DR. ROBERT M. GUILLOT

PRESIDENT



Since becoming its president over eight years ago, Dr. Robert Guillot has guided the University of North Alabama during a period of transition that has led to unprecedented growth in enrollment, curriculum, and facilities.

The Student body numbered slightly over 3,000 when Dr. Guillot became UNA's 10th chief executive on April 1, 1972. In less than five years, the enrollment had surpassed the 5,000 mark and it is expected to continue to climb during the new decade.

Dr. Guillot points with pride to the manner in which UNA students and student-athletes distinguish themselves in their respective fields in this country and abroad.

Several members of the 1979 Lion football squad received opportunities to play professionally in the National Football League, and Gerald Lavender, a star center on the 1979-80 basketball team, is currently performing with a club in Argentina.

Dr. Guillot, who seldom misses a men's or women's athletic event on campus and who has supported the teams with his presence consistently on the road, was sidelined by illness during the entire 1978 football season but kept in constant touch with the progress of the team and cheered it on to a 7-2-1 record, the best gridiron mark at UNA in 24 years.

Dr. Guillot's rapid recovery in his battle with the rare disease, transverse myelitis, is not surprising to those who know him well.

Returning home in November, 1978, he attended several basketball games in Flowers Hall and although he was still unable to walk without assistance, he led the cheers for the Lions in person as they competed for the NCAA Division II National Championship in Springfield, Mo. It goes without saying that the presence of UNA's No. 1 fan served as an inspiration to players and coaches as the Lions defeated Wisconsin-Green Bay to become the first Alabama team to win a national title in basketball.

Last season the football team won six games to post another successful season, and both the men's and women's basketball teams experienced outstanding campaigns. The men once again battled their way to the national tournament by finishing among the top four teams in the country, and the women captured the state championship and made an excellent showing in the regionals.

Dr. Guillot spearheaded a drive that led to the renovation of Braly Stadium, the Lions' football home, and the baseball park and intramural field has undergone a complete facelift.

Serving as president of the Gulf South Conference in 1978-79, Dr. Guillot accomplished several goals that will benefit the league for years to come. He led the search for a new commissioner and was instrumental in having the GSC headquarters moved to Birmingham, a more centrally located site for the seven-member league.

A native of Headland, Alabama and a graduate of Dothan High School, Dr. Guillot received the B.S. degree from Auburn University, his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Alabama, and the Chartered Life Underwriters degree from the American College. In 1977, Jacksonville State University conferred the honorary Doctor of Laws degree upon the UNA leader.

A Mason and Shriner, Dr. Guillot is past president of the Alabama League of Municipalities and the Association of Life Insurance Companies. He served three terms as mayor of Vestavia Hills.

He is married to the former Patty Shirley of Reform, and they have three children.

HISTORICAL STATEMENT

A state-owned institution operated under the direction of a Board of Trustees composed of the Governor, the State Superintendent of Education, and nine members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate, the University of North Alabama is coeducational, offering both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Major purposes include the preprofessional and professional preparation of students in a variety of fields in the arts and science, business, education, social work, and nursing and allied health sciences.

Recognizing its responsibility to the individual as well as to society, UNA endeavors to provide an academic and social environment calculated to develop maximum individuality on the part of the students as well as those characteristics which will render them productive members of a democratic society.

Nestled in the picturesque Tennessee River Valley, UNA is the oldest existing state-supported teacher educating institution south of the Ohio. It occupies a beautiful campus of 80 acres in a residential section of Florence. With a population of almost 40,000 the city is located just north of the Tennessee and is the largest in a four-city area that includes Tusculumbia, Sheffield, and Muscle Shoals, all located south of the river.

UNA traces its origins to LaGrange College, established in 1830 at LaGrange, Alabama by the Methodist Church on the first college charter to be issued by the new State of Alabama.

In 1872, the school at Florence was established as a State Normal School; it became State Teachers College in 1929, Florence State College in 1957, Florence State University in 1968 and the University of North Alabama on August 15, 1974.

Dr. Robert M. Guillot became the University's 10th president on April 1, 1972.



BILL JONES STORY

It doesn't take a genius to figure out the impact Bill Jones has made on the local and national level during his six-year career as head basketball coach at The University of North Alabama.

Just glance at the record and see for yourself.

His 115-53 slate while at UNA speaks for itself, but when you toss in three trips to the NCAA Division II Championship — where the Lions have finished first, third and fourth in the nation — and a Gulf South Conference crown, it just strengthens the theory that Jones is slowly and most assuredly building the University of North Alabama basketball program into a national powerhouse.

A native of Lexington, Alabama, Jones graduated from what was then named Florence State Teachers College in 1957. Although hampered with injuries throughout most of his collegiate career, Jones was a solid performer for the Lions, earning three varsity letters.

He began his coaching career at Yuma (Colo.) High School, and it was there that Jones proved he was destined for greatness. In addition to directing his team to an 18-3 overall record, Jones was voted "Conference Coach of the Year" by his peers.

Eager to return closer to home, Jones' next coaching stop came at Lauderdale County High School, where he served as head basketball coach and assistant principal. Three years later, he accepted a similar position at Opelika High School, and his 1962-63 team went on to post a 23-7 overall record and a third-place finish in the state.

His first collegiate coaching position came at Marion Institute, a school that offered very few basketball scholarships. But Jones quickly turned the Marion Program into one of respectability, winning 60 games in four years, and coming within one game of qualifying for the National Junior College Tournament on two occasions.

The University of Montevallo was Jones' first coaching position at a four-year institution, and in four years he posted an 85-52 overall record and claimed a couple of Southern States Conference championships. Jones was also named "Coach of the Year" following the 1972-73 season.

But in 1974, Jones returned to his alma mater, where he is currently serving as head basketball coach and associate athletic director.

In the past five seasons, Jones-coached UNA basketball teams have compiled the best overall record and the best league mark of any team in the Gulf South Conference, and the Lions have never finished lower than fourth in the GSC in any of those five years.

In addition to being named as the conference's "Coach of the Year" following last year's 21-10 record and a fourth-place finish in the country, Jones had the distinction of coaching his first All-America in guard Otis Boddie.

Jones is married to the former Joan Smith of Lexington, and they are the parents of three children, Kem, Rex and Pam.

WENDELL HUDSON STORY



Wendell Hudson's knowledge and experience in the game of basketball played a vital role in The University of North Alabama's success last season, but the one-time University of Alabama star may be called on to play an even greater role this year.

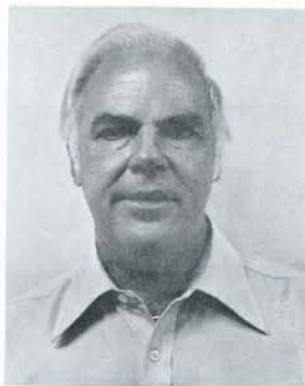
Credited with the development of former Crimson Tide great Reginald King and present stars Eddie Phillips and Phillip Lockett, Hudson — whose name is synonymous with basketball in the state of Alabama — will be asked to do the same with several untested but highly-skilled "inside" players on this year's Lions squad.

A graduate of Parker High School in Birmingham, one of the states basketball powerhouses, Hudson became the first black athlete to sign a scholarship with The University of Alabama. During his brilliant collegiate career — which saw him earn South-eastern Conference "Player of the Year" honors on two different occasions — Hudson was instrumental in rejuvenating the Tide basketball program under C. M. Newton. In his senior season, Hudson led Alabama to a 22-8 overall record and a semifinal berth in the National Invitational Tournament in New York City. The All-America forward was later drafted by both the Chicago Bulls of the NBA and Memphis of the now-defunct ABA.

His coaching career, like his collegiate career, began at Alabama, where he spent two years as an assistant coach with Newton. He later went on to be a full-time assistant coach for three seasons, before an NCAA ruling that limited the number of coaches on any one staff forced Hudson to once again become a part-time assistant. He became Bill Jones' assistant at UNA in June of 1979.

Hudson, a graduate of Alabama with a B.S. Degree in Physical Education, is married to the former Arlene Chatman of Birmingham. He is the father of five daughters and a son.

1980-81 BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

Replacing three seniors who guided the University of North Alabama basketball program into national prominence during their four-year careers is just one of the problems facing head basketball coach Bill Jones as he enters his sixth season at the helm of the Lions cage program.

And that's no easy task.

All-America guard Otis Boddie, career rebounding leader Gerald Lavender, and forward Garry Moore have departed via the graduation route, leaving behind them a host of impressive credentials. In four years, Boddie, Lavender and Moore combined for an 84-35 record, a National Championship, a third and fourth-place finish, respectively, in the nation, and a Gulf South Conference championship.

"A lot of talent and experience has graduated from last year's team," Jones said, "so we've got a lot of questions left unanswered. This could be a year of question with all the new faces we've got around here."

"However, we feel we have some good returning talent, with three of six starters coming back, plus we feel like we had an outstanding recruiting year. Our new players must plug some huge holes, and they must be able to help us quickly if we're going to have a good basketball season."

In addition to losing the three seniors, 6-9 forward Pat Lewallen and 6-2 guard Mark Smith will not be available for duty this season. Lewallen suffered a knee injury in the latter stages of last season and decided to forego his senior year, while Smith will undergo an arm operation and will be lost for the season.

There are some quality basketball players returning, however. Senior forward Johnny Buckmon, a walk-on a year ago who pieced together a tremendous season, will carry much of the scoring burden this year. Buckmon, who averaged 10.1 points and six rebounds, was named to the All-Region and NCAA Division II National Championship All-Tournament teams in '79-80.

Other returning starters include sophomore forward Robert Taylor of Huntsville (7.1 ppg and 4.3 rebounds), and junior guard Albert Owens of Birmingham (9.5 ppg and 4.1 assists).

Lettermen returning include senior guard Tim McCormick, and senior forward Gary Mitchell, with sophomores Lawrence Collier of New Hope and James Graham of Russellville pushing for more playing time this year.

Jones feels like the Lions had another outstanding recruiting season, landing Greg Jarmon, a 6-4, 205 pound forward who, as MVP of the Class 4A State Tournament, led Coffee High School of Florence to the state championship; 6-7 freshman Greg Tyon, who averaged 24 ppg as a senior at Mars Hill School in Florence, 6-11 junior college transfer Gary Tibbetts of Ozark, Ala., 6-4 guard Anthony Thornton of Birmingham, who played at Gadsden State Junior College for the past two years, and 6-4 freshman Reginald Garner, who was a teammate of Jarmon's on Coffee's state championship team.

"With only five returning lettermen, we feel like we've got a lot of work to do," Jones said. "But we're optimistic about our chances. We feel like we've got a good blend of freshmen and junior college transfers to go along with our returning experienced players."

"We feel like if we can get off to a good start, and our younger players come through, we can have a respectable basketball team. And by looking at our schedule, we have got to get it together pretty quick."

The Lions schedule includes non-conference games against perennial SEC power Vanderbilt in Nashville, two games with Alabama State, last year's NAIA runner-up, New York Tech, a team that finished second in the nation in NCAA Division II, Division I foe Middle Tennessee State University, Dillard University, Lambuth College, David Lipscomb and Columbus College, in addition to the always-tough Gulf South Conference slate.

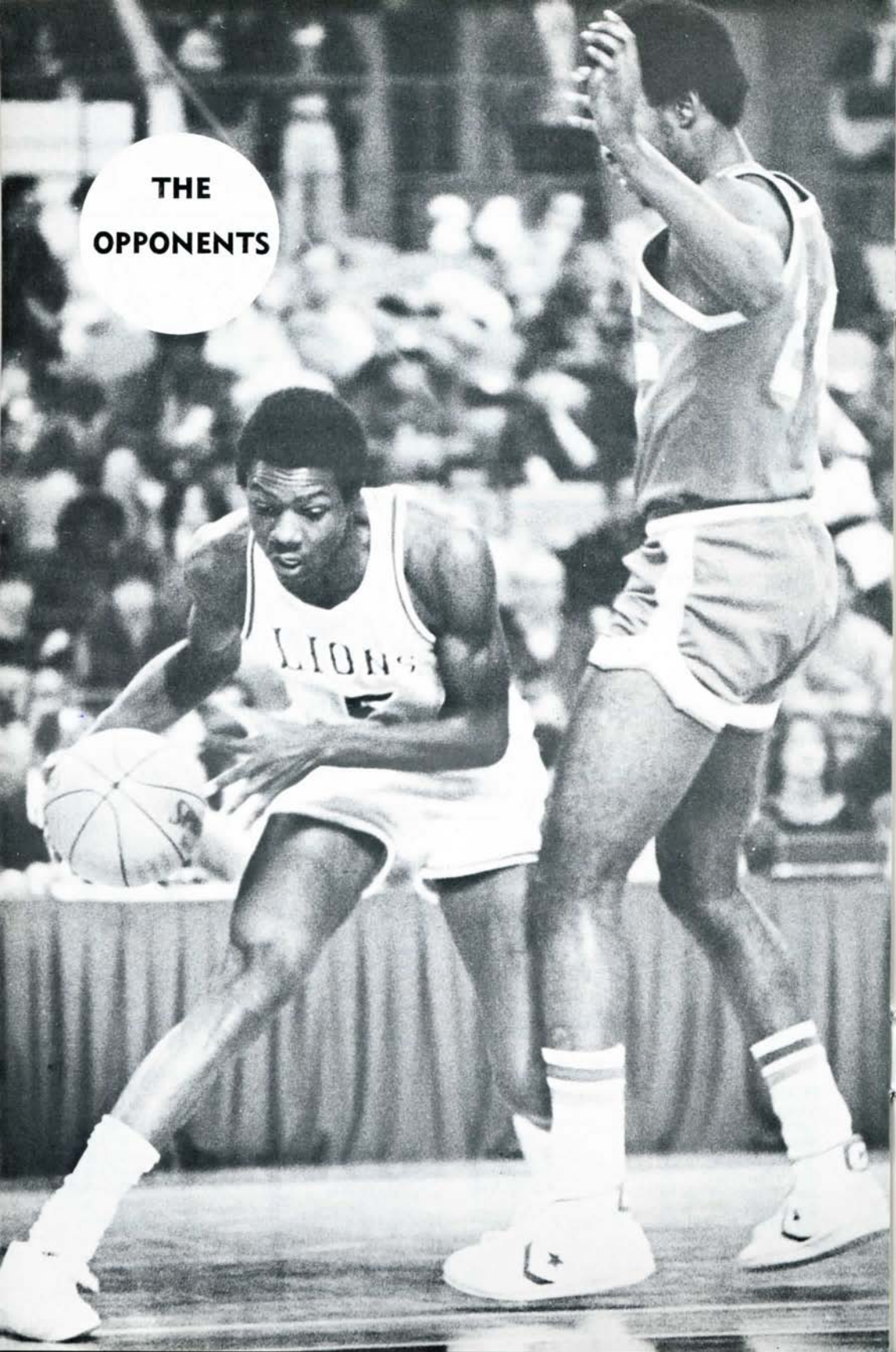

JACKSONVILLE STATE OUTLOOK

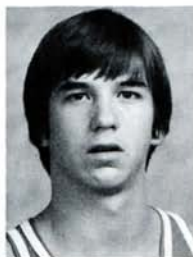
The Gamecocks expect to challenge for the Gulf South Conference championship that they captured last year, mainly due to the return of three starters.

Center Arnold Veasley, a 6-5, 230 pounder, is the big reason the Gamecocks expect to win the GSC once again. Veasley was the league's leading rebounder last year.

In addition to Veasley, Bill Jones will be depending on point guard Todd Smyly and forward Theodis Moore. Smyly is one of the top assists men in the league, while Moore is a tremendous leaper.

The biggest problem for the Gamecocks will be replacing four-year starter Al Lankford, a forward, and guard-forward Tommy Bonds. Bonds averaged 18.8 points per game last season.

HISTORY OF

THE GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

Organized in 1971, the Gulf South Conference has become one of the NCAA's most respected Division II conferences. The GSC as it is known today was born when the Gulf States and Mid-South Conferences disbanded in 1970. In this, its ninth year, the conference faces a new challenge.

Present members include Troy State University, Livingston University, University of North Alabama, Jacksonville State University, Delta State University, Mississippi College and the University of Tennessee-Martin. All but Mississippi College were charter members of the league in 1971. Two charter members — Southeastern Louisiana University and Nicholls State University — resigned membership this year to seek NCAA Division I-AA status.

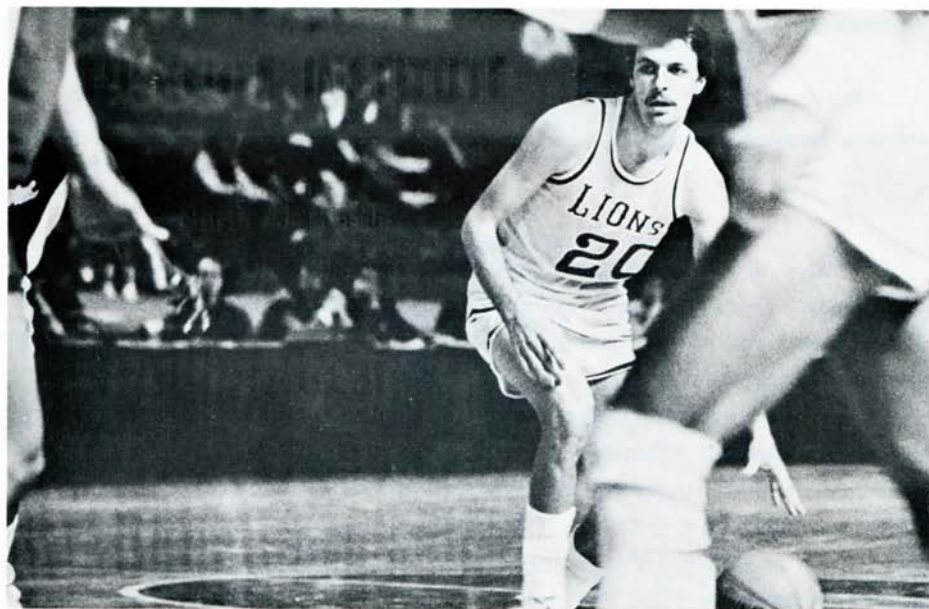
Since the league was formed, five national titles have been won by its members. Troy State won the 1976 and 1977 NCAA golf championships, finished second in 1978 and fourth in 1979. Livingston won the 1971 NAIA football crown and Southeastern Louisiana was the NAIA outdoor track and field champion. The League's most recent national title was won in 1979 by the University of North Alabama basketball team at the NCAA tournament.

The conference presently recognizes championships in cross country, football, basketball, baseball, golf, tennis and track. Also, the league annually recognizes the most outstanding student-athlete with the "Commissioner's Trophy" and the best overall athletic program with the "All-Sports Trophy."

Troy State is the only remaining school in the conference which has won the league's "All-Sports Trophy." TSU won the award in 1974-75 and again in 1976-77. TSU's Mark King, an all-America football player, won the initial "Commissioner's Trophy" in 1975.

Since the league was formed, its teams have qualified and competed for NCAA titles in every sport. Livingston and Jacksonville State have sent teams to the NCAA football playoffs. Jacksonville State has been invited to the playoffs the last two years and finished second in 1977. Delta State finished second at the 1978 baseball World Series and Mississippi College was fourth at the NCAA track meet the same year.

Serving as commissioner of the seven-team conference is James McCollough who assumed the duties in 1979. McCullough replaced Stanley Galloway who served as commissioner since the league was formed. McCullough was the former athletic director at California State College of Pennsylvania.

GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE SPORTS RELEASE

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA, OCTOBER 21, 1980

Following a spectacular 1979-1980 season which saw two conference schools make the NCAA Division II Playoffs, GSC basketball coaches and players are getting ready for what promises to be another exciting year for cage fans in the Southeast. The pre-season polls of conference coaches and SID's yielded identical results.

Defending champion Jacksonville State is picked to repeat as the league titleist, but Coach Bill Jones' Gamecocks should face stiff competition following a 20-5 season. (9-3 in the GSC). North Alabama, national champion two years ago and a semifinalist last season, is picked to finish second under the 1979-80 GSC Coach of the Year Bill Jones (no relation to Coach Jones of Jacksonville). Tennessee-Martin and Delta State are tabbed for third and fourth positions, respectively, and Livingston, Troy State, and Mississippi College round out a tough slate of GSC competitors.

Indicative of the conference's balance is the fact that one player from each team was selected to the 1980-81 preseason All-GSC squad by the conference coaches. This elite group is made up of seven players due to a three-way tie for the fifth position.

1980-1981 ALL GSC PRESEASON TEAM

ARNOLD VEASLEY, Jacksonville State — Last year Veasley led the GSC in rebounding with a 9.3 per game average and scored 14.2 points a game in his first season at JSU. He is 6'5", 230-pound senior and made the All-GSC second team in 1979-80.

JOHNNY BUCKMON, North Alabama — Buckmon's 10.1 scoring average and 5.1 rebound rate were important to the Lions' success last year. A big senior year is in store for this 6'4", 170-pounder.

DON HUBBARD, Tennessee-Martin — This big (6'5", 198 pounds) man averaged 13.3 points and grabbed 7.3 rebounds per game last season as a sophomore. He was a member of the 1979-1980 All-GSC second team.

JOHN COLES, Delta State — John has averaged 9.6 points per game over the past three seasons in the balanced DSU offense, including 6.9 points (and 5.1 rebounds) per game last year. The 6'5½", 200-pounder should excite GSC fans in his last season.

TONY ANDRE, Livingston — At 6'9", 235 pounds, Tony was second among conference rebounders last season with a 8.8 average and scored 15.8 points per contest. He made the All-GSC second team two years ago.

DARON FAYSON, Troy State — The 6'4", 170-pound Fayson averaged 13.2 points a game and was chosen to the All-GSC second team as a freshman. He will be a key to the Trojans' fortunes this winter.

ANTHONY HICKS, Mississippi College — Last year this young man led the GSC in field goal percentage with 66.9 percent (a conference record) and averaged 7.5 rebounds a game to win "Freshman Player of the Year" honors. He stands 6'6" and weighs 210 pounds.
