### QUICK HITS

- UNC is in the ACC final for the ninth year in a row and is playing for its seventh consecutive crown. The Tar Heels were the runner-up to Virginia in 2016 and have won every year since then.
- Carolina is the top seed in the field for the second year in a row and 20th time in school history.
- The Tar Heels are playing for the program's 26th ACC title.
- UNC and Duke faced off last Friday night in the regular-season matchup, with the Tar Heels winning 2-1 under the lights in Chapel Hill. Because Carolina had lost at Virginia a week earlier, that game was for a share of the regular-season conference championship, which UNC and Duke shared after each finishing conference play with one loss.
- Friday's game is UNC's third in a row against a top-4 team (No. 2 Duke, No. 4 Virginia, No. 3 Duke).
- UNC and Duke are meeting in the ACC Tournament for the 16th time overall, the first time since 2016. Carolina leads the conference tournament series 14-1, with Duke's previous win coming in Charlottesville in 2003.
- Four Tar Heels were announced on Monday as All-ACC honorees, with sophomores Ryleigh Heck and Sietske Brüning on the All-ACC first team and junior Kelly Smith and freshman Charly Bruder on the second team. Bruder was honored as the ACC Freshman of the Year.
- Carolina is the defending NCAA Champion after finishing last season 21-0. The 2022 title was the Tar Heels' 10th, passing Old Dominion's nine as the most titles won by a DI program.
- For the first time since 1981, UNC opened the season with a new head coach. Carolina alum Erin Matson, the 2022 National Player of the Year, stepped into big shoes when she was named to the program's top job on Jan. 31, 2023. She replaced Karen Shelton, the winningest coach in the sport's history, who retired in December after 42 years at the Carolina helm.
- Seniors Katie Dixon and Romea Riccardo were voted by their teammates as the 2023 captains.
- UNC will host this year's NCAA Championship at Karen Shelton Stadium, with semifinals on Nov. 17 and the final on Nov. 19.

**Heels vs. Devils**

UNC leads the overall series 83-12, dating back to a 2-0 Duke win on Oct. 3, 1974, Carolina's first season as a varsity program under the umbrella of the Department of Athletics.

- UNC has won the last nine matchups, dating back to the 2017 season, during which the Tar Heels played and practiced on Duke's home turf while Karen Shelton Stadium was under construction. On Oct. 20, 2017, in what was designated as a home game for UNC and was the Tar Heels' Senior Night even though it was in Durham, the No. 2 Blue Devils beat No. 5 UNC 3-2.

**Blue vs. Blue in the postseason**

Friday's game will be the 16th time that the Tar Heels and Blue Devils have met in ACC play. Carolina has won 14 of the previous meetings, with Duke's win coming in 2003, 4-3 in a semifinals game played in Charlottesville.

- The teams last met in ACC play in 2016, when UNC won 3-2 in a semifinals matchup in Winston-Salem. Carolina advanced on to the title game but fell 4-2 to Virginia, marking the most recent time that the Tar Heels didn't win the ACC Championship.
- This marks the third time that the teams have met in tournaments played at Virginia, with UNC winning 3-1 in 1984 and Duke winning 4-3 in 2003.
- UNC's first-ever ACC Tournament game was against Duke. In the conference's first tournament, in Chapel Hill in 1983, third-seeded Duke advanced to the semifinals with a first-round win over Wake Forest. Top-seeded Carolina opened its ACC Tournament history with a 2-1 win over the Blue Devils and went on to claim the conference crown with a 1-0 win over Maryland.
- This marks just the third time that UNC and Duke have met in the championship game, with the previous meetings in 1990 and 2011, both in College Park, Md.. Carolina won both games by 2-1 scores, with the 1990 game decided in overtime.
- In addition to the ACC meetings, UNC and Duke have met four times in NCAA Tournament play, with Carolina winning three of those. Including those games, the Tar Heels lead the postseason series with Duke 17-2.

**UNC in the ACC Tournament**

- UNC has won 25 ACC Championships, more than any other conference team. No other current conference school has won more than four (Wake Forest). Former member Maryland won 10 before moving to the Big Ten.
- The Tar Heels are 64-15 all-time in ACC Tournament play.
- UNC is the six-time defending champion in the event.
- The Tar Heels are the No. 1 seed in the tournament for the 20th time overall and the second year in a row.
- UNC is 36-2 overall when playing as the No. 1 seed.
- Carolina has won 17 of its 25 titles playing from the top spot, most recently in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

**Numbers of Note**

- UNC moved up to first in this week's RPI.
- After no yellow cards in the first 14 games of the season, UNC got two in last Friday's win over Duke.
- In ACC games only, UNC led the league in goals (2.8) and assists (2.2) per game. The Tar Heels are second to Duke in goals allowed, with Duke at .60 and UNC at 1.00.
- After not being outshot once in the first 11 games of the season, the Tar Heels were outshot in back-to-back road games, 8-6 at Syracuse (4-1 win) and 16-14 at UAlbany (4-3 win).
- Sophomore Ryleigh Heck is tied for the team lead in assists with six after

## At the Tar Heel Helm

Erin Matson, the most decorated player in Carolina field hockey history, was announced on Jan. 31, 2023, as the next head coach of the program in which she starred. Matson is the fifth head coach in the history of the varsity program and follows in the footsteps of Karen Shelton, who retired in December of 2022 as the winningest coach in the sport's history after 42 years at the program's helm.

"Erin is an outstanding leader who has a deep and thorough knowledge of the game, understands the balance it takes to be a successful student and athlete, and is determined to expand and propel the winning tradition of Carolina Field Hockey," Director of Athletics Bubba Cunningham said when Matson's hiring was announced. "She knows how to inspire, listen, teach and win – all qualities that will translate well to the sidelines and make her a terrific head coach. We all look forward to supporting her as she transitions and leads in this new role."

During her time as a Tar Heel, Matson played on four NCAA Championship teams and five ACC Championship teams. She was a three-time recipient of the Honda Sport Award for Field Hockey, becoming just the second player ever – after Shelton – to win that honor three times. She finished her career as the all-time scoring leader in both ACC history and NCAA Tournament play. In 2021, she was named by the ACC Network as one of the top 10 female athletes in conference history. A five-time ACC Offensive Player of the Year and the only student-athlete in any sport to earn ACC Player of the Year recognition five times, Matson started for three of the five undefeated teams in program history.

"To say I'm excited and honored to be the head coach of the UNC field hockey program is an understatement – this is a dream come true," Matson said. "This program means the world to me, and I will do whatever it takes to continue the excellence that is UNC Field Hockey. I want to thank Bubba Cunningham, Chancellor Kevin Guskiewicz and the members of the Board of Trustees for this opportunity and for believing in me. I intend to honor the University of North Carolina, Coach Shelton, and the program's history while working to find ways to achieve new heights, side-by-side with our Carolina community."

A member of the U.S. National Team since the age of 17, Matson has extensive international playing experience in addition to her collegiate experience. She was the top scorer at the 2022 Pan American Cup in Chile and has represented the U.S. all over the world, in countries including India, England, South Africa and New Zealand.

While balancing collegiate play, international play and studies, she also became an entrepreneur, founding a brand, "One," that sells gear bearing her logo. The company also organized and executed summer clinics, maximizing NIL (Name, Image, Likeness opportunities) as allowed by the NCAA.

A three-time team captain while at UNC, Matson majored in Advertising and Public Relations, graduating in December 2022.

### Last Time We Met: Oct. 27

#### No. 4 UNC 2, No. 2 Duke 1

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. – Nobody scored, then everybody scored, and when the dust settled the No. 4 North Carolina field hockey team had earned a 2-1 victory over No. 2 Duke to cap the regular season on Friday night at Karen Shelton Stadium.

After a 47-minute defensive battle, Duke scored to kick off a four-minute offensive flurry. UNC answered 26 seconds later, and then the Tar Heels scored again less than three minutes after that to earn the rivalry win.

Duke's goal on a penalty corner in the 47th minute broke the deadlock and gave the Blue Devils a brief 1-0 lead. But Carolina – which last Friday saw a 2-0 halftime lead evaporate when Virginia scored three quick goals to claim a 3-2 win – huddled up, gathered itself and played on. Transitioning quickly, senior Paityn Wirth dribbled into the circle and took a shot from the left side of the arc. Duke keeper Piper Hampsch saved it and the ball bounced out to Tar Heel freshman Sanne Hak at the far post. Hak put back the rebound to tie the game in the 48th minute of play.

Just over three minutes later, freshman Charly Bruder backed down a defender and sent a ball toward the cage from the top of the circle. It bounced through Wirth and a defender and to senior Katie Dixon, who spun and shot it into the cage for what would prove to be the gamewinner.

The Tar Heels continued the celebration into postgame, when they honored six seniors and two graduate students in Senior Night ceremonies.

“We needed a game like that for obvious reasons ... motivation, seniors, everything, but just pure belief in ourselves and a game that we feel confident that we dictated the majority of it,” UNC coach Erin Matson said. “I think that’s exactly what it was. Duke came out with great energy, good fire and they’re threatening all over – we knew that. They like to play with speed and it was our job to handle that and then match it and exceed it. The team did great – they played exactly to the gameplan. They’ve grown so much on this field but also off of it this year, and I think it really showed this game.”

The Friday night crowd was UNC’s second-biggest of the season at 1,356, trailing only the 1,500-strong capacity crowd for the season opener back in August.

### Fresh Faces

The Tar Heels have five freshmen on the roster, including two – Charly Bruder and Sanne Hak – who enrolled at UNC in January and practiced with the team all spring. Hak has been part of the starting lineup in the midfield for each game this season. Bruder has started five games and is tied for the team lead with 10 goals.

### Impact Transfers

The Tar Heels signed two graduate transfer who had impressive careers at their former schools.

- Maddie Kahn was a four-year starter in goal at Lehigh. She helped the team to a Patriot League title in 2022 and was the Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year as a sophomore in the 2021 spring season.
- Pleun Lammers earned second-team All-America honors in 2021 at Syracuse. She missed most of the 2022 season with a knee injury.

### Matson in the UNC record books

Erin Matson finished her UNC career as the program’s all-time leader in points and goals, and tied for first in assists.

- All five of Matson’s season points totals rank among the top eight seasons in school history, with her 2019 total of 33 goals ranking second overall.
- Matson also is the ACC’s all-time leader in points and goals.
- She is one of just four players in Division 1 history to total 300 career points.
- She holds the records for career goals (23) and points (54) in NCAA Tournament play.
- She finished her career ranked third all-time in career goals and career points, behind Old Dominion’s Marina Di Giacomo and Maaike Hilbrand.
- In March of 2021, the ACC Network named Matson the 10th best female athlete in conference history. She joined UNC soccer players Mia Hamm (No. 1) and Kristine Lilly (No. 7) on the list.

### Red, white and Carolina blue

**National Team:** Five Tar Heels – including two members of the current squad – have been named to the U.S. National Field Hockey Team for 2023-24, as announced on Tuesday by USA Field Hockey. Rising senior Katie Dixon has been selected for her National Team debut, and rising sophomore Ryleigh Heck has been named to the team for the second year in a row.

UNC alums Ashley Hoffman, Meredith Sholder and Cassie Sumfest, all National Team veterans, are also part of the 34-player U.S. roster for 2023-24.

Dixon, from Cary, N.C., is one of two athletes making a first appearance as part of the top U.S. squad. She played in all 21 games last season for the Tar Heels, who finished the 2022 campaign undefeated, and she also won gold with the U-21 team at the Junior Pan American Championships in April.

### U21 Selection Camp

Four Tar Heels earned invitations to USA Field Hockey’s U-21 Junior Women’s National Team Selection Camp, which will take place in January 2024. Charly Bruder, Hope Haynes, Ryleigh Heck and Kelly Smith were selected based on their performance at the Senior Nexus Championships in July.

### Karen Shelton Stadium

After spending 2017 playing and practicing at Duke’s stadium in Durham, the Tar Heels moved into their new facility at the start of preseason in August of 2018, and Karen Shelton Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 6, 2018. The facility was named for UNC’s head coach following a gift from Tar Heel supporters Ken and Cheryl Williams.

The Carolina blue chairback seats accommodate 900 fans, with more seating on the grass around the field for a total capacity of 1,500. The playing area includes a massive videoboard, European-soccer inspired benches and a three-level press box. The turf field is top-of-the-line and is a rarity among collegiate fields in being FIH-certified, attesting that it meets the high standards required for international competition.

UNC’s team building provides more than 10,000 square feet of space and includes home and visitor locker rooms, a team meeting room/theater, a coaches’ office, a sports medicine room, and an area for team meals and functions.

- Shelton Stadium is the only UNC facility named for a female coach and marked just the second time in school history that an individual has coached in a facility named for him or her. The first was the Dean E. Smith Center, where Smith coached the men’s basketball team for 11 and a half seasons between the building’s opening in 1986 and his retirement in 1997. Tar Heel women’s soccer coach Anson Dorrance now coaches at Dorrance Field, dedicated in 2019.

- Shelton is the only NCAA DI field hockey coach ever to coach in a facility named for her. There are two other DI facilities named for coaches, but both were dedicated in honor of former coaches.

- Now in their sixth season of playing at KSS, the Tar Heels are 54-4 on their home turf (5-2 in 2023, 8-0 in 2022, 4-2 in 2021, 14-0 in 2020, 11-0 in 2019, 12-0 in 2018).

### Championships at KSS

After hosting the 2020 NCAA Championship on May 7 and 9, 2021, the Tar Heels are set to host again in 2023.

Although the Tar Heels host first and second round action on a regular basis, Chapel Hill has been the site of the field hockey championship just one previous time, in 1987, in the days when the event was held at the home turf of one of the participating schools. In that game, Maryland beat UNC 2-1 in OT to take the national title.

### Family Ties

- UNC has a set of sisters the roster in Romea and Ciana Riccardo. Another sister, Celina, is a fifth-year senior on the Michigan State field hockey team. Romea (pronounced “rho-MAY”) is the oldest of eight Riccardo siblings.

- Junior Jasmina Smolenaars is the younger sister of Eva (pronounced

like “Ava”) Smolenaars, who wrapped up her Tar Heel career with the 2021 campaign. The two were teammates during the 2021 season.

• Ryleigh Heck’s older sister, Kara, is a senior on the field hockey team at Boston College. The sisters faced off on Oct. 6 when the Eagles visited Chapel Hill.
