2011-12 TAR HEEL BASKETBALL CAROLINA

TAR HEELS WILL FACE WOLFPACK IN ACC SEMIFINAL

◆ Top-seeded North Carolina (28-4, 14-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) beat eighth-seeded Maryland 85-69 in Friday's ACC Tournament quarterfinals in Atlanta and will face fifth-seeded NC State (22-11, 9-7) on Saturday in a semifinal at 1 p.m. at Phillips Arena. The winner will advance to Sunday's championship game.

◆ The Wolfpack reached Saturday's game with a 67-64 win over fourth-seeded Virginia in Friday's quarterfinals. NC State also beat Boston College in Thursday's first round.

◆ The Tar Heels, who have won eight games in a row, swept the season series from the Wolfpack in 2011-12, winning 74-55 in Chapel Hill on Jan. 26 and 86-74 on Feb. 21 in Raleigh. UNC has beaten NC State in each of the last 12 meetings between the schools.

◆ The Tar Heels will be playing in the semifinals for the seventh time in eight years and the 45th time in 59 ACC Tournaments. The Tar Heels are 30-14 in the semifinals.

◆ The ACC Network will televise the game regionally, with Tim Brant (play-by-play), Mike Gminski (analyst) and Debbie Antonelli (reporter) on the call. ESPN will televise the game nationally with Dan Shulman (play-by-play) and Fran Fraschilla (analyst) calling the action.

◆ UNC is the No. 1 seed at the ACC Tournament for the 24th time and is 46-13 as the top seed, winning 10 titles (including 2007 and 2008 under Roy Williams).

◆ UNC is ranked No. 4 in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today coaches polls this week.

MARSHALL BREAKS ACC SINGLE-SEASON ASSIST RECORD

◆ Sophomore point guard Kendall Marshall had 12 assists in the win over Maryland on Friday and has 311 assists this season, a new ACC and UNC single-season record.

◆ On Friday, Marshall eclipsed the previous ACC record of 303, set by Craig Neal of Georgia Tech in 1987-88.

THE SERIES VS. THE WOLFPACK

- ◆ The Tar Heels lead the all-time series with NC State, 146-75.
- ◆ Carolina is 11-4 against NC State in ACC Tournament games. Saturday's game will be the first ACC Tournament meeting between the two schools since an 89-80 Tar Heel win in the 2007 championship game in Tampa, Fla.
- ◆ UNC has beaten NCSU in the last three ACC Tournament meetings between the schools (1997 final, 1998 quarterfinal, 2007 final).
- ◆ Carolina has beaten the Wolfpack the last 12 times the teams have met and in 18 of the last 19 meetings in the series (with 14 of those 18 wins coming by double figures).
- ◆ UNC's current 12-game winning streak over NCSU is its longest winning streak against the Wolfpack, surpassing an 11-game streak from Feb. 10, 1934, to Feb. 22, 1938.
- ◆ The Tar Heels have won 35 of their last 43 games against the Wolfpack.
- ◆ UNC's 12-game winning streak against NC State is tied as the longest in the ACC era against a Big Four opponent. The Tar Heels also had a 12-game streak against Wake Forest from 1982-87.
- ◆ Since 1998, a ranked Carolina team has lost just once to an unranked NC State team, a stretch of 19 such meetings.
- ◆ Since the Tar Heels lost in Raleigh on Feb. 3, 2007, Carolina is 12-0 vs. NC State with an average margin of victory of 15.8 points per meeting.
- ◆ Williams is 23-1 as a head coach against NC State, including a 5-0 record at Kansas and an 18-1 mark at Carolina. Under Williams, UNC swept the season series from the Wolfpack in 2003-04, 2004-05, 2005-06, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12 and took two of three meetings in 2006-07 (splitting in the regular season and beating the Wolfpack in the ACC Tournament title game).

THIS SEASON IN CHAPEL HILL

- ◆ **Tyler Zeller** had 21 points and a career-high 17 rebounds as Carolina beat NC State for the 11th consecutive time and the 17th time in 18 meetings under head coach **Roy Williams** on Jan. 26 in Chapel Hill.
- ◆ Carolina held NC State to season lows in points (55, previous 60) and field goal percentage (36.8, previous 37.0). The Wolfpack shot 25.0 percent in the first half. NC State hit 9 of 20 three-point attempts (banking in four of those nine and making an 85-footer at the buzzer ending the first half). NC State made just 12 two-point baskets in the game.
- ◆ UNC won the rebounding battle, 48-26, and shot 48.4 percent from the floor.
- ◆ Carolina closed the first half on a 20-9 run to break open a close game and lead 37-23 at the break.
- ◆ **Kendall Marshall** had 11 assists, the eighth time this year he has 10 or more assists and the 14th time in his career. He has 422 assists as a Tar Heel, passing Walter Davis (409) for 13th place at UNC.
- ◆ **Reggie Bullock** made his first career start and responded with 11 points and five rebounds in a career-high 33 minutes (his previous high was 26 minutes at Virginia Tech on Jan.19).
- ◆ Bullock scored in double figures for the first time since Jan. 1 when he had 11 against Monmouth and hit three three-pointers for the first time since the Long Beach game on Dec. 10.
- ◆ **John Henson** had nine points and 10 rebounds while blocking five shots, the 17th time in his career he has blocked five or more shots in a game.
- ◆ **Desmond Hubert** grabbed five rebounds in 13 minutes.
- ◆ **Stilman White** had three points, one assist and no turnovers in five minutes. He had not scored in the previous four ACC games.

LAST MONTH IN RALEIGH

- ◆ **Kendall Marshall** scored a career-high 22 points, hit a career-high four three pointers and dished out 13 assists with zero turnovers to lead Carolina to an 86-74 win over NC State on Feb. 21 at the RBC Center in Raleigh. It was the first game in his career when Marshall led the Tar Heels in scoring.
- ◆ Marshall had combined for 14 points in his previous three ACC games and entered the game 6 for 25 from three-point range against ACC opponents. ESPN research after the game showed that no NCAA Division I player in at least 16 years has had 22 points, 13 assists and zero turnovers in a game.
- ◆ It was the fourth time a Tar Heel posted a game with at least 13 assists without a turnover. Kenny Smith did it twice (13 and 0 vs. Oral Roberts on Dec. 8, 1984, and 13 and 0 vs. UCLA on Nov. 24, 1985) and Jeff Lebo did it once (13 and 0 on Dec. 27, 1985, vs. Manhattan).
- ◆ It was the 36th game in UNC history that a player had 13 or more assists but only the fifth time that the same Tar Heel scored at least 20 points – and it is the only time a player scored at least 20 points, had at least 13 assists and committed zero turnovers.
- ◆ Marshall made a career-high seven field goals (previous best was five) in eight attempts and hit a career-high four three-pointers (previous best was two) in five attempts. The 13 assists were the most in Marshall's career without a turnover. His previous best was nine assists and no turnovers against Virginia Tech last season.
- ◆ Marshall's 13 assists give him 12 double-figure assist games this season, tying Ed Cota (1997-98) for the most in one season in UNC history. Marshall now has 18 double-figure assist games in his career, tying Raymond Felton for the second-most in UNC history (Cota had 32).
- ◆ **Harrison Barnes** scored 20 points for Carolina, his 12th 20-point game this season and his fourth in the last five games.
- ◆ **Tyler Zeller** scored 12 of his 14 points in the second half, finishing with 14 points, eight rebounds and four blocked shots, hitting all eight of his free throw attempts.
- ◆ **Reggie Bullock** scored 11 points (his third straight game in double figures) and hit three three-pointers. Bullock is 8 of 16 from three-point range in the last three games.
- ◆ Carolina shot 54.5 percent from the floor in the second half and 50.9 percent from the floor for the game.
- ◆ The Tar Heels committed only nine turnovers.
- ◆ Carolina scored just eight second-chance points (thanks in part to better shooting) its fewest since scoring seven against Long Beach State on Dec. 10th.
- ◆ **John Henson** had 14 points and 13 rebounds for his ACC-leading 14th double-double this season (and 33rd career).

◆ The Tar Heels shot 10 of 19 from three-point range in the game. The 10 three-pointers were the most since in seven games since UNC made 10 of 16 against Georgia Tech on Jan. 29.

◆ UNC's three-point percentage of .526 was its best since hitting 11 of 18 (.611) at Kentucky on Dec. 3.

◆ All five Carolina starters scored in double figures for the first time this season.

◆ The Tar Heels built a double-digit lead before the first official media timeout and led 19-5 after a Bullock three-pointer at the 14:29 mark. NC State stormed back and tied the score at 30-30 with 7:23 to play in the first half.

◆ Carolina beat NC State for the 12th time in a row, the 18th time in the last 19 meetings (with 14 of those 18 wins coming by double digits) and the 35th time in the last 43 meetings.

◆ UNC has won 13 of its last 16 games in Raleigh against NC State.

TAR HEELS GETTING DEFENSIVE

◆ Carolina is playing perhaps its best defense of the season lately, a key to the Tar Heels' run to the ACC regular season championship and the ACC Tournament semifinals.

◆ UNC opponents are shooting 38.6 percent from the floor this season, tying the 1997-98 team with the best opponent field goal percentage by Carolina since 1961 (also 38.6).

◆ In the last eight games, no opponent has shot better than 41.4 percent against Carolina (NC State on Feb. 21).

◆ No team has shot 50 percent against Carolina this season.

HENSON INJURES LEFT WRIST VS. MARYLAND

◆ Junior forward **John Henson** suffered a left wrist injury in the first half on Friday against Maryland and was limited to just seven minutes against the Terrapins.

◆ He had x-rays taken at the arena at halftime, which were negative. He was unable to return to the game because of soreness. Henson's status for Saturday's game likely will be determined prior to gametime.

TAR HEELS DOWN MARYLAND IN ACC QUARTERFINAL

◆ Five Tar Heels scored in double figures, Carolina shot 61.5 percent from the floor in the second half and the Tar Heels won the rebounding battle for the 14th game in a row as UNC beat Maryland, 85-69 on Friday in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals.

◆ **Kendall Marshall** had 12 assists and broke the ACC's single-season assist record. He now has 311 assists, breaking the record of 303 by Georgia Tech's Craig Neal in 1987-88. This was the 14th time this year he had 10 or more assists, one behind Chris Corchiani's ACC record of 15 in 1990-91. The last time a Tar Heel had a points/assists double-double in the ACC Tournament was **Raymond Felton** with 20 points and 10 assist vs. Maryland in the 2003 quarterfinals.

◆ Marshall has 311 assists in 32 games, an average of 9.72, which is the best in ACC single-season history and the eighth-best in NCAA history. In his career, Marshall has 541 assists in 69 games, an average of 7.84, which is second in ACC history.

◆ Marshall scored 13 points, the sixth time this year and the 12th time in his career he has scored in double figures. It was the third time in the last five games that Marshall has scored in double figures (22 at NC State, 20 at Duke and 13 vs. Maryland on Friday). In three games against Maryland this year, Marshall had 36 assists, an average of 12 per game.

◆ Marshall has posted double-doubles in points and assists in each of the last two games (20 and 10 at Duke, 13 and 12 vs. Maryland). He is the first Tar Heel to do so since Ty Lawson had 23 and 10 at Miami and 16 and 10 and 10 vs. Boston College in January 2008. No Tar Heel player ever has posted three consecutive double-doubles in points and assists.

◆ Freshman forward **James Michael McAdoo** scored 14 points, his first game in double figures against ACC competition. He last scored in double figures on Dec. 19th, when he also had 14 points. McAdoo had a game-high eight rebounds, his highest figure since he had nine against Monmouth on New Year's Day (in 17 games). It was the second time this year he led the Tar Heels in rebounding (he shared team honors in the win over Georgia Tech on Jan. 29).

◆ Freshman guard **P.J. Hairston** scored nine points, his highest output since he had 16 against Monmouth on Jan. 1st.

◆ Sophomore guard **Reggie Bullock** shared team scoring honors with 15 points. It was the second time this year he led the Tar Heels in scoring (and first since November 22 when he scored a career-high 23 points against Tennessee State). Bullock has scored in double figures in six of the last seven games and made multiple threes in six of the last seven. He is 16 of his last 36 three-pointers in the last seven games.

◆ Bullock made six field goals today, most since he had six against Long Beach on Dec. 10th.

◆ Carolina shot 61.5 percent from the floor in the second half (16 of 26), its highest percentage in a half in ACC play and the highest since it shot 61.8 percent in the first half against Monmouth on Jan. 1.

◆ The Tar Heels held the Terps to 38.7 percent shooting from the floor, the ninth time in the last

14 games that UNC held the opposition under 40 percent shooting. The Tar Heels are now 19-0 this season when the opponents shoot under 40 percent.

- ◆ Carolina shot 50.8 percent from the floor today. UNC is now 9-0 this year when it shoots 50 percent or better from the floor.
- ◆ It was the third time this year and the second game in a row that UNC had five players score in double figures (also at NC State and at Duke). Prior to Friday, the last time five Tar Heel scored in double figures in an ACC Tournament game was versus Clemson in the 2008 final.
- ◆ It was the 14th game in a row that the Tar Heels had equal to or more rebounds than the opponents (more rebounds in 13 of the 14).
- ◆ Terrell Stoglin had 30 points for Maryland, the first 30-point against by an opponent in the ACC Tournament since Georgia Tech's Will Bynum had 35 in the 2005 semifinals.

MARSHALL IN FINAL FIVE FOR COUSY AWARD

- ◆ Sophomore **Kendall Marshall** is one of five finalists for the 2012 Bob Cousy Award, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Friday. This annual award is given to college basketball's top point guard and is named after Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtics guard Bob Cousy. An original list, consisting of 60-plus candidates from around the country, was trimmed by a Hall of Fame appointed, nationally based committee to 20, down to 11 and now five candidates remain in consideration for one of college basketball's most prestigious awards.
- ◆ The final five candidates are Isaiah Canaan (Murray State), Matthew Dellavedova (Saint Mary's), Damian Lillard (Weber State), Marshall and Tyshawn Taylor (Kansas).
- ◆ The winner of the 2012 Bob Cousy Award will be awarded at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Monday, April 2nd in New Orleans as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

ZELLER IN FINAL 15 FOR WOODEN AWARD

- ◆ Senior forward **Tyler Zeller**, the 2012 ACC Player of the Year, is one of 15 Finalists for the John R. Wooden Award, announced by The Los Angeles Athletic Club on March 6.

CAROLINA'S HISTORY IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- ◆ The Tar Heels have an all-time record of 87-40 in Tournament play.
- ◆ Carolina's all-time ACC Tournament winning percentage of 68.5 is second-best in conference history.
- ◆ The Tar Heels have won 10 of their last 13 ACC Tournament games, winning seven in a row (including championships in 2007 and '08), then losing two in a row in 2009 and 2010 before going 2-1 last season and winning Friday against Maryland.
- ◆ Last year, Carolina made its 30th appearance in the ACC Tournament final, tied with Duke for most all-time. UNC is 17-13 in its 30 championship game appearances.
- ◆ The Tar Heels have won four of their last seven ACC championship games, winning in 2008, 2007, 1998 and 1997 and losing in 2011, 2001 and 1999.
- ◆ The Tar Heels have won the ACC Tournament 17 times, second in league history behind Duke's 19.
- ◆ Carolina has won ACC Tournament championships in 1957, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1972, 1975, 1977, 1979, 1981, 1982, 1989, 1991, 1994, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008.
- ◆ The Tar Heels have played in the ACC Tournament finals in 15 of the last 25 seasons (entering this weekend). Prior to 2007, UNC had gone five straight years without reaching the title game (2002-06), marking the first time since 1960-66 the Tar Heels had missed the title game in at least three straight seasons.
- ◆ **Roy Williams** is aiming for his third ACC championship as a head coach after capturing the 2007 title in Tampa and the 2008 title in Charlotte. While the head coach at Kansas, Williams won four Big 8/12 Tournament titles (1992, 1997, 1998 and 1999). Williams was an assistant coach under **Dean Smith** for three ACC championships at UNC (1979, 1981, 1982).

TAR HEELS AS NO. 1 SEED IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- ◆ This is the 24th time Carolina has been the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament. The Tar Heels have been the top seed in **1957**, 1960, **1967**, **1968**, **1969**, 1971, **1972**, 1976, **1977**, 1978, **1979**, **1982**, 1983, 1984, 1987, 1988, 1993, 2001, 2005, **2007**, **2008**, 2009, 2011 and 2012 (**bold** indicates championships won).
- ◆ UNC has gone 46-13 as the No. 1 seed, winning 10 titles (including 2007 and 2008 under **Roy Williams**).
- ◆ Carolina is 11-3 in six appearances as the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament under **Roy Williams**, winning titles in 2007 and '08, advancing to the final in 2011 and reaching the semifinals in 2005 and '09 prior to this season.
- ◆ The 2011-12 season is the 29th time Carolina has won at least a share of the ACC regular-season championship (and the sixth time under Williams, joining 2004-05, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09 and 2010-11).
- ◆ UNC has won 19 outright regular-season ACC titles, including five of the last eight.
- ◆ Williams has won or tied for 15 conference regular-season championships in 24 years as a head coach, including nine Big 8/12 regular season titles as Kansas' head coach and six ACC regular season titles at Carolina (2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012).

ROY WILLIAMS IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- ◆ Carolina is making its ninth ACC Tournament appearance under head coach **Roy Williams**. The Tar Heels are 12-6 in ACC Tournament play under Williams' tutelage. Williams is aiming for his third ACC title as a head coach after capturing the 2007 title in Tampa and the 2008 title in Charlotte.
