THE OPENING KICK

THE MATCHUP

- ▶ This is the first time the Terrapins have hosted the Bruins since 1955. That game took place almost exactly 71 years ago as the No. 6 Maryland defeated No. 1 UCLA, 7-0, in College Park on Sept. 24, 1955.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- ▶ Maryland totaled 423 yards and 23 first downs vs. Virginia Tech and the Terps had a season-high 359 passing yards with three passing touchdowns.
- ▶ Maryland ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 330 passing yards per game.
- ▶ Maryland's offense has ranked among the top four in the Big Ten in passing yards per game in each of the last five seasons. The Terps ranked fourth in the league in passing yards per game last season (255.7) and led the Big Ten in the category in 2023 at 278.9 yards per game through the air.
- ▶ Maryland's 126 points through three games is the second most in school history.
- ▶ Maryland is one of five FBS teams yet to commit a turnover this season (Louisville, Notre Dame, Penn State, South Alabama). It is the second time this century the Terrapins have started a season without a giveaway in their first three games (also: 2016)
- ▶ Maryland is one of eight FBS teams with three players who already have at least 100 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns this year. (one of three in the Big Ten with Iowa & UCLA)

MARVELOUS MALIK

- ▶ Quarterback **Malik Washington** is second in the Big Ten and ninth in FBS in passing yards per game with 297.3. He ranks third in the Big Ten in passing yards with 892, which ranks 12th in all of FBS. He is completing 72.2 percentage of his passes, which ranks 20th in FBS. He's second in the Big Ten and fourth in the nation in total completions with 83.
- ▶ Washington threw for 359 yards and three touchdowns against Virginia Tech.
- ▶ He became Maryland's first quarterback with consecutive 300-yard passing games since Taulia Tagovailoa in 2022.
- ▶ His 359 yards were the second-most in a game and marked his third career game with three touchdown passes.
- ▶ Washington is the third Maryland QB over the last 30 seasons to complete 70.0%+ of his passes with 350+ pass yards, 3+ pass TDs and 0 interceptions in a single game.
- ▶ Washington has tossed a touchdown in all of his nine home games with Maryland, tied for the second-longest streak in the last 30 years by a Maryland player.
- ▶ He is the second Maryland player in the last 30 years to tally at least 350 yards of total offense (pass + rush) in back-to-back games and the last Big Ten player to have a longer streak was Ohio State's C.J. Stroud in 2021 (five).
- ▶ Washington's 356 completions through 15 starts are fifth most by a Big Ten quarterback since 2008.
- ▶ Washington's 4,181 yards of total offense (pass yards + rush yards) ranks 10th among Big Ten QBs through 15 career FBS starts.
- ▶ Washington's 3,855 passing yards are the seventh most by a Big Ten QB through 15 FBS starts since 2008.

GROUND AND POUND

- ▶ Running back **Iverson Howard** became the first Terp to rush for a touchdown in each of his first three games of a season since Roman Hemby in 2023. He scored on a 2-yard rush against Virginia Tech for his fourth touchdown of the season.
- ▶ The Terps' 10 rush TDs this season are tied for the third most by a Maryland team through three games of a season over the last 30 years.

SACK ATTACK

- ▶ Maryland has recorded 11 sacks through its first three games of the 2026 season.
- ▶ The Terps' 11 sacks lead the Big Ten and rank sixth nationally.
- ▶ **DD Holmes** leads Maryland with 2.5 sacks, ranking second in the Big Ten behind Michigan State's Eli Coenen, who has three.
- ▶ Maryland is tied with Michigan with three players ranked among the conference's top five in sacks: Holmes (2.5), Thomas (2.0) and Derrick LeBlanc (2.0)

SECU SELL OUT

- ▶ Maryland's last home game vs. Virginia Tech was sold out. The Terps have announced sellouts in four of the last six home games.
- ▶ It is the program's first stretch of four sellouts in six home games since 2005, when Maryland sold out the final four games of the season.
- ▶ Maryland has drawn more than 11,000 students for each of the first two home games.

TERRAPIN TEAM NOTES

DURR'S CAREER NIGHT

- ▶ Wide receiver **Chris Durr Jr.**, established career-highs with 12 receptions and two touchdowns, along with his second 100-yard game in a row with 109 yards against Virginia Tech (9/19). He also surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards in the game.
- ▶ He became the only Maryland player this century to record consecutive 10-catch games.
- ▶ Durr joined Buffalo Bills star WR D.J. Moore (12-210, 2TD) and two-time Super Bowl champion Torrey Smith (14-224, 4TD) as the only Terps in the past 30 seasons with at least 12 catches, 100 receiving yards and two touchdowns in a game.
- ▶ He also has at least 100 yards receiving and a touchdown in each of his last two games. The only other Terps players to do that this century are Vernon Davis (2005), Torrey Smith (2010), Stefon Diggs (2013), Dontay Demus Jr. (2021) and Tai Felton (2024).
- ▶ He is the only Maryland player since 1996 to have 10+ receptions in consecutive games and is just the fourth Terrapin over the last 30 seasons to record 6+ receptions in 3+ straight games to begin a season joining D.J. Moore (2017), Dontay Demus (2021) and Tai Felton (2024).
- ▶ Durr Jr. is the first Big Ten player to record double-digit catches in multiple games this season.
- ▶ The only other Maryland player this century with 10 catches in two games for an entire season was Tai Felton in 2024. The last Big Ten player with a longer streak of double-digit reception games was Purdue's Charlie Jones in 2022 (three).
- ▶ Durr Jr. is the ninth Big Ten player since 1996 to have 10+ receptions and 1+ rec TD in consecutive games.
- ▶ He is the third Maryland player over the last 30 seasons with 12+ rec., 100+ rec. yards and 2+ rec. TD in a game.

PASS CATCHERS REACH NEW HEIGHTS

- ▶ **Dorian Fleming** surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards on six catches for 72 yards with his first touchdown of the season against Virginia Tech (9/19). He joined Chris Durr Jr., in reaching 1,000 yards against the Hokies.
- ▶ Fleming has receptions in 12 consecutive games dating to last season and 26 of his last 27 games going back to 2024.
- ▶ He becomes just the fifth Maryland tight end in the last 30 seasons to record nine games with three or more receptions.
- ▶ **Kaleb Webb** set a career high with 98 receiving yards on five catches, including a 44-yard reception that set up Maryland's first touchdown vs. Virginia Tech.
- ▶ **Na'eem Abdul-Rahim Gladding** added a career-long 43-yard reception in the fourth quarter of the Virginia Tech game. He now has a catch in 16 consecutive games dating to the first game of the 2025 season.

RETURNING TALENT

- ▶ Maryland football returns 71 percent of its production from last year's roster, which ranks second nationally behind only Notre Dame. The Terps welcome back 74 percent of their production on the defensive side of the ball, which ranks No. 4 nationally. Returners include 2025 leading tackler **Daniel Wingate** and freshman All-American **Sidney Stewart**.
- ▶ Maryland returns 68 percent of its offensive production from 2025, ranking No. 17 nationally. Returners include quarterback **Malik Washington**, All-Big Ten tight end **Dorian Fleming** and running back **DeJuan Williams**. Both Washington and Williams set Maryland freshman records, with Washington setting the mark for passing yards and Williams setting the record for receiving yards by a running back.
- ▶ Eight of Maryland's 11 All-Big Ten honorees from the 2025 season return in 2026.

TRANSFER PORTAL ADDS

- Maryland football welcomes 17 transfers.
- Wide receivers - **Na'eem Abdul-Rahim Gladding** (Old Dominion), **Chris Durr Jr.** (Wyoming) and **Ejani Shakir** (Independence CC).
- Defensive line was another position Maryland hit hard in the portal, adding **Lavon Johnson** (Texas), **Derrick LeBlanc** (UCF), **Armon Parker** and **Jayvon Parker** (Washington).
- Other additions include RB **Harry Dalton III** (USC), TE **Preston Howard** (Auburn), DB **Amari Jackson** (Boston College) and OL **Tellek Lockette** (Texas State), RB **Terrez Worthy** (Temple), LB **Stephen Dean III** (Virginia Military Institute), QB **Cardell Williams** (Sacramento State), LB **Jordan Williams** (Rice) and QB **Jack Capaldi** (Fordham)

NEW COACHES

- Maryland welcomed four new coaches during the offseason.
- **Clint Trickett** takes over as Offensive Coordinator/QB Coach after spending the 2025 season as offensive coordinator at Jacksonville State, where he led the Gamecocks to a 9–5 record and a bowl win. His offense averaged 408.7 yards and 28.1 points per game while producing Conference USA's top rushing attack.
- **Matt Barnes** returns for his second stint at Maryland and will serve as the Terps Special Teams Coordinator. Barnes spent the past two seasons at Mississippi State, where he served as Co-Defensive Coordinator and Safeties Coach.
- Former Terp greets **Randy Starks** and **Kyle Schmitt** return home as coaches. Starks will oversee the defensive line unit, while Schmitt will take over the tight ends room.

TERPS-TO-THE-NFL PIPELINE

- Maryland defensive back Jalen Huskey was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the third round of the 2026 NFL Draft.
- Maryland has now had a player drafted in nine consecutive NFL Drafts and in 30 of the last 32 drafts overall.
- Huskey became Maryland's eighth defensive back selected in the past eight NFL Drafts.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

- **Malik Washington**
 - Maryland football quarterback **Malik Washington** was named a nominee for the 2026 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.
 - The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team

recognizes college football student-athletes and head coaches who make an impact through community service, academic achievement and leadership.

- Away from the field, Washington is heavily involved in the community. He hosted his third annual "Friday Night Lights" free youth football camp at UA Stadium in Baltimore on July 24. The camp was designed for students in grades 3 through 8 and provides skills training, drills, and mentorship.
- Washington is also an active participant in the reading literacy program in which he went to multiple elementary schools in the DMV area to read to children. 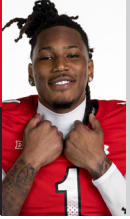

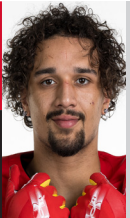

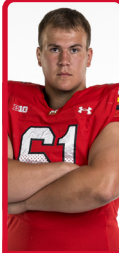

Maryland 62, Hampton 0

COLLEGE PARK, MD – Maryland cruised past Hampton with a 62-0 win at SECU Stadium to open the 2026 season. The Terps extended their nation-leading winning streak against non-conference opponents to 19 games and won their 16th consecutive season-opener against a non-conference opponent. Maryland posted its first season-opening shutout since 2019 while scoring its most points in a game since 2021.

DeJuan Williams broke off a 94-yard touchdown run for the Terps' first points of 2026. Williams' rush was Maryland's second-longest rush in school history. Williams finished with a career-high 116 rushing yards and two touchdowns on Saturday. **Iverson Howard** also logged a 66-yard, two-touchdown performance, giving Maryland its first game with two multi-touchdown performances since 2023. The Terps' six rushing touchdowns on Saturday were their most in a game since 2019 and their 365 ground yards marked their most since 2018. Quarterback **Malik Washington** threw for 186 yards and a touchdown against the Pirates, opening his sophomore campaign with a win and surpassing 3,000 career passing yards. Maryland took a 34-0 lead into the half after limiting Hampton (1-1) to 45 total yards (56 passing, -11 rushing) through the first 30 minutes of the contest. **Cardell Williams** quarterbacked most of the second half and locked down the win.

Maryland's defense was magnificent on Saturday. **Messiah Delhomme** snagged two of Maryland's three interceptions — **Jayden Shipp**s had the other — while the Terps held the Pirates to 85 total yards, collected five sacks, and limited Hampton to only six first downs. Maryland held its opponent to under 100 total yards for the first time since 2019 in front of 43,421 fans at SECU Stadium.

The Terps collected over 600 total yards (646) for the first time since 2024 and held their opponent to 10 rushing yards, the fewest allowed since 2019. Maryland looks to extend its non-conference winning streak next Saturday against Connecticut on the road. The game is slated for 3:30 PM and will air on CBS Sports Network.

Maryland 38, UConn 14

EAST HARTFORD, CT – The Maryland Terrapins moved to 2-0 in 2026 with a commanding 38-14 win over Connecticut (1-1) on the road on Saturday afternoon. The win extended Maryland's non-conference winning streak to a nation-leading 20 games.

Maryland quarterback **Malik Washington** dazzled with 347 passing yards on 34-41 passing and a career-high 82.9% completion percentage (the fourth-highest mark in program history), while new targets **Na'eem Abdul-Rahim Gladding** (130 yards, eight receptions, one touchdown) and Chris Durr Jr. (106 yards, 10 receptions, one touchdown) became the first two Terps to record 100+ receiving yards in the same game since 2025. Washington completed a program-record 18 consecutive passing attempts in the win. The Terps also rushed for 125 yards and three touchdowns as they improved to 4-1 all-time against Connecticut.

The Terps used two masterful drives in the second quarter to take their first lead while holding Connecticut scoreless. A nine-play, 92-yard touchdown drive preceded a 15-play, 91-yard march that **Sean O'Haire** capped off with a chip-shot field goal. The two drives chewed up nine minutes of clock in the second quarter and gave Maryland a 17-7 lead to take into the break. Washington threw for 209 yards in the first half, marking his fourth career game with more than 200 in the first half.

Maryland's defense was stout on Saturday, limiting the Huskies to 14 points — the only points scored against the Terps all season — and forcing a fumble in the first half. Connecticut punted six times as Maryland held an opponent under 300 passing yards for the 18th straight game (156). Maryland is back in action at home against Virginia Tech on Sept. 19.

Virginia Tech 35, Maryland 26

COLLEGE PARK, MD – The Terps suffered their first defeat of the season, 35-26 to Virginia Tech, on Saturday night at a sold-out SECU Stadium. Maryland (2-1) fell to its first non-conference opponent since 2019, ending its nation-leading 20-game non-conference winning streak.

Chris Durr Jr. had a career night with 12 receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns as he and **Dorian Fleming** (six receptions, 72 yards) both surpassed the 1,000 career receiving yard mark. Durr Jr. also became the only Terp this century to log consecutive 10-catch games. He became just the third Terp in the past 30 years with over 12 receptions, over 100 yards, and two scores, joining DJ Moore and Torrey Smith.

Malik Washington threw for 359 yards and three touchdowns on the night. Kaleb Webb hauled in a career-high 98 yards on five receptions. **Daniel Wingate** led the Terps defense with 12 tackles. Washington threw a pair of touchdown passes in Maryland's 12-point fourth quarter, but 445 total yards from Virginia Tech, and a 10/16 mark on 3rd down, helped the Hokies improve to 3-0 on the season. Maryland opens Big Ten play next week as the Terps host UCLA.

HEAD COACH MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

Towson '92 - 18th Year at Maryland, 8th as Head Coach



Michael Locksley returned home to become the University of Maryland's 37th head football coach in December 2018. Locksley, a Washington, D.C. native with deep personal and professional connections to the area, has over 30 years of coaching experience and 2026 will be his 18th season with the Terps over three separate stints at Maryland.

The winner of the 2018 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach, Locksley spent three years working under Nick Saban at the University of Alabama before taking the head coaching job at Maryland. He served as the Crimson Tide's co-offensive coordinator and won a national championship in 2017 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2018 and helping Alabama return to the College Football Playoff.

Maryland has made major strides since Locksley took over the program. The Terps posted three consecutive winning seasons from 2021-23 and won bowl games in each of those seasons, marking the first time in program history that Maryland won bowl games in three straight seasons. The Terps won a combined 16 games under Locksley during the 2022 and 2023 season, giving Maryland the fifth most wins among Big Ten teams during that time period.

In 2025, Maryland extended its nation-leading non-conference win streak to 18 games, in addition to picking up a Big Ten road win at Wisconsin. A total of 13 Terps earned All-Big Ten recognition, tying for the second-most honorees Maryland has produced in a season since joining the league in 2014. A young core began to emerge for Locksley, led by quarterback Malik Washington and Freshman All-American selections Zahir Mathis and Sidney Stewart. Off the field, 23 Terps earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition and Maryland was one of just seven teams nationally to be honored with the AFCA 2025 Academic Achievement Award. Locksley's 2026 signing class was ranked No. 23 nationally by 247Sports in the composite average player rankings. It was highlighted by five-star defensive lineman Zion Elee, who supplants Stefon Diggs to become the highest-rated player to ever sign with the Terps (ranked #2 overall nationally by ESPN).

In 2024, Maryland posted key wins over rival Virginia and Big Ten newcomer USC. The Terps won in Charlottesville, 27-13, in the 80th all-time meeting between the programs. Later in the season, Maryland had a thrilling come-from-behind victory over the Trojans, 29-28. It was the first all-time meeting between

the teams and the Terps scored the final 15 points, including a touchdown with just 53 seconds remaining to seal the win. The 2024 season also saw Maryland wide receiver Tai Felton earn AP and AFCA All-America recognition to go along with his First Team All-Big Ten selection. The Terps also sent five players to the NFL Combine, 23 players were named Academic All-Big Ten and Maryland hauled in a Top 25 signing class in February of 2025.

During the 2023 season, Locksley guided the Terps at an 8-5 record and a 31-13 win over Auburn in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl. It marked the first time the Terps had won eight or more games in back-to-back seasons since 2002-03. Maryland had 16 All-Big Ten selections in 2023, the most for the program since joining the Big Ten.

In 2022, Locksley propelled the Terps to an 8-5 record and a win over No. 23 N.C. State in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. Thirteen Terps garnered All-Big Ten recognition, highlighted by kicker Chad Ryland and quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa being named Second Team All-Conference. In 2021, Locksley led the Terps to their first winning season in seven years. The season was capped off with a 54-10 win over Virginia Tech in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl. Maryland's 54 points in the game marked the most ever for a Terrapin team in a bowl game and it was the most points ever scored by any team in Pinstripe Bowl history.

Maryland's offense has flourished under Locksley's leadership, ranking top-five in the Big Ten in seven major statistical categories in 2023: points per game (29.7), touchdowns (49), passing yards (3,626), completions (307), total yards (5,035), yards per game (387.3) and yards per play (5.9). The Terrapins potent offensive attack set numerous records in 2021, including the single-season marks for total yards (5,740) and passing yards (3,960).

Under Locksley's tutelage, Tagovailoa developed into one of the best quarterbacks in the country. The Locksley and Tagovailoa connection elevated Maryland's passing game to heights it has never seen before. Tagovailoa left College Park in 2023 as the Big Ten's all-time leader in passing yards (11,256) and ranks first in program history in every major passing category, including completions (955), completion percentage (66.7), passing touchdowns (76) and 300-yard passing games (15). Tagovailoa set seven single-season Maryland records in 2021, including program best marks for passing yards (3,860), completions (328), completion percentage (69.2) and passing touchdowns (26 – ties

Locksley, known for his strong recruiting skills, was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com. He also engineered top-10 recruiting classes during each of his two seasons (2003-04) as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida.

Locksley has signed 56 four or five star recruits over his coaching career (according to 247Sports), 37 of which came from the DMV area, in addition to coaching 116 NFL Draft selections. Among Locksley's successful signings to Maryland were future NFL stars Vernon Davis, Shawne Merriman, LaMont Jordan, D'Qwell Jackson, EJ Henderson, Yannick Ngakoue and Stefon Diggs.

Prior to Maryland, Alabama's Locksley-led offense averaged 45.6 points and 522.0 yards per game in 2018. The Tide set school records for points scored (684), single-season total offense (7,830 yards) and passing yards (4,854) in a season. Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa threw for 3,966 yards and a school-record 43 touchdowns in 2018.

In 2017, Locksley coached the Alabama wide receivers, who combined to catch 128 passes for 2,059 yards and 19 touchdowns led by First Team All-SEC selection Calvin Ridley. Ridley hauled in 63 passes for 967 yards and five touchdowns in his junior season. Locksley spent the 2016 season on the Crimson Tide's staff as an offensive analyst.

Prior to Alabama, Locksley served as Maryland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15. He was named the Terps interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.

TERRAPIN NFL NEWS & NOTES

NFL PIPELINE FLOWING STRONG

- ▶ Maryland defensive back Jalen Huskey was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the third round of the 2026 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Maryland has now had a player drafted in nine consecutive NFL Drafts and in 30 of the last 32 drafts overall.
- ▶ Huskey became Maryland's eighth defensive back selected in the past eight NFL Drafts.

DIGGS IS COMING HOME

- ▶ Former Terp Stefon Diggs enters his 12th NFL season with a new team, the Washington Commanders. After helping the New England Patriots reach the Super Bowl in 2025, Diggs recorded 85 receptions for 1,013 yards and four touchdowns while serving as one of the team's veteran leaders. He has now surpassed the 1,000-yard receiving mark in seven of the last eight seasons.

MOORE THAN CONSISTENT

- ▶ DJ Moore was traded to the Buffalo Bills this offseason. Moore enters his ninth NFL season with more than 8,000 career receiving yards and over 500 rushing yards. One of the league's most durable receivers, he has appeared in all 17 regular-season games in each of the last five seasons.

CROSSING INTO ELITE TERRITORY

- ▶ Nick Cross enters his fifth NFL season signing with the Washington Commanders after spending the previous four years with the Indianapolis Colts. During his time in Indianapolis, Cross appeared in 67 games, including starts in all 17 contests over each of the last two seasons. He totaled 304 tackles, five interceptions, 12 passes defended, and 3.5 sacks with the Colts.

STILL MAKING NOISE

- ▶ Tarheeb Still enters his third season with the Los Angeles Chargers after making an immediate impact as a rookie in 2024. Selected in the fifth round of the NFL Draft, Still appeared in 14 games with 12 starts, totaling 62 tackles (45 solo), 10 pass breakups, four interceptions—including a pick-six—and half a sack.
