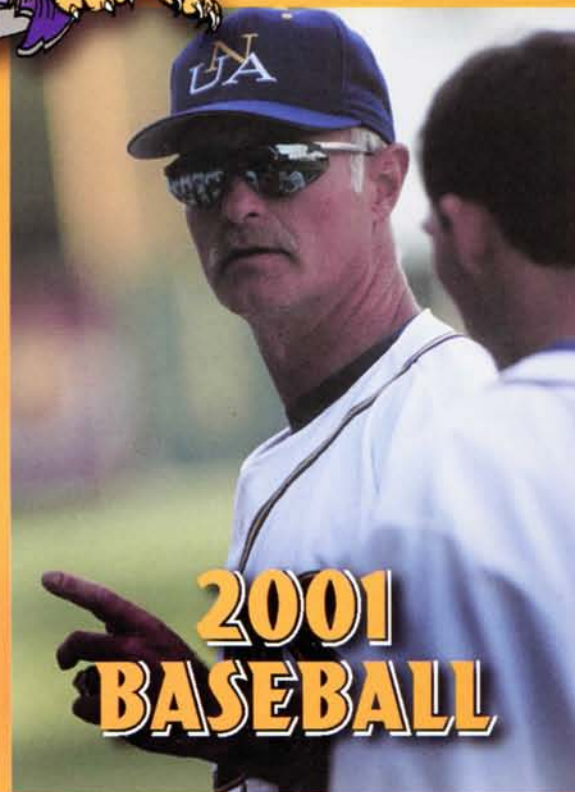

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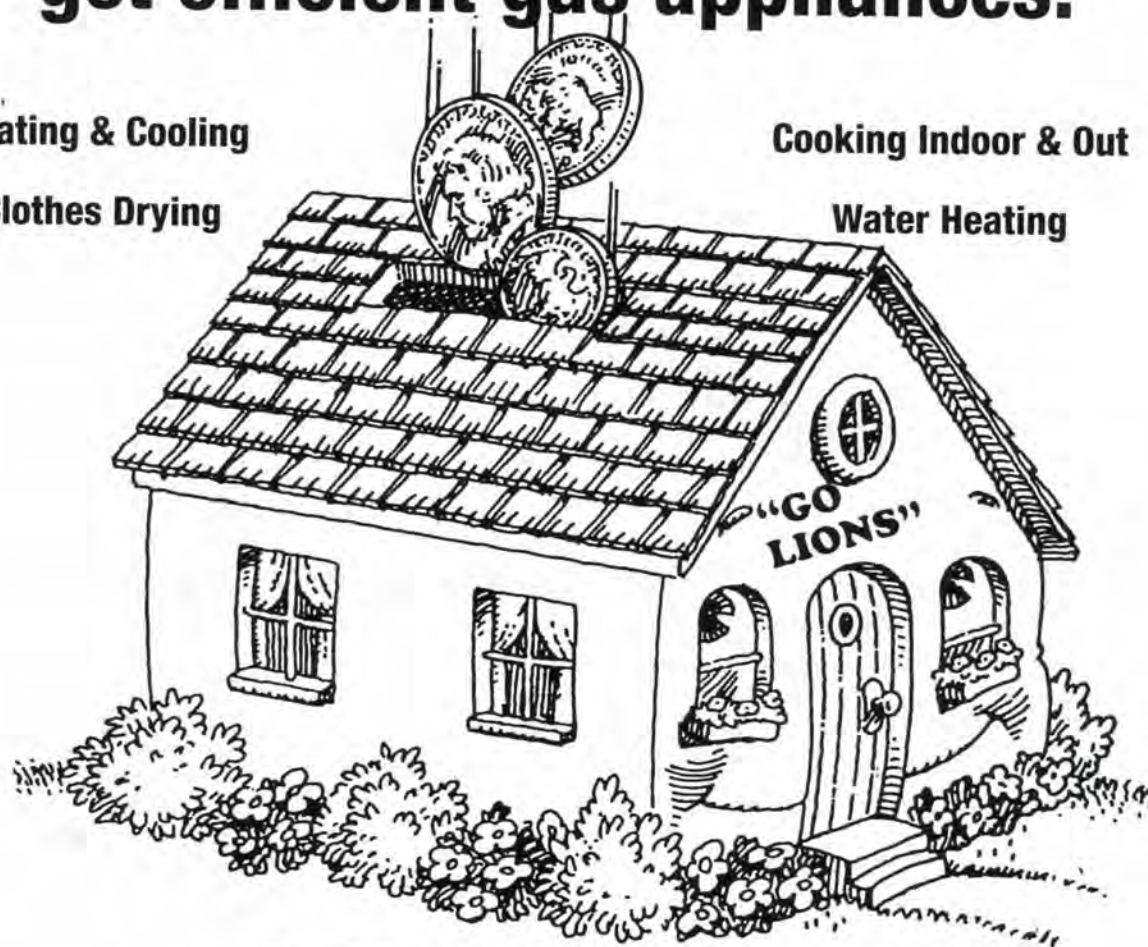
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UNIVERSITY OF NORTH

The University of North Alabama, established in 1830 as LaGrange College, became in 1872 the first state teachers college south of the Ohio River. UNA has developed into a regional university providing quality educational opportunities for students from the three-state region of Alabama, Mississippi and Tennessee.

The Gourman Report, which ranks the nation's universities, selected UNA as one of the better schools in Alabama. Of the 26 Alabama schools rated, UNA ranked first behind Alabama's five doctoral degree-granting institutions.

Using the Gourman criteria, North Alabama, if located in any of the other 53 U.S. territories or states, would rank first in five states, second in 12, third in 13, fourth in 10 and fifth in one. The Gourman scores ranked North Alabama first among Gulf South Conference schools.

North Alabama's academic role has expanded through the years. Bachelor's degrees are offered in majors in various areas of arts and sciences, business, education and nursing.

Preprofessional preparation for medicine, dentistry, optometry, podiatry, pharmacy, law, agriculture and forestry, engineering, veterinary medicine, medical technology and other allied health professions is offered. Various master's degrees are offered in the education and business fields.

North Alabama is the first major university to offer a four-year degree program in commercial music. Majors have interned in record industry offices in Nashville, Memphis, New York, Los Angeles, London, and nearby Muscle Shoals. UNA is one of 11 schools nation wide offering an undergraduate degree in industrial hygiene. Foreign language, nursing and science students also have opportunities to study abroad.

Numerous faculty and staff members hold positions of distinction in various national, regional and state professional organizations. Many have written books and/or published articles in newspaper, magazines and professional journals. The *Journal of Legal Economics* is published on campus.

Various centers have been established at North Alabama to serve its constitu-

ency. Operated by faculty and staff, they give undergraduate and graduate students excellent opportunities for research and public services.

They include the Occupational and Environmental Health Laboratory. Its scientific research has attracted national and international attention in the health field. The Geographic Research Center, in cooperation with the National Geographic Society, has increased the profile of geography in the state and has opened doors for students to partake in mapping and demographics research for various governmental agencies. Science faculty and students teach and study marine biology-related courses at Dauphin Island Sealab near Mobile, Alabama.

North Alabama also houses the northwest Alabama Education Research and Inservice Center, which provides inservice training for elementary and secondary educators in a six-county region. North Alabama has the only state university-operated kindergarten and grammar school, which afford education students a professional development laboratory experience in teaching.

Serving a nine-County region, the Small Business Development Center provides information, counseling and assistance to small businesses or to people planning to start small businesses. The Rare and Endangered Species Research Center personnel are conducting research on several endangered species in the region. The Wellness Research and Service Center researches areas of wellness,



exercise programs, nutrition, stress management, health education counseling and environmental support.

North Alabama works closely with various southern universities and many local, state and federal agencies on a myriad of projects and activities.

Supporting the faculty are the extensive resources of the Collier Library system, a federal records depository. It is computerized and tied into various library loan research networks.

North Alabama students excel in academics, student activities and athletics. Often they are recognized nationally for their achievements in specific areas.

North Alabama's alumni are equally successful. Among them are a Pulitzer Prize winner for literature, two Alabama governors, a Texas governor, numerous U.S. Congressmen, thousands of educators, and special assistant to the President of the United States.

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UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

ROBERT L. POTTS

Robert L. Potts was named President of the University of North Alabama on August 13, 1990, after serving as Interim President for seven months. He had previously served for six years as General Counsel for the University of Alabama System where he was instrumental in forming a System-wide Office of Counsel.

During the Potts tenure, the University of North Alabama has made significant progress. Under his leadership, the administrative structure of the University has been streamlined, admissions standards have been adopted, a University Development and Advancement Office has been established which has resulted in more than tripling the University's endowment, an innovative day care center has been created at Kilby Laboratory School, an annual fall convocation for new students is now held, and the University has enhanced its presence in the State Capital through a cooperative effort with other state universities. An international program has been created, and three new degree programs - a Master of Science in Criminal Justice, a Master in Physical therapy, and a Master of Arts in English - have been approved by the state coordinating board. Additionally, a campus master plan has been completed, and is being implemented with several new construction projects, an automation project has modernized the computing capability on campus, an Academic Resource Center has been established, and significant steps have been taken to improve student recruitment and retention. Moreover, during his Presidency, University athletic teams have won four National Championships at the NCAA Division II level.

Potts previously served on the Board of Trustees of Alabama State University and Oakwood



College. He has taught at Boston University, the University of Alabama and at UNA. He is a former member of the Board of Trustees of the National Conference of Bar Examiners, where during his tenure as Chair in 1995, the Board adopted a Multistate Performance Test for use by state bar examiners. He is a former Chairman of the Alabama Board of Bar Examiners. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the Bevil Center for

Advanced Environmental Technology, the Alabama Motorists Association and the Alabama Women's Hall of Fame. Potts is the current Chairman of the Board of the Marine Environmental Sciences Consortium which oversees the Dauphin Island Sea Lab and is composed of twenty-two Alabama colleges and universities. He is the immediate past president of the Gulf South Conference, an NCAA Division II athletic conference consisting of eighteen colleges and universities in six states. United States Secretary of Education Richard W. Riley has appointed Potts to the National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity for a term that extends through September 2001. He served a three-year term on the law school accreditation Standards Review Committee for the American Bar Association, and as a member of the Commission on Minorities in Higher Education of the American Council on Education. Potts also serves on the Secretary of the Army's ROTC Program Subcommittee and in February 1999 was selected as Chair of that group.

Potts attend Newbold College in England and received a Bachelor of Arts Degree cum laude from Southern College in Tennessee. He obtained a Juris Doctor Degree from the University of Alabama School of Law, where he served as Alabama Editor of the *Alabama Law Review*. After clerking for the U.S. District Court Chief Judge for the Northern District of Alabama, Potts received a Master of Laws Degree from Harvard University in 1971. Before entering higher education on a full-time basis in 1984, Potts practiced law in Florence, Alabama, where educational issues were a significant part of his practice. He has lectured widely on legal and education topics and is the author of several published articles.

2001 LION PREVIEW

He closed the year with a 5-3 record and a 4.47 ERA, walking just 13 while striking out 37. Welborn's improvement was tremendous in 2000, as he allowed 13 earned runs in his first three appearances, then gave up just 16 earned runs in his other 12 appearances of the season.

UNA also returns freshman pitcher Jody Willoughby of Southside, Ala., who pitched three scoreless innings last season before being injured and later received a medical red-shirt.

Lane expects junior transfer Jayeson McDonald of Tuscaloosa, Ala., to contend for a starting role after recording more than 100 strikeouts in his career at East Central Community College.

Junior right-hander Tatum Brown of Oxford, Miss., will be looked to as the closer for the Lions. He was an all-state and all-region pick at Northwest Mississippi Community College last season while helping lead the Rangers to a state championship.

In the field, all six of the Lions returnees are returning starters from 2000, led by All-Gulf South Conference performers Michael Searcy and Corey Murks.

Searcy, who started at second base for the Lions last season, was a first-team All-GSC pick and an all-region selection after hitting .381 with nine home runs, 61 runs batted in and 66 runs scored. He will make the move to start at shortstop this spring, replacing Willingham, who was two-time All-American before signing a professional contract with the Florida Marlins following his junior season.

"There's no question that Michael can help us at shortstop," said Lane. "He played there in high school and played there all fall. He's the type player that can help us at several positions."

Murks, who was a second-team All-GSC pick at third base last season, hit .389 a year ago with 10 home runs, 62 runs batted in and 54 runs scored. He ranked in the top 10 in the GSC in three categories and was also an All-GSC Tournament pick.

Also back for the Lions in the infield is two-year starter Douglas Hargett at first base, who has started 86 games in his first two seasons in the UNA program. Hargett hit .337 last season with two homers, 31 RBI and 36 runs scored, and was also a solid defender with just two errors in more than 300 chances.

The trio of Hargett, Searcy and Murks helped UNA post a .961 fielding percentage that placed UNA among the national leaders in Division II.

The one new starter in the infield is junior second baseman Clint Chaney of Hartselle, Ala. Chaney transferred to UNA from Jefferson State Community College in Birmingham.

Also expected to be key contributors are junior Bryan Swift of Belleville, Ill., and red-

shirt freshman Brock Beck of Florence.

Senior Tharun Anderson of LaPlace, La., will again start behind the plate, but Lane feels the addition of transfer Brandon Kiser of Batesville, Miss., will give the Lions depth and consistency behind the plate.

Anderson hit .320 last season with 21 runs batted in and 20 runs scored.

"We should have two good catchers who can do a good job of calling the game the way we want to play, and who understand our pitching staff," said Lane. "Kiser really made an impact in the fall. He has a good arm and has made progress behind the plate, but he is also a better hitter than we thought and that should give us a very solid tandem behind the plate."

In the outfield, UNA returns senior speedsters Vito Redman and Nick Mockabee.

Redman, a native of Duncanville, Ala., hit .270 last season, while stealing 21 bases in 25 attempts. Mockabee, from Poplar Bluff, Mo., hit .338 with 43 runs batted in, 40 runs scored and 14 steals in 18 attempts. Mockabee was also one of the main reasons UNA reached the GSC Tournament final last season as he went 8-for-16 in the post-season with five runs scored and seven RBI in five games.

"Vito will start the season in the leadoff spot and we'll have to see how he handles that," said Lane. "With his speed, we'll be looking for him to get on base a lot and give our offense a jump-start. And if Nick improves like we think he can, it will be very interesting."

Also in the mix in the outfield is junior Adam Wheeler of Gadsden, Ala., who is expected to start in right field. Wheeler trans-

ferred to UNA from Wallace State Community College, where he was a part of a team that won the state and regional championships last season on the way to finishing third nationally in the NJCAA World Series.

Junior Jeff Cochran of Safford, Ariz., could also see playing time in the outfield, but he will first have to overcome arm problems that plagued him all fall. If he is healthy, Lane feels he will be a legitimate middle of the lineup hitter for the Lions.

In addition to pitching, McDonald could also see playing time in the outfield.

As far as the Gulf South Conference race, Lane said he expects one of the most interesting seasons he has seen in his 17 years at UNA.

"Every year that I have been here, you always have two or three teams that have a good nucleus coming back, but in our side of the conference, all of the teams that were contenders last season have lost the majority of their key players," Lane said. "That's not to say there won't be some outstanding teams, but it will be teams with a lot of new faces."

"I think our schedule will give us a chance to compete against some good teams and get ready for the GSC schedule, but it will also give us a chance to develop our new players," Lane said.

UNA opens its season at home on February 9 against Lee College and will play its first 12 games at home at University Field. The Lions will also host four of their seven GSC series, playing Lincoln Memorial, Alabama-Huntsville, West Florida and Valdosta State at home, while travelling to West Georgia, Montevallo and West Alabama.

HEAD COACH MIKE LANE

Mike Lane has transformed the University of North Alabama baseball program into one of the nation's most consistent winners in his seventeen years at a school that had produced only one winning season in the six years prior to his arrival.

Lane has won 634 games, averaged 37 wins per season, won 40 games or more six times, won five Gulf South Conference championships and taken the Lions to ten NCAA regionals and one World Series since his arrival in 1983.

Under Lane, numerous Lion baseball players have gone on to play professional baseball, including Cedric Landrum who debuted in the major leagues with the Chicago Cubs and played in 1993 with the New York Mets, Jim Czajkowski, who reached the majors with Colorado Rockies in 1994, and Terry Jones, who debuted with the Rockies in 1996 and played last season with the Expos.

In addition, Lane has developed a national reputation of success and was chosen by the United States Baseball Federation to serve as one of three coaches for the South team in the U.S. Baseball Trials in Florida in 1992. The squad selected from those trials represented the U.S. in the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain.

Last season, Lane took UNA to a 36-16-1 record and into the championship game of the Gulf South Conference Tournament.

That followed a 1999 season when UNA went all the way to its first Division II Baseball World Series in Montgomery after the Lions won the GSC and Division II South Central Regional championships.

UNA finished fifth in the nation with a 45-12 overall record.

Lane led his first UNA squad to a 28-24-1 record and the first Gulf South Conference baseball championship in school history in 1984.

In 1985, the Lions went 46-11-1, finished the regular-season ranked No. 2 nationally in Division II and played in the



NCAA Central Region Tournament for the second straight year.

A No. 17 national ranking and a 34-16-1 record awaited in 1986.

That was followed with a 40-13-1 mark in 1987 for the second most wins in school history. The Lions also had a 21-2-1 record at home for the best home record ever at UNA.

A fifth straight winning season came in 1988 with a 29-16-1, mark then UNA jumped back into the national picture with a 44-11 finish in 1989 that included the GSC championship and another NCAA playoff berth.

In 1990 UNA went 37-9 in the regular-season but lost two straight games as the host of the Gulf South Conference Tournament and was then denied an NCAA playoff berth, despite a 37-11 record that included wins over Division I powers Middle Tennessee State and Mississippi State.

In 1991 the Lions earned their fifth NCAA playoff berth in eight years with a 30-17 record against one of the toughest schedules in school history.

UNA then followed with a 33-19-1 record in 1992 that netted the squad its third straight NCAA appearance. UNA won the regular-season GSC championship with a 13-4 league record and was runner-up in the South Central Regional.

In 1993, UNA tied for the regular-

season GSC championship and then won the tournament title, going undefeated and downing Jacksonville State 7-6 in the championship game. The Lions also earned a fourth straight post-season bid and ranked No. 2 nationally in the final regular-season poll before finishing as the runner-up in the South Central Regional.

In 1994 the Lions were 35-11-2 and won the GSC East Division title. In 1995 UNA went 43-15, won the GSC East Division and finished as the runner-up in the NCAA South Central Regional.

The Lions finished 37-11 in 1996 and were 40-15-1 in 1997, winning the Gulf South Conference championship and playing in their ninth NCAA regional in the last 14 years.

In 1998 UNA went 38-12, including a 24-4 home mark.

The Lions have a remarkable 381-89-4 record at home in Lane's 17 years at the school, with a record 32 home wins in 1999.

After receiving his B.S. degree from Kearney State College in Nebraska in 1974 in Administration and Physical Education, Lane served as an assistant at Georgia Southern University in 1976 and 1977 and received his Masters' degree in Education.

In 1978, Lane went to Yavapai Junior College as an assistant and helped lead the school to a runner-up spot in the national championships.

In 1979, he became head coach at Cochise Community College in Arizona and took a squad that had had four consecutive losing seasons and made two trips to the Arizona Junior College Playoffs. Lane's last four squads at Cochise won 24 games or more.

Since his arrival at UNA, Lane has been named GSC Coach of the Year four times in 1984, 1989, 1993 and 1999. He has produced 58 first-team All-GSC performers and 17 All-America selections. UNA had just seven first-team All-GSC picks in its first 11 years in the league, prior to Lane's arrival.

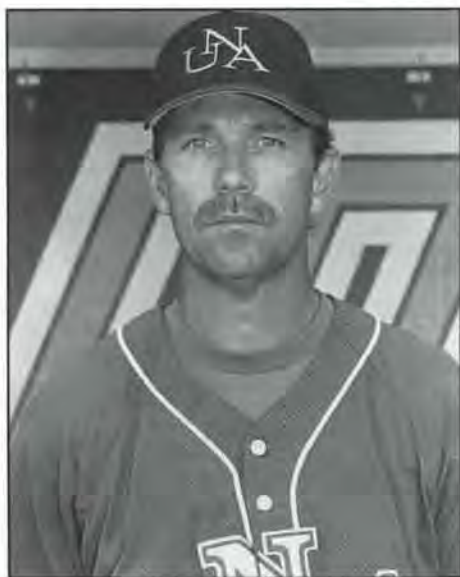

MIKE KEEHN
Assistant Coach

Set to begin his thirteenth season as an assistant coach with the Lions' baseball team in 2000, Mike Keehn has been an instrumental part of North Alabama's tremendous success over the past decade, as a student assistant and full-time assistant coach.

In addition to developing the University Field infield into one of the best playing surfaces in the country, Keehn has played a major role in helping the Lions sign some of the top players in college baseball.

Keehn has also handled several of the Lions' fund-raising efforts.

With a wealth of playing and coaching experience, Keehn has helped lead UNA to a combined 446-168-5 record over the last twelve seasons, while working with the Lion infielders and hitters.

During those 12 years UNA has won four Gulf South Conference baseball titles and made seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

In 1999 he helped direct a UNA team that went 45-12, won the Gulf South Conference and NCAA Division II South Central Regional championships and advanced to the Division II Baseball Championship in Montgomery, Ala.

An infielder at Kearney State College (now the University of Nebraska-Kearney), where he earned honorable mention All-America honors, Keehn was drafted and signed by the Texas Rangers organization.

After a stint in the minor leagues, he went to coach at Kansas City, Kan., Community College from 1985-88. He helped direct KCKCC to a 120-36 record over those three seasons with two Jayhawk Conference championships and two district runner-up finishes.

In 1988 he came to North Alabama and in his first season with the Lions he was a part of his third straight championship team as UNA went 44-11 and won the Gulf South Conference crown. The Lions then advanced to the NCAA regionals for the fourth time in six years.

In 1990 the Lions went 37-11 and won the GSC West Division and followed with a 30-17 mark in 1991 and an NCAA South Atlantic Regional berth.

UNA made its second straight NCAA appearance with a 33-19-1 finish in 1992 and followed with a third straight ap-

pearance, a third Gulf South Conference championship, and a 39-18 record in 1993. In 1994, UNA went 35-11-2 and won the GSC East Division. In 1995 UNA was 43-15, won the GSC East Division and advanced to the championship game of the NCAA Division II South Central Regional. In 1996 the Lions finished with a 37-11 record, and in 1997 UNA was 40-15-1, won its third GSC title since Keehn's arrival and made the ninth NCAA tournament appearance in school history.

In 1998 UNA was 38-12 and the Lions followed with a 36-16-1 mark last season.

Keehn received his B.A. in education with a double major in Physical Education and Business from Kearney State and earned his Master's in Education from UNA in July of 1990.

He and his wife Lisa have two daughters, Jessica and Erica, and a son, Austin.

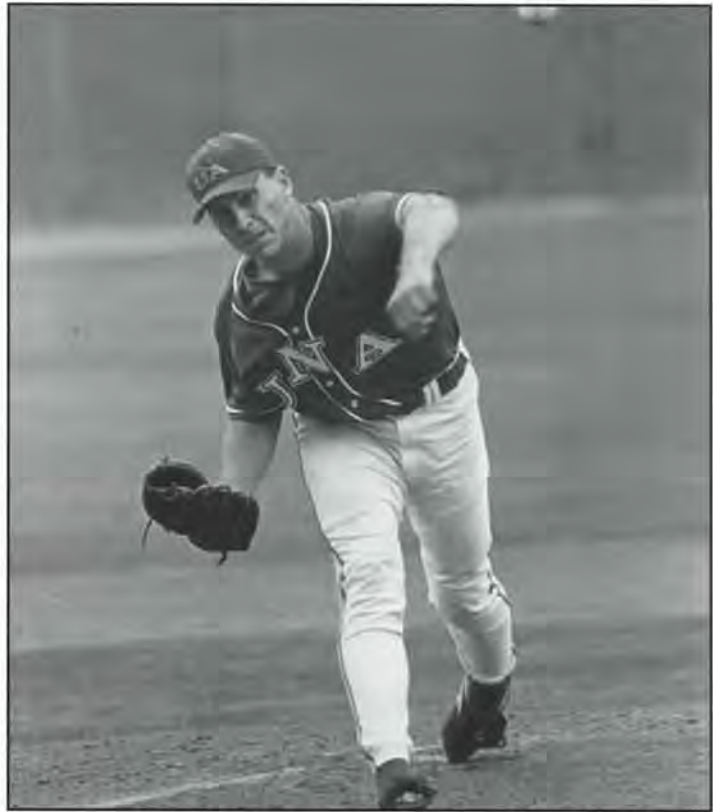

Since Mike Lane's arrival at the University of North Alabama in 1983, University Field has taken on an entirely different look, with overwhelming results.

Among the additions the UNA baseball program has seen are a new modern press-box, scoreboard, lights and grand stand - in addition to a vastly improved playing field.

And the home atmosphere of University Field has in turn proved beneficial to the Lions' play as UNA has won an incredible 80.7 percent of its games at home over the last 17 seasons. Since 1983-84, UNA has posted a 380-89-4 record at home, including a 19-4 record at University Field in 2000.

In 1999 the Lions won both the Gulf South Conference and NCAA Division II South Central Regional Tournament championships on its home field and went 32-5 at home.

The Lions have 20 or more home games in 12 of the last 14 seasons.

Those impressive records at home have been crucial in Lane's ability to turn the Lions' program into one of the most consistent winners in the country. UNA has won 634 games since Lane's arrival for an average of 37 wins per season, and the Lions have participated in the NCAA playoffs in ten of the last 17 seasons.

In 1989, UNA hosted its first NCAA baseball event and drew record crowds to University Field to watch three Gulf South Conference schools - UNA, Jacksonville State and

Delta State - battle for the regional crown. In 1995 UNA hosted its second regional, which was again an All-GSC affair with UNA, Delta State and Valdosta State, and in 1997 UNA hosted Elon and Central Oklahoma in the South Central Regional. Last season UNA hosted its fourth regional that included Alabama-Huntsville, Delta State and Southeastern Oklahoma State.

UNA struggled to go 11-7 at home in 1984 but won the first GSC baseball championship in school history on the field with a sweep of Mississippi College in the championship round.

That record has been followed by numerous impressive marks, including 12 seasons with 20 or more home wins.

Night baseball also began at University Field in 1990, and UNA went 9-1 in home night games that season, including a 6-2 win over Division I power Middle Tennessee State in the dedication game on April 5.

The Lions also have a full tarp which has prevented several rain-outs over the last five years, and the new ultra-modern scoreboard and expanded grand-stand have enhanced Lion games for the fans.

UNA baseball has come a long way in the last 17 seasons, and University Field is a reflection of those changes.

It is now among the top facilities in Division II baseball.

2000 SEASON IN REVIEW

LIONS WIN 36 AND FINISH AS GSC RUNNER-UP

With only five players returning from a team that had advanced to the NCAA Division II World Series in 1999, the University of North Alabama baseball team had a lot of questions to answer entering the 2000 season, but the Lions responded with a solid 36-16-1 record and a runner-up spot in the Gulf South Conference Tournament.

Despite the strong finish, the Lions were denied a spot in the Division II Regional Tournament, but UNA enjoyed its 17th straight winning season and won 35 games or more for the eighth straight year.

The biggest question mark for the Lions entering the 2000 season centered around a pitching staff that returned only one pitcher from the 1999 season. That pitcher, Matt Greenwood, was also hampered by arm problems, leaving the Lions with no veterans on their staff.

But, true to previous form that has placed the UNA pitching staffs annually among the best in Division II, Mike Lane molded a young staff that, despite its 5.24 ERA, finished with 13 complete games and five shutouts, and gave the high-powered UNA offense a chance to win games.

Key to that success was the emergence of juniors Duane Welch and Daniel Wren as starters, sophomore Ferenc Jongejan as a starter and reliever and freshman Josh Welborn as a starter down the stretch.

Jongejan got five decisions, including four wins, in UNA's first 13 games but became more of a factor from the bullpen as the season progressed. Welch, meanwhile, went 11-3, tying a school record for wins in a season and tying for the Gulf South Conference lead in wins. Wren went 8-3, with a team-leading 97.2 innings pitched, and Welborn went 5-3 and became a pivotal third starter for the GSC series.

Offensively, the four position players that UNA returned were formidable, with All-American shortstop Josh Willingham, All-Gulf South Conference outfielder Denny Paganelli, starting outfielder Chris Fears and starting first baseman Douglas Hargett all back.

Willingham repeated his All-American performance as a sophomore with another year, hitting .420 with 74 runs scored and 73 runs batted in.

Also key were the improvements of Fears and Hargett from their first seasons in the UNA program.

Fears hit just .275 as a junior in 1999 but jumped to .405 last season, scoring 76 runs, driving in 36 and stealing a GSC-leading 49 bases in 53 attempts. Those numbers earned Fears All-GSC, All-South Central Region and

All-America honors by the season's end.

Hargett's jump was equally impressive. He hit .270 as a freshman, but followed with a .337 average last season with 36 runs scored and 31 RBI.

Paganelli also earned All-GSC honors for a second straight year with a .315 average and 33 stolen bases.

As a team, the Lions averaged an astounding 9.8 runs per game and stole a Division II leading 205 bases. UNA hit .351 and had 178 extra-base hits, while walking 289 times and posting a .454 on-base percentage.

Overall, UNA had 10 players hit .315 or better, and six of those were newcomers to the UNA program.

Leading the way were eventual All-GSC second baseman Michael Searcy and All-GSC third baseman Corey Murks. Searcy hit .381 with nine homers and 61 RBI and Murks hit .389 with 10 homers and 62 RBI. Catchers Tharun Anderson and Patrick Jernigan were also key, hitting .361 and .320 respectively.

UNA opened the season with three straight wins at home over Bellarmine, with that second win giving Lane his 600th victory as head coach at UNA. The Lions then suffered back-to-back losses to eventual NCAA Tournament participant Abilene Christian. Wren then stepped up and fired a stellar three-hit shutout against Delta State to improve the Lions to 4-2.

A three-game road sweep of Christian Brothers in which the Lions scored 44 runs later pushed UNA to 11-4, but the Lions continued to be inconsistent and were at 13-6-1 when GSC play began with a series at Lincoln Memorial.

Once the GSC season began, UNA appeared to be a different team as the Lions pounded LMU 25-2, 7-1 and 14-1, getting three straight solid pitching performances from Wren, Welch and Jongejan, and record-setting hitting from Willingham, Fears and others.

Following a non-conference win over LeMoyne-Owen, UNA swept a GSC series against West Georgia as well, dowing the Braves 13-2, 8-0 and 12-5. In the 8-0 win, Welch pitched a no-hitter against West Georgia, marking the first time any UNA pitcher had thrown a no-hitter in a GSC game since the Lions joined the league in 1972.

Following wins over Tennessee Wesleyan, UNA had jumped to 22-6-1 and won nine straight, but those streaks would come to an abrupt stop in Huntsville.

In a battle between two teams contending for the GSC East Division lead, UAH prevailed in a rain-plagued series, winning all three games and marking just the second time in Mike Lane's tenure at UNA that the Lions had been swept in a three-game league series.

In the opener, UNA lost 13-12, rallying from six runs down in the top of the ninth to take the lead, then seeing that lead slip away on a couple of key errors.

Despite the solid pitching of Welch in game-two, UAH again overcame a 2-0 UNA lead for a 3-2 win. UAH then capped the series with a 10-5 win.

UNA rebounded with non-conference wins over Henderson State and won two-of-three from West Alabama to improve to 8-4 in the GSC. The Lions then slipped again, losing two-of-three to West Florida in a series that saw two of the three games go to extra innings.

At 9-6 in the league and getting in a precarious spot in the league standings, UNA played perhaps its best series of the season, sweeping Montevallo 7-4, 6-1 and 11-0.

The GSC Tournament spots remained in doubt entering the final weekend, but UNA managed to earn the third spot from the East Division, despite losing two-of-three to Valdosta State in the final regular-season series.

Having finished third in the East, UNA faced West Division champion Delta State in the GSC Tournament opener, and pulled off a 10-8 win that was highlighted by a grand-slam homer by Murks.

UNA followed with a 7-2 loss to Montevallo to fall into the loser's bracket, but the Lions again responded with a 10-6 win over Alabama-Huntsville, eliminating the Chargers from the tournament.

With a spot in the championship game at stake, UNA fell behind to Montevallo, then used the strength of an incredible 13-run eighth inning to take a 23-19 win over the Falcons and move into the title game for the second straight year. It was the third time in 2000 that UNA had scored 10 or more runs in an inning and it was the sixth time the Lions scored 20 or more runs.

Despite serious arm problems, Greenwood picked up wins in relief against both UAH and Montevallo.

Delta State exacted some revenge for its previous loss to UNA and for losing to the Lions in the 1999 championship game by downing the Lions 11-1.

Despite a season plagued by injuries, Greenwood finished his career with 15 saves, which equalled the school career record. Willingham also added his name several more times in the UNA record book, tying the single game records for runs in a game (5), RBI in a game (8) and hits in a game (5). He also became UNA's career hits leader with 205, and set a record for career grand slams with five.

Fears also equalled the school records for runs in a game and hits in a game, scoring five runs in a game twice in 2000. He was selected third-team All-American and Welch and Michael Searcy joined him and Willingham as first-team All-South Central Region selections.

THE GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

GSC History

Celebrating its 30th year of excellence, the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE (GSC) continues a tradition of growth and success that has brought it distinction as one of the elite conferences in Division II. With 18 active member schools in six southern states, the GSC has a broad and diverse membership committed to being the best in all aspects of the university experience. As an all-sport conference, the GSC is dedicated to the promotion and practice of honor, integrity and sportsmanship in all phases of intercollegiate athletics. With 33 Division II National Championships in eight sports, the GSC fosters success and encourages excellence in all of its student-athletes.

Originally known as the Mid-South Conference, the GSC was formed in the summer of 1970 with six members: Delta State, Florence State (now North Alabama), Jacksonville State, Livingston (now West Alabama), Tennessee-Martin and Troy State. Due to scheduling problems during the 1970-71 academic year, the only league sport was football. Jacksonville State won the league's first championship.

In 1971, Southeastern Louisiana and Nicholls joined the conference, bringing the membership to eight. The league (whose office was in Hammond, Louisiana) also changed its name to the GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE. The following year, Mississippi College and Northwestern Louisiana were admitted. Northwestern Louisiana withdrew two years later, followed by Southeastern Louisiana and Nicholls State in 1979.

The conference continued with seven teams until 1981, when the presidents voted to admit Valdosta State. West Georgia joined in 1983 as the ninth member. With the move to Division I by UT-Martin and Troy State in 1991, the GSC returned to seven member institutions.

After Troy State and UT-Martin departed, the conference embarked upon an expansion that has resulted in ten new members: Lincoln Memorial (1992-93); Alabama-Huntsville, Henderson State, Central Arkansas and Mississippi University for Women (1993-94); West Florida (1994-95); and Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech, Montevallo and Southern Arkansas (1995-96). Jacksonville State departed at the end of 1992-93. Mississippi College departed at the end of the 1995-96 academic year, dropping down to Division III. Christian Brothers University joined the conference in 1996, keeping the conference with 16 schools.

On April 14, 1999, the GSC announced the addition of Harding University and Ouachita Baptist University beginning with

the 2000-01 academic year, bringing its membership to 18 and making it the largest conference in Division II.

The GSC office was moved to its current Birmingham location by former Commissioner Jim McCullough. The current Commissioner, Nathan (Nate) N. Salant, has been in office since October, 1992. He is assisted by Information Director Michael L. Ingberg, Assistant Information Director Mike Anderson and Office Manager Mary Jean Box.

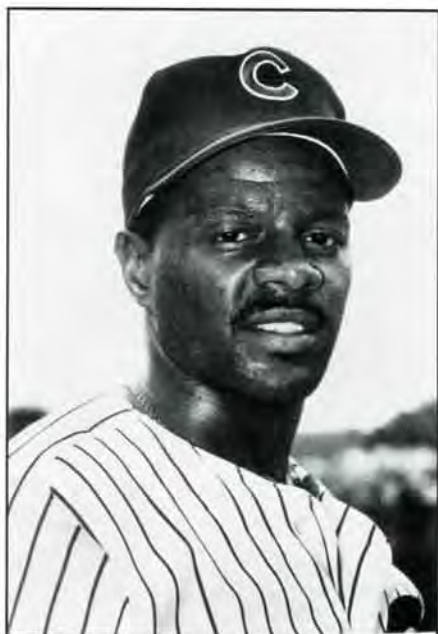

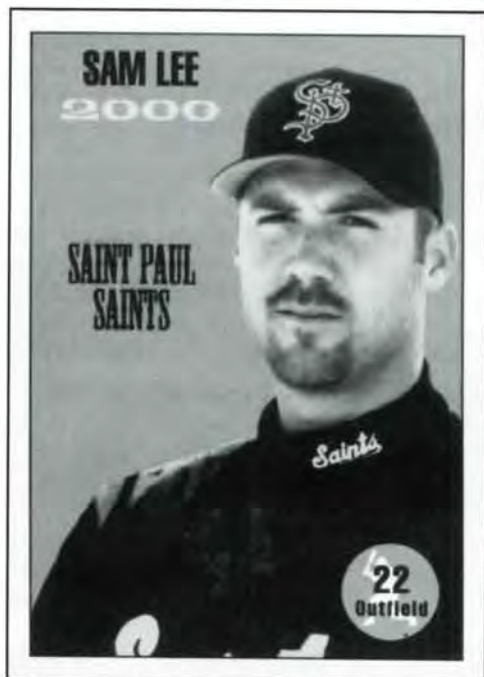

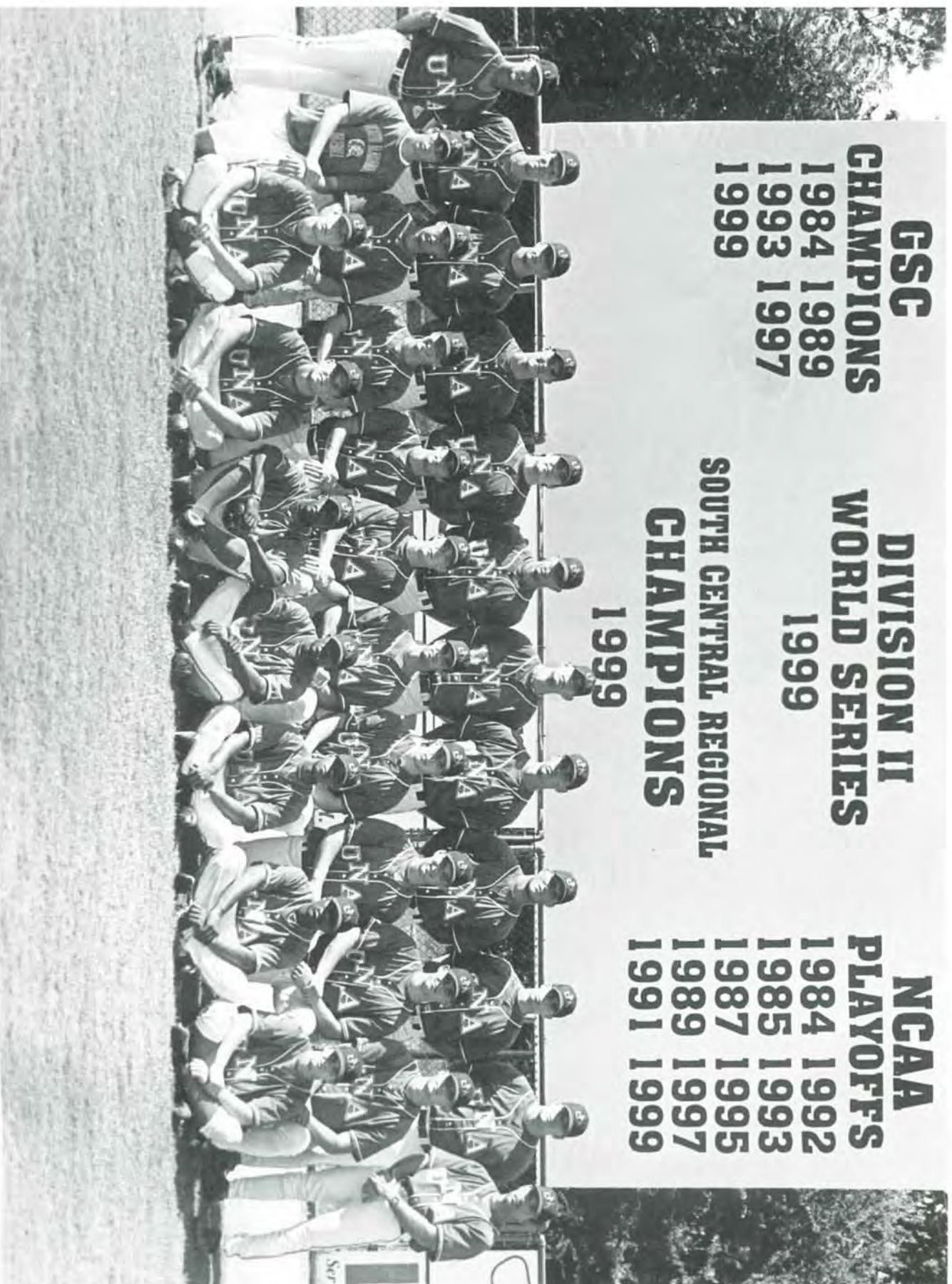
