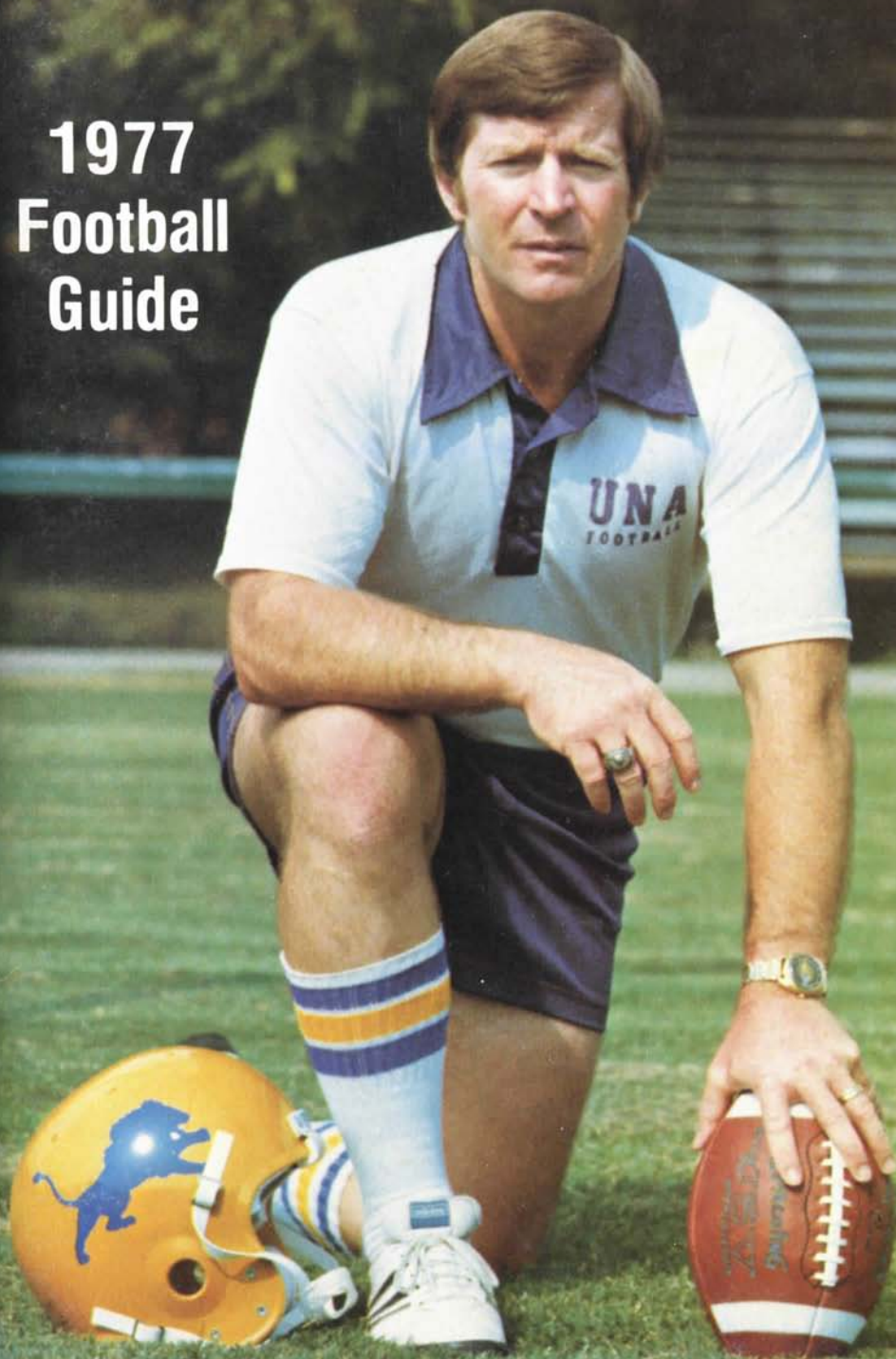

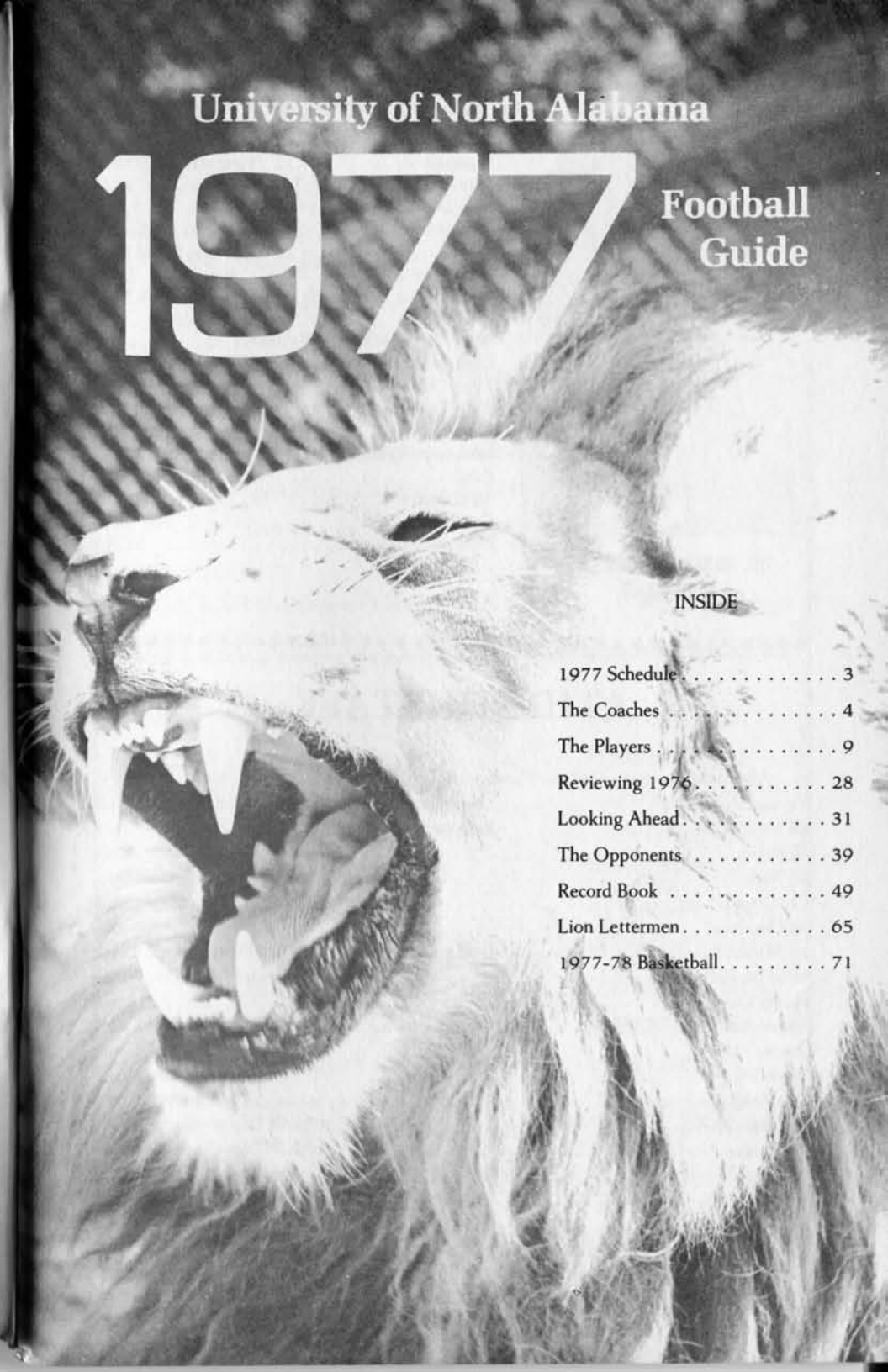

WAYNE GRUBB

"I suppose my coaching philosophy in a nutshell is if you work hard enough long enough something good will happen."

That philosophy has indeed worked for the University of North Alabama's new associate athletic director and head football coach, and there was no reason for Wayne Grubb to change it when he arrived in the Shoals last December.

One of Athens, Tennessee's top sports products, Grubb has already come virtually full cycle in athletics, leaving behind a string of winners. He has been associated with championship football teams on the high school, collegiate and professional levels and prior to accepting the position at UNA was in public relations and sales with the Birmingham Bulls of the World Hockey League.

Basically a tackle at McMinn County High School in Athens, Grubb earned a scholarship to the University of Tennessee. Signed as a fullback, he played center briefly during his freshman campaign, but as a sophomore was shifted to guard where he performed the remainder of his career with the Vols under Bowden Wyatt.

One of the most memorable games in which Grubb played came in 1959 when Tennessee upset defending national champion Louisiana State, 14-13.

After graduating in May, 1961, Grubb immediately accepted the head coaching job at Cordova, Ala. During five years at the Walker County school, he compiled a 38-8-4 record and directed the 1963 club to the State 2A title.

In 1966 he entered the collegiate ranks, working with the defense at Samford University. Three years later, he became the Bulldogs' head coach and in 1971 posted a 9-1 overall mark, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 20-10, in the Alonzo Stagg Bowl in Phenix City, Ala., for the NCAA Division II championship. Samford dropped its football program after the 1973 season and in five years Grubb had compiled a 26-20-3 record while working with no more than 22 scholarships per year.

He joined the staff of the Birmingham Americans in the World Football League for the 1974 season, coaching the offensive line. The Ams went 17-5 and captured the World Bowl.

In 1975, the Americans became the Vulcans and Grubb coached the offensive line and the specialty teams. Before the season was over, the WFL folded with the Vulcans out front in the title chase.

Grubb then became associated with the Bulls and although he was enjoying his work, no one had to do an arm twisting job when football called once again.

"I had been in football, going back to high school, for over 20 years, and the brief time I was away from it gave me the opportunity to see if I could be happy in some other area," Grubb said. "I was happy, but I missed football. There is a tremendous challenge facing the staff and young men here at UNA, and I'm as eager to entertain that challenge now as I was when I first got into this business. I suppose this is the reason I really missed football...being able to establish team goals and working hard to attain them."

Grubb is married to the former Becky Cunningham of New Tazewell, Tenn. They have two children, Christina, 12, and Robert Wayne, 10.

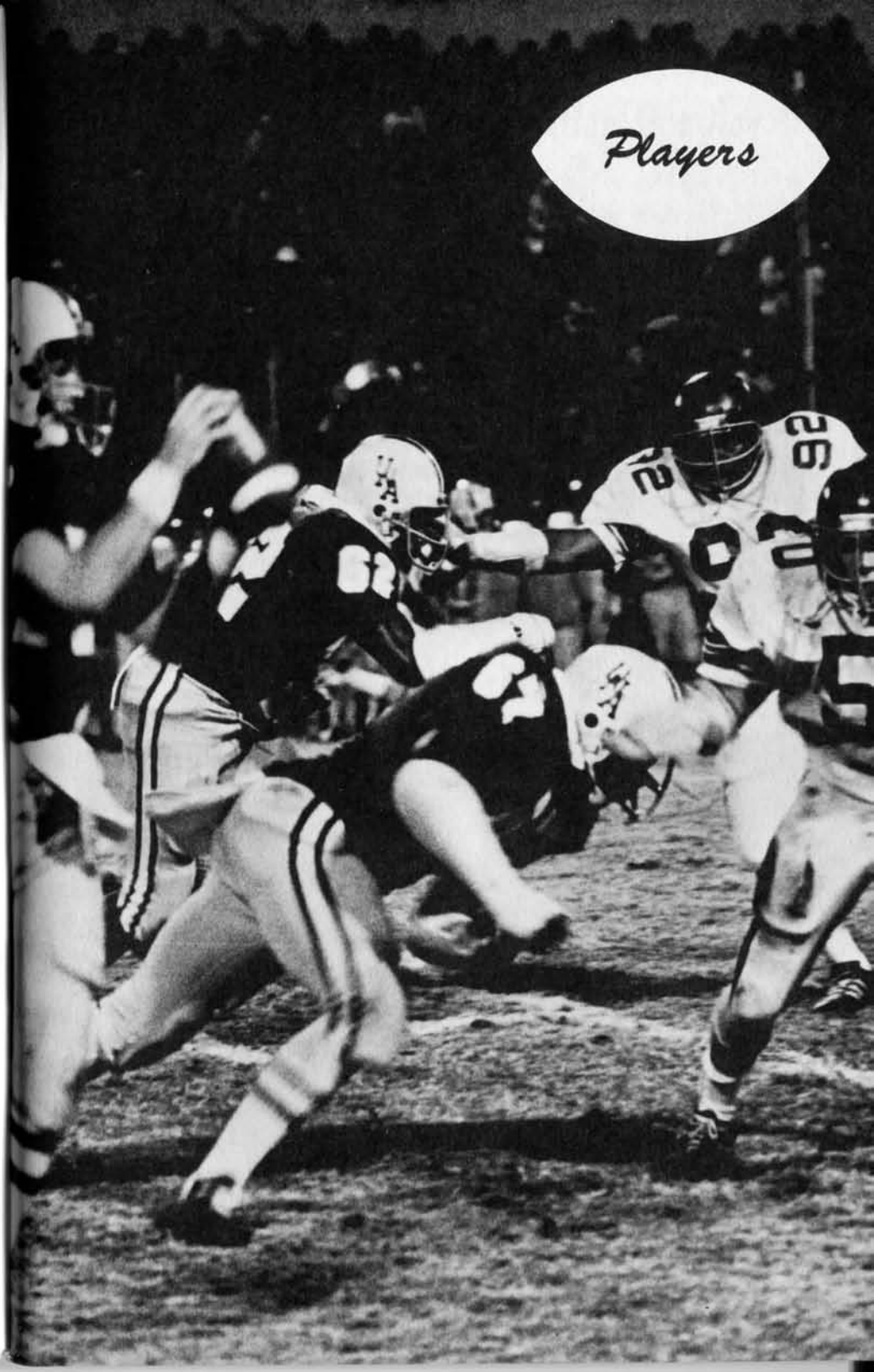

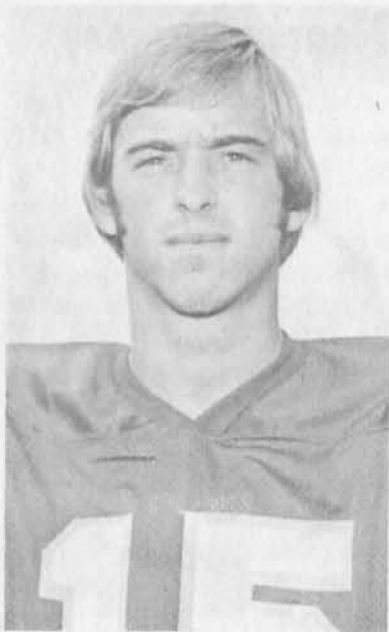
Maurice Brawley

SENIOR LINEBACKER from Tallahassee, Fla...born May 12, 1955, in Norfolk, Va...6-0, 215...one letter...started two seasons for Maryville (Tenn.) College before move to UNA...had good spring and will begin fall as No. 1 "sam" linebacker...one of stronger players on squad, bench presses close to 400 pounds...expected to develop into one of genuine defensive leaders...will call defensive signals.

SENIOR LINEBACKER from Birmingham, Ala...born June 2, 1955, in Ft. Campbell, Ky...6-2, 210...one letter...transferred to UNA from University of Alabama...has been plagued by injuries since arrival, but keeps bouncing back...is determined to be a factor in Lion defense in '77...finished spring as No. 2 "blood" end...has excellent range and speed...solid pass defender.

SENIOR HALFBACK from Moulton, Ala...born Sept. 22, 1954, in Moulton...5-9, 180...one letter...probably fastest and quickest player in backfield...extreme quickness out of stance...gives him opportunity to be great runner in the veer...a 4.5 sprinter, could have exceptional year...could be used in specialty areas as punt and kickoff returner...scored two touchdowns last season.

Looking Ahead With Wayne Grubb

Question: You came to UNA at about the time other schools were winding down in the recruiting war. How do you think this will affect the Lions in your first season?

Answer: No doubt about it, we got off to a very late start. In fact, it was well into February before we were able to make a turn in our recruiting program. But because we have a hard-working, dedicated staff, I feel that we located some quality players who, for one reason or another, had remained unsigned. We sold them on coming here, and I don't think they'll regret it because UNA has something to offer. It is a great university with an outstanding academic program and it is located in a tremendous area of the Tennessee Valley. I suppose at one point I thought we were going to be in serious trouble because of our late recruiting start, but I firmly believe we finished strong. And that's what it's all about.

Question: What is your basic approach to coaching?

Answer: Before a player will give his best, he must be happy. I think there are three key factors involved in accomplishing this. You must treat a young man fair, you must be honest with him, and you've got to give him a chance. If he's given a chance to play, and he doesn't make it, he has satisfied himself. If you're fair with him, and shoot straight, he can't ask for anything more. I think that young men today are looking for someone to justify what they're doing. In coaching, I think all of us are looking for the best people possible, and if we do these three things we can find them.

Question: Should football be fun?

Answer: Football is fun. Regardless what you're doing, unless you enjoy it, you won't do a very good job. If a player doesn't really enjoy the participation and the competition of football, there's no way he can give his 100 percent. This is why I encourage people to get out of football if they're not having fun playing it. We try to make our practices fun, and that isn't all that easy to do because much of it of course is hard work. As a matter of fact, 99 percent of it is work. The games are fun. But the rewards of all the work in practice make it worthwhile.

Question: What do you view as being critical in building a football program?

Answer: I believe in the kicking game because so many games are won or lost with it. I suppose I got that from the General. (Coach Robert Neyland at Tennessee). The kicking game and defense were the backbone of his teams. In other words, try to keep from losing, and then try to win. That has changed today. People are trying to score more because this will bring people into the stadium. Fans want to see points on the scoreboard; they like to see a lot of passes thrown, and the long run. But I'm interested in winning, if by only a point. Naturally, I hope we can develop a potent offense capable of producing a lot of

points. But we're going to start to build by molding a sound kicking game.

Question: What will it take for UNA to be successful in 1977?

Answer: Oneness. That's it in a nutshell. If you don't have oneness you're out of business before you start. I don't mean just team unity, I'm speaking of oneness among everyone related with the football program. In order to have a strong, dynamic organization, we must have a unified faculty, administration and community. I think we have a highly qualified staff and I feel that our players will progress from week to week. But in order to accomplish our mission on the field, we must have staunch support.

Question: What did you spot as the problem areas, or the major weaknesses, during spring training?

Answer: Offensively, we need a couple of additional offensive linemen who can play, and another wide receiver. Defensively, we need to locate four players who can contribute in a hurry, and that would be a couple of backs and one defensive lineman and one linebacker.

Question: What about strong points?

Answer: We're fortunate in one sense of having had during the spring four quarterbacks with potential. I would not be afraid to play either of them, John Grubb, Jeff Davis, Garner Ezell, or Gerald Goodman. But on the other hand, we are hoping that one will step forward and take control. It will be to the benefit of the team to settle on one quarterback and go with him as far as we possibly can. I also think we are relatively strong in runningbacks. Maurice Brawley is a veteran and has had some great moments at UNA. Terry Stooksberry, Otis Green, and Curtis Sirmones should be top-notch runners this fall. If we can develop another linebacker, we should be strong here.

Question: Do you feel leadership will be adequate?

Answer: We had some questionable areas in attitude during the early portion of spring training, but I am content with the attitude of the team as a whole at this stage. We have a group of young men who think they can play football, and that's a big part of it. We have a good crop of seniors in Terry Witherspoon, Mike Allison, Robert Steele, Brawley, Goodman, Ezell, Jeff Hittinger, Danny Neal, Clark Galen, John Byrd, Melvin Pointer, Don Pearson, Bubba Gibson, Rodney Bivens, Len Harvey, and Myles Smith. I have met with them and they are interested in winning. They want to leave UNA on a winning note, and that's exactly what we want for them.

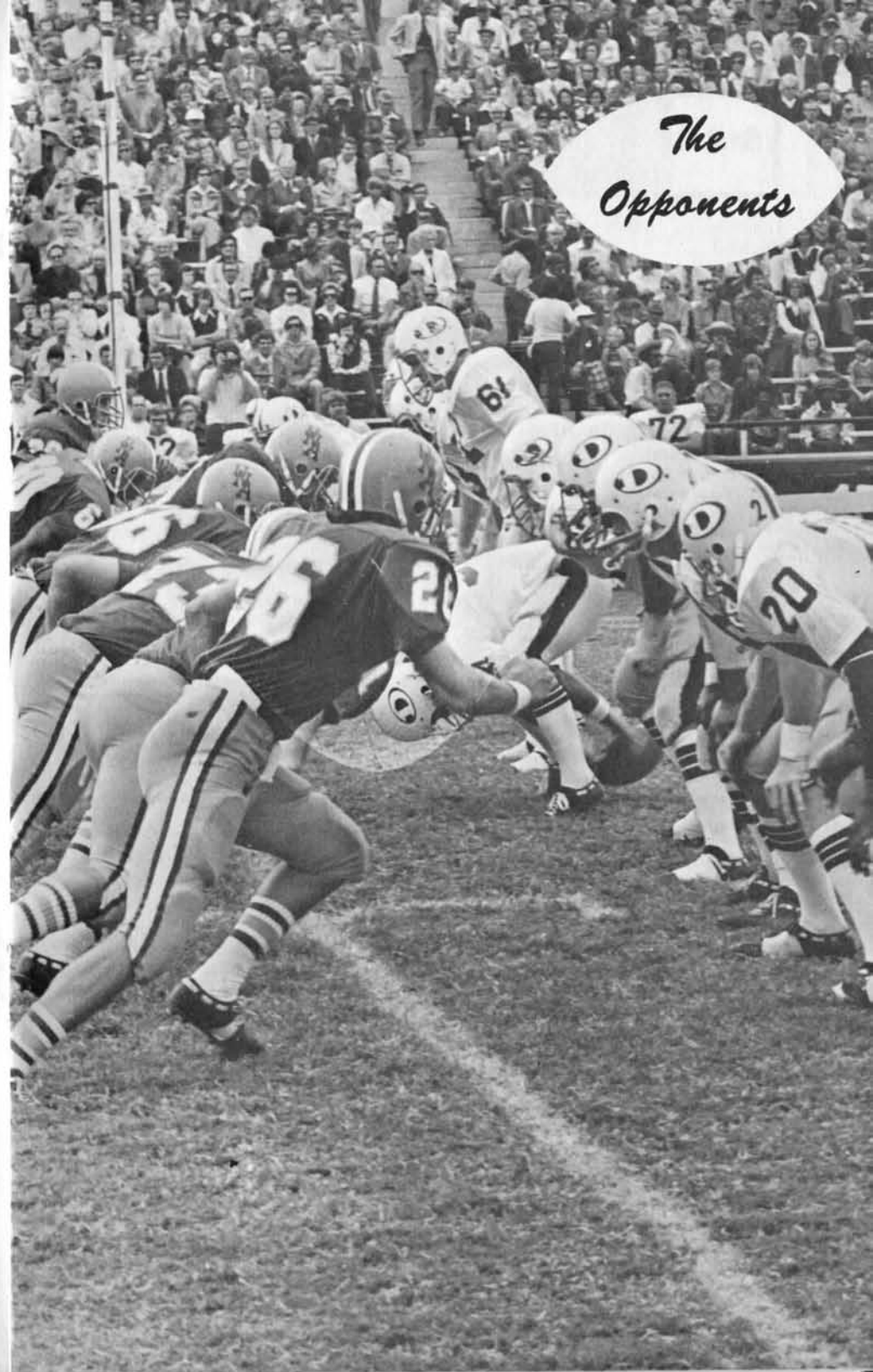

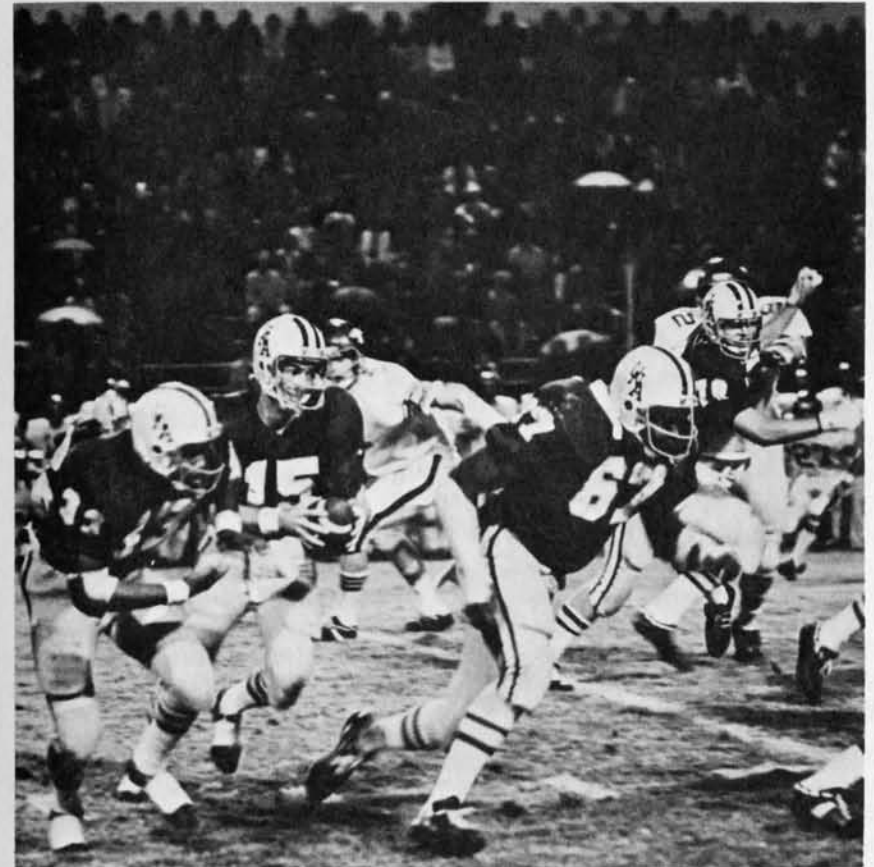

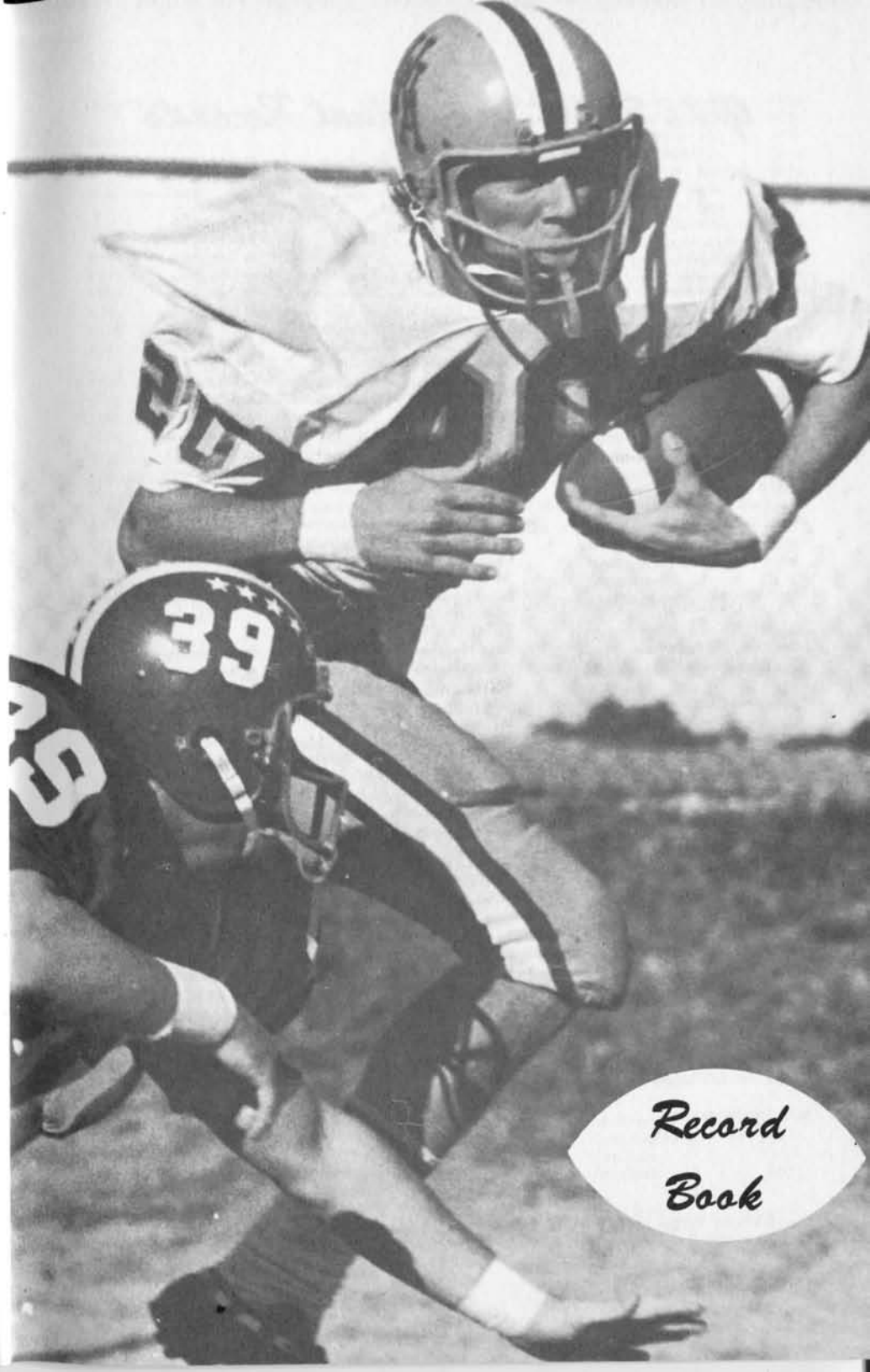
