the 2000s, Maryland went 111-49 for a .694 win percentage. In the decade of the 1990s, Maryland posted a 95-47 record. The .669 winning percentage matched Maryland's win percentage of the 1980s when the Terps went 83-41 and also compiled a .669 win percentage.
- ▶ Midway through the 2020s, the Terrapins are 73-18 (.802), which is on pace to equal the second-best winning percentage for a decade behind only the 1950s when the Terps were 84-15-1 (.845). The only other decade with a winning percentage of .800+ was the 1970s, with a mark of 85-21 (.802).

### CONSECUTIVE 10-WIN SEASONS

- ▶ With an 11-8 win against Johns Hopkins on April 18, 2025, the Terps extended their streak of double-digit win seasons to 22, the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse. Only two programs own a current streak of at least 10-straight 10-win seasons after Notre Dame's streak was snapped in 2017 at 11. (\*2020, canceled in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, is not counted on this list.)

- ▶ The streak also coincides with the Terps making 22 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, also the longest such streak in the country in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse.

### HOME COOKING

- ▶ Maryland has won 35 of its last 43 (.814) home games and was 4-1 at SECU Stadium in 2025.
- ▶ The Terps are 93-21 (.816) overall in home games under John Tillman since 2011.

## TERRAPIN TEAM NOTES (CONT.)

### GET TO 10 AND WIN

- ▶ Since John Tillman took over the program in 2011, Maryland has won 177 of the 202 games when scoring 10 or more goals for an .876 winning percentage.
- ▶ Maryland is also 138-23 (.857) since 2015 when scoring at least 10 goals.

### HOLDING OPPONENTS TO SINGLE-DIGITS

- ▶ Maryland is 142-13 since Tillman took over the program in 2011 when it allows nine goals or less for a .916 winning percentage, including a 51-game winning streak when holding foes to less than 10 goals from 2017 to April 20, 2024.
- ▶ The Terps were 13-1 last season when holding opponents to single digits, doing so in 14 of 17 games.

### OVERTIME IS TERP TIME

- ▶ The Terps are 19-9 (.667) in overtime games under John Tillman and have won ten of their last 12 dating back to 2020.
- ▶ The Terrapins are 41-30-4 all-time in overtime games dating back to the second season in 1925. Maryland played to a 5-5 tie at Stevens in 3OTs.

### KEY RETURNERS

- ▶ The Terps welcome back a trio of attackmen/midfielders who started the majority of games in 2025. Graduate student **Eric Spanos** has appeared in 51 career games, totaling 116 points (79 goals, 37 assists). Senior **Braden Erksa** has recorded 137 points in 51 games (83 goals, 54 assists), while graduate student **Zach Whittier** has added 61 points (27 goals, 34 assists) over 48 games.
- ▶ Spanos was selected to wear the highly coveted No. 1 jersey this season, marking the first time since Jared Bernhardt (2019–21) that an offensive player has donned the jersey.
- ▶ Defensively, Maryland returns a trio of key contributors from its 2025 run: close defenseman **Will Schaller**, long-stick midfielder **AJ Larkin**, and short-stick defensive midfielder **Eric Kolar**. The group has combined for 128 games played.
- ▶ In goal, senior **Brian Ruppel** returns and is expected to anchor the Terps' defense after backing up 2022 NCAA Tournament Most Outstanding Player and career saves record holder **Logan McNaney**. Ruppel has appeared in 17 career games, starting 13 during the 2023 season following McNaney's season-ending injury. During that stretch, he recorded 138 saves while allowing 11.25 goals per game.

### MEET THE NEWCOMERS

- ▶ The Terps welcome five transfers ahead of the 2026 season: **Michael Alexander** (Yale), **Henry Dodge** (Vermont), **Trey Fleece** (UMBC), **Leo Johnson** (Yale), and **Chris Lyons** (Yale). The group was ranked as the No. 1 transfer class in the nation by Inside Lacrosse.
- ▶ Alexander, a defender, played five seasons at Yale and earned three NEILA All-New England First Team selections along with All-Ivy League honors. He appeared in 55 games with 52 starts, recording 56 ground balls and 30 caused turnovers.
- ▶ Dodge, the 2025 America East Faceoff Specialist of the Year and a 2025 America East All-Conference First Team selection, played three seasons at Vermont. He appeared in 29 games and posted a .632 career faceoff winning percentage, totaling 179 ground balls. His 71 percent win rate in 2025 ranked among the best in Division I.
- ▶ Fleece, a short-stick defensive midfielder, played three seasons at UMBC, appearing in 35 games. He recorded 87 ground balls and 16 caused turnovers and was named Second Team All-America East in 2025.
- ▶ Johnson, an attacker, spent four seasons at Yale, playing three seasons and appearing in 45 games. He totaled 101 goals, 71 assists, and 69 ground balls. Johnson was named to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List in 2025 and earned Second Team All-Ivy League honors.
- ▶ Lyons, also an attacker, spent four seasons at Yale, playing three seasons and appearing in 41 games. He recorded 128 goals, 35 assists, and 50 ground balls. Lyons was named an All-American and an All-Ivy League selection in 2023 and was on the Tewaaraton Award Watch List in 2025.

### CONFERENCE DOMINATION

- ▶ Since joining the Big Ten in 2015, Maryland is 45-12 (.789) in conference play.
- ▶ The Terps are also a conference-best 12-6 (.667) all-time in Big Ten Tournament games. Since joining the Big Ten in 2015, the Terps have won at least a share of the Big Ten regular season titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2021, 2022). The Terps have also won the Big Ten Tournament four times (2016, 2017, 2021, 2022).

### BIG CROWDS COME OUT FOR THE TERPS

- ▶ In 2026, Maryland is currently second in the nation home attendance averaging 3,747 fans per game.
- ▶ Maryland played in two of the three highest-attended regular-season games of the 2025 men's college lacrosse season, highlighted by a crowd of 10,137 fans when the Terps faced Notre Dame in Atlanta.
- ▶ The Terps ranked second nationally in home attendance despite playing the fewest home games among the top five programs, drawing a total of 28,079 fans. Maryland was also second nationally in average attendance in 2025 (4,011).
- ▶ SECU Stadium also hosted the third-largest regular-season crowd of 2025 when Maryland welcomed Johns Hopkins, attracting 10,123 fans.

# HEAD COACH JOHN TILLMAN

Maryland: 200-60 (.769) - 16th Season | Overall: 220-79 (.736) - 19th Season



Blending a mix of the program's historic motto, "Be The Best," with his own principles of high character in all aspects of life, John Tillman has created a formula that has resulted in one of the most successful eras in Maryland lacrosse's illustrious history.

Tillman's formula came to ultimate fruition in 2017 when Maryland captured its first NCAA National Championship since 1975. He then led the Terps back to the top in 2022 with an undefeated 18-0 season capped by the 2022 National Championship.

Since taking over the helm as Maryland head coach 16 years ago, Tillman has led the Terps to 11 NCAA Final Fours, nine national title games and a 200-60 (.769) overall record. He is in his 16th season at Maryland in 2026.

Tillman's numbers since arriving in College Park in 2011 are impressive, leading the country in All-American selections (95), NCAA Tournament wins (34) and Final Fours (11) during that 14-year span.

In just 15 NCAA Tournament appearances, Tillman has already supplanted himself among the greatest coaches in history. His 34-12 (.737) career NCAA Tournament record ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history.
