UNA IN 67TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

• This is UNA's 67th season of intercollegiate football since the program was revived at the school in 1949. UNA has an overall 441-256-16 record. The school's 19 NCAA Division II Playoff appearances are tied for the most by any school in the division's history and the Lions 31 all-time post-season wins rank second in Division II history.

UNA RETURNS 56 LETTERMEN AND 15 STARTERS

• UNA returns 56 lettermen and 15 starters from a 2014 team that went 9-2, won a share of the Gulf South Conference Championship and advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

UNA LEADS SERIES WITH ALL 2015 OPPONENTS

• UNA holds a winning record against all 10 opponents on its 2015 schedule. UNA had been tied with Mississippi College but the Lions 58-0 win last season gave UNA a 15-14-2 advantage. UNA is unbeaten against Miles (9-0), Shorter (3-0), Florida Tech (2-0), UNC-Pembroke (2-0) and Western Oregon (1-0) and holds the edge on traditional rivals Valdosta State (22-16-1), Delta State (31-26-1), West Georgia (21-11) and West Alabama (50-17-1) as well.

UNA IS STATE'S WINNINGEST COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL PROGRAM SINCE 1990

* North Alabama has the most wins and best winning percentage of any collegiate football program from the state of Alabama since 1990. UNA has a 214-84-1 record over the last 25-plus seasons for a 71.9 winning percentage.

SERIES VS. MISSISSIPPI COLEGE

* This will be the second meeting between North Alabama and Mississippi College since the Choctaws return to the Gulf South Conference last season. The rivalry dates back to 1963 but was dormant from 1995-2013. UNA drilled Mississippi College 58-0 last year in Clinton to take the lead in the all-time series 15-14-2. The Lions have won the last five consecutive meetings, with the Choctaws last win over UNA coming in 1991.

* This will be Mississippi College's first trip to Florence since 1994 when UNA routed the Choctaws 24-0 on the way to its second straight national championship. The bad news for UNA, however, is that the Lions are just 5-8-2 all-time at Braly Stadium against Mississippi College.

UNA LOOKING FOR THIRD STRAIGHT GSC TITLE

* North Alabama earned a share of the 2013 and 2014 Gulf South Conference football championships and is trying to become just the third team in league history to win three straight GSC crowns. Wallace and the UNA Lions won three straight from 1993-95 and Valdosta State won three straight under Chris Hatcher from 2000-02.

Bobby Wallace is the first coach in league history to win five GSC football championships. Former GSC coaches Ron Roberts

THOMPSON OFF TO A QUICK START

* UNA senior running back Lamonte Thompson opened the season with a 173-yard performance against Miles at Legion Field. It was Thompson's third career 100-yard game against Miles and the ninth overall of his career. In three games against Miles, Thompson has 464 yards on 57 carries and has scored five touchdowns. That's 8.1 yards per carry. He has now moved past Lawson Fletcher to rank as the sixth leading rusher in UNA history.

WINGO PROMINENT IN UNA CAREER RANKINGS

UNA senior quarterback Luke Wingo ranks fourth in school history for career passing yards (5,358), fourth in career total offense (6,346), fifth in career pass completions (385), fifth in career touchdown passes (36) and fourth in career touchdowns responsible for (63).

UNA HAS WON 13 STRAIGHT SEASON-OPENERS

* With a 34-17 win over Miles, the Lions have now won their last 13 straight openers dating back to a 24-21 double-overtime loss at Samford in the 2002 opener. UNA has an all-time 40-23-4 record in its 67 season-opening games. Current UNA head coach Bobby Wallace has a 12-2 record in his 14 season-openers at UNA.

WALLACE'S FIRST SIGNING CLASS REACHES SENIOR SEASON

• When Bobby Wallace returned to UNA in 2012, his first signing class included 37 freshmen. Many of those players have now reached their senior season - with 15 still in the program. That list includes Trevor Brooks, Tyler Grigsby, Eddrick Harris, DeAndre Harrison, Kamarin King, Khyle Jackson, Floyd Jones, Lee Mayhall, Will Minor, Jalen Reedus, James Rivers, Diamond Simmons, Jacob Tucker, Luke Wingo and Rod Winston.

WALLACE CHASING HAL SELF TO BECOME UNA'S WINNINGEST FOOTBALL COACH

* UNA Head Coach Bobby Wallace is just two wins behind Hal Self in the rankings of winningest football coaches in school history. Self won 109 games over 21 seasons from 1949-69. Wallace has 107 wins in just his 14th season at UNA. Wallace already ranks as the winningest football coach in Gulf South Conference history with 133 wins in 18 seasons in the league.

WALLACE IS WINNINGEST COACH IN GSC HISTORY

* UNA Head Coach Bobby Wallace is the winningest football coach in Gulf South Conference history with 133 victories in 19 total years in the league (14-North Alabama, 5-West Alabama). With UNA's win at North Carolina-Pembroke in the second round of the 2013 playoffs, Wallace passed former Mississippi College Coach John Williams who had 122 wins at MC from 1972-90. Williams had mistakenly been listed in the GSC record book with 124 wins and the error was not discovered until the post-season, after Wallace had already broken the mark. Wallace has a 133-76-1 record in 19 seasons in the league with four GSC Championships and eight total NCAA Playoff Appearances.

THREE UNA ASSISTANTS ALSO FORMER LION PLAYERS

Three full-time members of the current UNA football staff were also outstanding players for the Lions. Offensive coordinator **Cody Gross** played quarterback at UNA from 1992-95 and had a 41-2 record as a starter that included three NCAA Division National Championships. He earned All-GSC and All-American honors and has been inducted into the Division II Football Hall of Fame. Defensive backs coach **Blake Farris** was a four-year letterman and starter for the Lions from 1992-95. He earned All-GSC, All-Super Region 2 and All-American honors and holds the school record for interceptions in a season with 10. Defensive line coach **Gabe Poe** was a starting linebacker and leading tackler on UNA's 2013 team, earning All-Gulf South Conference honors.

LIONS IMPROVE TO 3-1 AT LEGION FIELD

* With a season-opening 34-17 win over Mies College, UNA improved to 3-1 all-time at Birmingham's Legion Field. UNA lost the final game of the 1971 regular-season 60-7 to Jacksonville State at Legion Field. The Lions returned to Birmingham on Sept. 2, 1989 to defeat Alabama A&M 19-7 with Bobby Wallace as head coach. UNA then downed Miles 31-30 at Legion Field in the 2012 season-opener for both schools and again in the 2015 opener.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

Choctaws Coast to Season-Opening Win Over Texas College, 61-6

CLINTON, Miss. --- The Mississippi College football team tied a school record with seven rushing touchdowns in a 61-6 win over Texas College on Saturday night at Robinson-Hale Stadium.

On a warm and humid evening, the Choctaws (1-0) and Steers (0-1) saw the kickoff pushed back 45 minutes due to lightning in the area.

The weather was about the only thing that slowed down the MC offense, as they put up 61 points for the first time since a 61-14 win over McMurry on September 19, 2009.

The Choctaws scored seven rushing touchdowns, one from seven different players, for the first time since completing the feat twice in 1975 (Arkansas-Monticello and Mexico Polytechnico) and once in 1974 (Baptist Christian).

Sophomore quarterback Kyle Smith led the MC offense, going 8-for-13 through the air with 138 passing yards and two scores. He also had a team-high 67 rushing yards with one score.

Freshman Colt Freeman rushed the ball three times for 61 yards and a score, while senior Darius Youngblood had two carries for 34 yards and a touchdown. Junior Josh Dixon was efficient with one carry for 32 yards and a score.

Junior Marcel Newson led the Choctaw receivers with four catches for 89 yards and two scores, including a 55-yard reception to open the scoring in the first quarter.

With the Choctaws leading 26-6 in the final seconds of the first half, Smith would run the ball in from a yard out as time expired to give MC a 33-6 lead going into the break.

The MC defense would take over from there, pitching a shutout in the second half. The Steers only picked up 11 first downs and 179 yards of total offense.

Sophomore Chris Manning picked off his third career pass, while freshman Da'Quan Lewis had an interception in the end zone, returning it for 29 yards.

Junior Alexander Greer had a team-high six tackles, while junior JaQarius Scott had 2.0 TFL and senior Lazarus Shelby and junior Nathan Stevens each recorded a sack.

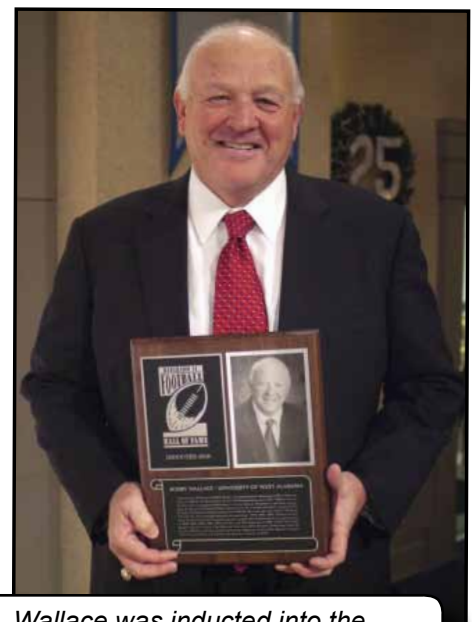

Wallace is Winningest Football Coach in Gulf South Conference History

UNA Head Coach Bobby Wallace is the winningest football coach in Gulf South Conference history with 133 victories in 19 total years in the league (14-North Alabama, 5-West Alabama). With UNA's win at North Carolina-Pembroke in the second round of the 2013 playoffs, Wallace passed former Mississippi College Coach John Williams who had 122 wins at MC from 1972-90. Williams had mistakenly been listed in the GSC record book with 124 wins and the error was not discovered until the post-season, after Wallace had already broken the mark. Wallace has a 133-76-1 record in 19 seasons in the league with four GSC Championships and eight total NCAA Playoff Appearances.

North Alabama has played 92 games against nationally ranked opponents since 1992 - including facing three ranked teams in 2014.

The Lions are 55-36-1 in the 92 previous meetings with ranked opponents over the last 23 seasons.

UNA won 18 straight games against nationally ranked teams at home from 1992-99, dating back to a 14-12 loss to third ranked Jacksonville State in the 1992 playoffs, prior to a 28-21 loss to Pittsburg State in 1999.

UNA has played 48 of its last 92 games against ranked teams against Top 10 teams. The Lions are 28-20 in those previous 48 games.
