PLAYING ON THE NATIONAL STAGE

The FCS Kickoff game with UNA against No. 20 Mercer was broadcasted on two ESPN cable networks — the first-time this has ever happened for UNA — starting on ESPN's flagship channel before shifting to ESPNU in the third guarter. 2023 North Alabama Notes - Preliminary Quick Hitters

1993 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP REUNION

* This week, UNA will honor its 1993 team that went 14-0 and won the Division II National Championship. The pregame ceremony will begin at 5:40 p.m. and the team will join the current Lions on the field after the game for the TNT Fireworks postgame presentation.

ABOUT LAST WEEK...

* The Lions earned their first road win of the season on Saturday at Tennessee Tech, using a strong defensive performance to win 20-7 over the Golden Eagles.

DEFENSIVE SHUTOUT

* The only points allowed by UNA in the 20-7 win over Tennessee Tech came on a pick-six, meaning the defense did not allow any points while on the field. This marks the first "defensive shutout" for the Lions since defeating Shorter 48-0 in 2017.

A NEAR HALF-DOZEN TURNOVERS

* UNA had three interceptions and two fumble recoveries Saturday at Tennessee Tech. The five turnovers mark the most for UNA since recording five against Charleston Southern in 2021 — tying UNA's FCS era record.

FIRST WINS OF DEARMON ERA

- * Despite being heavy underdogs against a Chattanooga team receiving votes in both major FCS polls, the Lions earned their first win under new head coach Brent Dearmon on Sept. 2, 2023 with a 41-27 victory at Braly Stadium.
- * Two weeks later, UNA celebrated the first road win under Dearmon as the Lions defeated Tennessee Tech 20-7.

ROAD WINS IN FCS ERA

* UNA now has five road wins as an FCS member, including Southern Utah (2018), Jackson State (2018), Gardner-Webb (2019), Hampton (2021) and now Tennessee Tech.

A BIT OF TRICKERY

* The only offensive touchdown in the UNA/Tennessee Tech game on Saturday was a reverse from Noah Walters to Kaden Cooper, who then tossed back to TJ Smith on the right side. Smith — the backup QB — threw across field to Walters who ran it in from 26 yards out. This marked both the first passing TD for Smith and receiving TD for Walters.

ODD STATS FOR THE QUARTERBACK

* Over the last three games, Noah Walters has completed 43-of 76 passes for 398 yards since the last time he threw a touchdown. Oddly enough, Walters has scored a rushing and recieving touchdown more recently than his last passing touchdown.

UAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- * In the first three weeks of United Athletic Conference awards, UNA has been honored twice with both an offensive and defensive player of the week.
- * Takairee Kenebrew won the first-ever offensive award for his three touchdown performance in a 41-27 win over Chattanooga.
- * Philjae Bien-Aime was named the defensive player of the week on Monday after recording two interceptions and four tackles against Tennessee Tech.

EARLY CHALLENGES

* UNA will face four opponents either ranked or receiving votes in the FCS polls in the first five games. Mercer was ranked No. 20 and No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll and Stats Perform Top 25, respectively, while Chattanooga and Tarleton State both received votes in those polls the week they faced UNA. This week, UT Martin received the most votes (96) in the Stats Perform Top 25.

OSSAI PICKS UP FUMBLES

* Senior and defensive captain Philip Ossai was in the right places at the right times on Saturday against Tennessee Tech, scooping up a pair of fumbles for two of UNA's five forced turnovers.

* With two recoveries, Philip Ossai sets the new FCS era single game record for fumble recoveries, while also tying the FCS era record for most in a season.

OSSAI HONORING RONALD MCKINNON

- * Starting this season, Coach Brent Dearmon wanted to honor UNA's tradition with reminders of the past, including a focus on the historic "Purple Swarm" defense of the mid-1990s that totaled three national championships.
- * A key player on that team was Ronald McKinnon, who went on to win the 1995 Harlon Hill trophy honoring the best player in D2 football each season. McKinnon remains the only defensive player to win the award. McKinnon went on to play linebacker for the Arizona Cardinals for nearly a decade in the late 1990s and early 2000s.
- * This fall, Coach Dearmon had McKinnon bestow the honor of wearing his #44 jersey to Philip Ossai, a senior defensive lineman and team leader.
- * Ossai previously wore #48 for UNA in honor of his brother, Joseph Ossai, who was drafted in the third round of the 2021 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals out of the University of Texas. Ossai was willing to change numbers from #48 to #44 this season to honor McKinnon and the UNA tradition.

SEAY YOU LATER

* UNA's first touchdown against Tennessee Tech came in response to a pick-six by Jacque McGowan, as UNA's A.J. Seay jumped a route and returned UNA's first interception return of the season. Before Saturday, the last pick-six for UNA came in 2019 against Charleston Southern as Jalen Dread went 62 yards.

NO PUSHOVERS

* All 10 of UNA's FCS opponents this season finished at least four wins last season with the Tech schools (Tennessee Tech, Utah Tech) turning in 4-7 records. Six of UNA's opponents finished with identical 7-4 records, while FBS opponent Florida State went 10-3 last year.

THE UNITED ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

- *The ASUN and WAC have partnered for football for the third consecutive year and have rebranded as the United Athletic Conference (UAC)
- * In 2023, the UNA football team is competing for the first time as a member of the United Athletic Conference. UNA's other 13 sports have competed in the ASUN since the Lions made the move to Division I in 2018.
- *UNA football competed as an FCS independent in 2018 before joining the Big South Conference as a football-only member in 2019. The Lions did not play as part of the Big South 2020 spring season, opting for a four-game fall schedule instead. UNA returned to the Big South in 2021. North Alabama spent the 2022 season as a member of the ASUN conference.

LIONS VS. UT MARTIN

- * UNA has a 19-12-1 all-time record against UT Martin.
- * Saturday will mark the 33rd all-time meeting between the two schools and will be the first meeting in 33 years.
- * The series began in 1949 during UNA's first season of football and went on pause in 1990 as UT Martin made the jump from D2 to FCS in 1991.
- * UNA has won the last two meetings in 1989 and 1990.
- * The last meeting was UNA's Homecoming game at Braly Stadium. The Lions won 49-0 for their fourth all-time shutout of the Skyhawks.

- * North Alabama will face four schools from the Tri-Star State this season, including Chattanooga, Tennessee Tech, UT Martin and United Athletic Conference rival Austin Peay.
- * Tennessee is the most represented state on UNA's schedule with four opponents, followed by Texas with two. Georgia, Florida, Kentucky, Arkansas and Utah each have one opponent.
- * UNA has a 67-45-2 record against the state of Tennessee

UT MARTIN IS UNA'S MOST FREQUENT FCS RIVAL

* With 32 all-time meetings, UT Martin ranks as the eighth-most frequent opponent in UNA history, but the most among current FCS members — despite not playing in 33 years.

LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY

* UNA's 53-0 win over UT Martin in 1949 is tied for the fourth largest margin of victory in school history along with a 53-0 win over West Georgia in 2008. That record stood for 54 years until UNA defeated Stillman 68-7 in 2003. The record is now at 62 as UNA defeated West Alabama 76-14 in 2005.

TOOK HIS VITAMINS AND SAID HIS PRAYERS

* The school record for field goals in a single game was set against UT Martin in 1969 by David Hogan with five. The record was later matched in 2012 by Michael Schuster and in 2018 by Chandler Carrera. Hogan also holds the record for points scored by kicking in a single game with 19.

EIGHT PICKOFFS VS. THE SKYHAWKS

* The school record for interceptions in a single game is eight, which was set against UT Martin in 1968. Don Richard had three of those interceptions, tying the single game individual record. Rod Brooks later tied this record in 1982 against UT Martin.

THE FIRST-EVER 100 YARD RETURN

* UNA's first-ever kickoff return that went 100 yards came against UT Martin in 1970, as Bobby Joe Pride took it to the house. His 100 yard record was later matched by Delvon Carpenter in 2017.

THE SECOND-LONGEST RETURN, TOO?

* In 1989, Troy Nelson retuned a kickoff for a 99 yard touchdown against UT Martin, meaning two of the three longest kickoff returns in school history are against the Skyhawks.

RUSHING AGAINST UT MARTIN

* UNA's 12th-best rushing performance in a single game came against the Skyhawks in 1969, as the Lions ran for 413 yards. Also, the ninth-longest run from scrimmage in school history came from Bennie Burns in 1974 against UT Martin, going 87 yards. That record is currently held by Parker Driggers with a 99 yard run against Robert Morris in 2021.

GETTING IN THE HOMECOMING SPIRIT

* Next week is UNA's Homecoming game against EKU, as the Lions have a 52-20-1 record all-time on Homecoming. In fact, UT Martin has been UNA's opponent on homecoming eight times. The Lions are 5-2-1 all-time against UT Martin on Homecoming.

2023 North Alabama Notes - More UT Martin and General Notes

HIGH ATTENDANCE AT BRALY

* In 1980, UNA drew a crowd of over 10,000 for the first time in program history. The three games with over 10,000 fans that season include MTSU, Alabama A&M and UT Martin.

HIGH RUSHING PERFORMANCES

- * Two of the top five individual rushing performances in school history came against UT Martin. This includes Robert Douthitt's 225 yard performance in 1960 and the same amount of yardage from Leonard Thomas nine years later in 1969.
- * This record held until 1993 when both Brian Satterfield and Tyrone Rush broke it during the first championship season at UNA. Satterfield went for 243 yards against Fort Valley State, while Rush went for 248 yards against Delta State.
- * Last season, former Lion ShunDerrick Powell broke those records with 251 yards against UVA Wise.

UNA REMAINS LAST D2 OVER FBS WIN

* UNA remains the last Division II team to beat a Division I-A (FBS) team, defeating Southwestern Louisiana (now Louisiana) on October 11, 1997 in four overtimes, 48-42.

FCS KICKOFF BROADCASTED ON ESPN

- * The FCS Kickoff last Saturday against Mercer was broadcasted on ESPN's flagship station. This marked North Alabama's first appearance on an ESPN network since 2016 when they appeared on ESPN2 in a 29-3 loss against Northwest Missouri State in the Division II National Championship Game
- * Last week was North Alabama's first game broadcasted on ESPN since 1995 in a 27-7 victory over Pittsburg State in the Divsion II National Championship Game.
- * After a weather delay in the third quarter halted play for over an hour, the game was shifted to ESPNU. This marked UNA's first time having a single game aired on two ESPN cable networks.

WHITE SCHULTZ SETS FCS KICKOFF STANDARD

* Edwin White Schultz's 14 tackles in the FCS Kickoff game against Mercer set a new record for the game. The record was previously set at 14 by Chattanooga's Tavon Lawson in 2017 and North Dakota State's Jordan Champion in 2015.

NORTH ALABAMA HAS SECOND WINNINGEST COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL PROGRAM IN ALABAMA SINCE 1990

- * The University of North Alabama ranks second only behind the University of Alabama for football success by a school from the State of Alabama since 1990.
- * UNA record over the last 33 seasons: 255-127-1
- * Most college football wins in the state of Alabama since 1990
 - 1. Alabama 297 wins
 - 2. North Alabama 255 wins
 - 3. Auburn 249 wins
 - 4. Tuskegee 248 wins

NORTH ALABAMA IN SIXTH SEASON IN FCS

- * This is North Alabama's sixth season as a member of FCS but is just the Lions' second as a full Division I member after a four-year transition period.
- * A charter member of the Gulf South Conference and the NCAA Division II, the Lions officially moved to Division I status on July 1, 2018, and began their transition in the Fall of 2018.
- * UNA produced one of the most successful football programs in the history of the Gulf South Conference and Division II, advancing to the Division II Playoffs 12 times in its final 15 seasons in the division and making 21 total playoff appearances, winning 35 post-season games and three national championships. The 21 post-season trips and 35 playoff wins rank second in DII history. * During the transition, UNA went 7-3 in 2018, 4-7 in 2019, 0-4 in COVID shortened 2020 season, and 3-8 in 2021 for a 14-22 record. *In the Lions first season as a full-fledged Division I member, they posted a 1-10 record.

- * In the 2023 home opener against Chattanooga, North Alabama debuted its new uniforms that featured...
 - Purple jerseys with white "North Alabama" text
 - Purple pants with the new Lion head patch
 - Purple helmets with the classic "stars" earned for good performances as worn in the 1990s.
 - A subtle gold trim on the jerseys
 - An adidas patch on the right side
 - The UAC logo on the left side to represent UNA's first year as a new UAC member.

BIG CROWDS

- * The last time North Alabama had over 10,000 fans at Braly Stadium came last season against Tarleton State.
- * UNA has had 49 games with a home attendance of over 10,000 dating back to 1980 against MTSU.
- * The 2013 season marked the first time UNA had three straight home games with over 10,000 fans, coming against Delta State, West Georgia and West Alabama.
- * In the first game of the Brent Dearmon Era last week, UNA had a crowd of 9,361, ranking high among home-opening crowds in program history.

LOTS OF PURPLE

* The Lions will face four opponents with purple in their color scheme this season, including Tarleton State, Tennessee Tech, ACU and Central Arkansas.

NORTH ALABAMA VS. FCS

* The Lions have an 18-35 record against teams in the FCS (formerly I-AA) Division. The first opponent at the level came in 1978, as UNA defeated Austin Peay by a 10-6 final. UNA's first loss came to East Tennessee State by a 27-7 final in Florence.

LIONS AT BRALY

- * UNA has a 276-126-8 all-time record at Braly Stadium.
- * In the Division I Era, UNA was 4-1 at home in 2018, 3-2 in 2019, 0-1 at home in a shortened 2020 season, 2-4 in 2021,1-3 last season and 1-0 this season for a 11-11 home record in Division I.

STREAKING AT BRALY

* The longest home win streak for UNA came at 28 games from September 4, 1993 to September 14, 1996.

UNA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- * Last season's game at Chattanooga was North Alabama's first game against a nationally ranked team that season, and the 10th by the Lions against a ranked Division I team since their move to Division I in 2018.
- * All-time, UNA is 0-14 against ranked FCS opponents, with the nine of those 14 games coming on the road and one coming in neutral site action against Mercer in the season opener.
- * North Alabama faced four nationally ranked FCS teams in its first 10 games in 2021 and one more in 2022. Mercer opened the 2023 the season nationally ranked in four FCS polls.
- * UNA has played 117 games against nationally-ranked opponents since 1992. The Lions are 61-55-1 in those 117 meetings with ranked opponents over the last 31 seasons.
- * UNA has played 60 of those 117 games against teams ranked in the Top 10. The Lions are 31-29 in those previous 60 games.
- * UNA has a 40-22 record at Braly Stadium against nationally-ranked teams since 1992.
- * North Alabama's first game ever against a nationally ranked FBS opponent was No. 8 BYU in 2020.

UNA VS. FCS OPPONENTS

- * UNA is 12-29 against FCS opponents since making the move to Division I in 2018.
- * UNA has gone 7-11 in its 16 home contests against FCS opponents since 2018, 5-16 on the road and 0-2 at a neutral site. * The Lions are 18-36 against FCS schools since 1978.
- * Before hosting Western Illinois in the 2019 season-opener, North Alabama had played 11 straight games against FCS opponents on the road, dating back to 1992 at Braly Stadium against Troy.

* UNA had four All-Americans on the 1993 team, including running back Tyrone Rush, linebacker Ronald McKinnon, defensive lineman Jeff Redcross and offensive guard Jeff Surbaugh.

MORE AWARDS FROM 1993

* Fifteen UNA players earned at least one Gulf South Conference accolade that season, including Cody Gross, Jarius Hayes, Keith Humphrey, Ronald McKinnon, Lee Morris, O.J. Patrick, Jeff Redcross, Tyrone Rush, Brian Satterfield, Gerald Smith, Jamie Stoddard, Jeff Surbaugh, Brad Stepp, Jon Thompson and Michael Williams. Coach Bobby Wallace was also named Kodak National Coach of the Year in 1993, on top of many other accolades.

85 RECORDS BROKEN

* In 1993, UNA tied or broke 85 Gulf South Conference records.

UNCHARTED WATERS

* UNA's 14 wins remains tied for the most in program history with the 1995 season. Prior to 1993, only three other seasons in program history brought double digit win totals, coming in 1980, 1983 and 1985 under Wayne Grubb.

CONTROL/COMMAND F

* If you search "1993" in the UNA football record book, it shows up 393 times — more than any other year. This is followed by "1995" with 371 entries and "1994" with 313 entries.

LIONS TO PLAY FIRST POWER 5 PROGRAM SINCE 1959

• In week 12 of the 2023 season the UNA football team will travel to Tallahassee to take on the Florida State Seminoles. This will be the first power five program that the Lions have had on the schedule since 1959 when the Lions fell 42-7 in Nashville to Vanderbilt.

LIONS FACING THREE SCHOOLS FOR THE FIRST TIME IN PROGRAM HISTORY

• North Alabama will be facing three opponents for the first time in school history in 2023. Mercer, Utah Tech and Florida State. The Lions will face Mercer in Montgomery, Ala. in the FCS Kickoff game to be broadcast on ESPN. UNA will meet United Athletic Conference member Utah Tech for the first time in the 2023 season in Florence on October 21. The Lions will also travel to Tallahassee to take on the Florida State Seminoles for the first time in program history, which will be the first power five opponent North Alabama has seen in over 60 years.

LIONS IN SECOND SEASON OF POSTSEASON ELIGIBILITY

• Following a four year transition period, the Lions became fully eligible for the NCAA postseason at the Division I level for all sports beginning in the 2022-23 academic year. The Lions are searching for their first Division I NCAA tournament appearance across all sports this season.

LIONS IN SEASON-OPENERS

• The Mercer game kicked off North Alabama's 75th season of collegiate football. The Lions are 42-29-4 all-time in their 75 season-opening games. UNA is 2-4 in season openers at the Division I level, defeating Southern Utah 34-30 on the road in 2018, downing Western Illinois 26-17 at home to open the 2019 season, losing 28-7 at Liberty in 2020, 49-28 at home to 17th ranked Southeastern Louisiana in 2021, 17-14 to Indiana State in 2022 and 17-7 to 20th ranked Mercer in 2023.

THATS A LOT OF PLAYS

* Last week at Tarleton State, UNA set a new school record for offensive plays with 109 total snaps. The previous record 96 plays was set in 2002 vs. Arkansas Tech and in 2010 at Glenville State.

BALANCED ATTACK

* As UNA tied its school record for offensive plays at 96 midway through the fourth quarter, the Lions had run 43 rushing plays and 43 passing plays. From there, 11 of the last 13 plays were passing.

HALF-A-THOUSAND YARDS

* North Alabama finished with 565 yards against Tarleton State on Saturday, marking the 61st time in school history that UNA's offense turned in over 500 yards in a game and just the 11th time on the road. Two of the 11 came at Tarleton State in 2013 and 2023.

THOUSANDS UPON THOUSANDS

* UNA and Tarleton combined for 1,042 yards last Saturday, marking the second straight game that the Lions and their opponent totaled over 1,000 yards combined. Furthermore, seven of UNA's last 10 games dating back to last season have seen over 950 combined yards, including five with over 1,000 yards.

BUSY DAY UNDER CENTER

* North Alabama sophomore quarterback Noah Walters completed 36-of-63 passes for 342 yards on Saturday at Tarleton State, setting the new school record for pass attempts and falling one short of the school record for completions. Both records were set by Vinnie

Saylor against Central Arkansas in 2005, who went 37-for-58. * The 342 yards set a new career high for Walters, last set against Tennessee Tech at 333 yards in 2022.

FOURTH QUARTER RALLY VS. MOCS

- * The Lions took a 21-0 lead in the first 16 minutes vs. UTC thanks to three touchdowns from Noah Walters to Takairee Kenebrew.
- * Chattanooga came back with 27 unanswered points, taking a 27-21 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter.
- * UNA tied the game with 8:49 remaining on a short touchdown run by Jalyn Daniels, then took the lead with an acrobatic catch in the end zone by Dakota Warfield. Chattanooga stalled on 4th and short with just under 2:00 remaning, allowing Jalyn Daniels to seal the deal with an 81 yard deal-sealing touchdown.

BIG DAY FOR EDWIN WHITE SCHULTZ

* Redshirt sophomore safety Edwin White Schultz — a transfer from Kansas — recorded 14 tackles in his UNA debut, including nine solo tackles, a tackle for loss and a forced fumble. Last season at Kansas, he had just two tackles in three games.

FIRST EVER UAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- * The United Athletic Conference (UAC) announced the first-ever players of the week in league history, naming North Alabama redshirt senior Takairee Kenebrew as the Offensive POTW.
- * Kenebrew caught five passes for 172 yards and three touchdowns in Week 1 against Chattanooga.
- * The sixth-year senior also received national recognition for his performance, including a Stats Perform FCS National Offensive Player of the Week honorable mention and a spot on the Pro Football Focus (PFF) Week 1 National Team of the Week. Kenebrew was the only FCS player on the PFF team of the week, as the rest were Power 5 or FBS players.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS VS. CHATTANOOGA

- * Coach Brent Dearmon describes his offense as one built on explosive plays, rather than three yards and a cloud of dust. This was on display last week against Chattanooga as 13 plays went for 15 yards or longer.
- * Four of the six touchdowns scored by UNA were explosive plays, including all three touchdown catches by Takairee Kenebrew that went for 25 yards, 59 yards and 21 yards.
- * Jalyn Daniels had an 81 yard run for the final score of last week's win, ranking as the 12th longest run in school history and the third longest in the FCS era behind Parker Driggers (99 yards against Robert Morris in 2021) and Terence Humphrey (88 yards against Presbyterian in 2019).

MATCHING HIS OWN RECORD

* The three touchdowns by Takairee "TK" Kenebrew not only matched his single game personal record for TDs set three times prior, but also matches the UNA record by an individual since moving to the FCS level six seasons ago. He also ranks atop the nation in both total touchdowns and receiving touchdowns, while his 172 yards led the nation for the week.

MOVING UP THE CAREER RECORD BOOKS

- * On a career note, Takairee Kenebrew sits fourth on the all-time touchdown reception list, joining former UNA Lion and 1955 NFL MVP Harlon Hill with 19 career TD receptions. One more would put Kenebrew in a tie for third with three-time national champion Michael Edwards at 20, who played from 1993-96.
- * Prior to this season, Kenebrew was tied with former teammate Dexter Boykin for fifth on the career list at 16 touchdowns. Boykin played at UNA from 2018-2021.
- * The record is currently held by Dre Hall with 25 touchdown catches from 2014-17.
- * Behind Dre Hall in second is Jason Messing with 23 catches from 2004-2007.

A TOUGH ENDING TO A PROMISING SEASON

- * In the Tarleton State game, sophomore running back Jalyn Daniels suffered a lower body injury that will likely sideline him the rest of the season. Daniels leds the team with 223 rushing yards on 16 attempts and three touchdowns.
- * With 13.9 yards per carry, Daniels was perhaps on pace to set the new school record for season rushing average set at 8.0 by Kenyatta Jones in 1993.

TURNOVERS PRODUCED WEEKLY

- * One week after Edwin White Schultz forced the first fumble of the season in the opener against Mercer, linebacker Shaun Myers intercepted a tipped pass for the first pick of the season against Chattanooga.
- * In the third game of the season at Tarleton, Memphis transfer Rush Lansdell intercepted a pass in the first half.
- * In addition to Lansdell's interception, UNA forced another key redzone turnover as KJ Trujillo recovered his own forced fumble at the three yard line near the end of the third quarter.
- * The turnover party continued into Tennessee Tech as the Lions went from five to 10 on the year.
- * UNA scored all 20 points off turnovers at Tennessee Tech.

2023 North Alabama Notes - Previous Weeks and Other Notes

SHORT DRIVES

* Last season, the Lions had 12 scoring drives that went at least four minutes long. In 12 scoring drives already this season, the Lions have yet to go beyond four minutes on a drive.

HOWEVER MANY IT TAKES

* In 12 scoring drives this season, UNA has used anywhere from 1-10 plays with the exception of a seven play drive.

GOING FOR IT OFTEN

* UNA leads the nation in fourth down attempts, going for it 14 times. The Lions have been successful seven of those 14 times. The second-most attempts this season is 11 by Monmouth.

MUSICAL PUNTER

* Freshman punter Adam Watford is averaging 44.8 yards per punt to rank eighth in all of FCS. On Friday before the season opener, Watford - a talented pianist - was spotted at the grand piano in the Renaissance Montgomery Hotel playing various classical hits for his teammates before dinner.

WEIRD WEATHER

* UNA's season opener at the FCS Kickoff in Montgomery, Ala. hit a snag in the third quarter, as the game was delayed for over an hour due to lightning detected in the area. The delay started with 11:59 remaining in the third quarter, as UNA was in the middle of a seven-play, 30-yard offensive drive that moved the ball from its own 18 to its own 48.

STARTING BACK WITH A FLASH

* After the 75 minute weather delay at the Cramton Bowl, UNA's Jalyn Daniels broke off a 30 yard run to put UNA near the red zone. The Lions went on to run 16 plays on the long drive, but it ended with a momentum-changing field goal block by Mercer.

LAST WEATHER DELAY

* Prior to Saturday at the Cramton Bowl, the last time UNA had an extended weather delay was on Sept. 22, 2018 against Azusa Pacific — UNA's first home football game in Division I history. The Lions won that game by a 37-35 final.

ANOTHER NOTABLE WEATHER DELAY

* Another notable weather delay came on Sept. 24, 1988 against Delta State in Cleveland, Miss. The game was stopped multiple times for tornado warnings, but ended in a 27-24 road win for the Lions and the first win under new head coach Bobby Wallace.

QUARTERBACK BATTLE SOLVED?

* Coach Dearmon used both Noah Walters and TJ Smith at the quarterback position against Mercer, calling the season opener "an extension of fall camp" of sorts. Noah Walters led the passing game by going 10-for-17 through the air for 65 yards. TJ Smith finished 2-for-7 for 27 yards. The duo combined for 46 rushing yards and a score. Since then, Walters has taken all but two snaps over the last two weeks against UTC and Tarleton.

CATCHING ALL OF HIS TARGETS

* Redshirt junior Kobe Warden — a local product from Brooks High School in Killen — led the receiving corps with six catches for 37 yards against Mercer, including 15 yards after catch. Warden caught all six of his targets with a long of 14 yards.

A CLEAN SHEET

* UNA won the turnover battle against both Mercer and UTC as the Lions did not commit any turnovers. Meanwhile, the Lions recovered a muffed punt and later forced a fumble while Mercer was inside the five yard line, while also coming up with a pair of turnovers against Chattanooga.

A TIMELY TURNOVER

* Edwin White Schultz forced the only fumble of the game against Mercer and did so at a perfect time. Mercer was three yards away from scoring until White Schultz forced the ball out and a host of Lions jumped on it to prevent the score. Redshirt junior Rush Lansdell was credited with the recovery.

A PERFECT MATCH

* The Lions and Bears had the exact same total of offensive yards in the first half of the FCS Kickoff. The Lions had a 54-53 yard advantage in passing, while the Bears had a 98-97 yard advantage in rushing for 151 total yards each way.

TOUGH ENDINGS

* The Lions had three consecutive drives that went at least eight plays and 42 yards against Mercer but resulted in two loss of downs and a blocked field goal. The latter of those drives ended in a 16-play, 74-yard drive near the goal line to start the third quarter.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

- * The Week 0 FCS Kickoff marked the first game in the history of the United Athletic Conference (UAC). The Lions also own rights to the first-ever touchdown scored in the league's history a three-yard touchdown run by TJ Smith.
- * This Saturday against Tarleton State, UNA will participate in the first-ever conference game between two UAC schools.

SECOND TIME WITH DUPLICATE NUMBERS

* This season marks just the third time in the 75-year history of the UNA football program that the Lions are wearing duplicate numbers. The only duplicate numbers being used by the Lions this season are 0-9.

WALTERS TAKES QUARTERBACK ROLE AS ROOKIE

- * Sophomore quarterback Noah Walters of Lincoln, Neb. got a win in his first collegiate start on Sept. 10, 2022 at home against Virginia-Wise. It was just his second collegiate game overall.
- * The 2021 state of Nebraska Gatorade Player of the Year, Walters rallied the Lions in the fourth quarter to tie the game at Indiana State and force overtime in UNA's season opener.
- * Against UVA-Wise, he was 7-for-21 for 96 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 33 yards on seven carries.
- * The last true freshman to start at quarterback for the Lions was Luke Wingo on Oct. 18, 2012 in a road game at West Georgia.
- * Walters has already thrown one of the longest touchdown passes in school history with a 78-yarder to Demarcus Lacey against Tarleton State. It was the longest pass and touchdown pass of UNA's FCS era surpassing a 76-yarder from Rett Files to Takairee Kenebrew in 2021 against Charleston Southern.
- * At Kennesaw State, he threw three touchdown passes to Takairee Kenebrew from 62, 60 and 31 yards.
- * He had back-to-back 300+ yard passing games against Kennesaw State and Jacksonville State.
- * He followed with 215 yards and three touchdown passes at Eastern Kentucky, and also ran for a TD.
- * He threw for 333 yards and two touchdowns against Tennessee Tech.

* UNA quarterback Noah Walters was among 25 players nationally on the Watch List for the 2022 Jerry Rice Award as the FCS Freshman of the Year.

WALTERS HAS LED FOUR 4TH QUARTER RALLIES

- * Although he only played in 11 collegiate football games as a rookie, UNA quarterback Noah Walters led four game-tying or lead changing drives in the final four minutes of three different games.
- * He rallied the Lions in the fourth quarter to tie the game at Indiana State and force overtime in UNA's season opener, hitting Corson Swan with a 10-yard touchdown pass with 48 seconds left in regulation
- * At Kennesaw State, he led a six-play, 60-yard drive to setup a Sam Contorno field goal to take a 20-17 lead with 11:38 left in the game. He then led a four-play, 71-yard drive that culminated with a 60-yard TD pass to Takairee Kenebrew with 3:43 left in the game to give UNA a 27-20 lead.
- * At Eastern Kentucky, Walters led a five-play, 79-yard drive and hit Kenebrew with a 20-yard TD pass to give UNA a 53-49 lead with just 1:13 left in the game.
- * That experience paid off in 2023 as a sophomore, as Walters connected with Dakota Warfield with 6:17 to go to take the lead and ultimately defeat Chattanooga by a score of 41-27.

WALTERS TOP FRESHMAN PASSER AT UNA

* Walters has already surpassed the passing marks set by previous Lions who earned a starting spot as a freshman.
* The last freshman to start at quarterback at UNA was Luke Wingo in 2012. He started the last three games of the 2012 season.

- * Sophomore running back / receiver Demarcus Lacey showed big play potential last season. Lacey broke a 43-yard run on a handoff against Virginia-Wise, then outraced the Tarleton State secondary on a 78-yard touchdown reception against the Texans. It is the longest pass play of UNA's FCS era.
- * Lacey averaged 17.3 yards per pass reception and 6.3 yards per carry.

- North Alabama is in its 75th season of football, following the reviving of the sport at the school in 1949. UNA has an overall record of 481-300-16.

* The Lions 56-53 loss at Eastern Kentucky set a school record for most combined points in a UNA game with 109. The previous mark was 90 in a 1997 win at Louisiana (48-42), a 2005 win against West Alabama (76-14) and a 2015 win over North Carolina-Pembroke (62-28).

PARKER DRIGGERS MADE RECORD-BREAKING RUN

- * UNA junior (then redshirt freshman) Parker Driggers of Brantley, Ala., made a record-breaking run in the second quarter of the Lions 42-31 win over Robert Morris on October 16, 2021 at Braly Stadium. With the Lions backed up to their own one-yard line, Driggers took a handoff, bounced to right side and went 99 yards to the end zone.
- * With 99 yards as the maximum distance for any running or pass play in collegiate football, Driggers run obviously would equal any previous record, but no one in school or conference play had ever run that far.
- * The previous UNA record was 97 yards by Brian Satterfield against Fort Valley State in the 1993 season opener at Braly Stadium
- * The previous Big South Conference record was 96 yards by Nari Gaither of Gardner-Webb last spring.
- * Driggers run did not set or tie an FCS record, however. David Worlock, Director of Media and Statistics at the NCAA, provided the following policy information: A reclassifying school cannot be considered for statistical records (game, season or career) in a division until it is a full-fledged member of that division. Although reclassifying schools do not qualify for statistical records in their old or new divisions, they can qualify for "Collegiate Records" since they still are active NCAA members. Individuals or schools that qualify in this situation will be indicated as reclassifying in the records. For individual career records, only the years in which a school is a full-fledged member of a division will count toward career records of that division. So . . . Driggers did tie an NCAA Collegiate Record as well.

PARKER DRIGGERS EARNED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

* Parker Driggers earned Big South Conference Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance against Robert Morris on October 16, 2021. Driggers had 255 all-purpose yards 145 yards rushing, 14 receiving and 96 on kickoff returns. He also scored three touchdowns and set UNA and Big South Conference records and tied the NCAA Collegiate Record for the longest run from scrimmage ever at 99 yards.

DRIGGERS SETS SCHOOL FCS MARKS IN 2021

- * UNA's Parker Driggers of Brantley, Ala., recorded 255 all-purpose yards in the Lions 42-31 win over Robert Morris on October 16, 2021, marking the most all-purpose yardage by any Lion in the school's FCS era. Driggers had 145 yards rushing, 14 receiving and 96 on kickoff returns.
- * Driggers also scored three touchdowns against Robert Morris, which are the most total TDs and rushing TDs by a Lion on the FCS level.

AMAURI FLOYD CONNECTION

* Incoming junior linebacker Amauri Floyd - a transfer from Robert Morris - was on the starting defense for Robert Morris when Parker Driggers went for 99 yards in the UNA / RMU game in 2021. Now, Morris joins the Purple Swarm defense as a starting linebacker and finished his UNA debut with six tackles and had 10 in his home debut against Chattanooga.

Today's UNA Football Notebook spotlight shines on the quarterback position.

UNA has eight quarterbacks listed on this year's roster, including five players entering a freshman or redshirt freshman season. On the flip side, the Lions have three upperclassmen including returners Ben Harris and Noah Walters, as well as redshirt junior transfer TJ Smith.

Walters played in all 11 games last season, completing 151 of 285 passes for 2,149 yards and 19 touchdowns as a freshman. Harris, a transfer from the University of Oklahoma, appeared in three games for the Lions in 2022.

Prior to UNA and FAU, Smith spent his freshman season at Upper Iowa where he completed 12-of-34 passes for 266 yards and one touchdown over two games. He is a former Riddell Florida Player of the Year out of McArthur High School.

Three quarterbacks on the roster come from within the state, including returning redshirt freshman Brayson Edwards out of Sylacauga. He is joined by true freshmen Carson Creehan from Madison Academy and Cade Golden out of Thompson High School.

Colton Shaffer, a Summertown, Tenn. native, enters his first season at UNA after spending the 2022 season at Middle Tennessee State. Another quarterback on the roster, true freshman Isaiah Tate, also comes from the Tri-Star State after a stellar career at Germantown High School near Memphis.

This group will be coached by former SEC quarterback Jake Bentley, who threw for over 10,000 yards and 78 touchdowns in his collegiate career with stops at South Carolina, Utah and South Alabama. Bentley completed the 2022 season at Florida Atlantic as an offensive graduate assistant with Coach Brent Dearmon.

The running back room currently has seven players, one of which is sophomore Demarcus Lacey who is transitioning over from the wide receiver position.

Lacey had 34 rushing attempts for 215 yards and a touchdown, while catching 19 passes for 316 yards and seven scores.

FLORENCE, Ala. (August 12, 2023) – 'The Purple Swarm' currently lists 18 players on the defensive front, including nine returners from last season. Among the returners are two statistical leaders for the Lions last season, one of which is junior Kam'ron Green who led UNA with four sacks and ranked second with 5.5 tackles for loss. Green transferred to UNA last season from UCF.

Additionally, the Lions bring back senior Philip Ossai, who led the team with 7.5 TFLs while adding a pair of sacks. Ossai, who wore No. 48 last season in honor of his family ties to the NFL, will make the jersey swap to No. 44 to honor 1995 Harlon Hill winner Ronald McKinnon.

"I've been getting a lot of love from the community," said Ossai. "I'm excited to take on this mantle for the team. I want to honor the legacy of my family but also honor the legacy of Ronald McKinnon. I talked to him briefly and he's a great guy who did everything the right way to get to where he is right now. I feel that I'm trending in the right direction."

Perhaps the most experienced player in the room is redshirt junior Tyler Antkowiak, a Trussville, Ala. native who has played in each of the last 24 games for UNA over three seasons.

The group is coached by Thomas Johnston, who joined the staff last December after coaching at Alabaster (Ala.) High School. Johnston lettered three seasons at UAB as a linebacker, earning freshman all-conference honors in 2017 and winning a Conference USA championship the following season.

North Alabama Has Claimed Seven National Championships:

The University North Alabama athletic program has won seven NCAA Division II National Championships with three in football (1993, 1994, 1995), two in men's basketball (1979, 1991), one in women's volleyball (2003) and one in softball (2016).

UNA is One of Just Five Schools With at Least Two Basketball and Two Football Titles:

North Alabama is one of just five schools in NCAA history on all levels to have won at least two National Championships in football and men's basketball. The others are Florida, Michigan State, Northwest Missouri State and Wisconsin-Whitewater.

Two National Player of the Year Awards Named for Former UNA Athletes:

The Division II National Player of the Year Awards in two sports are named for former North Alabama student-athletes: The Josh Willingham Award in baseball and the Harlon Hill Trophy in football.

FOOTBALL

North Alabama has Second Winningest Collegiate Football Program in Alabama Since 1990:

The University of North Alabama ranks second only behind the University of Alabama for football success by a school from the State of Alabama since 1990. Over the last 33 seasons, North Alabama has a combined 253-125-1 record in football, second behind Alabama's 292 wins over the same period. Tuskegee and Auburn are tied for third with 245.

North Alabama was First NCAA Scholarship Football Team to Win Three Straight National Titles:

With three straight NCAA Division II Football National Championships from 1993-95, North Alabama became the first school in the history of NCAA scholarship football to win three consecutive football national titles. The only other schools to match that feat since have been FCS members Appalachian State (2005-07) and North Dakota State (2011-15).

UNA was First Collegiate Football Team to Win 40 Games in Three Years:

North Alabama was the first college football program in NCAA history to win as many as 40 games in just three seasons when the Lions went 41-1 from 1993-95. The only loss during that three-year span was 17-10 on the road at Youngstown State in 1994. Youngstown State went on to win the FCS football national championship that season.

North Alabama was First Integrated Collegiate Football Team in Alabama

On September 21, 1968, the University of North Alabama, then known as Florence State University, became the first predominantly white college in the state of Alabama to play an African American player in a collegiate football game. Freshmen Leonard "Rabbit" Thomas of Huntsville, Ala., and Bobby Joe Pride of Decatur, Ala., played in the Lions'



season-opening game against Central Arkansas on September 21, 1968, breaking the color barrier in the state. The duo not only played in every game that season but both went on to distinguished careers as four-year lettermen for the Lions and both are members of the UNA Athletic Hall of Fame. As far as other predominantly white institutions in the state of Alabama, West Alabama, Jacksonville State and Samford played their first African American football players in 1969. Auburn followed in 1970, Alabama and Troy in 1971. Alabama had five African American students walk-on on its football team in the spring of 1967 but none of them played in a game.

Five Former Lions Have Played in the Super Bowl:

Five former North Alabama Lions went on to play in the Super Bowl during their careers in the National Football League. The first was receiver Robert Steele who played as a backup with the Dallas Cowboys in Super Bowl XIII. A pair of former Lions were in the same secondary in Super Bowl XXIV as Lewis Billups and Daryl Smith were teammates on the Cincinnati Bengals. Wide receiver Stevie Hobbs was a team captain and special teams starter on the Washington Redskins in Super Bowl XXVI and defensive tackle Shawn Lee was a starting defensive lineman for the San Diego Chargers in Super Bowl XXIX. Hobbs is the only former Lion on the winning team in the Super Bowl as Washington defeated the Buffalo Bills 37-24.

Lions Reached NCAA Football Playoffs in 12 of Last 15 Seasons:

The University of North Alabama football program advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 12 of the Lions' last 15 seasons in Division II (2003, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016)

UNA's 21 All-time Football Playoff Appearances Rank Second in Division II History:

The University of North Alabama football program advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs 21 times between 1980 and 2016. It is the second most appearances in the history of the Division II playoffs by current or former members. The Lions 35 all-time playoff wins also rank second in DII history.


North Alabama's Ronald McKinnon was Inducted into College Football Hall of Fame:

Former University of North Alabama All-American linebacker Ronald McKinnon (1992-95) was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in July of 2008. His class included such notables as Joe Paterno and Doug Flutie. A three-time consensus All-American on three national championship teams, McKinnon is the only defensive player to ever be selected as the Harlon Hill Trophy winner as Division II player of the year. He went on to a 10-year NFL career where he recorded more than 1,000 tackles.

Spirit Hill

Spirit Hill is the location for UNA's pre-game tailgate parties throughout the fall. Thousands of Lion fans cover the hill, adjacent to Braly Stadium, prior to every UNA home football game. Campus organizations, alumni groups and others reserve spots on the hill, and there are also places for children's activities. Two hours prior to kickoff the UNA football players pass through on their Lion Walk into the stadium.

Lion Walk

Members of the UNA football team walk through the Spirit Hill tailgate area two hours and 15 minutes prior to all Lion home games at Braly Stadium to meet and greet fans and family members.

Pride Rock

The University of North Alabama's Pride Rock tradition at Braly Stadium began in 1994, with the rock making its first appearance at a Lion football game on Sept. 10 at Braly Stadium against Alabama A&M.

Pride Rock is a 60-pound, engraved granite stone with an actual paw print from Leo, UNA's live lion mascot. The rock is used as a motivational tool for the Lion players. It is placed just behind the north end zone at all Lion by

the north end zone at all Lion home games and the players file past and touch the rock on their way to the field. It serves as a reminder to the current Lion players of the proud tradition that has been established at the school and of all the former players who have played a part in building that tradition. It also symbolizes the pride and unity of the team and the university.

UNA sports information director Jeff Hodges originated the idea of the Pride Rock after the home of the Pride of Lions in the movie the Lion King.

Leo's former trustee, Joe Wallace, designed the rock, and it was crafted and donated to the


university by Richard Beckman of Florence Marble Works.

Webster's Ninth New Collegiate Dictionary defines pride as, 1: The quality or state of being proud; a: delight or elation arising from some act, possession, or relationship; 2: a source of pride: the best in a group or class; 3: a company of lions.

Victory Flame

The victory flame returned to the UNA campus in 1995 through the efforts of the UNA National Alumni Association. An important University symbol, the Victory Flame burned on the UNA campus from 1962 to 1986 but was extinguished with the building of the Guillot University Center. The new Victory Flame and Victory Garden stand between Bibb Graves Hall and the Memorial Amphitheater, directly across the street from the flame's former site. The flame is lit following every Lion victory or significant event in the life of the University. A miniature replica of the Victory Flame also stands atop the Lion football dressing room at Braly Stadium and is lit on game days.
