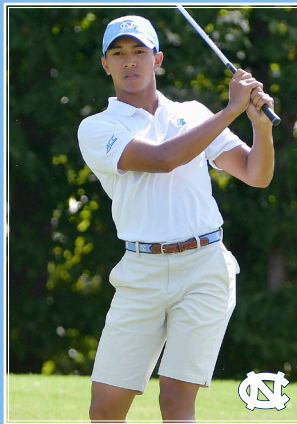

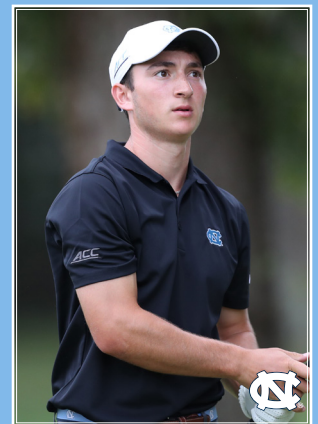

**ANDREW  
DIBITETTO**  
Head Coach

Andrew DiBitetto led the Tar Heels to a pair of tournament victories, the school's highest NCAA Tournament finish in 15 seasons and a number of individual and team records in his first season as head coach.

The 32-year-old is in the midst of his eighth season with the Tar Heels. He was an assistant coach for three seasons and also the associate head coach from 2014-17.

"Andrew has brought a renewed excitement to the golf program," says three-time Tar Heel All-America and Hall of Famer Davis Love III. "His passion, commitment, and vision for the future has the Tar Heel family engaged in supporting the team any way possible."

Last year, his first as head coach, Carolina won the Tar Heel Intercollegiate and beat a strong national field at the Western Intercollegiate, UNC's first win ever on the west coast. The Tar Heels were fourth at the NCAA Kissimmee Regional and finished 15th at the NCAA Championship, the program's highest national finish since 2003. Junior Joshua Martin earned honorable mention All-America honors and seniors Ben Griffin, Jose Montañó and William Register were PING all-region selections.

Tar Heel players set a number of new standards for Carolina golf:

- Griffin finished his career with the lowest stroke average in UNC history and earned All-ACC honors for the second time;
- Griffin set UNC 54-hole records in winning the Tar Heel Intercollegiate with a 19-under-197;
- sophomore Austin Hitt posted the lowest score to par by a Tar Heel in an NCAA regional;
- Griffin (second), Montañó (11th) and Register (12th) had three of the 12 lowest scoring averages in UNC single-season history;
- those three players plus Hitt and Martin account for five of the 11 best stroke averages in Carolina history;
- Griffin became the first Tar Heel to shoot three rounds in the 60s in an ACC Tournament;
- UNC won the Tar Heel Intercollegiate shooting the lowest 54-hole score (815) and finishing the best to par (-49) in school history. It was the second-best score to par in ACC history.

All six of Carolina's veteran players who appeared in the starting lineup improved their strokes per round from 2016-17 to 2017-18, and five of the six lowered their average score by more than a full stroke per round.

Academic achievement continued to be a priority for DiBitetto as six Tar Heels earned a spot on the ACC Honor Roll and four were named Srixon/Cleveland Golf All-America Scholars. Carolina was the only ACC program to have four All-America Scholars.

In the fall of 2018, sophomore Ryan Gerard shot a final-round 61 at Notre Dame, the lowest 18-hole score in UNC history.

DiBitetto (pronounced DEE-bih-TET-toe) won the Jan Strickland Award in 2016, which is presented to the assistant coach who has excelled in working with their student-athletes both on the course and in the classroom. DiBitetto served as an assistant coach on the United States' team that defeated Team Europe in the 2017 Palmer Cup.

"Coach DiBitetto has the motivation and drive needed to bring this golf program to the highest possible level," says Griffin. "His dedication to making us better and ability to connect to us as players is unmatched, and I am excited to see what is in store for the future. I think there will be a positive student-athlete experience and a lot of success this year under Coach DiBitetto."



"Coach is like a father figure and a best friend," says Register. "He's not afraid to let you know if you've messed up, but he's also there to enjoy all the fun times together. He's a natural leader and one of the hardest workers I've ever met. I can't wait to play for him as my coach."

The Rochester, N.Y., native was an accomplished golfer at Charlotte, where he led the 49ers to unprecedented success at the NCAA Championships. In 2018, Charlotte honored DiBitetto at a home football weekend for his outstanding career.

As a junior in 2007, he earned honorable mention GCAA/PING All-America honors after finishing ninth and leading Charlotte to a tie for third place at the NCAA Championships, the school's highest finish in history. His ninth-place finish was the highest to date by a 49er.

As a senior, Charlotte was ranked consensus No. 1, won the A-10 Championship and tied for eighth at the NCAA Championships. It was the first time in school history men's golf posted back-to-back top 10s at NAAs. He set and still holds the records for most tournaments and most consecutive tournaments played (50).

DiBitetto was second at the 2007 A-10 Championships and fifth in 2006. He led the 49ers to A-10 Championships in 2006.

DiBitetto also excelled in the classroom as a student-athlete, winning Atlantic 10 Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors in 2007, and was chosen an All-America Scholar by the coaches in 2007 and 2008. He was an Atlantic 10 All-Academic team selection in 2006 and 2007. DiBitetto has carried that passion for academic excellence to his coaching career, as well, as five Tar Heels have been selected to the All-ACC Academic team on eight occasions since he joined the UNC staff.

DiBitetto graduated cum laude with a degree in business management and played professionally for a short time. He returned to Charlotte as assistant coach in 2009 and was named the interim head coach for the 49ers in December 2010.

DiBitetto played or coached on six consecutive Atlantic 10 championship teams. Charlotte qualified for the NCAA Regionals in 2009, 2010 and 2011, and the 49ers had six players selected to the All-Atlantic 10 team. Five players were named GCAA Scholar All-Americans, three players were selected to the GCAA/PING All-Region team and two players earned A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year honors. Corey Nagy was a two-time All-America, earning honorable mention in 2009 and second-team honors in 2010.

DiBitetto was born on Jan. 17, 1986. He and his wife, Laree, have two sons, Levi and Luxen.

**MATT CLARK**  
Assistant Coach

Matt Clark is in his second season as assistant coach at the University of North Carolina.

Last year, he helped the Tar Heels finish 15th at the NCAA Championship, the program's highest showing in 15 years, win two team tournament titles and post six other top-five performances. Three Tar Heels earned all-region honors and a fourth was an honorable mention All-America. Six players made the ACC Honor Roll, four were Srixon/Cleveland Golf All-America Scholars and one was recipient of an ACC post-graduate scholarship.

All six of Carolina's veteran players who appeared in the starting lineup improved their strokes per round from

2016-17 to 2017-18, and five of the six lowered their average score by more than a full stroke per round.

Clark was a Division I head coach for 14 years – from 2008-17 at UNCW and 2003-08 at Georgia State. He built both programs into two of the top mid-majors in the country, winning a combined five conference championships. A collegiate golfer from 1995-97 at the University of Alabama, Clark began his coaching career as an assistant for six seasons at his alma mater, where he worked for a pair of national coaches of the year and Golf Coaches Association of America Hall of Famers in Dick Spybey and Jay Seawell.

A four-time conference coach of the year (twice at UNCW and twice at Georgia State), Clark led the Seahawks to 10 team titles, including the 2016 Tar Heel Intercollegiate at UNC Finley, and a dozen individual event titles, including the 2017 Auburn Tiger and Clemson Invationals. His student-athletes received five PING all-region honors, 20 all-conference selections, three Colonial Athletic Association Player-of-the-Year awards, two CAA Rookie-of-



the-Year honors and one UNCW Male Student-Athlete of the Year award.

The Seahawks won the CAA in 2011, 2012 and 2013, and played in four NCAA Regionals as a team and had individuals qualify for regional play an additional five times. In 2016-17, the Seahawks posted the lowest team stroke average and had the lowest individual stroke average in school history.

Clark's UNCW teams also excelled in the classroom. The NCAA has awarded UNCW a public recognition award in each of the past two seasons for having Academic Progress Rates in the top 10 percent in the country. Twelve Seahawks earned Academic All-America honors, the team received All-Academic honors from the GCAA from 2011-2017 and Thomas Eldridge was the CAA's Scholar Athlete of the Year for men's golf in 2017. The men's golf team won UNCW's Team Leadership Award in 2011 and 2012 for outstanding academics, athletics and community service.

Clark began his head coaching career in 2003 at Georgia State in Atlanta. Clark led the Panthers to two conference championships, six team and 10 individual event titles, and coached six All-Americans, seven all-region players and 12 all-conference selections. He had three players compete in the Palmer Cup, two were named GSU Male Student-Athletes of the Year, and had a finalist for both the Ben Hogan and Jack Nicklaus Awards. Two of the Panthers who played for him competed in the Open Championship.

Georgia State participated in the NCAA Regionals all five years he served as head coach and advanced to the NCAA Championship three times, finishing in the top 20 in 2004, 2005 and 2007. The Panthers were ranked No. 4 in the nation in 2005.

A native of Prattville, Ala., Clark and his wife, Erica have two daughters, Ansley and Graelyn.

UNC Finley Golf Course is one of the premier university-owned facilities in the country. Originally built in 1949, Finley underwent a major renovation in 1999 by internationally-renowned designer Tom Fazio.

Finley features a par-72 layout with five sets of tees, including 7,349 yards for the championship markers. A state-of-the-art irrigation system and exceptional drainage helps keep the course first-class throughout the year.

The clubhouse was renovated in 2012, which nearly doubled its size to 10,000 square feet. The clubhouse features the Naismith Grill, pro shop, locker rooms and the A.E. Finley Memorabilia Room, which commemorates the history and support of the Finley family throughout the last 60-plus years.

UNC Finley Golf Course is located on the University of North Carolina campus between NC Highway 54 and U.S. 15-501. In addition to being the home of the Tar Heel men's and women's golf programs, Finley is played by Carolina students, faculty, staff, alumni and golf enthusiasts from across the southeastern United States.

Finley, rated 4.5 stars by Golf Digest, is ranked the top public course in the Triangle by the NC Golf Panel. It played host to the 2015 NCAA Chapel Hill Regional, annually hosts collegiate tournaments for both the men's and women's teams, and has been a qualifying site for the Web.com Tour.

Carolina golfers have the opportunity to play, practice and train at one of the finest all-around golf, academic and fitness complexes in the country. Players can tee it up for 18 holes at UNC Finley Golf Course, practice at the Williamson Practice Facility at the Chapman Center, and study, work out and grab a nutrition-rich snack at the Fueling Station at the Loudermilk Center for Excellence – and all of that is located within a five-minute drive of each other on the UNC campus.

**The Chapman Center** is the home of Carolina Golf. Located at one end of the UNC Finley driving range, the Chapman Center is a private 4,500-square foot facility that includes the team locker room, coaches' offices, practice areas, meeting and conference room and memorabilia.

The Chapman Center includes two hitting bays that feature state-of-the-art video equipment and teaching systems.

Players have easy access to the **Williamson Golf Team Practice Facility**, which includes a 120-yard wide driving range, three putting greens, bunkers and several short-game areas. The three putting greens feature two bent grass greens and one Bermuda green.

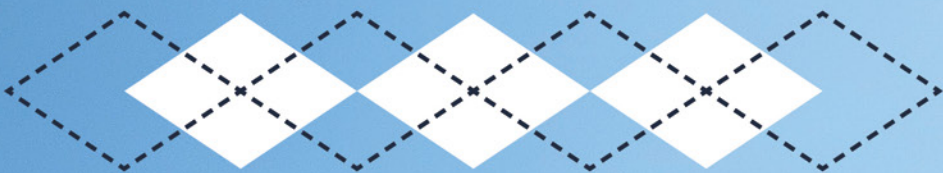

## ACADEMIC SUPPORT PROGRAM for STUDENT-ATHLETES

The Academic Support Program for Student-Athletes (ASPSA) reports directly to the Office of the Executive Vice Chancellor and Provost and is uniquely positioned to collaborate with faculty, the Department of Athletics and the campus community to support student-athletes as they excel in the classroom and compete in athletics. The ASPSA helps student-athletes explore their academic interests and abilities as well as provides numerous academic services including tutoring, secondary academic and career advising, assistance with University and NCAA eligibility, and coordination of academic honors and awards. In addition to the Director/Assistant Provost, the ASPSA staff includes 12 academic counselors, three learning specialists, and an office manager.

ASPSA staff work together to guide and support student-athletes throughout their career at Carolina, beginning with an introduction to academics at UNC during the recruiting process through graduation and beyond. All incoming student-athletes, as well as those in need of more intensive academic support, participate in the My Academic Plan (MAP) program. Academic counselors and learning specialists work with each student-athlete to customize his or her MAP based on academic preparedness, course schedule, and individual need.



The Academic Support Program is housed in the Loudermilk Center for Excellence, a 150,000-square-foot facility that serves all of Carolina's nearly 800 student-athletes across 28 varsity sports. The Loudermilk Center's largest feature is the John W. Pope Student-Athlete Academic Support Center. This facility provides classrooms for teaching and tutoring, study lounges, office space and a computer lab.

The floor also includes offices for the Student-Athlete Development program, which guides students in personal development, leadership development and career development.

## 2017-18 Academic Highlights

- Ben Griffin was the team's Athletic Director's Scholar-Athlete Award winner and received an honorary post-graduate scholarship from the ACC.
- William Register was one of four senior student-athletes to win the Mildred McCaskill Award for athletics, academics and service.
- Griffin, Register, Jose Montañó and Joshua Martin were named Academic All-ACC and Srixon/Cleveland Golf All-America Scholars. Carolina was the only ACC school with four All-America scholars.

## Leadership Academy Framework

## Richard A. Baddour Carolina Leadership Academy

The Richard A. Baddour Carolina Leadership Academy develops world-class leaders for a lifetime of service and success. In 2004, its launch marked the first leadership development program in collegiate athletics, and in the intervening years, it has prided itself on being the premier leadership development program in collegiate athletics. It was the first and continues to stand as the best of its kind.

Programming is based upon descriptive and applied frameworks. A descriptive framework describes how student-athletes progress through the programming. It is a leadership depth chart and pipeline. An applied leadership framework provides a language and an architecture with which to speak about leadership. UNC features an applied framework which is unique to Carolina and uniquely Carolina. The frameworks showcases the interdependence of leading self and leading with others.

## MEN'S GOLF HISTORY

Carolina has a long and rich golf tradition with 44 appearances in the NCAA Championships, including a 15th-place finish under first-year head coach Andrew DiBitetto in 2018, and seven additional seasons competing in NCAA Regionals.

The Tar Heels have won 97 team events, including 11 Atlantic Coast Conference championships. Carolina golfers have won 119 individual titles, including a pair of NCAA championships — Harvie Ward in 1949 and John Inman in 1984.

Carolina has 21 top-10 finishes in the NCAA Championship, including second-place in 1953 and 1991. The Tar Heels finished third in 1993, fourth in 1960 and 1984 and fifth in 1978.

UNC posted five straight top 10s from 1949-53, placing eighth, sixth, seventh, 10th and second in consecutive championships.

The Tar Heels finished ninth, eighth and fourth from 1982-84 when the team was led by Inman and future PGA standout Davis Love III. Devon Brouse coached those teams in the '80s as well as the 1990 and 1991 squads that placed seventh and second at the NCAA Championships, respectively.

UNC's latest top-10 performance was in 2003 when Inman, who was head coach from 1998-2011, led UNC to a tie for ninth.

Individually, the Tar Heels have 21 top 10s in NCAA Championship play, led by medalists Ward and Inman. That includes 11 finishes in the top five — in addition to Ward and Inman, Bill Williamson was second in 1953, Buck Adams was third in 1957, John McGough (1978), Greg Parker (1987) and Tim Scherrer (1991) each placed fourth and Joe Correll (1954), Gene Lookabill (1956), Bob Galloway (1960) and McGough (1979) were fifth.

McGough's back-to-back fourth- and fifth-place performances in 1978-79 stamp him as the only Tar Heel with two top-five finishes in NCAA play; Ward and Love III are the other Tar Heels with a pair of top 10s. Love tied for sixth in 1985 and was eighth a year earlier.

Ward won the 1949 NCAA title, a year after he won the prestigious North and South Amateur in Pinehurst. The Tarboro, N.C., native beat Texas's Morris Williams Jr., 5 & 4 in the 36-hole NCAA final in Ames, Iowa. In 1950, Ward reached the third round of match play.

Inman shot a 66 and a pair of 67s in his four rounds to break Ben Crenshaw's NCAA record with a 17-under 271 to win at Bear Creek Golf World in Houston.

Inman also won the Fred Haskins Award in 1984 as the top collegiate golfer in the nation. The Greensboro native later became the first person to win the Atlantic Coast Conference men's golf title as both a player and head coach.

The Tar Heels have won the ACC Championship in 1956 and 1960 under head coach Chuck Erickson, 1965 under Ed Kenney, 1977 under Mike McLeod, 1981, 1983, 1984, 1986, 1995 and 1996 under Brouse and 2006 under Inman.

Thirteen different Tar Heels have won medalist honors at the ACC Championships, including Buzzy Basinger (1956), Bill Thornton (1958), Pete Green (1961), John Baldwin (1965), Marty West (1971), John Spelman (1981), Inman (1982), Love III (1984), John Hughes (1986), Parker (1987), Mark Wilson (1996), Dustin Bray (2002) and Richard Treis (2003). Erwin Laxton won consecutive league titles in the 1930s when the Tar Heels were members of the Southern Conference.

Bray won three events in two different seasons and holds the UNC for most collegiate tournaments won with seven. Love III and Pat Moore won a half-dozen times, Inman, Parker and Hughes were five-time winners.

Moore holds the single-season record for most tournaments won. The Austin, Minn., native won six events overall, including four in 1991, and went on to win three times on the Buy.com Tour.

Three players have earned All-America honors three times — Inman (1982-84), Love III (1983-85) and Max Harris (1998-2000). They're among the 33 Tar Heels to earn honorable mention or better All-America honors. Last year, Joshua Martin was an honorable mention All-America selection.

In addition to success in collegiate competition, Carolina golfers have been successful in professional, international and amateur golf.

Love III has won 21 PGA Tour events, including the 1997 PGA Championships, and the 1992 and 2003 PLAYERS Championship, and played on six United States' Ryder Cup

teams and six President Cup teams. He was Ryder Cup captain in 2012 in and is the captain of the 2016 Ryder Cup team. He won the 2015 Wyndham Championship at age 51, making him the third-oldest winner in PGA Tour history. He is the only player to win on the PGA Tour in the 1980s, 1990s, 2000s and 2010s.

Mark Wilson is a current PGA Tour professional and has won five times on tour, including the Honda, Sony and Phoenix Opens. Wilson won the Ben Hogan Award as the top scholar-athlete in collegiate golf in 1996.

Inman won two PGA Tour events and is playing on the Champions Tour, while Bray is playing on the Web.com Tour.

Jim Ferree, who won the 1953 Southern Conference title while a Tar Heel, was a fixture for many years on the PGA and Senior Tours.

Internationally, Ward went 6-0 in Walker Cup matches in 1953, 1955 and 1959. Fuhrer (1981), Love III (1985) and Scherrer (1991) played in the Walker Cup and Inman was a member of the World Amateur Team in 1984. Max Harris represented England/Ireland on the 1998, 1999 and 2000 Palmer Cup teams. Bray represented the United States in the 2002 U.S./Japan Matches and was on the Palmer Cup squad the next year. Kevin O'Connell was the MVP of the 2008 U.S./Japan Matches as he led the USA to a 37-23 win.

Exceptional amateur play dates back more than 60 years to Ward, who became one of the most successful golfers in amateur history. He reached the U.S. Amateur quarterfinal in 1947, won the North and South in 1948 and the NCAA title in 1949. Ward won the 1952 British Amateur, the 1954 Canadian Amateur and the U.S. Amateur in 1955 and 1956. He is the only person to win an NCAA title and the U.S., British and Canadian Amateurs.

Ward finished fourth in the 1957 Masters, seventh in the 1955 U.S. Open and eighth in the 1955 Masters. He turned professional in 1974 and won the 1977 North Carolina Open.

Scherrer, who won the PGA Tour's Kemper Open in 2000, was second at the U.S. Amateur in 1992.

Carter Jenkins won both the 2015 North Carolina and Carolinas Amateurs. Jenkins became the first player in 92 years to win the Carolinas Amateur three times.

Kevin O'Connell, a two-time All-ACC selection in 2008 and 2009, won the 2018 U.S. Mid-Amateur title, earning spots in the 2019 Masters and U.S. Open.

Carolina has had its share of great coaches, as well.

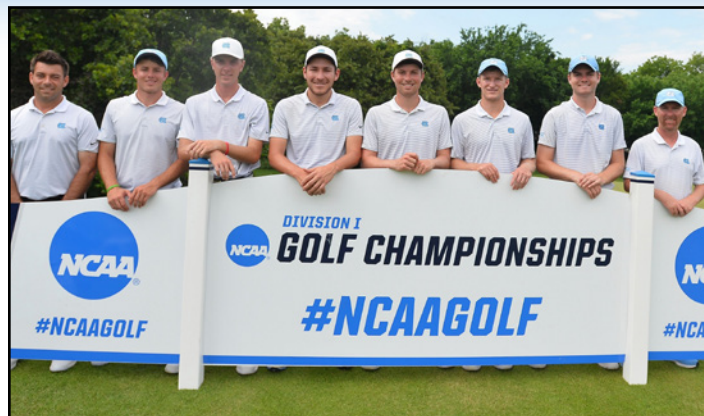
John Kenfield became head coach in the program's second year in 1929 and served for six years. Better known as UNC's tennis coach for 30-plus years, Kenfield yielded to Chuck Erickson in 1935. Later to become UNC's director of athletics, Erickson built Carolina into a national golf power. In 23 seasons, Erickson's teams

posted a 182-45-9 dual-match record, won five conference championships, and placed second and fourth in the 1953 and 1960 NCAA Championships. Erickson's tenure was interrupted for three years during World War II when the school fielded no team, but the post-war era produced Ward and A.E. Finley Golf Course was built in 1949. Prior to that, UNC played its home matches at Hope Valley Country Club in Durham.

Erickson, a long-time member of the NCAA Golf Committee, was succeeded by Ed Kenney in 1961, whose teams won over 71 percent of their matches during his 12 years as head coach. Clyde Walker served as coach for one year in 1973, and Mike McLeod for four years beginning in 1974.

Devon Brouse took the reins in 1978 and led the Tar Heels to a fifth-place NCAA finish in his first season. In 21 seasons, Brouse's teams won six ACC titles and posted 17 top-20 and 10 top-10 finishes in the NCAA Championships. His teams won 55 tournament titles and he coached 54 individual champions, including six ACC individual champions and an NCAA champion.

Inman's teams won 16 events and had 16 individual champions, including two ACC champions, in his 13 years as head coach. The Tar Heels posted 10th-place finishes at the NCAA Championships in 1999 and 2000.

Under Andrew Sapp, Carolina won seven team and six individual events from 2011-17, playing in four NCAA Regionals and returning to the NCAA Championship in '17 for the first time in 10 years.

Andrew DiBitetto spent six years as an assistant coach under Sapp and was elevated to head coach prior to this season.

The Tar Heels won the 2017 Tar Heel Intercollegiate in record fashion, shooting 49 under par. Senior Ben Griffin set school records by winning the event at 19-under-197.

Griffin earned his second honorable mention All-America honor in 2018 after leading UNC to a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championship.

Carolina qualified for nationals from the Kissimmee Regional, where Austin Hitt shot 10 under, UNC's best score in a regional.

In 2018, sophomore Ryan Gerard shot a 10-under-61 in the final round at Notre Dame, the lowest competitive round in Carolina Golf history.

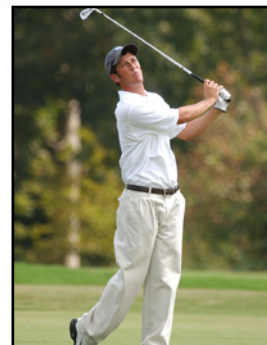

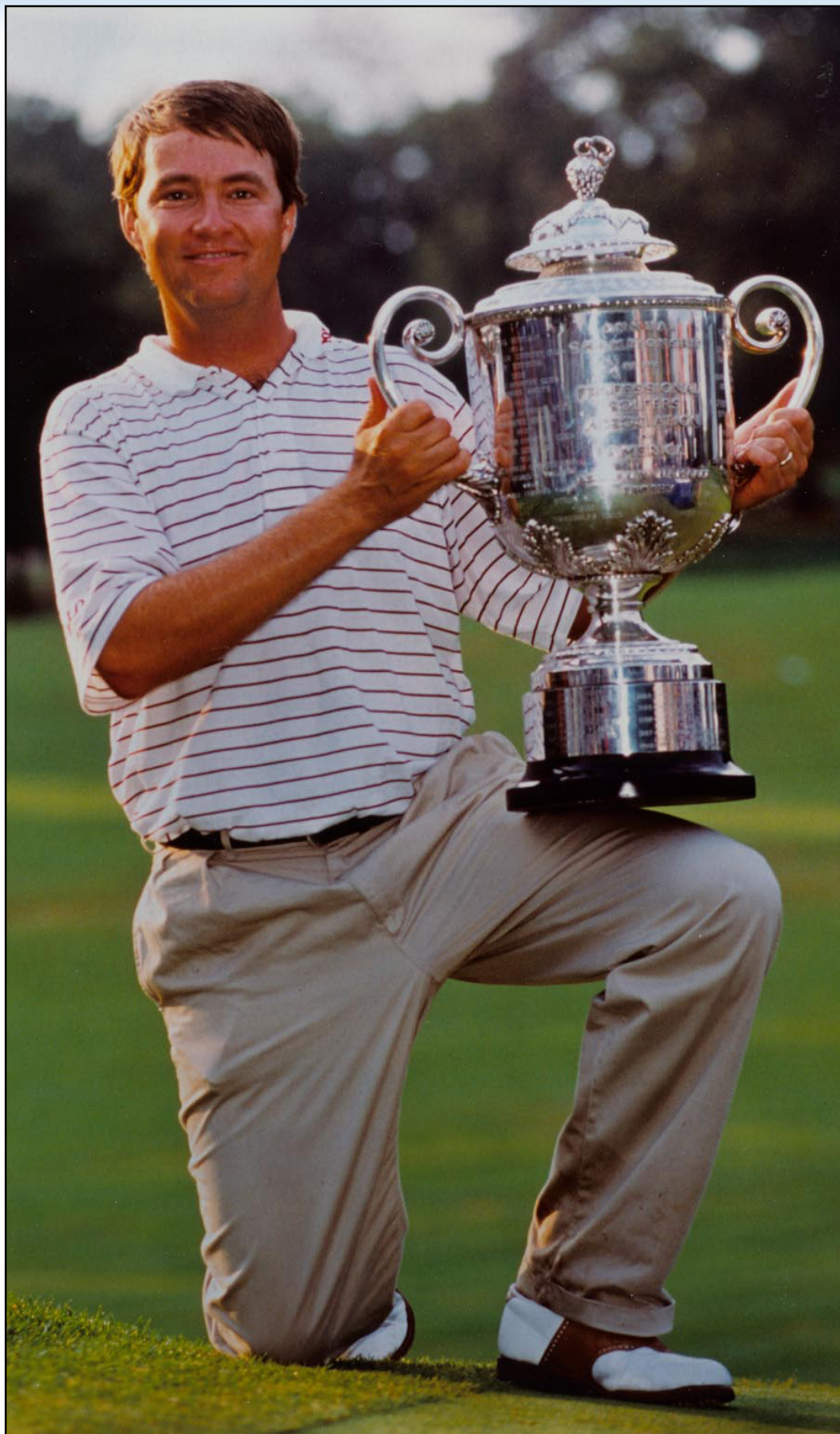
## DAVIS LOVE III

- Only player to win PGA Tour events in 1980s, 1990s, 2000s and 2010s
- Played on six U.S. Ryder Cup and six Presidents Cup teams
- Four-time World Cup of Golf champion
- Payne Stewart Award recipient (2008)

## ORDER OF MERIT

The University of North Carolina established the Carolina Order of Merit in 1991 to honor former players, coaches, administrators and friends who have distinguished themselves in the game and for their overall contributions to the UNC golf program. Jim Ferree and Harvie Ward were the first inductees. Ceremonies take place each fall at the Executive Cup Golf Tournament banquet.

### DONNA ANDREWS (2003)

Played at UNC from 1986-89 • Second-team All-America • Third at the 1989 NCAA Championship, the highest finish ever by a Tar Heel • Two-time champion of North and South Amateur • Member of ACC's 50th Anniversary Team • Six-time winner on LPGA Tour, including 1994 Nabisco Dinah Shore • Top three in two U.S. Opens • Played twice in Solheim Cup • Past president of the LPGA.

### DICK BADDOUR (2011)

Director of Athletics for 15 years from 1997-2011 • Under his direction, the Tar Heels won 13 national championships and 66 ACC championships, more than any other school during that time • UNC had nine top-10 finishes in the Directors' Cup in his last 10 years • Worked at the University for 45 years.

### DEVON BROUSE (2013)

Director of golf and men's golf coach for 21 years from 1978-98 • Had 10 top 10s and 17 top 20s at the NCAA Championships and won six ACC titles • Three-time ACC Coach of the Year • Coached an NCAA champion, six ACC individual champions, 18 All-Americans (32 awards) and 20 All-ACC players (36 awards) • Inducted in the Golf Coaches Association of America's Hall of Fame in 2009.

### WOODY DURHAM (2007)

"Voice of the Tar Heels" served as master of ceremonies at the Executive Cup since 1976 • North Carolina Sportscaster of the Year 13 times • Curt Gowdy Award winner for electronic media by the Basketball Hall of Fame in 2015 • North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame inductee • Co-chair of the Carolina Kids Classic, which raises money for the Ronald McDonald House, the UNC Children's Hospital and the Childhood Trust.



### CHUCK ERICKSON (1992)

Golf coach 1935-61 and director of athletics from 1952-68 • Won five conference championships and placed second and fourth in the 1953 and 1960 NCAA Tournaments • Coached NCAA champion Harvie Ward and All-Americans Bill Williamson and Bill Thornton • Helped form the ACC and construct Finley Golf Course • North Carolina Sports and Helms Hall of Fame inductee.

### JIM FERREE (1991)

Played at UNC from 1951-1953 • Won the 1953 Southern Conference championship • Pine Bluff, N.C., native, he played on the PGA Tour from 1956-1966, winning the 1958 Vancouver Centennial • Fixture on the Senior Tour where he won the 1986 Greater Grand Rapids Open and the 1991 Bell Atlantic Classic.

### A.E. FINLEY & THE FINLEY FOUNDATION (2002)

A.E. Finley was largely responsible for the original construction of Finley Golf Course which opened in 1949 • The Finley Foundation remains an integral part of the Executive Cup Golf Tournament which is a fixture on the schedule each year.

### BOBBY GALLOWAY (1993)

Team captain in 1960 when Carolina won the ACC Championship and finished fourth at NAAs • Reached the quarterfinals that year in the NCAA Championship • Carolinas PGA champion in 1971, won the North Carolina Open in 1972 and the National PGA Club Pro title in 1976 • Carolinas Professional Golfer of the Year in 1976 • Regained his amateur status in 1980 and won 10 times.

### DOT GUNNELLS (1994)

UNC's women's coach from 1974-1993 • NGCA Hall of Famer • National coach of the year in 1993, ACC Coach of the Year in 1984 and won the NGCA's Gladys Palmer Award for contributions to golf outside the normal coaching responsibilities • Had 11 top 25s, placed eighth at the NCAA Championship three times (1989, '92 and '93), won the ACC in 1992 and coached five All-Americans.

### JOHN INMAN (1996)

1984 NCAA champion and National Player of the Year • ACC champion in 1982 • Three-time All-America who won five events and led UNC to three straight top 10s at NAAs • Won two PGA events in 12 years on Tour • UNC head coach for 13 years • In 2006, became the first to win the ACC title as both a player and coach • Coached UNC to three top-10 finishes at NAAs.

### ED KENNEY (1994)

Head coach from 1961-72 and head pro at Finley for 27 years • His teams won more than 71 percent of their matches, finished 12th at the 1962 NCAA Championship and won an ACC title in 1965 • Coached three individual ACC medalists.

## DAVIS LOVE III (1997)

World Golf Hall of Fame inductee (2017) • Three-time All-America and six-time collegiate event winner from 1983-85 • Only Tar Heel with two top 10s in NCAA play • ACC champion in 1984 • Helped lead UNC to 17 team titles and two top 10s at NAAs • Selected to the 1985 Walker Cup team • 21-time PGA Tour winner, including the 1997 PGA and two PLAYERS titles • PGA Rookie of the Year in 1986 • Six-time Ryder Cup player and two-time Ryder Cup captain.

## ROGER PERRY (2001)

Friend and supporter of the Carolina golf program • Served as chairman of Carolina's Executive Cup Golf Tournament for three years and was co-chairman of the fundraising campaign for the redesign and construction of UNC Finley Golf Course and the Chapman Center • A real estate developer and president of East West Partners Management Company, Inc.

## HARVIE WARD (1991)

Played at UNC from 1947-1950 • Carolina's first All-America and NCAA champion in 1949 • Won the 1948 North and South Amateur beating Arnold Palmer, former U.S. Amateur Champion Dick Chapman and international star Frank Stranahan • Won the 1950 Southern Conference, the 1952 British Amateur, the 1954 Canadian Amateur and the 1955 and 1956 U.S. Amateurs • Had two top 10s in the Masters and was seventh in 1955 U.S. Open.

## BILL WILLIAMSON (1992)

Played at Carolina's from 1951-1953 • Runner-up in the 1953 NCAA Tournament and led UNC to second place • Former chair of the Executive Cup • In 2004, the men's and women's practice facility was named the Williamson Golf Team Practice Facility • A successful businessman in Charlotte, he was co-chairman for the renovation of UNC Finley Golf Course.
